

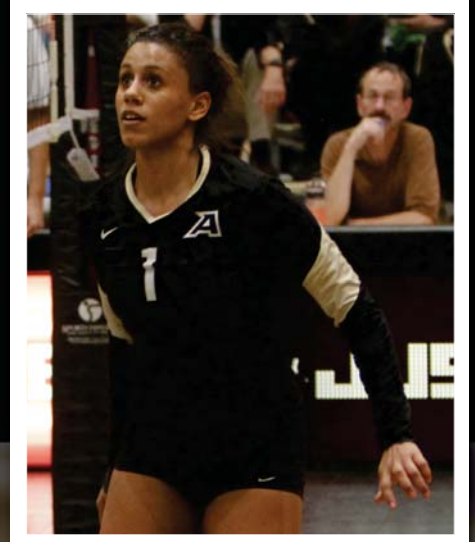

# WEST POINT

The United States Military Academy is renowned because of its historic and distinguished reputation as a military academy, and as a leading, progressive institution of higher education. Made legendary in books and movies produced over the years, the Academy's "Long Gray Line" of graduates includes some of our nation's most famous and influential men: Ulysses S. Grant, Robert E. Lee, Thomas "Stonewall" Jackson, George S. Patton, Omar Bradley, Douglas MacArthur, Dwight Eisenhower and Norman Schwarzkopf.

Because of this superb education and leadership experience, West Point graduates historically have been sought for high level civilian and military leadership positions. Their numbers include two U.S. presidents, several ambassadors, state governors, legislators, judges, cabinet members, educators, astronauts and corporate executives.

Today, West Point continues to provide hundreds of young men and women the unique opportunity to develop physically, ethically and intellectually while building a foundation for an exciting, challenging and rewarding career as an Army officer in the service of our nation. Cadets have much more responsibility in running the Academy than students in most other colleges or universities. It adds to the leadership experience.

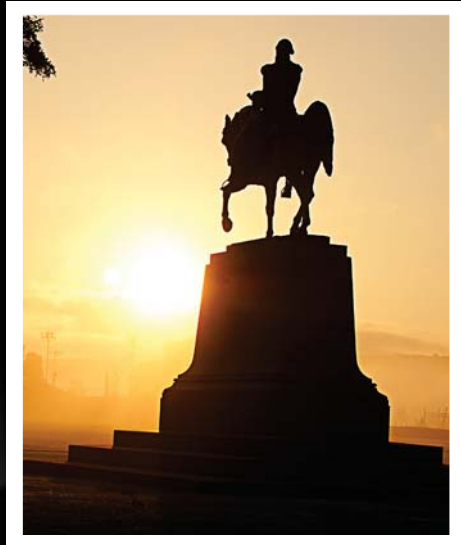

# DISTINGUISHED GRADUATES



**FRANK BORMAN**

**ROBERT E. LEE '29**

The Academy's ninth Superintendent (1852-55), Lee was a model cadet during his four years at West Point. He graduated second in his class and never earned a single demerit during his four years at the Academy. At the beginning of the Civil War, he was selected to serve as Commanding General of the Army, but instead resigned his commission and was named General-In-Chief of the Confederate Army from 1861 to 1865. Lee's surrender to Ulysses S. Grant (USMA 1843), at Appomattox Court House, Va., ended the Civil War. Fort Lee, Va., was named in his honor.

**ULYSSES S. GRANT '43**

Grant distinguished himself during the Civil War at the Battle of Vicksburg in 1863; his victory secured control of the Mississippi River for the Union. President Abe Lincoln later appointed him Commanding General of the Army in March 1864. On April 9, 1865, at Appomattox Court House, Va., Robert E. Lee (USMA 1829) surrendered the Army of Northern Virginia to him, ending the Civil War. Grant later served as the 18th President of the United States from 1869 to 1877. Today, his image graces the \$50 bill.

**GEORGE W. GOETHALS '80**

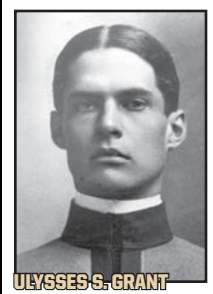
Goethals became an architect and was builder of the Panama Canal, 1904 to 1914.

**JOHN J. PERSHING '86**

Considered the second most senior officer in Army history, behind only George Washington, Pershing served as commander of the American Expeditionary Force during World War I. The two-million-plus troops of the AEF made a decisive contribution to the defeat of Imperial Germany. Pershing's abilities as a leader distinguished him among European commanders, and through repeated successes on the battlefield, promoted American prestige around the world. He served as Army Chief of Staff in 1921, and was named General of the Armies of the United States upon his retirement in 1924.

**DOUGLAS MacARTHUR '03**

After World War I, MacArthur returned to West Point to serve as the Academy's 31st Superintendent from 1919 to 1922. During that time, he was responsible for

the revitalization of the Academy. He was later promoted to General of the Army and served as Supreme Allied Commander in the Pacific Theater during World War II. During that time, he received the Medal of Honor for leading defense preparation and operations on the Philippine Islands. He later served as Supreme Allied Commander, Japan, and as commander, United Nations Command in the Far East. He was one of only five officers to be promoted to General of the Army (five stars).

**GEORGE S. PATTON JR. '09**

"Old Blood and Guts," Patton was one of the most colorful commanders in the Army. During World War II the famed commander of the 2nd Armored Division and later the Third Army displayed courage and daring as prominently as the pair of ivory handled revolvers he wore. Patton accomplished one of the most remarkable feats in military history in December 1944, when he quickly turned the Third Army northward to reinforce the Allied southern flank against the German attack in the Battle of the Bulge. The General's doctrine of aggressive employment of massive armor forces continue to prove themselves in combat arenas around the world.

**OMAR N. BRADLEY '15**

During his career, Bradley earned a reputation as one of the best infantry commanders in World War II. He commanded the 82nd Airborne and 28th Infantry Divisions before going on to command the 1st Army and the 12th Army Group. After the war he served as Army Chief of Staff from 1948 to 1949 and served as the first Chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff from 1949 to 1953. He was the last Army officer to be promoted to General of the Army (five stars), and the Bradley fighting vehicle is named in his honor.

**DWIGHT D. EISENHOWER '15**

During World War II, Eisenhower served as Supreme Commander of Allied Forces Europe from 1943 to 1944, during which he led the D-Day invasion of Europe. During that time, he was promoted to General of the Army (five stars). After the war, he served as Army Chief of Staff from 1945 to 1948 and was named President of Columbia University in 1948. He served as the 34th President of the United States from

1953 to 1961 and was one of only five officers to be promoted to General of the Army (five stars).

**ALEXANDER M. HAIG JR. '47**

Haig served as Chief of Staff to President Richard Nixon from 1973 to 1974; Supreme Allied Commander in Europe 1974 to 1979; President of United Technologies Corporation 1980 to 1981 and Secretary of State during the Reagan administration from 1981 to 1982.

**FRANK BORMAN '50**

An astronaut from 1962 to 1970, Borman commanded the first circumlunar flight of the earth. He later served as President of Eastern Airlines.

**FIDEL V. RAMOS '50**

One of the Academy's international cadets, Ramos served as a Philippine Army officer after graduation. He eventually became the country's military Chief of Staff and later Secretary of National Defense. He also served as President of the Republic of the Philippines from 1992 to 1998.

**EDWIN E. ALDRIN '51**

An astronaut from 1963 to 1972, Aldrin participated in the first manned lunar landing with Michael Collins (USMA '52) and was the second man to walk on the moon.

**EDWARD WHITE '52**

An astronaut from 1962 to 1967, White was the first man to walk in space and was one of the three astronauts killed in the Apollo I disaster in 1967.

**H. NORMAN SCHWARZKOPF '56**

As Commander-in-Chief, United States Central Command from 1988 to 1991, Schwarzkopf's command ultimately responded to Iraq's invasion of Kuwait with the largest U.S. deployment since the Vietnam War, including portions of the Navy, Air Force, and Marine Corps as well as units from dozens of nations around the world. After retiring, Schwarzkopf received the Presidential Medal of Freedom.

**PETER M. DAWKINS '59**

Dawkins was Cadet Brigade Commander (First Captain of the U.S. Corps of Cadets) as a senior and became the third Heisman

Trophy winner in Army football history. He later served as chairman and CEO of Primerica.

**JAMES V. KIMSEY '62**

Kimsey was the founding chairman of America Online, and was named chairman emeritus in 1996. He founded the Kimsey Foundation in 1996.

**MICHAEL W. KRZYZEWSKI '69**

Krzyzewski served as head basketball coach at West Point from 1974 to 1979 before assuming similar duties at Duke University. Krzyzewski has led the Blue Devils to three national championships and was inducted into the Basketball Hall of Fame in October 2001. He coached the U.S. at the 2008 Olympics in Beijing.

**MARTIN E. DEMPSEY '74**

General Martin E. Dempsey serves as the 18th Chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff. In this capacity, he serves as the principal military adviser to the President, the Secretary of Defense and the National Security Council. By law, he is the nation's highest-ranking military officer. Prior to becoming Chairman, the general served as the Army's 37th Chief of Staff. Dempsey served as the Deputy Commander and then Acting Commander of U.S. Central Command. Before becoming Chief of Staff of the Army, he commanded U.S. Army Training and Doctrine Command.

**RAYMOND T. ODIERNO '76**

Odierno commanded the 4th Infantry Division during the fall of 2003 which, along with Special Forces units, captured Saddam Hussein in December of that year. Odierno helped plan and coordinate the raid that netted Iraq's fallen dictator. He currently serves as Chief of Staff of the U.S. Army.

**ROBERT S. KIMBROUGH '89**

Kimbrough was named one of 11 new astronaut candidates by NASA in May 2004. Kimbrough ranks among Army Baseball's career leaders in saves. A veteran of Desert Storm, he currently works for NASA in Houston as a flight simulation engineer and participated in a space shuttle mission in 2009.

# GILLIS FIELD HOUSE



## GILLIS FIELD HOUSE: THE HOME OF ARMY VOLLEYBALL

Gillis Field House, which serves as home for the Army volleyball and indoor track teams, is named in honor of Maj. William G. Gillis (USMA '41). During his time at West Point, Gillis was a tremendous multi-sport athlete. Although he was probably best known for his accomplishments as the captain of the football team, Gillis also starred on the indoor and outdoor tracks. As a member of the track squad, Gillis set Academy records in the 220-yard low hurdles (which lasted for several years) and the high hurdles.

After graduation, Maj. Gillis became the youngest battalion commander in the Third Army at the age of 26, and led his troops to a number of major victories against the German Army throughout Europe. Sadly, Gillis' leadership role came to an end on Oct. 1, 1944, after he was killed in action. Despite his short time of service, Gillis earned a number of military accolades such as the Distinguished Service Cross, a Silver Star, a Bronze Star and several foreign ribbons, including the Distinguished Service Order and the Croix de Guerre.

For 36 seasons the Army volleyball team has come to know West Point as 'Home Sweet Home'. Incredibly in all those years, dating back to 1978, the Black Knights have only experienced five losing seasons on the banks of the Hudson. Army moved its home court from Arvin Gymnasium to its current residence, Gillis Field House, in 1999. Since moving to Gillis Field House in 1999, the Black Knights have not endured a single losing season and reached the 150 victory mark in 2013.

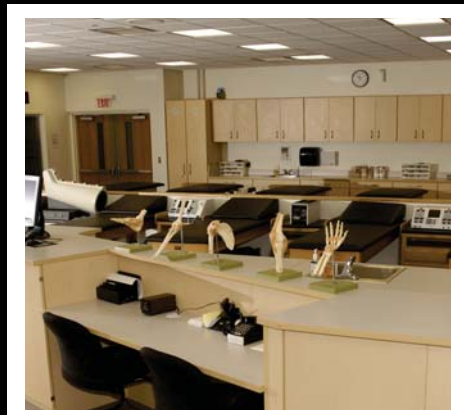
# OLYMPIAN VISITS WEST POINT

Phee '14 and Alexandra Bell. Walsh-Jennings won olympic gold medals in beach volleyball in 2004, 2008 and 2012 paired with Misty May-Treanor.



# ATHLETIC TRAINING

Stationed on the first floor of Kimsey Athletic Center, Army's athletic training department moved into its new and spacious home in the spring of 2003. The athletic training room now covers 9,500 square feet, housing the finest equipment available for the prevention, treatment and rehabilitation of athletic injuries. Highlights of the facility include a 1,202-square-foot cardiovascular room containing more than 25 pieces of equipment; a state-of-the-art hydrotherapy area equipped with a 2,018-square-foot rehabilitation pool, Jacuzzi, two large pools, and four regular pools; 10 treatment tables; five modular taping tables; high-density storage; and a physician's office with X-ray capability. The training room also features a vast array of the latest treatment and rehabilitation equipment. Thanks to the expansive new treatment area, Army's athletic training staff can service countless Black Knight athletes simultaneously so they are able to realize their full potential on the "fields of friendly strife."

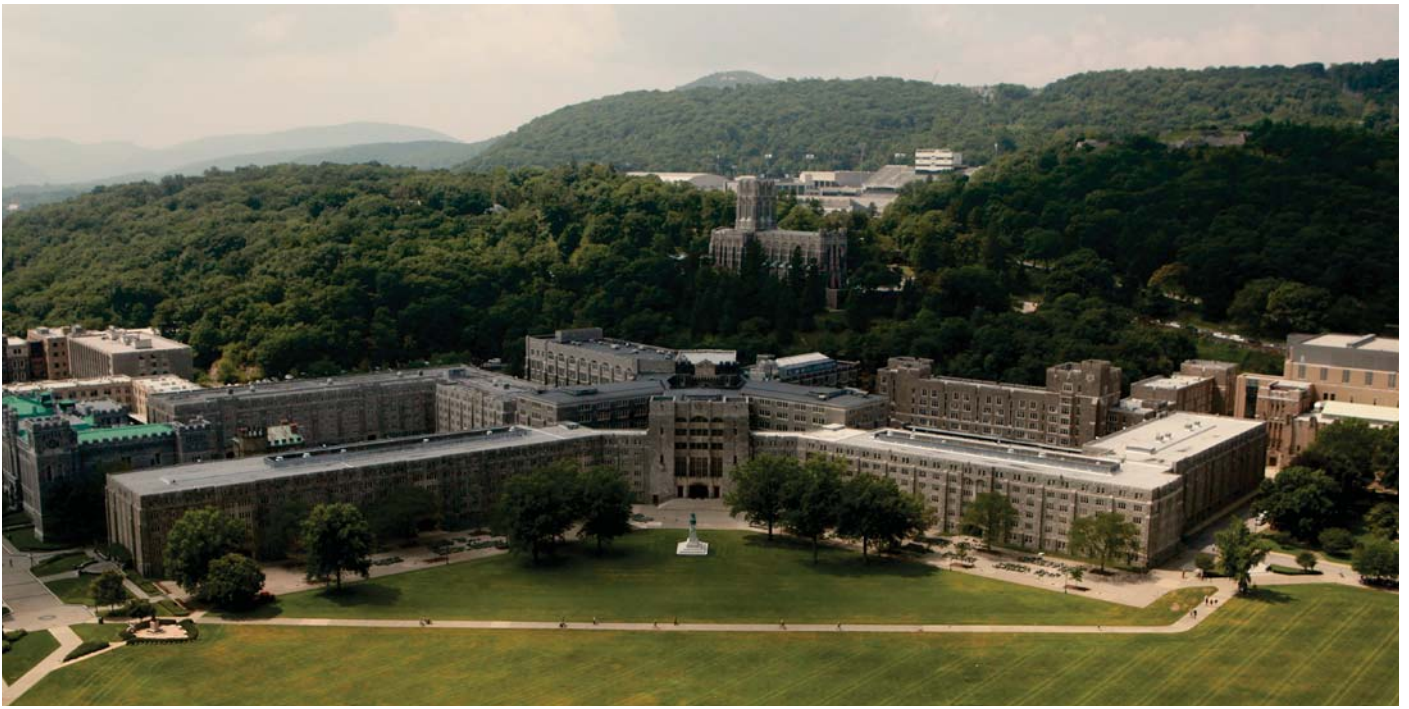
## O'MEARA, MALEK, DAWKINS CLASS OF 1959

### STRENGTH DEVELOPMENT CENTER

An integral component in Army's intercollegiate athletic program is the strength and conditioning department. The most visible sign of Army's commitment in this area is the O'Meara, Malek, Dawkins, Class of 1959 Strength Development Center in Kimsey Athletic Center, one of the finest facilities in the nation. The monstrous 20,000-square-foot center is located on the second floor of Kimsey Athletic Center and features 30 tons of plates and dumbbells; 15 pieces of cardiovascular equipment, including six high-speed treadmills; a state-of-the-art weight training area with 16 rack and platform training stations, as well as a separate dumbbell area; and top-of-the-line Hammer strength equipment. Under the direction of Scott Swanson, the O'Meara, Malek, Dawkins, Class of 1959 Strength Development Center rivals any training facility in the country.



# U.S. MILITARY ACADEMY



The mission of the U.S. Military Academy is to educate, train, and inspire the Corps of Cadets so that each graduate is a commissioned leader of character committed to the values of Duty, Honor, Country; professional growth throughout a career as an officer in the U.S. Army; and a lifetime of selfless service to the Nation.

Founded on March 16, 1802, the Academy celebrated its Bicentennial in 2002. But West Point's role in America's history dates to the Revolutionary War, when both sides realized the strategic importance of the commanding plateau on the west bank of the Hudson River. Gen. George Washington considered West Point to be the most strategic position in America. He personally selected Thaddeus Kosciuszko, one of the heroes of Saratoga, to design the fortifications in 1778 after problems arose with French engineers originally placed in charge of the design. In 1779, General Washington transferred his headquarters to West Point. Continental soldiers built forts, batteries and defensive barriers. A 100-ton iron chain was extended across the Hudson to control river traffic. Today, several links from that chain are arranged at Trophy Point as a reminder of West Point's original fortifications.

In 1802 President Thomas Jefferson signed the legislation establishing the U.S. Military Academy to create an institution devoted to the arts and sciences of warfare. This effectively eliminated America's wartime reliance on foreign engineers and artillerymen. West Point became the nation's first engineering school and served as the model for engineering programs which were eventually established at other colleges.

Col. Sylvanus Thayer, the "Father of the Military Academy," served as Superintendent from 1817 through 1833. He upgraded academic standards, instilled military discipline and emphasized honorable conduct. Early graduates were largely responsible for the construction of the nation's initial railway lines, bridges, harbors, and roads. Although the curriculum maintains its focus on engineering, in recent decades the program of instruction has markedly changed, providing cadets a selection of more than 40 majors. This tradition of academic and military excellence, guided by a demanding standard of moral and ethical conduct, remains the cornerstone of the West Point experience.

It is said at West Point that "much of the history we teach was made by those people we taught." The Academy has produced famous leaders throughout its illustrious past...Civil War Generals Grant, Sherman, Lee, and Jackson, to name but a few. In World War I, 34 of the 38 corps and division commanders were graduates. World War II would see many graduates reach brigadier general or higher, to include Eisenhower, MacArthur, Bradley and Patton. In more recent conflicts, MacArthur, Ridgway, Westmoreland, Abrams, Schwarzkopf and Abizaid were in command.

Academy graduates have also excelled in air and space exploration, and countless others went on from military service to become leaders in medicine, law, business, religion and science.

Since its founding, the Military Academy fulfills the same mission as it always has . . . to educate, train, and inspire the Corps of Cadets. It accomplishes this mission by developing cadets in three essential areas: intellectual, physical and military. These developmental paths are balanced and fully integrated into the daily life of each young man and woman at the Academy.

Intellectual growth is fostered through an academic curriculum that provides a broad liberal education in the arts and sciences. The electives program builds upon the foundation of the core, allowing cadets to develop even greater competence in selected areas. In addition, the fields-of-study and majors nurture the development of creativity, critical thinking, and self-directed learning, essential characteristics of 21st century officers. The four-year academic experience leads to a bachelor of science degree and a commission as a second lieutenant in the Army.

Physical development is achieved through a rigorous athletic and physical education program. Each cadet participates at the intercollegiate, club or intramural level each semester. This readies the cadet for the physical demands of military life and helps teach good judgment and self-discipline, even while under mental and physical stress.

Military development begins with the cadet's first day at West Point. Most military training takes place during the summer, with new cadets undergoing Cadet Basic Training, or Beast Barracks, their first year, followed the second summer by Cadet Field Training. Cadets spend their third and

fourth summers serving in active Army units around the world; attending specialty training such as airborne, air assault or northern warfare or helping to train the first- and second-year cadets. The Cadet Leader Development System seeks to give the cadets increasing responsibility until they are ready to receive their commissions and assume their duties as leaders in today's Army.

Moral and ethical values guide cadets throughout their four years at West Point. Commitment to the Academy's "Bedrock Values," based on integrity and respect for the dignity of others, begins on the first day. Integrity is reflected in the Cadet Honor Code which states: "A cadet will not lie, cheat, steal, or tolerate those who do." Respect denotes that cadets treat others with the same respect and dignity they themselves would expect. At West Point, it is not enough to train leaders—they must be leaders of character.

Admission is keenly competitive and is open to young men and women from all states and territories and from every socioeconomic level. Prospective cadets must receive a nomination by a member of Congress or from the Department of the Army. The Academy seeks candidates who possess records of success in academics, athletics and leadership indicative of well-rounded individuals.

Although the life of a cadet is demanding, there remains an array of club activities ranging from golf, skiing, boxing, crew and orienteering to such organizations as the cadet radio station, Habitat for Humanity and Big Brothers-Big Sisters. Additionally, the U.S. Corps of Cadets hosts a Special Olympics event each spring.

Today's Military Academy is a vastly different institution from the small academy legislated into being by Congress in 1802. Originally just 1,800 acres, the Academy has grown to more than 16,000 acres. The first graduating class numbered just two men; today's classes graduate more than 900 new officers annually, both men and women, who are prepared for leadership roles within the Army.

With the expansion of knowledge and the changing needs of the United States Army and the nation, life at West Point has changed to keep pace. Ever mindful of its rich heritage, the U.S. Military Academy is developing leaders for tomorrow, and its focus remains the national needs of the 21st century.



# ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE

The Center for Enhanced Performance (CEP) is a state-of-the-art facility committed to developing the full potential of each cadet through comprehensive mental toughness and academic skills training. It offers three programs designed to maximize West Point cadet performance, as well as export these critical mental skills to the United States Army at large.

The Performance Enhancement Program (PEP) is the nation's most comprehensive training program for learning, practicing and mastering the intangible mental skills that underlie human performance; confidence despite setbacks, concentration amidst distractions, and composure under stress. Cadets participate in individual training sessions during free periods in their academic schedule, learning, and then applying the skills of imagery, attention control, energy management, and goal setting. Biofeedback training allows cadets to learn crucial self-regulation techniques, and sophisticated audio and video simulations of game and practice situations are used to facilitate mental rehearsal of specific physical, academic, or military skills.

These training methods are derived from the field of applied sport psychology, where they are employed in the training of professional and Olympic athletes, but apply to every other area of human performance.

# ACADEMY ADMINISTRATION

## LTG ROBERT CASLEN

### SUPERINTENDENT



Lieutenant General Robert L. Caslen, Jr. became the 59th Superintendent of the U.S. Military Academy at West Point on July 17, 2013.

LTG Caslen graduated from the U.S. Military Academy in 1975. He earned master's degrees from Long Island University and Kansas State University.

Previous to this assignment, LTG Caslen served as the Chief of the Office of Security Cooperation-Iraq.

LTG Caslen's prior deployments and assignments include serving as the commander of the Combined Arms Center at Fort Leavenworth, Kan., the command that oversees the Command and General Staff College and 17 other schools, centers, and training programs located throughout the United States; commanding general of the 25th Infantry Division (Light) and commanding general of the Multi-National Division-North during Operation Iraqi Freedom; Commandant of Cadets for the U.S. Military Academy; Deputy Director for the War on Terrorism, J-5, The Joint Staff; Assistant Division Commander (maneuver), 3rd Infantry Division (Mechanized); Chief of Staff, 10th Mountain Division (Light); Chief of Staff, Combined Joint Task Force Mountain during Operation Enduring Freedom; Commander, 2nd Brigade, 101st Airborne Division (Air Assault); Chief of Staff, 101st Airborne Division (Air Assault); Senior Brigade C2 Observer/Controller, Operations Group, Joint Readiness Training Center; Commander, 1st Battalion, 14th Infantry, 25th Infantry Division (Light); Executive Officer to the Deputy Commander in Haiti during Operation Uphold Democracy; J-3 in Honduras for Joint Task Force Bravo; Brigade Operations Officer, 3rd Brigade, 101st Airborne Division (Air Assault); Executive Officer, 2nd Battalion, 187th Infantry, 101st Airborne Division (Air Assault) during Operations Desert Shield/Desert Storm.

LTG Caslen's awards and decorations include the Distinguished Service Medal, the Defense Superior Service Medal with Oak Leaf Cluster, the Legion of Merit with four Oak Leaf Clusters, the Bronze Star Medal with two Oak Leaf Clusters, the Defense Meritorious Service Medal, and the Meritorious Service Medal with five Oak Leaf Clusters. He has earned the Combat Infantryman Badge, the Joint Chiefs of Staff Identification Badge, and is Airborne, Air Assault, and Ranger qualified.

LTG Caslen is married with three children.

## BG JOHN THOMSON III

### COMMANDANT OF CADETS



Brigadier General John (J.T.) Thomson became the 75th Commandant of Cadets this August. He hails from Tyler, Texas, and earned his commission as

a Second Lieutenant of Field Artillery in 1986.

His initial assignment was with the 6th Battalion, 41st Field Artillery (M109A2, 155mm SP) in Kitzingen, Germany, in direct support to the 2nd Brigade, 3rd Infantry Division from 1987 to 1990. In 1990, BG Thomson was assigned to the 2nd Armored Cavalry Regiment in Nuremberg, Germany. From 1992 to 1994, he served as Operations Officer for the 1st Armored Division Artillery in Baumholder, Germany, and then later commanded Bravo Battery, 4th Battalion, 29th Field Artillery (M109A2, 155mm SP) in direct support to the 2nd Brigade, 1st Armored Division. Following battery command, he served as a Tactical Officer for the U.S. Corps of Cadets at West Point until 1997.

From June 1998 to June 2003, BG Thomson was assigned to the 4th Infantry Division (M) at Fort Hood, Texas. BG Thomson commanded the 2nd Battalion, 4th Field Artillery (MLRS) of the 214th Field Artillery Brigade at Fort Sill, Okla., from June 2003 to June 2005.

Following battalion command, he served on the Joint Staff as an advisor to the Assistant to the Chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff, extensively interacting and traveling with the U.S. Department of State on national security affairs. From May 2007 to Feb. 2008, he served as the Executive Officer to the Commanding General of Multi-National Corps, Iraq. He later headed the Commander's Initiatives Group for Multi-National Forces-Iraq from Oct. 2008 to Jan. 2009, and then served as Executive Officer to the MNF-I Commanding General from April 2009 to July 2009.

BG Thomson commanded the 41st Fires Brigade, 1st Cavalry Division at Fort Hood, Texas, from Oct. 2009 to July 2011. Following brigade command, he became the Director of the Chief's Coordination Group (CCG) for the 38th Chief of Staff of the Army at Headquarters, Department of the Army through March 2013. In April 2013, he assumed duties as Deputy Commander for the 4th Infantry Division at Fort Carson, Colo.

BG Thomson earned a B.S. degree in computer engineering from the U.S. Military Academy in 1986 and a M.S. degree in Counseling and Leader Development from Long Island University in 1995.

BG Thomson and his wife, Holly, have two sons, Tyler and Parker.

## BG TIM TRAINOR

### DEAN OF THE ACADEMIC BOARD



Brigadier General Timothy E. Trainor, Ph.D., became the Dean of the Academic Board at the United States Military Academy in the summer of 2010. He

previously served as professor and head of the Department of Systems Engineering at West Point where he taught courses in engineering management, systems engineering and decision analysis.

Trainor graduated with a Bachelor of Science from West Point in 1983 and entered the Engineer Branch of the U.S. Army. As an engineering officer, Trainor has served in operational assignments around the world, including Germany, Honduras, Fort Bragg, N.C., Fort Riley, Kans. and Sarajevo, Bosnia.

Trainor has a Master of Business Administration from the Fuqua School of Business at Duke and a doctorate degree in industrial engineering from North Carolina State University. He is a member of the Military Applications Society of the Institute for Operations Research and the Management Sciences the Military Operations Research Society, the American Society for Engineering Management and the American Society of Engineering Education. He is a past president of Epsilon Mu Eta, the national Engineering Management Honor Society. Trainor is also a member of the Board of Fellows for the David Crawford School of Engineering at Norwich University.

As an analyst, Trainor helped develop the Installation Status Report that provides the Army a standardized means to assess infrastructure and environmental conditions on installations to support resource allocation decisions. He has applied decision analysis methods in completing an organizational analysis of the Army's Installation Management Agency and in assessing defense security cooperation programs.

Trainor deployed to Basrah, Iraq in the summer of 2007 and worked with the British-led Provincial Reconstruction Team in helping the provincial Iraqi leaders improve their infrastructure revitalization plans.

Trainor is married to Col. Donna Brazil, a 1983 graduate of West Point, who is a professor in the Department of Behavioral Sciences at the Academy. They have a daughter Cory, who graduated from West Point in 2013. Sons, Danny and Zach are currently at West Point. Danny is a firstie and Zach is a plebe.



## BOO CORRIGAN


**DIRECTOR OF ATHLETICS**  
**4TH YEAR | NOTRE DAME, 1990**

**B**oo Corrigan was named the Academy's director of athletics on Feb. 1, 2011.

"We have an opportunity to work every day with a truly exceptional group of young people," Corrigan said. "The opportunities they receive through intercollegiate athletics will help shape their own leadership styles as they become officers in the U.S. Army. We have a great team that focuses daily on our cadet-athletes. We strive to enhance their overall experience as they develop into the leaders our nation needs."

In his short time as athletic director, Corrigan has strengthened and expanded Army Athletics' relationships in several key areas. In his tenure, Army has secured a new apparel agreement with Nike, a new pouring rights contract with Coke and bringing in the Aspire Group to enhance ticket sales and better serve Army season ticket holders. Corrigan also crafted the Team Army concept, a comprehensive plan designed to add significant value to Army's corporate sponsorships while maintaining the tradition of West Point Athletics.

Under Corrigan, Army has experienced incredible success on the fields of friendly strife, including winning the star series against Navy as well as the overall competition in 2013-14.

Corrigan, who has a proven record as a fundraiser, spearheaded changes in the Army A Club and ticket operations that have resulted in more than \$20 million dollars in major gifts and record-setting annual giving during his tenure. During that time the funding for a new lacrosse facility, that is scheduled to break ground, was secured, while raising a record amount in each successive year.

In addition to his role in enhancing revenues for Army Athletics, Corrigan led a strategic planning process that developed a new mission statement and goals for the department.

In his first full three years at West Point, Corrigan has overseen a program that owns 11 Patriot League regular season or tournament championships and sent eight teams to the NCAA postseason (rifle). Thirty-three cadets have earned a major award from their conference.

Last season, Corrigan led Army Athletics to its first star series victory since 1996, going 12-11 in star series competitions against Navy. It was the 12th victory in the series for the Academy. West Point went 18-13 overall against the Mids during the year and has a 34-29-1 mark versus Navy in the last two seasons.

Army finished a very successful campaign in 2013-14 with an overall record of 235-173-7 for a .575 winning percentage, the highest mark since 2004-05.

In 2013-14, the Black Knights brought home league titles in men's tennis, baseball and women's basketball. Army won regular season titles in men's tennis and baseball, while the women's hoops squad won the league tournament and was a 13th seed in the NCAA Tournament. Ten of Army's squads participated in Patriot League postseason, while rifle earned an NCAA berth for the 11th-straight season.

In 2012-13 alone, Army accounted for more than 100 all-league citations. Hockey's Cheyne Rocha and lacrosse's Brendan Buckley each captured the Senior CLASS Award in their respective sports, making Army the only school in the nation to have multiple winners in 2012-13.

During the 2012-13 season, Army teams combined to post an overall record of 236-183-8 for a .562 winning percentage. The winter sports programs had their best sea-

son in five years as the women's basketball team won the Patriot League regular season title, the men's basketball team posted its first winning season in 28 years and the rifle squad advanced to the NCAA Championships for the 10th consecutive season.

It was also a great year in the competition against fellow service academies. Army split the season series versus Navy, 16-16-1, marking the best winning percentage against the Mids (.500) since 2004-05. The Black Knights owned a 4-2-1 record against Air Force, improving the record to 20-18-2 (.525) versus service academy foes in 2012-13.

Cadet-athletes have continued to thrive in the classroom under Corrigan's watch. In his two full years, Army has boasted seven Academic All-Americans, including six first-team selections. Lacrosse's Brendan Buckley became the first Army athlete to capture Academic All-American of the Year honors in 2012. In 2011, the Black Knights' football team boasted two first-team CoSIDA Academic All-Americans, a first for the program since 1957. Since the start of the 2011-12 season, Army boasts six Patriot League Scholar-Athletes of the Year, including Buckley, a two-time overall men's winner.

Twenty of Army's 24 NCAA programs scored above the national average in the 2013 NCAA APR report. The men's cross country and wrestling teams earned public recognition for finishing in the top 10 percent of their respective sport. The cross country squad boasted a perfect score of 1,000.

In addition, former football standout Andrew Rodriguez, Class of 2012, became the first Army player to win the National Football Foundation's William V. Campbell Trophy, which is presented annually to the nation's top football scholar-athlete. Rodriguez later was honored with the Amateur Athletic Union's James E. Sullivan Award as the top amateur athlete in the country. He was the first Army player to receive the award since 1946 and was just the third player in history (Peyton Manning, Tim Tebow) to win both the Campbell Trophy and Sullivan Award.

Army has been the focus of national attention since Corrigan's arrival. He was instrumental in supporting the CBS documentary, "Game of Honor," that chronicled the Black Knights' 2011 football season leading up to its annual showdown with arch-rival Navy. Not only was the two-hour program broadcast to a national audience on Showtime, but also won the Emmy Award for Best Sports Documentary. The Army football team was also the focus of a behind-the-scenes book titled, "Soldiers First," written by New York Times writer Joe Drape.

Corrigan has also made his mark on the aesthetics of historic Michie Stadium. In order to upgrade the appearance and provide a better experience for Army fans, Corrigan implemented a Michie Stadium branding and signage campaign that began in 2011. The first phase of the project was completed prior to the 2012 season.

In addition to his duties at West Point, Corrigan has been an active leader in the Patriot League, serving as chairman of the conference's Broadband Committee.

Corrigan, who was the senior associate athletic director for external affairs at Duke University starting in August 2008, brings a wealth of leadership to his post. He is a proven administrator with 18 previous years of experience in all areas of revenue generation, external affairs, staff management and leadership.

Corrigan's chief responsibilities at Duke included the oversight of the Blue Devil corporate partnerships and the Marketing, Promotions, Ticket, Internet Operations, Sports Information and Video Services departments. In only two years at Duke, Corrigan was responsible for the negotiation of multi-media rights to ISP.

A supervisor of the 2009 NCAA Champion women's tennis and 2010 NCAA Champion men's lacrosse programs, Corrigan was a part of three NCAA Championships at Duke in just two seasons. He is currently a member of the NCAA Men's Lacrosse Rules committee and the Atlantic Coast Conference Men's Lacrosse Committee, while serving on the Executive Budget Committee at Duke.

Prior to arriving at Duke in August of 2008, he oversaw Notre Dame's corporate relations and marketing as an associate athletic director for five years. During his stint at Notre Dame, Corrigan spearheaded the redesign of its official athletics website and creation of 15-20 hours of original video content weekly. That resulted in a 35 percent increase in page views and unique users. Corrigan also worked directly with ISP Sports, CSTV, and NBC Sports from a sales and marketing standpoint.

Before joining the staff at Notre Dame, Corrigan spent nearly three years as the associate athletic director for marketing at the United States Naval Academy. He was responsible for turning the marketing department from a deficit to profit in his first year with full budget responsibility for the department. Corrigan also was intimately involved with the re-branding of the Annual Giving Campaign (The Blue and Gold), which led to an increase of 75 percent year over year donations.

His collegiate experience also includes a stint as assistant director of marketing at Florida State from 1992-95.

Corrigan is a 1990 University of Notre Dame graduate with a degree in economics. He is married to the former Kristen Aceto, a former field hockey and lacrosse player at the University of Virginia who also earned a master's degree from the school. The couple has three children, Finley, Tre and Brian. He is the youngest of seven children of Gene and Lena Corrigan.

Practice will generally run from 3:30-6:30 p.m. during the week.

# HEAD COACH ALMA KOVACI



## HEAD COACH ALMA KOVACI

Temple '02  
Eighth Season  
Record at Army: 151-59

In seven years as the head coach of one of the most successful Army programs, Alma Kovaci has proven to be one of the best young volleyball coaching minds in the country. During her tenure at West Point, Kovaci has authored a 151-59 (.719) record and led Army to the 2009 Patriot League title. The 2009 team captured the program's first championship since 1994 and fourth overall, and the Black Knights punched their ticket to the NCAA Division I Tournament for the first time in the program's 35-year history.

Kovaci reached the 75-win plateau faster than any other coach in Army volleyball history, accomplishing the feat in her third year at West Point. The Black Knights have averaged 21 wins per season and enjoyed five 20-plus-win campaigns during her impressive tenure. Kovaci became the third coach in Army history to reach the century mark at West Point in 2011, joining legendary head coach Bob Gambardella (1983-1995) and her mentor, Glen Conley (1999-2006).

A native of Tirana, Albania, Kovaci became the seventh Army head coach in 2007 in what was her first head coaching appointment. Since ascending into a head coaching role, she garnered back-to-back Patriot League Coach of the Year honors in 2008 and 2009, while also developing Army's only two AVCA All-Northeast Region honorable mention all-stars (Jamie Clark '08, Ariana Mankus '13) and 26 All-Patriot League selections. The elite group includes three-time Setter of the Year Maureen Bannon, two-time Patriot League Player of the Year Ariana Mankus, 2010 Patriot League Rookie of the Year Megan Wilton, 2013 Patriot League Rookie of the Year Olivia Fairfield, and two-time Patriot League Setter of the Year Mary Vaccaro. Since arriving at West Point in 2003, she has mentored five three-time All-Patriot League selections and one four-time honoree in Bannon.

In perhaps her most memorable season on the sidelines, Kovaci faced a tough test heading into the 2009 campaign after losing four all-league players and five starters at the end of 2008. A testament to her recruiting success and motivational tactics, she turned a 2009 team that featured five new starters into an NCAA Tournament team. Army headed into the postseason with a 26-5 mark after going 12-2 to capture the Patriot League regular-season title for the second year in a row. She went on to lead Army to an 18-14 mark in 2010, a 23-8 record in 2011, and a 20-9 mark in 2012. In 2013, Army went 14-13.



No stranger to Army's volleyball program when she assumed the reins in 2007, Kovaci served as the Black Knights' assistant coach from 2003-2006. Army has made the four-team Patriot League Tournament field every season since her arrival at West Point, which stands as a Patriot League record.

In just her first year in the head coaching role, Kovaci produced a 24-5 record, including a second-place conference finish at 12-2 and a ninth-straight trip to the Patriot League Tournament. Kovaci's club went 14-1 at home and appeared on national television twice that fall.

Kovaci cultivated her skills as Glen Conley's top aide for four years, making West Point's decision to hire her as head coach a rather easy one. In her assistant role, Kovaci helped produce the 2004 Patriot League Player of the Year, Caitlin Machon, and the conference's top player in 2005, Abby Casciato.

While serving as an assistant coach at Army, Kovaci remained active on the court. In January 2005, she was called back from the states to play as a member of the Albanian National Team when it competed at the FIVB World Championships in Sheffield, England. During the week-long event, she was listed as the seventh best digger in the world and ranked among the top-15 best hitters.

Kovaci's prominence as one of the top Albanian players was apparent early in her career. In 1996, Albania spearheaded a campaign called Vision 2000, which projected who its top athletes would be over the next three years. Kovaci was the committee's selection as the country's top volleyball player. Along with the recognition, Kovaci took part in various television spots and met with many Albanian and international dignitaries.

Kovaci arrived on the banks of the Hudson following a one-year stint at Centre College in Danville, Ky., where she served as a volunteer assistant coach during the 2002 season. Under her tutelage, the Colonels went 23-19 and placed two team members on the Southern Collegiate Athletic Conference second team.

Prior to her coaching tenure at Centre College, Kovaci played in the United States Professional Volleyball League with the Grand Rapids Force during its inaugural season in 2002. In addition to playing in the four-team league, Kovaci guided high school teams and performed public relations work during her one season in the USPV. She finished second in the league in digs per game. Kovaci also played competitively in the adult USAV league.

A 2002 graduate of Temple University, Kovaci earned a bachelor's degree in kinesiology. Kovaci was an immediate standout on the court at Temple, serving as the Owls' captain in 1999 and 2000, while helping them to three-straight Atlantic 10 titles (1997-99). She earned AVCA All-America honors in each of those same years, and was named to the AVCA All-District team in 1998, 1999 and 2000. In addition, ASICS lauded Kovaci as an All-American in 1999 and 2000. The two-time Atlantic 10 Conference Most Valuable Player led the Owls in virtually every category her senior season. That marked Kovaci's third major award from the conference as she picked up Rookie of the Year plaudits in 1997. In her senior season, she played in 79 games, tallied 492 kills and registered 315 digs. Kovaci also led the team with 29 service aces and ended the season second in hitting percentage (.275).

# HEAD COACH ALMA KOVACI



Kovaci concluded her decorated collegiate career just 18 kills shy of the all-time record with 2,046 and graduated as the school record holder for career digs with 1,632. Her career-high 38 kills in a three-game match versus George Washington in 1999 still stands second all-time in NCAA history. It is the most kills for a three-game match since 2001. Kovaci punctuated her career during the 25th Anniversary season of the Atlantic 10 when she was named the Owls' top volleyball player in 25 years of A-10 competition.

Fitting after authoring such a fine collegiate career, Kovaci became the first volleyball player inducted into the Temple Sports Hall of Fame on Oct. 15, 2011.

She has assisted with the Bob Bertucci Volleyball Summer Program and helped with the Frostburg State Volleyball Summer Program in 2001. Fluent in three languages (English, Albanian, Italian), Kovaci was also a Synergy Volleyball Camps clinician in 1999 and 2000 and a volunteer assistant coach for the Synergy Volleyball Club in 1999 and 2000. She has conducted numerous volleyball camps and clinics at West Point as well.

Prior to the 2006 campaign, Kovaci attended the NCAA Women Coaches Academy in Colorado Springs, Colo. She was one of 25 female coaches in the NCAA selected to participate. Kovaci was awarded a scholarship to attend the National Association of Collegiate Women Athletics Administrators conference in June. She has served as a panelist at a number of public functions, including a National Ethics in America panel that specifically focused on ethics in sports. She was also named the winner of the Coach Mike Krzyzewski Teaching Character Through Sport Award in the corps squad leader division.

Kovaci, resides at West Point, N.Y., and holds professional credentials with the AVCA, while serving as the Patriot League's representative to the organization. She has also been a member of the Minority Opportunities Athletic Association and continues to chair the AVCA subcommittee on marketing. Kovaci represents the Patriot League on the All-Region voting committee as well.

Army volleyball head coach Alma Kovaci announced Sarah Lusk joined her staff as an assistant coach in mid-April 2014. Lusk is an Army veteran, who completed two tours of Iraq and coached the All-Army Women's Volleyball Team to a pair of gold medals.

While contributing to all aspects of the program, Lusk concentrates her efforts working with the middle blockers and Army's overall team blocking. She also handles travel operations, equipment and joining in the Black Knights' recruiting efforts. Lusk joined fourth-year Army assistant coach Stafford Barzey on Kovaci's staff.

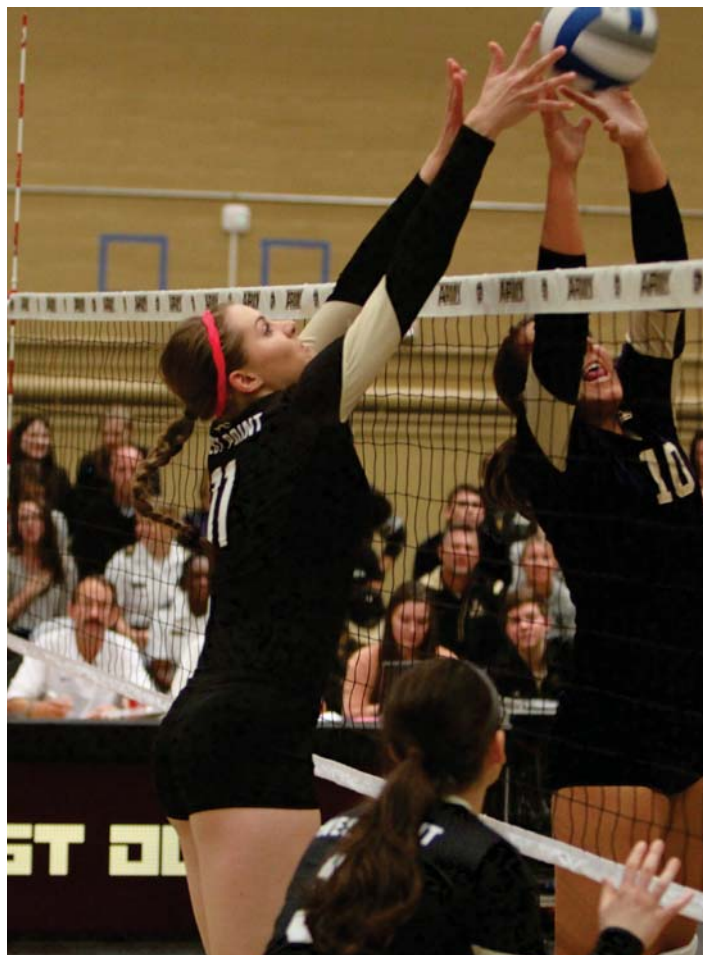

### Patriot League Academic and Athletic Success

Now in its third decade as an all-sport conference combining academic and athletic excellence, the Patriot League sponsors championships in 24 men and women's sports. Initially started as an NCAA Division I-AA football conference in 1986, the Patriot League became an all-sport conference in 1990 and includes American, Army, Boston University, Bucknell, Colgate, Holy Cross, Lafayette, Lehigh, Loyola and Navy as full members, and Fordham, Georgetown, MIT and Richmond as associate members. These institutions are among the oldest and most prestigious in the nation and their alumni have and continue to play leadership roles in shaping our country. Since 1998, the Patriot League has ranked first each year among all Division I conferences awarding athletic aid in the NCAA Graduation Rate Report. The League also had more than 93 percent of its teams score above the national APR average in the most recent data, and 92 Patriot League teams earned NCAA Academic Performance Program Public Recognition Awards after posting academic progress rate scores in the top 10 percent of all squads in their respective sports. The Patriot League's mission is simple: to provide successful competitive athletic experiences while maintaining high academic standards, and to prepare its student-athletes to be leaders in society. During the 2013-14 academic year, Patriot League student-athletes and teams have accomplished the following:

\*The Patriot League ranked second among all conferences in multi-year APR rating, and led all leagues in men's basketball APR.

\*81 Patriot League teams recorded perfect graduation success rates and 92 earned NCAA Public Recognition Awards for ranking in the top 10 percent of their sport in APR.

\*More than 93 percent of Patriot League teams scored above the national average in APR.

\*Patriot League teams won NCAA Tournament games in seven different sports, with American winning twice to advance to the Round of 16 in volleyball.

\*League squads also won NCAA first-round or regional contests in football (Fordham), men's soccer (Navy), women's soccer (Boston University), women's lacrosse (Loyola), softball (Boston University) and baseball (Bucknell).

\*Navy won the overall Patriot League Presidents' Cup for the second time in three years, while Army took first place on the men's side and Boston University claimed the women's title in its inaugural season.

\*Fifteen student-athletes earned Capital One/CoSIDA Academic All-America recognition, including first-team accolades for Fordham's Brett Biestek (Football), Bucknell's Joe Meyer (Men's Soccer) and Navy's Elizabeth Hoerner (Women's Soccer).

\*Thirty-five student-athletes received Capital One/CoSIDA Academic All-District honors.

\*There were 2,450 student-athletes on the Patriot League Academic Honor Roll in 2013-14, including 128 with a semester GPA of at least 4.0.

\*American women's basketball standout Alexis Dobbs and Navy women's soccer star Elizabeth Hoerner and women's rowing student-athlete Katherine Ashton each earned NCAA Postgraduate Scholarships. Dobbs and Hoerner were later named the Patriot League's nominees for the NCAA Woman of the Year Award.

\*Loyola's Joe Fletcher (Men's Lacrosse) and Boston University's Allison Barwise (Track and Field) were named the Patriot League Male and Female Scholar-Athlete of the Year recipients, respectively.

\*The Patriot League Sportsmanship Awards went to a pair of basketball student-athletes in American's Darius Gardner on the men's side and Army's Krishawn Tillett for the women.

\*Lafayette's Alec Golini (Men's Soccer) and Lehigh's Brooke Astor (Women's Track and Field) earned the Patriot League Outstanding Leadership and Character Awards for their excellence in leadership and service.

\*Four Patriot Leaguers were named Senior CLASS Award finalists, including three in men's lacrosse.

\*Loyola's Joe Fletcher was one of five finalists for the Tewaaraton Award given to the top player in men's lacrosse, and also earned the William C. Schmeisser Outstanding Defensive Player Award from the USILA.

\*Twenty-four Patriot Leaguers were named first, second or third-team All-Americans in team sports, including six in football, five in men's lacrosse, four in women's lacrosse and three in men's soccer.

\*Loyola spent the majority of the season as the No. 1-ranked team in the men's lacrosse national polls.

\*Fordham football and Loyola men and women's lacrosse each finished in the top 10 of national polls, while Navy men's soccer and American volleyball and field hockey each placed in the top 25 of their sport's final national rankings.

\*Navy's Jay Stell placed third in the javelin at the NCAA Outdoor Track and Field Championships, matching the best-ever finish for a Patriot League male and earning first-team All-America honors.

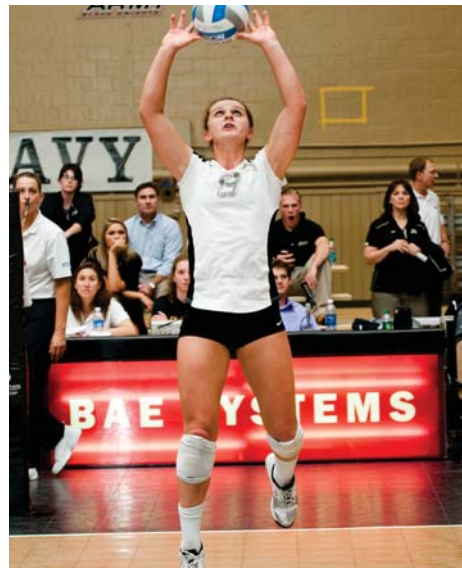

### ARIANA MANKUS '13

#### ARMY ATHLETIC ASSOCIATION TROPHY



Ariana Mankus '13 became the second player in West Point volleyball history to be awarded the prestigious Army Athletic Association Trophy, and the first since Elizabeth Lazzari in 2009.

The Army Athletic Association trophy is awarded annually to the male and female cadets who display the "most valuable service to intercollegiate athletics during a career as a cadet."

As a three-time first team All-Patriot League performer, including a unanimous selection in 2012, Mankus was one of two Black Knights to earn AVCA All-Northeast Region honors and was named ECAC Offensive Player of the Year last fall. Her career began as impressive as it ended, as Mankus became the first player in league history to win Player and Rookie of the Year honors in the same season.

Mankus was also a key cog in Army's first Patriot League title in 15 years in 2009 and the team's first NCAA Division I Tournament appearance. She finished her career second on Army's career kills (1,563) and digs (1,424) lists and is one of just three players all-time to reach the century mark in both statistical categories. The aforementioned statistics rank sixth and seventh in Patriot League history, respectively.

A team captain, Mankus was a four-time Patriot League Academic Honor Roll member and a two-time Academic All-Patriot League honoree. The Student-Athlete Advisory Committee president will enter the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers in the spring of 2013 with a degree in Art, Philosophy and Literature.



# ARMY-NAVY RIVALRY

## INSIDE THE RIVALRY

Though the annual gridiron meeting between the two service academies draws most of the rivalry's attention, Army and Navy also compete in 22 other sports, including volleyball. Compounded by the fact that both compete in the Patriot League, the volleyball teams have built a strong rivalry that has been Army-dominated since 2005.

Army has won eight straight matches against Navy and owns a 24-2 games record during that stretch. In addition, Army is 15-1 in the last 16 meetings and has won 24 of the previous 28 competitions. With its recent success, the Black Knights now hold a commanding 43-10 record over their Navy adversaries. Of all the varsity sports that both schools compete in, the Army volleyball team owns one of the highest winning percentages against the Midshipmen (.811).

While the rivalry has gone back and forth at times, the Black Knights owned the 1980s, winning 10 of the first 12 contests from 1981-89. The first-ever meeting between the two academies came in 1981, which ended in a 3-2 victory for Army. Following a five-set win by Navy the next year, Army reeled off seven consecutive victories to take an 8-1 lead in the series by 1987.

The longest winning streak for Army lasted nine matches, starting with a 3-0 shutout in the first of two meetings in 1989 and continued through the 1995 tilt, which also ended in a 3-0 sweep. The win in 1995 extended Army's record to 17-2 at that point.

Army has never lost more than two straight contests to Navy, with those setbacks coming in 1996 and 1997.

Seven of Navy's 10 victories against Army have come in five sets with the Mids claiming one sweep, a 3-0 triumph in 1997. For Army, 24 of its 43 positive outcomes have come via a three-set win, including six during the current eight-match winning streak.

Coinciding with Army's success of late has been the steady guidance of head coach Alma Kovaci. Since taking over the program in 2007, Kovaci possesses a 13-1 record versus Navy, including a 7-0 mark in matches played at West Point.

Overall, Army is 25-4 against Navy at home, 16-6 in Annapolis and 2-0 in neutral site competitions. The neutral-site meetings occurred in East Stroudsburg, Pa. in 1986 and in 2005 at the Patriot League Tournament in Washington, D.C. After winning the 2005 semifinal match, Army improved to 2-0 against Navy in the postseason. The first meeting happened in 1991 in the second round of the Patriot League tournament.
