TOP STORYLINES

- Georgia State closes out the season at Old Dominion on Saturday, Nov. 29 at 2:00 p.m. ET.
- Despite the loss against Marshall in week nine, running back Jordon Simmons and kicker Braeden McAlister broke program records in the game. Simmons ran back a 92-yard touchdown to break the program record for longest rushing touchdown. He accumulated 164 rushing yards during the game to place himself third overall in program history for the most single-game rushing yards.
- McAlister kicked a 60-yard field goal against Marshall (Nov. 15) to tie the SBC record for longest field goal, mark the longest Sun Belt field goal this season, break the GSU program record and hit the second-longest FG in the NCAA this season. This kick earned him week 12 SBC Special Teams Player of the Week honors, the only POTW recognition for the Panthers this season.
- Quarterback Cameran Brown became the Panthers starter in week seven at Georgia Southern, and started until injury in week nine at coastal. The senior QB went 29-for-38 with 280 passing yards and a career-high 120 rushing yards at Southern (Oct. 18). Previously this season, veteran quarterback TJ Finely has had the start, with Brown coming in throughout.
- Coach McGee and the Panthers' staff welcomed the largest recruiting class in program history, adding 29 to the early signing class, and 67 total newcomers.

SERIES HISTORY

- Georgia State and Old Dominion are meeting for the 7th time in program history. The Panthers are 1-5 in the series after falling 21-14 at home last season.

LEADING THE PACK

- Receiver **Ted Hurst** leads the Panthers through another season, totaling 928 yards on 64 receptions and six touchdowns. The senior notched a career-high 10 receptions and matched his career-high two touchdowns in the win over Murray State (Sept. 13), the best-single game offensive performance for the Panthers so far this season.
- Following directly behind Hurst is **Javon Robinson** with four touchdowns. The junior receiver has accumulated 579 yards on 55 receptions.
- The junior transfer snagged a career-high nine receptions against App State (Oct. 11).
- Running back **Jordon Simmons** leads the Panthers' run-game with 464 yards on 80 carries.
- Simmons scored a 92-yard rushing touchdown on the first offensive snap against Marshall to set a new program record for longest rushing touchdown (Nov. 15). His 164 total yards against Marshall placed third overall in the program for single-season rushing yards.
- He scored his first touchdown of the season against Coastal Carolina (Nov. 8).
- Simmons leads the Panthers in yards-per-carry, averaging 6.2. He ran a career-long 92-yarder against Marshall (Nov. 15), which is the longest rush in Georgia State history.
- Quarterback **Cameran Brown** leads the Panthers in scoring with 17 TDs, including four rushing touchdowns.
- The dual threat scored Georgia State's first rushing touchdown of the season against Memphis (Sept. 6). He matched his career-high three touchdowns from passes against Murray State (Sept. 13). He leads the panthers through the air, going 114-for-173 for 1,239 yards.
- On the defensive side, linebacker **Josiah Robinson** leads the Panthers with 83 tackles (437 UA), seven tackles for loss of 18 yards, a sack and a fumble recovery. Following closely behind is safety **Jaylen Jones** with 59 tackles (30 UA), 3.5 TFL and a safety.

THE QUARTERBACKS’ ROOM.

- Transfer **Cameran Brown** joined the Panthers for the 2025 season and made an immediate impact in the passing and run game, throwing for 1,296 yards and rushing for 260.
- Brown got his first start of the season in the Panthers’ rivalry game at Georgia Southern (Oct. 18), and has had the starting position since. He set a career-high rushing yards (120), total passes (38) and passing yards (280) against Georgia Southern.
- He leads the Panthers in touchdowns (17) and completion percentage (64.9).
- In the Georgia Southern games, Brown entered the record book tying for fifth-most single-game pass completions (29), and placing seventh in the record book for single-game completion percentage (76.3).
- Brown tied the single-season program record for completion percentage against Murray State (Sept. 13) after going 10-for-12 through the air.
- The redshirt junior completed one passing and one rushing touchdown, and went 8-for-12 for 139 yards, against Memphis (Sept. 6), marking his first two touchdowns of the season.
- In his first start of the season, Brown had a season-best 280 passing yards on 29 completions, and a career-high 120 rushing yards against Georgia Southern (Oct. 18).
- Transfer **TJ Finley** made his Georgia State Debut as the Panthers’ starter in week two against Memphis. In his first game in blue and white, the 6-7 QB went 21-for-29 for 201 yards.
- Finley leads the Panthers’ QB room with 1,244 yards.
- The veteran QB joined the Panthers’ active roster after week one of the season.
- Finley joined the Panthers from Western Kentucky, where he started in three games before being sidelined due to injury.
- **Veilleux**, the Panthers starter in 2024, has seen action in two games this season.
- Veilleux threw a season-long 46-yard pass to Javon Robinson against Troy (Nov. 22).
- Last season, Veilleux led the squad with 2,047 passing yards and 13 touchdowns in the air during the 2024 season. The senior QB threw a career-high three touchdown passes and recorded his first career rushing touchdown in the Panthers win over Vanderbilt on Sept. 14, 2024.

- Georgia State entered the 2025 season with six quarterbacks in rotation,

featuring returner Christian Veilleux, Tulane transfer TJ Finley and Texas Tech transfer Cameran Brown

LOCKDOWN D

- After 11 contests, the Panthers defense totals 779 tackles, 54 tackles for loss of 162 yards, 17 sacks and three forced fumbles.
- **Josiah Robinson** leads the Panthers with 83 tackles (47 UA) and seven TFL.
- Robinson is top 10 in the Sun Belt in tackles (7.5 PG) and fumble recoveries (1).
- Safety **Jaylen Jones** has had a standout season with the Panthers, ranking second on the team in tackles (59), and totaling 3.5 TFL and a safety.
- Jones Forced a fumble at Troy (Nov. 22) to set **Deuce Walker** for a career-first fumble recovery.
- Georgia State enters the 2025 season with a versatile mix of returners and newcomers on defense.
- The Panthers return defensive stars Henry Bryant, Damaine Wilson, Josiah Robinson, Sir Mells and Ian Mathews, all of which made huge impacts on the 2024 season.
- Georgia State’s defense finished the 2024 campaign ranking fifth in the Sun Belt and 38th in the nation with eight fumble recoveries.
- The Panthers snagged nine interceptions throughout the 2024 season, good for ninth in the Sun Belt.

CAN’T TOUCH TED

- Senior Ted Hurst, a highly decorated senior wide receiver, leads the Panthers with 928 yards on 64 receptions and six touchdowns. He averages 92.8 yards-per game.
- Hurst holds the season-long reception of 70 yards, which he set on a pass from Cam Brown against South Alabama (Oct. 23).
- This season, he entered the record book at No. 9 for single-game receiving yards after accumulating 172 against Murray State (Sept. 13). He also placed second overall in the record book for single-game receptions (10) and receiving touchdowns (2).
- Hurst joined the Panthers’ squad in 2024 from Valdosta State and made an immediate impact to the Georgia State offense, leading the Panthers in receptions, yards, yards per-reception, and touchdowns.
- Hurst broke the program record for single-season touchdowns in his first season with the Panthers.
- After only one season with the Panthers, Hurst stands second overall in program history for career yards per-reception. He finished the 2024

season with a 17.2 yard per-reception average.

NOT SAFE FROM SAFETIES

- The Panthers lead the nation in safeties with two.
- For the first time in program history, Georgia State has recorded two safeties in a single season, happening in back-to-back games for the Panthers.
- Redshirt senior **Marlin Dean** completed the first safety of the 2025 season for the Panthers against Memphis (Sept. 6). The second one came from safety **Jaylen Jones** in Georgia State's win over Murray State (Sept. 13).
- The Panthers have recorded a safety in every season for the last three consecutive seasons.
- In 2023, the Panthers put up two points against Old Dominion late in the fourth quarter on a team safety. The Panthers struck again in 2024 when former linebacker Kevin Swint took down Vanderbilt quarterback Diego Pavia in the end zone.

FOR THE RECORD

- Redshirt Junior Braeden McAlister kicked a 60-yard field goal against Marshall (Nov. 15) to tie the SBC record for longest field goal, mark the longest Sun Belt field goal this season, break the GSU program record and hit the second-longest FG in the NCAA this season.
- Senior Jordon Simmons posted 164 rushing yards against Marshall (Nov. 15) to place third overall in program history for single-game rushing yards.
- Simmons scored a 92-yard rushing touchdown to break the record for longest rushing touchdown in program history (Nov. 15).
- Ted Hurst caught nine touchdowns during his inaugural season with the Panthers to break the program record for single-season touchdown, a record that was set in 2013.
- Hurst currently stands fourth overall in the program for career touchdown receptions with 15. He also sits fourth overall for career receiving yards.
- Brown entered the record book tying for eighth overall in total career touchdown passes.
- Henry Bryant stands at three career fumble recoveries, which is tied for fifth in program history. He needs two more to tie the career record for fumbles recovered.
- Bryant is also in the record book for career sacks. Currently standing at 8.5, he is 4.5 sacks away from breaking the record.
- Kicker Liam Rickman matched the

single-game points-by-kicking record during the 2024 season after notching 15 points against Vanderbilt.

- Rickman also matched the single-season PAT record in 2024 after clearing seven at Texas State.
- Rickman's 23 career field goals stands fourth overall in program history. he 10 field goals away from breaking the record.
- Senior quarterback Christina Veilleux stands eighth overall in the record book for career passing yards, after recording 2,047 during the 2024 season. His 13 career touchdown passes also stands at eighth overall in the record book.

PRESEASON HONORS

- Senior Wide receiver Ted Hurst earned 2025 SBC Preseason First-Team Offense, 2025 Phil Steele Preseason All-Sun Belt First Team, 2025 Freaks List by The Atlantic, 2025 HERO Sports G5 Preseason All-American and Preseason Biletnikoff Award Watch List honors following a standout 2024 season. Hurst was a 2024 All-Sun Belt Second-Team Offense and 2024 College Football Network All-Sun Belt Offense honoree.
- Senior defensive tackle Henry Bryant earned SBC preseason Second Team Defense and 2025 Phil Steele Preseason All-Sun Belt First Team honors. Bryant was a 2024 All-Sun Belt Honorable Mention selection, and was named to the 2024 Athlon Sports Preseason All-Sun Belt Second Team Defense.

FROM THE TRANSFER PORTAL

- Georgia State brought in one of its biggest transfer classes for the 2025 season with 35 transfers.
- Head coach McGee welcomed seven transfers from Power 4 conferences, including: DJay Braswell (South Carolina), Leo Blackburn (Georgia Tech), Tyler Scott (Auburn), Branson Robinson (UGA), Bernard Causey (LSU), Rashad Amos (Ole Miss) and Joe Laterza (TCU).
- The Panthers also added Sun Belt transfers Wesley Campbell VI (ULM), PJ Hatter (Texas State) to the 2025 squad.

THE MCGEE ERA

- Head Coach Dell McGee enters his second season at the helm of the Georgia State Panthers football program.
- Dell McGee, a Columbus, Ga., native with 22 years of coaching experience, including back-to-back national titles as the run game coordinator and running backs coach for the Georgia Bulldogs, was named the fourth head football coach in Georgia State history on Feb.



GAME NOTES

23, 2024.

- Although this is McGee's first full-time head coaching position, he was already 1-0 coming in to his head coaching position at Georgia State. He led Georgia Southern to a 58-27 win over Bowling Green in the 2015 GoDaddy Bowl while serving as interim head coach.
- Playing just its 16th season of football and 12th at the FBS level, Georgia State has already played in six bowl games (4-2 record) and five in the last seven years, including last year's 45-22 win over Utah State in the Famous Idaho Potato Bowl.

THE PANTHERS STAFF

- Georgia State returns nine coaches from the 2024 staff and welcomed six during the off-season.
- Hue Jackson was elevated to the offensive coordinator position after serving as the Assistant General Manager during the 2024 season.
- Travis Pearson joined the Panthers' staff as the Defensive Coordinator for the 2025 season after spending the past three seasons at Troy.

SEASON OPENERS

- The 2025 season marks the fourth consecutive season opening on the road, including 2024 (35-12 loss at Georgia Tech), 2023 (42-35 win vs. Rhode Island) and 2022 (35-14 loss at South Carolina).
- Georgia State is 6-10 in season openers after falling to Ole Miss this season.
- The Panthers opened on the road for just the fifth time in 15 seasons of existence, including four road openers in the last four years.
- The only other time that GSU has opened the season on the road was the 2019 upset against Tennessee (38-30).
- Georgia State is opening on a Saturday for the sixth time in the last seven years. The team opened on a weeknight for its first nine years of existence and then again during the 2023 season, including five Thursday games, four Fridays and one Wednesday.

2024 RECAP

- In the Panthers' first season under head coach McGee during the 2024 season, Georgia State finished 3-9 (1-7 SBC) on the season, with wins over Chattanooga, Vanderbilt and Texas State.
- The Panthers lead the Sun Belt and finished top 50 in the nation for fewest penalties per game (5.27).
- Defensively, GSU finished the 2024 season ranking second in the conference and top 20 in the nation for

fumbles recovered with eight. Henry Bryant led the Panthers and the Sun Belt with two fumble recoveries, finishing eighth in the nation.

PANTHERS IN THE PROS

- 2024 graduate Ben Chukwuma made the 53-man roster for the Tampa Bay Buccaneers. The Offensive tackle signed as a free agent on May 9, 2025.
- Kicker Will Lutz, who played at Georgia State from 2012-15, signed with the New Orleans Saints in 2016 and kicked for the Saints through the 2022 season. Lutz was traded to the Denver Broncos prior to the 2023 season.
- Nick Arbuckle, who played at Georgia State 2014-15, went to mini-camp with the Pittsburgh Steelers in 2016. Since then, he has played in the CFL with the Calgary Stampeders, Ottawa Red Blacks, Edmonton Elks and Toronto Argonauts. He Helped lead the Argonauts to the CFL's Grey Cup championship in 2024.

MANNING CAMP MENTOR

- QB Christian Veilleux joined the 2025 Manning Camp staff as a mentor during the off-season.
- The veteran QB worked alongside a roster of standout college quarterbacks to serve as mentors for up-and-coming athletes.

PANTHERS VS POWER 4

- The Panthers faced two Power 4 opponents this season, starting with a season-opener at Ole Miss. Georgia state will also traveled to Vanderbilt in game two of the home-and-home series on Sept. 20.
- Georgia State has faced 20 power four schools since its establishment in 2010. Most recently, the Panthers faced two Power four opponents during the 2024 season, including a win over SEC opponent Vanderbilt.
- Georgia State has seen action against seven Power 4 opponents in the last three years, including home games against North Carolina (2022), UConn (2023) and Vanderbilt (2024).
- Most notably, the Panthers' 38-30 victory at Tennessee in the 2019 season opener for the program's first win over a Power Five team. In that game, Georgia State trailed 17-14 at the half but outscored the Vols in the second half.
- Most recently, the Panthers upset Vanderbilt 36-32 on Sept. 14, 2024 at home.

HEAD COACH DELL McGEE

Dell McGee, a Georgia native with 22 years of coaching experience, including back-to-back national titles as the run game coordinator and running backs coach for the Georgia Bulldogs, was named the fourth head football coach in Georgia State history by GSU President Dr. M. Brian Blake and Director of Athletics Charlie Cobb on Feb. 23, 2024.

“We are proud to announce Coach Dell McGee as our head football coach,” Cobb said upon McGee’s hiring. “Coach McGee is an outstanding and authentic man with a strong passion for developing young men. His track record of competitive success at the high school and college levels makes me confident that he will lead our football program to its greatest achievements. We welcome Linda and Dell to Georgia State University!”

In his first season at the helm of the Panthers, McGee formed the biggest recruiting class Georgia State has ever seen, bringing in nearly 50 newcomers to the roster. Despite a short timeline to form a team of his own, McGee coached the Panthers to a 36-32 upset over Vanderbilt to mark the first time in program history that the Panthers have beaten a Power 5 opponent on home turf.

McGee took over a Georgia State program that began play 2010 and has appeared in six bowl games in the last nine years, winning four, including three in the last four seasons.

The Columbus, Ga., native has spent almost his entire coaching career in his home state. He served the last eight seasons at Georgia, where his abilities as a coach and recruiter have contributed to the Bulldogs’ remarkable run of success under Kirby Smart. McGee has been a key part of a Georgia program that has amassed 94 victories in eight seasons, highlighted by back-to-back College Football Playoff national championships in 2021 and 2022 as well as a berth in the 2017 CFP title game, eight bowl victories, two Southeastern Conference titles and six SEC Eastern Division crowns.

Rivals.com named McGee the 2018 National Recruiter of the Year after the Bulldogs signed the consensus No. 1-rated recruiting class, and he helped recruit and develop Georgia’s 56 NFL draft picks from 2017-23, including 15 first-rounders and an NFL-record 25 players drafted over the last two years.

McGee joined Smart’s original Georgia staff in 2016 as running backs coach, the position he worked with throughout his tenure in Athens. He also served



as assistant head coach in 2018, and then in 2019, he was named run game coordinator.

In his eight seasons at UGA, McGee coached four 1,000-yard rushers: Nick Chubb in 2016-17; Sony Michel in 2017; D’Andre Swift in 2018-19; and Elijah Holyfield in 2018. Chubb and Michel amassed over 8,400 combined yards and 87 touchdowns. Chubb, Michel, and Swift, as well as James Cook and Zamir White, were all taken in the first four rounds of the NFL Draft.

Before going to Georgia, McGee worked two seasons as the running backs coach at Georgia Southern (2014-15). In December 2015, he served as the interim head coach and led the Eagles to a victory in the GoDaddy Bowl.

He spent the 2013 season as an analyst at Auburn, his alma mater, and was part of the staff that led the Tigers to a berth in the 2013-14 BCS national championship game, one of McGee’s four appearances coaching in the national championship game. He was also part of an undefeated team as a player at Auburn, where he helped preserve the Tigers’ undefeated 1993 season with a critical interception against Alabama.

He began his coaching career in the prep ranks as an assistant coach at Georgia high schools Harris County (2002) and Greenville (2003-04) and then earned his first head coaching position at Carver-Columbus High School in 2005. He built that program into a perennial powerhouse that recorded seven straight seasons with 10 or more wins from 2006-2012, highlighted by the 2007 Class AAA state title.

McGee attended Kendrick High School in Columbus, Ga., and then was a two-year starter and four-year letterwinner at Auburn from 1992-95.

He was drafted in the fifth round of the 1996 NFL Draft by the Arizona Cardinals and spent time with the Cardinals and Detroit Lions over three NFL seasons. He also played in NFL Europe, the XFL and the Arena Football League in a seven-year professional career.

. Dell and his wife Linda have one son, Austin, a member of the Panthers football team who signed with Georgia State in December 2023.

The Trojans finished the 2024 campaign winning three of their last four games and posted a top 25 defense nationally in November, while Damaje Yancey finished fourth in the Sun Belt with nine pass break ups.

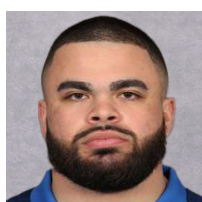

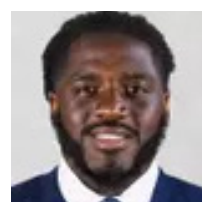

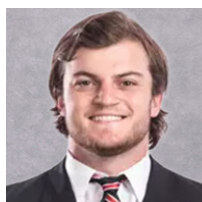

"Pete" Petit Field at CENTER PARC CREDIT UNION STADIUM



CENTER PARC CREDIT UNION STADIUM

is the home of Georgia State football. The Panthers took over this iconic property, formerly Centennial Olympic Stadium and then Turner Field, for the 2017 season.

The facility was renamed Center Parc Credit Union Stadium as part of a 15-year, \$21 million agreement between Center Parc Credit Union, a division of Atlanta Postal Credit Union (APCU), and Georgia State Athletics, announced on Aug. 11, 2020.

Center Parc Stadium features 25,000 seats for football, a FieldTurf playing surface on "Pete" Petit Field and dramatic views of the Atlanta skyline. The conversion process incorporated the existing seating areas on the north, west and south sides of the stadium with a new grandstand constructed on the east side, formerly the outfield.

The Panthers are in their fifth season in this impressive venue, which also houses the Football Operations Suite, completed in 2019. All of the program's day-to-day operations are at Center Parc Stadium, including practice, weight room, meetings rooms, coaches' offices, athletic training room and equipment room.

Center Parc Stadium was originally constructed as the 85,000-seat Centennial Olympic Stadium and used for the 1996 Centennial Olympic Games. Following the Olympic Games, much of the north end of the stadium was removed in order to convert it to the 49,000-seat baseball park that served as the home of the Atlanta Braves from 1997 through 2016.

The Braves played their final game at Turner Field on Oct. 2, 2016. In November 2016, the Board of Regents approved Georgia State University's purchase of 38 acres of the 68-acre site for \$22.8 million, and the conversion process began in early 2017.

The redevelopment of this iconic property also includes the Georgia State University Convocation Center, which opened in 2022 at the north end of the property, and new Georgia State baseball and softball facilities to be constructed on the footprint of the former Atlanta-Fulton County stadium. Residential, retail and corporate facilities are being developed by Carter and Associates.

Hurst Leads Panthers to 37-21 Victory over Murray State

ATLANTA -- Georgia State scored first and never trailed on the way to a 37-21 victory against Murray State Saturday night at home at Center Parc Stadium.

"Wins are hard to come by, and we're gonna celebrate them when we do have them," head coach Dell McGee said, after securing the first win of the season for the Panthers. "We still have some things that we need to work on in all three phases, but really proud of our guys' effort."

The triumph improved Georgia State's record to 1-2 on the season while the Racers fell to 0-3.

Branson Robinson paced the Panthers rushing attack by accumulating 65 yards over the course of the game, averaging 8.1 yards per carry. Rashad Amos also added 56 yards and one touchdown on the ground, averaging 5.1 yards per carry.

The most prolific target for Georgia State quarterbacks was Ted Hurst, who caught 10 passes for 172 yards and two scores.

Josiah Robinson paced the Georgia State defensive effort, totaling nine tackles, 1.0 TFL, and one recovered fumble. D-Icey Hopkins added 1.0 TFL and one sack and Alex Mullings had 1.0 TFL and one sack in the win.

Veilleux, Robinson Have Stellar Outing, Panthers Fall to Troy

TROY, Ala.-- Christian Veilleux threw for 307 yards and Javon Robinson put up 146 receiving yards, but Georgia State fell to Troy 31-19 on the road Saturday afternoon.

Veilleux went 19-for-38 on the way to the 307-yard, one-touchdown outing with one interception.

Jordan Simmons totaled 67 yards to lead the Panthers' ground attack in the game. Simmons also tacked on 39 receiving yards. Veilleux also tacked on 37 yards on the ground, picking up 12.3 yards per carry.

Robinson's 146-yard, one-touchdown performance led the Georgia State receiving corps.

Deuce Walker showed out for the Georgia State defense, recording four tackles and one recovered fumble. Fuches Lewis II added three tackles, 1.5 TFL, and a career-first sack, and Richard Kramer had three tackles, 1.0 TFL and one sack in the loss.

Georgia State also had an outstanding day offensively, logging 516 total yards, 152 on the ground and 364 through the air, while averaging 6.1 yards per play and out-gaining Troy.

Georgia State's defense was tough against the run, limiting Troy to just 62 yards on the ground. Georgia State out-rushed Troy by 90 yards. The Panthers defense lived in Troy's backfield all game, collecting four sacks and six total tackles for loss.

How It Happened

Georgia State got on the scoreboard first and opened up a 3-0 lead with 13:29 remaining in the second quarter. Troy then scored to take a 10-3 lead before the Panthers put a field goal on the board to close the gap and make it a 10-6 game.

After Troy scored to increase its lead to 17-6, Georgia State responded with a touchdown with 3:29 left in the third quarter lead to cut the deficit to 17-12. Troy scored to increase its lead to 24-12 before the Panthers scored again to narrow the advantage and make it a 24-19 game. Georgia State didn't score again in the game and Troy added seven more points to finish off the scoring.

Game Notes

- » Georgia State outgained Troy 516-423, including a 152-62 advantage on the ground.
- » Georgia State had their highest scoring quarter in the fourth period, when they put up seven points.
- » Georgia State converted 3 of 14 third downs while Troy was successful on 11 of 20.
- » Jabriel Rhodes-Nelson led the Panthers with nine tackles.
