TOP STORYLINES

- After starting 2-0 on the season, the Panthers take their first out-of-state trip to Orlando, Fla. to face the University of Central Florida on Saturday, Sept. 19 at 7:00 p.m. at Acrisure Bounce House.
- Senior quarterback Cameran Brown earned Sun Belt Player of the Week (Sept. 14) after carrying the Panthers with 315 yards and a touchdown to lead Georgia State to a 31-17 win over C-USA Champions Kennesaw State. Brown netted 253 yards in the air with a season-long 45 yard pass while maintaining a 69.6 completion percentage. On the ground, the dual-threat quarterback ran for 62 yards on 9 carries, including an 18-yard run to hurdle into the end zone to score the first touchdown for the Panthers.
- Through two games, Georgia State is averaging 45.0 points and 523.0 yards per game, including 257.0 rushing yards and 266.0 passing yards. The Panthers have dominated on the ground, outrushing opponents 514-156 with a 9-1 advantage in rushing touchdowns, while holding opponents to just 13.5 points and 270.5 total yards per game.
- The Panthers are 2-0 on the season after defeating North Carolina A&T (Sept. 4) and Kennesaw State (Sept. 12) so far this season.
- Georgia State opened the season with a 59-10 win over North Carolina A&T on Sept. 5, setting the program record for most points scored in a game, largest margin of victory and second fewest points allowed in program history.
- The Panthers enter year three under the direction of head coach Dell McGee.
- Georgia State returns 50 student athletes from the 2025 roster and added 67 newcomers, including 37 transfers and 24 freshmen.

SERIES HISTORY

- Georgia State and UCF are meeting for the first time in program history.

LAST TIME OUT

- Georgia State used a big 230-yard performance on the ground, including 101 yards from Laneal McCrary Jr., and three rushing touchdowns to pick up a 31-17 win against Kennesaw State Saturday night.
- The Panther win marked the first time since Nov. 2024 that Kennesaw State lost at home.
- Cameran Brown led Georgia State's passing attack with 253 yards through the air. The signal caller also added 62 yards and one touchdown on the ground.
- McCrary Jr. paced the Panthers rushing attack by accumulating 101 yards and one touchdown over the course of the game, averaging 5.3 yards per carry.
- Kyle Washington hauled in two catches for 59 yards.
- Deuce Lee showed out for the Georgia State defense, totaling five tackles and one interception. Xavier Esqillion added three tackles, 1.0 TFL, and one sack.

SCOUTING THE KNIGHTS

- The University of Central Florida is 1-1 on the season after falling 12-7 to Pittsburgh last week.
- The Knights average 383.0 yards per game, including 193 through the air. Quarterback Alonza Barnett leads UCF with 344 yards and two touchdowns with one interception.
- Defensively, Lewis Carter leads UCF with 15 tackles. Eight Knights have recorded one or more sacks this season.

PANTHERS VS POWER 4

- The Panthers continue the six-year streak against power 4 opponents as they are set to face Power 4 opponents UCF on Sept. 19 in Orlando, Fla.
- Georgia State has faced 20 power four schools since its establishment in 2010. Most recently, the Panthers faced two Power four opponents during the 2024 season, including a win over SEC opponent Vanderbilt.
- The Panthers have seen action against seven Power 4 opponents in the last three years, including home games against North Carolina (2022), UConn (2023) and Vanderbilt (2024).
- Most recently, the Panthers upset Vanderbilt 36-32 on Sept. 14, 2024 at home.
- Most notably, the Panthers' 38-30 victory at Tennessee in the 2019 season opener for the program's first win over a Power Five team. In that game, Georgia State trailed 17-14 at the half but outscored the Vols in the second half.
- Georgia State has solidified future power 4 opponents, including a week 0 matchup against Clemson in 2027 and a trip to Alabama in 2028.

MOVING THE CHAINS

- The Panthers have recorded 51 first downs compared to just 27 by their opponents. Georgia State has nearly doubled its opponents in rushing first downs, 26-11.
- Georgia State has converted 13-of-25 third downs for a 52 percent success rate while holding opponents to just 6-of-23, or 26 percent. They have been successful on 66.7 percent of fourth down conversions.
- The Panthers average 523.0 yards of total offense with nearly identical production on the ground and through the air. With 257.0 rushing yards and 266.0 passing yards per game, Georgia State averages 7.4 yards per offensive play.

- Their rushing offense and total offense lead the Sun Belt and rank top 20 in the nation.

CAN'T CATCH CAM

- Starting quarterback **Cameran Brown** has completed 31-of-43 passes for 443 yards and two touchdowns through two games, good for a 72.1 completion percentage and 169.3 efficiency rating. Brown has also rushed for 77 yards and a touchdown, accounting for 520 yards of total offense.
- Brown is averaging 6.4 yards per rush, the best mark among Panthers with at least 10 carries. He has produced 520 yards of total offense, accounting for nearly half of Georgia State's 1,046 total yards.

THE QUARTERBACKS' ROOM.

- Senior starting quarterback **Cameran Brown** leads the Panthers with 520 yards on 443 passing yards and 80 on the ground.
- Since arriving at Georgia State, Brown has thrown just two interceptions on 228 pass attempts. He threw only one interception across 185 attempts in 2025 and has one on 43 attempts this season.
- Getting the first start of the season, Brown went 15-for-20 for 190 passing yards and two touchdowns, including a game-log 30-yard pass to DJ Murray for the first touchdown of the season against North Carolina A&T (Sept. 4).
- Brown enters year two with the Panthers after joining the squad as a transfer in 2025. He earned the starting position as the quarterback in game seven of the 2025 season.
- Merrimack transfer **Ayden Pereira** took control of the quarterback position after halftime of the home opener and racked up 78 yards, including 28 on the ground and 50 through the air. The veteran quarterback scored his first touchdown as a Panther on a 17-yard run into the end zone.
- Freshman **Gavin Nuckolls** went a perfect 3-for-3 for 20 yards in his first collegiate start against NCA&T.
- Sophomore **TJ Stanley** got his first collegiate action against NCA&T, totaling 13 yards on two completions.
- Georgia State saw action from all five quarterbacks in the season opener against NCA&T. After seeing Cam Brown for the entirety of the first half, the Panthers saw action from the remaining four.

- Transfer running back **Lanear McCrary Jr.** leads the Panthers with 176 rushing yards and two touchdowns on 28 carries, averaging 6.3 yards per attempt. He recorded Georgia State's first 100-yard rushing performance of the season with 101 yards at Kennesaw State (Sept. 12).
- McCrary Jr. leads the conference in both total rushing yards (176) and rushing yards per-game (88.0).
- DJ Murray** has scored a team-high three touchdowns through two games, finding the end zone twice on the ground and once through the air. He has 138 yards from scrimmage with 75 rushing and 63 receiving.
- Murray notched a career-high two touchdowns in the Panthers' season-opener against NCA&T (Sept. 4).
- Murray and **Kyle Washington** are each averaging 21.0 yards per reception, while **Grant Hollier** has turned two catches into 65 yards for a team-best 32.5 yards per reception.
- Savion Hart** has made the most of his five rushing attempts, totaling 66 yards and a touchdown for an average of 13.2 yards per carry. His 41-yard run against North Carolina A&T is the Panthers' longest rush of the season.
- Rodshaun Dorsey** and **Derrick Avery Jr.** share the team lead with seven receptions a piece. Dorsey leads GSU with 88 receiving yards, while Avery has totaled 84 yards.

TRENCH WORK

- Georgia State has run 141 offensive plays through two games without allowing a sack, and have only given up four tackles for loss. Georgia State's O-line leads the nation in sacks allowed. They also lead the Sun Belt and rank seventh in the nation for fewest TFL allowed.
- Neither opponent has reached 100 rushing yards against Georgia State this season. North Carolina A&T finished with 84 yards, while Kennesaw State was held to 72. The Panthers are allowing just 78.0 rushing yards per game.

LOCKDOWN D

- The Panthers defense has racked up 102 tackles and 11 tackles for loss of 42 yards. They have held their opponents to 270.5 total yards per-game.
- Georgia State's defense has only allowed 6-of-23 (26.09%) third down conversions, and has not allowed a fourth down conversion yet this season.
- Coby Owens** leads the Panthers with eight tackles through two games, including a tackle for loss and a pass breakup.

PARTY IN THE BACKFIELD

- On the line, **Xavier Esqillion** leads the Panthers with 3.5 TFL, closely followed by **Jabriel Rhodes-Nelson** with three. They co-lead the panthers with two sacks a piece.
- Rhodes-Nelson has recorded three tackles for loss for 17 yards and two sacks for 13 yards through the first two games. His two-sack performance against North Carolina A&T (Sept. 4) is GSU's individual game high this season.

NO FLY ZONE

- In the backfield, Georgia State has racked up seven pass breakups and an interception. Sophomore **Tyson McCrary** leads the defensive backs with four breakups through the air.
- Deuce Lee** recorded Georgia State's first interception of the season at Kennesaw State (Sept. 12). Lee has five tackles and a pass breakup through two games.

SPECIAL TEAMS, SPECIAL PLAYERS

- Georgia State leads the Sun Belt and is fourth in the nation in net punting, averaging 49.7 yards per punt.
- Sophomore **Samer Layous** has a perfect 4-for-4 field goals to lead the nation in field goal percentage. He is also 9-for-9 PATs.
- Christian Teeter** is averaging 49.7 yards on his three punts this season, with two traveling 50-plus yards and all three downed inside the 20. His season long is 59 yards.
- The Panthers completed a blocked kick against NCA&T (Sept. 4) to mark the first blocked kick since 2023.

A RECORD-BREAKING SEASON OPENER

- In the Panthers' 59-10 win over North Carolina A&T, Georgia State broke the program record for most points in a game and the largest margin of victory, surpassing the previous mark of 55 (originally set vs. Savannah State in 2010 and matched vs. ULM in 2021).
- Georgia State's 35 first-half points tie for the second-most in a half in program history, matching the total against East Carolina in 2020.
- The Panthers' 24-point third quarter ties for the second-most points in a quarter in program history, marked against Texas State in 2016.
- The Panthers' 21-point second quarter ties for the third-most points in a quarter in program history, now done against 18 different opponents.
- Georgia State's blocked punt in the third quarter was the program's first since 2023.
- Defensively, the Panthers held the Aggies to 209 total offensive yards to mark the third-fewest yards allowed in a game.

KEY RETURNERS

- Senior **Cameran Brown** returns for year two as the Panthers' starting quarterback. Brown saw action in 10 games and started in four. He led the team through the air with 1,296 yards on 120 completions and 13 touchdowns... Limited his offensive game to only one interception throughout the entirety of the season.
- The Panthers returned key offensive performers in running back DJ Murray, receivers DJ Riles, Kyle Washington and DJ Avery Jr. and tight ends Grant Hollier and Avion McBride. On the front line, Georgia State also returned veterans Donovan Funsch, Tyler Williams and Deandre Duffus, who contributed to 2,586 yards in the air and 1,294 on the ground.

**GAME NOTES**

- Defensively, the Panthers also returned defensive backs Deuce Walker, Derrick Maxey III and Tyson McCrary, as well as linebackers Kelan Butler Coby Owens. On the line, Georgia State returned defensive ends Jabriel Rhodes-Nelson and Richard Kramer.

FROM THE TRANSFER PORTAL

- Beating last year's record for the biggest transfer class in program history, Georgia State brought in 37 transfers, including eight junior college student athletes.
- Head coach McGee welcomed eight transfers from Power 4 conferences, including: Jordan Brown (Arizona), Deylin Hassert (Iowa State), Jaydon Hood (Michigan), Marcus Mascoll (Florida), Keenan Nelson (Ohio State), Kelton Smith (Georgia), Gage Stanaland (Oklahoma State), Isaiah Stone (LSU).
- The Panthers also added G5 transfer Kelze Howard from Oregon State.

FRESHMEN FACES

- Georgia State added 24 fresh faces from the high school class of 2026, adding depth on both sides of the ball.
- Expected to see action on the offense is Quantavious Wiggins, an Atlanta native from Langston Hughes, who was one of the top rated running backs out of high school.

GEORGIA GROWN

- Sixty five Panthers hail from the Peach State, making up more than half of Georgia State's roster playing in their home state.

THE MCGEE ERA

- Head Coach Dell McGee enters his third season at the helm of the Georgia State Panthers football program.
- Dell McGee, a Columbus, Ga., native with 22 years of coaching experience, including back-to-back national titles as the run game coordinator and running backs coach for the Georgia Bulldogs, was named the fourth head football coach in Georgia State history on Feb. 23, 2024.
- Although this is McGee's first full-time head coaching position, he was already 1-0 coming in to his head coaching position at Georgia State. He led Georgia Southern to a 58-27 win over Bowling Green in the 2015 GoDaddy Bowl while serving as interim head coach.
- Playing just its 16th season of football and 12th at the FBS level, Georgia State has already played in six bowl games (4-2 record) and five in the last seven years, including last year's 45-22 win over Utah State in the Famous Idaho Potato Bowl.

THE PANTHERS STAFF

- McGee returned eight assistant coaches from the 2025 staff, highlighted by offensive coordinator Hue Jackson and wide receivers coach Dameyune Craig, who was elevated to the Associate Head Coach position.
- McGee elevated Zach Conowal, former special teams assistant, to the Special Teams Coordinator position.

- Co-Defensive Coordinators Cam Clark and John Haneline joined the Panthers staff in Jan. 2026.
- McGee also returned position coaches in Enrique Davis (RB), Casey Roddick (OL), Juwan Taylor (ILB) and Ryan Williams (QB).

PANTHERS IN THE PROS

- Wide Receiver Ted Hurst was selected by the Tampa Bay Buccaneers as the No. 84 overall pick in the 2026 NFL Draft, becoming the highest draft pick in Georgia State history.
- 2024 graduate Ben Chukwuma made the 53-man roster for the Tampa Bay Buccaneers. The Offensive tackle signed as a free agent on May 9, 2025.
- Defensive tackle Travis Glover, who played at Georgia State from 2018-23, was selected by the Green Bay Packers in the sixth round (202nd overall) of the 2024 NFL Draft.
- Kicker Will Lutz, who played at Georgia State from 2012-15, signed with the New Orleans Saints in 2016 and kicked for the Saints through the 2022 season. Lutz was traded to the Denver Broncos prior to the 2023 season.
- Nick Arbuckle, who played at Georgia State 2014-15, went to mini-camp with the Pittsburgh Steelers in 2016. Since then, he has played in the CFL with the Calgary Stampeders, Ottawa Red Blacks, Edmonton Elks and Toronto Argonauts. He Helped lead the Argonauts to the CFL's Grey Cup championship in 2024.

SEASON OPENERS

- The 2026 season marks the first time since 2023, and the first time in the McGee era, that Georgia State hosts the season-opener.
- Georgia State is 7-10 in season openers after defeating North Carolina A&T this season.
- With this season's home-opener, the Panthers have hosted 12 of the program's 16 total season-openers, including the first nine from 2010-18.
- The Panthers opened on the road for just the fourth time in 15 seasons of existence last season, including three in the last four seasons. The only other time that GSU has opened the season on the road was the 2019 upset against Tennessee (38-30).
- Georgia State is opening on a Friday for the fifth time since the team's inception. The team opened on a weeknight for its first nine years of existence and then again during the 2023 season, including five Thursday games, four Fridays and one Wednesday.

Coach McGee and the Panthers football staff made 67 additions to the 2024 roster, with a mix of freshmen and veteran Transfers.

 HEAD COACH DELL McGEE

DELL McGEE, a Georgia native with 22 years of coaching experience, including back-to-back national titles as the run game coordinator and running backs coach for the Georgia Bulldogs, was named the fourth head football coach in Georgia State history by GSU President Dr. M. Brian Blake and Director of Athletics Charlie Cobb on Feb. 23, 2024.

“We are proud to announce Coach Dell McGee as our head football coach,” Cobb said upon McGee’s hiring. “Coach McGee is an outstanding and authentic man with a strong passion for developing young men. His track record of competitive success at the high school and college levels makes me confident that he will lead our football program to its greatest achievements. We welcome Linda and Dell to Georgia State University!”

In his first season at the helm of the Panthers, McGee formed the biggest recruiting class Georgia State has ever seen, bringing in nearly 50 newcomers to the roster. Despite a short timeline to form a team of his own, McGee coached the Panthers to a 36-32 upset over Vanderbilt to mark the first time in program history that the Panthers have beaten a Power 5 opponent on home turf.

McGee took over a Georgia State program that began play 2010 and has appeared in six bowl games in the last nine years, winning four, including three in the last four seasons.

The Columbus, Ga., native has spent almost his entire coaching career in his home state. He served the last eight seasons at Georgia, where his abilities as a coach and recruiter have contributed to the Bulldogs’ remarkable run of success under Kirby Smart. McGee has been a key part of a Georgia program that has amassed 94 victories in eight seasons, highlighted by back-to-back College Football Playoff national championships in 2021 and 2022 as well as a berth in the 2017 CFP title game, eight bowl victories, two Southeastern Conference titles and six SEC Eastern Division crowns.

Rivals.com named McGee the 2018 National Recruiter of the Year after the Bulldogs signed the consensus No. 1-rated recruiting class, and he helped recruit and develop Georgia’s 56 NFL draft picks from 2017-23, including 15 first-rounders and an NFL-record 25 players drafted over the last two years.

McGee joined Smart’s original Georgia staff in 2016 as running backs coach, the position he worked with throughout his tenure in Athens. He also served



as assistant head coach in 2018, and then in 2019, he was named run game coordinator.

In his eight seasons at UGA, McGee coached four 1,000-yard rushers: Nick Chubb in 2016-17; Sony Michel in 2017; D’Andre Swift in 2018-19; and Elijah Holyfield in 2018. Chubb and Michel amassed over 8,400 combined yards and 87 touchdowns. Chubb, Michel, and Swift, as well as James Cook and Zamir White, were all taken in the first four rounds of the NFL Draft.

Before going to Georgia, McGee worked two seasons as the running backs coach at Georgia Southern (2014-15). In December 2015, he served as the interim head coach and led the Eagles to a victory in the GoDaddy Bowl.

He spent the 2013 season as an analyst at Auburn, his alma mater, and was part of the staff that led the Tigers to a berth in the 2013-14 BCS national championship game, one of McGee’s four appearances coaching in the national championship game. He was also part of an undefeated team as a player at Auburn, where he helped preserve the Tigers’ undefeated 1993 season with a critical interception against Alabama.

He began his coaching career in the prep ranks as an assistant coach at Georgia high schools Harris County (2002) and Greenville (2003-04) and then earned his first head coaching position at Carver-Columbus High School in 2005. He built that program into a perennial powerhouse that recorded seven straight seasons with 10 or more wins from 2006-2012, highlighted by the 2007 Class AAA state title.

McGee attended Kendrick High School in Columbus, Ga., and then was a two-year starter and four-year letterwinner at Auburn from 1992-95.

He was drafted in the fifth round of the 1996 NFL Draft by the Arizona Cardinals and spent time with the Cardinals and Detroit Lions over three NFL seasons. He also played in NFL Europe, the XFL and the Arena Football League in a seven-year professional career.

Dell and his wife Linda have one son, Austin, a member of the Panthers football team who signed with Georgia State in December 2023.

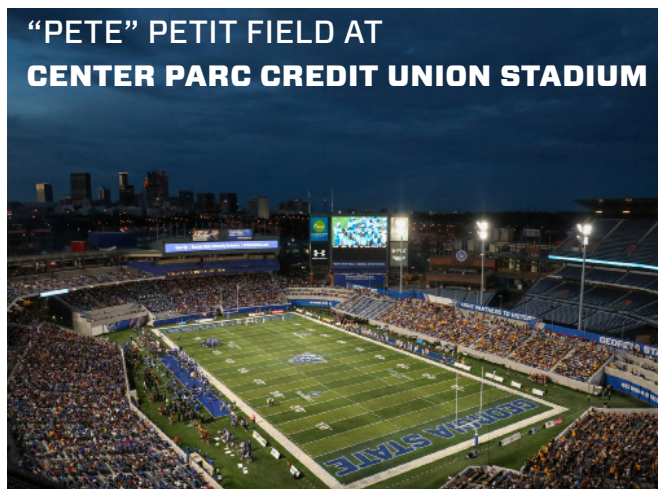

"PETE" PETIT FIELD AT CENTER PARC CREDIT UNION STADIUM



CENTER PARC CREDIT UNION STADIUM

is the home of Georgia State football. The Panthers took over this iconic property, formerly Centennial Olympic Stadium and then Turner Field, for the 2017 season.

The facility was renamed Center Parc Credit Union Stadium as part of a 15-year, \$21 million agreement between Center Parc Credit Union, a division of Atlanta Postal Credit Union (APCU), and Georgia State Athletics, announced on Aug. 11, 2020.

Center Parc Stadium features 25,000 seats for football, a FieldTurf playing surface on "Pete" Petit Field and dramatic views of the Atlanta skyline. The conversion process incorporated the existing seating areas on the north, west and south sides of the stadium with a new grandstand constructed on the east side, formerly the outfield.

The Panthers are in their fifth season in this impressive venue, which also houses the Football Operations Suite, completed in 2019. All of the program's day-to-day operations are at Center Parc Stadium, including practice, weight room, meetings rooms, coaches' offices, athletic training room and equipment room.

Center Parc Stadium was originally constructed as the 85,000-seat Centennial Olympic Stadium and used for the 1996 Centennial Olympic Games. Following the Olympic Games, much of the north end of the stadium was removed in order to convert it to the 49,000-seat baseball park that served as the home of the Atlanta Braves from 1997 through 2016.

The Braves played their final game at Turner Field on Oct. 2, 2016. In November 2016, the Board of Regents approved Georgia State University's purchase of 38 acres of the 68-acre site for \$22.8 million, and the conversion process began in early 2017.

The redevelopment of this iconic property also includes the Georgia State University Convocation Center, which opened in 2022 at the north end of the property, and new Georgia State baseball and softball facilities to be constructed on the footprint of the former Atlanta-Fulton County stadium. Residential, retail and corporate facilities are being developed by Carter and Associates.

Panthers Take Home Opener in Record-Breaking Fashion

ATLANTA-- Georgia State had a record-breaking season opener, defeating North Carolina A&T 59-10 in a Friday night showdown at Center Parc Credit Union Stadium.

"Congratulations to our players and team for tonight's win," head coach Dell McGee said. "They allowed their preparation to carry over into the game where our players got to make the game plan come to life. They did just that and we are happy about the win."

In a 49-point win, the Panthers set the program record for most points scored in a game, largest margin of victory and largest student-body attendance in program history. Seven different players reached the end zone, including two touchdowns from Dennis Murray Jr. to aid the Panthers in the win.

The 59 points broke the previous program mark of 55, set against ULM in 2021 and against Savannah State in 2010. The 49-point margin of victory is also the largest in program history, and Georgia State's 35 first-half points ties for the second-most in a half in program history, matching the 35 the Panthers put up against East Carolina in 2020. The 24-point third quarter ties for the second-most points scored in a single quarter in program history, a mark now shared against Texas State from 2016. A blocked punt in the third quarter, Georgia State's first since 2023, helped set up one of nine Panther scoring drives.

Cameron Brown led Georgia State's passing attack, completing 15 of 20 attempts for 190 yards and two touchdowns without an interception. Lanear McCrary Jr. paced the ground game with 75 yards and a touchdown on 9 carries (8.3 per carry), while Savion Hart added 61 yards and a score on just 4 totes, including a 41-yard touchdown burst. Murray Jr. found the end zone twice, once on a 30-yard touchdown catch from Brown to open the scoring, and again on a 14-yard touchdown run.

Jabriel Rhodes-Nelson anchored the Georgia State defense with three tackles, 2.0 tackles for loss and two sacks. Xavier Esquillon added four tackles, 2.5 TFL and a sack, and Aaron Moore chipped in a sack of his own.

"We got an opportunity to play a lot of guys, which was good to see," McGee said. "Those guys earned the opportunity, and when you're on scout team all week then get the chance to play, that allows those guys to better prepare for harder competition."

Offensively, Georgia State piled up 563 total yards, 284 rushing and 279 passing, averaging 7.9 yards per play. The Panthers converted 7 of 12 third downs and were 1-for-1 on fourth down. Defensively, Georgia State limited NC A&T to just 209 total yards (84 rushing, 125 passing) while sacking Aggies quarterbacks five times for 28 yards and totaling nine tackles for loss.

"I want to give a shoutout to the fans and thank them for coming out tonight" McGee said. "That was the best attendance we have ever had as a program since I have been here."

How It Happened

Cameron Brown found Murray Jr. deep down the right sideline for a 30-yard touchdown, capping a lightning-quick, one-play, six-second drive to make it 7-0 with 7:17 left in the first quarter.

The Panthers weren't done in the opening frame. Georgia State put together an 11-play, 90-yard march, finishing it off when McCrary Jr. punched in an 8-yard touchdown run as time expired in the first, extending the lead to 14-0.

NC A&T got its first answer in the second quarter, with a 61-yard catch-and-run touchdown to make it 14-7, but Georgia State answered right back. The Panthers put together an 11-play, 70-yard drive, and capped it with a 2-yard touchdown run from Qwantavius Wiggins to push the margin back to 21-7. Murray Jr.'s second score of the night, a 14-yard scamper, and an 8-yard touchdown pass from Brown to Jamari Miller with 19 seconds left in the half rounded out a three-touchdown second quarter for Georgia State, and the Panthers took a commanding 35-7 lead into the break.

Georgia State kept its foot on the gas out of the locker room. Ayden Pereira, filling in at quarterback, capped a 60-yard drive with a 17-yard touchdown scramble on the third play of the second half to make it 42-7. Two drives later, after NC A&T's punt was blocked and recovered at the Aggies' own 8-yard line, the Panthers' offense stalled in the red zone but Samer Layous connected on a 26-yard field goal to make it 45-7. Savion Hart then broke a 41-yard touchdown run on the very next Georgia State snap, and Xavier Butler capped the third-quarter outburst with a 20-yard touchdown run with 1:42 left, pushing the score to a staggering 59-7 and completing a 24-point third quarter for the Panthers.

NC A&T's lone points of the second half came on a 39-yard field goal early in the fourth quarter, the culmination of a 13-play, 53-yard drive, the Aggies' longest of the night. Georgia State's offense went quiet in the fourth as the Panthers ran clock, and NC A&T was unable to find the end zone again, kneeling out the final possession from inside its own 10-yard line.

Game Notes

- » Georgia State's 59 points set a new program record for a single game, surpassing the previous mark of 55 (vs. ULM, 2021 and vs. Savannah State, 2010).
- » The 49-point margin of victory is the largest in program history.
- » Georgia State's 35 first-half points tie for the second-most in a half in program history, matching the total against East Carolina in 2020.
- » The Panthers' 24-point third quarter ties for the second-most points in a quarter in program history, marked against Texas State in 2016.
- » The Panthers' 21-point second quarter ties for the third-most points in a quarter in program history, now done against 18 different opponents.
- » Georgia State's blocked punt in the third quarter was the program's first since 2023.
- » Georgia State outgained NC A&T 563-209, including a 284-84 edge on the ground.
- » The Panthers scored first with 7:17 left in the first quarter and never trailed.
- » Seven different Georgia State players scored a touchdown with Dennis Murray Jr. scored twice.
- » Georgia State converted 7 of 12 third downs, compared to NC A&T's 4 of 14.
- » Christian Teeter punted twice for Georgia State, averaging 45.0 yards per punt with two of his kicks downed inside the 20.

Brown, McCrary Carry Panthers to 31-17 Victory Against Kennesaw State

KENNESAW, Ga -- Georgia State used a big 230-yard performance on the ground, including 101 yards from Lanear McCrary Jr., and three rushing touchdowns to pick up a 31-17 win against Kennesaw State Saturday night on the road at Walens Family Field at Fifth Third Stadium.

"I'm super proud of everybody in our organization that helped make this happen tonight," Head Coach Dell McGee said. "It's all about preparation, and as long as our guys continue to believe in the process, good things will continue to happen."

The triumph improved Georgia State's record to 2-0 on the season while the Owls fell to 1-1.

Cameron Brown led Georgia State's passing attack with 253 yards through the air. The signal caller also added 62 yards and one touchdown on the ground.

McCrary Jr. paced the Panthers rushing attack by accumulating 101 yards and one touchdown over the course of the game, averaging 5.3 yards per carry.

Kyle Washington hauled in two catches for 59 yards.

Deuce Lee showed out for the Georgia State defense, totaling five tackles and one interception. Xavier Esquillion added three tackles, 1.0 TFL, and one sack.

Georgia State recorded a big showing on the ground, racking up 230 rushing yards while averaging 4.9 yards per carry and out-rushing Kennesaw State by 158 yards. Georgia State converted on 46.2 percent of third-down attempts on the day.

Defensively, Georgia State held up fairly well against the Kennesaw State offensive attack, holding the Owls to 332 total yards.

"Our guys handled the tempo well, and I thought our defense played outstanding tonight," McGee said on the defensive performance. "The key was stopping them on first down, and I think our guys did a great job on that."

How It Happened

Georgia State scored on the game's first drive to take a 3-0 lead. Kennesaw State then tied things up at 3-3 before the Panthers responded with a 27-yard field goal from to jump back in front 6-3.

Georgia State then added a touchdown with 12:02 left in the second quarter to make it a 14-3 lead. The Panthers kept building their lead, scoring again to go up 21-3.

Georgia State continued to extend its lead, scoring again with 4:42 remaining in the third quarter to go ahead 28-3. The Owls then rallied, tallying eight points before the Panthers responded with a field goal to extend their lead to 31-11. Georgia State didn't score again and Kennesaw State added six more points to finish off the scoring.

- » Georgia State outgained Kennesaw State 483-332, including a 230-72 advantage on the ground.
- » The Panthers scored first with 9:18 left in the first quarter and never trailed the rest of the game on their way to victory.
