LEADING OFF: Winners of five in a row and 16 of their last 20 games, Georgia State hosts in-state rival Kennesaw State Wednesday at 5 p.m. at the GSU Baseball Complex in the third of three games this season between the two Atlanta-area programs.

The Panthers captured this year's first two meetings, winning 12-5 on April 9 at GSU and 3-2 in 10 innings on April 16 at KSU.

Georgia State is coming off a three-game sweep of Colonial Athletic Association foe Towson, that improved the Panthers' record to 32-17. Playing its first game since May 1, Kennesaw State is 22-25.

Georgia State continues to rank among the nation's top five in batting average (.322, 3rd), hits (574, 2nd), runs (387, 3rd), runs per game (7.9, 5th) and doubles (121, 3rd). The Panthers are 10th nationally in slugging (.463) and 11th in on-base percentage (.408).

GSU shortstop Chad Prain, named to the Brooks Wallace Shortstop of the Year Award Watch List, is enjoying one of the top offensive seasons in the nation, ranking third in the NCAA in hits (80) and seventh in batting average (.410). He also has 44 RBI and 14 stolen bases, and the GSU shortstop helps the Panthers rank in the top 15 in the nation in double plays.

Freshman center fielder Josh Merrigan, a three-time CAA Rookie of the Week and a strong candidate for Freshman All-America honors, leads all conference freshmen in batting average (.357), hits (74), runs scored (46), RBI (34), total bases (105) and stolen bases (11). **Among all freshmen in the nation, Merrigan is second in hits and third in batting average and runs scored. With 74 hits, he ranks 10th nationally among all players.**

Junior outfielder-designated hitter Chase Raffield leads the Panthers with nine home runs and 46 RBI, ranking third in the CAA homers and fourth in RBI.

Freshman right-hander Brantley Burton (0-0) will make his first start on the mound, becoming the fourth different rookie pitcher to get a starting nod this season. Freshman righty Jordan Hillyer (1-2) will start for Kennesaw State.

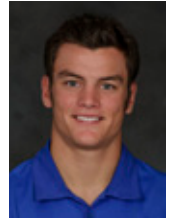
ANOTHER 30-WIN SEASON: With a 32-17 record and seven games remaining, Georgia State is putting together one of the top records in school history, including a fifth winning season in the last six seasons under head coach Greg Frady.

THE SERIES WITH KENNESAW STATE:

Kennesaw State holds a 10-8 lead in the series with Georgia State, but the Panthers have won the first two meetings this season, 12-5 and 3-2 in 10 innings.

GSU 12, KSU 5 (April 9 at GSU): Nic Wilson homered and drove in four runs for the Panthers, who broke open a 6-5 game with six runs in the eighth inning. Caden Bailey added three RBI, Josh Merrigan went 4-for-5, and Chad Prain contributed three hits and two RBI. Four GSU relievers combined to limit the Owls to two runs over the final 7-2/3 innings.

GSU 3, KSU2, 10 innings (April 16 at KSU): Greg Bowder singled home the winning run in the top of the 10th inning. Georgia State tied the game in the top of the ninth when Chad Prain slid home safely, scoring from second base on an error on the shortstop.

Last season, the two teams played a weekend series. Kennesaw State won the Friday night game at GSU, 11-5 in 10 innings, and then earned one-run victories on Saturday and Sunday at Kennesaw, 5-4 and 7-6.

The two schools played eight times from 1984-92. Then the series resumed in 2009, and since then, six of the 10 games have been decided by one run or in extra innings.

These three games are among the eight contests on the Panthers' schedule against in-state rivals. Georgia State has defeated Georgia, lost at Georgia Tech, split a home-and-home with Mercer and defeated Savannah State for a 5-2 record against in-state teams.

SEVEN ROOKIE WINNERS IN 11 WEEKS:

Illustrating the talent and impact of Georgia State's freshman class, the Panthers have had the Colonial Athletic Association Rookie of the Week winner seven times in the first 11 weeks of the season, including four in a row.

Center fielder Josh Merrigan leads the way with three awards, while starting pitcher Garrett Ford has two. Matt Rose, an infielder and closer, and starting pitcher Nathan Bates have also been honored.

Merrigan, Rose and catcher Joey Roach regularly start in the field, and on the mound, Bates and Ford start on Friday and Saturday, respectively, and Rose has become the closer.

The trio of Merrigan, Rose and Roach have

combined for nearly 450 at-bats, a .313 batting average, seven homers, 77 RBI and 91 runs scored.

On the mound, Ford, Bates and Rose have logged more than 135 innings, posting a 3.72 ERA, seven wins and five saves.

PRAIN NAMED TO BROOKS WALLACE AWARD WATCH LIST: Junior shortstop Chad Prain, enjoying one of the top offensive seasons in the nation, was named last week to the Brooks Wallace Shortstop of the Year Award watch list. The Valdosta, Ga., native is batting .410, ranking third in the NCAA in hits (80) and in batting average. He also ranks among the national leaders with 44 RBI, despite generally batting in the leadoff or number two spot. He has three homers, 15 doubles and one triple, along with 14 stolen bases.

Prain had a hitting streak of 20 games, two shy of the school record, and he also had a streak of reaching base in 37 straight games. He has 26 multi-hit games.

Prain's value to the Panthers was in full evidence as he figured prominently in a pair of extra-inning victories at New Orleans (April 12-13). On Friday, he hit a solo home run, his second of the season, in the top of the 12th inning to give GSU the 4-3 victory. On Saturday, the Panthers trailed 5-4 with two outs in the top of the ninth inning and were down to their last strike when Prain was hit by an 0-2 pitch with bases loaded to bring home the tying run. In the top of the 11th, he was at the plate when the go-ahead run came home on a wild pitch in the 6-5 victory.

MERRIGAN RANKS AMONG NATION'S TOP FRESHMEN: Georgia State center fielder Josh Merrigan is a strong candidate for the CAA Rookie of the Year Award as well as Freshman All-America honors.

For the season, Merrigan is batting .357 with three homers, 34 RBI and 46 runs scored. He is 11-for-11 on stolen bases. **In the last two weekend series, he has homered in one-run victories for Georgia State.**

He leads all conference freshmen in batting average, hits, runs, RBI, total bases and stolen bases while ranking third overall in hits and fifth overall in runs scored.

Merrigan ranks third among all freshmen in the nation in batting average and runs scored and second in hits. His 74 hits rank 10th in the NCAA among all players.

PANTHERS PITCH THEIR WAY TO CAA SERIES WIN AT NORTHEASTERN:

After falling 6-5 in 13-innings on Friday (Apr. 26), Georgia State came back to win its CAA road series at Northeastern with a 6-0 shutout on Saturday, followed by a 2-1 victory Sunday. The Panthers allowed just two earned runs in the series, which covered 30-1/3 innings, for an ERA of 0.59. Both earned runs scored in Friday's loss, and then the GSU staff allowed just one unearned run over the next 18 innings on Saturday and Sunday.

Freshman Garrett Ford tossed eight shutout innings and teamed with Jerry Stuckey for a combined shutout on Saturday, and junior Andrew Fessler tossed a complete-game, five-hitter with a career-high eight strikeouts in Sunday's 2-1 victory.

FORD IS GSU'S LATEST CAA ROOKIE OF THE WEEK HONOREE:

Georgia State's freshman pitcher Garrett Ford was named Colonial Athletic Association Rookie of the Week on April 29, his second award of the season.

The rookie left-hander from Loganville, Ga., threw eight scoreless innings in a combined shutout of Northeastern. Ford allowed just four hits and walked none while striking out four in eight innings. He needed just 95 pitches to record 24 outs.

Ford earned his first Rookie Award on Mar. 18 after he took a shutout into the ninth inning to lead the Panthers to a 12-3 victory over George Mason. Over the first eight innings, he allowed no runs on seven hits with two walks and one strikeout. With GSU leading 12-0 and the bullpen depleted after Friday's 14-13 game, he started the ninth inning and allowed three runs before giving way to the bullpen. His final line included 8.1 innings, three runs, nine hits, three walks and one strikeout.

Ford has been the Panthers' Saturday starter all season, posting a 4-3 record with a 5.03 ERA in a team-leading 68.0 innings.

THISCLOSE: Over the last 15 games Georgia State has played nine one-run games and five extra-inning games.

One seven-game stretch from April 12-20 featured six one-run games and four extra-inning contests as the Panthers played 72 innings in nine days.

In two of the three extra-inning wins, the Panthers were down to their last out. At New Orleans (Apr. 13), GSU trailed 5-4 in the top of the ninth and had the bases loaded with two outs when Chad Prain fell behind 0-2 but fouled off several pitches before he was hit by a pitch to bring home the tying run. At Kennesaw State (Apr. 16), Prain scored the tying run on an error with two outs in the top of the ninth.

PANTHERS WIN 16 OF LAST 20:

Georgia State has won 16 of its last 20 games. Included in this stretch is an eight-game winning streak from April 5-13 that equalled the second-longest winning streak in school

history. The GSU record is 11 in a row by the 2011 squad. The Panthers also won eight in a row in 2000, 2008 and 2009.

PANTHERS ON THE OFFENSIVE:

Georgia State features one of the nation's most productive offenses. GSU ranks among the nation's top five in batting average (.322, 3rd), hits (574, 2nd), runs (387, 3rd), doubles (121, 3rd) and runs per game (7.8, 5th). The Panthers are 10th nationally in slugging (.463) and 11th in on-base percentage (.408).

Junior shortstop Chad Prain leads the way with an eye-catching .410 batting average that is seventh in the nation, followed by freshman center fielder Josh Merrigan at .357.

In 2010, Georgia State led the nation in runs scored with 10.5 per game and ranked third with a .355 batting average.

ROSE TAKES ON DUAL ROLE: After playing primarily as an infielder for the first half of the season, freshman Matt Rose now has begun to see more time on the mound, closing games for the Panthers.

The 6-3 right-hander (1-2) has five saves and a 1.21 ERA in 14 appearances. In his last nine appearances (all since April 7), Rose has four saves and one win and has allowed just one earned run.

Rose also plays first base or third base and is batting .261 with two homers and 25 RBI.

MERRIGAN IS THREE-TIME CAA ROOKIE OF THE WEEK:

Georgia State freshman Josh Merrigan captured his third Colonial Athletic Association Rookie of the Week honor on Apr. 22. The center fielder from Marietta, Ga., and Walton High School batted .333 with two RBI and three runs scored in four games on the week.

Merrigan earned his first CAA Rookie honor of Feb. 18 after began his GSU career by hitting .636 (7-for-11) in the opening series against Butler. He drove in six runs and scored six more and also walked twice and went two-for-two on stolen bases. The left-handed hitter accomplished this while facing left-handed starting pitchers for the Bulldogs each game.

Merrigan batted .364 with one home run and three RBI in a three-game sweep of Old Dominion to garner accolades for the second time on Mar. 18.

THE THRILL OF THE CHASE:

Junior Chase Raffield is putting up productive power numbers for the Panthers. The left-handed hitting outfielder-DH leads the team with nine home runs, 16 doubles, 46 RBI and a .621 slugging percentage. He is batting .354, and he ranks third in the CAA in homers, fourth in RBI and fifth in slugging.

SARRATT NAMED ACADEMIC

ALL-DISTRICT: Georgia State catcher Scott Sarratt was named Thursday to the Capital One Academic All-District IV baseball team, announced by the College Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA).

A senior from Statesboro, Ga., Sarratt batted .326 with one home run and 20 runs batted in through 30 games before he suffered a season-ending hand injury at James Madison on April 20.

The chemistry major maintains a 3.54 grade point average. He is now eligible for the Capital One Academic All-America team. Earlier this season, Sarratt was named to the watch list for the 2013 Johnny Bench Award as the nation's top catcher, and on March 4, he was selected Colonial Athletic Association Player of the Week.

In two seasons with the Panthers, Sarratt compiled a career batting average of .309 with four homers and 41 RBI in 69 games. He is an outstanding defender who threw out 34 of 58 runners attempting to steal while posting a career field percentage of .983.

MERRIGAN SETS GSU FRESHMAN RECORDS:

Enjoying an outstanding rookie season, freshman center fielder Josh Merrigan is beginning to make his mark in the Georgia State record book. Now with 70 hits on the season, he has easily surpassed the previous high for a GSU freshman, 57 hits by current volunteer assistant Bradley Logan in 2007 and former outfielder Jay Langston in 1997.

Merrigan has scored 46 runs on the season to break that GSU freshman mark (44 by Jay Langston in 1997).

BATES FANS 11 TO EARN CAA ROOKIE OF THE WEEK:

Pitcher Nathan Bates was named CAA Baseball Rookie of the Week on Apr. 15, one of four different Panthers to earn the award a total of six times this season. The 6-7 right-hander from Senoia, Ga., recorded a career-high 11 strikeouts in a nine-inning start at New Orleans. Although he was not credited with the win in the 12-inning game, he helped the Panthers to a 4-3 victory.

Bates allowed just five hits and one earned run (three runs overall) before giving way to the bullpen after nine innings. He retired the final 13 batters he faced and 17 of the last 18.

His 11 strikeouts are the most for a GSU pitcher since Justin Malone fanned 11 in a complete-game victory over George Mason on May 21, 2011.

Bates has a 2-1 record and a 2.83 ERA on the season.

ROSE GRABS ONE OF GSU'S SIX ROOKIE OF THE WEEK AWARDS:

Georgia State freshman Matt Rose shined at the plate and on the mound to help the Panthers to a sweep of Fordham and was named CAA Rookie of the Week on Apr. 8.

Playing first and third base, the Melbourne, Fla., native batted .400 (4-for-10) with four RBI in three games, and also earned a save on the mound.

Rose is one of four Georgia State freshman who have been named CAA Rookie of the Week a total of five times this season, joining outfielder Josh Merrigan, a two-time selection, and starting pitchers Garrett Ford and Nathan Bates.

OUCH!: Georgia State batters have set a new school record for times hit by a pitch. Panthers have been plunked 72 times in 49 games this season, surpassing the previous record of 70, set in 2008 (56 games).

Chad Prain leads the way with 13, three shy of the individual school record of 16, held by current Director of Operations Nick Hogan (2008) and T.J. Brandenburg (2006). Caden Bailey has been hit 10 times, and Chase Raffield and Mark Hogan eight times each.

SQUEGLIA CLIMBS GSU VICTORIES

LIST: After missing the 2012 season with an arm injury, senior pitcher Nick Squeglia returned to the GSU staff in 2013. The right-hander from Lawrenceville, Ga., earned his first victory in nearly two year against Alabama A&M, when he took a no-hitter into the sixth inning. Squeglia finished with one hit allowed and a career-high eight strikeouts in six scoreless innings.

Squeglia has added wins over UNC Asheville, Alabama State and Savannah State to run his career record to 15-6, good for seventh place in GSU history in all-time wins.

WALK-OFF HEROICS: Georgia State trailed Old Dominion, 10-1, in the sixth inning before rallying for a 12-10 victory (Mar. 16), capped by a walk-off homer by Chase Raffield. The Panthers scored two in the sixth, two in the seventh and three in the eighth to pull within 10-8. In the ninth, Nic Wilson hit a solo homer with one out to make the score 10-9. With two outs, Greg Bowder drew a walk, moved to second on a passed ball and then scored the tying run on Garitt Church's infield single and an ensuing wild throw. With the game tied, Raffield belted his two-run, walk-off home run.

Ironically, this dramatic comeback came one year to the day after the Panthers scored 11 runs in the bottom of the ninth inning - 10 of them with two outs - to turn a 10-run deficit into a 13-12 victory over Northeastern on March 16, 2012.

Raffield's blast was Georgia State's second walk-off homer in three games as Caden Bailey led off the bottom of the ninth inning with a solo homer to break a 7-7 tie and lift the Panthers past George Mason, 8-7, on Mar. 10.

WALK-OFF FOR BAILEY PUNCTUATES HITTING STREAK:

Sophomore infielder Caden Bailey's first career home run was a memorable one. With GSU and George Mason tied at 7-7, Bailey led off the bottom of the ninth inning and belted the 1-0 pitch over the left field fence for the series-clinching, walk-off victory.

Earlier in the game, Bailey delivered a two-run single to help the Panthers rally from a 6-0 deficit. That hit also extended his hitting streak to 19 games, dating back to the final three games of 2012. One game later, his streak was snapped at 19, which goes down as the fourth-longest in school history. The GSU record for longest hitting streak is 22 games by current volunteer coach Bradley Logan in 2008. Two Panthers had 21-game streaks in 2004 in Justin Newman and Tim Burgess.

SARRATT TABBED TO BENCH AWARD WATCH LIST:

Georgia State catcher Scott Sarratt was named to the initial watch list for the 2013 Johnny Bench Award presented by BaseballSaving.com, the Greater Wichita Area Sports Commission announced Mar. 11.

Sarratt, a senior from Statesboro, Ga., is one of 48 catchers named to the watch for the award given annually to the top Division I collegiate catcher.

The Panthers' backstop is enjoying an outstanding season, batting .326 with one home run and 20 runs batted in.

SARRATT NAMED CAA PLAYER OF THE WEEK:

Senior catcher Scott Sarratt was named CAA Player of the Week on March 4 after the senior backstop batted .500 for the week to lead the Panthers to three wins in four games against SEC and ACC foes.

In GSU's 10-7 victory over Georgia, Sarratt doubled to lead off the second inning and then came around to score the Panthers' first run. In the Panthers' decisive four-run rally in the fifth inning, Sarratt delivered an RBI-single to bring in the first run of the inning and then scored on Chris Triplett's go-ahead home run.

On Friday, the Statesboro, Ga., native drove in two runs in Georgia State's 5-4, come-from-behind victory over Boston College. In the

sixth inning, his RBI single pulled GSU within 4-2, and then in the seventh, he doubled off the wall to bring home the go-ahead run. In Sunday's series clinching win over BC, he contributed a two-out, two-run single that put GSU ahead 5-2 in game the Panthers would eventually win, 7-6.

FRADY REACHES 200-WIN MILESTONE:

Georgia State's 7-6 win over Boston College on March 3 was the 200th victory at Georgia State for head coach Greg Frady, now in his seventh season at the helm. He ranks second in career victories by a GSU head coach with 225, trailing only Mike Hurst, who won 293 games in 13-plus seasons. Frady's winning percentage of .571 is the best mark in school history.

Frady added another milestone against Fordham on April 7 with his 400th victory as collegiate head coach, including 187 wins in six seasons as the head coach at North Florida Community College.

Frady has led the Panthers to five winning seasons in his seven years, highlighted by a school-record 39 victories, conference title and NCAA berth in 2009. Prior to his arrival, the Panther program had achieved just two winning seasons ever and had never won more than 31 games in any year.

WHAT A WEEK: Georgia State enjoyed one of the more memorable weeks in school history by winning three out of four games against SEC and ACC foes in a six-day span from Feb. 26 through Mar. 3.

The Panthers began the week with a 10-7 win over Georgia, for the program's first victory over the Bulldogs since 2001.

Then GSU took two out of three from Boston College at Al Lang Stadium in St. Petersburg, Fla. The Panthers earned one-run victories over Boston College on Friday (5-4) and Sunday (7-6). The Eagles won the middle game, 2-0.

ROUND-TRIPPERS FOR TRIPLETT:

Outfielder Chris Triplett has four home runs on the season, including two in a week that propelled the Panthers to huge wins over Georgia and Boston College.

The junior from Fayetteville, Ga. (Sandy Creek HS) belted a two-run homer in the fifth inning against Georgia that put the Panthers ahead 8-7 en route to the 10-7 win.

Three games later against Boston College, he hit another two-run blast in the third inning to give GSU a 3-2 lead in a game the Panthers eventually won, 7-6.

Triplett's fourth homer came on May 5 in a n 8-3 victory over Towson.

PANTHERS RALLY FOR 10-7 WIN

OVER GEORGIA: Chris Triplett's two-run home run in the fifth inning put Georgia State ahead and sent the Panthers to a 10-7 victory over Georgia Feb. 26 at the GSU Baseball Complex for GSU's first win over the Bulldogs since 2001. Georgia State rallied from deficits of 3-0, 4-1 and 7-4 to snap a 12-game losing streak to the Bulldogs. After Triplett's blast put the Panthers ahead, 8-7, senior Greg Bowder delivered a two-run, pinch-hit single for key insurance runs, and relievers Jerry Stuckey and Matt Rose shut down the Bulldogs over the final five innings.

MAKE YOUR MOVE:

The 2013 campaign marks Georgia State's final season in the Colonial Athletic Association as the Panthers officially join the Sun Belt Conference in all sports on July 1, 2013.

GSU was a charter member of the Sun Belt Conference in 1976 and competed in the league in baseball from 1979-82. In 1984, Panther baseball began competing in the Trans America Athletic Conference (TAAC), later renamed the Atlantic Sun Conference. The Panthers then moved to the Colonial Athletic Association for the 2006 season.

TWO PANTHERS PREVIOUSLY

DRAFTED: Two current Panthers have previously been drafted by Major League teams. Freshman pitcher-infielder Matt Rose was selected by the Toronto Blue Jays in the 24th round of the 2012 Draft. Junior outfielder Chris Triplett was selected in the 47th round of the 2010 Draft by the Detroit Tigers.

PEACH STATE PRODUCTS:

Relying heavily on the its talent-rich home state, the Georgia State roster features 21 of 28 players from Georgia, 17 of those from the metropolitan Atlanta area.

The remaining seven Panthers hail from Florida (4), North Carolina (2) and Wisconsin.

FRADY COACHES GERMAN

NATIONAL TEAM: Along with his duties at Georgia State, Greg Frady serves as the coach of the German National Team. He has won more than 100 games in international competition and was named European Coach of the Year in 2010.

Most recently, Frady guided Germany to a fourth-place finish at the 2012 European Championships and to the finals of the World Baseball Classic Qualifier. That squad featured former Panthers B.J. Roper-Hubbart, Aeden McQueary-Ennis and Eric Suttle.

IT'S ACADEMIC: The Georgia State baseball program achieved a team grade point average of 3.02 for the fall 2012 semester. Sixteen team members earned academic honors.

TWO-SPORT STAR: Senior outfielder Mark Hogan is concentrating on baseball this spring after playing three seasons at line-backer for the Georgia State football team. He is the Panthers' career leader in tackles with 157, and he was named to the 2012 Capital

One Academic All-District first team.

Hogan enrolled at Georgia State in 2009 as the first scholarship player for GSU's startup football program, which played its first season in the fall of 2010.

Last spring, Hogan joined the baseball team, playing the sport for the first time since he was a senior at Lincoln-Sudbury High in Massachusetts in 2008. Still, he hit .319 in 42 games while juggling baseball and spring football practice.
