The day ended with a two-hour practice at Christl Arena, where members of Team USA participated in shooting contests with members of Army's men's and women's basketball teams.

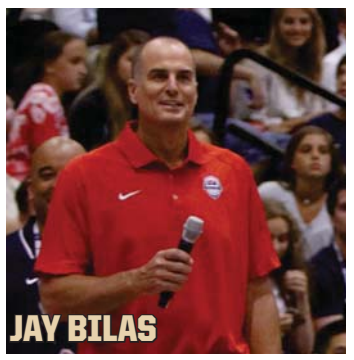

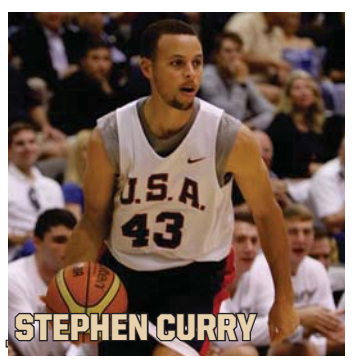

The 2015-16 campaign will mark the 26th season that the Donald W. Holleder Center has served as home to the Army women's basketball team. The Black Knights officially moved into Army's premier winter sports showcase for the 1990-91 season. That move coincided with Army's return to the Division I level of competition in joining the newly formed Patriot League.

The women's team left behind some fond memories at Central Gymnasium, its home since first hitting the hardwood in 1976-77, in favor of the modern and luxurious facility located across the street from Michie Stadium.

The Holleder Center has been the men's home court since the winter of 1985 when they said goodbye to the USMA Field House -- a home they had known for many decades.

In the beginning, the women joined the men for doubleheaders at Christl Arena, while hosting the Empire State Tournament their last four years as a Division II school (1987-90). Army won the ESC Tournament title and the automatic NCAA Division II Regional bid in 1988, while finishing runner-up its final year (1990).

The Holleder Center houses not only the Edward C. Christl Jr. Arena that seats 5,043 for basketball, but the Joseph S. and Frederick H.S. Tate Rink that seats 2,648 for ice hockey as well. The building, dedicated Oct. 1, 1988, was named for Maj. Donald W. Holleder (USMA '56), who was killed in action in Vietnam in 1967. While at West Point, Holleder excelled in basketball and football. He earned All-America honors in the latter, and has been enshrined in the College Football Foundation Hall of Fame. Holleder was inducted into the Army Sports Hall of Fame in 2006.

The basketball arena was named for 1st Lt. Edward C. Christl Jr. (USMA '44), who was killed in Austria in 1945. Elected captain of the basketball team his senior year, Christl led the Cadets to a perfect 15-0 record.

The building is constructed of concrete and steel-framed masonry complete with spectator and support facilities. It contains two concession areas, an Army Athletic Association gift shop, ticket office, sports medicine room, storage areas and offices for coaching and administrative personnel for both basketball and hockey programs.

Christl Arena possesses a Horner hardwood basketball floor, which has been refurbished several times over the past decade. The floor measures 149 x 116 feet. Showers and locker facilities for Army's men's and women's squads, plus three visiting team locker rooms are located close by. The arena also contains six portable basketball supports and fixed chair and bench seating for spectators.

During the 1999-2000 season, the Academy enhanced patrons' game-viewing pleasure by replacing the four-sided overhead scoreboard at midcourt with two wall-mounted units. The scoreboards, located on the north and south walls of Christl Arena, feature state-of-the-art signage and digital displays, along with accompanying boards that show player point and foul totals.

Christl Arena hosted quarterfinal and semifinal rounds of the Patriot League men's and women's tournament in 1994-95 and again in 1998-99. Christl served as the backdrop for the 2006 and 2014 Patriot League Women's Tournaments. After earning the No. 1 seed in the postseason tournament in 2006 and the No. 2 seed in 2014, the Black Knights hosted the quarterfinal and semifinal rounds as well as the championship game. Christl also served as the site for the opening two rounds of the women's tournament in 2007-08.

During the summer of 2015, Christl Arena underwent a facelift, including a redesigned court and updated concourse, which features new signs and pictures of the Black Knights throughout the years.

The Army women have authored a 231-129 (.642) mark during their 25-year stay at Christl Arena.

ATHLETIC COMMUNICATIONS



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The 2015-16 women's basketball media guide was prepared to assist the media in its coverage of the Black Knights. Media Credentials: All media credentials for 2015-16 Army women's basketball home games at Christl Arena must be made in advance to Harrison Antognioni of athletic communications. Credentials will be held for pick-up at the ticket office "Will Call" window located in the main lobby of the Holleder Center.

Photographers: All photographers attending Army basketball home games must have their credentials clearly displayed. Requests for credentials should be made in advance and directed to Harrison Antognioni. Limited space is available along each baseline and positions will be made available on a priority basis.

Press Row: Press row is located courtside on the west side of the basketball floor of Christl Arena. The official scorer, timekeeper, public address announcer and both teams are located opposite press row. Press Row Phone: (845) 938-4441.

Telephones: For filing convenience, several telephones are located along press row in Christl Arena. All calls should be made collect, with a credit card or to an "800" number. West Point telephone lines require a "99" prefix for all calls off post. Those desiring their own private line should contact Verizon at (845) 890-2850 for installation procedures.

In-Game Services: Pregame notes, cumulative statistics, media guides and game programs will be made available prior to the start of each game in the Media Room, located just outside the Christl Arena main doors. Computer generated team and individual statistics, box scores and play-by-play, will be passed out to the media at halftime and again at the conclusion of the game. A facsimile machine is available should media wish to transmit box scores or stories via that method. Additionally, data terminals are placed along press row, delivering official courtside statistics throughout the game. Please contact the athletic communications office at least 24 hours in advance to reserve a press row location near one of the terminals.

Radio Information: The U.S. Military Academy will provide one (1) telephone line for one visiting radio station, with commercial groups granted preference over student stations, unless otherwise indicated by the visiting team's athletic communications contact. The line may be reserved through Harrison Antognioni. There is a rental fee of \$75 for all visiting radio stations of non-Patriot League member schools, and all calls should be charged to the outlet or billed to a credit card. Checks must be payable to: Army Athletic Association and received on the day of the game. For additional information on reserving phone lines, contact Harrison Antognioni at (845) 938-6996 or contact Verizon at (845) 890-2850 to reserve a line. Be sure to inform Verizon offices that the line will be placed along press row in Christl Arena, and then notify the athletic communications office that reservations have been made.

Post Game Interviews: Army West Point head coach Dave Magarity will be available to the media following a 10-minute "cooling off" period. Anyone wishing to speak with a specific player should notify Harrison Antognioni before the players enter the locker room. Those players will also be made available. Interview policies and procedures for Army West Point's opponents will be determined by visiting sports information directors.

In-Season Interviews: All player and coach interviews must be scheduled through Army West Point's Office of Athletic Communications by contacting Harrison Antognioni. Please call at least 24 hours in advance for "in-person" and phone interviews. Army practice sessions are closed to members of the media, unless accompanied by a member of the athletic communications staff. Please contact Army West Point's Office of Athletic Communications in advance to determine the status of practice and to gain clearance into the workout. Practice will generally run from 3:30-6 p.m. during the week.

On The Web: Members of the media can access Army game notes, box scores, cumulative statistics, player bios and recaps of previous games at the Army Athletic Association's official website GoArmyWestPoint.com, maintained by Sidarm Sports.

The Patriot League, which Army West Point is a member of in several sports, publishes a weekly report including standings, Players and Rookies of the Week, team notes and updated statistics will be placed on the league's web site: www.PatriotLeague.com.

Dave Magarity begins his 10th season as head coach at Army West Point in 2015-16 and his 11th at the Academy after serving as associate head coach in 2005-06. Magarity was introduced as the program's eighth head coach in April 2006.

Magarity led the Black Knights to their third straight appearance in a national postseason in 2014-15, as Army West Point earned an automatic bid to the WNIT, following berths in the NCAA Tournament and WNIT in 2014 and 2013, respectively. Army West Point concluded the season with a 23-8 overall record to mark its third consecutive 20-win season. Both accomplishments were team firsts.

The Black Knights finished 14-4 during the 2014-15 Patriot League regular season to enter the conference tournament as the No. 2 seed.

Junior Kelsey Minato landed WBCA All-America honorable mention recognition to become the sixth Army West Point player to earn All-America accolades, and the first since Lisa Russell '95 in 1993. Minato established a team single-season record with 84 three-pointers, breaking her own mark of 82 in 2013-14. She also set a program single-game record with eight three-pointers, achieving the feat against Boston University (Jan. 29) and Lehigh (March 9).

Minato earned All-Patriot League first team honors following the regular season, joining Katie Macfarlane '04 as the only Army West Point player to be named to the first team three times. Senior Olivia Schretzman joined Minato with postseason accolades, earning selection to the All-Patriot League third team.

In 2013-14, Magarity surpassed Lynn Chiavaro (132 wins) to become Army West Point's career wins leader after his team defeated Holy Cross on Jan. 15, 2014. The 32-year coaching veteran reached the 400 career win threshold in 2011-12 and shows a 482-439 career record.

Magarity guided Army West Point to a 25-8 finish in 2013-14, setting the program's Division I record for victories in a season. The 25 wins equaled the team's all-time wins mark that Army West Point established as a Division II program in 1983-84.

After finishing tied for second in the regular season, the Black Knights claimed their second Patriot League Tournament championship, thanks to a seven-game winning streak that was capped by a 68-58 win over Holy Cross in the conference title game.

Army West Point advanced to the NCAA Tournament for the second time as a Division I program, and for the fourth time overall.

By leading Army West Point to the NAAs, Magarity became just the second coach to take both a men's and women's program to the NCAA Tournament, after he guided the Marist men's team to the dance in 1987. He joins William "Speedy" Morris, who reached the NCAA Tournament with the men's and women's basketball teams at La Salle.

Minato joined Lisa Russell '95 as the only Army West Point player to earn back-to-back Patriot League Player of the Year nods following her record-setting season. Minato established Army West Point single-season records in points (725), free throws (207) and three-pointers (82), while also topping Academy single-season marks in points per game (22.0) and free throw percentage (92.4). Joining Minato as All-Patriot League performers were senior Jen Hazlett (second team) and freshman Dani Failor (All-Rookie Team).

The 2012-13 campaign was one of the most successful in program history. Magarity became the first head coach in Army West Point's Division I history to record multiple 20-win seasons as he led a young Black Knight squad to a 22-9 record, just their second Patriot League regular-season title in program history and the program's first WNIT bid.

Army West Point became the first team in conference history to sweep all major awards, with Magarity claiming the league's Coach of the Year. In addition to his coaching honor, freshman Kelsey Minato became the first in league history to be voted both the Player and Rookie of the Year, while senior Anna Simmers was tabbed Defensive Player of the Year. Minato was the first Rookie of the Year and second Player of the Year to be mentored by Magarity, while Simmers was the second Defensive Player of the Year.



Minato and Simmers were honored with All-Patriot League first-team selections, while Minato and classmate Aimee Oertner were unanimous picks to the All-Rookie Team. Army West Point had multiple first-team selections for the first time in program history, while the two newcomer nods were also a program first.

After graduating the team's top two scorers and four starters from the 2010-11 team, Magarity and his staff worked hard to exceed all expectations in 2011-12. Three months after being selected seventh in the Patriot League preseason poll, the Black Knights finished the regular season tied for third, clinching home-court advantage for the conference tournament. Army West Point was narrowly edged out by Holy Cross in the quarterfinals to end the season 14-16.

The Black Knights' senior-dominated unit went 13-16 in 2010-11, bowing out to Bucknell in the Patriot League Tournament after tying the Bison for fourth place in the regular-season standings.

Seasons of 18-12 and 19-12 marks followed in 2007-08 and 2008-09, respectively, as Magarity continued to challenge his players with two of the most rigorous nonconference schedules in program history. Army West Point faced top-25 teams in Connecticut, Rutgers and Ohio State over the span of two years in order to best prepare the team for Patriot League play in January.

A young Black Knight squad without a single senior on the roster posted an 11-18 mark in 2009-10. However, Magarity's club still managed to finish in a tie for fourth place and capture the fourth seed in the Patriot League Tournament.

Magarity was chosen to take the reins following what had been a "Cinderella" storybook season in 2005-06 for the Black Knights until their head coach, Maggie Dixon, died suddenly that spring.

Magarity spent the 2005-06 season on the bench with Dixon, serving as associate head coach and playing an integral role in the Black Knights' magical campaign during which the team won its first-ever Patriot League Tournament title, accompanied by an NCAA Tournament berth.

Faced with an unthinkable challenge after the loss of Dixon, the Black Knights honored their late coach and ushered in the Magarity era with a stellar 24-6 record. Army West Point posted an 11-3 mark in conference play, further cementing the fact that the Academy made the right deci-

sion in Magarity's hiring and that the program was in more than capable hands.

Magarity is one of just four active Division I women's basketball coaches to make the transition from the men's side to coaching women. The short list also includes Paul Westhead (Oregon), Alan LeForce (Coastal Carolina) and Dennis Wolfe (Virginia Tech).

Magarity has mentored five 1,000-point scorers at Army West Point, including Jen Hazlett '14 and Kelsey Minato, who both reached the plateau in 2013-14. The other players to reach the 1,000-point mark under Magarity's watch, Cara Enright '08, Alex McGuire '09 and Erin Anthony '11, make up one of the most celebrated trios in Army history, as they represent the program's third, fourth and fifth-leading scorers, respectively. Magarity's marquee recruit from day-one, Anthony wrapped up a decorated career ranked second on Army's career rebounding list. A two-time CoSIDA/Capital One Academic All-America selection, Anthony was a four-year all-league performer and three-time Patriot League Scholar-Athlete of the Year.

Along with Anthony, Enright and McGuire, Magarity groomed 2007-08 Patriot League Defensive Player of the Year Maragree King '08. His players have combined to win 15 All-Patriot League citations, seven All-Rookie Team honors and three Player of the Year (Enright, Minato) awards.

One of the most well-respected and recognizable faces in the basketball community, the honors and awards for Magarity are plentiful. In addition to 2013's Patriot League honor, he was presented with the Anaconda Lifetime Achievement Award at the 2008 Men's Basketball Final Four in San Antonio, Texas. In his first season at Army, the N.Y.-Metropolitan Basketball Writer's Association named Magarity its Coach of the Year. Following the landmark 2005-06 campaign, the Army team was bestowed with the Jimmy V Foundation Comeback Award, AT&T National Sportsmanship Award and Patriot League Sportsmanship Award, further rooting Magarity's influence on the program.

Magarity added to his coaching accolades when he was named the Basketball Coaches Association of New York Division I Women's Basketball Coach of the Year following the 2013-14 campaign.

Magarity arrived at West Point in October of 2005 following a brief stint as the Assistant Commissioner/Director of Men's Basketball Operations

for the Mid-American Conference (MAC). Magarity was responsible for basketball scheduling, working closely with the MAC coordinator of officials and served as a liaison between the league office and the 12-member institutions. Prior to joining the MAC, he held a similar position with the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference (MAAC) based in Edison, N.J.

In 23 years as a men's head coach, including 18 just 31 miles north of West Point at nearby Marist College in Poughkeepsie, N.Y., Magarity tallied an overall record of 313-334 (.484), with 253 of those victories coming with the Red Foxes.

During his coaching tenures at Marist and St. Francis University (Pa.), Magarity was honored as Coach of the Year in four different leagues. He was first named Coach of the Year at St. Francis in 1981, earning NABC Division I District III accolades, before garnering recognition at Marist during the 1986-87 season when he won ECAC Metro honors.

He was honored again following the 1994-95 campaign, being dubbed the Northeast Conference Coach of the Year, and the following season was recognized by the NABC for the second time in his career. He would again earn NABC Coach of the Year honors following the 2000-01 and 2001-02 seasons. Magarity was selected the MAAC Coach of the Year in 2001-02 by the league's coaches. He won Colleg Insider.com's top coaching honor three times (2000, 2001, 2002) and the Sport Magazine New York Metropolitan Basketball Writers Association Award once in 1988.

Under his direction from 1986 to 2004, the Red Foxes saw unparalleled success as he led his teams to an NCAA Tournament appearance in 1987 and to the National Invitational Tournament in 1996. Of the 18 Marist teams he coached, 15 of them reached double digits in wins and two eclipsed the 20-win plateau, including a 22-win performance during the 1995-96 season.

His coaching career began at St. Francis in 1973 as a graduate assistant and then as an assistant coach until taking over the reins of the program in 1978, becoming the youngest Division I head coach in the nation at the time (27). In his third campaign, Magarity led the Red Flashes to a 17-10 mark, the most wins in a season for St. Francis in a dozen years, and earned District III Coach of the Year honors as a result.

In his first season at the helm of the Red Foxes in 1986-87, Magarity made a name for himself, leading that group to the institution's first-ever 20-win season (20-10) and the team's second consecutive berth in the NCAA Tournament. Magarity's squad ranked 11th in the country in field goal percentage defense (.425) and scoring defense (62.9). The Red Foxes won 14 of their last 15 games that season as Magarity took home ECAC Metro Coach of the Year honors.

In his second campaign, Magarity and the Red Foxes continued to impress as they finished 18-9 overall and earned a share of the ECAC Metro Conference regular-season crown with a 13-3 conference mark. Marist continued to show that defense was a key to Magarity's coaching philosophy, ranking second in the nation in field goal percentage defense holding opponents to 40.1 percent shooting from the floor. The Metropolitan Basketball Writers Association honored Magarity by presenting him the second annual Mike Cohen "Good Guy" award. That June, Magarity saw Marist gain national prominence when Rik Smits was the second pick overall of the 1988 NBA Draft by the Indiana Pacers. Smits played 13 seasons in the NBA and was selected to the East squad for the NBA All-Star Game in 1998. He retired in 2000 ranked second in the Pacers' franchise history in points (11,125), rebounds (4,601) and blocked shots (959).

Magarity led Marist to only its second 20-win season in 1995-96, compiling a school-record 22 wins, and posted a school-record .759 winning percentage (22-7). The Red Foxes earned the program's first bid to the NIT, and Magarity was recognized as the NABC District II Coach of the Year. Four players from that squad were named All-Northeast Conference.

The Red Foxes and Magarity won a share of the MAAC regular-season title in 2001-02, the first since joining the league prior to the start of the 1997-98 campaign. Marist went 13-5 in MAAC action on its way to an overall 19-9 record.

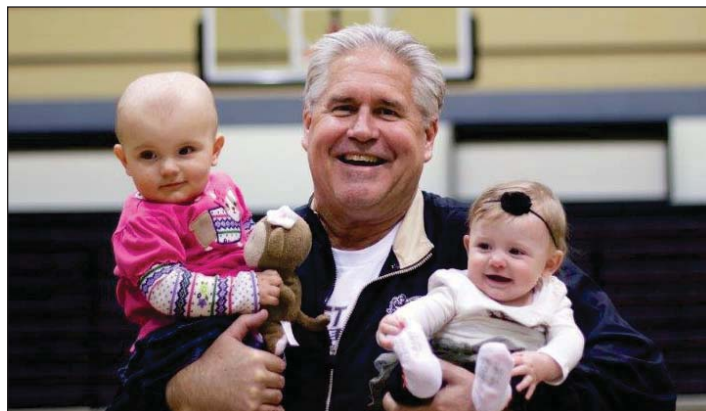
During his 18 seasons at Marist, Magarity coached a total of 11 Red Foxes who eclipsed the 1,000-point mark for their careers. But his tenure was marked by more than just playing success. Magarity coached two Academic All-Americans and graduated better than 95 percent of his players who completed their NCAA eligibility.

A 1974 graduate of St. Francis in Loretto, Pa., Magarity earned a bachelor's degree in business management and marketing.

Magarity, who hails from Philadelphia, Pa., and his wife, Rita, have three children: Maureen, Katie and David, Jr., two granddaughters, Charlotte and Taylor and a grandson, Carter. All three Magarity children are Marist graduates, while Maureen served as her father's assistant and eventually associate head coach at Army West Point before departing to take the head women's basketball coaching position at the University of New Hampshire in May 2010.

COLLEEN MULLEN

ASSOCIATE HEAD COACH

FIFTH SEASON

Colleen Mullen enters her fifth season at Army West Point, and her fourth as the team's associate head coach, in 2015-16. Mullen served as an assistant coach during the 2011-12 campaign.

Mullen joined Army West Point's staff as an assistant coach in July 2011 and was promoted to associate head coach a year later. Mullen made her way to West Point after two years at Long Island University where she was the top assistant and recruiting coordinator. She also spent a season as an assistant coach at Patriot League foe Lehigh. Along with assisting all aspects of the program, Mullen is also Army West Point's recruiting coordinator.

"I am excited to have Colleen join our coaching staff here at the Academy," head coach Dave Magarity said upon her hiring. "She brings a wealth of experience and an infectious energy as a recruiter. She has a strong background as a teacher of the game, and her ability to work with our young backcourt will be critical for our future success as a team."

A proven point guard as a collegiate player for both Rhode Island and New Hampshire, Mullen has continued to cultivate her expertise at the guard position since entering the coaching ranks.

During the 2014-15 season, Mullen worked primarily with Army West Point's guards in helping lead the team to its program-record third straight appearance in a national postseason tournament, as the Black Knights reached the WNIT following berths in the NCAA Tournament and the WNIT in 2014 and 2013, respectively. Army West Point finished the season 23-8 to mark its third straight 20-win season, also a program first.

Junior point guard Kelsey Minato earned her third consecutive All-Patriot League first team selection, joining Katie Macfarlane '94 as the only player in program history to be named to the All-Patriot League first team three times. Minato became just the sixth Army West Point player to earn All-America honors and established program record for single-season scoring average (22.3), single-season three-pointers (84) single-game three-pointers (8).

In 2013-14, Mullen helped develop an Army backcourt that led the Black Knights to a team-record 25 wins and their second NCAA Tournament appearance as a Division I program.

Under Mullen's watch, Minato turned in arguably the best single-season performance in team history. Minato set Army single-season records in points (725), free throws (207) and three-pointers (82), while also topping the Academy's single-season list in points per game (22.0) and free throw percentage (92.4).

The Black Knights drained a program-record 212 three-pointers in 2013-14, while Minato and senior guard Jen Hazlett (73) finished the year first and second on Army's single-season three-point shooting list, respectively.

Minato claimed her second straight Patriot League Player of the Year honor in 2013-14, while Hazlett was recognized on the all-league second team.

Army's backcourt shined in 2012-13, as Minato became the first in Patriot League history to be voted Player and Rookie of the Year, while the Black Knights had two first-team All-Patriot League selections for the first time in program history, with both honorees being guards (Minato, Anna Simmers).

The Black Knights' high-scoring perimeter unit helped Army average its highest scoring output since 2007-08 thanks in large part to the second-most accurate three-point shooting contingent in the Patriot League. The Black Knights' success rate beyond the arc was their highest since 2008-09, while their 158 triples were the most Army had made since 2004-05.

Prior to Army, Mullen worked as an assistant coach for seven years, including two seasons at Long Island. Her duties at Long Island also included overseeing the assistant coaching staff, coordinating all on and off campus recruitment and serving as the academic coordinator. The Blackbirds improved their overall team grade-point average from a 2.84 in 2010 to a 3.19 in 2011. A proven recruiter, her first recruiting class was ranked 88th nationally by All-Star Girls Basketball Report. Mullen was also responsible for signing first team All-America junior college player Ebony Davis out of St. Louis, Mo.

Mullen spent 2007-08 at Lehigh where she oversaw player development with an emphasis on the backcourt. During her short stint at Lehigh, she guided three of the program's top guards - Erica Prosser, Tricia Smith and Alex Ross - to All-Patriot League selections. All three players went on to garner major Patriot League honors and help Lehigh to back-to-back conference titles.

In addition to her coaching duties at Lehigh, she also oversaw compliance, marketing, team travel, equipment, academics, alumni relations, community outreach, facilities and game management.

Mullen spent 2005-07 as the top assistant at Southern New Hampshire after serving as the director of basketball operations at Northern Illinois in 2004-05.

As a player, Mullen spent two seasons at Rhode Island, leading her team in assists each year before transferring to New Hampshire. A two-year captain, she was one of the top feeders in Wildcat history and finished her two-year career with 218 assists, the 14th-highest mark in school history. Mullen was named to the America East Academic Honor Roll in each of her two seasons.

Mullen received a Bachelor of Science degree in Business Administration from New Hampshire in 2003. She earned her a Master of Business Administration degree from Southern New Hampshire in 2006. She and her wife Lauren Hall-Gregory live with their daughter Maggie in Ossining, N.Y.



EMILY GARNER

ASSISTANT COACH
FOURTH SEASON

Emily Garner begins her fourth season as an assistant coach at Army West Point in 2015-16.

Head coach Dave Magarity introduced Garner as an assistant coach to the women's basketball staff on June 21, 2012. Garner spent the previous two seasons with the Long Island University women's basketball program following a four-year playing career at Army West Point's Patriot League foe Lafayette.

Garner helped guide the Black Knights to their program-record third straight appearance in a national postseason tournament during the 2014-15 season, as Army West Point advanced to the WNIT following bids to the NCAA Tournament and WNIT in 2014 and 2013, respectively.

In her second season mentoring the Army West Point post players in 2013-14, Garner helped the Black Knights win their second Patriot League championship and second NCAA Tournament berth as a Division I program. The Black Knights totaled 38.0 rebounds per game, while Army West Point's 5.2 rebounding margin was tops in the Patriot League. Freshman forward Danielle Failor was named to the conference's All-Rookie Team after averaging 4.3 points and 3.9 rebounds while appearing in all 33 games.

In her first season behind the Army West Point bench, Garner guided forward Aimee Oertner to a unanimous All-Rookie Team selection after the standout post player notched 81 rejections during her freshman campaign.

Prior to coming to West Point, Garner spent the previous two seasons at LIU, serving as an assistant coach (2010-11) and director of basketball operations (2011-12). During that time, the Blackbirds averaged 20 wins per season while earning consecutive berths to the Northeast Conference Championship.

For Army West Point, the Virginia native's responsibilities include monitoring the team's academic progress while also serving as the point of contact for marketing initiatives and community outreach and relations projects. Her recruiting efforts will focus on her home region of the Mid-Atlantic and Southeast.

Garner began her coaching career at her alma mater, Robinson Secondary High School in Fairfax, Va. She was an assistant coach for the Rams, while serving the same role for the Potomac Valley Tarheels AAU squad.

Garner was a four-year member of the Lafayette women's basketball team, playing in 108 career games. She led the Leopards in rebounding for two seasons while also garnering a pair Patriot League Academic Honor Roll citations.

Garner, who graduated with a Bachelor of Arts degree in English with a minor in economics and business in 2009, remains on Lafayette's all-time top-10 lists for career rebounds, free-throws made and free-throws attempted, as well as single-season marks for rebounds and free-throw attempts.

ASSISTANT COACH

THIRD SEASON

Jenna McLaughlin returns to Army West Point for her third season as assistant coach in 2015-16.

Head coach Dave Magarity announced the hiring of McLaughlin on Aug. 21, 2013. McLaughlin arrived at West Point after serving as an assistant coach at NYU. McLaughlin's primary roles include assisting in player development, recruiting, scheduling and team operations, while also coaching the guards and wing players.

McLaughlin excelled in her first two seasons at Army West Point, mentoring solid backcourts that led the team to appearances in the NCAA Tournament and the WNIT.

In 2014-15, the Black Knights established a program record by advancing to their third straight national post-season tournament, as Army West Point earned a trip to the WNIT after bids to the NCAA Tournament and the WNIT in 2014 and 2013, respectively.

In her first season at the Academy, McLaughlin helped coach the Black Knights to their second Patriot League Tournament championship and the team's second appearance in the Division I NCAA Tournament.

McLaughlin has played important roles in the development of a number of guards at Army West Point to include Kelsey Minato, Jean Parker and Jen Hazlett '14. Minato achieved a plethora of Academy single-season records in 2013-14, including scoring (725), free throws (207), three-pointers (82), scoring average (22.0) and free throw percentage (92.4).

Minato broke her own Academy records for three-pointers (84) and scoring average (22.3) during the 2014-15 season, while also setting the program's single-game record with eight three-pointers.

McLaughlin, who played collegiately at Molloy College, spent the 2012-13 season on the NYU sidelines. The Violets' season was highlighted by an upset victory over 13th-ranked Washington as well as a standout freshman campaign by Megan Dawe, who was voted UAA Rookie of the Year and ECAC Division III Metro Rookie of the Year.

McLaughlin, who graduated from Molloy in 2009 with a bachelor's degree in history before remaining in Long Island to pursue a graduate degree, took her first coaching assignment out of college at Sacred Heart University. The Carle Place, N.Y., native spent two seasons with the Pioneers, who went 43-20 during her stint to include an NCAA Championship bid in 2012. While at SHU, McLaughlin completed a master's degree in teaching.

As a shooting guard at Molloy, McLaughlin led the Lions to a pair of NCAA Tournament bids, including the program's first in 2008 after claiming the East Coast Conference title. As a graduate student in 2010, McLaughlin led Molloy to a team-record 22 wins, another ECC crown and its second trip to the NCAAs.

McLaughlin comes from a family with military history as both grandfathers served in World War II. McLaughlin's maternal grandfather served in the Army while her paternal grandfather was in the Navy and worked on the U.S.S. Terry destroyer in the Pacific.



LISA STRACK

ASSISTANT COACH
SECOND SEASON

Lisa Strack begins her second season as assistant coach at Army West Point in 2015-16.

Head coach Dave Magarity announced the addition of Strack as an assistant coach to the women's basketball staff on July 1, 2014. Before coming to West Point, Strack spent two seasons as the video coordinator for the Virginia Tech women's basketball program after a four-year playing career at American University.

Strack played an important role in mentoring several Black Knights during the 2014-15 season and helped the team to a program-record third straight appearance in a national postseason tournament. Army West Point finished 23-8 and earned the Patriot League's automatic bid to the WNIT, following appearances in the NCAA Tournament and WNIT in 2014 and 2013, respectively.

Strack spent the 2012-13 and 2013-14 seasons at Virginia Tech, where she worked as the video coordinator with the women's basketball team. During her time in Blacksburg, Va., Strack was responsible for breaking down film and assisting in recruiting visits.

No stranger to the Patriot League, Strack was a four-year standout guard at American University prior to taking the position at Virginia Tech.

A 1,000-point scorer and two-time All-Patriot League selection at American, Strack led the Eagles in scoring and rebounding during her senior year and earned Patriot League Player of the Year honors. As a senior, she was named American's Female Student-Athlete of the Year, while serving as a team captain and starting in all 31 games.

Strack capped her playing career by leading American to a program record-tying 23 victories, a 14-0 mark in the Patriot League and the school's third WNIT appearance in four seasons.

Strack graduated as just the ninth American women's basketball player to record 1,000 points and 500 rebounds in her career, finishing with 1,059 points and 500 rebounds. She was also the Patriot League's steals leader in 2011-12, registering 2.6 steals per game, and ranked in the top 10 in the conference in scoring and assists, with averages of 11.5 points per game and 2.8 assists per game.

Additionally, Strack was recognized on the 2010 Patriot League All-Tournament Team and garnered All-Rookie Team honors in 2009.

A native of Langhorne, Pa., Strack graduated from American in 2012 with a Bachelor of Science degree in Business Administration.

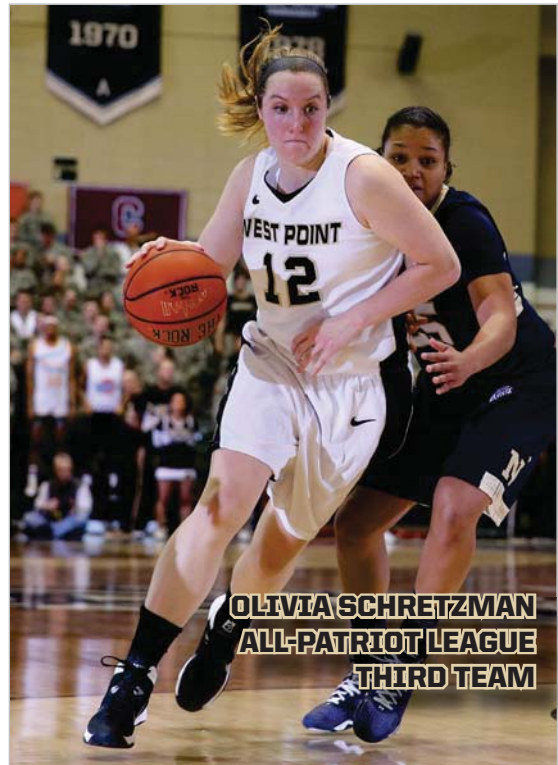
- The 2014-15 Army women's basketball team continued to build on its success in recent years with a program-record third straight trip to a national postseason tournament. The Black Knights made their second appearance in the WNIT after earning the Patriot League's automatic bid to the tournament.
- Army finished the season 23-8 overall, marking the first time in team history it reached the 20-win plateau in three consecutive seasons. The Black Knights went 14-4 in the Patriot League for the second year in a row, including an 13-1 finish to the regular season.
- During that span, the Black Knights strung together 11 straight victories to mark the second-longest winning streak in team history, coming up just one win shy of the Academy record set by the 2006-07 team.
- Army earned the No. 2 seed in the Patriot League Tournament and posted its lone tournament victory with a 48-45 overtime victory against Colgate in a league quarterfinal game on March 6 at Christl Arena.
- The Black Knights received a bid to the WNIT and faced St. John's in the first round on March 19. St. John's prevailed for a 64-56 victory in the contest.
- Army also established a program standard for recording the fewest turnovers per game, committing just 353 turnovers on the year (11.4 per game). The team's 11.4 turnovers per game were the sixth fewest nationally at the end of the season.
- The Black Knights also landed a pair of players on All-Patriot League teams, with junior Kelsey Minato earning a spot on the first team and senior Olivia Schretzman drawing third-team recognition.
- Minato also drew Women's Basketball Coaches Association (WBCA) All-America honorable mention praise to become the sixth Army women's basketball player to earn All-America status, and the first since Lisa Russell (USMA '95) was honored in 1993.
- Minato collected All-Met first team honors for the second year in a row in April after finishing the season with an Army single-season record of 23.8 points per game. Her 23.8 points per game ranked eighth nationally at the end of the season.

ARMY-NAVY SERIES

Basketball became the first women's sport to join the time-honored Army-Navy rivalry tradition when the two service academies met at the Dartmouth-Burger King Invitational on Jan. 18, 1981, in Hanover, N.H.

Center Pat Walter poured in 18 points and guard Dena Caradimitropoulou chipped in with 14 as Army prevailed 65-48 in the first meeting. Trailing 18-15 with 7:31 remaining in the first half, Army reeled off nine straight points to pull ahead 24-18 at intermission. The Black Knights continued their surge into the second half as they stretched that slim lead to a 48-31 bulge and never looked back in coasting to the win.

Army harassed Navy into shooting 27 percent from the field, and the Midshipmen also struggled at the line, converting just 8 of 23 chances. The Black Knights shot 77 percent from the stripe (17-22) and 39 percent from the floor (24-61).

The rebounding was equal as the Black Knights pulled down 50 caroms and Navy grabbed 49. Walter and Navy's Bernie Boska each grabbed 10 boards. The Mids also had two players in double figures. Colleen Cassidy scored 18 points, sharing scoring honors with Walter, and Lynne Coe added 12.

The Army-Navy Trophy, awarded annually to the winner of the competition, was established 26 years ago through the generosity of Army donors Francis and Joe DeVito. The Trophy (pictured below) consists of a five-inch diameter crystal basketball which sits on a sterling silver pylon. Army's and Navy's seals are etched on the pylon. Army will host this year's "Trophy Game" on Jan. 23 at Madison Square Garden in New York, N.Y.

Navy captured the inaugural Trophy after defeating Army, 68-55, at Annapolis on Feb. 25, 1989. The Black Knights were a 47-41 winner in the first "Trophy Game" at West Point the following year where it resided for a five-year period (1990-94).

The two academies met once annually until Navy's entrance into the Patriot League in 1991-92. They began clashing twice a season, facing each other an unprecedented three times during Navy's first year in the league with the third showdown coming in the opening round of the league tournament. Army and Navy have since faced each other four more times in the Patriot League Tournament, twice in the opening round (1997 and 1998), while meeting for the first time in the quarterfinals in 1998 and again in 2001.

After taking the measure of Navy three times its inaugural year in the conference, Army went on to claim the next four meetings to stretch its win streak, which began in 1990, to nine straight. Navy ended its drought when it won the "Trophy Game" (66-51) at Alumni Hall on January 21, 1995. The win was the Mids' first home victory over Army since 1989 and first league win over the Black Knights after losing seven straight.

Army avenged that first-round loss with a hard fought 52-49 triumph at Christl Arena in a quarterfinal-round tournament game to extend its home streak

over the Mids to five straight. The Black Knights snapped a five-game drought on Feb. 23, 2002, with a 75-67 victory capturing the "Star Game" for the second time in four years.

While Army struggled, Navy was dominating at home, away and at the tournament over the next three-plus seasons before its run was snapped in 1998-99 under first-year head coach Sherri Abbey-Nowatzki. The Black Knights' 51-50 upset in the "Trophy Game" at Alumni Hall halted the Mids' nine-game series win streak in the same place it started.

Meeting three times in 2000-01, Navy won both the regular-season encounters, including the "Trophy Game" on Saturday, Jan. 26 at Alumni Hall. The Black Knights bested the Mids when they won 73-61 in the quarterfinals of the Patriot League Tournament on March 2.

In the winter of 2001-02, the two schools split with each winning on its home court. The Mids captured the first meeting (71-60) at Alumni Hall on Jan. 26 and the Black Knights won at Christl Arena to even the "Trophy Game" series at 7-7.

In 2003, Army lost a heartbreaking triple-overtime thriller in Annapolis. Navy escaped with the narrow victory on a free throw in the closing seconds. Each team earned a victory on its home court in 2004, as the Black Knights captured their eighth Trophy with a 65-60 win.

Beginning in 2004, Army won six consecutive Trophy Games to establish a series record. The Black Knights went 9-3 during that six-year stretch for Army's most successful run since the early '90s.

Navy defeated Army, 54-48, to capture its first star since 2003 on Feb. 20, 2010, at Christl Arena, as the road team would claim the Trophy in each of the next three meetings. The 2013 was no different as Army defeated Navy in Annapolis, 48-40, holding the Midshipmen to a series-low point total en route to its first season sweep of Navy since 2008.

Army broke the trend in 2014, when the Black Knights defeated Navy, 54-48, in the Star game at Christl Arena on Feb. 8, becoming the first team to win the Trophy on its home court since 2008. The Black Knights defeated the Midshipmen, 58-46, in the Star game at Navy's Alumni Hall on Feb. 7, 2015.

Kelsey Minato had a pair of impressive games against Navy in her first season at West Point - cracking the Army-Navy record book with accurate outside shooting. Minato was named a National Player of the Week nominee by espnW following her second-straight clutch performance against the Midshipmen in mid-February to finish her rookie season with an 18.0 ppg average against the service academy rival. In 2013-14, Minato scored 25 points in the first meeting with Navy before totaling 14 points in Army's Star game win over the Midshipmen.

ABOUT THE PATRIOT LEAGUE

In October of 1982, Dr. Peter Likins, then-president of Lehigh University, shared a vision he had with several of his colleagues. That dream became a reality two years later when the Colonial League was established.

The league, formally organized in 1984, was founded on the principles of maintaining teams of athletes whose academic ability and progress are representative of the entire student body, the awarding of athletic scholarships on the basis of need, and holding institutional presidents directly responsible for governance and policies.

Founding members of the league included Bucknell University, Colgate University, Davidson University, the College of the Holy Cross, Lafayette College and Lehigh University. Fordham University ultimately replaced Davidson after three years of football competition.

Originally formed as a football-playing league, the Colonial League began formal competition in 1986 and was renamed the Patriot League in December 1989.

It was at the beginning of the 1990-91 academic year that the Patriot League began competition in 23 sports, including football. Just prior to that year, the United States Military Academy joined the league. The United States Naval Academy followed for the 1991-92 season to boost league membership to eight. During the summer of 2001, American University formally joined the Patriot League in all sports and began competition that fall.

In its second decade of competition, the league now includes American, Army, Bucknell, Colgate, Holy Cross, Lafayette, Lehigh and Navy as full members, and Fordham and Georgetown as associate members.

Alan W. Childs, Dean of Academic Services at Lafayette College, was selected as the league's first executive director in 1986. Dr. Childs helped bring the league to its feet by setting a strong foundation and adhering to the principles outlined by Likins and the other league presidents.

Former Army athletic director Carl Ullrich, who was inducted into the Army Sports Hall of Fame in September of 2007, was named the league's first full-time executive director in May 1989. For one year, he served in a dual capacity as Army athletic director and Patriot League director. He retired from West Point in the summer of 1990 and served the league full-time until retiring in the summer of 1993. Connie Hurlbut succeeded Ullrich and became the first woman to be named executive director of a Division I league.

Hurlbut oversaw the league's operation for six seasons until resigning her post in the spring of 1999 to become Director of Operations for the WNBA.

Carolyn Schlie Femovich, named to the league's top post soon after Hurlbut's departure, ushered the league into its second decade of all-sports competition in 2001-02 and continues to steer the league via a myriad of regional and national initiatives.

The Black Knights have captured the Presidents' Cup—signifying the league's all-sports champion—four times, including walking away with the hardware in the spring of 2005 for the first time since 1997. Army's men have captured 10 all-sports championships in the last 18 years, including a streak of six in a row from 1992-93 through 1997-98.

Schlie Femovich stepped down as the league's Executive Director following the 2014-15 academic year and was replaced by Jennifer Heppel, who joins the Patriot League after serving five years as an associate commissioner at the Big Ten Conference.

Army women's basketball is 161-165 in the Patriot League since the inception of the conference in 1990-91. Army won Patriot League titles in 2005-06 and 2013-14.

1976-77

After President Gerald Ford signed legislation in 1975 that declared women would be permitted to seek nomination and attend a military institution, the U.S. Military Academy welcomed its first co-ed class in July of 1976.

That historic change not only impacted the nation's armed forces, but also dramatically reshaped the profile of the academies' athletic program. Basketball was the first women's sport at the U.S. Military Academy to field a team, and played an intercollegiate schedule at the club status its first year.

There were no fall sports that first year, but plans were being laid in August for a woman's basketball team with Dennis VanFossen heading the program. More than 30 players tried out with the roster finally being trimmed to 11 players, but only six had experience in organized high school basketball.

That group was affectionately dubbed the "Sugar Smacks" by the Corps. Smack is cadet slang for a plebe or freshman and the sugar was added in referring to the feminine gender.

On December 1, 1976, Army hosted Skidmore College before a capacity crowd in the Central Gymnasium in opening a 20-game schedule (with all but two played at home). Army went on to close out its first year with an impressive 15-5 mark, showing it was ready for the next step -- varsity status in 1977-78.

The first team averaged 68.9 points a game, tallying 1,309 points along with grabbing 750 rebounds. Army shot 38.6 percent from the floor and 50.7 percent at the charity stripe. Colleen Brennan led the team in scoring, assists and free throws. She piled up 327 points (19.2 ppg.), shot 72.5 percent from the line and dished off 64 assists. Christi Stevens topped the team with 232 rebounds (12 rpg.) while Carol Barkalow finished second in scoring (13.2 ppg.) and rebounding (9.2 rpg.).

1977-78

Army's performance its first year at the club level showed it was ready to move to the next step in its elevation to varsity status.

Joe Ciampi, a successful local boys' coach at Marlboro High, was named to head the women's program. He enjoyed tremendous success during his tenure, compiling a 39-10 record over a two-year period.

Army played its first intercollegiate game at New Paltz, just a few miles away from the Academy, on Monday, Nov. 28 at 7 p.m. The team literally ran New Paltz off the floor, jumping out to a 42-9 lead at the half, on its way to a lopsided 84-17 decision. Dena Caradimitropoulou, a plebe from Tucker, Ala., was the leading scorer with 15 points along with 14 points from Melissa Miles, while Kim Hall and Laurie Utchel chipped in with 10 points apiece.

Army made its home debut two days later at Central Gymnasium, hosting Fordham in a 4 p.m. tilt. The gym was overflowing as the cadets cheered the ladies on to a 65-56 decision over the Rams.

Army rolled to its third straight victory, defeating Cortland State, 82-73. Ciampi's squad built a 19-point lead in the first half, then preserved that margin over the final 20 minutes. The Black Knights then suffered their first defeat, bowing 58-53 in the first game of a doubleheader at St. John's. Army outscored the Red Storm 32-31 in the second half, but was unable to overcome an 11-point first-half disadvantage.

Army would only lose four more times as it spun an 18-5 mark. Among its highlights was a 62-51 win over Indiana University, the defending state champions. Carol Barkalow and Caradimitropoulou shared individual scoring honors in compiling 13.8 averages. Earlier in the year, Barkalow set a school single-game mark with a 30-point effort in a 71-40 home victory over Long Island University.

1978-79

Army's second varsity season and final year in the 1970s resulted in its first 20-plus win season as head coach Joe Ciampi guided the team to runner-up honors at the New York State AIAW Championship.

Army exhibited balanced scoring throughout the season en route to compiling a 21-5 mark. The Black Knights set a school single-game record in scoring 111 points to defeat visiting New Paltz by a 72-point margin. That latter record still stands, though the former mark for points was broken in 1986-87.

After gaining a postseason berth, the first in its short history, Army joined St. John's, Fordham and C.W. Post at the AIAW Tournament hosted by Iona. Seeded second, Army edged St. John's, 50-48, in its semifinal game, but bowed in the finals to top-seed Fordham, 63-60.

Dena Caradimitropoulou topped the team in scoring with 278 points (10.6 ppg.). Kim Hall was next at 9.6 ppg., along with ripping down a team-high 193 boards. After leading Army to an impressive start, winning 80 percent of its contests the first two varsity years, Ciampi accepted the head coaching position at Auburn where he coached until his retirement following the 2003-04 season.

1979-80

The first women's class marched into its senior season with a new name and a new coach with Liz Cousins becoming the first woman to head the program. As the first class moved up the ranks, Army traded its "Sugar Smacks" moniker for the more sophisticated Black Knights.

Under Cousins' direction, the Black Knights posted their fourth straight winning campaign. Stevens made history in being elected captain all four years.

Pat Walter and Kim Hall finished one-two in scoring and rebounding. Pat Walter averaged 11.2 ppg. in scoring while grabbing 214 rebounds, followed by Hall's 10.8 ppg. and 213 boards.

1980-81

Harold Johnson, an assistant to Liz Cousins, became the third varsity coach at the helm when he took over the program. He went on to produce a 123-86 mark during his seven-year tenure.

Johnson did not disappoint his inaugural season as he led Army to runner-up honors at the New York AIAW Championships, while tying the school record for victories in compiling a 21-13 mark.

It was the second time in history that the Black Knights finished runner-up in a state tournament. His efforts earned him "Coach of the Year" honors by the Eastern Women's Intercollegiate Newsletter.

Seeded fourth at the tournament, Army upended top-

seed St. John's 69-66 in overtime, but lost in the finals to C.W. Post, 69-59.

Army and Navy also met for the first time in a predetermined draw at the Burger King Classic sponsored by Dartmouth with Army claiming a 65-48 victory.

Kim Hall closed out the season as the team's leading scorer (11.8 ppg.) and rebounder (7.8 rpg.). In early February, she became the first woman in Academy history to score 1,000 points.

1981-82

Facing one of the most challenging schedules in history, a young and inexperienced team turned in a strong showing in the first Metro Atlantic Conference championships, bowing to St. Peter's in the finals, 65-51, en route to a 15-14 mark.

Pat Walter became the second Black Knight to reach the 1,000-points milestone, breaking Kim Hall's mark by two points (1,108). Yearling Melody Smith, named to the MAAC all-tournament team, topped the team in scoring (10.2 ppg.) and was the only player in double figures.

1982-83

Army suffered its first losing campaign, struggling to an 11-16 mark in its final year in the MAAC (4-6) and Division I. It would be eight years before Army returned to Division I level of competition.

Army enjoyed depth in the frontcourt, but lacked that ingredient in the backcourt. Smith, an All-MAAC pick, led the team in scoring with a 16.5 ppg., hitting 48.5 percent from the floor and 85.4 percent from the stripe. Plebe Pam Pearson finished second in scoring (9.7 ppg.) and led the team in rebounding (9.3 rpg.), while Alma Cobb wasn't far behind in averaging eight caroms a game.

1983-84

Army's introduction to Division II proved an incredible success.

Armed with a fast-breaking style of basketball, Coach Harold Johnson led the Black Knights to the quarterfinals of the NCAA Division II Tournament and a school record 25-3 mark. Army, ranked fifth nationally at the conclusion of the season, won the New York State R.T. French Women's Cup and was the Eastern Regional champion.

A clutch basket by freshman Laurie Goetz and four free throws by Melody Smith in the final 28 seconds carried Army to a 59-53 victory over Utica in an NCAA Division II East Regional game at the Army Field House. That win earned Army a trip to the NCAA quarterfinals where it faced Valdosta State, ranked third nationally, on St. Patrick's Day. Luck was not with the Black Knights whose 10-game winning streak was snapped in a 92-65 defeat.

The Lady Blazers broke open a 17-17 game by pulling away 36-25 with 3:52 left until intermission, then pulled out to a 10-point lead at halftime. Valdosta State stretched its lead to 16 and Army was unable to mount a comeback. Foul shooting proved a factor as Army shot 33 percent and the Lady Blazers hit 71 percent. Jenni Moehringer led Army with a career-high 24 points and Pam Pearson chipped in with 15. Both were named to the all-tournament team.

Smith became the third Black Knight to score 1,000 points along with becoming Army's all-time scoring leader just nine games into the season. She scored 409 points her final year in closing out her career with a school record 1,420 points that stood for another 20 years.

Pearson, who broke the school single-game rebounding mark with 22 against St. Francis (Ill.), became the first women's basketball player named to an All-America

squad with her selection to the second team by the American Women's Sports Federation. Johnson was named the Northeast Region "Coach of the Year" along with being selected an All-America Coach.

1984-85

Army just missed a winning season (14-15), but the Black Knights continued their assault on the record books. Pam Pearson reached the 1,000 point plateau at the conclusion of her junior year, the first player to do so in three years. She shattered Kim Hall's record for career rebounds, and her mark of 881, set over a three-year period, has yet to be matched.

Pearson repeated as a second team All-America and won several conference and regional awards. Her frontcourt mate, Julie Del Giorno, was an honorable mention All-America, while Harold Johnson again was selected an All-America coach. Del Giorno topped the team in scoring with 14.9 ppg. and was second in rebounding at 8.6 in grabbing 240. Pearson was the rebounding leader with 317 (10.9 ppg.) and was second in scoring (14.4 ppg.). Sophomore Laurie Goetz also broke into double figures in averaging 10.1 ppg. along with dishing off 111 assists.

The Black Knights reached the semifinals of the Empire State playoffs, closing out the regular-season league play tied for third with a 7-5 mark. Drawing a home berth, Army defeated New York Tech in the quarterfinals, 74-62, to advance to the semis where they fell to Mercy, 90-80. The season highlight was a two-point (54-52) win at Navy.

1985-86

The season proved significant as Harold Johnson posted his 100th career win at the Army helm in a 19-11 campaign. The Black Knights defeated Navy, 66-53, for the third straight time in Army's new showcase, Christl Arena. The Black Knights were fourth in the Empire State Conference regular-season standings, reached the semis of the playoffs and were runner-up at the ECAC South Division II playoffs.

Julie Del Giorno wrote her name into the record book in several categories her final year. She shattered the season scoring mark with 476 points to move into second place on the career charts with 1,270 points. She also climbed into the No. 2 spot in rebounding with 827 rebounds while bettering the school record for career steals (175). In addition to garnering second team All-America honors, Del Giorno was selected first team all-region and all-league. Johnson was named a College Division All-America coach for the third straight year.

1986-87

Army turned in its best performance in the Empire State Conference to date after claiming the runner-up spot in both the regular-season and playoffs to close the books on an 18-14 campaign.

It proved a banner year for team captain Laurie Goetz who shattered six school marks. The four-year "floor general" broke the record for points in a game (39) and season (568) in closing out her career as the second-leading scorer in school history with 1,331 points. Her record for points in a game has yet to be equaled.

Goetz also set assist marks on season (129) and career (436) levels as well as career steals (168). At one point, she ranked 12th among the NCAA Division II scoring leaders. Among the many accolades she earned was third team All-America honors and being selected the Empire State's "Player of the Year." Johnson picked up his fourth All-America coaching certificate in his final year at the helm. He departed as the all-time winningest head coach with 123 victories in closing out a seven-year run. Both marks would later be broken by his assistant, Lynn Chiavaro.

1987-88

Chiavaro was elevated to the head position after serving for five years as Harold Johnson's top assistant. She became the fourth mentor to take over the reins and second woman to head the young program.

Chiavaro did not disappoint, directing Army to the Empire State Tournament title and its second-ever NCAA appearance en route to a 19-13 record. She was tabbed as the Metropolitan "Coach of the Year" following the success she met her rookie year.

Jennifer Fleming was named the MVP of the ESC tournament after igniting a 17-0 run in rallying Army to the title. She broke the Academy mark for season assists (182) in closing out her sophomore year.

1988-89

Youth and inexperience took its toll as the best Army could manage was just one win in its final seven games to finish under .500.

In spite of its 11-15 mark, Army ranked third in the nation in scoring defense for the second straight year after holding its opponents to 57.5 ppg. The Black Knights, the defending ESC champions, were at one point tied for first place in the regular-season standings, but settled for fourth place and a playoff berth against Pace. The Setters rallied in the second half to eliminate Army with a 64-58 decision.

Jennifer Fleming, a first team all-league pick, averaged 13 points in leading the team in scoring, while finishing second to plebe Kim Kawamoto (153) in assists with 112. Leeann Duhoski, second in scoring (8.4 ppg.) and first in rebounding with 171 caroms, was named a second-team ESC pick and Heather Bryn earned honorable mention.

1989-90

Though a postseason bid eluded Army its final season at the Division II level, the Black Knights had several highlights on which to reflect.

Troubled by an injury-riddled first half, the Black Knights rallied from an 0-7 start to win 19 of 22 games in the second half for a final 19-10 mark.

Army ranked first in the nation in scoring defense (49.3 ppg.) and third in field goal percentage defense (35.0). The Black Knights were runner-up in the

Empire State Conference and defeated Navy, 47-42, to snap a three-year Mid reign. Jennifer Fleming reached the 1,000-point milestone, the seventh Black Knight to accomplish that feat. She broke the mark for career steals (230) and moved into second place on the assist charts with 415. Kim Kawamoto ranked 14th nationally in assists with 186 after eclipsing the school single-season mark of 182 held by Fleming.

1990-91

Army's return to Division I saw the Black Knights struggle early before rebounding with a solid showing in the newly formed Patriot League where they reached the finals of the postseason tournament. The Black Knights compiled a 20-10 mark, ranked second in the nation in scoring defense and scored a series high 69 points in posting an 18-point win over Navy for its first victory at Annapolis since 1985. Army swept the service academies, beating Air Force 76-58 for first place at the Florida Tech Tournament.

Army ranked eighth nationally in field goal percentage defense, 30th in rebound margin and captured two tournament crowns. Kim Kawamoto led the league in assists and ranked 12th nationally in the final NCAA statistics. She shattered six records, breaking the career standard for assists (562) and steals (214) along with shattering her own season and single-game marks in both.

1991-92

In spite of starting off the season with a young and inexperienced frontcourt, Army ranked nationally in scoring defense (13th) for the fifth straight year along with topping the Patriot League for the second straight year.

Seeded fourth in the league tournament, Army opened with a 77-65 victory over Navy, defeating the Mids an unprecedented three times with their entrance into the league. Army fell to top-seed Fordham, 83-72, in the semis in closing the books on a 17-12 campaign.

Plebe center Lisa Russell was tabbed Patriot League "Rookie of the Year" after garnering weekly honors seven times. She closed out her first season with 393 points (13.6 ppg.) to set a school plebe scoring mark, while becoming just one of three freshmen to score 300 points

Kim Kawamoto established nine USMA records in closing her career as Army's game, season and career leader for assists, steals and three-pointers. She missed only one start (the first game of her plebe year) in 114 games and is the only player to accomplish that. Kawamoto ranked nationally in assists (5th) for the third straight season.

Senior captain Mary Langendorf left an impressive legacy in becoming the first player in school history to record 1,000 career points, grab over 500 rebounds and hand out 275 assists.

1992-93

A young Army squad shined on the hardwood, earning league and national recognition. The Black Knights were ranked nationally for the sixth straight year in scoring defense (10th/57.8), swept Navy and posted their first league win over Holy Cross, 54-52.

Lisa Russell walked off with the top Patriot League honors for the second straight year with her selection

as co-MVP. A first team all-star pick, the 5-9 forward led the league in scoring (18.2 ppg.) and field goal percentage (51.2). She was named a third team All-America by the American Women's Sports Federation and selected to the inaugural All-Met first team by the Metropolitan Basketball Association.

Russell became the fifth Black Knight to earn All-America honors, but just the second selected as a sophomore. She topped the team in scoring for the second straight year and led the Black Knights in rebounding (7.1 rpg). Her 492 points were the second highest single-season mark in school history. Sophomore Carrie Garinger set USMA records for three-point field goals on game (5) and career (25) levels en route to finishing second in scoring (9.3 ppg.).

Seeded No. 4 at the league tournament, Army suffered a 50-46 loss to No. 5 Bucknell in the opening round to finish at 12-15.

1993-94

Army ranked nationally (12th) in scoring defense for the seventh straight year, compiled a 17-11 overall record and finished fourth in the league (8-4) standings. The Black Knights extended their win streak over Navy to nine straight following a two-game sweep in February, while Lynn Chiavaro recorded her 100th career win at West Point.

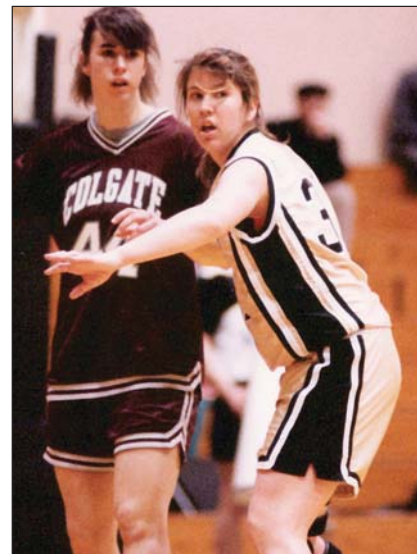
Lisa Russell wrote the headlines for the third consecutive year. In late December, she became the ninth Black Knight to score 1,000 points, but did so faster than any other player. She repeated as the league's Co-MVP, bettered her school mark for the second-highest season total with 526 points, while her 18.8 ppg. remains a school best. The 5-9 forward became the league's all-time leading scorer with 1,411 points (which has since been broken) and closed out the season just 12 shy of the Army record. Russell elected to sit out her final year following surgery to repair a fractured vertebra in her lower back.

Carrie Garinger finished second in scoring with 342 points (12.2) and pulled down 118 rebounds in spiraling into the top 20 on the career scoring (775) and rebounding (302) charts.

Army reached the semifinals of the league tournament for the third time in four years, bowing to eventual champion Fordham, 68-48. Garinger was named to the all-tournament team.

1994-95

With just one starter back to form Army's nucleus, a young Black Knight team suffered through a 4-23 season. Navy snapped Army's series win streak at nine, while putting the skids to a seven-game league drought in posting its first home victory since 1989. The Black Knights defeated Navy in the second meeting to extend their home domination over the Mids to five straight. In the Hudson Valley Challenge Trophy, Army rallied to edge Marist, 50-49.

Julie Schellhase broke the single-season mark for three-pointers with 25. Jamie Arundell topped the team in scoring (11.1 ppg.) and was second in rebounding (5.2 rpg.). Schellhase finished second in scoring (9.4 ppg.), while Kim Hanson topped the team in rebounding (5.6 rpg.).

1995-96

Defying a last-place ranking in the preseason coaches' poll, Army jumped out to a 2-1 start in the Patriot League. That success proved short-lived as the team struggled with a depleted lineup during a 14-day suspension period due to disciplinary action. After losing its hold in the first-half standings, Army was unable to return to that early success.

The Black Knights defied the odds once again when they upset defending champion and preseason favorite Holy Cross, 68-62, at Christl Arena to earn a share of fifth place with Navy and a chance to control their destiny with two league games remaining. That win proved the high point of a difficult schedule as Army dropped its final two regular-season games to finish sixth in the standings.

Jamie Arundell was named to the Patriot League second team all-star unit after leading the team in scoring (11.5 ppg.) and rebounding (5.9 rpg.). Kim Hanson grabbed a team-high 145 rebounds to close out her career 15th on the charts with 445 caroms. Senior guard Carrie Jeanneret moved into fourth place in career assists with 327. Plebe Karen Callahan set a USMA Christl Arena record in a 20-rebound performance against Cornell, and Lynn Chiavaro became the winningest coach in school history with 125 victories.

1996-97

It was not a kind season and proved the worst in school history as Army suffered through a frustrating 1-25 campaign. Army fell to Navy three times as its losing skid to the Mids stretched to six straight dating back to 1995-96.

Julie Schellhase, whose three-pointer lifted Army to its lone win over Colgate, broke the school career mark for treys with 53. Adrienne Quimby topped Army in scoring (9.9 ppg.) and rebounding (5.1 rpg.). Laura Worthing, the top point producer with 250 points (9.6), was a second team all-league pick.

1997-98

Army suffered though its fourth straight losing campaign which resulted in head coach Lynn Chiavaro resigning at the conclusion of a 7-20 season after an 11-year reign. Jamie Arundell provided many of the individual highlights in becoming the 10th player in Black Knights history to eclipse the 1,000-point mark in closing out her career ranked 10th in scoring (1,007 points) and 11th in rebounding (528). She earned second team all-Patriot League honors after finishing among the leaders with 334 points and 174 rebounds. Freshmen Dawn Halfaker and Megan Work were named to the all-rookie team, the first time any Army players were picked for that unit since the 1992 season. Halfaker broke Army's single-season mark for steals (85), tops in the league as well, in earning a national ranking of 18th (T).

The Black Knights hosted their first-ever tournament Thanksgiving weekend inviting Air Force, St. Francis (N.Y.) and St. Bonaventure to that inaugural field.

1998-99

Sherri Abbey-Nowatzki took over at the Army helm and became the sixth head coach of the women's basketball program.

Army's 62-56 defeat of Yale in December was its first over an Ivy League school, spanning 12 games, since the 1995-96 season. Nowatzki's most impressive of four milestone victories came in Patriot League play.

A first-round league road defeat of Lafayette proved one for the record books as Army's 56-53 verdict snapped a 10-game losing streak in its first-ever win on the Leopards' home court.

Army's 51-50 triumph over Navy in the annual "Trophy

Game" at Alumni Hall snapped a nine-game losing streak to the Mids and returned the trophy to West Point for the first time since 1994. Nowatzki's cagers didn't rest on their laurels as they had one more shocker left, that coming in the opening round of the postseason tournament hosted by Army.

The No. 7 seed Black Knights became the lowest-seeded team in Patriot League tournament history to pull off an upset when they upended No. 2 Bucknell 72-67 in the tip-off game.

Senior co-captain Laura Worthing led Army in scoring with 328 points (11.7 ppg.) in closing out her career with 847 points to rank 16th on the all-time scoring charts along with a school-record 57 three-pointers. Sophomore Therese Kelley was named to the league's second team and plebe Halaevalu Helu was an all-tournament pick.

1999-2000

Though a young Army team had its share of peaks and valleys, the Black Knights' 6-3 mark in January proved their best monthly showing since 1994. During that time, Army ranked third in the Patriot League. Army's win over Lafayette (91-60) set a pair of Christl Arena records and the Black Knights defeated Navy at Alumni Hall for the second straight year.

Juniors Megan Dempsey and Therese Kelley wrote the headlines in the new millennium. Dempsey broke the USMA season mark for three-pointers in draining 46 after having made just one her first two seasons to rank fourth on the all-time charts. Kelley became just the second Army player named to the Patriot League first team. The 6-2 forward topped Army and ranked among the league's leaders in scoring, rebounding, blocks, free throw percentage and field goal percentage.

2000-01

Recording one of the greatest turnarounds in Division I women's basketball history, the Black Knights began the season with a 4-0 record and their best start in 15 years.

After capturing its own tournament for the first time in the program's history, Army went on to post a 15-game mark of 13-2, its best at the Division I level.

Army was the lone Patriot League team to beat

defending champion Holy Cross, 87-71, the win coming at home. The victory helped Army capture the No. 4 seed at the league tournament where the Black Knights beat archrival Navy, 73-61, in the quarterfinal round.

For the fifth time in school history, the Black Knights advanced to the league's semifinal round where they were defeated 70-50 by eventual champion Holy Cross.

Finishing the season with a 19-10 mark, Army posted the most wins since recording 20 victories in 1990-91. It marked just the seventh time in school history Army compiled at least 19 wins in a season.

Senior Therese Kelley became only the second Army player to be selected a two-time Patriot League first team pick. She also became only the 11th Black Knight to score 1,000 points and grab 500 rebounds. Freshman Katie Macfarlane was chosen to the league's second team all-star unit and rookie team after collecting the second-best mark by a freshman, scoring 340 points and grabbing 236 rebounds. Senior Megan Dempsey closed out her career owning three-point field goal records on both the single-season and career records.

2001-02

With just two seniors, Army's youngsters came together in the second half of Patriot League play. Sophomore Katie Macfarlane led the team in scoring (18.3 ppg.) and rebounding (10.2 rpg.) and was named to the all-Patriot League first team. Macfarlane, the lone league player to average a double-double, was also named to the All-Metropolitan second team.

Army finished the season with an 11-18 overall record and 5-9 mark in the Patriot League. For the second time in as many years, the Black Knights defeated perennial Patriot League power Holy Cross, 68-67, at home in Christl Arena.

Highlighting Army's non-conference schedule was a trip to Notre Dame to face the defending national champions. The Black Knights fell, 89-57.

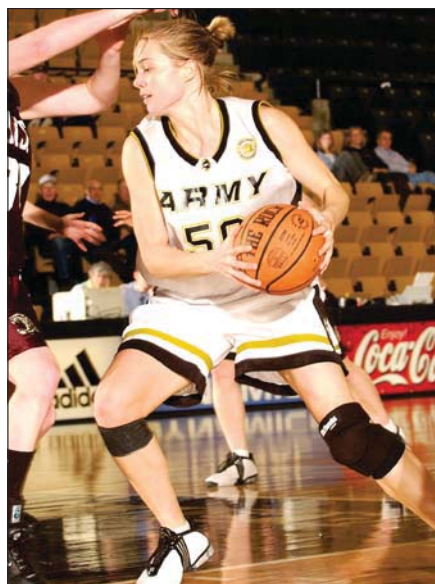
Junior Christine Gassman was the team's second-leading scorer at an increase of more than 8.0 ppg. from her sophomore campaign. Senior team captain Halaevalu Helu finished second in rebounding at 5.5 rpg. and senior Christina Canelli topped the team in assists (2.8 apg).

2002-03

Despite occupying the No. 6 seed in the Patriot League ranks, the Black Knights played the role of spoiler by upsetting two of the top teams in the conference. Army shocked No. 3 Lehigh and second-seeded American to advance to their first Patriot League title game since 1990-91. The Black Knights' magical run came to end there, however, as top-seeded Holy Cross successfully defended its title with a 78-65 defeat of Army in the championship.

Junior Katie Macfarlane continued her stellar play in the post, becoming the only player in the conference to average a double-double. A first team all-league selection for the second year in a row, Macfarlane averaged 17.7 points and 10.6 rebounds per outing. She was also selected to the All-Metropolitan second team.

Macfarlane was one of three players on the Black Knight roster to start all 31 games, along with seniors Amy Saal and Christine Gassman. Saal ranked second on the squad with a scoring average of 10.5 points

per game, while Gassman, the Academy's all-time leader in three-pointers, tallied 8.8 points per game. Gassman shattered Megan Dempsey's record for three-pointers made and finished her career with 112, smashing the previous record of 82.

One of the highlights to the 2002-03 campaign was Army's trip to Puerto Rico for the San Juan Shootout. While there, the Black Knights matched up with one of the most prolific teams in Division I women's basketball in the former national champion Tennessee Lady Vols.

The Black Knights finished the 2002-03 slate with an overall record of 15-16, which included a notable 72-69 victory over service-academy rival Air Force.

2003-04

Senior co-captain Katie Macfarlane wrote many of Army's headlines in garnering a plethora of honors, including being named the Patriot League's "Player of the Year". She led the league in scoring and ranked second in rebounding. Macfarlane was chosen as the conference's "Player of the Week" four times, giving her 12 such citations for her career, and earned her third consecutive All-Patriot League first team certificate.

The 6-0 forward from Clarence, N.Y., amassed 48 career "double-doubles" and ended her illustrious career with a 16.8 scoring average and a 9.8 rebounding average. She became the league's and Army's all-time leading rebounder with 1,143 boards along with being the Black Knights' leading scorer.

Macfarlane closed out her career with numerous single-game, single-season and career records at the Academy. In addition to her scoring and rebounding records, she is also Army's all-time leader in free throws made and attempted along with field goals made and attempted. She is the only Black Knight ever to lead the squad in rebounding in each of her four years on the team.

Freshman Jen Hansen was named to the league's all-rookie team. The Black Knights defeated Navy (65-60) in the "Star Game" at Christl Arena. Army finished 14-14 overall and 6-8 in the league. The Black Knights also captured the North Star Invitational championship in Fairbanks, Alaska over the Thanksgiving Holiday.

2004-05

Senior co-captain Shavonne Holden and freshman scoring sensation Cara Enright, along with sophomore Jen Hansen and senior Lindsay Brent, headlined the Army team. Both Holden and Enright were named to the Patriot League second team, and Enright earned all-rookie team honors on her way to being named the Patriot League's Rookie of the Year.

Enright led the Black Knights with a 13.2 scoring averaging, while Brent was Army's leading rebounder, averaging 6.4 rebounds. Hansen set a new Black Knights' record for 3-pointers made in a season, and Enright chipped in at third on the list.

Holden finished her career 11th in rebounds, 16th on the career points ledger and seventh in career free throws.

Army earned its highest seed in the Patriot League Tournament, third, since the creation of the league prior to the 1990-91 season, but the Black Knights run to the tournament title was spoiled by No. 6 seed Colgate in the opening round.

The Black Knights concluded the 2004-05 campaign with an overall record of 15-13 and 8-6 in conference play. Army's eight Patriot League victories were the most since 1993-94, in which the Black Knights also captured eight

wins. It also marked the first time the Black Knights swept Navy in the yearly series since the 1993-94 season.

2005-06

The Black Knights experienced a coaching change at the top on Oct. 5, just 11 days before the start of practice as Maggie Dixon was named the seventh head coach of the Black Knights.

The change proved beneficial for both Dixon and the Black Knights as she led Army through one of its most storied seasons in the history of the program. The Black Knights capped a 20-11 campaign with a bid to the NCAA Division I Tournament and were among those also receiving votes in the final Associated Press poll.

The Black Knights began the season with a tough non-conference slate, which left the squad with a 6-7 record heading into league play.

Army won its first league contest in overtime against Colgate and turned around to face a Holy Cross squad, who historically had given the Black Knights fits. Army squeaked out a 59-56 victory against the Crusaders and began to build momentum. Army came across a few road blocks in Lehigh and Colgate, but the Black Knights won the first six straight contests of the month of February and clinched the Patriot League regular-season crown with a 71-52 victory at Lafayette on Feb. 21.

The Black Knights earned the top seed in the postseason tournament for the first time in program history and earned the right to host a quarterfinal and semifinal round at West Point's Christl Arena.

Army advanced to the championship game for just the third time in its 16 years as a member of the Patriot League, and first since 2003, after breezing past No. 8 Lafayette, 74-55, and No. 5 Colgate, 73-55, in the quarterfinals and semifinals, respectively.

After sweeping their nemesis Holy Cross during the regular season for the first time, the Black Knights met the Crusaders in the Patriot League Championship game at West Point. Sophomore Stefanie Stone drained the winning free throw with 8.8 seconds remaining and Army held on to defeat the Crusaders and stamp the Black Knights' ticket to the NCAA Tournament.

It marked the first trip to the "Big Dance" at the Division I level for Army or any of the three service academies.

The Black Knights earned a No. 15 seed and faced No. 2 Tennessee in the first round of the Cleveland Regional in Norfolk, Va.

Dixon was tabbed the Patriot League's "Coach of the Year" in her first season at the helm. Sophomore Cara Enright was honored as the league's "Player of the Year," and freshman Alex McGuire became the second straight Army player to capture Patriot League "Rookie of the Year" accolades.

Junior Jen Hansen became the Academy's all-time leader in three-pointers during the first contest of the season against Coast Guard for 143 three-point field goals for her career. The Seminole, Fla., native also led the Black Knights in free throw percentage, successfully connecting on 46 of 53 attempts moving her into first place on the career free throw percentage ledger (122-151-.808).

Enright rewrote several of Army's single-game records and continues to move up the career charts. Her 511 points are the sixth-highest single-season mark. Her 94 free throws made tied her with Julie Del Giorno for seventh on the single-season ledger, while for the second consecutive season, she etched her name into the single season three point field goals made list.

The Norco, Calif., native catapulted into 18th place on the Black Knights' career scoring list. In her 59 games thus far as a Black Knight, Enright amassed 881 points for a 14.9 average, second in the career list.

Stone set an Army record for single-season field goal percentage, connecting on 98 of 170 attempts for a .576 average. She also is ninth in free throws made, after sinking 90 foul shots a year ago.

McGuire had the second-best performance from the foul line of any Black Knight player. McGuire's .856 (77-90) percentage ranks second behind Pat Walter (.882) on the single-season free throw percentage list.

2006-07

Army opened the 2006-07 campaign with a heavy heart, following the sudden passing of 2006 Patriot League "Coach of the Year" Maggie Dixon on April 6, 2006. Under first-year head coach Dave Magarity, who served as Dixon's assistant in 2005-06 after a 23-year run as a Division I men's basketball coach, the Black Knights set an Army Division I record for wins with a 24-6 mark. The team went 11-3 in Patriot League play for the second year in a row, while also matching the most road wins (11-3) in the program's history.

After dropping its season-opener to in the inaugural Maggie Dixon Classic on Nov. 12 at Christl Arena, the Black Knights spun off five straight wins. The Black Knights' 72-48 win over Troy on Nov. 24 was a special night for junior guard Cara Enright, as she became just the 13th player in Army history to score 1,000 points. At the end of 2006-07, Enright stood fifth in Army history with 1,329 career points.

Following a tough 65-54 loss at Seton Hall on Nov. 26, the Black Knights embarked on a record-breaking, 13-game winning streak that spanned from Nov. 30 thru Jan. 16. During that stretch, Army knocked off Colgate, Holy Cross, Lehigh and American to start conference play with a 4-0 record. Unfortunately, the end of Army's run came at the hands of Navy on Jan. 21 at Christl Arena.

However, the Black Knights got revenge for that loss by winning the annual Army-Navy "Star" game less than a month later in Annapolis, Md.

Army's 11-3 conference record was enough to earn the Black Knights the second seed heading into the Patriot League Tournament at Navy's Alumni Hall. Army's record-breaking season came to an end with a 57-53 loss to Lehigh on March 3, 2007 in the opening round of the tournament.

Enright (first team) and sophomore guard Alex McGuire (second team) earned All-Patriot League honors at the end of the season. Enright was also a first team All-Metropolitan Area honoree, while Magarity picked up "Coach of the Year" honors by the same organization.

Army's post-season honors included the Jimmy "V" Foundation Comeback Award, AT & T National Sportsmanship Award and Patriot League Sportsmanship Award.

2007-08

Facing one of its toughest schedules in recent memory, Army put together its fourth-straight winning season with an 18-12 mark. The Black Knights went 9-5 record to tie Lehigh for third in the final Patriot League standings.

A crop of four talented seniors, a budding junior class and a pair of rookies that played like veterans helped Army to a successful second season under head coach Dave Magarity.

The Black Knights faced four 2006-07 NCAA Tournament teams, highlighted by meetings with then-No. 1 Connecticut in Hartford, Conn., and then-No. 3 Rutgers at Madison Square Garden as a part of the Maggie Dixon Classic.

Army kicked off Patriot League play with a pair of home wins over Colgate and Holy Cross before heading out on the road for three straight contests. The team continued to have an up-and-down conference run, but it did include sweeps of Holy Cross, Lafayette, Colgate and archrival Navy throughout the year.

Army nabbed the fourth seed heading in to the Patriot League Tournament, which was held at West Point's Christl Arena for the second time in three years. Army drew Bucknell in the quarterfinals, a team that the Black

Knights had fallen against just seven days prior in the regular season finale. Despite a sparkling 25-point effort from senior guard Cara Enright in what was her final game as a Black Knight, Army dropped a 50-47 heartbreaker in overtime on a Bucknell buzzer-beater.

Enright (second team), junior guard Alex McGuire (first team) and freshman forward Erin Anothony (rookie team) earned all-league status. Senior guard Margaree King also earned Patriot League Defensive Player of the Year plaudits.

2008-09

Army rebounded from a tough 1-4 start to win nine of its next 10 games, beginning with a crucial 54-44 win at rival Air Force during a Thanksgiving trip to Colorado. The Black Knights' lone loss between Nov. 29 and Jan. 10 came to nationally ranked Rutgers at the Maggie Dixon Classic on Dec. 14 at Madison Square Garden. The Black Knights closed out non-conference play with an 11-6 mark.

A 3-4 record during the first half of Patriot League play left the Black Knights in the middle of the pack. The team rebounded, however, to go 5-2 during the second half of conference play to salvage a tie for third in the final league standings. That final run included the Black Knights' fifth-straight "Star" game win (58-50) over Navy on Feb. 21 in Annapolis. At the close of the regular-season slate, Army found itself in a four-way tie with Bucknell, Navy and Holy Cross for third place. After exhausting all tiebreakers, the Black Knights played as the No. 5 seed in the Patriot League Tournament, which top-seeded Lehigh hosted at Stabler Arena.

Army drew No. 4 Holy Cross in the first round and sent the Crusaders packing following a 54-47 win. Appearing in the semifinals for the first time since winning the title in 2005-06, Army's season came to an end to the host Mountain Hawks (61-42). Then-sophomore point guard Nalini Hawkins poured in 20-plus points in both games and was named to the All-Tournament Team.

Senior G Alex McGuire earned first team all-league honors, while sophomore F Erin Anthony was named to the second team, and also became the first Army women's basketball player to be named Scholar-Athlete of the Year.

2009-10

Without a single senior on the roster, a young and inexperienced Army team pulled out a fourth-place finish in the Patriot League in 2009-10. The Black Knights needed a key win at Bucknell in the final game of the regular season to clinch the No. 4 seed in the Patriot League Tournament. They left Lewisburg, Pa., with just that in the form of a 49-37 triumph.

Despite enduring its first losing season in head coach Dave Magarity's tenure at Army, the Black Knights tied Holy Cross and Colgate for fourth in the final Patriot League standings (5-9).

Throughout the non-conference slate, Army took on a pair of nationally ranked opponents in No. 16 Oklahoma and No. 24 Georgia Tech. Playing on their home court, the Black Knights managed to hold a 29-23 halftime lead over the Sooners but could not hang on in what turned out to be a respectable 59-46 defeat.

For the second year in a row, junior F Erin Anthony led the Patriot League in rebounding (10.4 per game), while finishing second in scoring (16.1 points per game). The postseason accolades poured on for the Allentown, Pa., native as she was named first team All-Patriot League, first team All-Met Basketball Writer's Association, Patriot League Scholar-Athlete of the Year (second year in a row) and a CoSIDA/ESPN The Magazine First Team All-American.

The Black Knights drew No. 5 Holy Cross in the Patriot League Tournament, a team they swept during the regular season, at the Hart Center in Worcester, Mass. While Anthony scored her 1,000th career point during the contest, Army came out on the short end of a 57-53 decision in the quarterfinal match-up.

2010-11

Army relied on the experience of four starting seniors to guide it through a 2010-11 season that saw the Black Knights finish in a tie for fourth place in the final Patriot League standings and record a 13-16 record.

The Black Knights reeled off a six-game win streak to start the New Year, won their first four Patriot League games and reclaimed the Army-Navy "Trophy" to highlight the 2010-11 campaign. The Black Knights drew the fifth seed in the Patriot League Tournament and bowed to Bucknell for the third time in the quarterfinals.

As expected, Army leaned heavily on senior F Erin Anthony for the season's entirety. The Allentown, Pa., native finished her decorated career as Army's fourth all-time leading scorer and second all-time leading rebounder. She joins Katie Macfarlane '04 as the only two players in program history to record 1,000 points and 1,000 rebounds. Anthony also became the Black Knights' all-time leader in blocked shots (234) in her final season. A first team All-Patriot League performer, Anthony garnered a fourth Patriot League Scholar-Athlete of the Year award and was named an Academic All-American for the second time. She was also one of 10 national finalists for the prestigious Lowes Senior CLASS Award.

Army also bid farewell to starters Nalini Hawkins, Jessie Coiffard and Laura Baranek. Hawkins finished her career with 944 career points.

HARDWOOD HISTORY

2011-12

Army went 14-16 and 8-6 in Patriot League contests, but despite the somewhat lackluster record, Army grew in leaps and bounds during a season that many predicted would find the Black Knights in the bottom half of the conference.

Army was picked to finish seventh in the conference's preseason poll after losing four starters from the 2010-11 squad, but ended in a tie for third with rival Navy at regular-season's end.

With 18.9 points per game, Anna Simmers averaged the highest scoring output against league foes since 2003-04, garnering All-Patriot League first-team honors. Combined with second-team member Jen Hazlett, the pair formed the conference's highest-scoring duo since 2002-03. Hazlett chipped in 13.1 points per league game to rank sixth in the conference.

Hazlett was one of Army's most balanced players during her sophomore campaign, averaging a team-best 7.5 rebounds per contest and racking up six double-doubles to lead the squad. In addition, her 30-point scoring performance against Colgate was the most by a Black Knight since 2005.

Freshman Olivia Schretzman collected All-Rookie honors, marking the first time since 2007-08 the Black Knights nabbed a trio of certificates.

Head coach Dave Magarity reached a personal milestone by earning his 400th career win and finished the year one win shy of the century mark for victories at Army.

2012-13

The 2012-13 season was one for the record book as Army went 22-8, including 11-3 in Patriot League play to claim a share of the regular-season conference title along with Navy, despite a season sweep of the Midshipmen. A young Army squad, which had just one senior play significant minutes and one junior on the roster, made Patriot League history as the Black Knights swept all four year-ending major awards.

Head coach Dave Magarity, who won his 100th game at the Academy to become just the third coach in program history to reach triple-digit victories, was tabbed Patriot League Coach of the Year for the first time in his career. Anna Simmers, Army's leading scorer for two consecutive seasons, was voted the conference's Defensive Player of the Year and was named to the All-Patriot League first team.

Freshman sensation Kelsey Minato made league history by becoming the first to be named both Player and Rookie of the Year in the same season. Minato, who was the conference's leading scorer in league games, was also a unanimous All-Rookie Team choice and All-Patriot League first-team selection. Classmate Aimee Oertner was also a unanimous All-Rookie pick.

Army set program records for lowest defensive scoring average, finishing the season ranked seventh in the country, as well as least amount of turnovers per game, which ranked 17th nationally. The Black Knights held two Patriot League foes below 40 points for the first time in history. Army won both the Gold and Silver Stars in the same season for the first time since 2009.

Despite the successes, Army's stay in the Patriot League Tournament came to an abrupt end as the top-seeded Black Knights were ousted by No. 8 Colgate at West Point in the quarterfinals. By virtue of winning the conference's regular-season title, Army earned an automatic bid into the WNIT for the first time in program history. Despite leading for the majority of the first half, the Black Knights fell at Fordham in the first round, 55-46.

At season's end, Minato picked up another honor as the lone freshman to earn All-Met honors. Minato, who set an Army record for most Patriot League Rookie of the Week citations, became the sixth Black Knight to garner All-Met recognition as she was voted to the second team.

2013-14

The 2013-14 Army women's basketball team turned in arguably the best season in program history after finishing 25-8, including a 14-4 mark in the Patriot League. Army claimed its second Patriot League title to earn the conference's automatic bid to the NCAA Tournament for the second time in the team's Division I history.

The 25 victories marked Army's most as a Division I program, while tying the all-time team record that the team set as a Division II program in 1983-84.

In his eighth season as head coach, Dave Magarity became the program's all-time wins leader, recording his 133rd victory at the Academy on Jan. 15, 2014. Magarity finished the season with 146 wins as Army's mentor.

Sophomore Kelsey Minato was named Patriot League Player of the Year for the season season in a row, joining Lisa Russell (USMA '95) as the only Army player to earn recognition as the conference's top player in back-to-back seasons. Also garnering postseason conference awards were senior Jen Hazlett and freshman Dani Failor, who landed on the all-conference second team and all-rookie team, respectively.

Along with contributing to the team's wins record, Hazlett and Minato left their own marks in Army's record book. Both players reached the 1,000-point milestone for their careers, with Hazlett reaching the plateau at American on Jan. 25, 2014 and Minato eclipsing 1,000 career points on Feb. 26, 2014 at Boston University.

The pair became the 16th and 17th 1,000-point scorers in Army women's basketball history, and were the first duo to reach the milestone in the same season.

Army split its season series with service-academy rival Navy, but earned a win in the Star game on Feb. 8, 2014 to extend its winning streak in the Star series to two games.

Minato became the quickest player to score 1,000 points, after achieving the plateau in 59 career games. The sophomore also set a number of Army single-season marks to include scoring average (22.0), free-throw percentage (92.5), total points (725), free throws (207) and three-pointers (82). She also established a total of 18 single-game scoring records and matched one other (3 NCAA, 8 Patriot League, 4 Army women's basketball, 4 Christl Arena) during a contest against Holy Cross on Feb. 12, 2014. Included in her records were a Patriot League standard of 49 points and an NCAA-record 26-of-26 performance from the free-throw stripe.

Army, which entered the Patriot League Tournament as the No. 2 seed, began its title run with a narrow 49-45 win over Boston University in the conference quarterfinals on March 6 before the Black Knights topped third-seeded American, 68-55, on March 10. Army drew a match-up with fifth-seeded Holy Cross in the conference title game on March 15, marking the fifth time the schools have met league championship. Army prevailed for a 68-58 victory over Holy Cross and earned the Patriot League's automatic bid to the NCAA Tournament.

Army, which earned a No. 13 seed in the NCAAs, faced No. 4 Maryland in the tournament's first round on March 23 in College Park, Md., ultimately falling to a 90-52 defeat. Minato scored a game-high 27 points to establish an Army record for most points in an NCAA Tournament game.

Following the season, Minato earned another honor, as she was selected to the All-Met first team to become the fifth Black Knight to earn multiple All-Met recognitions.

2014-15

Army continued to built off its success in recent years by appearing in the WNIT, its third national postseason tournament in the last three seasons. The WNIT bid marked the first time in program history that the Black Knights appeared in three straight national postseason tournaments and also marked the team's first time winning at least 20 games in three consecutive years.

Army started Patriot League play 1-3, but finished the regular season with a 14-4 conference record after going 13-1 the rest of the way to include an 11-game winning streak. The 11-game winning streak marked the second longest in school history after the Black Knights gathered 12 straight victories during the 2006-07 season.

Junior Kelsey Minato finished the year with a team-record 22.3 ppg to rank eighth in the nation. She was honored on the Women's Basketball Coaches Association (WBCA) All-America honorable mention team following the season as she became just the sixth Army women's basketball player to land All-America praise. She also earned All-Met first team recognition for the second season in a row.

On the court, Minato finished the year with a number of Academy records, including career scoring average (22.3), career three-pointers (221), single-season three-pointers (84) and single-game three-pointers (8). She also set a Patriot League record by extending her double-digit scoring streak to 80 games.

As a team, Army established a program record by committing the fewest turnovers in a single season (353; 11.4 per game). The Black Knights' 11.4 turnovers per game listed sixth for fewest in the country.

Following the Patriot League regular season, Minato earned All-Patriot League first team honors for the third straight year, while senior Olivia Schretzman was selected to the All-Patriot League third team.

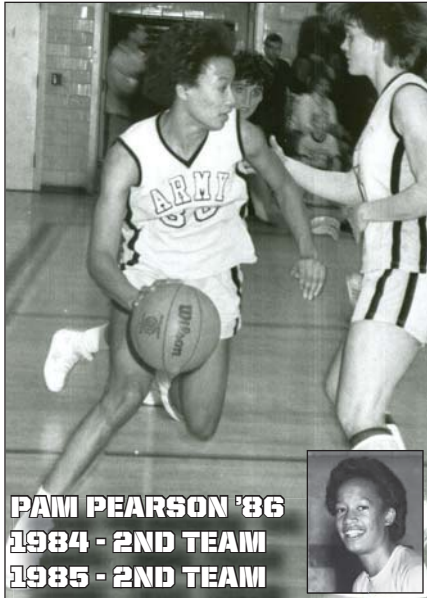

ANNUAL TEAM AWARDS

MAJ. GENERAL PHILIP H. DRAPER AWARD

Established in 1993, the Draper Award is given annually to the Most Valuable Player of the Army women's basketball team and is named in honor of Philip Draper. A 1929 West Point graduate, Draper spent nearly three decades on the Banks of the Hudson, serving two tours and teaching French before returning from 1951-53 as the Graduate Manager of Athletics. Draper's son, Stephen, also graduated from West Point in 1964. His wife, Lucy, was instrumental in the passage of the federal legislation to admit women into the gates at five national service academies. The family stayed at West Point until they had the opportunity to witness the first female cadets sworn in at Trophy Point in 1976. This award is funded by the Draper family and was presented for the first time at the graduation awards convocation, where it continues to be awarded today, in 1994.

ROBERT E. LEE '29

The Academy's ninth Superintendent (1852-55), Lee was a model cadet during his four years at West Point. He graduated second in his class and never earned a single demerit during his four years at the Academy. At the beginning of the Civil War, he was selected to serve as Commanding General of the Army, but instead resigned his commission and was named General-in-Chief of the Confederate Army from 1861 to 1865. Lee's surrender to Ulysses S. Grant (USMA 1843), at Appomattox Court House, Va., ended the Civil War. Fort Lee, Va., was named in his honor.

ULYSSES S. GRANT '43

Grant distinguished himself during the Civil War at the Battle of Vicksburg in 1863; his victory secured control of the Mississippi River for the Union. President Abe Lincoln later appointed him Commanding General of the Army in March 1864. On April 9, 1865, at Appomattox Court House, Va., Robert E. Lee (USMA 1829) surrendered the Army of Northern Virginia to him, ending the Civil War. Grant later served as the 18th President of the United States from 1869 to 1877. Today, his image graces the \$50 bill.

GEORGE W. GOETHALS '80

Goethals became an architect and was builder of the Panama Canal, 1904 TO 1914.

JOHN J. PERSHING '86

Considered the second most senior officer in Army history, behind only George Washington, Pershing served as commander of the American Expeditionary Force during World War I. The two-million-plus troops of the AEF made a decisive contribution to the defeat of Imperial Germany. Pershing's abilities as a leader distinguished him among European commanders, and through repeated successes on the battlefield, promoted American prestige around the world. He served as Army Chief of Staff in 1921, and was named General of the Armies of the United States upon his retirement in 1924.

DOUGLAS MacARTHUR '03

After World War I, MacArthur re-

turned to West Point to serve as the Academy's 31st Superintendent from 1919 to 1922. During that time, he was responsible for the revitalization of the Academy. He was later promoted to General of the Army and served as Supreme Allied Commander in the Pacific Theater during World War II. During that time, he received the Medal of Honor for leading defense preparation and operations on the Philippine Islands. He later served as Supreme Allied Commander, Japan, and as commander, United Nations Command in the Far East. He was one of only five officers to be promoted to General of the Army (five stars).

GEORGE S. PATTON JR. '09

"Old Blood and Guts," Patton was one of the most colorful commanders in the Army. During World War II the famed commander of the 2nd Armored Division and later the Third Army displayed courage and daring as prominently as the pair of ivory handled revolvers he wore. Patton accomplished one of the most remarkable feats in military history in December 1944, when he quickly turned the Third Army northward to reinforce the Allied southern flank against the German attack in the Battle of the Bulge. The General's doctrine of aggressive employment of massive armor forces continue to prove themselves in combat arenas around the world.

OMAR N. BRADLEY '15

During his career, Bradley earned a reputation as one of the best infantry commanders in World War II. He commanded the 82nd Airborne and 28th Infantry Divisions before going on to command the 1st Army and the 12th Army Group. After the war he served as Army Chief of Staff from 1948 to 1949 and served as the first Chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff from 1949 to 1953. He was the last Army officer to be promoted to General of the Army (five stars), and the Bradley fighting vehicle is named in his honor.

DWIGHT D. EISENHOWER '15

During World War II, Eisenhower served as Supreme Commander of Allied Forces Europe from 1943 to 1944,

during which he led the D-Day invasion of Europe. During that time, he was promoted to General of the Army (five stars). After the war, he served as Army Chief of Staff from 1945 to 1948 and was named President of Columbia University in 1948. He served as the 34th President of the United States from 1953 to 1961 and was one of only five officers to be promoted to General of the Army (five stars).

ALEXANDER M. HAIG JR. '47

Haig served as Chief of Staff to President Richard Nixon from 1973 to 1974; Supreme Allied Commander in Europe 1974 to 1979; President of United Technologies Corporation 1980 to 1981 and Secretary of State during the Reagan administration from 1981 to 1982.

FRANK BORMAN '50

An astronaut from 1962 to 1970, Borman commanded the first circumlunar flight of the earth. He later served as President of Eastern Airlines.

FIDEL V. RAMOS '50

One of the Academy's international cadets, Ramos served as a Philippine Army officer after graduation. He eventually became the country's military Chief of Staff and later Secretary of National Defense. He also served as President of the Republic of the Philippines from 1992 to 1998.

EDWIN E. ALDRIN '51

An astronaut from 1963 to 1972, Aldrin participated in the first manned lunar landing with Michael Collins (USMA '52) and was the second man to walk on the moon.

EDWARD WHITE '52

An astronaut from 1962 to 1967, White was the first man to walk in space and was one of the three astronauts killed in the Apollo I disaster in 1967.

H. NORMAN SCHWARZKOPF '56

As Commander-in-Chief, United States Central Command from 1988 to 1991, Schwarzkopf's command ultimately responded to Iraq's invasion of Kuwait with the largest U.S. deploy-

ment since the Vietnam War, including portions of the Navy, Air Force, and Marine Corps as well as units from dozens of nations around the world. After retiring, Schwarzkopf received the Presidential Medal of Freedom.

PETER M. DAWKINS '59

Dawkins was Cadet Brigade Commander (First Captain of the U.S. Corps of Cadets) as a senior and became the third Heisman Trophy winner in Army football history. He later served as chairman and CEO of Primerica.

JAMES V. KIMSEY '62

Kimsey was the founding chairman of America Online, and was named chairman emeritus in 1996. He founded the Kimsey Foundation in 1996.

MICHAEL W. KRZYZEWSKI '69

Krzyzewski served as head basketball coach at West Point from 1974 to 1979 before assuming similar duties at Duke University. Krzyzewski has led the Blue Devils to three national championships and was inducted into the Basketball Hall of Fame in October 2001. He coached the U.S. at the 2008 Olympics in Beijing.

MARTIN E. DEMPSEY '74

General Martin E. Dempsey serves as the 18th Chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff. In this capacity, he serves as the principal military adviser to the President, the Secretary of Defense and the National Security Council. By law, he is the nation's highest-ranking military officer. Prior to becoming Chairman, the general served as the Army's 37th Chief of Staff. Dempsey served as the Deputy Commander and then Acting Commander of U.S. Central Command. Before becoming Chief of Staff of the Army, he commanded U.S. Army Training and Doctrine Command.

RAYMOND T. ODIERNO '76

Odierno commanded the 4th Infantry Division during the fall of 2003 which, along with Special Forces units, captured Saddam Hussein in December of that year. Odierno helped plan and coordinate the raid that netted Iraq's fallen dictator. He currently serves as Chief of Staff of

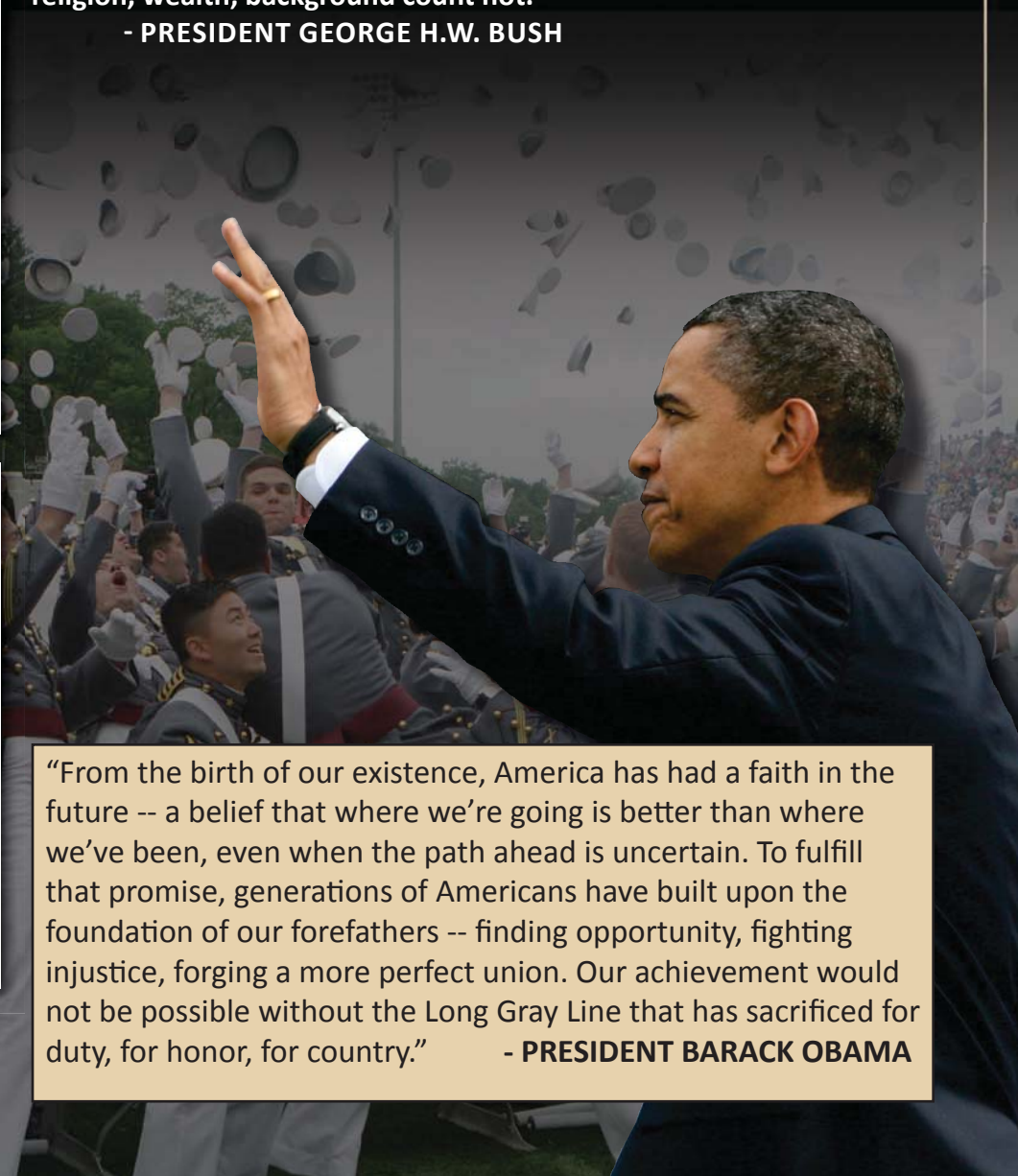

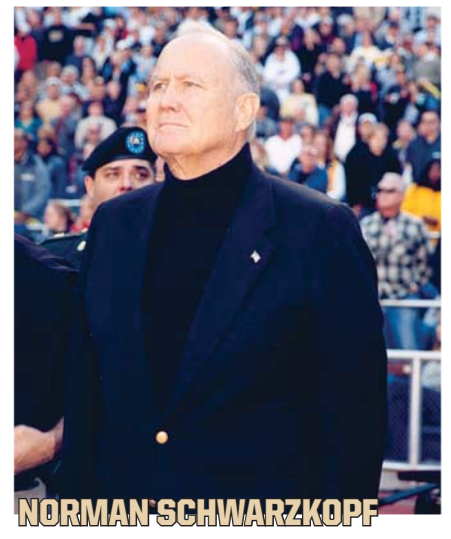

Lieutenant General Robert L. Caslen, Jr. became the 59th Superintendent of the U.S. Military Academy at West Point on July 17, 2013.

Lt. Gen. Caslen graduated from the U.S. Military Academy in 1975. He earned master's degrees from Long Island University and Kansas State University.

Previous to this assignment, Lt. Gen. Caslen served as the Chief of the Office of Security Cooperation-Iraq.

Lt. Gen. Caslen's prior deployments and assignments include serving as the commander of the Combined Arms Center at Fort Leavenworth, Kan., the command that oversees the Command and General Staff College and 17 other schools, centers, and training programs located throughout the United States; commanding general of the 25th Infantry Division (Light) and commanding general of the Multi-National Division-North during Operation Iraqi Freedom; Commandant of Cadets for the U.S. Military Academy; Deputy Director for the War on Terrorism, J-5, The Joint Staff; Assistant Division Commander (maneuver), 3rd Infantry Division (Mechanized); Chief of Staff, 10th Mountain Division (Light); Chief of Staff, Combined Joint Task Force Mountain during Operation Enduring Freedom; Commander, 2nd Brigade, 101st Airborne Division (Air Assault); Chief of Staff, 101st Airborne Division (Air Assault); Senior Brigade C2 Observer/Controller, Operations Group, Joint Readiness Training Center; Commander, 1st Battalion, 14th Infantry, 25th Infantry Division (Light); Executive Officer to the Deputy Commander in Haiti during Operation Uphold Democracy; J-3 in Honduras for Joint Task Force Bravo; Brigade Operations Officer, 3rd Brigade, 101st Airborne Division (Air Assault); Executive Officer, 2nd Battalion, 187th Infantry, 101st Airborne Division (Air Assault) during Operations Desert Shield/Desert Storm.

Lt. Gen. Caslen's awards and decorations include the Defense Distinguished Service Medal, Distinguished Service Medal with Oak Leaf Cluster, the Defense Superior Service Medal with Oak Leaf Cluster, the Legion of Merit with four Oak Leaf Clusters, the Bronze Star Medal with two Oak Leaf Clusters, the Defense Meritorious Service Medal, and the Meritorious Service Medal with five Oak Leaf Clusters. He has earned the Combat Infantryman Badge, the Joint Chiefs of Staff Identification Badge, and is Airborne, Air Assault, and Ranger qualified.

Brigadier General John (J.T.) Thomson hails from Tyler, Texas, and earned his commission as a Second Lieutenant of Field Artillery in 1986. His initial assignment was with the 6th Battalion, 41st Field Artillery (M109A2, 155mm SP) in Kitzingen, Germany, in direct support to the 2nd Brigade, 3rd Infantry Division from 1987 to 1990. His duties included Fire Direction Officer, Platoon Leader, Battery Executive Officer, Support Platoon Leader, and Battalion Maintenance Officer.

In 1990, Brig. Gen. Thomson was assigned to the 2nd Armored Cavalry Regiment in Nuremberg, Germany. His duty assignments included Regimental Assistant S4, Regimental Target Analyst, and Fire Support Officer. From 1992 to 1994, he served as Operations Officer for the 1st Armored Division Artillery in Baumholder, Germany, and then later commanded Bravo Battery, 4th Battalion, 29th Field Artillery (M109A2, 155mm SP) in direct support to the 2nd Brigade, 1st Armored Division. Following battery command, he served as a Tactical Officer for the U.S. Corps of Cadets at West Point until 1997.

From June 1998 to June 2003, BG Thomson was assigned to the 4th Infantry Division (M) at Fort Hood, Texas. His assignments were Assistant Fire Support Coordinator (Plans), Division Artillery S3, Executive Officer for 2nd Battalion, 20th Field Artillery (MLRS), Division Artillery Executive Officer, and Division Deputy Chief of Staff.

Brig. Gen. Thomson commanded the 2nd Battalion, 4th Field Artillery (MLRS) of the 214th Field Artillery Brigade at Fort Sill, Okla., from June 2003 to June 2005. Following battalion command, he served on the Joint Staff as an advisor to the Assistant to the Chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff, extensively interacting and traveling with the U.S. Department of State on national security affairs. From May 2007 to Feb. 2008, he served as the Executive Officer to the Commanding General of Multi-National Corps, Iraq. He later headed the Commander's Initiatives Group for Multi-National Forces-Iraq from Oct. 2008 to Jan. 2009, and then served as Executive Officer to the MNF-I Commanding General from April 2009 to July 2009.

Brig. Gen. Thomson commanded the 41st Fires Brigade, 1st Cavalry Division at Fort Hood, Texas, from Oct. 2009 to July 2011. Following brigade command, he became the Director of the Chief's Coordination Group (CCG) for the 38th Chief of Staff of the Army at Headquarters, Department of the Army through March 2013. In April 2013, he assumed duties as Deputy Commander for the 4th Infantry Division at Fort Carson, Colo.

Brig. Gen. Thomson earned a B.S. degree in computer engineering from the U.S. Military Academy in 1986 and a M.S. degree in Counseling and Leader Development from Long Island University in 1995. He is also a graduate of the German Army's Tactical Warfighting Course, the Combined Arms Services and Staff School, the U.S. Army Command and General Staff College, the Joint and Combined Warfighting School of the Joint Forces Staff College, and the U.S. Army War College Fellowship program at the Institute of World Politics in Washington, D.C. His awards and decorations include the Defense Superior Service Medal, Legion of Merit, Bronze Star Medal, Defense Meritorious Service Medal, Meritorious Service Medal, Joint Service Commendation Medal, Army Commendation Medal, Army Achievement Medal, Combat Action Badge, Joint Staff Identification Badge, German Armed Forces Proficiency Badge, Parachutist Badge, Ranger Tab, Ancient Order of St. Barbara medal, and 2nd Cavalry Dragon Order of the Spur.

Brigadier General Timothy E. Trainor, Ph.D., became the Dean of the Academic Board at the United States Military Academy in the summer of 2010. He previously served as professor and head of the Department of Systems Engineering at West Point where he taught courses in engineering management, systems engineering and decision analysis.

Trainor graduated with a Bachelor of Science from West Point in 1983 and entered the Engineer Branch of the U.S. Army. As an engineering officer, Trainor has served in operational assignments around the world, including Germany, Honduras, Fort Bragg, N.C., Fort Riley, Kans. and Sarajevo, Bosnia.

Trainor has a Master of Business Administration from the Fuqua School of Business at Duke and a doctorate degree in industrial engineering from North Carolina State University. He is a member of the Military Applications Society of the Institute for Operations Research and the Management Sciences the Military Operations Research Society, the American Society for Engineering Management and the American Society of Engineering Education. He is a past president of Epsilon Mu Eta, the national Engineering Management Honor Society. Trainor is also a member of the Board of Fellows for the David Crawford School of Engineering at Norwich University.

As an analyst, Trainor helped develop the Installation Status Report that provides the Army a standardized means to assess infrastructure and environmental conditions on installations to support resource allocation decisions. He has applied decision analysis methods in completing an organizational analysis of the Army's Installation Management Agency and in assessing defense security cooperation programs.

Trainor deployed to Basrah, Iraq in the summer of 2007 and worked with the British-led Provincial Reconstruction Team in helping the provincial Iraqi leaders improve their infrastructure revitalization plans.

Trainor is married to Col. Donna Brazil, a 1983 graduate of West Point, who is a professor in the Department of Behavioral Sciences at the Academy. They have a daughter Cory, who graduated from West Point in 2013. Son, Danny, is a 2LT in the Army and a 2015 West Point graduate and son, Zach, is currently a yearling at USMA.

BOO CORRIGAN

DIRECTOR OF ATHLETICS

Now in the midst of his fifth year as the Director of Intercollegiate Athletics at the Army West Point, Boo Corrigan has guided the Black Knights to incredible successes on the fields of friendly strife, victories over Navy, surpassed ambitious fundraising goals, upgraded several facilities, added three varsity sports and created a new brand identity, all while cadet-athletes continued to raise the bar academically.

Corrigan was named Director of Intercollegiate Athletics on Feb. 1, 2011 and the short time since, Army has won the "Star" series against Navy, claimed the overall competition against the Midshipmen, added Academic All-American certificates, raised the annual fund by nearly \$3 million, increased the "For Us All Capital Campaign by \$55 million," completed fundraising on a new lacrosse building and established 10 new program endowments.

Under Corrigan's leadership, Army has added women's lacrosse and men's and women's rugby to its offering of sports with nearly a quarter of the Corps of Cadets, around 1,000, competing in varsity sports under the athletic department.

In addition to the additional sport offerings, a massive state-of-the-art videoboard was added to Tate Rink, a press box was included at Doubleday Field at Johnson Stadium, the ticket office was upgraded and moved to a more fan-friendly location in Michie Stadium and work will begin the fall on a lacrosse building that will include locker rooms, team rooms, weight room, athletic training space and much more for both the men's and women's lacrosse programs. A branding campaign that started in 2011 at Michie Stadium will continue with additions to Christl Arena this fall.

Corrigan has strengthened and expanded Army Athletics' relationships in several key areas. In his tenure, Army has secured a new apparel agreement with Nike, a new pouring rights contract with Coke and bringing in the Aspire Group to enhance ticket sales and better serve Army season ticket holders. Corrigan also crafted the Team Army concept, a comprehensive plan designed to add significant value to Army's corporate sponsorships while maintaining the tradition of West Point Athletics.

In his first full three years at West Point, Corrigan has overseen a program that owns 11 Patriot League regular season or tournament championships and sent eight teams to the NCAA postseason. Thirty-three cadets have earned a major award from their conference.

Last season, the senior class of 2015 set a high standard for future classes with a .556 winning percentage, marking the highest four-year percentage since the Class of 1995 finished with a .557 mark. In addition, Army West Point had another great year in the classroom with three cadet-athletes earning Patriot League Scholar-Athletes of the Year in their respective sports.

Army West Point also partnered with Nike to complete a successful rebranding initiative in the spring of 2015. Corrigan ushered in a new logo and word mark for Army West Point as part of the rebrand.

In 2013-14, Corrigan led Army Athletics to its first star series victory since 1996, going 12-11 in star competitions against Navy. It was the 12th victory in the series for the Academy. West Point went 18-13 overall against the Mids during the year and has a 34-29-1 mark versus Navy in the last two seasons.

Army finished a very successful campaign in 2013-14 with an overall record of 235-173-7 for a .575 winning percentage, the highest mark since 2004-05.

The Black Knights brought home league titles in men's tennis, baseball and women's basketball. Army won regular season titles in men's tennis and baseball, while the women's hoops squad won the league tournament and was a 13th seed in the NCAA Tournament. Ten of Army's squads participated in Patriot League postseason, while rifle earned an NCAA berth for the 11th-straight season.

Army collected more than 100 all-league citations in 2012-13 alone. Hockey's Cheyenne Rocha and lacrosse's Brendan Buckley each captured the Senior CLASS Award in their respective sports, making Army the only school in the nation to have multiple winners in 2012-13.

During the 2012-13 season, Army teams combined to post an overall record of 236-183-8 for a .562 winning percentage. The winter sports programs had their best season in five years as the women's basketball team won the Patriot League regular season title, the men's basketball team posted its first winning season in 28 years and the rifle squad advanced to the NCAA Championships for the 10th consecutive season.

It was also a great year in the competition against fellow service academies. Army split the season series versus Navy, 16-16-1, marking the best winning percentage against the Mids (.500) since 2004-05. The Black Knights owned a 4-2-1 record against Air Force, improving the record to 20-18-2 (.525) versus service academy foes in 2012-13.

Cadet-athletes have continued to thrive in the classroom under Corrigan's watch. In his three full years, Army has boasted 12 Academic All-Americans, including seven first-team selections. Lacrosse's Brendan Buckley became the first Army athlete to capture Academic All-American of the Year honors in 2012. In 2011, the Black Knights' football team boasted two first-team CoSIDA Academic All-Americans, a first for the program since 1957. Since the start of the 2011-12 season, Army boasts six Patriot League Scholar-Athletes of the Year, including Buckley, a two-time overall men's winner. During the 2013-14 season, Army registered five Academic All-American selections.

Twenty of Army's 24 NCAA programs scored above the national average in the 2013 NCAA APR report. The men's cross country and wrestling teams earned public recognition for finishing in the top 10 percent of their respective sport. The cross country squad boasted a perfect score of 1,000.

In addition, former football standout Andrew Rodriguez, Class of 2012, became the first Army player to win the National Football Foundation's William V. Campbell Trophy, which is presented annually to the nation's top football scholar-athlete. Rodriguez later was honored with the Amateur Athletic Union's James E. Sullivan Award as the top amateur athlete in the country. He was the first Army player to receive the award since 1946 and was just the third player in history (Peyton Manning, Tim Tebow) to win both the Campbell Trophy and Sullivan Award.

Army has been the focus of national attention since Corrigan's arrival. He was instrumental in supporting the CBS documentary, "Game of Honor," that chronicled the Black Knights' 2011 football season leading up to its annual showdown with arch-rival Navy. Not only was the two-hour program broadcast to a national audience on Showtime, but also won the Emmy Award for Best Sports Documentary. The Army football team was also the focus of a behind-the-scenes book titled, "Soldiers First," written by New York Times writer Joe Drape.

In addition to his duties at West Point, Corrigan has been an active leader in the Patriot League, serving as chairman of the conference's Broadband Committee.

Corrigan, who was the senior associate athletic director for external affairs at Duke University starting in August 2008, brings a wealth of leadership to his post. He is a proven administrator with 18 previous years of experience in all areas of revenue generation, external affairs, staff management and leadership.

Corrigan's chief responsibilities at Duke included the oversight of the Blue Devil corporate partnerships and the Marketing, Promotions, Ticket, Internet Operations, Sports Information and Video Services departments. In only two years at Duke, Corrigan was responsible for the negotiation of multi-media rights to ISP.

A supervisor of the 2009 NCAA Champion women's tennis and 2010 NCAA Champion men's lacrosse programs, Corrigan was a part of three NCAA Championships at Duke in just two seasons. He served as a member of the NCAA Men's Lacrosse Rules committee and the Atlantic Coast Conference Men's Lacrosse Committee, while serving on the Executive Budget Committee at Duke.

Prior to arriving at Duke in August of 2008, he oversaw Notre Dame's corporate relations and marketing as an associate athletic director for five years. During his stint at Notre Dame, Corrigan spearheaded the redesign of its official athletics website and creation of 15-20 hours of original video content weekly. That resulted in a 35 percent increase in page views and unique users. Corrigan also worked directly with ISP Sports, CSTV, and NBC Sports from a sales and marketing standpoint.

Before joining the staff at Notre Dame, Corrigan spent nearly three years as the associate athletic director for marketing at the United States Naval Academy. He was responsible for turning the marketing department from a deficit to profit in his first year with full budget responsibility for the department. Corrigan also was intimately involved with the re-branding of the Annual Giving Campaign (The Blue and Gold), which led to an increase of 75 percent year over year donations.

His collegiate experience also includes a stint as assistant director of marketing at Florida State from 1992-95.

Corrigan is a 1990 University of Notre Dame graduate with a degree in economics. He is married to the former Kristen Aceto, a former field hockey and lacrosse player at the University of Virginia who also earned a master's degree from the school. The couple has three children, Finley, Tre and Brian. He is the youngest of seven children of Gene and Lena Corrigan.

Long recognized as one of the premier academic institutions in the United States, the U.S. Military Academy provides a challenging curriculum that culminates in a bachelor of science degree upon graduation.

More than 25 fields of study and 19 optional academic majors are available to cadets as West Point strives to educate and train the Corps of Cadets so that each graduate shall have the attributes essential to professional growth as an officer in the regular Army.

The USMA curriculum is also geared toward providing West Point graduates with an intellectual foundation for increasing responsibility (as they ascend the ranks) through a balanced undergraduate education.

The Academy's highly competitive academic environment, coupled with its broad-based academic curriculum, has helped West Point rank fourth nationally in the number of both Rhodes Scholars and Hertz Scholars that it has produced.

The West Point curriculum is divided into three portions - core courses, an engineering sequence and a field of study. Cadets are required to take 26 core courses plus five additional classes in one of seven engineering sequences (mechanical, electrical, civil, nuclear, systems, computer or environmental).

Beginning with the first semester of the junior year, cadets begin to take electives for their chosen field of study. Fields of study require completion of nine additional courses, bringing to 40 the number of classes a cadet must pass in order to receive a degree.

The selection of an optional major involves anywhere from one to four - usually three - additional courses above and beyond the nine field of study electives. This will allow the Cadet to expand his or her realm of study within a chosen discipline.

Physical education and military science courses round out the challenging curriculum. Cadets are required to incorporate classes from both disciplines into each semester's class schedule, creating a standard six-course load for each academic term.

WOMEN AT WEST POINT

1779

Margaret (Molly) Corbin is the first woman to receive a military pension in the United States for her heroism and service to the country during the Revolutionary War. She is buried in the West Point cemetery.

1836

The Warner Sisters come to Constitution Island. For half a century, Susan and Anna Warner wrote popular novels and taught Sunday School to West Point cadets. Susan wrote "A Wide World," one of the nation's best sellers, in the 1850s. Anna wrote the words to the children's verse "Jesus Loves Me." In 1908 they donated the island to the Military Academy.

1957

Maj. Emma Baird becomes the Assistant Chief of the Personnel Branch and is reputed to be the first woman staff officer at West Point.

1968

Dr. Betsy Lewis, the Academy's fine arts librarian, teaches art classes in the English Department to First Class Cadets as the first female faculty member.

1973

1st Lt. Virginia Fry is the first full-time female faculty member, serving as a geography instructor in the Department of Earth, Space and Graphic Sciences.

1975

President Gerald Ford signs legislation that forever changes the face of America's service academies when he declares that women would be permitted to seek nomination and attend a military institution.

1976

Army welcomes its first co-ed class in July of 1976 with the admission of 119 women with the Class of 1980; Mrs. Sue Peterson joins the Department of Physical Education as its first female instructor.

1978

"Women at West Point" television movie airs on CBS; Maj. Nancy Freebairn is the first female tactical officer; basketball is the first women's sport to gain varsity status.

1979

Cadet Kathy Gerard is the first female Brigade Executive Officer, and Col. Mildred Hedberg is the Chief of Staff for the United States Corps of Cadets.

1980

The first women's class graduates from West Point; Andrea Hollen, the Academy's 58th Rhodes Scholar, is the first of 62 women to receive her diploma; Terry Tepper is awarded the Army Athletic Association (AAA) Trophy for "most valuable service to women's athletics." Maj. Cathy Kelley is the Academy's first woman named a permanent associate professor.

1981

Dena Caradimitropoulos, who starred in basketball, is the first woman and only the sixth cadet to win the AAA Special Award for "outstanding achievements and exemplary leadership in athletic competition."

1984

Karen Short, a member of the women's basketball team, is the first female to command Cadet Basic Training and be a Regimental Commander. Tracy Hanlon, a star in both basketball and track, is the first female to qualify for the Olympic trials (heptathlon).

1985

Lissa Young is the first female Deputy Brigade Commander and the first to be in charge of Cadet Field Training.

1986

Pam Pearson earns All-America honors in track and is the only woman at West Point selected for All-America honors in two sports, having been chosen twice in basketball. Women's soccer becomes a varsity sport.

1987

Capt. Kathy Gerard-Snook and Bobbi Fiedler-Prinslow (West Point '80) are the first women graduates to serve on the USMA faculty.

1988

Ann Marie Wycoff, named the "Outstanding Female Swimmer" at the NCAA Division II Champions, is the first athlete to capture four national titles in a single championship event.

1989

Kristen Baker is the first woman to command the Corps of Cadets with her selection as First Captain; Capt. Heidi Brown (West Point '81) and Mary Finch (West Point '83) are the first women graduates to serve as tactical officers.

1990

Carol Barkalow (West Point '80), who starred in basketball, writes a book ("In the Men's House") about her West Point experience as a member of the first female class.

1993

Capt. Margaret Belknap (West Point '81), a member of the Systems Engineering Department, is the first woman to serve as a White House Fellow.

1995

Rebecca Marier, a tennis star, is the first female cadet to graduate No. 1 in her class.

1997

Col. Maureen LeBoeuf is the first female to head an academic department with her appointment as Professor and Head of the Department of Physical Education. Barbara Treharne (West Point '80) and Heidi Brown (West Point '81) are two of four females to command air defense artillery Patriot battalions.

1999

Alison Jones is the first female and second cadet in a decade to receive the Soldiers Medal for heroism in the terrorist bombing of the American Embassy in Nairobi, Kenya. Women's tennis becomes the first female team to earn a Division I NCAA tournament berth.

2000

The U.S. Military Academy celebrates the 20th anniversary of the first women's class to graduate.

2001

The 25th year of females at the U.S. Military Academy is observed while the Academy celebrates its bicentennial.

2003

Rebecca Halstead (West Point '81), former women's basketball manager, becomes the first female West Point graduate to achieve rank of general in the U.S. Army.

2005

Pamela Denise Pearson (West Point '86) became the first women's basketball player inducted into the Army Sports Hall of Fame.

Col. Cindy (Glazier) Jebb (West Point '82), a former volleyball captain, becomes the first female graduate to be named Professor, USMA, when she becomes Deputy Head of the Department of Social Sciences.

2006

Army becomes the first service academy to earn a bid to the NCAA Division I Women's Basketball Tournament.

Col. Maritza Ryan (West Point '82) becomes the first female graduate to be the Head of an Academic Department when she becomes the Professor of Law.

2007

Former Army standout in both basketball and track & field, Alma Cobb (West Point '84), is inducted into the Army Sports Hall of Fame.

2009

Former basketball and track star Tracy Hanlon (West Point '84) is inducted into the Army Sports Hall of Fame.

2010

Melody Smith (West Point '84), Army's women's basketball's fourth all-time leading scorer, is inducted into the Army Sports Hall of Fame.

2011

Erin Anthony (West Point '11) wins the prestigious Army Athletic Association Trophy and is a Lowe's Senior CLASS Award national finalist. Katie Macfarlane (West Point '04) is inducted into the Army Sports Hall of Fame. Both were standout women's basketball players.

2013

Track and field athlete Lindsey Danilack was named the First Captain for 2013-14 - just the fourth female to serve in that position - the highest in the cadet chain of command.

2014

Army earned its second bid to the NCAA Division I Women's Basketball Tournament, and first since 2006.

2015

Kelsey Minato (West Point '16) becomes the sixth Army women's basketball player to earn All-America honors. Kim Kawamoto (West Point '92) becomes the sixth women's basketball player to be inducted into the Army Sports Hall of Fame.
