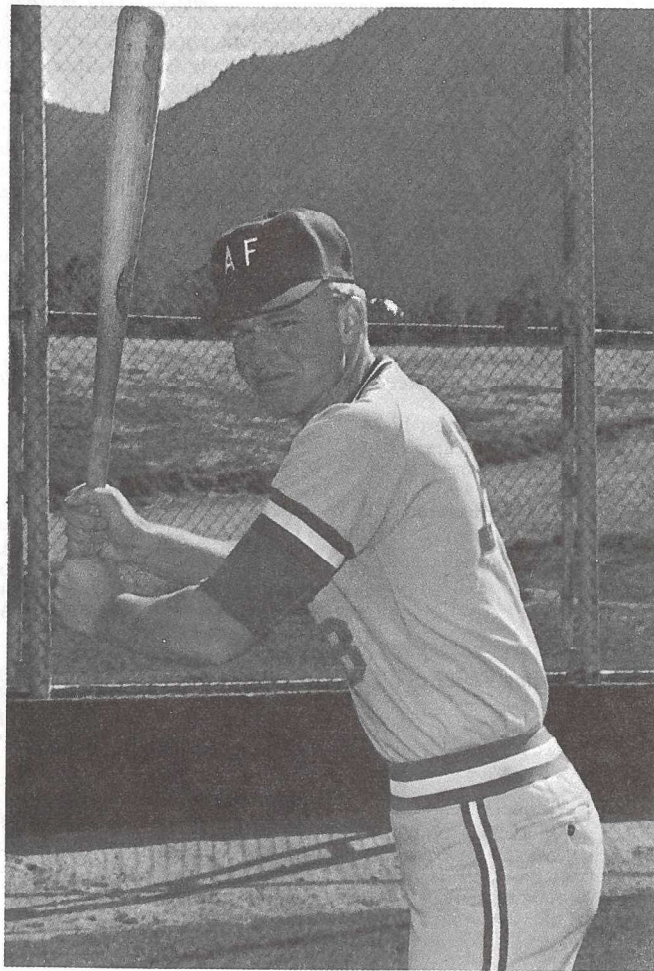

Head Baseball Coach

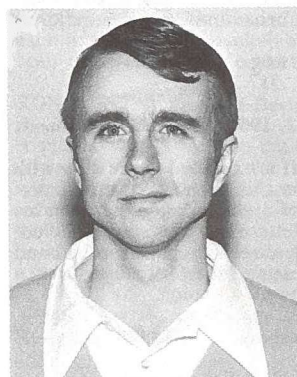
Returning after a year's absence, Captain Robison will be in his sixth year at the helm of the Air Force varsity baseball team. A dedicated professional to both the Air Force and the game of baseball, the Falcon coach has put together a winning percentage of just under 50 percent against some of the toughest competition in the District 7 Region, and would like nothing better than return the Falcons to the Playoffs, a spot the team has been out of since the 1969 season.

Holder of a BA and a Master's degree in physical education from Baylor University, Robison spent a year's temporary duty last season at King Salmon AFB, AK.

A veteran of collegiate, semi-pro and Armed Forces baseball competition, Captain Robison lettered four years as a pitcher at Baylor, and helped the Bears to a co-championship in the Southwest Conference in 1966. Captain Robison, who entered the Air Force in 1957 as an enlisted man, played two seasons of service ball in England, being named to the United Kingdom All-Star team each season. The Falcon coach received an ROTC commission following his graduation from Baylor in 1967.

Captain Robison has been a physical education instructor at the Academy since July 1969. He has been a member of the National Association of College Baseball Coaches Rules Committee.

Married, Captain Robison and his wife Nancy have a son Daniel and two daughters, Lori Ann and Melissa Alma.



CAPTAIN PHIL KECK
Head Junior Varsity Coach

Beginning his second season as head junior varsity coach, Captain Keck helped lead the 1976 team to a strong 12-4 record and helped groom several of the players who will be starting on the varsity squad this season.

A 1969 graduate of the Air Force Academy, Captain Keck played three years of varsity baseball as an infielder and was on teams that competed in the national collegiate playoffs in 1967 and 1969.

Following graduation, Captain Keck was assigned to pilot training at Randolph AFB, TX, then served as a KC-135 pilot at Beale AFB, CA, and was a pilot of an EC-47 aircraft at DaNang AB, Vietnam. Captain Keck received his assignment to the Academy in July 1975. In addition to his coaching duties, he instructs in handball, boxing, racquetball and golf intramural programs.

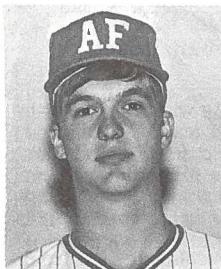

KARL APFEL — First Base — Freshman — 6-0, 180 — R — L — Elkhart, IN — No 14B; 14W.

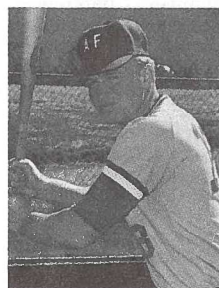
An all-state player from Indiana's Elkhart Memorial High School, Karl is expected to continue the strong defensive job required of all Academy first basemen. A left-handed thrower, Karl's measurements should fill the bill with ease. As a prep star, Karl led his conference in most triples in a season, most runs batted in during a career and won two varsity basketball letters. Two of his goals are to be a pilot after graduation and to contribute to a winning Academy baseball season.



DAVE ATZHORN — Pitcher — Junior — 6-2, 180 — R — R — Merrillville, IN — 13-13

A returning letterman from last season, Dave had the fourth lowest earned run average on the 1976 team, 4.56, starting three games and appearing in three others in relief. One of his top 1976 games was a 2-1 victory over Wyoming while in another he pitched Air Force to an 11-4 decision over Southern Colorado. A hard-throwing right hander, Dave is rated as a top prospect this season.

KYLE BARTELS — Shortstop — Junior — 6-2, 180 — R — R — Elk Grove, CA — 23-23

A starter midway through last season, Kyle made the most of his opportunities by banging out a .317 batting average and playing a strong shortstop position. A junior varsity standout at the Academy before being called up to the varsity, Kyle will captain the 1977 squad and will help anchor the Air Force infield. Kyle, who earned his first varsity letter last season, was also a good athlete as a prep, lettering twice in baseball and basketball at Elk Grove High School. Kyle is a behavioral sciences major at the Academy.

JEFF BRAKE — Catcher — Junior — 6-2, 190 — R — R — Wilmont, MN

New to Air Force baseball this season, Jeff is expected to see duty with both the varsity and junior varsity teams this season. A strong performer, Jeff brings to the team the role of a versatile athlete from his high school days. At Adrian Public, Jeff lettered in four sports, including two letters in baseball and basketball, three others in football and another in track. In addition, he also captained the football team as a junior and the basketball and track teams as a senior.

ROBERT CHANDLER — Outfield — Freshman — 6-1, 190 — R — R — Tulsa, OK

An all-state player from Tulsa's Webster High School, Robert is rated by coach Joe Robison as having the potential to be one of the best Academy outfielders. A two-sport athlete as a prep, Robert was a starter on the Academy varsity football team this past fall on defense, and should make his presence well known on the baseball field this year. Robert has the ability to hit the long ball and make the key play in the outfield.



BOB CIOLA — Pitcher — Senior — 5-10, 165 — R — R — Shelton, CT — 11-11

The most experienced returning pitcher, Bob has already earned three varsity baseball letters and is expected to be one of the top three hurlers this season. A righthander, Bob posted a strong 3.45 earned run average on the 1976 team in over 30 innings of work as a starter. Of nine appearances in 1976, Bob started five games, posting a 2-4 record, but two of his losses were by one run. Bob majors in behavioral sciences at the Academy.

JEFF GOODRICH — Outfield-Designated Hitter — Freshman — 5-9, 180 — L — R — El Paso, TX — 3-3

On a team dotted with several freshman candidates, Jeff is one of three left-handed hitters to be named to the squad which will be playing its longest season schedule ever — 50 games. Jeff, who should add valuable assistance in the outfield and as the DH, was a three-sport athlete as a prep at Coronado HS, earning three letters in football, and one each in baseball and wrestling. Planning an aerospace future, Jeff hopes to get involved with the space program after graduation.

TOM GREEN — Second Base — Sophomore — 5-10, 160 — R — R — Redondo Beach, CA — 8-8

Up from the junior varsity team where Tom was one of the top hitters, the Falcon sophomore will be competing with Mark Meakins for the regular second base job this season. Tom, who plans to major in engineering, earned two varsity baseball letters and one track monogram at Redondo Union HS, being named to an all-league second team his senior year.

KEITH HEISE — Pitcher — Junior — 6-3, 190 — R — R — Waterloo IA — 25-25

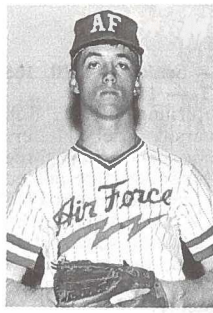
Hoping to nail down a solid spot on the Falcon pitching staff, Keith brings experience with him from the junior varsity squad last season. A righthander, Keith attended West HS, where he earned two letters each in basketball, baseball and football. In addition, he also captained both the football and basketball teams his senior year.

RON HUNT — Outfield-Designated Hitter — Sophomore — 6-0, 195 — R — R — Greenville, NC — 22-22

A player with a famous major league name, Ron is expected to be a power hitter and one of the regular players who will be used as a designated hitter this season. Also a strong outfielder, with a good arm, Ron earned all-state baseball honors while playing at J.H. Rose HS his senior year. Ron also won all-state honors twice in football and another such honor for his wrestling talents. Overall, in high school, Ron earned a total of nine letters in three sports.

JOHN LAHOFF — Pitcher — Freshman — 5-10, 180 — L — L — Council Bluffs, IA — 9-9

John should see some spot action this season in a 50-game schedule and could be a big plus during April when several twin bills are scheduled back-to-back. A four-sport letterman in high school, John lettered three times as a pitcher and an outfielder and earned all-state and all-league honors in those positions at Thomas Jefferson. In addition, John earned three letters in football as a halfback and punter, two letters in wrestling, taking all-league honors at the 138-pound weight and one letter as a basketball guard. John attended the Academy prep school, participating in lacrosse.



WADE LEATHAM — Pitcher — Sophomore — 5-10, 175 — R — L — Sumter, SC — 18-18
A returning letterman and starter off last year's team, when he was only a freshman, Wade had the most wins last season with four. He lost only one. He also led the team in appearances with 15, an Academy season record, and headed the team in strikeouts with 41 in 50 innings of work. Still another first for the strong southpaw was that he had the only save on the 1976 squad. One of his best games was a 2-1 win over Florida Tech. Wade attended Hillcrest HS, where he earned all-state honors as a senior and helped his team to a state championship that same season.

RANDY MARTINEZ — Pitcher — Senior — 6-0, 170 — R — R — Mulvane, KS — 2-2
Randy posted the highest games started total of any returning Falcon pitcher from last season, and is rated as one of three Air Force pitchers who have been given the role of "stoppers" in 1977. Randy, who worked in 44 plus innings last season, third highest on the team, was an all-state player in baseball at Mulvane HS, also earning three varsity letters in the sport. A behavioral sciences major at the Academy, Randy was also an all-league and all-state player in basketball, as well as earning two letters as a football player.

SCOT McLAUGHLIN — Catcher — Sophomore — 6-0, 180 — R — R — Montgomery, AL — 17-17

A prime candidate for a starting catching position, Scot is rated as having the best arm of the three catchers named to the team. In 1976, Scot saw action in just eight games as a freshman, but will probably see much more this season. Needing to improve his eye at the plate, Scot as a prep at Central Alabama Academy, he lettered twice in baseball, earning all-state honors his senior year. Scot, who plans to major in international affairs, also earned two football and one basketball letters as a prep.

MARK MEAKINS — Second Base — Senior — 5-11, 160 — R — R — Greeley, CO — 1-1
Versatile as an infielder, Mark returns for the 1977 season after having already earned two varsity baseball letters. Rated as the kind of player that a coach has to have on the team to have a winner, Mark needs to improve his batting skills to round out his game this season. A senior from Greeley Central HS, Mark earned two varsity baseball letters as a prep, also lettering twice in tennis and once in swimming. Mark is a management major at the Academy.

DAVE MEEHAN — Catcher — Junior — 5-7, 160 — R — R — Louisville, KY — 6-6

Rated as the best hitter of the battery of catchers, Dave will round out the team with good muscle and will add a strong game in the field besides being a team leader behind the plate. A junior, Dave, as a prep athlete, earned two varsity baseball letters at Seneca HS, also earning three varsity football letters, being named an all-state player in football his senior year. Dave is a basic sciences major at the Academy.

TOM MORAZ — Pitcher — Freshman — 6-1, 175 — R — R — Anchorage, AK

A freshman, Tom was named to the varsity team after fall practice and could add assistance in spot starting and relief assignments during the upcoming season. A four-sport athlete in high school, Tom lettered twice as an outfielder at A.J. Diamond, and earned three letters in football and two each in basketball and tennis. Tom also was a two-time all-league choice as a football player, playing both offensive and defensive line positions.



GREG POSTULKA — Pitcher — Junior — 6-3, 185 — R — R — Rockford, IL — 12-21

Hard throwing and determined describes Greg as he approaches his first full season as a Falcon hurler. Last season, Greg appeared in only three games near the end of the campaign, but compiled the lowest earned run average on the team, a 2.70. His best effort on the varsity, after being a regular on the JV team, was a 12-0 win over rival Colorado College. In that game he faced 17 batters and struck out 11. An all-state baseball player in high school, Greg earned four varsity baseball letters while attending Auburn HS, also earning two additional letters in football and basketball. Greg is a management major.

STEVE SALECK — Outfield — Freshman — 6-0, 180 — L — R — Eau Claire, WI — 20-20

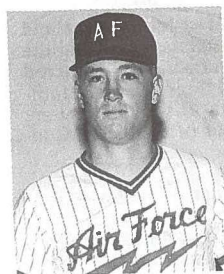
Slated for outfield duty this season, Steve, who was a regular on the varsity basketball team this past season as a guard, comes to the 1977 baseball team as a highly regarded prospect. One of three left handed hitters on the team, Steve earned two letters each in baseball, basketball and football at John F. Kennedy HS in Bloomington, MN. In basketball and football, he also earned all-league honors and was co-captain of his high school team in basketball.

MARTY SCHMIDT — Third Base — Sophomore — 6-0, 185 — L — R — Duluth, MN — 4-4

Expected to be a starter at third base this season, Marty is an aggressive player who swings with power from the left side of the plate. Marty was a valuable asset to last year's junior varsity team and should play an important role on the varsity in 1977. A three-year letterman in baseball at Denfield HS in Idaho, Marty also earned two letters as a football player.

EDDIE SCHUMACHER — Shortstop — Sophomore — 5-10, 160 — R — R — Longmont, CO — 21-12

Backup to team captain Kyle Bartels at shortstop, Eddie can also play well at second base, and is looked upon as a valuable aid to the Falcon fortunes in 1977. A sophomore, Eddie will be playing his first varsity season after playing JV ball last season. As a prep athlete at Longmont HS, Eddie earned two varsity baseball letters, being named to an all-conference team as a senior. He also was captain of the baseball team as a senior.



PAT SHAY — Pitcher — Senior — 6-2, 180 — R — R — Lakewood, CA — 19-19

One of five returning veteran pitchers, Pat has been given a role as a "stopper" on the mound this season after earning his first varsity letter last year.
