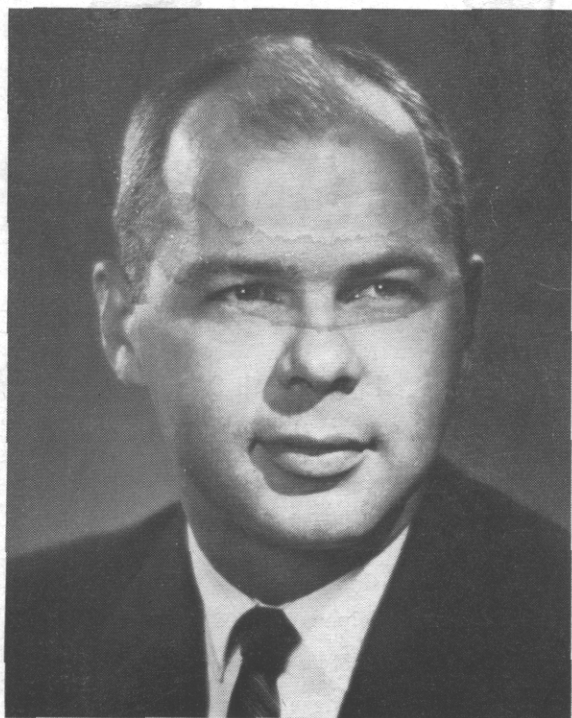

JIM "MOOSE" MALMQUIST

Head Football Coach—Athletic Director

Coach Jim Malmquist, commonly referred to as "Moose", came to Augustana College last spring from Texas Lutheran in Seguin, Texas. His hometown was Grand Rapids, Minnesota, in the middle of the Minnesota Iron Range, where he excelled as a high school football star; from here he stepped into the Minnesota Intercollegiate and led the Golden Gusties of Gustavus Adolphus to successive conference titles as a fullback. As a college senior Coach Malmquist was one of the Co-Captains of the Gusties along with again being chosen All-Conference.

"Moose's" coaching career began at Starbuck High School in Minnesota, thence to Hibbing Jr. College, followed by a three year stint as backfield coach at his old alma mater, Gustavus Adolphus. Malmquist moved to Texas Lutheran as head coach in 1959 and in three seasons made the Bulldogs a recognized small college independent in the State of Texas where they take their football seriously.

Coach Malmquist is ably aided by his wife Ann, who was his college sweetheart, along with four little Malmquists — Lori, age 8; Mike, age 7; Casey, age 5; and David, age 3.

VIRG SANDVIG

Backfield Coach

Started his coaching career in 1949 at Dell Rapids, where he remained for 9 years as the head coach in the three major sports; in 1958 he moved to Yankton College as Head Football Coach and Athletic Director, returning to his alma mater in March of 1960.

Virg spent three years in the Marine Corps during World War II as an enlisted man, participating in several of the South Pacific Island invasions.

Coach Sandvig received his B.A. from Augie in 1949 after lettering in both football and basketball for three years. His senior year he captained the Vikings playing both end and quarterback. Virg has a Master's Degree from the University of Minnesota and is married to the former Jan Westera of Sioux Falls. They have three children — Scott 9, Stacey 6 and Ann 4.

DAVE BOLSTORFF

Line Coach

Dave is 28 years old and joined the Viking coaching staff this fall. He also hails from Grand Rapids, Minnesota, on the Mesabi Range. After an illustrious athletic career in high school, Dave enrolled at the University of Minnesota where he spent one year participating in football and track. His final three years were spent at St. Olaf where he made All-Conference for three years at guard and also Williamson Little All-American.

Coach Bolstorff spent the next two years at St. Olaf as an Assistant Line Coach. Dave then entered the Seminary and was ordained a Lutheran minister. While at the Sem Dave coached at Minnehaha Academy a year and then played one season in the Pacific Coast Pro League while interning on the west coast. As an Assistant Pastor at Faribault, Minnesota, Dave continued actively as a coach at Faribault High School with the line.

Dave is ably aided by his wife Donna and their two months old son Peter.

KEN KESSINGER

Freshman Coach and Trainer

Coached five years at Chamberlain High School before returning to his alma mater in the fall of 1954. He was named "Coach of the Year" by a statewide sports publication in 1953.

Kess served as an officer in the Air Force during World War II in the European theatre.

Ken was a three sport man at Washington High School in Sioux Falls and also at Augustana College.

He received his B.A. Degree from Augustana in 1949 with a major in Physical Education. He has his Master's Degree from South Dakota State.

Coach Kessinger is married to the former Lila Strand of Sioux Falls and they have a son named Tom, age 10.

RETURNING LETTERMEN PLAYER SKETCHES

MEL ANDERSON No. 66 Senior 215 lbs.

A regular guard in 1961 who traps well and is one of the better linebackers in the North Central Conference. Mel hails from Fairmont, Minnesota and is majoring in Physical Education.

ORRIN ANDERSON No. 64 Senior 205 lbs.

Running mate at guard with Mel Anderson, he is another Minnesota product from Hardwick, Minnesota who played high school football at Luverne. Orrin was elected Co-Captain by his teammates last spring. He works in the summer and part time during the school term for the Northwest Security National Bank. He is a Business Administration major.

CHRIS HAGEN No. 88 Junior 202 lbs.

Regular tackle in 1961, but was moved to end last spring due to the graduation of three letterwinners at that position. The type of boy who can play any position on the team. Chris is the son of a former Viking Letterman, Dr. Clarence Hagen from LeMars, Iowa. Chris is an "A" student majoring in Political Science. He was married this past summer.

LES JOSEPHSON No. 38 Junior 205 lbs.

Alternated at fullback with Fred Hecker in 1961. Les is from Minneota, Minnesota and made the transition from 8 man football exceptionally well. He loves contact and has excellent speed and agility. He is majoring in Physical Education and is married. There is a great deal of similarity between this athlete and Hagen in that both can play anywhere on the team.

TED KESSINGER No. 50 Senior 208 lbs.

Regular center as a junior, this Sioux Falls Washington athlete is a bruising linebacker who is also a very capable defensive end. He loves to hit and is very strong. Ted is majoring in Physical Education and plans to coach upon graduation. He is a student of football.

ROLAND LARSON No. 11 Junior 170 lbs.

Former 1st team All-State Class AA quarterback from Rapid City. Played a great deal of defense as a Sophomore and could see considerable action on offensive this year. He is a tremendous leader and never gives out less than 100 per cent. He is majoring in Physical Education and plans a coaching career.

RETURNING LETTERMEN PLAYER SKETCHES

RON MITCHELL No. 12 Senior 190 lbs.
Regular quarterback in 1961, Ron played as a regular his sophomore year on defense and played both ways last season. He led the squad in total offense in 1961 gaining 720 yards in 141 plays. He also was the leading passer completing 43 out of 87 for 627 net yards and three touchdowns.

MICHAEL NELSON No. 82 Junior 190 lbs.
Alternated at left end with graduated Glen Rames last fall, and is a firm bet to hold down a starting end in 1962. Mike will be one of the smallest linemen on the squad but has two outstanding qualities—defensive toughness and offensive pass catching ability. He played his high school football at Lennox, South Dakota.

DOYLE SCHULER No. 42 Senior 194 lbs.
This former All-State eight man grid star from Granada, Minnesota is probably the top football player in the squad. He can play any backfield position and excel. At the moment, it appears he will be the starting right half-back this fall. Doyle is majoring in Art with his ultimate goal Architecture.

DUANE TAUER No. 15 Junior 195 lbs.
A former All-State quarterback from Morgan, Minnesota who is the best passer on the squad. He had the misfortune of having a leg injury last fall which held him back from playing more. Duane is majoring in Physical Education.

DOUG WRAY No. 24 Senior 192 lbs.
Elected Co-Captain with Orrin Anderson for 1962, this Cherokee, Iowa power back has the strength and speed to punish the defense. He was the leading scorer in 1961 with 9 touchdowns and 6 points on extra point conversions. He also led the squad in rushing and pass receiving. Doug is majoring in Mathematics.
