TOP STORYLINES

- Georgia State opens the season with a Friday-night showdown, hosting North Carolina A&T on Sept. 4 at 7:00 p.m. at Center Parc Credit Union Stadium.
- Georgia State will host its annual #FanFromDay1 tradition, welcoming first-year students to join the team in the preseason run out. The athletics department will also host Friday night Fireworks, featuring the largest fireworks display in Atlanta.
- The Panthers enter year three under the direction of head coach Dell McGee.
- Georgia State returns 50 student athletes from the 2025 roster and added 67 newcomers, including 37 transfers and 24 freshmen.

SERIES HISTORY

- Georgia State and North Carolina A&T are meeting for the first time in program history.

SCOUTING THE AGGIES

- North Carolina A&T is 0-1 on the season after falling 17-7 in Week 0 against Morgan State.
- the Aggies started second-year quarterback Braxton Thomas, who threw for a career-high 240 yards on 20-for-30 passing.
- Senior Elijah Kennedy led the Aggies on offense with five receptions.

SEASON OPENERS

- The 2026 season marks the first time since 2023, and the first time in the McGee era, that Georgia State hosts the season-opener.
- Georgia State is 6-10 in season openers after falling to Ole Miss during the 2025 season.
- With this season's home-opener, the Panthers have hosted 12 of the program's 16 total season-openers, including the first nine from 2010-18.
- The Panthers opened on the road for just the fourth time in 15 seasons of existence last season, including three in the last four seasons. The only other time that GSU has opened the season on the road was the 2019 upset against Tennessee (38-30).
- Georgia State is opening on a Friday for the fifth time since the team's inception. The team opened on a weeknight for its first nine years of existence and then again during the 2023 season, including five Thursday games, four Fridays and one Wednesday.

2025 RECAP

- In the Panthers' second season under head coach McGee, Georgia State finished 1-11 (0-8 SBC) on the season, with a 37-21 win over Murray State.

UP NEXT

- Georgia State heads up I-75 to face Kennesaw State at Fifth-Third Bank Stadium on Saturday, Sept. 12 at 7:00 p.m. in game one of the scheduled home-and-home.

KEY RETURNERS

- Senior **Cameran Brown** returns for year two as the Panthers' starting quarterback. Brown saw action in 10 games and started in four. He led the team through the air with 1,296 yards on 120 completions and 13 touchdowns... Limited his offensive game to only one interception throughout the entirety of the season.
- The Panthers returned key offensive performers in running back DJ Murray, receivers DJ Riles, Kyle Washington and DJ Avery Jr. and tight ends Grant Hollier and Avion McBride. On the front line, Georgia State also returned veterans Donnovan Funsch, Thylor Williams and Deandre Duffus, who contributed to 2,586 yards in the air and 1,294 on the ground.
- Defensively, the Panthers also returned defensive backs Deuce Walker, Derrick Maxey III and Tyson McCrary, as well as linebackers Kelan Butler Coby Owens. On the line, Georgia State returned defensive ends Jabriel Rhodes-Nelson and Richard Kramer.

FROM THE TRANSFER PORTAL

- Beating last year's record for the biggest transfer class in program history, Georgia State brought in 37 transfers, including eight junior college student athletes.
- Head coach McGee welcomed eight transfers from Power 4 conferences, including: Jordan Brown (Arizona), Deylin Hassert (Iowa State), Jaydon Hood (Michigan), Marcus Mascoll (Florida), Keenan Nelson (Ohio State), Kelton Smith (Georgia), Gage Stanaland (Oklahoma State), Isaiah Stone (LSU).
- The Panthers also added G5 transfer Kelze Howard from Oregon State.

FRESHMEN FACES

- Georgia State added 24 fresh faces from the high school class of 2026, adding depth on both sides of the ball.
- Expected to see action on the offense is Quantavious Wiggins, an Atlanta native from Langston Hughes, who was one of the top rated running backs out of high school.

GEORGIA GROWN

- Sixty five Panthers hail from the Peach State, making up more than half of Georgia State's roster playing in their home state.

THE QUARTERBACKS' ROOM.

- Senior **Cameran Brown** enters year two with the Panthers after joining the squad as a transfer in 2025. He earned the starting position as the quar-

terback in game seven of the 2025 season.

- Brown finished the 2025 season leading the Panthers through the air with 1,296 yards on 120 completions and 13 passing touchdowns, while limiting his offensive game to only one interception throughout the entirety of the season.
- On the ground, Brown led the team with four rushing touchdowns and finished third on the Panthers' leaderborad in rushing yards with 260.
- He led the Panthers in touchdowns (17) and completion percentage (64.9) last season.
- In the Georgia Southern games, Brown entered the record book tying for fifth-most single-game pass completions (29), and placing seventh in the record book for single-game completion percentage (76.3).
- Brown tied the single-season program record for completion percentage against Murray State (Sept. 13) after going 10-for-12 through the air.

THE MCGEE ERA

- Head Coach Dell McGee enters his third season at the helm of the Georgia State Panthers football program.
- Dell McGee, a Columbus, Ga., native with 22 years of coaching experience, including back-to-back national titles as the run game coordinator and running backs coach for the Georgia Bulldogs, was named the fourth head football coach in Georgia State history on Feb. 23, 2024.
- Although this is McGee's first full-time head coaching position, he was already 1-0 coming in to his head coaching position at Georgia State. He led Georgia Southern to a 58-27 win over Bowling Green in the 2015 GoDaddy Bowl while serving as interim head coach.
- Playing just its 16th season of football and 12th at the FBS level, Georgia State has already played in six bowl games (4-2 record) and five in the last seven years, including last year's 45-22 win over Utah State in the Famous Idaho Potato Bowl.

THE PANTHERS STAFF

- McGee returned eight assistant coaches from the 2025 staff, highlighted by offensive coordinator Hue Jackson and wide receivers coach Dameyune Craig, who was elevated to the Associate Head Coach position.
- McGee elevated Zach Conowal, former special teams assistant, to the Special

PANTHERS IN THE PROS

- Wide Receiver Ted Hurst was selected by the Tampa Bay Buccaneers as the No. 84 overall pick in the 2026 NFL Draft, becoming the highest draft pick in Georgia State history.
- 2024 graduate Ben Chukwuma made the 53-man roster for the Tampa Bay Buccaneers. The Offensive tackle signed as a free agent on May 9, 2025.
- Kicker Will Lutz, who played at Georgia State from 2012-15, signed with the New Orleans Saints in 2016 and kicked for the Saints through the 2022 season. Lutz was traded to the Denver Broncos prior to the 2023 season.
- Nick Arbuckle, who played at Georgia State 2014-15, went to mini-camp with the Pittsburgh Steelers in 2016. Since then, he has played in the CFL with the Calgary Stampeders, Ottawa Red Blacks, Edmonton Elks and Toronto Argonauts. He Helped lead the Argonauts to the CFL's Grey Cup championship in 2024.

PANTHERS VS POWER 4

- The Panthers continue the six-year streak against power 4 opponents as they are set to face Power 4 opponents UCF on Sept. 19 in Orlando, Fla.
- Georgia State has faced 20 power four schools since its establishment in 2010. Most recently, the Panthers faced two Power four opponents during the 2024 season, including a win over SEC opponent Vanderbilt.
- The Panthers have seen action against seven Power 4 opponents in the last three years, including home games against North Carolina (2022), UConn (2023) and Vanderbilt (2024).
- Most recently, the Panthers upset Vanderbilt 36-32 on Sept. 14, 2024 at home.
- Most notably, the Panthers' 38-30 victory at Tennessee in the 2019 season opener for the program's first win over a Power Five team. In that game, Georgia State trailed 17-14 at the half but outscored the Vols in the second half.
- Georgia State has solidified future power 4 opponents, including a week 0 matchup against Clemson in 2027 and a trip to Alabama in 2028.

 HEAD COACH DELL MCGEE

Dell McGee, a Georgia native with 22 years of coaching experience, including back-to-back national titles as the run game coordinator and running backs coach for the Georgia Bulldogs, was named the fourth head football coach in Georgia State history by GSU President Dr. M. Brian Blake and Director of Athletics Charlie Cobb on Feb. 23, 2024.

“We are proud to announce Coach Dell McGee as our head football coach,” Cobb said upon McGee’s hiring. “Coach McGee is an outstanding and authentic man with a strong passion for developing young men. His track record of competitive success at the high school and college levels makes me confident that he will lead our football program to its greatest achievements. We welcome Linda and Dell to Georgia State University!”

In his first season at the helm of the Panthers, McGee formed the biggest recruiting class Georgia State has ever seen, bringing in nearly 50 newcomers to the roster. Despite a short timeline to form a team of his own, McGee coached the Panthers to a 36-32 upset over Vanderbilt to mark the first time in program history that the Panthers have beaten a Power 5 opponent on home turf.

McGee took over a Georgia State program that began play 2010 and has appeared in six bowl games in the last nine years, winning four, including three in the last four seasons.

The Columbus, Ga., native has spent almost his entire coaching career in his home state. He served the last eight seasons at Georgia, where his abilities as a coach and recruiter have contributed to the Bulldogs’ remarkable run of success under Kirby Smart. McGee has been a key part of a Georgia program that has amassed 94 victories in eight seasons, highlighted by back-to-back College Football Playoff national championships in 2021 and 2022 as well as a berth in the 2017 CFP title game, eight bowl victories, two Southeastern Conference titles and six SEC Eastern Division crowns.

Rivals.com named McGee the 2018 National Recruiter of the Year after the Bulldogs signed the consensus No. 1-rated recruiting class, and he helped recruit and develop Georgia’s 56 NFL draft picks from 2017-23, including 15 first-rounders and an NFL-record 25 players drafted over the last two years.

McGee joined Smart’s original Georgia staff in 2016 as running backs coach, the position he worked with throughout his tenure in Athens. He also served



as assistant head coach in 2018, and then in 2019, he was named run game coordinator.

In his eight seasons at UGA, McGee coached four 1,000-yard rushers: Nick Chubb in 2016-17; Sony Michel in 2017; D’Andre Swift in 2018-19; and Elijah Holyfield in 2018. Chubb and Michel amassed over 8,400 combined yards and 87 touchdowns. Chubb, Michel, and Swift, as well as James Cook and Zamir White, were all taken in the first four rounds of the NFL Draft.

Before going to Georgia, McGee worked two seasons as the running backs coach at Georgia Southern (2014-15). In December 2015, he served as the interim head coach and led the Eagles to a victory in the GoDaddy Bowl.

He spent the 2013 season as an analyst at Auburn, his alma mater, and was part of the staff that led the Tigers to a berth in the 2013-14 BCS national championship game, one of McGee’s four appearances coaching in the national championship game. He was also part of an undefeated team as a player at Auburn, where he helped preserve the Tigers’ undefeated 1993 season with a critical interception against Alabama.

He began his coaching career in the prep ranks as an assistant coach at Georgia high schools Harris County (2002) and Greenville (2003-04) and then earned his first head coaching position at Carver-Columbus High School in 2005. He built that program into a perennial powerhouse that recorded seven straight seasons with 10 or more wins from 2006-2012, highlighted by the 2007 Class AAA state title.

McGee attended Kendrick High School in Columbus, Ga., and then was a two-year starter and four-year letterwinner at Auburn from 1992-95.

He was drafted in the fifth round of the 1996 NFL Draft by the Arizona Cardinals and spent time with the Cardinals and Detroit Lions over three NFL seasons. He also played in NFL Europe, the XFL and the Arena Football League in a seven-year professional career.

. Dell and his wife Linda have one son, Austin, a member of the Panthers football team who signed with Georgia State in December 2023.

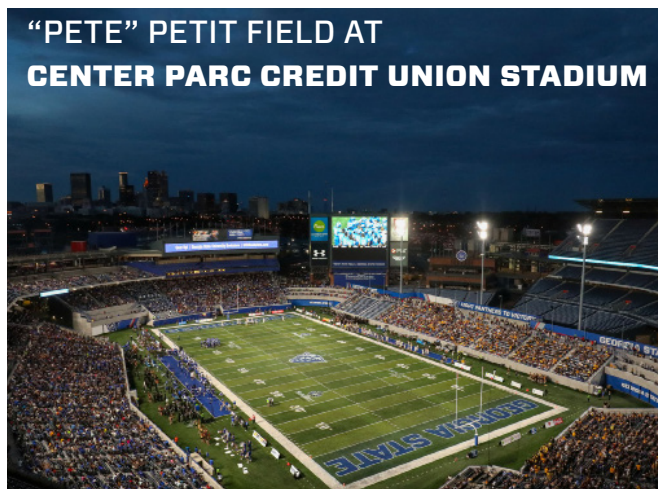

"PETE" PETIT FIELD AT CENTER PARC CREDIT UNION STADIUM



CENTER PARC CREDIT UNION STADIUM

is the home of Georgia State football. The Panthers took over this iconic property, formerly Centennial Olympic Stadium and then Turner Field, for the 2017 season.

The facility was renamed Center Parc Credit Union Stadium as part of a 15-year, \$21 million agreement between Center Parc Credit Union, a division of Atlanta Postal Credit Union (APCU), and Georgia State Athletics, announced on Aug. 11, 2020.

Center Parc Stadium features 25,000 seats for football, a FieldTurf playing surface on "Pete" Petit Field and dramatic views of the Atlanta skyline. The conversion process incorporated the existing seating areas on the north, west and south sides of the stadium with a new grandstand constructed on the east side, formerly the outfield.

The Panthers are in their fifth season in this impressive venue, which also houses the Football Operations Suite, completed in 2019. All of the program's day-to-day operations are at Center Parc Stadium, including practice, weight room, meetings rooms, coaches' offices, athletic training room and equipment room.

Center Parc Stadium was originally constructed as the 85,000-seat Centennial Olympic Stadium and used for the 1996 Centennial Olympic Games. Following the Olympic Games, much of the north end of the stadium was removed in order to convert it to the 49,000-seat baseball park that served as the home of the Atlanta Braves from 1997 through 2016.

The Braves played their final game at Turner Field on Oct. 2, 2016. In November 2016, the Board of Regents approved Georgia State University's purchase of 38 acres of the 68-acre site for \$22.8 million, and the conversion process began in early 2017.

The redevelopment of this iconic property also includes the Georgia State University Convocation Center, which opened in 2022 at the north end of the property, and new Georgia State baseball and softball facilities to be constructed on the footprint of the former Atlanta-Fulton County stadium. Residential, retail and corporate facilities are being developed by Carter and Associates.

Panthers Fall to Georgia Southern Despite Fourth-Quarter Lead

STATESBORO, Ga -- Georgia State fell 41-24 on Saturday night at Allen E. Paulson Stadium.

Quarterback Cameran Brown led Georgia State's passing attack with 280 yards through the air, tossing one touchdown without throwing an interception. The signal caller also added a career-high 120 yards and one touchdown on the ground.

To go along with Brown's showing, Rashad Amos added to the Panthers' rushing attack by picking up 29 yards and one touchdown in the game.

Brown's most prolific target in the ballgame was Javon Robinson, who caught seven passes for 71 yards. Ted Hurst got in on the action in the passing game as well, hauling in five balls for 68 yards and one touchdown.

On the defensive side, Josiah Robinson had seven tackles and 1.0 TFL in the loss.

Georgia State converted on 71.4 percent of third-down attempts going 10-for-14 on the day.

How It Happened

After Georgia Southern opened the scoring to go up 3-0, Georgia State responded to take a 7-0 lead with 4:52 remaining in the first quarter. Georgia Southern scored to go ahead 10-7 before the Panthers responded to even the game at 10-10.

Georgia State followed with a five-yard touchdown reception from to Hurst at the :46 mark in the second quarter and took a 17-10 lead in the process. Georgia Southern then took control of the lead, building a 20-17 advantage before the Panthers responded with a three-yard touchdown run from Amos to jump back ahead 24-20. Georgia State didn't score again in the game and Georgia Southern added 21 more points to finish off the scoring.

Panthers Come Up Short in Close Battle with South Alabama

ATLANTA -- Georgia State fell 38-31 to South Alabama on Thursday night at Center Parc Credit Union Stadium.

Cameran Brown led Georgia State's passing attack with 241 yards through the air, tossing four touchdowns and one interception. The signal caller also added 67 yards on the ground.

Jordon Simmons totaled 78 yards to lead the Panthers' ground attack in the game, picking up 7.1 yards per carry along the way.

Brown's most prolific target in the ballgame was Ted Hurst, who caught five passes for 110 yards and two scores. Dennis Murray Jr. got in on the action in the passing game as well, hauling in three balls for 54 yards and one touchdown.

Kedrick Walker paced the Georgia State defensive effort, collecting nine tackles, 2.5 TFL, and 1.5 sacks. Team added and Braeden McAlister had in the loss.

The Georgia State offense did a good job prolonging drives, converting on 46.2 percent of third-down attempts. The Panthers also went 2-for-3 on fourth down.

Defensively, Georgia State held up fairly well against the South Alabama rushing attack, holding the Jaguars to 188 yards on the ground. In part because of that stellar defense, Georgia State runners out-gained their South Alabama counterparts 199-188.

How It Happened

Georgia State responded to a 7-0 lead from South Alabama with a score to tie it up at 7-7 with 7:15 left in the first quarter. South Alabama scored to go ahead 14-7 before the Panthers scored again to tie it up at 14-14.

South Alabama fought back to take a 28-14 lead before Georgia State put a field goal on the board to cut into the lead with 8:04 left in the third quarter and make it a 28-17 game. The Panthers then scored again, narrowing the gap to 28-23.

Georgia State scored again, an 11-yard touchdown pass from Brown to tie it up at 28-28 in the fourth quarter, and took a 31-28 lead in the process. Georgia State didn't score again and South Alabama tacked on 10 more points to finish off the scoring.

Panthers Come up Short in a 40-27 Loss to Coastal Carolina

CONWAY, S.C. -- Georgia State fell 40-27 to Coastal Carolina on the road Saturday afternoon.

The Chanticleers improved to 6-3 on the year and 5-1 in Sun Belt Conference play, while the Panthers fell to 1-8 overall and 0-5 in conference matchups.

Jordan Simmons led all Panthers rushers with 99 yards and one touchdown in the contest, picking up 5 yards per carry. Dennis Murray Jr. also added 19 yards on the ground, averaging 6.3 yards per carry.

Ted Hurst reeled in 10 catches for 165 yards and one score. Grant Hollier got in on the action in the passing game as well, hauling in three balls for 58 yards and one touchdown.

Jartavius Flounoy paced the Georgia State defensive effort, totaling three tackles, 1.0 TFL and one sack. His sack marked a career-first. Jabriel Rhodes-Nelson added seven tackles, 2.0 TFL and one sack, and Rashad Amos had in the loss.

Defensively, Georgia State held up fairly well against the Coastal Carolina passing attack, holding the Chanticleers to 120 yards through the air.

Georgia State took care of business in the red zone, scoring four times on four trips inside Coastal Carolina's 20-yard line, with all of those scores being touchdowns.

Panthers Come up Short to Marshall

ATLANTA-- Georgia State fell 30-18 to Marshall at home Saturday afternoon.

Tj Finley led Georgia State's passing attack with a season-high 251 yards through the air, tossing one touchdown and two interceptions.

Jordan Simmons paced the Panthers rushing attack by accumulating 164 yards and one touchdown over the course of the game, averaging 8.6 yards per carry. In the first offensive play of the game for the Panthers, Simmons scored a 92-yard rushing touchdown to mark the longest rushing touchdown in program history. Simmons also tacked on 64 receiving yards, including a season-high 32 yard reception.

Branson Robinson also added two yards on the ground.

Ted Hurst reeled in seven catches for 74 yards. Grant Hollier got in on the action in the passing game as well, hauling in six balls for 51 yards and one touchdown.

Jartavius Flounoy showed out for the Georgia State defense, collecting three tackles, 2.0 TFL and one sack. Kedrick Walker added a career-high 11 tackles, 1.0 TFL and one sack.

The Georgia State offense did a good job prolonging drives, converting on 41.2 percent of third-down attempts. The Panthers also went 4-for-4 on fourth down.

Georgia State's defense held up fairly well against the run, limiting Marshall to 168 yards on the ground.

On special teams, kicker Braeden McAlister made a 60-yard field goal to tie the SBC record for longest field goal, mark the longest Sun Belt field goal this season, break the GSU program record and hit the second-longest FG in the NCAA this season.

Georgia State scored first and opened up a 7-0 lead with 13:05 left in the first quarter. Marshall then scored to take a 21-7 lead before the Panthers put a field goal on the board to narrow the gap and make it a 21-10 game.

Veilleux, Robinson Have Stellar Outing, Panthers Fall to Troy

TROY, Ala.-- Christian Veilleux threw for 307 yards and Javon Robinson put up 146 receiving yards, but Georgia State fell to Troy 31-19 on the road Saturday afternoon.

Veilleux went 19-for-38 on the way to the 307-yard, one-touchdown outing with one interception.

Jordon Simmons totaled 67 yards to lead the Panthers' ground attack in the game. Simmons also tacked on 39 receiving yards. Veilleux also tacked on 37 yards on the ground, picking up 12.3 yards per carry.

Robinson's 146-yard, one-touchdown performance led the Georgia State receiving corps.

Deuce Walker showed out for the Georgia State defense, recording four tackles and one recovered fumble. Fuches Lewis II added three tackles, 1.5 TFL, and a career-first sack, and Richard Kramer had three tackles, 1.0 TFL and one sack in the loss.

Georgia State also had an outstanding day offensively, logging 516 total yards, 152 on the ground and 364 through the air, while averaging 6.1 yards per play and out-gaining Troy.

Georgia State's defense was tough against the run, limiting Troy to just 62 yards on the ground. Georgia State out-rushed Troy by 90 yards. The Panthers defense lived in Troy's backfield all game, collecting four sacks and six total tackles for loss.

How It Happened

Georgia State got on the scoreboard first and opened up a 3-0 lead with 13:29 remaining in the second quarter. Troy then scored to take a 10-3 lead before the Panthers put a field goal on the board to close the gap and make it a 10-6 game.

After Troy scored to increase its lead to 17-6, Georgia State responded with a touchdown with 3:29 left in the third quarter lead to cut the deficit to 17-12. Troy scored to increase its lead to 24-12 before the Panthers scored again to narrow the advantage and make it a 24-19 game.
