

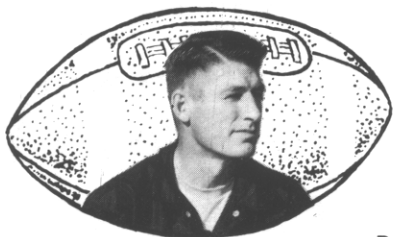

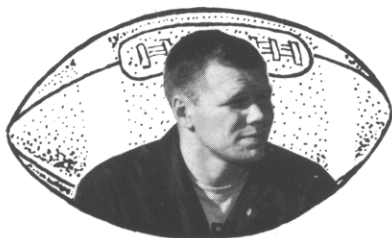

JIM "MOOSE" MALMQUIST

ATHLETIC DIRECTOR - HEAD FOOTBALL COACH

Coach Jim Malmquist will be starting his twelfth year of coaching, his third at Augustana and his sixth as a college head coach. He moved to Augie from Texas Lutheran where he had been head coach for three seasons.

"Moose" began his coaching career at Starbuck High School in Minnesota, thence to Hibbing Junior College for two years, followed by a three year stint as backfield coach at his alma mater, under his old college coach, Lloyd Hollingsworth of Gustavus Adolphus. He was one of the co-captains of the Gusties in his undergraduate playing days along with being chosen an All-Conference Back during the hey day of Gustavus football. "Moose" led the Golden Gusties of Gustavus Adolphus to successive conference titles in the Minnesota Intercollegiate Conference from 1949 to 1952.

Coach Malmquist married the former Ann Storholm of Minneapolis who was his college sweetheart. Their family consists of three fullbacks and a cheerleader; Lori is 10, Mike is 9, Casey 7 and David 5.

VIRG SANDVIG

Backfield Coach

Virg coached for 9 years at Dell Rapids High School and in 1958 moved to Yankton College as Head Football Coach and Athletic Director. He returned to his alma mater in March of 1960 and spent two years as line coach and the last two as backfield coach.

After graduating from Washington High School and lettering in four sports, Virg spent three years in the Marine

Corps during World War II as an enlisted man, participating in several of the South Pacific Island invasions.

Coach Sandvig received his B.A. from Augustana in 1949 and his Master's Degree from the University of Minnesota in 1957. He is married to the former Jan Westra of Sioux Falls and they have three children, Scott 11, Stacey 8, and Ann 6.

DAVE BOLSTORFF

Line Coach

Coach Dave is the youngest member of the Viking Coaching Staff. He is also Head Wrestling Coach at Augustana. Like Head Coach Jim Malmquist, Dave hails from Grand Rapids, Minnesota. Dave spent his freshman year in college at the University of Minnesota and his final three years at St. Olaf where he made All-Conference honors at Guard as well as Williamson Little All-American.

Dave is ably aided by his wife Donna and their 2 year old son Peter and 3 month old Gretchen.

KEN KESSINGER

Freshman Coach and Trainer

Coached five years at Chamberlain High School before returning to his alma mater in the fall of 1954. He was named "Coach of the Year" by a statewide publication in 1953.

Kess served as an officer in the Air Force during World War II in the European Theatre.

Ken was a three sport man at Washington High School in Sioux Falls and also at Augustana College. He received his B.A. Degree from Augustana in 1949 with a major in physical education. He has his Master's Degree from South Dakota State.

Coach Kessinger is married to the former Lila Strand of Sioux Falls and they have a son Tom, age 12.

BRIEF PLAYER SKETCHES

Duane Bergdale, 6-0, 225 pound sophomore center from Annandale, Minnesota...started on last year's frosh team and was impressive in the spring game on defense.

James Breit, 5-10, 165 pound sophomore quarterback from Sioux Falls who is an all-around athlete that is playing a new position in college after playing right half in high school.

Dave Damgaard, 5-10, 175 pound junior halfback from Sioux Falls caught three passes for 105 yards in 1963, two of which netted 6 points. Dave will see a great deal of action this year on both offense and defense.

Dave Doolittle, 5-11, 189 pound sophomore fullback who will be used primarily on defense this year. This Winnebago, Minnesota athlete will back up Mark Osthus at fullback.

Jerry Enns, 5-10, 187 pound junior halfback from Mountain Lake, Minnesota is one of the key members of the Vikings this fall. His talent will be used on both offense and defense. Jerry is probably the most complete football player on the squad.

Paul Evans, 6-3, 218 pound sophomore tackle from Sioux Falls could break into the starting line-up early. Paul lacks only experience because he has the strength and agility to be an excellent tackle.

Jerry Gubbrud, 5-11, 228 pound senior center from Canton who will be seeking his third varsity letter as a Viking. This individual is one of the leaders of the squad.

Bill Hahn, 5-9, 180 pound senior halfback from Sioux Falls was a starter in both 1962 and 1963 as a defensive halfback. Bill missed the last four games of 1963 due to a broken arm suffered in the St. Norbert's game.

LeRoy Halstenson, 6-2, 206 pound junior tackle from Sioux Falls who has the ability to play end or tackle. LeRoy started as a sophomore and never missed a contest in the 10 game schedule.

Paul Haugh, 5-10, 173 pound sophomore halfback from Faribault, Minnesota was the most impressive halfback on last year's freshman team. Paul is an excellent tackler.

Chuck Hazlett, 6-0, 180 pound sophomore guard from Fowler, Colorado. Chuck can add needed depth to the Vikings at center, guard, or tackle.

Duane Jagodzinske, 6-0, 199 pound sophomore fullback from Welcome, Minnesota who Coach Malmquist will probably make into a defensive specialist during his first varsity year. Jag is a very coachable boy who should play a great deal before his career is over.

Les Klemt, 6-1, 190 pound senior guard from Oak Park, Illinois has failed to letter, but has added some weight which should help him this fall.

James Knutson, 5-8, 155 pound sophomore halfback from Veblen, South Dakota is an excellent pass defender. Jim is also a very good offensive running back. He just lacks size and speed.

Ron Krosschell, 6-2, 211 pound senior guard from Jackson, Minnesota will be seeking his second varsity letter. Ron will be the leading candidate at the right guard position this fall.

Dan Larson, 6-1, 194 pound sophomore end from LeRoy, Minnesota has made himself known to the coaching staff by always giving 100 per cent regardless of whether he is on offense or defense.

George Lewis, 6-0, 200 pound senior halfback from Edgemont, South Dakota averaged 4.0 yards per carry as a sophomore and 4.2 yards as a junior. George was the fourth leading ball carrier for the Vikings as a sophomore and third last year. He will be at left halfback this fall.

Dean Libra, 5-9, 167 pound junior halfback from Jackson, Minnesota will see considerable action this fall. Dean caught five passes for 63 yards as a sophomore.

Uno Markin, 5-9, 202 pound sophomore tackle from Gothenburg, Nebraska lacks experience, but is eager to learn. He improved a great deal from last fall and spring.

Ron Mickelberg, 6-3, 232 pound junior tackle from Detroit Lakes, Minnesota was a starter all last year as a sophomore. Ron is one of the better tackles in the North Central.

William Mohr, 6-1, 190 pound junior guard from Luverne, Minnesota is another regular lineman of Coach Bolstorff's who started last season as a sophomore.

Roger Nelson, 6-4, 245 pound sophomore tackle from Benson, Minnesota is the biggest man on the squad. Rog should add some very competent depth to the tackle corps.

Mark Osthus, 5-10, 196 pound sophomore fullback from Beresford, South Dakota, should be the starting fullback. Mark is an outstanding running back who can consistently eat up the yards.

Tom Peterson, 6-1, 219 pound sophomore guard from Richfield, Minnesota missed spring ball due to a knee operation. This fact sets Tom back somewhat in his development, however, he should catch up with the rest by mid-season.

Harold Pierce, 6-1, 187 pound senior right end from Freeborn, Minnesota attended his first two years of college at Waldorf. Harold is an excellent pass receiver and began to show improvement as an offensive blocker and defensive end last fall.

Gary Pressler, 6-1, 192 pound junior quarterback from Selby, South Dakota will receive his chance to lead the Vikings this fall after playing mostly defensive safety as a sophomore. Both Tauer and Larson, last fall's quarterbacks have graduated, so Gary must fill their shoes.

Tom Roskens, 6-2, 218 pound senior tackle from Spencer, Iowa is another returning letterman at tackle - that gives the Vikings their strongest position.

Jack Ruff, 6-2, 195 pound senior end from Nisland, South Dakota, lettered as a sophomore, but concentrated on basketball as a junior. Jack was impressive in spring ball and should start at one end.

Jim Silliman, 6-2, 209 pound sophomore tackle from Windom, Minnesota is one of the most conscientious boys on the squad. Jim has a great deal of determination and wants to play.

Jay Smith, 6-1, 155 pound sophomore end from Sioux Falls needs more weight but does not lack hustle and desire.

Don Smith, 5-10, 205 pound junior guard from Madison, Minnesota was moved this last spring from center to guard. The transition to a different position has helped Don a great deal. He is a very sound linebacker and blocker.

Jim Stearns, 6-2, 180 pound junior end from Hutchinson, Minnesota does all the punting for the Vikings. He shared the punting chores with Hagen last fall, but will be the mainstay in this department this fall. Jim is also an excellent defensive end and pass receiver.

Bruce Thorkelson, 6-0, 182 pound junior center from Maynard, Minnesota was injured during spring practice, but will be back again this September healthy. Bruce is a hitter and one of the best liked boys on the squad.

Tom Urevig, 5-11, 189 pound junior quarterback from Lewisville, Minnesota is a Waldorf Junior College transfer who was a teammate of Pierce. Tom is an excellent passer which is one of the reasons he was chosen as an All-American Junior College Quarterback.

Tom Vander Heiden, 5-10, 189 pound sophomore from Sioux Falls will push anyone that is playing ahead of him. Tom is a competitor who excels on defense.

Pete Van Vooren, 6-1, 226 pound junior from Lake Benton, Minnesota who played tackle last year and was moved to end this spring. Pete has all the attributes to be an outstanding college football player.
