Joe Alberici enters his 11th season at the helm of the Army lacrosse program in 2016. Following in the footsteps of some of the biggest names in the history of the sport, Alberici roams the same sideline where Hall of Fame legends such as Jack Emmer, Ace Adams, Dick Edell and F. Morris Touchstone once tread.

A former assistant to Emmer, Alberici returned to the banks of the Hudson River after a nine-year stint as an assistant coach at Duke where he helped the Blue Devils tighten their grip as one of the nation's premier lacrosse programs.

Alberici became the 10th head coach in Army's storied 90-year history in 2006, and was tasked to fill the big shoes left by his mentor, Emmer, who retired as college lacrosse's all-time winningest coach in 2005.

Alberici led Army to its first-ever Patriot League tournament title in 2010, defeating Navy, 11-8, in the championship contest. The Black Knights, who compiled a 6-0 conference record during the regular season for the first time that spring, went on to upset No. 2-ranked Syracuse in the first round of the NCAA tournament. Alberici helped mold Garrett Thul '13 into the national Rookie of the Year in 2010 as the attackman set plebe records in goals and points. Thul joined Jeremy Boltus '11- Army's most recent first team All-American and 2013 Patriot League Offensive Player of the Year John Glesener as three of Alberici's most prized recruits as of late.

When it comes to Alberici producing successful cadet-athletes both on the field and in the classroom, the numbers speak for themselves. In just nine short years at the Academy, his players have earned a total of 21 All-America certificates. Alberici has also mentored eight Patriot League major award winners (Player of the Year, Defensive Player of the Year, Goalkeeper of the Year, Rookie of the Year), 73 Patriot League Honor Roll recipients, five Academic All-Americans, three Patriot League Scholar-Athletes of the Year and two Senior CLASS Award winners (Brendan Buckley, 2013; Andrew Maisano, 2010).

In addition, 11 of his players have been selected in the Major League Lacrosse draft. Alberici and the Black Knights continued their success in league play, making it to another Patriot League Tournament as the fifth seed in 2015.

2015, the Black Knights made an incredible run to the championship game with a 12-11 win in the final seconds at Loyola in the Patriot League Quarterfinals. Army West Point was down five with less than 12 minutes remaining and pulled off the win. The Black Knights went on to knock off top-seeded Navy on its home field to reach the title game against Colgate. Army West Point reached 10 wins for the second time unter Alberici and saw John Glesener, Sam Somers and Austin Schultz garner All-America honors from the USILA. Somers was named the 2015 Patriot League Goalkeeper of the Year after leading the conference in goals against average. The Black Knights also put 19 players on the Patriot League Honor Roll

A big reason for the overall record of 9-5 in 2014 was the defensive side of the field as the Black Knights were the top-ranked defensive unit in 2014, allowing 7.21 goals per game. Army faced three ranked teams during 2014 and all three games were decided by one goal, including games on the road against No. 2 Loyola and No. 5 Notre Dame. The Black Knights defeated Navy for the sixth-straight year as well. Alberici was named Patriot League Coach of the Year, while John Glesener and Sam Somers were first team All-Patriot League and voted as All-America selections. Twelve players were selected to the Patriot League Academic Honor Roll as well. In addition to the postseason honors, Pat Hart played in the North/South Game at the end of

the season.

As he has done every season at West Point, Alberici engineered a Patriot League Tournament berth for his Black Knights, who finished the year with an 8-6 mark. Army faced five nationally ranked teams and defeated Navy for a fifthstraight time in 2013. While Thul shattered Army's goal-scoring record in his final season, the Flemington, N.J., native also picked up All-America honors for a third time. Glesener and fellow senior Brendan Buckley were also named. With Buckley anchoring, the Black Knights ranked third in the nation in scoring defense, yielding 7.79 goals per game, at year's end. Alberici's emphasis on molding the true student-athlete was never more evident than in 2013. Ten players earned Patriot League Academic Honor Roll plaudits, while Buckley produced a laundry list of postseason academic and athletic awards to include Patriot League Defensive Player of Year, USILA Academic All-America, Capital One Overall Academic All-American of the Year, Patriot League Scholar-Athlete of the Year and the 2013 Senior CLASS Award. Thanks to the recent success of Buckley, Alberici has now mentored four of the Patriot League's last five Scholar-Athlete of the Year winners. In addition to Buckley's success, Thul became the third lacrosse player to win the prestigious Army Athletic Association Trophy, awarded annually to the top graduating male and female athletes. Drafted by the Hamilton Nationals of the MLL, Thul also embarked on his rookie NLL season with the Philadelphia Wings in 2013-14.

Army showed improvement from a 7-8 showing during a 2012 campaign that saw the Black Knights face seven nationally ranked opponents and reach No. 20 themselves. Army's 6-5 overtime win at then-No. 15 Bucknell halted the Bison's eight-game win streak. While the victory in Lewisburg, Pa., provided plenty of highlights, the apex of Army's season came courtesy of a 9-6 win over rival Navy on national television to clinch a Patriot League Tournament berth. Tim Henderson '12 garnered Patriot League Defensive Player of the Year honors following his final season. He went on to help the Long Island Lizards make a run in the MLL playoffs and joined Thul in earning All-America honors in 2012. Henderson and Thul headlined a group of five Black Knights to capture 2012 All-Patriot League honors. Following Army's 2012 Patriot League Tournament appearance, Alberici served as the North Team head coach at the annual USII A/I ax World North-South Senior All-Star game where he mentored Henderson, Devin Lynch '12 and Larry LoRusso '12 one last time.

In 2011, Alberici recorded his 50th victory at Army and mentored one of the most prolific feeders in the program's storied history. Jeremy Boltus '11 finished second on Army's all-time points (214) and assists (124) lists. The team captain became the second player in Army history to be one of five national finalists for the Tewaaraton Award, presented annually to the top player in college lacrosse, and the first Black Knight since 2005 to be named first team All-America, Boltus went on win the Army Athletic Association Award as his class' top male athlete and to enjoy a breakout campaign with the MLL's Hamilton Nationals. He led all rookies in scoring, nabbed MLL Rookie of the Year accolades and now plays for the Denver Outlaws.

With the tandem of Thul and Boltus firing on all cylinders, Alberici's sixth season at the helm saw the Black Knights defeat rival Navy at Navy-Marine Corps Memorial Stadium for the first time since 1997. The 14-9 comeback victory marked a third straight win over the Mids and fourth victory for the Class of 2011. Army, nationally ranked at the time, also clinched a Patriot League Tournament berth that afternoon and effectively eliminated Navy from the four-team playoff for

the first time in conference history. Army went on to finish the season with a 9-6 overall mark and ranked as high as No. 7 in the country. The Black Knights totaled five All-America certificates, three MLL draftees and produced a second team Academic All-America honoree.

Alberici was named the 2008 Patriot League Coach of the Year after leading Army to a 9-6 record, including a 5-1 conference mark which was good enough to clinch the Patriot League regular season title and top seed for the postseason tournament, hosted at Michie Stadium. Five Black Knights garnered All-Patriot League honors, including senior Adam Fullerton '08, who won his second-straight conference Goalkeeper of the Year award on his way to third-team All-America honors. Ranked as high as No. 8 during the season, Army finished the season No. 19 in the final USILA National Coaches Poll on the heels of a scoring defense that only allowed 7.13 goals per game, to rank sixth nationally.

In 2007, Alberici guided the Black Knights through a roller coaster season, highlighted by a 6-1 start and an upset of No. 2 Syracuse in the Carrier Dome that marked the first time the Orange had ever lost at home in February. Ranked as high as No. 8 in the national polls during the campaign, the Black Knights would go on to qualify for their third-straight Patriot League Tournament to finish the season. His stalwart defense allowed just four opponents to score over 10 goals en route to a 7.80 goals against average that ranked 10th in the country. Alberici also watched four of his players garner all-conference honors.

In his first season as head coach, Alberici led the Black Knights to their second-straight appearance in the Patriot League Tournament Championship game. Two of his players - attackman John Walker '06 and defenseman Matt Luyster '06- capped their Army careers with Honorable Mention All-America honors while leading the squad to its ninth-straight season with at least eight victories against one of the toughest schedules in the country.

Alberici's tenure at Duke coincided with the Blue Devils' rise to national prominence, which culminated in their magical run to the Division I title contest in 2005, a game in which they fell 9-8 to top-ranked Johns Hopkins. Ranked second in the nation behind the Blue Jays for much of the spring, Duke forged a remarkable 17-3 ledger and established an NCAA record for victories in a single season. Two of Duke's losses were one goal defeats at the hands of Johns Hopkins, including an 11-10 double-overtime loss at JHU's Homewood Field in early April.

Alberici's duties at Duke included recruiting director, assisting with the daily administration of the program, serving as the Blue Devils' defensive coordinator and coaching the team's goalkeepers.

After serving as offensive coordinator and working with Duke's man-up offense during his first eight years, he assumed the roles of defensive coordinator and coach of the mandown defense during his final season. He was promoted to associate head coach in 1999.

During Alberici's nine years on head coach Mike Pressler's staff, the Blue Devils forged a sparkling 96-47 (.671) record, made seven appearances in the NCAA Tournament-including a run of six-straight postseason trips between 1997 and 2002 - and captured a pair of Atlantic Coast Conference titles (2001 and 2002).

The Blue Devils reached the Final Four for the first time in 1997, Alberici's initial year in Durham, before embarking on their remarkable postseason run in 2005. Under Alberici's watchful eye, Duke ranked second in the nation in scoring defense, surrendering just 6.91 goals per game.

Alberici spent the 1995 and 1996 seasons at West Point as an assistant coach, and helped the Black Knights to a 10-5 showing and an NCAA appearance in 1996. Army won its final five games that season, including victories over Hofstra, Navy and Rutgers, to earn the Academy's 12th postseason berth.

A 1991 graduate of Alfred University, Alberici was a two-time lacrosse All-American in 1990 and 1991 and also garnered Academic All-America accolades as a senior. A four-year starter on attack, he set six school scoring records and led the Saxons to winning seasons in 1989, 1990 and 1991.

A three-time team captain, Alberici led the entire nation, including all three divisions, in assists as a junior, garnering 78 helpers in 17 contests for a 4.6 assist per-game average. In 2001, Alberici was inducted into Alfred's Hall of Fame. Following graduation, Alberici remained at his alma mater for two years in the role of graduate assistant coach, earning his master's degree in education in 1993.

He accepted his first head coaching assignment soon thereafter when he was named to the top post at SUNY Oneonta. In 1994, the Dragons forged an 8-6 record and established a single-season school record for victories, earning Alberici Empire Lacrosse League Coach of the Year laurels. It was on the heels of that spectacular season that Alberici made the move to West Point.

A native of Auburn, N.Y., Alberici was inducted into the Auburn High School Hall of Fame in 2008, joining his older brother, John and father, Gino, as enshrinees. In his present role as the face of Army's storied program, Alberici has assumed control of a club that remains intertwined with the rich history of collegiate lacrosse.

In 98 seasons, the Black Knights have amassed 759 victories, trailing only Johns Hopkins, Syracuse and Navy in all-time wins at the Division I level. Army has produced eight national champions, while 12 men associated with the program (eight players and four coaches) have been enshrined in the National Lacrosse Foundation Hall of Fame.

Alberici served a term as an assistant coach for the U.S. National Lacrosse Team at the 2010 World Lacrosse Championships in Manchester, England, helping the Americans to the gold medal. In 2007, he was also appointed to the United States Intercollegiate Lacrosse Association (USILA) Board of Directors, the sport's national governing body.


Currently, Alberici serves on multiple lacrosse committees around the country. He is a member of the Tewaarton Award selection committee, the USILA National Poll and Assistant Coach of the Year panel. He also serves on the US Lacrosse National Team coach selection committee.

Alberici and his wife, Petra, reside at West Point with their son, Maximus, and daughter,

PICKED TO FINISH FOURTH

The Patriot League announced its men's lacrosse preseason poll and all-league selections ahead of the 2016 season, and the Black Knights are selected to finish fourth in the conference. Army earned 85 points in the poll for fourth, while Loyola Maryland was picked to win the league with 122 points and 12-of-18 first-place votes. Navy was picked second after its strong showing last season as the Mids got 108 points and five top votes. The defending tournament champions, Colgate, came in at third with 105 points and took home a first-place nod.

STACKPOLE, GRABHER EARN WEEKLY HONORS

After downing UMass, Tim Stackpole and Dan Grabher were both honored with weekly awards by the Patriot League for their performances. Stackpole was named the Patriot League Defensive Player of the Week, while Grabher was selected as Faceoff Specialist of the Week. Stackpole had five caused turnovers in the win, and Grabher won 8-of-12 faceoffs and picked up five ground balls.

PLEBES LEAD THE WAY

Rookie Nate Jones was Army's top scorer in the season opener with two goals and an assist for three points, while AJ Barretto became the first rookie goalie to start a season opener since Rick Aguilar in 1991. Barretto stopped four shots in his debut.

PRESEASON HONORS

The Black Knights had two players earn preseason all-league recognition by the Patriot League. Firstie Austin Schultz and cow Cole Johnson were both selected to the Patriot League Preseason All-League Team. Schultz was 1-of-3 defensemen selected and he returns after a stellar junior season. Schultz was a United States Intercollegiate Lacrosse Association Honorable Mention All-American a season ago. Johnson is back as Army's top returning scorer after a career-high 53 points. He posted a team-high 36 goals and added 17 assists last year and was selected to the All-Patriot League First Team.

HOME COOKING

Army has a friendly home schedule for the opening portion of its schedule with six of its first eight games coming at West Point. The Black Knights will play a total

of eight games at home this season and six games on the road, including matchups against Syracuse and Notre Dame.

ALBERICI BACK ON SIDELINES

Head Coach Joe Alberici is back on the sidelines for his 11th season at the helm of Army Lacrosse. He is 84-69 since taking over at West Point. Alberici is eight wins away from No. 100 in his career after spending a season at SUNY Oneonta prior to moving to Duke as an assistant coach. Last season, Army won 10 or more games for the second time under Alberici and for the 18th time in program history.

STORIED PROGRAM

The Black Knights have continued their winning tradition throughout the years and currently rank fifth all-time in most wins at 759. Johns Hopkins tops the list at 955. Army has inched closer to Navy over the years and is 13 away from the Mids on the list as they have 772 all-time victories.

WHAT'S UP NEXT?

Army takes to the road for the first time this season with a visit to No. 5 Syracuse next Sunday at 4 p.m. The game will be carried live on ESPN3 at the Carrier Dome. The Black Knights played the Orange last season and fell 12-9 on Feb. 22, when Syracuse was ranked second in the nation

PATRIOT LEAGUE NETWORK

Army joined the Patriot League Network across all league sports in 2015-16, including lacrosse. This season will be the first where fans can view all men's lacrosse home games free of charge on PatriotLeague.

tv. Zack Daly has the call for all home contests. Fans can access the live video by logging onto PatriotLeague.tv or by clicking the live video link on the men's lacrosse schedule page.

ARMY ON TELEVISION

In addition to the webstreaming service on PatriotLeague.tv, the Black Knights will be featured three times on television. CBS Sports Network will carry the Army-Navy Game on April 16, and the matchup between the Black Knights and Loyola on April 22 at Ridley Athletic Complex. Army is to be featured once on the American Sports Network as the Black Knights head to Colgate for a faceoff on March 26. Also the semifinals and championship rounds of the Patriot League Tournament will be live on CBS Sports Network.

TEAM CAPTAINS

Army named its captains for this year's squad during last season's end of the year banquet. Shea Mullins, Austin Schultz and Jimbo Moore are this year's leaders.

BROTHERLY LOVE

The Black Knights welcomed 15 rookies to this year's squad and two of them had the Army perspective prior to stepping on campus. Griffin Schultz is a plebe on this year's team and is the younger brother of captain Austin Schultz. Patrick Poulos has even more experience as he is the brother of firstie Luke Poulos and 2010 West Point graduate Matthew Poulos. It is the second-straight season Army has had a pair of brothers on the team as the Gleseners played together in 2015 as did the two Faircloth brothers.

NEW LOOK

Army West Point Athletics introduced a new brand and identity system that sets the visual direction for years to come. With the goal of developing an innovative and consistent athletic identity that pays tribute to the Academy's legacy and tradition, U.S. Army and Academy leadership, Army West Point Athletics, Nike, current and former cadet-athletes, coaches, historians and West Point graduates, collaborated on a nearly 18-month brand evolution program. As part of the new identity, all 30 ath-



letic programs will showcase consistent logos, colors, lettering and numerals.

The primary mark, referred to as Athena's Shield, show-cases four unique components.

- The shield is among West Point's most potent symbols and represents the mission of the U.S. Army to support and defend the Constitution of the United States against all enemies, foreign and domestic.
- The helmet was worn by Pallas Athena, the Greek goddess of wisdom, just war, skill and justice. The helmet faces dexter, Latin for "right" from the viewpoint of the bearer of the field as opposed to sinister. The dexter side is considered the side of greater honor. The 13 segments that connect the helmet and the plume reference the 13 British colonies that declared independence from the Kingdom of Great Britain and became the first states in the Union.
- The sword, also known as Xiphos, is a double-edged, single-hand sword used by the ancient Greeks. It symbolizes the scholar-warrior and signifies protection, righteousness and justice. While the original 1898 USMA crest had the sword sheathed, the sword here is unsheathed to allow the viewer to see the martial elements of Army West Point, the warrior spirit, more clearly.
- The star has multiple meanings, including the connection to the U.S. Army and its storied past. During World War II, every tank, truck and airplane in the U.S. Army sported a star as they fought to victory in Europe and the Pacific. The star also represents the connection to the American people and 50 stars from the flag.

FACEOFF STABILITY

With the return of Alex Daly from injury, the Black Knights have one of the best 1-2 punches in nation with Daly and Dan Grabher. Daly is a two-time All-Patriot League player, while Grabher filled in for most of 2015 and had one of the best seasons in Army history. Grabher won 58 percent (157-271) of his faceoffs and scooped up 84 ground balls in 16 games. He became only the fifth player in school history with 20 faceoff wins in a game after going 20-for-25 against Loyola on March 14. Daly was at 55 percent (44-80) before his injury against Rutgers.

BIG SHOES TO FILL

Army has two large size shoes to fill this season with the graduation of three-time All-American John Glesener and 2015 Patriot League Goalie of the Year Sam Somers. Glesener ends a streak of pure goal scorers for Army dating back to Jeremy Boltus, who graduated in 2011. Over the past six-plus years, the Black Knights have had a scorer in Boltus, Garret Thul and Glesener. Army will also have to replace a defensive midfield group that was one of the best in Al DeStefano, Billy Baird and Jimbo D'Aprile.

GOOD THINGS COME IN SMALL PACKAGES

Senior Connor Cook has been one of the most consistent players on the Black Knights over the past two seasons. He returns as Army's second-leading scorer with 43 points on 35 goals and eight assists. Cook is a hard-nosed player that will go to the tough areas to put the ball in the back of the net. He was second on the squad in goals last year, including five against Bucknell. Cook had a total of seven points in the 12-4 win, which came the week of his father's passing.

ARMY GREATS TO ENTER IMLCA HALL OF FAME

The Intercollegiate Men's Lacrosse Coaches Association (IMLCA) has announced its inaugural Hall of Fame class and it features three former Army coaches in Jim "Ace" Adams, Dick Edell and Jack Emmer, which was the most of any school for this year's class. Former UMass coach Dick Garber was also among the first class of honorees. The inductees were selected by the IMLCA Hall of Fame Committee consisting of Tom Gill, U.S. Merchant Marine Academy (chair), Fred Acee (Air Force), Guy Van Arsdale (Jacksonville), Mike Murphy (Colgate), Dan Sheehan (Le Moyne), and Tom Leanos (Drew). The IMLCA Hall of Fame celebration will take place Saturday, May 28.

COMPETITIVE SCHEDULE

The Black Knights once again will play a tough schedule in 2016. Army is set to face three teams that made the NCAA Tournament a season ago in Colgate, Syracuse and Notre Dame. All three come away from West Point and as always the Army-Navy Game is as competitive as any game in the nation.

SCOUTING THE SCARLET KNIGHTS

Rutgers comes to West Point with a 1-0 record after downing St. John's in lopsided fashion with a 19-11 victory. The Scarlet Knights are returning eight of their starters from 2015 and only lost 10 letterwinners from a season ago. Head Coach Brian Brecht is back for his fifth season at the helm of Rutgers and he has an 87-87 career record as a head coach.

Senior captain Scott Bieda had a record-breaking day with nine points (five goals, four assists), and was named NCAA and Big Ten Offensive Player of the Week. Redshirt freshman Adam Charalambides scored six times in his career debut and was named Big Ten Freshman of the Week. Overall, the Scarlet Knights had eight different scorers against the Red Storm and Alex Schoen dominated in faceoffs, going 21-for-27 with four ground balls.

In net, Max Edelmann made his Rutgers debut with the start in goal, making nine saves to earn the win over St. John's.

SERIES HISTORY

The Army-Rutgers series goes back to 1923 and this will be the 79th meeting all-time between the two schools. Army holds a 56-21-1 advantage in the series after its 9-7 win over the Scarlet Knights last season in New Brunswick, N.J. Two seasons ago, Rutgers came to West Point and snapped a six-game losing streak against the Black Knights with a 9-8 overtime victory. It was the first win at Army since 1998.

SCOUTING THE KEYDETS

VMI makes the trip North to West Point for its second game of the weekend on Sunday. The Keydets travel to Saint Joseph's on Saturday to open their campaign under new head coach Jon Birsner. This year's roster is a young one for the visitors with 15 rookies and only six seniors.

The Keydets return their second-leading scorer in senior Dan Bull, who had 10 goals and six assists in 2015. Mike DeBlasio led the team with 17 points on 14 goals and three assists, but he was lost to graduation. Wesley Sanders is back for his second season after a rookie campaign of 14 points on nine goals and five assists. The Keydets will look for more experience at the faceoff with sophomore Nate Kraemer coming back after a rookie season of just under 100 faceoffs taken. Rookie Gordon Livermore will also be in the mix for the Keydets.

In goal, sophomores Joe Riccadonna and Logan Moore are both back and are the replacement for Evan Windisch, who graduated last spring. Riccadonna played in 10 games last season with two starts and had a 1-2 mark with a .388 save percentage. Moore saw action in three games in a reserve

WEST POINT, N.Y. – A smothering defense and a balanced scoring attack helped the Army lacrosse team earn a 9-5 win over UMass in its season opener on Friday afternoon at Michie Stadium.

Army (1-0) was led by rookie Nate Jones, who recorded three points on two goals and an assist. Cole Johnson and Ted Glesener contributed to the win with a goal and an assist each.

Rookie AJ Barretto earned the start to become the first rookie goalie to start an opener since Rick Aguilar in 1991. Barretto finished with only three saves as he got a lot of help from his defensive unit. The Army defense gave up only 16 shots and combined for nine caused turnovers. Tim Stackpole was all over the field and caused a career best five turnovers.

The Black Knights took the first lead of the game with a goal from Glesener scoring from the alley with an assist to Johnson. UMass answered on the next possession with Spencer getting the Minutmen on the board with 5:41 left in the opening quarter. Army regained the lead late in the frame with Shea Mullins tallying his first of the year with a nice individual effort to give the Black Knights a 2-1 lead at the end of one quarter.

Dalton MacAfee gave the Black Knights a 3-1 lead early in the second quarter with a shot that had eyes for the net. He was being checked as he let go of the shot and somehow he got it off. The ball went through traffic and bounced past Smith for his first collegiate goal.

The teams traded goals to end the second quarter as Jake Lisauskas cut the Army lead to one at 3-2 with 8:33 to go in the quarter. Dan Grabher fired back on the ensuing faceoff by winning it and going beating Smith to give Army its two-goal lead back at 4-2 at the half. The goal came 20 seconds after Lisauskas tally.

Jones gave Army a three-goal advantage early in the second half with his first of his career to make it a 5-2 game. UMass then went on a 3-0 run to tie the game at 5-5 with 14:04 left in the fourth quarter.

The Black Knights clamped down defensively for the final 14 minutes and scored the final four goals to earn the 9-5 victory. Moore and Jones got the run started with back-to-back tallies coming less than two minutes apart to regain the lead at 7-5. Conor Glancy and Cole Johnson finished off the game two tallies in the final two minutes and Army had a win in its second-straight season opener.

Army's dominance showed on the stat sheet with a 43-16 shot advantage. The Black Knights won the ground ball battle by a 39-25 margin.

Grabher was 8-for-12 at the faceoff, while Alex Daly made his return to the lineup after missing most of last season to injury and looked comfortable with five wins on six faceoffs.

Minutemen own the series lead at 14-11 after Army's win today ... Coach Alberici is 2-3 against the Minutemen ... Senior Sam Finney carried the flag on the field prior to the game in Army's traditional way of starting the game ... the five goals allowed were the lowest in a season opener since 2008 when Army defeated VMI 16-3 ... AJ Barretto was the first rookie goalie to start a season opener in net since Rick Aguilar '94 did in 1991 ... Aguilar made six stops in his debut ... Reaves Klipstein had a career-high seven ground balls ... Tim Stackpole had a career-best five caused turnovers as the LSM ... Dalton MacAfee, who also plays hockey at the Academy had a goal in his first career game ... a total of five rookies played in their first collegiate game on Friday ... the game was originally scheduled for Saturday, Feb. 13, but was moved to Friday due to cold temperatures expected.
