WEEK 11: SOUTH DAKOTA STATE AT CAL BAPTIST, AIR FORCE

THE LEAD

The South Dakota State wrestling program is heading west this week as they take on Cal Baptist and Air Force on Thursday and Saturday. These are the first two Big 12 conference duals for the Jackrabbits since their dual with Northern Iowa in November, where they lost a narrow contest, 16-15 on criteria.

KEY STORYLINES

- **The New:** South Dakota State added four transfers in September from the University of Iowa: Zach Glazier, Cobe and Cade Siebrecht and Drake Rhodes. The transfers come in alongside six freshmen.
- **The Old:** SDSU returns seven of its 10 starters from last year, including All-Americans Tanner Jordan, Cade DeVos and Bennett Berge. The team also returns NCAA Qualifiers Derrick Cardinal, Alek Martin and Cael Swensen
- **Program Records:** The Jacks brought home a program record four All-Americans in 2023-24 with Tanner Jordan, Cade DeVos, Bennett Berge and Tanner Sloan. The Jacks tied their program record of eight NCAA Qualifiers by sending Cardinal, Martin, Swensen and Clay Carlson.
- **Experience Matters:** The projected starting lineup for the Jackrabbits this year includes five athletes in their sixth year of collegiate eligibility. Amongst those five athletes, they total eight NCAA Qualifications, 1 Big 12 Title and two All-American honors.
- **In the Rankings:** SDSU is ranked No. 12 in the NWCA Coaches Poll this week. They are up two spots from last week when they were ranked No. 14. The Jacks come in ranked at No. 3 in the NWCA Coaches Mid-Major Poll.
- **Home Mat Advantage:** The Jackrabbits put up a home record in 2023-24 of 7-1. Their only loss came to fellow ranked program Missouri, only losing the dual 19-21. SDSU scored over 30 points in six of their eight home duals.
- **In the Classroom:** The SDSU wrestling program had the fourth highest team GPA in the country amongst wrestling programs last year, according to NWCA. The Jackrabbits compiled a 3.5416 team grade-point average to receive the team recognition for the fourth season in a row and were the highest-ranking Big 12 Conference school.
- **New Staff, Familiar Faces:** Two-Time All-American Clay Carlson was added to the wrestling coaching staff in the offseason as an assistant coach. Carlson wrestled at SDSU for six years and was a four-time NCAA qualifier, two-time All-American and two-time Big 12 Wrestling scholar athlete of the year. Brady Berge was also promoted on the staff from volunteer assistant coach to the head coach of the JWC regional training center.
- **Individual Rankings:** The Jacks have a wrestler ranked in nine of 10 weight classes as we hit week 11 of the college wrestling season. Drake Rhodes, Luke Rasmussen, Julian Tagg and Derrick Cardinal have been the biggest movers, going from unranked in the pre-season to ranked in FloWrestling's polls as of week 11
- **Series vs. Cal Baptist, Air Force:** SDSU is 2-0 all-time against Cal Baptist with the last meeting between the two schools taking place in 2024. SDSU took the dual that day in dominant fashion, 39-3. The Jacks are 9-9 all-time against Air Force, the last meeting between the two schools took place in 2024 and featured a dominant 32-9 Jackrabbit victory. The Jacks will look to take a lead in the all-time series against the Falcons this weekend.

COACHING NOTES

Damion Hahn is overseeing a successful rebuilding of South Dakota State University wrestling as he enters his seventh season at the helm of the Jackrabbits' program.

During the 2019-20 season, the National Wrestling Coaches Association selected 149-pounder Henry Pohlmeier, 184-pounder Zach Carlson and 197-pounder Tanner Sloan as second-team All-Americans after the NCAA Championships were canceled at the onset of the COVID-19 pandemic.

The Jackrabbits returned to the winning side of the ledger during the 2021-22 campaign and also cracked the national rankings as a team for the first time since early in Hahn's first season.

In postseason competition, SDSU placed sixth at the 2022 Big 12 Wrestling Championship and sent four wrestlers on to the NCAA Championships in Detroit.

The 2022-23 season included a 10-dual winning streak en route to a 12-4 record. The Jackrabbits also were strong in tournament settings, placing third at the Cliff Keen Las Vegas Invitational in December and posting a sixth-place finish at the Big 12 Wrestling Championship.

SDSU went on to send a program-record eight wrestlers to the NCAA Championships, coming away with a 14th-place finish and two All-Americans — Clay Carlson, who placed fifth at 141 pounds and 197-pound runner-up Tanner Sloan.

In the 2023-24 season, Hahn led SDSU to one of their most successful seasons during his tenure. During January, the Jackrabbits went undefeated at home on their way to a 13-4 record overall and a 7-2 conference record in the Big 12.

SDSU sent eight more wrestlers to the NCAA Championships in 2023-24, matching their total from the prior season. The Jackrabbits had their most successful year at the NCAA's with a program record four All-Americans, Bennett Berge, Tanner Jordan, Tanner Sloan and Cade DeVos.

Hahn's teams also have performed well in the classroom, earning Top 30 Scholar Team All-America honors from the National Wrestling Coaches Association each of the past four seasons. The 2021-22 squad ranked seventh among Division I programs with a 3.465 grade-point average and six Jackrabbits were recognized individually as NWCA Scholar All-America honorees.

JACKRABBIT NOTES

UP THIS WEEK - Cal Baptist, Air Force

The Jacks head to Riverside, California for a dual against Cal Baptist on Thursday this week. The Jacks are 2-0 against Cal Baptist all-time with their last meeting ending in a dominant 39-3 dual victory for the Jacks.

On Saturday, SDSU heads to the USAFA for a dual with Air Force. The all-time series between the two schools is tied 9-9. The last meeting between the two schools took place in 2024 and ended in a 32-6 victory for the Jackrabbits.

The Jacks will look to build momentum off of a strong showing at the NWCA National duals where they took second behind the 1-seed No. 7 Northern Iowa.

LAST TIME OUT - NWCA National Duals

The Jacks took second at NWCA National Duals this weekend as they split their matches against No. 17 Little Rock and No. 7 UNI on Saturday.

In their first dual of the day, SDSU went up against No. 17 Little Rock. Tanner Jordan started the day for the Jacks with bonus points as he scored a 9-1 decision over Jayden Carson to give SDSU an early lead. Julian Tagg added to the lead at 141 pounds when he took down Brennan Van Hoecke 14-5 to add another four points to the Jacks lead.

SDSU dropped their matches at 149 and 157 pounds by decision allowing Little Rock to take a slight lead after five matches, 10-8. Marcus Espinoza-Owens got the Jacks back on the right track by upsetting No. 24 Joseph Bianchi at 165 pounds with a 13-6 decision.

Cade DeVos followed up Espinoza-Owens with a dominant 8-2 decision against Tyler Brennan. In the highlight match from the dual, No. 6 Bennett Berge took on No. 10 Brock DelSignore. Each wrestler had one point from an escape coming down to the last minute of the match when Berge scored a huge takedown to take a decision 5-1 over DelSignore. This put the Jacks up 17-10 with two matches left.

Thomas Dineen put up a good fight against No. 6 Stephen Little, holding the top-ranked 197-pounder to a 7-3 decision. No. 25 Luke Rasmussen finished the dual with an impressive pinfall victory over Keith Miley at 5:45 of the match to secure the victory for the Jacks, 23-13.

In the championship dual, the Jacks wouldn't fare as well. After a late takedown by Tanner Jordan put the Jacks on the board with a decision win, the Jacks would drop the rest of the matches, allowing UNI to take the bout

31-3.

Derrick Cardinal, Marcus Espinoza-Owens, and Cade DeVos had tightly contested matches at 133, 165 and 174 pounds. Cardinal gained an early lead against Julian Farber with a takedown but couldn't build any momentum, dropping a decision 6-3. Marcus Espinoza-Owens faced a tough challenge going up against No. 18 Jack Thomsen. After each wrestler scored an escape, Thomsen was able to push through a takedown and take a decision over Espinoza-Owens. DeVos battled with No. 16 Jared Simma for the third time this year. After scoring a late takedown to go up 5-4 in the match, DeVos gave up a late reversal, allowing Simma to take the 6-5 decision and go 2-1 against DeVos for the year.

LINEUP BREAKDOWN

125 - The projected starter at 125 pounds is All-American Tanner Jordan. Jordan went 28-12 overall last year and was 12-4 at the 125 spot in duals. The likely backups to Jordan at 125 are Brady Roark and Daniel Guanajuato. In open competition last year, Roark went 12-4 and scored eight of his 12 wins by technical fall. Guanajuato did not compete last year, as he was focused on training in his first year of collegiate competition.

133 - The likely starter at 133 pounds is Derrick Cardinal. Cardinal put up a 23-11 record overall last year and a 10-4 dual record at the 133 pound spot last season. This was capped off by a NCAA qualification for Cardinal. The projected backups for Cardinal at the 133 pound spot are freshman Kenton Cooke and Cale Seaton. Cooke, a freshman from Anchorage, Alaska, was a two-time state champion at 130 and 140 pounds his junior and senior years in Alaska. Cale Seaton, a freshman from Iowa City, Iowa, was also a two-time state champion in Iowa at 126 and 132 pounds. He was also a four-time medalist during his time in Iowa City.

141 - 141 pounds is a spot where the Jacks will have a good amount of competition. Two wrestlers that could compete at the 141 spot are Avery Allen and Julian Tagg. Avery Allen enters his redshirt freshman year with the Jackrabbits after going 9-0 across two tournaments in 2023-24. Julian Tagg joins the Jackrabbits after transferring in from North Carolina where he did not see much competition. Caleb Gross also enters his sixth year with the program, after returning from injury in December. He is 29-32 for his career as a Jackrabbit.

149 - Due to an injury at 149 pounds, there will be a competition at the weight class. The two wrestlers likely to fit in at 149 pounds

are Daniel Kimball and Colin Dupill. Kimball, a senior from Buckingham, Iowa, went 14-4 last year and 1-0 in duals as he backed up Alek Martin at 149 pounds. He won 11 of his bouts by decision. Colin Dupill, a redshirt freshman from Greenville, Tenn., went 10-5 overall last year and 1-0 in duals, the same as Kimball last season. He got two wins by technical fall, one win by major decision and seven of his wins by decision.

157 - The projected starter at 157 pounds is sixth year senior Cobe Siebrecht. Siebrecht transferred from the University of Iowa to SDSU in September alongside his brother Cade, Drake Rhodes and Zach Glazier. Siebrecht sat out the 2023-24 season at Iowa, but in 2022-23 was an NCAA qualifier at 157 pounds for the Hawkeyes. He posted a 14-8 record overall in 2022-23 and was 11-6 in duals, adding six wins against ranked foes. SDSU returns NCAA qualifier Cael Swensen at 157 pounds as well, but due to an injury, Swensen will most likely not compete in 2024-25. The likely backup at 157 pounds is redshirt freshman Moses Espinoza-Owens. Espinoza-Owens went 13-7 in open tournaments and won seven of his 13 wins by major decision, technical fall or fall.

165 - With the graduation of starter Tanner Cook at 165 pounds, the starting spot is a wide open competition for the Jackrabbits. The three wrestlers with a chance at the spot are Connor Gaynor, Drake Rhodes and Marcus Espinoza-Owens. Connor Gaynor, a junior from Mokena, Ill., went 2-8 his sophomore season with the Jacks and 1-4 in duals. Marcus Espinoza-Owens, a redshirt freshman from Woods Cross, Utah, went 15-8 overall in 2023-24 and won six of his bouts by technical fall. Drake Rhodes, a redshirt sophomore who transferred from the University of Iowa, posted a 17-9 record through two years of competition with the Hawkeyes. All three wrestlers will have the opportunity to earn the spot at 165 pounds.

174 - At 174 pounds the projected starter is All-American Cade DeVos. DeVos went 28-3 overall and 15-1 in dual competition. DeVos also won the Big 12 title at 174 pounds on his way to his fourth NCAA qualification. DeVos is pencilled in but should have many athletes behind him as backups. Burk Blasius and Riggan Boger should have the opportunity to backup DeVos when it comes to dual season. Blasius, a freshman from Wall, S.D, was a four-time state champion in Class B at 160, 170 and 175 pounds. Riggan Boger is heading into his redshirt freshman year at SDSU. Boger went 5-5 in open competition last year after winning four state titles in high school at South Summit high school in Francis, Utah.

184 - The projected starter at 184 pounds for the Jacks is All-American Bennett Berge. Berge

went 25-7 overall and 11-2 at the 184 pound spot in route to a fourth place finish at the NCAA Championships in 2023-24. Backing him up at 184 pounds you could see Burk Blasius, Brock Fettig or Jared Thiry. Brock Fettig went 13-3 in open tournaments and 0-2 in duals at 165 pounds in 2023-24. Jared Thiry went 3-14 at 197 pounds in 2023-24.

197 - The projected starter at 197 pounds is Iowa transfer Zach Glazier. Glazier was the runner-up at Big 10 Tournament in 2023-24 at 197 pounds. Glazier was 14-4 in dual matches and scored nine wins over ranked opponents. Over four years of competition at Iowa, he went 37-9. Backing him up at 197 pounds are Tommy Dineen and Cody Donnelly. Dineen, a redshirt freshman from Hancock, Minn., went 17-6 overall in 2023-24 and 3-0 in duals. He won all three of his dual matches by fall or technical fall. He rattled off an 11 match win streak to close his season, winning by fall or technical fall in seven of the 11 matches. Cody Donnelly, a senior from Phillip, S.D., backed up Tanner Sloan at 197 pounds last year and put up an 8-3 overall record while competing in three open tournaments. He ended the season on a seven-match winning streak and claimed individual co-championships at both the Worthington Open and Don Parker Open.

285 - Luke Rasmussen is the projected starter at 285 pounds for the Jacks this season. Rasmussen went 17-13 overall in 2023-24 and 6-8 in duals. He finished seventh at the Big 12 Championships. Backing him up at 285 pounds Kail Wynia. Wynia went 11-3 in his redshirt freshman year, with six wins by technical fall and two by pinfall.

WRESTLER TO WATCH: Julian Tagg

Julian Tagg has become the starter by committee for the Jacks at 141 pounds. The junior has two top-10 ranked wins over No. 5 Cael Happel and No. 9 CJ Composto this year. Tagg's win over No. 9 CJ Composto of Penn, helped jumpstart the Jackrabbits in their dual after dropping the first two matches at 125 and 133 pounds. After Tagg's decision win, the Jackrabbits would take five of the seven remaining matches to win the dual, 21-16.

Tagg enters the rankings for the first time this year at No. 24 in FloWrestling's rankings and No. 31 in InterMat's rankings. The junior from Lodi, Ohio will be the starter at 141 pounds for the Jacks this week as they take on Cal Baptist and Air Force. He will be one to watch going forward for the Jackrabbits this season.

JACK-ADEMICS

Head coach Damion Hahn's squad competes vigorously on the mat and in the classroom.

Last year's squad came in at fourth in the

country in team GPA with a 3.5416 team grade-point average. This was the fourth year in a row that Hahn's squad was honored by the NWCA. The team grade-point average was also the highest in the Big 12 last year.

Seven Jackrabbit wrestlers were also honored by the NWCA as NCAA Scholar All-Americans. These wrestlers were Bennett Berge, Derrick Cardinal, Clay Carlson, Cade DeVos, Daniel Kimball, Tanner Sloan and Cael Swensen. Carlson and DeVos were each honored for the fourth time in their collegiate careers, while Cardinal, Sloan and Swensen all received recognition for the second time.
