OPENING TIP

The Army West Point men's basketball team looks for its fourth straight win on Wednesday night when it takes on Bryant in Smithfield, R.I. The game begins at 7 p.m. and will be broadcast online on NECFrontRow.com.

Tuesday marks the 50th anniversary of former Army head coach Bob Knight's first coaching victory, a 71-62 win over Worcester Tech (12/8/65). Knight coached six seasons at West Point and led the Black Knights to a 102-50 record before eventually compiling a 902-371 career record over 42 seasons at Indiana (29 years) and Texas Tech (seven years).

Army has made at least 10 three-pointers in seven straight games and is averaging 10.9 three-point field goals per contest this season, which is sixth in the country. Kyle Wilson is fourth in the nation in threes per game with 4.13. As a team, Army is shooting 41.4 percent from three-point range (63-of-152), which ranks 19th in the nation. Adam Roe (10-of-16, 62.5 percent) and Kennedy Edwards (11-of-19, 57.9 percent) occupy the top two spots in the Patriot League for three-point shooting percentage. Edwards is the reigning Patriot League Player of the Week after his career-high 21-point showing in Army's win at Maine.

Army has the top scoring offense in the Patriot League (86.6 points per game) and leads the conference in scoring margin (+9.8).

Seniors Tanner Plomb and Kyle Wilson have each scored in double figures in the first eight games of the season. Wilson set a new career standard with 36 points on eight three pointers in the win over FDU and Plomb netted a career-best 31 points in the OT win over Gardner-Webb.

Wilson scored 15 points in the win over Arkansas - Pine Bluff to become the fifth player in Academy history to reach 1,600 career points. He now has 1,637 career points.

Plomb has 967 career points going into Tuesday's game and is looking to become the 30th player in Academy history to score 1,000 points. Multiple players from the same graduating class to reach the 1,000-point mark include 1981 graduates Bob Brown (1,282) and Marty Coyne (1,126) and 1990 graduates Todd Mattson (1,122) and Steve Rothert (1,054).

Senior point guard Dylan Cox is among the nation's leaders in assists per game. Cox leads the Patriot League and is tied for eighth in the country with an average of 7.3 assists per night. In his first two games of the year, Cox set and equaled a career high with 11 assists against Fairleigh Dickinson and George Washington.

Together, Wilson and Plomb were the top scoring duo in the Patriot League in 2014-15 with an average of 33.3 points per game. Wilson was first in scoring in the conference at 17.5 points per game, while Plomb ranked fourth overall with a 15.8 points per game average. Plomb (20.4) and Wilson (19.5) are the top two scorers in the Patriot League in 2015-16.

Kevin Ferguson's 63.1 percent career field-goal percentage (368-of-538) is third among active NCAA Division I players. Belmont's Evan Bradds leads the list with a 68.4 career-field goal percentage. Jalen Billups of Northern Kentucky is second at 63.6 percent for his career.

Kevin Ferguson and Larry Toomey each played in their 100th career games against Maine. Kyle Wilson is the next player set to play in his 100th career game, with 99 entering Tuesday's contest.

THE LAST MEETING

Bryant built a double digit halftime lead and led the entire second half in an 80-73 victory over Army at Christl Arena. Dymari Starks directed the offensive performance for the visitors with a game-high 23 points.

Army had four players score in double figures, led by Kyle Wilson's 19. Kevin Ferguson contributed 15, Dylan Cox had 14, and Tanner Plomb netted 12.

The loss dropped Army to 6-2, while Bryant improved to 2-5 on the year.

"They controlled the game in all of the important aspects of the game," head coach Zach Spiker said. "We allowed Bryant to get a number of offensive rebounds, take easy shots and they shot 50 percent from the floor. Truthfully, when you allow a team to achieve those numbers, you deserve to lose and tonight was no exception."

Both teams shot better than 50 percent in the contest, but Bryant was plus-five on the glass and held a 13-9 difference on the offensive boards.

Bryant got off to a great start offensively and led 25-12 midway through the first period on Hunter Ware's stepback three-pointer. The start featured nine points by Starks, who led all scorers with 13 points at intermission.

Army slashed the deficit to six and then made it a three-point game when Cox went coast to coast and finished a three-point play. Up 34-31 at that point, Joe O'Shea (10 points) answered Cox's drive by draining a contested three to help Bryant close the half on an 8-0 run. Ware hit another triple during the spurt to push his first-half total to 11 points and Bryant shot 51.6 percent (16-of-31) from the floor in the opening half. Army made 11 of its 22 first-half attempts, but turned the ball over eight times, while only forcing three Bryant turnovers and went into the locker room down 42-31.

Bryant continued to shoot the ball well in the second half and went up by 18 points with a 14-4 run seven minutes into the second half. Ware had a layup, O'Shea drilled a triple and Starks connected on a pullup trey, before Ware's jumper made punctuated the stretch and made it 58-40.

Army came back with six in a row, from Ferguson, Wilson and Cox in succession, but the 18-point cushion was quickly regained by Bryant on a three-point play by Andrew Scocca (11 points) and Starks' third three ball.

The visiting Bulldogs led by as many as 20 points with seven minutes remaining and the margin ended up being big enough to withstand Army's late push. A Wilson three trimmed the score to 75-66 with 1:15 left, but Ware converted four free throws in the final minute to keep Army at bay. Ware ended his night with 17 points on 5-of-10 from the floor, including 3-of-5 from distance.

"I think we got it to six or seven a couple times there late," Spiker added. "But, the truth is that when you dig yourselves that big of a hole, you spend a lot of energy getting out of it and there's not much left to get you over the hump. I thought the better team won the game tonight."

PRESEASON POLL

Army was picked to finish fourth in the Patriot League's annual preseason poll. The Black Knights earned 108 points in the poll. Lehigh claimed the top spot with 156 points and 12 first-place votes, the defending regular-season champions Bucknell finished second in the voting with 150 points and eight first-place nods, while Boston University was third with 126 points.

Behind the Black Knights was American (84), defending conference champions Lafayette (82) and Loyola (73) in seventh. Holy Cross (50), Colgate (36) and Navy (36) rounded out the list.

KEY NCAA RULE CHANGES

Shot clock reduced from 35 seconds to 30 seconds.

Restricted area arc expanded from three feet to four feet.

Reduction of 30-second timeouts from four to three; only two carry over to the second half.

A 30-second timeout called within 30 seconds of a media timeout will become the media timeout.

Coaches can only call timeouts during a dead ball situation

Removed the five-second closely guarded count on a dribble

Officials will be able to use instant replay to look at the release of the ball on potential shot clock violations at any point during the game for made baskets only.

FDU HIGHLIGHTS

Army's 96 points at FDU equaled the most for a Zach Spiker coached team and the Black Knights set a new field-goal percentage record during the Spiker era with their 64.8 percent effort (35-of-54). Army totaled 25 assists, including a career-high 11 by Dylan Cox as he posted the third double-double of his career. Cox's 11 assists were the most for an Army player since Josh Miller '10 had 11 against Brown on Jan. 2, 2008.

In addition, Ferguson reached the 20-point mark for the fourth time in his career and Wilson's 36 points were the most for an Army player since Ella Ellis '13 put in 37 at Yale on Nov. 24, 2012.

2015 BARCLAYS CENTER CLASSIC

Army defeated Arkansas - Pine Bluff (81-60) and Gardner-Webb (103-98) to claim the Barclays Center Classic title. Tanner Plomb recorded his first-career 30-point game with a 31-point outburst, including seven three-pointers in the win against the Runnin' Bulldogs in overtime of the championship game. Kevin Ferguson posted his sixth-career double-double against Gardner-Webb and became the 13th player in Academy history to reach 500 career rebounds. Army reached the 100-point mark for the first time during the Spiker era and the 17th time in Academy history. The 201 combined points tied the Christl Arena record (Army 113, Bethany 88 - Jan. 8, 2001) and Army's 27 assists equaled the program record.

NEW LOOK

Army West Point Athletics introduced a new brand and identity system in April 2015 that sets the visual direction for years to come. With the goal of developing an innovative and consistent athletic identity that pays tribute to the Academy's legacy and tradition, U.S. Army and Academy leadership, Army West Point Athletics, Nike, current and former cadet-athletes, coaches, historians and West Point graduates, collaborated on a nearly 18-month brand evolution program. As part of the new identity, every athletic programs will showcase consistent logos, colors, lettering and numerals.

The primary mark, referred to as Athena's Shield, showcases four unique components.

- The shield is among West Point's most potent symbols and represents the mission of the U.S. Army to support and defend the Constitution of the United States against all enemies, foreign and domestic.

- The helmet was worn by Pallas Athena, the Greek goddess of wisdom, just war, skill and justice. The helmet faces dexter, Latin for "right" from the viewpoint of the bearer of the field as opposed to sinister. The dexter side is considered the side of greater honor. The 13 segments that connect the helmet and the plume reference the 13 British colonies that declared independence from the Kingdom of Great Britain and became the first states in the Union.

- The sword, also known as Xiphos, is a double-edged, single-hand sword used by the ancient Greeks. It symbolizes the scholar-warrior and signifies protection, righteousness and justice. While the original 1898 USMA crest had the sword sheathed, the sword here is unsheathed to allow the viewer to see the martial elements of Army West Point, the warrior spirit, more clearly.

- The star has multiple meanings, including the connection to the U.S. Army and its storied past. During World War II, every tank, truck and airplane in the U.S. Army sported a star as they fought to victory in Europe and the Pacific. The star also represents the connection to the American people and 50 stars from the flag.

On first reference broadcasters, print and digital media members are encouraged to use **Army West Point**. From there, simply **Army** or **Black Knights** are acceptable when referring to the team. **Cadets** is also an acceptable secondary reference, in addition to **Black Knights**. For scoreboards and score graphics, **ARMY** is permissible.



2014-15 HIGHLIGHTS

Army reached 15 victories for the third consecutive year, marking the first time the Black Knights have had three straight 15-win campaigns since Bob Knight's teams each won at least 15 from 1967-70. The last time Army had four straight 15-win seasons was from 1920-24.

Zach Spiker earned his sixth straight 10-win season and joined Bob Knight as the only Army head coaches to win 10 games in six straight years. No Army head coach has ever won 10 games in seven consecutive seasons.

Spiker became the third-fastest Army coach to reach 75 career victories when he accomplished the feat in 160 games. Bobby Knight won his 75th game in 107 tries and Leo Novak needed 110 contests to reach 75 wins. Spiker's 84 career wins rank fourth all-time in Academy history (84-98).

The Class of 2015 was responsible for 58 victories over four seasons. Those 58 wins marked the most victories in a four-year stretch since 1980 when that group graduated with 62 wins. The Class of 2016 has 46 wins. The four Army teams from 1966-70 posted a program-best 73 wins.

Army was 3-0 in overtime games and 5-1 in games decided by three points or less in 2014-15.

2014-15 HOT START

Army's 2-0 start was its first to include victories against two Division I opponents since 1970-71 when Bob Knight coached Army.

Army's first 3-0 start since the 2001-02 campaign and was 3-0 to start the season for the first time versus current Division I opponents since Bob Knight's team opened the 1968-69 season with consecutive wins over Lehigh, Cornell and Temple.

First time Army opened the season with four straight wins versus current Division I opponents since 1939. Started 4-0 for the first time since the 1978-79 season when Mike Krzyzewski held the position of head coach.

Army's first 5-0 start since the 1976-77 campaign and first 5-0 start versus current Division I opponents since 1939. First 6-1 start since the 1978-79 campaign. First 7-2 start since the 2009-10 season. First 10-3 start since the 1978-79 campaign.

Army started 6-1 on the road to mark its best road start since the 1976-77 campaign.

ACADEMIC SUCCESS

Army achieved its highest team grade-point average in 10 years - 2.84 GPA in the fall 2014 semester. Seven players named to West Point Dean's List in the fall, including five returning players. Mac Hoffman (3.571 GPA), Larry Toomey (3.122), Dylan Cox (3.089), Austin Williamson (3.086) and Jacob Kessler (3.083).

Hoffman and Cox also landed on the Patriot League Academic Honor Roll. Hoffman was one of only five Patriot League student-athletes to post a GPA of 4.0 or higher with his 4.008 score during the spring semester. Cox registered a 3.204 GPA in the spring to make his first appearance on the list. Hoffman, Cox and Richard Brown (3.011) also were placed on the West Point Dean's List for the spring semester.

KNICKS CAMP AT CHRISTL

For the second consecutive year, the New York Knickerbockers of the National Basketball Association held their annual preseason training camp at the United States Military Academy.

The team, under the direction of second-year head coach Derek Fisher, arrived at West Point on Monday, Sept. 28 and conducted a team building session at the start of camp. Tuesday morning the Knicks visited the Arvin Cadet Physical Development Center where they witnessed combatives and boxing training, indoor obstacle course testing (IOCT) in Hayes Gymnasium, and aquatics and lifetime sport instruction at Crandall Pool, as well as cadet training in the Combat Water Survival Lab.

The team held two practices each day on Tuesday and Wednesday at Christl Arena, the home of the Army men's and women's basketball programs, including a Wednesday evening session that was open for Cadets to attend. An autograph and photo session with the Knicks followed the workout.

On Wednesday afternoon, Knicks President Phil Jackson, a 13-time NBA champion, and Willis Reed, one of the 50 Greatest Players in NBA History and a Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Famer spoke to the Army football team.

Thursday morning, the Knicks staged a team photo at Trophy Point prior to their only practice and later in the evening the team shared a meal with cadets in the Cadet Mess Hall inside Washington Hall.

ELLIS '13 SELECTED IN NBA D-LEAGUE DRAFT

Former Army men's basketball standout Ella Ellis was selected by the Maine Red Claws in the 2015 NBA Development League Draft on Oct. 31. Ellis, a 2013 graduate of the U.S. Military Academy, earned an invite to Red Claws' training camp, which began on Nov. 3.

Ellis was Maine's second pick of the draft and was chosen in the second round at 31st overall. The Red Claws serve as the minor league affiliate of the NBA's Boston Celtics and are one of 19 D-League teams, who each have a direct association to an NBA franchise.

Ellis graduated as Army's fifth all-time leading scorer with 1,585 career points. He is the only player in Academy history to amass at least 1,500 points, 450 rebounds (466), 150 assists (161) and 40 blocked shots (45). Ellis was Army's first two-time member of the All-Patriot League First Team since 1996 and captured second-team All-NABC District 13 honors in consecutive seasons, a program first since all-time leading scorer Kevin Houston (1986-87).

ARMY-NAVY SET FOR MSG

The men's and women's basketball programs will host Navy in a doubleheader on Jan. 23 at Madison Square Garden in New York City. The games will be televised nationally by CBS Sports Network.

Army last played at Madison Square Garden during the 1985-86 season when it met La Salle, and also appeared there on multiple occasions with Bob Knight at the helm for games in the National Invitation Tournament. In 1969, Knight and Mike Krzyzewski, a senior captain for the Black Knights, led Army to a fourth-place finish in the N.I.T., including a victory over South Carolina, which Knight considers one of his greatest-ever triumphs.

"Having the privilege to play at Madison Square Garden is a tremendous opportunity for our program," head men's basketball coach Zach Spiker said. "One of the advantages of being at West Point is that our cadet-athletes are able to travel and experience unique places and events like this one. Our team will appreciate the opportunity, but will also be focused on the challenge of competing against a great opponent in Navy."

SPIKER VISITS TROOPS IN KOREA

Head men's basketball coach Zach Spiker, head women's basketball coach Dave Magarity and Director of Athletics Boo Corrigan visited Korea in late May to witness the U.S. Army's operations in the country.

The weeklong trip offered Corrigan, Magarity and Spiker the opportunity to speak with graduates and faculty and to tour a number of Army bases with some of the soldiers who are deployed. The group was also accompanied by a contingent of West Point representatives, including Superintendent Lt. Gen. Robert Caslen.

"It was a very educational, humbling and motivating experience," Spiker said. "We saw former players, cadet-athletes and West Point grads in high-ranking leadership positions everywhere we went. Army West Point Athletics was well represented and it was an honor to see how our Army soldiers work and what they do on a daily basis."

"The trip to Korea and the National Training Center was one of the most memorable experiences I've ever had," Magarity said. "To visit the Demilitarized Zone and see what our soldiers are up against in terms of defending and supporting the South Koreans and to watch the training at Camp Irwin, was absolutely remarkable."

On the first full day in Korea, the group toured the United States Forces Korea base before speaking with Academy graduates at a West Point graduates luncheon.

The trip also included a visit to the Demilitarized Zone (DMZ) along the border of North Korea and South Korea and a tour of the Joint Security Area. The travel party flew by helicopter to Camp Casey to witness static display tours of a number of military vehicles.

Included on the trip back to West Point was a stop at the National Training Center in Fort Irwin, Calif., to observe a realistic training session before returning to New York.

Spiker has led Army to three straight 15-win seasons for the first time since the program won at least 15 under Knight's guidance from 1967-70.

THE CLASS OF 2019

Approximately 1,270 cadet candidates, including 280 women, 425 minorities, 17 international cadets and 13 combat veterans began Cadet Basic Training this summer.

The incoming class was selected from a pool of 16,000 applicants. The 280 women represent 22 percent of the class. Minority enrollment, roughly 33 percent, includes 189 African-Americans, 93 Asian-Americans, 119 Hispanic-Americans and 10 Native Americans.

The Class of 2019 includes cadets from every state in the nation and 17 international cadets entering the class under the sponsorship of their respective countries. The countries represented include Bangladesh, Guyana, Mongolia, Montenegro, Netherlands, Malaysia, Pakistan (two), Panama, Philippines, Romania, Rwanda, Saudi Arabia, Taiwan, Tanzania, Turkey and the United Arab Emirates. Upon graduation, these cadets will return to their respective countries as officers in their armed forces.

FREE BASKETBALL

Army's overtime win against USC (12/13/14) snapped a streak of five straight overtime losses for the Black Knights. During Zach Spiker's tenure, Army is 5-6 in overtime games, including a 1-1 mark in double-overtime contests. The last time Army played a triple OT game was Feb. 14, 2009 when it beat Lehigh 82-75. Army has four consecutive overtime victories after its 103-98 win over Gardner-Webb.

INTERMISSION INFORMATION

Army is 64-23 since the start of the 2009-10 season when leading at the break. In that span, Army is 16-15 when leading by five or less, 18-5 when its lead is between six and nine points, and 30-3 when holding a double-digit lead. In that same time frame, Army is 6-4 when tied, 15-18 when trailing by five or less and 0-32 when down by double digits.

DEPARTMENT OF DEFENSE

Dating back to 2009-10, Army has posted a 39-12 record when holding foes to 60 points or less.

The Black Knights named their 2015-16 team captains prior to the start of the season. Seniors Dylan Cox, Tanner Plomb, Larry Toomey and Kyle Wilson were chosen by their teammates. Cox is in his third season as a team captain, linking him with Matt Bell '07 as the only three-year captains in program history.

SENIOR STARTERS

Army, Tulsa and Texas Southern (three seniors, two graduate students) are the only three teams in the nation to regularly feature a starting lineup consisting of all seniors. The Black Knights typically open the game with Dylan Cox, Kyle Wilson, Larry Toomey, Tanner Plomb and Kevin Ferguson in the starting five, a combination that has been together in every game since the fourth contest of 2015-16 at George Washington.

THREE IS BETTER THAN TWO

Army has made at least 10 three-pointers in seven straight games and is averaging 10.9 three-point field goals per contest this season, which is sixth in the country. Kyle Wilson is fourth in the nation in threes per game with 4.13.

ROSTER BREAKDOWN

Army's roster features seven seniors, which is tied for the most in program history.

Army returned 91.6 percent of its scoring and 92.9 percent of its rebounding from last season.

The Black Knights added nine players as part of the Class of 2019.

Army's roster has players from 13 different states. North Carolina is home to five players, the most of any single state.

Army will return 140 of a possible 150 starts from the 2014-15 season, which is the second-most during Zach Spiker's tenure.

Army built a 19-point halftime lead and never looked back in an eventual 93-54 victory over Ferrum College in its 2015-16 season opener.

Kevin Ferguson's 18 points led Army offensively on 9-of-11 shooting, while Tanner Plomb and Kyle Wilson contributed 17 and 15 points, respectively. Ferguson added eight rebounds and three blocks and as a team, Army shot 55.2 percent from the field (37-of-67).

Fox had nine points, three rebounds, two assists and two steals at the point guard spot for the Black Knights.

Army seized control with a 10-0 spurt and held a 23-13 lead by at 10:45 mark of the opening half. John Emezie's first-career bucket, a layup, started the stretch that ended with three consecutive baskets by Ferguson underneath.

Following a pair of field goals by Ferrum, Army's lead stretched to 13 following a corner three by Wilson after an offensive rebound by Larry Toomey. The Black Knights' 17-4 run officially lasted 6:31 and had Army ahead 30-17 with 7:32 left in the first half. Army pulled down 12 offensive rebounds in the half, which led to 15 second-chance points.

Toomey continued to find the open man and fed Plomb for a one-handed slam with five minutes on the clock as Wilson began to get going offensively. His jumper a minute later followed a three and pushed the cushion to 16 points.

Army took a 48-29 lead into the locker room after shooting 51.4 percent from the floor in the period. Ferguson had 14 points, seven rebounds and three blocks at the break, while Wilson added 10 points. The Black Knights had a 20-13 advantage on the glass and forced Ferrum into 10 turnovers.

Nine straight points, capped by a steal and a layup by Plomb extended Army's lead to 57-29 early in the second half.

Army's largest lead was the final 39-point margin. The Black Knights finished with a 38-29 rebounding advantage and were plus-10 in turnovers. Alek Ayer was Ferrum's leading scorer with 16 points on 7-for-15 shooting.

Army used an early run to distance itself from Binghamton in an eventual 75-60 victory over the Bearcats at the Binghamton University Events Center.

Three Army players scored in double figures, including a game-high 23 points by Tanner Plomb as the Black Knights improved to 2-0 on the year. Kyle Wilson scored 16 points and Kevin Ferguson added 12 in the win. Plomb, Ferguson and Larry Toomey each pulled down eight rebounds as Army was plus-five on the glass.

The Black Knights shot 41 percent from the floor (25-of-61), including 11-for-30 from beyond the arc (36.7 percent). Army had 17 assists, including five from Jordan Fox and four by Toomey.

Army used an early 10-2 run to jump out to a 12-6 lead and forced Binghamton into four turnovers prior to the first media stoppage. A runner by Scott Mammel tacked on two more points, before Toomey's drive and kick to an open Plomb three punctuated the 15-3 stretch and had Army up 17-7.

Back-to-back corner threes by Adam Roe, the second with 6:30 to play in the first half, sent Army's lead back to 11 points as they led 30-19. Following Plomb's third three and Edwards' second, Army had a 12-point cushion with 3:30 left in the period.

The Black Knights managed a 42-30 halftime lead despite being called for 17 fouls as a team and turning the ball over 10 times. As a team, Army hit seven threes in 19 attempts (36.8 percent), and outrebounded Binghamton 23-18. The Bearcats shot 12-of-21 from the free throw line.

The second half began with Binghamton scoring the first six points to cut the 12-point deficit in half. Everson Davis made a crucial layup to start the period before a layup by Dusan Perovic and two free throws by the Bearcats.

Over the next four minutes, Army scored 10 of the next 12 points starting with a Wilson triple. Army collected three steals during the stretch and a reverse layup by Wilson surrounded five points by Plomb. It was 52-38 with 14:21 on the second-half clock.

The lead hovered around double digits for the Black Knights over the next six minutes. A three by Perovic late in the shot clock trimmed Army's lead to 60-51, but an offensive rebound by Toomey off his own miss led to two free throws for the senior forward. A miss on the other end by Perovic gave the ball back to Army and Wilson drilled a corner three to push the lead back to 14.

Binghamton never cut Army's lead to less than 10 points and Army came away with the 15-point victory.

George Washington used a 15-0 run midway through the second half to pull away from Army in a 92-81 decision at the Smith Center.

Tanner Plomb led the Black Knights (3-1) offensively with a game-high 27 points on 10-of-18 shooting, including four three pointers, and pulled in 12 rebounds for his second double-double in as many games. Kyle Wilson added 16 points and Larry Toomey scored 11. Dylan Cox equaled his career-high with 11 assists.

The Colonials (4-0) had five players in double figures, led by Kevin Larsen's 21. Patricio Garino scored 18, Matt Hart put in 17 off the bench, while Tyler Cavanaugh and Joe McDonald contributed 11 and 10 points, respectively. As a team, GW hit on 50.8 percent of its field-goal attempts (31-of-61) and went 26-of-33 at the free throw line.

Army was 9-for-20 at the charity stripe in the loss and connected on 46.2 percent from the field (30-of-65), with a 12-for-28 effort from distance.

George Washington opened the contest by scoring all 12 of the game's first 16 points inside the paint. Garino had six of the Colonials' points early on, before Army trimmed the deficit to three (16-13) following a Wilson triple.

Yuta Watanabe answered with a straightaway triple of his own to ignite a 14-3 run for the home team that pushed the lead to 30-16. Kevin Larsen had five points and Garino scored four as the Colonials equaled their largest lead of the first 20 minutes.

Army tightened its defense and cut GW's lead to single digits with seven straight points that made it 40-33 with 1:27 left in the half. The Colonials were 0-for-8 from the field during the four-plus minute stretch, with two turnovers. A layup by Hart ended the run and GW closed the half with six of the final eight points to go into halftime with a 46-35 lead.

Plomb, who led the Black Knights with 10 points in the first half, scored Army's first five points of the second prior to a Kennedy Edwards spot-up three that pulled the Black Knights within six (49-43). A technical foul on the Colonials led to an Army free throw, before Edwards drilled his second three to make it a two-point game.

The Army run was punctuated (15-3) when Plomb connected on a contested three that gave Army its first lead of the night at 50-49. A two-handed slam by Larsen pushed GW ahead briefly, but Plomb found Toomey open for three to put Army back up 53-51.

The Colonials reeled off nine quick points, capped by a three ball by Cavanaugh that forced an Army timeout with 12 minutes remaining. A steal and score by Hart increased the lead to 62-53, Cox missed a pair at the stripe, and the run continued with a Hart jumper and two free throws by Joe McDonald. The 15-0 spurt ended with a layup by Plomb.

George Washington led by as many as 16 points, but Army refused to go away. A one-handed slam by Plomb and a steal led to a Wilson trey that made it 83-76 with 2:38 left. A foul call put McDonald back at the line where he made a pair and Army never got any closer the rest of the way.

The Army men's basketball team led for a majority of the first half, but Tennessee's combination of Armani Moore and Kevin Punter were too much to handle in a 95-80 final at Thompson-Boling Arena.

Moore (29) and Punter (26) combined for 55 points on 20-for-35 shooting. Moore filled up the stat sheet with eight rebounds, six assists, four blocks and a steal, while Punter added four assists and three steals. Robert Hubbs III joined them in double figures with 14 points and Derek Reese added nine.

Tanner Plomb led the Black Knights with 24 points and collected seven rebounds, while Kyle Wilson scored 21 on 8-of-16 shooting and a 5-for-11 effort from beyond the arc. Kevin Ferguson grabbed 12 rebounds to equal his career high.

As a team, the Vols shot 52.9 percent from the floor (37-for-70) and hit 10-of-22 three-point attempts after missing their first eight from downtown. Army held a 44-37 rebounding edge, but turned the ball over twice as much as Tennessee (14-7).

Army used an early 10-4 run to break a 6-6 tie that included a three-point play by Plomb and a layup in traffic moments later. A floater off glass by Jordan Fox made it 16-10 in favor of the visiting Black Knights and ended the stretch.

Army's lead remained at six (24-18) thanks to a 4-for-7 start from beyond the arc, but Tennessee closed the gap to two with consecutive baskets by Shembari Phillips and Moore. The Volunteers eventually tied the score at 26-26 with a lay-in by Admiral Schofield.

The Black Knights led for most of the opening 20 minutes, but Tennessee made its final three shots of the period, including a three by Hubbs at the buzzer that made it 40-36 in favor of the Vols. Hubbs and Punter each scored 11 points in the first half, while Plomb had 11 to lead Army. Tennessee turned eight Army turnovers into 10 points and shot 48.6 percent from the floor (18-for-37), while holding the Black Knights to 40.6 percent (13-of-32).

Tennessee opened up its largest lead by the first media timeout of the second half with a three-pointer by Phillips to make it 53-44. A runner in the paint by Wilson briefly interrupted the run for Tennessee, which officially ended at 15-3 following a three by Hubbs and a pair at the line from Punter, to increase the advantage to 58-46.

A layup by Cox and an open three by Wilson trimmed the deficit to seven (61-54), but Punter continued to find space with back-to-back jumpers to push the lead back to double digits with under 12 minutes to go.

The Black Knights continuously cut the deficit under 10 points, but every time they looked to make a run, the Vols had an answer on the other end. Tennessee took its largest lead of the night on a corner triple by Reese that made it 87-69 and the home side eventually claimed the 15-point victory.

After a furious Gardner-Webb rally sent the game to overtime, but Army made the critical plays in the extra session to claim the 2015 Barclays Center Classic championship crown at Christl Arena. The 103-98 triumph for Army improved it to 5-2 on the season.

Tanner Plomb garnered most-valuable player honors and Kyle Wilson was also selected to the all-tournament team. The 6-7 senior forward poured in a career-high 31 points on an 11-for-17 shooting performance, with seven threes, while Wilson added 20 points. Kevin Ferguson recorded his second straight double-double with 17 points and 10 rebounds and Dylan Cox contributed 10 points and nine assists.

Army was ahead by as many as 25 points in the first half, but Gardner-Webb erased a 10-point deficit with 1:13 left in regulation to send the game to OT. GWU received a 31-point effort from Harold McBride, Tyrell Nelson scored 20 points and Dylan Poston put in 18. McBride and Poston each hit five three-point field goals, and it was Poston's three at the end of regulation that sent the game to overtime.

Leading 9-8 in the game's opening minutes, Army reeled off 13 straight points to take a 22-8 lead. John Emezie ignited the run with a layup, Mac Hoffman had two buckets, Ferguson scored twice inside and Wilson buried a three-pointer off a feed by Cox. The Army point guard had four of Army's 14 first-half assists on 19 made field goals.

Following a three-pointer by McBride, Army scored five more points, including a triple by Plomb, to extend its lead. Two free throws by McBride preceded another Emezie layup, before Plomb erupted for nine straight points for the Black Knights. A layup and two dunks, the second on a highlight-reel alley-oop off a lob by Larry Toomey, and a wide-open three put an exclamation point on Army's 29-5 run.

During the spurt, Army was 12-for-15 from the field and Army was up 38-13 with seven minutes to play as Gardner-Webb called its third timeout of the first half.

The visitors pulled back within 12 points late in the period, but Plomb's late trifecta put Army's halftime advantage at 45-30.

A three-pointer by Isaiah Ivey cut Army's lead to 11 points at the 14:23 mark of the second half, but again Plomb had an answer. Back-to-back threes kept him perfect from distance to that point (6-for-6) before Ferguson made a layup to push the lead to 19.

Gardner-Webb was within 14 points with 11 minutes remaining, but Adam Roe continued his hot shooting start to the season with a three-pointer from the top of the key.

GWU hung around and was able to cut Army's deficit to single digits (83-76) with a little more than two minutes to play. Plomb drained a three -pointer a minute later to push the lead back to 10.

With exactly a minute left, McBride went to the line and made two free throws. A turnover by Army led to a second-chance three-ball by McBride that quickly had Gardner-Webb within five (86-81) with 40 seconds on the clock. Plomb made one of two free throws before McBride got back to the line where he made two more to draw the visitors within four at 87-83 with 28 seconds to go. Another Army turnover led to an easy layup (87-85), before Wilson gave the ball away again and fouled LaQuincy Rideau with 11 seconds left.

Rideau had a chance to tie the game, but missed the second free throw and Ferguson was fouled with seven seconds to go. The senior center drained both of his foul shots and Gardner-Webb got the ball down by three. Wilson nearly stole a pass to end the game, but his momentum carried him out of play under the Army basket. After a brief discussion, one second was put on the clock and Gardner-Webb sent the game to overtime when Poston drained a deep three-pointer to tie the game at 89-89.

Poston connected on trey early in the overtime period to give Gardner-Webb its first lead since the 18:47 mark of the first half at 92-91. Army scored five of the next six points, including a three by Wilson (96-93) and never trailed from that point. Kennedy Edwards buried a gigantic corner three-pointer with 52 seconds left on a pass from Plomb after Gardner-Webb made it a two-point game on the previous possession.

A hot-shooting first 20 minutes gave the Army men's basketball team a 21-point halftime lead and it never looked back in an 84-71 victory over Maine at the Cross Insurance Center.

Kennedy Edwards registered a career-high 21 points to pace the Army offense, Kyle Wilson (17) and Tanner Plomb (13) joined him in double digits, while Kevin Ferguson tied a career-high with six blocked shots.

Army drained 12-of-34 three-point field goals, while limiting Maine to 2-for-16 from distance in the game. The Black Knights won the turnover battle (16-12) and outscored Maine in that department 21-8. The Black Bears outrebounded Army 50-42 and were plus-13 in second-chance points.

A furious pace to start the night saw Army secure a 19-11 lead after eight straight points. Edwards started the spurt with a bucket inside, before back-to-back transition threes by Adam Roe and Larry Toomey.

Maine came back with five points in a row, but Edwards got in on the three-point parade with a trifecta from the wing to make it 22-16.

Midway through the first half, Army extended its advantage to 12 (32-20) when Edwards hit a baseline jumper that forced a timeout by the Black Bears. That jumper followed a three by the Army junior and a strong drive and finish by Plomb. After the stoppage, Plomb hit a three-pointer to cap the 10-0 Army run.

Army continued to shoot the ball well from downtown as the lead ballooned to 21 points (45-24) with three-pointers by Wilson and Roe, and then a rainbow pullup two-point jumper from Plomb.

The Black Knights took a 50-29 lead into halftime as six different players made a three-pointer in the period. Army connected on 8-of-17 three-point attempts (47.1 percent) and 20-of-29 attempts overall (51.3 percent), while holding a plus-five margin in turnovers (12-7). Maine shot 41.9 percent in the opening half (13-of-31), but were 1-of-8 from distance.

Maine cut Army's lead to 16 by the first media timeout of the second half, but Army came back with threes by Edwards and Wilson, before a putback by Roe made it 67-43.

The visiting Black Knights led by as many as 25 points, before a 13-4 Maine run trimmed their lead to 15 points with five minutes left. An Army timeout halted the momentum briefly before a pair of Wilson free throws ended Maine's 18-4 run with 2:23 to play. Army led 80-67 at that point and walked away with the 13-point win.

Devine Eke led all scorers with 29 points and had a game-high 16 rebounds for Maine in the losing effort. Eke was 14-of-18 from the floor and scored a majority of his points in the paint.
