Host North Florida finishes four strokes up

Jacksonville, Fla. -- The University of North Florida retained its four stroke lead over Florida, winning the 1994 Queen's Harbour Intercollegiate with a three-round total of 893.

Rick Johnston led the Ospreys, shooting a 72 in the final round and finishing fourth overall at 219.

UNF and UF both shot a 294 in the final round, while Arkansas, who was tied for second after the first and second rounds, shot a 297. The Ospreys, ranked No. 7 in Division II, had taken a four stroke lead over Florida and Arkansas after the first round, and shot the same at UF the final two rounds.

Valdosta State's Briny Baird took medalist honors, finishing at 213. Bud Still of Arkansas finished second at 216, followed by Chris Couch of Florida at 218.

GSU MEN'S GOLF TEAM FINISHES FOURTH IN TROJAN CLASSIC

Auburn, Ala. -- Led by David Engram and Steve Meyer, both of whom tied for 11th place with 152 totals for their two days of play, the Georgia State men's golf team finished fourth in the 15-team Trojan Classic this weekend.

Auburn and South Alabama tied for the team title with 595 totals, Columbus College was third at 616 and Georgia State was a solid fourth at 617.

The Panthers, who enjoyed their strongest showing of the fall, finished ahead of several other quality teams, including Southern Mississippi (619), host Troy State (625), Central Florida (625), Mississippi State (626), Vanderbilt (627), Ole Miss (628) and Southeastern Louisiana (635).

ATLANTA, Ga. -- Steve Meyer, a sophomore golfer at Georgia State University from Dunwoody, has qualified for the U.S. Amateur later this month in Houston, Tex.

Earlier this week, Meyer shot a 73-68-141 two-round total at the U.S. Amateur Qualifying Sectional in Jacksonville, Fla., to earn a spot in the national tournament Aug. 22.

As a freshman at GSU this past spring, Meyer paced the Panthers with a 77.3 stroke average over 24 rounds.
