Napa River Grill Cardinal Cup September 20-21, 2004

Lisbeth Meincke Wins Individual Medalist Honors

SIMPSONVILLE, KY. – The Georgia State women's golf team finished one stroke behind tournament winner James Madison in the final round of the Napa River Grill Cardinal Cup on Tuesday, Sept. 21 at the par-72, 6,159-yard Cardinal Club Golf Course. Junior Lisbeth Meincke fired an even par-72 in the final day to earn individual medalist honors for the Lady Panthers.

James Madison, who was in fifth place after the first day, shot a 293 in the final round for a tournament total of 918. Georgia State carded a final day score of 307 for a 919 total and second place finish. Host University of Louisville placed third at two strokes back with a score of 921. The University of South Florida finished fourth at 930, while Southern Mississippi rounded out the top-5 with a 956.

Meincke finished with a three-round score of 214 in capturing her third career medalist honors. Adrienne White of Louisville placed second, four strokes behind Meincke, while James Madison's Carol Green fired a total score of 224 for third place.

Freshman Anna Scott shot a 235 to finish tied for 13th place. JeNae Riehlman tied for 20th place at 238, while senior Erica Wein tied for 26th place with a 240. Senior Lina Bustos carded a 249 to finish 42nd.

Beacon Woods Invitational October 1-3, 2004

Lady Panthers Place Fifth At Beacon Woods Invitational

BAYONET POINT, FLA. – The Lady Panthers golf team carded a team score of 300 in the final round of the Beacon Woods Invitational for a fifth place finish on Sunday, Oct. 3 at the par-72, 6,015-yard Beacon Woods Golf. Junior Lisbeth Meincke finished second after being defeated in a three-hole sudden death playoff by Louisville's Adrienne White.

East Carolina overcame two-day leader Coastal Carolina to win the tournament after firing a 294 on the final day. Coastal Carolina took second with a tournament team score of 883, five strokes back of ECU. Host South Florida tied with Louisville, who carded a final round of 282, for third at 887. Georgia State finished with a three-day total of 894.

White and Meincke both finished at five-under par 211 after shooting a 68 in the final round. White won medalist honors in a sudden death playoff that went three holes. Senior Erica Wein ended in a five-way tie for 10th place with a score of 221. Freshman Anna Scott finished tied for 21st with a 227. Seniors JaNae Riehlman and Keri Anne Scott placed tied for 54th and 57th, respectively, at 241 and 246.

Hatter Fall Classic October 18-19, 2004

Meinke Ears Second Medalist Honors Of Fall Season

DELAND, FLA. – Georgia State's women's golf team finished second in the final day of the Hatter Fall Classic on Tuesday, Oct. 19 with a score of 603 at the par-72, 5,963-yard course at Victoria Hill Golf Club. Junior Lisbeth Meincke garnered medalist honors carding a two-under-par 142. Meincke won her second tournament of the fall season and has four career medalist honors.

Campbell led the 13-team tournament field that featured eight Atlantic Sun Conference members from start to finish with a score of 588. Troy placed third six strokes behind Georgia State at 609. The University of Central Florida finished fourth with a tournament score of 629 and McNeese State jumped up two spots to round out the top-five with a 631.

The Lady Panthers had two players finish in the top-five, Meincke and senior Erica Wein. Meincke matched her career-low score of 70 in the second round. Wein recorded her second top-five finish at State with a score of 147 for fifth place. Freshman Anna Scott finished in a two-way tie for 17th place with Troy's Emily Parker at 155. Senior JeNae Riehlman tied for 23rd with a score of 159 and senior Keri Anne Scott shot a 163 to finish in a tie for 33rd place.

McNeese State's Maria Engstrom and Campbell's Alejandra Shaw tied for second with a tournament score of 145. Ashley Grier of UCF finished fourth at 146.

Lady Panthers Conclude Fall Season With Second Place Finish At Home Tournament

STOCKBRIDGE, GA. – Georgia State's women's golf team finished five strokes behind tournament winner Campbell to place second in the final day of the 12th Annual John Kirk/Lady Panther Intercollegiate on Tuesday, Oct. 26. The Lady Panthers shot a two-day score of 603 on the par-72, 5,842-yard Eagle's Landing Country Club.

Campbell, last year's Atlantic Sun Conference champion, shot a final day score of 297 to finish with a tournament record total of 598. UAB finished three strokes back of Georgia State for third at 606, while Yale placed fourth with a tournament score of 609. Middle Tennessee rounded out the top-five at 610 in the 11-team tournament field.

Georgia State place three golfers in the top-10. Freshman Anna Scott finished second with a 69-78-147, marking her best career finish. Junior Lisbeth Meincke ended in a six-way tie for fourth place with a 75-74-149. Senior Erica Wein tied for 10th place with scores of 72-78-150. Senior Keri Anne Scott tied for 37th at 78-82-160 and JeNae Riehlman carded an 87-79-166 to tie for 51st place. Sophomore Lina Bustos tied for 44th place with a 79-83-162, while Pam Torres shot a 85-84-169.

UAB's Brooke Mangan garnered medalist honors finishing one-under-par 143 for the tournament. Mangan carded the second lowest individual tournament two round score. Taryn Durham of Middle Tennessee placed third, one stroke behind Scott at 148.

7th Annual UCF Invitational February 7-8, 2005

All Five Lady Panthers Finish In Top-12 At UCF Invitational
ORLANDO, FLA. – The Georgia State women's golf team successfully defended its title after shooting a final round score of 297 to end with a tournament total of 583 to win the UCF Invitational on Tuesday, Feb. 8 at the par-72, 5,919-yard Stoneybrook Golf Course. The Lady Panthers, who set a new school record for lowest team tournament score for two rounds, posted an eight-stroke victory over second-place Rollins College, who has won the NCAA Division II Championships for two consecutive years. Georgia State placed all five golfers in the top-12 and picks up its first victory of the season.

Florida Southern's Pamela Feggans earned individual medalist honors for the second straight year after finishing with a three-under-par 141.

Freshman Anna Scott carded a two-under-par 70 in the final-round to finish second with a career-low 142, barley missing her first tournament victory. Junior Lisbeth Meincke shot a 74 on the final day to finish even-par 144 for third-place. Seniors Erica Wein and JeNae Riehlman ended in a tie for eighth-place after shooting a 76 and 77, respectively, to end at a total of 150. Riehlman set a new-career low. Freshman Joanna Klatten did well in her first tournament as a Lady Panther, carding an 80 on the last day and ending in a tie for 12th-place at 151.

Women's Golf Records Eight-Stroke Victory Over No. 25 Washington State

MIAMI, FLA. – The Georgia State women's golf team won its second straight tournament, carding the lowest final-round score of the day at 296 on Tuesday, Feb. 22 at the Fourth Annual Miccosukee Women's Championship. The Lady Panthers posted an eight-stroke victory (914) over No. 25 Washington State at the par-73, 5,919-yard Miccosukee Country Club. It marks the first time in program history the Lady Panthers have won back-to-back tournaments.

Georgia State recorded its second lowest third-round score in school history (296) and placed two golfers in the top-10. Colorado's Hannah Hoch held on to her two-round lead to earn individual medalist honors with a 222 in the 18-team tournament field.

Junior Lisbeth Meincke ended in a three-way tie for fifth-place after firing a two-under-par 71 for the final round and finished with a score of 226. Joining Meincke in the top-10 was senior Erica Wein. Wein finished in a four-way tie for ninth-place with a score of 230. Senior JeNae Riehlman recorded a career-low 233 in ending in a tie for 19th-place. Riehlman shot a one-over-par 74 in the third-round for a new personal best. Freshmen Anna Scott and Joanna Klatten finished tied for 24th-place after carding a 75 and 76, respectively in the final round to end with scores of 235.

Pinehurst Challenge March 6-8, 2005

Lady Panthers Fire Second Lowest Final Round Score To Finish Seventh

PINEHURST, N.C. – The Georgia State women's golf team fired the second-lowest final round of the day with a 313 to finish seventh at the Pinehurst Challenge on Tuesday, March 8. Despite 30 mph winds and hail storms, the Lady Panthers jumped up six spots on the par-72, 6,009-yard Pinehurst #8 course to end with a tournament total of 953. Junior Lisbeth Meincke shot a 77 for the final round to end in a three-way tie for third-place with a total of 227. Meincke has finished fifth or better in every tournament for the 2004-05 season.

Washington State held onto its lead to win the tournament with a score 918 in the 18-team field. The Cougars carded a third-round score of 314. UNC Wilmington's Becky Berzonski and Michelle Jarman shared individual medalist honors after finishing in a tie for first-place with a three-day total of 224.

Senior Erica Wein finished in a tie for 25th-place after firing a 77 in the final round to end with a total of 227. Freshmen Anna Scott and Joanna Klatten both shot a 78 on the last day to tie for 45th and 56th, respectively. Scott had a total of 243, while Klatten posted a 246. Senior JeNae Riehlman finished 82nd with a 255.

Lady Panthers Record Seventh Top-Five Finish Of The Season

BRADENTON, FLA. – The Georgia State women's golf team shot the third lowest round on the final day with a 300 to finish fifth at the Waterlefe/USF Invitational on Tuesday, March 15. Junior Lisbeth Meincke finished in second-place with a score of 214 at the par-72, 5,975-yard Waterlefe Golf Club.

Meincke, who recorded her eighth top-five finish of the season, fired a two-under-par 70 for the third-round. The Rungsted, Denmark, native, ended two-strokes behind eventual winner Tina Miller of Miami, who carded the lowest round of the tournament with a four-under-par 68. Miami shot a final-round score of 292 to post a 19-stroke victory over host USF in winning the event. The Lady Panthers ended with a three-round total of 918, three-strokes back of Atlantic Sun Conference-rival Campbell (915).

Georgia State had two golfers finish in the top-10. Senior Erica Wein finished 10th after firing a one-over-par 73 for a tournament score of 225. Senior Erica Wein Finishes Second In Leading Lady Panthers To Victory

WALLACE, N.C. – The Georgia State women's golf team fired a final-round score of 309 to end with a total score of 914 in route to winning the Lady Seahawk Invitational on Tuesday, April 5. The Lady Panthers posted a seven-stroke victory over host UNC Wilmington at the par-72, 6,134-yard River Landing Golf Club. It marks the third tournament this season the Lady Panthers have won, setting a new team record for victories. Georgia State placed three golfers in the top-10.

Georgia State, who is ranked 48th nationally, topped two other nationally ranked programs in second-place UNC Wilmington (39) and Atlantic Sun Conference-rival Campbell (43). Elon's Morgan Olds claimed individual medalist honors with a one-stroke victory over Georgia State's Erica Wein. Olds fired the lone sub-par round of the day with a 71.

Wein recorded the top Lady Panther finish as she placed second with a three-day total of 223. Wein, a senior, carded a one-over-par 73 for the final round. Junior Lisbeth Meincke ended in a three-way tie for seventh-place after shooting a final-round score of 79 for a total of 229. Freshman Joanna Klatten posted her best performance of the season with a 10th-place finish. Klatten shot a personal-best three-round score of 231. Senior JeNae Riehlman ended tied for 28th with a 243 after firing a 79 in the final round. Freshman Anna Scott tied for 64th with a 254.

Atlantic Sun Conference Championships April 11-13, 2005

Women's Golf Captures Second A-Sun Title: Earns Second NCAA Regional Berth

DELAND, FLA. - Georgia State women's golf team claimed the championship of the Atlantic Sun and the automatic berth into the NCAA postseason regionals. Junior Lisbeth Meincke won her third consecutive individual championship and Coach Cathy Mant was named A-Sun Coach of the Year. The A-Sun championship was played at the Victoria Hills Golf Club, a par-72, 5,942-yard course.

It marks Georgia State's second conference championship in the past three years under Coach Mant. Meincke becomes only the second golfer in conference history to win three consecutive championships, joining Florida International's Moira Dunn (1991-93).

Meincke, a native of Denmark, won the individual medalist honors with a four-stroke margin over Campbell's Alejandra Shaw. Lady Panther teammate Anna Scott, a freshman from England, carded a 75 on the final day to finish in fourth place overall. A third Lady Panther, Joanna Klatten from France, fired a 77 to finish tied for sixth overall. Meincke and Scott both were named to the All-Tournament Team for their performances.

This tournament win marked the fourth first-place finish of the spring for the No. 43 Lady Panthers, which is a new school record.

NCAA Regional Results

2003 NCAA East Regional

After capturing its first Atlantic Sun Conference Championship, Georgia State earned the program's first-ever NCAA automatic bid to the NCAA East Regional in 2003. The Lady Panthers were among 21 teams competing in the regional hosted by Wake Forest University at the Salem Glen Country Club in Winston-Salem, N.C.

After the first round of play, Georgia State tied for 12th place with a score of 306. Freshman **Lisbeth Meincke**, who won medalist honors at the Atlantic Sun Championships, tied for ninth place after firing a 72. Senior **Sam White** and junior **Sally Bishop** both finished with a 76 to tie for 41st place. Junior **Nicole Wagner** carded an 82, while junior **Elizabeth White** shot an 88.

The Lady Panthers fell four spots after day two, in a three-way tie for 16th place with UNC Wilmington and Western Carolina. State shot a 307 for a two-round score of 613. Meincke fired a 76 to tie for 22nd place, while Sam White finished with a 74 for 37th. Wagner carded a 76 and Bishop and Elizabeth White carded and 81 and 85, respectively.

Georgia State concluded its season and NCAA Championship run with an 18th-place showing at the East Regional. In the final round, the Lady Panthers shot a 306 for a 54-hole total of 919. Sam White was State's top finisher with a 224, to tie for 36th place. Meincke ended in a tie for 64th place with a 229. Wagner shot a 231, while Bishop was four strokes behind her at 235. Elizabeth White rounded out Georgia State's performers with a 254.
