LEADING OFF: Winners of nine of their last 10 games, Georgia State returns to Colonial Athletic Association play with a weekend series at James Madison. Games are slated for 6:30 p.m. Friday and Saturday followed by a 1 p.m. contest Sunday at Eagle Field at Veteran's Memorial Park in Harrisonburg, Va.

The Panthers will be playing the final three contests in a stretch of eight straight road games. This weekend also marks the second of three straight weekend series away from home, and the third of four consecutive conference weekends on the road for the Panthers.

Playing its first CAA series in three weeks, Georgia State is 25-14 overall, 5-7 in conference play, 2.5 games ahead of James Madison, which stands 14-20, 6-11 CAA.

Georgia State ranks among the nation's top five in batting average (.326), hits (461), runs (310), and runs per game (7.9), and the Panthers lead the nation with 98 doubles.

Individually, GSU shortstop Chad Prain LEADS THE NATION with 67 hits, while his .435 batting average is third, trailing fellow CAA hitter Jimmy Yezzo of Delaware (.449) and Justin Parr of Illinois (.440). Prain has reached base in 36 consecutive games. He ranks second in the CAA with 38 RBI.

Sophomore infielder Caden Bailey is also enjoying a very productive season with a .386 batting average and 24 RBI.

Freshman center fielder Josh Merrigan, a two-time Colonial Athletic Association Rookie of the Week, leads all CAA freshmen in batting average (.342), hits (55), runs scored (36), RBI (25), total bases (71) and stolen bases (10).

Junior outfielder-designated hitter Chase Raffield ranks fourth in the CAA with seven home runs. He is batting .333 with 34 RBI, good for seventh in the league.

Georgia State's weekend rotation includes a pair of freshmen who have both won the CAA's Rookie of the Week award. On Friday, 6-7 right-hander and current Rookie of the Week Nathan Bates (2-1, 2.18) takes the hill, followed by lefty Garrett Ford (3-3, 5.40) on Saturday. Junior left-hander Andrew Fessler (3-1, 2.22), who is fifth in the CAA in ERA, gets the call Sunday.

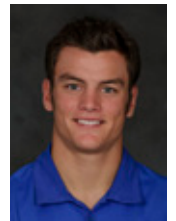
THISCLOSE: Georgia State has played five straight one-run games, winning four of them. All five games have been on the road. Three of the five games have gone to extra innings, with the Panthers playing a total of 51 innings in a five-day stretch.

In two of the three extra-inning wins, the Panthers were down to their last out. At New Orleans (Apr. 13), GSU trailed 5-4 in the top

of the ninth and had the bases loaded with two outs when Chad Prain fell behind 0-2 but fouled off several pitches before he was hit by a pitch to bring home the tying run. At Kennesaw State (Apr. 16), Prain scored the tying run on an error with two outs in the top of the ninth.

PANTHERS WIN NINE OF LAST 10:

Georgia State has won nine of its last 10 games. The only loss in that stretch was a 3-2 defeat in the series finale at New Orleans, which snapped an eight-game winning streak. Still, Georgia State equalled the second-longest winning streak in school history. The GSU record is 11 in a row by the 2011 squad. The Panthers also won eight in a row in 2000, 2008 and 2009.

PITCHING STAFF MAKES PROGRESS:

Georgia State's offense has received national notoriety, but the GSU pitching staff has been much improved as the Panthers have won nine of their last 10 games. During that stretch, the hurlers have compiled a 2.90 ERA.

In particular, the bullpen has been outstanding, collecting six wins, six saves and a 1.80 ERA over the last 10 games.

PANTHERS ON THE OFFENSIVE:

Georgia State features one of the nation's most productive offenses. GSU leads the nation in hits (461) while ranking in the top five nationally in batting average, (.326, 3rd), runs (310, 2nd) and runs per game (7.9, 5th). The Panthers also lead the nation with 97 doubles.

Eight Panther regulars are hitting .300 or higher, including junior shortstop Chad Prain, with an eye-catching .435 batting average that is third in the nation.

In 2010, Georgia State led the nation in runs scored with 10.5 per game and ranked third with a .355 batting average.

THE SERIES WITH JAMES MADISON:

James Madison holds a 15-5 lead in the series, which began in 2006, but Georgia State has won four of the last six meetings.

Last season in Atlanta, GSU took two out of three from the Dukes, winning 9-8 and 4-2 before falling 15-13 in the series finale.

Georgia State also won two out of three on its last trip to Harrisonburg in 2011, when JMU opened the series with a 9-6 victory before the Panthers answered with 16-3 and 9-6 wins.

PRAIN SPARKS OFFENSE:

Junior shortstop Chad Prain is enjoying one of the top offensive seasons in the nation. The Valdosta, Ga., native is batting .435 for the season, and he is FIRST IN THE NCAA in hits (67) and third in batting average. He leads the Panthers and ranks second in the CAA with 38 RBI, despite batting in the leadoff or number two spot. He has two homers, 13 doubles and one triple, along with 12 stolen bases.

Prain had his hitting streak snapped at 20 games on April 7, two shy of the school record, but he has reached base in 36 straight games. He has 22 multi-hit games.

Prain's value to the Panthers was in full evidence as he figured prominently in a pair

of extra-inning victories at New Orleans (April 12-13). On Friday, he hit a solo home run, his second of the season, in the top of the 12th inning to give GSU the 4-3 victory. On Saturday, the Panthers trailed 5-4 with two outs in the top of the ninth inning and were down to their last strike when Prain was hit by an 0-2 pitch with bases loaded to bring home the tying run. In the top of the 11th, he was at the plate when the go-ahead run came home on a wild pitch in the 6-5 victory.

"Chad is having a great season, putting up All-America type numbers," said GSU head coach Greg Frady. "The home run Friday night was awesome, but then on Saturday, he was at the plate with two outs and us down to our last pitch. He really battled in his at-bat with a lot of balls fouled off and then got hit by a pitch. The maturity of standing in there and taking it to get us tied up says a lot about Chad and the competitor that he is."

BATES IS GSU'S LATEST ROOKIE

OF THE WEEK: Pitcher Nathan Bates is this week's Colonial Athletic Association Baseball Rookie of the Week, the second straight Panther to be honored and the fourth different GSU freshman to earn the award this season.

The 6-7 right-hander from Senoia, Ga., recorded a career-high 11 strikeouts in a nine-inning start at New Orleans. Although he was not credited with the win in the 12-inning game, he helped the Panthers to a 4-3 victory.

Bates allowed just five hits and one earned run (three runs overall) before giving way to the bullpen after nine innings. He retired the final 13 batters he faced and 17 of the last 18.

His 11 strikeouts are the most for a GSU pitcher since Justin Malone fanned 11 in a complete-game victory over George Mason on May 21, 2011.

Bates has a 2-1 record and a 2.18 ERA on the season.

ROSE TAKES ON DUAL ROLE:

After playing primarily as an infielder for the first half of the season, freshman Matt Rose now has begun to see more time on the mound, closing games for the Panthers.

The 6-3 right-hander (0-1) has four saves and a 1.42 ERA in 10 appearances. In his last five appearances (all since April 7), Rose has three saves, a 0.00 ERA, and eight strikeouts in 7-1/3 innings.

Rose also plays first base or third base and is batting .287 with two homers and 21 RBI.

MERRIGAN IS TWO-TIME CAA

ROOKIE OF THE WEEK: Georgia State freshman Josh Merrigan was named Colonial Athletic Association Rookie of the Week twice in the season's first six weeks, and he leads all conference freshmen in batting average, hits, runs, RBI, total bases and stolen bases.

The center fielder from Marietta, Ga., and Walton High School batted .364 with one home run and three RBI in a three-game sweep of Old Dominion to garner accolades on Mar. 18.

Merrigan earned his first CAA Rookie honor of Feb. 18 after began his GSU career by hitting .636 (7-for-11) in the opening series

against Butler. He drove in six runs and scored six more and also walked twice and went two-for-two on stolen bases. The left-handed hitter accomplished this while facing left-handed starting pitchers for the Bulldogs each game.

For the season, Merrigan is batting .342 with 25 RBI, and 36 runs scored. He is 10-for-10 on stolen bases.

ROSE IS PANTHERS' FOURTH ROOKIE OF THE WEEK HONOREE:

Georgia State freshman Matt Rose shined at the plate and on the mound to help the Panthers to a sweep of Fordham and was named CAA Rookie of the Week on Apr. 8.

Playing first and third base, the Melbourne, Fla., native batted .400 (4-for-10) with four RBI in three games, and also earned a save on the mound.

Rose is one of four Georgia State freshman who have been named CAA Rookie of the Week a total of five times this season, joining outfielder Josh Merrigan, a two-time selection, and starting pitchers Garrett Ford and Nathan Bates.

FRESHMEN ALL OVER THE LINEUP

CARD: Freshmen are playing key roles for Georgia State, both at the plate and on the mound.

Three freshmen regularly start in the field for the Panthers in center fielder Josh Merrigan, first baseman-third baseman Matt Rose and catcher Joey Roach, and GSU starts freshmen Nathan Bates and Garrett Ford on Friday and Saturday, respectively. Rose is also pitching key innings, and outfielder Shane Gordon has become an important role player.

At the plate, Panther rookies have accounted for nearly 400 at-bats, a .305 batting average, 71 RBI and 83 runs scored.

On the mound, more than one-third of the Panthers' innings pitched have been logged by freshmen, who have made 11 starts and earned six wins and four saves. The Panthers are now starting freshmen on both Friday and Saturday.

Merrigan, Ford, Rose and Bates have all been honored as CAA Rookie of the Week.

WALK-OFF HEROICS: Georgia State trailed Old Dominion, 10-1, in the sixth inning before rallying for a 12-10 victory (Mar. 16), capped by a walk-off homer by Chase Raffield. The Panthers scored two in the sixth, two in the seventh and three in the eighth to pull within 10-8. In the ninth, Nic Wilson hit a solo homer with one out to make the score 10-9.

With two outs, Greg Bowder drew a walk, moved to second on a passed ball and then scored the tying run on Garitt Church's infield single and an ensuing wild throw. With the game tied, Raffield belted his two-run, walk-off home run.

Ironically, this dramatic comeback came one year to the day after the Panthers scored 11 runs in the bottom of the ninth inning - 10 of them with two outs - to turn a 10-run deficit into a 13-12 victory over Northeastern on March 16, 2012.

Raffield's blast was Georgia State's second walk-off homer in three games as Caden Bailey led off the bottom of the ninth inning with a solo homer to break a 7-7 tie and lift the Panthers past George Mason, 8-7, on Mar. 10.

STANLEY STEAMS FROM BULLPEN:

Sophomore right-hander Connor Stanley (Oviedo, Fla.) leads Georgia State and is second in the CAA with 20 appearances, all in relief. He has a 4-1 record with a team-leading three saves.

In the Panthers' current stretch of nine wins in their 10 games, Stanley has earned two wins and a save and has not allowed a run in five appearances.

In a three-game sweep of Old Dominion (Mar. 15-17), Stanley came out of the bullpen to finish all three games, earning a win and a save.

WALK-OFF FOR BAILEY PUNCTUATES HITTING STREAK:

Sophomore infielder Caden Bailey's first career home run was a memorable one. With GSU and George Mason tied at 7-7, Bailey led off the bottom of the ninth inning and belted the 1-0 pitch over the left field fence for the series-clinching, walk-off victory.

Earlier in the game, Bailey delivered a two-run single to help the Panthers rally from a 6-0 deficit. That hit also extended his hitting streak to 19 games, dating back to the final three games of 2012. One game later, his streak was snapped at 19, which goes down as the fourth-longest in school history. The GSU record for longest hitting streak is 22 games by current volunteer coach Bradley Logan in 2008. Two Panthers had 21-game streaks in 2004 in Justin Newman and Tim Burgess.

FORD NAMED CAA ROOKIE OF THE WEEK:

Georgia State's freshman pitcher Garrett Ford was named Colonial Athletic Association Baseball Rookie of the Week on March 18 after a standout performance in defeating George Mason (3-9-13) in game two of the CAA series.

The rookie left-hander from Loganville, Ga., took a shutout into the ninth inning to lead the Panthers to a 12-3 victory.

Over the first eight innings, Ford allowed no runs on seven hits with two walks and one strikeout. With Georgia State leading 12-0 and the bullpen depleted after Friday's 14-13 game, he started the ninth inning and allowed three runs before giving way to the bullpen.

His final line included 8.1 innings, three runs, nine hits, three walks and one strikeout.

Ford has been GSU's Saturday starter since the season began. Against Boston College, he carried a shutout into the seventh inning but was the tough luck loser in a 2-0 defeat.

SARRATT TABBED TO BENCH AWARD

WATCH LIST: Georgia State catcher Scott Sarratt was named to the initial watch list for the 2013 Johnny Bench Award presented BaseballSaving.com, the Greater Wichita Area Sports Commission announced Mar. 11.

Sarratt, a senior from Statesboro, Ga., is one of 48 catchers named to the watch for the award given annually to the top Division I collegiate catcher.

The Panthers' backstop is enjoying an outstanding season, batting .333 with one home run and 19 runs batted in.

SARRATT NAMED CAA PLAYER OF THE WEEK:

Senior catcher Scott Sarratt was named CAA Player of the Week on March 4 after the senior backstop batted .500 for the week to lead the Panthers to three wins in four games against SEC and ACC foes.

In GSU's 10-7 victory over Georgia, Sarratt doubled to lead off the second inning and then came around to score the Panthers' first run. In the Panthers' decisive four-run rally in the fifth inning, Sarratt delivered an RBI-single to bring in the first run of the inning and then scored on Chris Triplett's go-ahead home run.

On Friday, the Statesboro, Ga., native drove in two runs in Georgia State's 5-4, come-from-behind victory over Boston College. In the sixth inning, his RBI single pulled GSU within 4-2, and then in the seventh, he doubled off the wall to bring home the go-ahead run. In Sunday's series clinching win over BC, he contributed a two-out, two-run single that put GSU ahead 5-2 in game the Panthers would eventually win, 7-6.

FRADY REACHES 200-WIN

MILESTONE: Georgia State's 7-6 win over Boston College on March 3 was the 200th victory at Georgia State for head coach Greg Frady, now in his seventh season at the helm. He ranks second in career victories by a GSU head coach with 213, trailing only Mike Hurst, who won 293 games in 13-plus seasons. Frady's winning percentage of .566 is the best mark in school history.

Frady added another milestone against Fordham on April 7 with his 400th victory as collegiate head coach, including 187 wins in six seasons as the head coach at North Florida Community College.

Frady has led the Panthers to four winning seasons in six years, highlighted by a school-record 39 victories, conference title and NCAA berth in 2009. Prior to his arrival, the Panther program had achieved just two winning seasons ever and had never won more than 31 games in any year.

WHAT A WEEK: Georgia State enjoyed one of the more memorable weeks in school history by winning three out of four games against SEC and ACC foes in a six-day span

from Feb. 26 through Mar. 3.

The Panthers began the week with a 10-7 win over Georgia, for the program's first victory over the Bulldogs since 2001.

The GSU took two out of three from Boston College at Al Lang Stadium in St. Petersburg, Fla. The Panthers earned one-run victories over Boston College on Friday (5-4) and Sunday (7-6). The Eagles won the middle game, 2-0.

THE BURNS NOTICE: Left-hander Ben Burns, a junior college transfer from Daytona State, has quickly become a bullpen stalwart for the Panthers. Burns has five victories, all in relief, and one save.

He picked up his fourth victory in the Friday night win over Old Dominion (3-15-13). He came on in the fourth inning with the Panthers trailing 7-5. After immediately picking off a runner at second base he pitched 4-2/3 innings in which he gave up just one run on four hits, allowing the Panthers to rally for a 13-8 victory.

Burns allowed one run and two hits in 3-2/3 innings for a win over UNC Asheville (3-5-13). In the Friday night win over Boston College (3-1-13), he came on in the third inning and finished the game, limiting the Eagles to one run and three hits while striking out five to earn the victory. He also earned the win in relief on Opening Day against Butler.

ROUND-TRIPPERS FOR TRIPPLETT:

Outfielder Chris Triplett leads the Panthers with three home runs on the season, including two last week that propelled the Panthers to huge wins over Georgia and Boston College.

The junior from Fayetteville, Ga. (Sandy Creek HS) belted a two-run homer in the fifth inning against Georgia that put the Panthers ahead 8-7 en route to the 10-7 win.

Three games later against Boston College, he hit another two-run blast in the third inning to give GSU a 3-2 lead in a game the Panthers eventually won, 7-6.

PANTHERS RALLY FOR 10-7 WIN

OVER GEORGIA: Chris Triplett's two-run home run in the fifth inning put Georgia State ahead and sent the Panthers to a 10-7 victory over Georgia Feb. 26 at the GSU Baseball Complex for GSU's first win over the Bulldogs since 2001. Georgia State rallied from deficits of 3-0, 4-1 and 7-4 to snap a 12-game losing streak to the Bulldogs. After Triplett's blast put the Panthers ahead, 8-7, senior Greg Bowder delivered a two-run, pinch-hit single for key insurance runs, and relievers Jerry Stuckey and Matt Rose shut down the Bulldogs over the final five innings.

SQUEGLIA CLIMBS GSU VICTORIES

LIST: After missing the 2012 season with an arm injury, senior pitcher Nick Squeglia has returned to the GSU rotation. The right-hander from Lawrenceville, Ga., earned his first victory in nearly two year against Alabama A&M, when he took a no-hitter into the sixth inning. PEACH STATE PRODUCTS: Relying heavily on the its talent-rich home state, the Georgia State roster features 23 of 30 players from Georgia, 19 of those from the metropolitan Atlanta area.

The remaining seven Panthers hail from Florida (4), North Carolina (2) and Wisconsin.

FRADY COACHES GERMAN

NATIONAL TEAM: Along with his duties at Georgia State, Greg Frady serves as the coach of the German National Team. He has won more than 100 games in international competition and was named European Coach of the Year in 2010.

Most recently, Frady guided Germany to a fourth-place finish at the 2012 European Championships and to the finals of the World Baseball Classic Qualifier. That squad featured former Panthers B.J. Roper-Hubbert, Aeden McQueary-Ennis and Eric Suttle.

POMP AND CIRCUMSTANCE:

Two members of the 2013 squad are already Georgia State alumni. Outfielder Mark Hogan completed requirements for his bachelor's degree in finance in the spring of 2012 and began work toward a second degree in managerial science. Pitcher Nick Squeglia earned his degree in criminal justice in December 2012.

IT'S ACADEMIC:

The Georgia State baseball program achieved a team grade point average of 3.02 for the fall 2012 semester. Sixteen team members earned academic honors, led by senior pitcher Nick Squeglia on the President's List, signifying a semester GPA of 4.0 or higher.

TWO-SPORT STAR:

Senior outfielder Mark Hogan is concentrating on baseball this spring after playing three seasons at line-backer for the Georgia State football team. He is the Panthers' career leader in tackles with 157, and he was named to the 2012 Capital One Academic All-District first team.

Hogan enrolled at Georgia State in 2009 as the first scholarship player for GSU's startup football program, which played its first season in the fall of 2010.

Last spring, Hogan joined the baseball team, playing the sport for the first time since he was a senior at Lincoln-Sudbury High in Massachusetts in 2008. Still, he hit .319 in 42 games while juggling baseball and spring football practice.
