### GET READY FOR THE GAME...

- Georgia State and Arkansas State will meet for the first of two regular season meetings on Monday night in the 14th meeting all-time between the two programs.
- Georgia State enters play in a tie for second-place in the Sun Belt Conference standings at 3-1, one game back of 4-0 Little Rock and tied with Georgia Southern and Appalachian State.
- Georgia State remains the top team in the Sun Belt Conference in the latest NET Rankings sitting at No. 110 as of Sunday morning.
- Since returning to the Sun Belt in 2013-14, Georgia State has finished in the top two of the final regular season conference standings five times in six seasons.
- GSU is 81-35 in Sun Belt Conference regular season games since rejoining the league in 2013-14.
- Georgia State saw its eight-game conference game winning streak snapped on Saturday at Coastal.
- Despite trailing by 10 points with two minutes to play, Georgia State nearly pulled off a remarkable comeback before falling 74-72 to the Chanticleers.
- Georgia State's 10-5 start is the fifth-best start in program history. It marks the second-straight season the Panthers have recorded at least won 10 wins in their first 15 games.
- As the decade came to an end, the Panthers finished the 10 year stretch winning 197 games during the 2010's. The previous best decade was the 2000's when Georgia State won 158.
- GSU has won 12-straight home games dating back to last season and 20 of their last 21 home contests. The streak is currently the fourth-longest in program history and tied for the 18th-longest in the nation.
- Georgia State is currently ranked No. 5 in the country and No. 1 in the Sun Belt Conference allowing opponents to shoot just 25.5 percent from 3-point range. GSU also ranks No. 34 in the country as opponents are shooting just 38.5 percent from the floor.
- GSU is shooting 38.2 percent from 3-point range which ranks No. 25 in the NCAA and No. 2 in the league.
- Georgia State is currently forcing 17.80 turnovers per contest, the 21st-best mark in the NCAA.
- Junior Kane Williams, who was named Tournament MVP of the 2K Empire Classic and to the All-Sun Belt Preseason Second Team is averaging 13.5 points, 4.1 rebounds, and 4.6 assists per game.
- Justin Roberts was named to the 2K Empire Classic All-Tournament Team and is currently averaging 2.13 steals per game, No. 41 in the country. He already has three games this season where he recorded five swipes.
- As a team, GSU is swiping 9.8 steals per game, ranked No. 11 in the NCAA.
- GSU has won more games (144) than any other Division I team in Georgia since the start of the 2013-14 season.
- Kane Williams is one of just nine active juniors in the country to have won conference tournaments in each of their first two years and appeared in NCAA Tournament games.

**MAY THE FOURTH BE WITH YOU**

Since joining the Sun Belt six years ago, Georgia State has won three conference regular season titles, finished as a regular season runner-up twice, advanced to four conference tournament finals, and won three tournament titles in New Orleans. The Panthers go for a fourth tournament title this year.

Over the six-plus year stretch, the Panthers are 81-35 in Sun Belt Conference regular season games. The 81 wins are the most in the league during that time. **GSU has finished in the top two in the Sun Belt Conference regular season standings five times in the last six years.**

**HOME SWEET HOME**

Since the start of the 2011-12 season, Georgia State is 100-21 in the comfy confines of the GSU Sports Arena.

The Panthers have gone 78-11 at home the last five-plus seasons, including a 13-1 mark at home last year and 6-0 mark this season. During that span, Georgia State put together an 18-game winning streak which ranks second-longest in school history. **The Panthers are currently on a 12-game home court winning streak which is the fourth-longest in program history and currently ranks No. 18 in the country.**

**TONIGHT'S OPPONENT**

Georgia State and Arkansas State will meet for the 15th time on Monday with the Panthers holding a 10-3 lead in the series.

The Panthers have won three-straight meetings in the series including the last time in Jonesboro, 77-66.

Last year Georgia State earned a 76-60 win over Arkansas State in the GSU Sports Arena.

Jeff Thomas led five players in double figures for Georgia State with 15 points, knocking down five 3-pointers. The Panthers hit 14 3-pointers for the game, connecting on 46.7 percent from long range.

D'Marcus Simonds scored 14 points, while Devin Mitchell scored 13 points including four 3-pointers.

Ty Cockfield led all scorers with 20 points for Arkansas State. Grantham Gillard chipped in nine points and seven rebounds.

**LAST TIME OUT**

Despite trailing by 10 points with two minutes to play, Georgia State nearly pulled off a remarkable comeback before falling to Coastal Carolina 74-72 at the HTC Center.

Coastal Carolina used a pair of late second-half runs to go ahead 68-58 with two minutes to play before GSU mounted a furious comeback that came up just short.

Freshman Joe Jones III just missed a double-double for the Panthers with nine points and 10 rebounds. Redshirt-sophomore Justin Roberts led Georgia State with 16 points and added seven rebounds while junior Kane Williams also just missed a double-double with 11 points and seven assists. Sophomore Nelson Phillips scored nine points and swiped a career-high six steals.

The Chanticleers were led by DeVante Jones who scored 23 points and swiped five steals, while Tommy Burton finished with a double-double of 10 points and 10 rebounds.

**#WE-RUN-THIS-STATE**

If it wasn't enough that Georgia State has more wins (144) than any other NCAA Division I program in the state of Georgia since the start of the 2013-14 (see below for details), the Panthers have also beaten everyone in the state since that time.

Since the start of the 2013-14 season, Georgia State has knocked off Mercer each of the last two seasons (along with Georgia, Kennesaw State, and Georgia Southern last year). The Panthers even took an exhibition game with Georgia Tech two seasons ago.

**BEST OF THE PEACH STATE**

Since the start of the 2013-14 season, Georgia State has been the best program in the state of Georgia. A total of six Division I programs reside in the Peach State. Just check out the records, the numbers do not lie. (Thru Saturday, Jan. 4)

**RECORD-SETTING OPENING NIGHT**

Georgia State's 69-point win over Brewton-Parker on opening night was the largest margin of victory in program history, trumping a 60-point win against Tennessee Temple on Nov. 14, 2014.

The 35 points allowed to the Barons was the third-fewest allowed in program history. The only two better performances came against Howard (33 pts./11-21-09) and William & Mary (34/12-3-11).

**A TREND BROKEN**

New head coach Rob Lanier broke a strange trend for new Panther head coaches in his debut. Lanier became the first Panther head coach to win their GSU debut since the 1981-82 season when Jim Jarrett defeated Oglethorpe. The following seven head coaches all lost their debuts, though several went on to have successful stints with the Panthers including Bob Reinhart, Charles "Lefty" Driesell and Ron Hunter.

**WE ARE THE CHAMPIONS**

With two impressive victories in California, Georgia State won the Riverside Regional of the 2K Classic benefiting Wounded Warrior Project. The Panthers defeated 2019 NCAA Tournament team Prairie View A&M 83-74 to open the event on Nov. 22. A night later, trailing by 14 with under 13 minutes to play, Georgia State rallied for a 69-60 win over host California Baptist. The Panthers lead the Lancers without a field goal for the final 7:32, giving up just four made free throws.

Kane Williams was named the Tournament MVP, while red-Justin Roberts earned All-Tournament recognition.

**TOURNAMENT SUCCESS**

For the eighth time in the last nine years, Georgia State competed in an in-season tournament, this year competing in the with the eight-team 2K Empire Classic benefiting Wounded Warrior Project. The Panthers are a game over .500 in those events. This year Georgia State faced then No. 2 Duke, Georgetown, Prairie View A&M, and California Baptist.

**PRESEASON HONORS**

After earning Sun Belt Conference All-Tournament recognition as a sophomore, junior Kane Williams earned All-Sun Belt Preseason Second Team recognition to begin the season. This season Williams is averaging 13.7 points, 4.4 assists, and 4.2 rebounds per game while shooting 44.9 percent from 3-point range.

**DOUBLE YOUR PLEASURE**

Georgia State junior Josh Linder has already recorded two double-doubles this season. He picked up his first double-double of the season recording career-highs with 19 points and 12 rebounds at College of Charleston. He then finished with 17 points and 11 rebounds at Georgetown



**LUCKY 7'S**

Georgia State finished last year with a winning record in six consecutive seasons and will try to make it seven this year. It marks the first time in the 56-year history of the program that GSU has garnered a winning record in six-straight seasons.

**ON TO THE PROS**

The list of former Georgia State players going on to play professional seems to grow exponentially each year.

Four years ago, R.J. Hunter was selected with the 28th pick in the first round of the NBA Draft by the Boston Celtics. After multiple stops with NBA teams and in the G-League, he is now playing overseas in Turkey.

Of the four seniors to finish up last year, one is currently on a G-League rosters (Malik Benlevi - Salt Lake City), while another (Jeff Thomas - Wisconsin) was just cut, Jordan Tyson was playing overseas in October before an injury sidelined him for a couple weeks. Former Panther Curtis Washington has also signed to play in the G-League this year.

Here is a list of others still playing overseas: Jeremy Hollowell/Israel, Eric Buckner/France, Willie Clayton/Uruguay, Ousman Krubally/France, Leroy Davis/Mexico, Isaiah Williams/Ukraine, and Manny Atkins/France.

**SEEN WORLDWIDE**

For the fifth-straight year, all Georgia State home games will air live on the ESPN family of networks which this season includes ESPN+. With the program's rise, all 31 games this season will be able to be viewed either via linear package or digitally.

Among the highlights were the games at Duke (ACC Network) and at Georgetown (FS1). The Panthers had three games air on FloHoops (College of Charleston and both games of the 2K Empire Classic benefiting Wounded Warrior Project in California).

**763 AND COUNTING**

Georgia State has made at least one 3-point field goal in 763 straight games, dating back to the 1994-95 season. The last team to hold the Panthers without a trey was Stetson on Feb. 18, 1995. The streak is among the top 25 in the country.

**NEXT UP**

Georgia State will return home to face Louisiana on Thursday night at the GSU Sports Arena. Tip is set for 7 p.m. and can be seen on ESPN+ as well as heard on WRAS-FM 88.5.

**THE VOICE OF THE PANTHERS**

Dave Cohen, the Voice of the Panthers, entered his 37th year calling Georgia State basketball during the 2019-20 season. Cohen has only missed about 15 games during that time and most were due to scheduling conflicts calling Georgia State football games. He is tied for the 18th longest streak in the country of active Division I Men's Basketball Play-by-Play Announcers.

## HEAD COACH ROB LANIER

Georgia State named Tennessee Associate Head Coach Rob Lanier as the Panthers next men's basketball head coach on April 5, 2019.

Lanier spent the last four seasons as associate head coach at Tennessee. The Volunteers finished the 2018-19 season 31-6, advancing to the Sweet 16 of the NCAA Tournament. The season included a win over the No. 1 team in the nation and a No. 1 national ranking for the Volunteers.

In addition to boasting four years of Division I head coaching experience at Siena, the 51-year-old Lanier also has coached in the Big 12, SEC, ACC, Big East, Atlantic 10 and MAAC. He has worked on the bench for 11 teams that advanced to NCAA Tournament play.

Immediately prior to his hiring at Tennessee in April 2015, Lanier served four seasons for Rick Barnes as the associate head coach at Texas from 2011-15. It was Lanier's second stint on Barnes' staff in Austin.

In total, Lanier has played a role in signing nine McDonald's All-Americans, and 11 players that he either signed or coached have gone on to become NBA Draft Picks.

Before returning to Texas, Lanier served as assistant coach under Billy Donovan at Florida for four seasons. In those four years, Lanier helped the Gators advance to postseason play every year while posting a 99-44 (.692) cumulative record.

Lanier's tenure at Florida was preceded by a two-year stint as an assistant coach on Dave Leitao's coaching staff at Virginia. During his second year in Charlottesville (2006-07), the Cavaliers posted a 21-11 record and advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament. Despite being picked to finish eighth in the conference, Virginia registered an 11-5 mark in league play and claimed a share of the ACC regular-season championship with North Carolina. It marked the first league title for the Cavaliers since 1994-95.

Lanier spent four years as the head coach at Siena from 2001-05. During that span, the Saints advanced to one NCAA Tournament and one NIT.

Siena won the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference Tournament Championship in 2002 and then defeated Alcorn State in an NCAA Tournament opening-round game before losing to eventual national champion Maryland in the first round. During the 2002-03 campaign, Lanier guided Siena to a 21-11 record and a third-place MAAC finish with a 12-6 league mark before advancing to the NIT.

Prior to becoming the head coach at Siena, Lanier worked alongside Barnes as an assistant coach at Texas for two seasons from 1999-2001. During that first stint in Austin, the Longhorns recorded a two-year mark of 49-18 (.731) and advanced to a pair of NCAA Tournaments.

Prior to Lanier's departure to take over the program at Siena, he played a major role in the recruitment of T.J. Ford, who went on to earn National Player of the Year honors with the Longhorns in 2002-03.

Lanier served as an assistant coach at Rutgers University for two seasons from 1997-99.

Lanier's first full-time collegiate coaching experience came at his alma mater, St. Bonaventure, from 1992-97. Prior to that, he broke into the college coaching ranks as a graduate assistant and then a restricted-earnings assistant coach at Niagara from 1990-92.

A native of Buffalo, N.Y., Lanier graduated from St. Bonaventure in 1990 with a bachelor's degree in psychology. A four-year letterman with the Bonnies who scored 868 career points, he was a three-year starter and team captain during his senior season. Lanier earned Atlantic 10 Conference All-Freshman Team honors in 1986-87 and was named the team's Most Improved Player in 1988-89. A two-time scholar-athlete nominee, he went on to earn a master's degree in educational counseling from Niagara in 1993.

Born July 24, 1968, Lanier and his wife, Dr. Dayo Lanier, have a son, Emory, and a daughter, Kai.

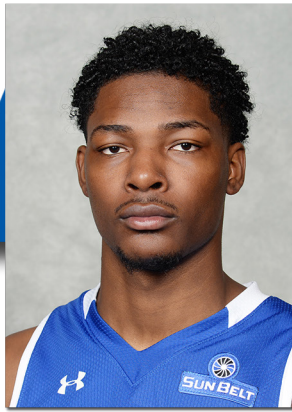

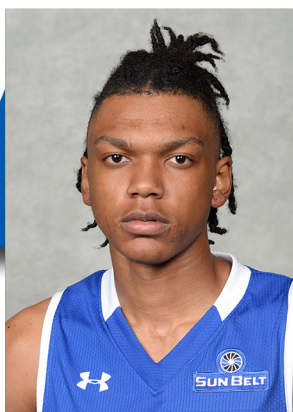

**GEORGIA STATE 104, BREWTON-PARKER 35**

GSU Sports Arena • Atlanta, Ga.

Senior Damon Wilson scored a career-high 22 points and Georgia State cruised to a record-setting 104-35 win over Brewton-Parker on in head coach Rob Lanier's debut for the Panthers.

Georgia State's (1-0) 69-point win was the largest margin of victory and the 35 points allowed was the third-fewest allowed in program history.

Wilson went 8-of-10 from the floor and 4-of-4 from 3-point range while pulling down seven rebounds. He finished as one of five Panthers in double figures as sophomore Nelson Phillips added 17 points and five rebounds while redshirt-junior Corey Allen added 15 points in his GSU debut.

Junior Kane Williams finished with 14 points including four 3-pointers to go along with six assists, while sophomore Kavonte Ivory came off the bench to score a career-high 13 points and seven rebounds. Ivory's previous career-high was four points.

Lanier became the first Georgia State head coach to win his debut since Jim Jarrett at the start of the 1981-82 season. The previous seven head coaches lost their debuts on the Panther sideline.

Georgia State held Brewton-Parker (3-1) to just 22.0 percent shooting including 3-of-27 from 3-point range. The Panthers forced the Barons into 29 turnovers which led to 45 points.

Four minutes into the game the Panthers took an early 10-2 lead forcing the Barons into four turnovers in just the first four minutes.

Using a 15-0 run, Georgia State pushed the lead to 19-2 with 14:01 to play in the first half. The Panthers kept their foot on the peddle and on a Williams 3-pointer led 22-5 seven minutes into the game, causing Brewton-Parker to call its first timeout.

Georgia State went into the locker room leading 50-15 after holding Brewton-Parker to just 5-of-26 shooting as the Barons turned the ball over 15 times in the first 20 minutes.

GSU kept the pressure on after the intermission going on a 25-7 run to start the half to build a 75-22 lead with 11:58 to play.

Freshman Joe Jones III, making his GSU debut, finished with seven points and nine rebounds, while another freshman, Jalen Thomas, added eight points and seven rebounds.

Georgia State finished the game shooting 50.7 percent from the floor and 14-of-28 from 3-point range.

Despite a double-double from junior Josh Linder and a career-high 22 points from redshirt-sophomore Justin Roberts, Georgia State fell to the College of Charleston 84-80 on Saturday afternoon at TD Arena.

Linder finished with career-highs of 19 points and 12 rebounds for Georgia State (1-1) which couldn't overcome 28 fouls that saw four players foul out. Roberts went 7-of-9 from the floor and 7-of-10 from the free throw line.

College of Charleston (2-0) was led by Grant Riller who scored 23 points going a perfect 14-of-14 from the free throw line, while Brevin Galloway added 19 points.

The two teams combined for 59 free throw attempts as Charleston went 24-of-29 from the line and the Panthers 23-of-30. The two former conference foes were called for four technical fouls in a game that was physical on both ends of the court.

Georgia State outrebounded Charleston 40-28, but turned the ball over 19 times which led to 27 Cougar points. The Panthers scored just 14 points off 16 College of Charleston turnovers.

After Georgia State took an early 5-2 lead, College of Charleston used an 8-0 run to take a 10-5 lead and never trailed the remainder of the first half.

Trailing 27-20, Linder scored six-straight GSU points including a pair of free throws after a double-technical was called to cut the Cougars lead to just 28-26 with 4:38 to play in the opening half.

College of Charleston went into the locker room lead 40-39 after shooting 50 percent from the floor, while the Panthers went just 2-of-9 from 3-point range.

Charleston started the second half using a 13-5 run and led 53-44 with 16:14 to play before the Panthers responded. Following a pair of free throws by Kane Williams and then a 3-pointer from Roberts, Georgia State retook the lead 62-61, the first lead for the Panthers since 5-2.

A lay-up by Williams with 5:33 to play gave Georgia State a 75-70 lead. The Panthers still led by three points on another Williams layup with 2:26 remaining, but the Cougars responded with a 7-0 run.

A 3-pointer by Nelson Phillips with 18 seconds to play cut Charleston's lead to 81-80, but the Panthers would get no closer. Phillips finished with five points and six rebounds before fouling out.

Williams finished with 13 points but went just 4-of-18 from the floor before fouling out. Redshirt-junior Corey Allen added nine points as the Panthers suffered their first loss of the season.

No. 2 Duke used a 20-4 early second half run to overcome Georgia State's late first half lead to earn a 74-63 win over the Panthers in the first game of the 2K Empire Classic benefiting Wounded Warrior Project at Cameron Indoor Stadium.

Corey Allen led Georgia State (1-2) with 20 points on 9-of-18 shooting, while junior Kane Williams added 16 points and seven assists.

The Panthers held Duke (4-0) to just 34.2 percent shooting and 7-of-28 from 3-point range but could not overcome Tre Jones who played all 40 minutes, scoring a career-high 31 points on 10-of-19 shooting, including four 3-pointers and 7-of-10 free throws. ### GEORGIA STATE 81, CHARLOTTE 78 OT

Georgia State rallied from a six-point deficit with 91 seconds to play and then topped Charlotte in overtime 81-78 on Wednesday afternoon at the GSU Sports Arena.

Redshirt-sophomore Justin Roberts knocked down two 3-pointers in the final minute and redshirt-junior Corey Allen hit two big shots with less than two minutes to play in overtime to give Georgia State (4-3) its third-straight win and eighth-straight victory at home dating back to last season.

Allen finished with a team-high 17 points, while Roberts contributed 16 points, four rebounds and three steals. Junior Kane Williams filled up the box score with 12 points, seven assists and six rebounds.

Charlotte (2-3) got a double-double from Coastal Carolina transfer Amidou Bamba who finished with 14 points and 11 rebounds, while Drew Edwards finished with 24 points.

Trailing 71-65 with 1:31 to play in regulation, senior Damon Wilson knocked down a 3-pointer to cut Charlotte's lead to just three with 1:23 remaining. After a lay-up by Bamba, Roberts knocked down back-to-back 3-pointers, the second coming with 28 seconds to play. After Jordan Shephard made one of two free throws to tie the game, a Roberts 3-pointer was just off the mark with four seconds to play sending the game into overtime.

In overtime, Charlotte took a two point lead with 2:01 to play but would not score again as Allen knocked down a 3-pointer with 1:46 to play and then made a jumper in the paint with 47 seconds left to secure the win.

With both teams shooting over 60 percent midway through the first half, Charlotte took a 22-21 lead before the Panthers used an 8-0 run to go ahead 29-22 with 7:41 to play. The Panthers pushed the lead to as many as nine before Charlotte responded with a 7-0 run to cut Georgia State's lead to 33-31 with 3:02 to play in the half.

Georgia State went into the locker room leading 38-36 and led most of the second half. After a four-point play by Wilson gave the Panthers a 58-50 lead with 8:18 to play, Charlotte cut into GSU's lead and went ahead 64-62 following an 8-0 run.

Wilson finished with 16 points for Georgia State, while freshman Jalen Thomas came off the bench to score eight points on 4-of-4 shooting, while pulling down five rebounds in a career-high 29 minutes.

Jahmir Young and Jordan Shephard each finished with nine points for Charlotte which dropped to 0-3 on the road this season.

### GEORGIA STATE 83, DARTMOUTH 80 OT

GSU Sports Arena • Atlanta, Ga.

Redshirt-junior Corey Allen scored 28 points and knocked down eight 3-pointers to lead Georgia State to an 83-80 overtime victory over Dartmouth at the GSU Sports Arena.

Georgia State (5-3) won its second overtime contest in as many games, extended its winning streak to four-straight and has now won nine-straight games at home dating back to last season, the fifth-longest streak in school history.

After scoring eight points in the first half, Allen caught fire in the second half finishing the game 10-of-20 from the floor, including 8-of-15 from 3-point range while also pulling down seven rebounds.

Dartmouth (5-3) lost for the second-straight time despite a near double-double of 23 points and nine rebounds from Chris Knight. James Foye led the Big Green with 25 points while also pulling down five rebounds.

Kane Williams once again filled up the box score finishing with 16 points, eight rebounds, and four assists. Freshman Jalen Thomas earned his first career start and finished with seven points and six rebounds in just over 22 minutes.

Dartmouth took an early 16-8 lead with 12:02 to play in the opening half as the Panthers missed 12 of their first 17 shots.

Georgia State started to heat up late in the half and on back-to-back 3-pointers by Allen and Nelson Phillips took a 22-21 lead with 5:50 to play, the Panthers first lead since being ahead 2-0.

Dartmouth hit back-to-back 3-pointers and used an 8-0 run with under two minutes to play to lead 32-26 before Georgia State scored the final five points of the half and went into the locker room trailing by just one.

Allen came out and knocked down back-to-back 3-pointers to start the second half, which was followed by a Williams 3-pointer to give the Panthers a 40-36 lead with 18:17 to play. Another 3-pointer by Williams capped an 8-0 Georgia State run to give the Panthers a 53-45 lead with 11:27 remaining after the game was tied at 45.

The Big Green immediately responded with a 7-0 run and trailed by just one with 7:28 to play before retaking the lead 57-55 with just over five minutes to play in the game.

A 3-pointer by Foye gave Dartmouth a 67-65 lead with 56 seconds to play. Thomas responded with a lay-up for the Panthers to tie the game with 36 seconds left, before Taurus Samuels made a jumper for the Big Green to go back up by two with 13 seconds remaining.

Allen's jumper from just inside the 3-point arch with 1.2 seconds to play sent the game into overtime.

### GEORGIA STATE 73, MERCER 61

Hawkins Arena • Macon, Ga.

Led by 16 points from both Damon Wilson and Corey Allen, along with stellar first half defense Georgia State earned a 73-61 win over in-state foe Mercer at Hawkins Arena.

Georgia State (6-3) pushed its winning streak to five-straight games and defeated Mercer (4-6) for the 18th time in the last 21 match-ups.

Wilson went 7-of-11 from the floor to go along with five rebounds while Allen matched the senior going 6-of-12 from the floor including three 3-pointers. Allen, in his first year playing for the Panthers, scored the 1,000th point of his career. Mercer got 14 points from both Djordje Dimitrijevic and Victor Bafutto but was held to just 35.1 percent shooting.

Mercer missed its first nine field goals before Patrick Urey was able to make a free throw as the Panthers took an early 7-0 lead.

Georgia State went ahead 13-1 before the Bears finally made their first field goal with 11:31 to play in the half. The Bears missed 16 of their first 17 shots and the Panthers took an early 20-5 lead.

Leading 22-13 Georgia State used a 6-0 run to go ahead 28-13 with 2:35 to play and went into the locker room with a 31-18 lead. The Panthers held Mercer to just 18.8 percent shooting in the first half while forcing the Bears into 10 turn-overs before the break.

Trailing by 16 early in the second half, Mercer used a 6-0 run to cut Georgia State's lead to just 10 with 16:08 to play. The Bears would get as close as seven points multiple times midway thru the second half but could get no closer.

A steal and fast break lay-up by Allen with 6:08 to play gave the Panthers a 60-49 lead and the 1000th point of his career.

Georgia State went back ahead by double figures with 4:18 to play and Mercer was never able to get closer than 10 points again.

Junior Kane Williams added 12 points and five rebounds for the Panthers, while redshirt-sophomore Justin Roberts finished with 13 points and six assists.

Freshman Joe Jones III came off the bench to score eight points and pulled down three rebounds for the Panthers which shot 47.4 percent from the floor and 9-of-18 from 3-point range.

Ethan Stair just missed a double-double for Mercer finished with 13 points and eight rebounds playing all 40 minutes.

**GEORGIA STATE 83, UT ARLINGTON 77**

Coming off a stretch of 12 days without a game, four Panthers scored in double figures as Georgia State earned an 83-77 win over UT Arlington to open defense of its back-to-back Sun Belt Conference titles at the GSU Sports Arena.

Senior Damon Wilson tied a career-high with 22 points and six rebounds, while junior Kane Williams just missed a double-double with 17 points and nine boards. Freshman Jalen Thomas made his third-straight start and scored a career-high 11 points while grabbing five rebounds.

Georgia State (7-3, 1-0 Sun Belt) extended its winning streak to six-straight games and won for the 10th-straight time at home dating back to last season. The 10-game stretch is tied for the fourth-longest in school history.

UT Arlington (4-8, 0-1 Sun Belt) lost for the fourth-straight time and for the fifth-straight time to the Panthers, including the last two Sun Belt Conference Tournament championship games.

The Mavericks were led by David Azore who scored 23 points as UTA went a perfect 17-of-17 from the free throw line, but in turning the ball over 20 times proved to be too much to overcome.

Trailing by two, Georgia State used an early 14-0 run to take a 20-8 lead halfway through the first half.

The Panthers pushed the lead to as many as 11 before the Mavericks bounced back with a 6-0 run to cut Georgia State's lead to 25-20 with 6:17 to play. UT Arlington used an 10-0 run just minutes later to take a 33-29 lead with 2:44 to play in the half before Thomas knocked down one of two free throws to stop the run.

The Mavericks went into the locker room leading 35-33 as neither team shot better than 35 percent in the opening half. Tied at 47, Georgia State used a quick 5-0 run to take a 52-47 lead with 10:53 to play causing the Mavericks to call their second timeout of the game. Just minutes later, the Panthers used an 8-0 run to push the lead to 62-52 with 7:23 to play.

UT Arlington would get a close as five points with 6:33 to play but could never cut it to less than a two-possession game. Wilson's fast break lay-up with 42 seconds to play put the Panthers back up by 10 before finishing with the six-point win.

Redshirt-sophomore Justin Roberts finished with 15 points, six rebounds, six assists, and five steals. Sophomore Nelson Phillips came off the bench to score nine points.

Brian Warren added 19 points and five rebounds for the Mavericks, while TiAndre Jackson-Young scored 16 points.

**GEORGIA STATE 81, TEXAS STATE 69**

Georgia State outscored Texas State 18-4 over the final six minutes to top the Bobcats 81-69 at the GSU Sports Arena.

Georgia State (8-3, 2-0 Sun Belt) won for the seventh-straight time and 11th-straight at home dating back to last season. The seven-game streak is tied for the seventh-longest in program history, while the 11-straight at home is the fourth-longest streak.

Freshman Joe Jones III just missed a double-double with a career-high tying eight points while pulling down a career-high 11 rebounds. Redshirt-junior Corey Allen and redshirt-sophomore Justin Roberts led the Panthers with 17 points each while junior Kane Williams added 12.

Despite going 27-of-30 from the free throw line, Texas State (7-6, 0-2 Sun Belt) lost for the fourth time in its last five games. Eric Terry led the Bobcats with 19 points and seven rebounds while Nijal Pearson finished with 14 points and seven rebounds.

Trailing 65-64 with 5:48 to play, Georgia State went on a 14-0 run capped by a Damon Wilson 3-pointer with 1:25 to play to secure the win. Wilson finished with 11 points, four rebounds, and four assists for the Panthers.

Texas State quickly took a 6-0 lead following a free throw by Eric Terry with 17:18 to play. The Bobcats pushed the lead to 17-3 seven minutes into the game by using an 11-0 run and holding Georgia State to just 1-of-12 shooting to start the contest.

The Panthers immediately responded with an 8-0 run to cut Texas State's lead to 19-14 with 10:15 to play in the half as Lanier used full court pressure to force multiple turnovers.

Allen's 3-pointer as the shot clock expired with 2:52 to play cut Texas State's lead to just 31-30 and two minutes later a lay-up by Wilson gave the Panthers a 35-34 lead, GSU's first of the game.

Texas State went into the locker room with a 38-35 lead despite neither team shooting 40 percent. The Bobcats went 19-of-20 from the free throw in the first half while the Panthers were just 4-of-4.

The Bobcats scored the first six points of the second half and took a quick 44-35 lead with 17:14 to play before Allen knocked down another 3-pointer. It started a 7-0 Georgia State run that cut Texas State's lead to 44-42 with 15:52 remaining.

The Panthers started to heat up from 3-point range and knocked down three on three-straight possessions to cut Texas State's lead to 52-51 with 13:13 to play.

Nelson Phillips tied the game 60-60 making 1-of-2 free throws with 7:34 to play and then again at 62 following a monstrous dunk.

Texas State regained the lead 65-64 on a jumper by Eric Terry with 5:48 to play, but the Bobcats would not score again until another Terry jumper with 1:01 to play.

Nelson Phillips came off the bench to score 12 points.

**SMU 85, GEORGIA STATE 76**

Moody Coliseum • Dallas, Texas

Playing its third game in five days, Georgia State saw its seven-game winning streak snapped on Monday night as SMU topped the Panthers 85-76 at Moody Coliseum.

Kane Williams led Georgia State (8-4) with 22 points, but the Panthers shot just 36.6 percent from the floor and could not overcome a 17-point second half deficit.

SMU (9-2) snapped a two-game losing streak as Isiah Mike recorded a double-double with 14 points and 12 rebounds, while Kendrick Davis and Feron Hunt scored 18 points each.

Redshirt-junior Corey Allen added 18 points including four 3-pointers for the Panthers, while redshirt-sophomore Justin Roberts chipped in 16 points going 4-of-10 from 3-point range as GSU finished the game 11-of-31 from long range.

GSU's seven game winning streak was tied for the seventh-longest in program history. GSU was coming off a weekend where they opened defense of their back-to-back Sun Belt Conference titles with wins over UT Arlington and Texas State.

SMU rushed out to an early 19-6 lead halfway thru the first half as the Panthers went just 3-of-20 from the floor to start the game.

Georgia State started to heat up as Williams scored eight-straight GSU points before Roberts took over the half.

Trailing 32-21, Roberts knocked down a 3-pointer and swiped the ball in the back court which led to a lay-up. After a lay-up by Wilson, Roberts knocked down another 3-pointer to cut SMU's lead to just one with 2:14 to play, just over a minute later, the redshirt-sophomore knocked down another triple to give GSU a 34-33 lead.

SMU went into the locker room leading 37-34 despite 13 turnovers which led to 14 GSU points. The Panthers were held to just 11-of-34 shooting in the half but went 8-of-14 after missing 17 of their first 20 shots.

The Mustangs opened the second half on a 10-0 run to immediately go back up by 13, 47-34, just three minutes into the half.

SMU pushed the lead to 69-52 with 6:40 to play before the Panthers made one last run getting as close as six with 2:28 to play.

Junior Josh Linder added five points and five rebounds off the bench, while senior Damon Wilson added nine points and four rebounds.

Tyson Jolly just missed a double-double for SMU with 17 points and eight rebounds.

SMU shot 51.8 percent from the floor and went 22-of-26 from the free throw line, while outrebounding the Panthers 44-34.

Led by a career-high tying 22 points from redshirt-sophomore Justin Roberts, Georgia State cruised to an 83-53 win over Middle Georgia State in the GSU Sports Arena.

Georgia State (9-4) extended its home court winning streak to 12-straight games and have won 20 of the last 21 at the GSU Sports Arena. The 12-game streak is the fourth-longest in program history.

Middle Georgia State (6-5) lost to the Panthers in the non-conference finale for the second-straight year despite 18 points from Michael Graham and 11 rebounds off the bench from De'Mirra Glover.

Roberts just missed a double-double adding career-highs with nine rebounds and seven assists.

Middle Georgia State took an early 16-11 lead just over six minutes into the game before the Panthers took control.

On a 3-pointer by Roberts with 11:06 to play in the half, Georgia State took its first lead of the game, 21-20, as part of a 7-0 run.

The Panthers extended the run to 23-2 to take a 41-22 lead with 2:35 to play. During that same time, the Knights were held without a field goal for more than six minutes.

Georgia State went into the locker room leading 43-24 after holding the Knights to just 22.2 percent shooting and 0-of-11 from 3-point range.

After the two teams played even for the first few minutes of the second half, Georgia State used an 11-0 run to take a 68-38 lead making eight of their first 13 field goals to start the second half.

The Panthers pushed the lead to as many as 32 points with 4:34 to play.

Junior Josh Linder came off the bench to added seven points and seven rebounds, while sophomore Kavonte Ivery scored seven points and grabbed five rebounds.

### GEORGIA STATE 69, APPALACHIAN STATE 60

Holmes Convocation Center • Boone, N.C.

In a battle of Sun Belt Conference first place teams, Georgia State earned a 69-60 win over Appalachian State on Thursday night at the Holmes Convocation Center.

Four Panthers finished in double figures for Georgia State (10-4, 3-0 Sun Belt) led by freshman Jalen Thomas who scored a career-high 14 points and pulled down six rebounds.

Appalachian State (8-6, 2-1 Sun Belt) had entered the night as part of an early season five-way tie for first place with the Panthers. The Mountaineers were led by Adrian Delph who finished with a double-double of 18 points and 10 rebounds. All-Sun Belt Preseason Third Team member Isaac Johnson missed the game with an injury.

Junior Kane Williams just missed a double-double finishing with seven points and a career-high tying nine assists, while redshirt-sophomore Justin Roberts scored 13 points. Freshman Joe Jones III returned to the starting line-up and finished with 11 points while sophomore Nelson Phillips added eight points and seven rebounds.

Georgia State won its eighth-straight conference game dating back to last season and is now 81-34 since rejoining the conference in 2013-14.

After missing its first five shots of the game, GSU started to heat up and after going a stretch of knocking down five of seven field goals led 16-6 with 11:45 to play in the first half as the Mountaineers turned it over nine times in the first eight minutes.

Trailing by 13, Appalachian State used a 6-0 run to cut Georgia State's lead to 19-12 with 9:10 to play but would not get any closer in the first half.

Holding a 31-23 lead, Georgia State finished the half on a 9-0 run to take a 40-23 lead into the locker room. The Mountaineers were held without a field goal for the final 2:43 of the half. The Panthers dominated points in the paint 24-10 while forcing App State into 13 turnovers.

GSU pushed the lead to 57-38 before the Mountaineers used an 8-0 run to cut the Panther lead to just 11 with 10:01 as Corey Allen fouled out with 11 points and three rebounds.

Following the run, the Mountaineers were held without a point for nearly four minutes as Georgia State continued to maintain a double-digit lead.

Appalachian State used a late 6-0 run to cut Georgia State's lead to 64-57 with 1:35 to play but could get no closer in the final 90 seconds.

Justin Forrest, the second-leading scorer in the Sun Belt Conference was held to just 10 points on 2-of-14 shooting and turned the ball over five times.

Appalachian State used the game with 24 turnovers which led to 19 GSU points while shooting just 36.2 percent for the game, including just 4-of-18 from 3-point range.

### COASTAL CAROLINA 74, GEORGIA STATE 72

Despite trailing by 10 points with two minutes to play, Georgia State nearly pulled off a remarkable comeback before falling to Coastal Carolina 74-72 at the HTC Center.

Coastal Carolina (9-6, 2-2 Sun Belt) used a pair of late second-half runs to go ahead 68-58 with two minutes to play before Georgia State (10-5, 3-1 Sun Belt) mounted a furious comeback that came up just short.

Joe Jones III just missed a double-double for the Panthers with nine points and 10 rebounds. Redshirt-sophomore Justin Roberts led Georgia State with 16 points and added seven rebounds while junior Kane Williams also just missed a double-double with 11 points and seven assists. Nelson Phillips scored nine points and swiped a career-high six steals.

The Chanticleers were led by DeVante Jones who scored 23 points and swiped five steals, while Tommy Burton finished with a double-double of 10 points and 10 rebounds.

In a sloppy game for both sides, Georgia State turned the ball over 23 times while forcing Coastal Carolina into 21 turnovers. Neither team shot better than 42.0 percent from the floor or 31.0 percent from 3-point range.

CCU led 60-58 with 3:46 to play before using an 8-0 run to take a 68-58 lead on the Panthers with two minutes to play.

Georgia State still trailed 70-61 with 1:21 remaining before back-to-back field goals by Roberts and senior Damon Wilson cut the lead to five. Following a jumper by Hosana Kitenge with 50 seconds to play and a Jones free throw, Coastal led 73-65 with just 35 seconds on the clock.

Roberts hit another jumper for the Panthers and a possession later Williams made a lay-up and free throw to cut Coastal's lead to just three with 19 seconds to play. After Josh Peterson knocked down 1-of-2 free throws, Roberts made another jumper with 1.5 seconds to play as Coastal led by just two.

After being fouled Garrick Green missed both free throws for the Chanticleers, but a full-court 3-pointer by Kavonte Ivery was just off the mark.

The two teams traded leads for the first part of the half before Georgia State used a 6-0 run to turn a three point deficit into a three point lead, 22-19, with 8:27 to play.

Tied at 27, the Panthers used a 5-0 run to lead 32-27 with 3:54 to play, before Coastal finished the half on a 6-0 run to send the two teams in to the locker room tied at 35.

Wilson finished with nine points while Ivery came off the bench to score five and pull down a pair of rebounds.

Garrick Green added 10 points and five rebounds for Coastal while Keishawn Brewton scored 14.
