## Don Coryell (1961-72)



**Aztec Coaching Legend &  
1999 College Football Hall of Fame Inductee**

In 1961, San Diego State College director of athletics Bill Terry hired a little-known assistant from USC to take over as head coach of the Aztec football team. Twelve years later, Donald David Coryell left Montezuma Mesa for the National Football League, having made an indelible impact upon the San Diego State athletic program, upon the campus, on the San Diego community and, maybe most importantly, on college football.

There are many reasons why the College Football Hall of Fame voted Don Coryell into its hallowed membership in 1999.

In the first place, Coryell, who had previously been a head coach at Whittier

College, was a winner throughout his career. At San Diego State, he compiled an astounding 104-19-2 record, capturing two national college division championships along the way. During his dozen seasons at SDSU, the team posted winning streaks of 31 and 25 games and in only one season did the squad lose more than twice. In 1966 and 1969, the Aztecs completed unbeaten and untied campaigns. San Diego State secured three bowl victories during Coryell's tenure.

It was Coryell who was the driving force in San Diego State's efforts to move from an NCAA college division (Division II) to a university division (Division I) program, a move that was brought to fruition in 1969.

Apart from his record or the 42 players who were drafted by the NFL during his tenure, Coryell had his greatest impact in bringing the modern passing game to college football. He was the first collegiate coach to make the commitment to the forward pass as the base component of an offensive scheme and use it as the means to be successful. Coryell's "passing tree", with numerically assigned routes, simplified the teaching aspect of his system in coordinating pass patterns for quarterbacks and receivers.

He went on to coach for nine years in the NFL (St. Louis Cardinals and San Diego Chargers) and remains the only coach to win 100 games at both the collegiate and professional levels.

Don Coryell was formally inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame in South Bend, Ind., on Aug. 12-13, 1999, joining former player Fred Dwyer, who was enshrined in 1997. SDSU also gave recognition to him at the school's Homecoming game vs. New Mexico on Oct. 9, 1999.

The first Aztec inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame was George Brown, who played for the Aztecs in 1947 and later spent 15 years as the San Diego State team doctor.

## Aztec First-Team All-Americans

### Henry Allison

**All-American (1970 *The Sporting News*, *Time Magazine*, *Newspaper Enterprise Association*)**

Played two seasons at San Diego State after transferring from College of Sequoias where he also lettered twice ... He anchored the offensive line that set the record for points in a season (44.9 per game) at the guard position ... Received first team All-American Honors in 1970, his last year at SDSU ... Was drafted in the fifth round by the Philadelphia Eagles and finished his five-year NFL career with St. Louis and Denver.

### Willie Buchanon

**All-American (1971 *The Sporting News*, *Time Magazine*, *Newspaper Enterprise Association*)**

A two-year letterwinner at San Diego State (1970 and 1971) and a team captain his senior season ... Earned most valuable player honors in the 1971 East-West Shrine All-Star Game ... He also played in the Coaches All-America Game and College All-Star Game ... Had five interceptions as a senior, the most on the team and the fifth highest total in the PCAA ... Also punted 39 times for a 36.5 yard average, the fifth best mark in the PCAA ... Selected as the cornerback on *The Sporting News* all-time college team ... First round draft choice by the Green Bay Packers in 1972 ... Played for seven seasons with the Packers before ending his professional career ... Named NFL Defensive Rookie of the Year in 1972 ... Charter member of the Aztec Hall of Fame (1988) ... Also inducted into the Packers Hall of Fame (1993) and San Diego Hall of Champions (1994).

### John Butler

**Little All-American (1935 *Little All-American*)**

The first Aztec football player to receive national recognition ... A three-year letterwinner (1933, 34, 35), Butler earned All-America accolades in 1935 ... Played both ways, as a pulling guard on offense and a linebacker on defense ... Voted to the all-conference team all three seasons ... Served as the mayor of San Diego from 1951 to 1955 ... Member of the Aztec Hall of Fame.

### Fred Dryer

**All-American (1968 *Little All-American*)**

A two-year letterwinner and starter at San Diego State (1967, 1968) who helped guide the Aztecs to a 19-1-1 record during his tenure ... Played 13 seasons in the National Football League for the New York Giants and the Los Angeles Rams ... A two-time Pro Bowl selection, Dryer anchored a defensive line that led the Rams to an appearance in Super Bowl XIX ... Following his football career, had a successful acting career, starting in the long-run-

ning television series "Hunter" and later starting his own production company ... Inducted into the Aztec Hall of Fame in 1988 and the College Football Hall of Fame in 1997.

### John Duich

**All-American (1938 *Little All-American*)**

Played three seasons (1936, 37, 38) ... Was captain and most valuable player on the 1938 team ... Played professional football for the Los Angeles Bulldogs.

### Steve Duich

**All-American (1967 *Little All-American*)**

A two-year letterwinner and starter at San Diego State (1966, 1967) who helped guide the Aztecs to a 21-1 record during his stay on the Mesa ... Anchored the offensive line that averaged 29.2 points and 355.7 yards of offense in 10 games ... In his All-America season, the Aztecs averaged nearly four yards per rush with four players gaining more than 280 yards rushing during the season ... Selected in the fifth round of the NFL Draft by the Green Bay Packers ... Son of Aztec All-American John Duich

### Lloyd Edwards

**Little All-American (1968 *Little All-American*)**

Lettered in 1967 and 1968 at San Diego State, helping the Aztecs to a 19-1-1 record in his two seasons ... Earned All-America honors as a senior in 1968 ... Second leading rusher on the '67 squad, with 442 yards rushing on 71 carries for an impressive 6.2 yards per carry ... Followed that up with an 809-yard rushing campaign in 1968, carrying 178 times for a 4.5 rush average ... Also had seven rushing touchdowns in his All-American campaign ... He had three rushing touchdowns and was not stopped for a loss in any of his 71 carries ... Selected in the third round of the NFL Draft by the Oakland Raiders in 1969.

### Marshall Faulk

**Three-Time All-American (1991 *Associated Press*, *The Sporting News*; 1992 *Consensus*; 1993 *Consensus*)**

Three-time All-American (1991, 92, 93), two-time unanimous consensus All-American (1992, 93) ... Led the nation in rushing as a freshman in 1991 with 1,429 yards and in 1992 as a sophomore with 1,630 yards ... Despite playing just three collegiate seasons, ranks 21st all-time with 4,557 yards rushing ... fifth player in NCAA history and first since Cornell's Ed Marinaro in 1970-71 to record back-to-back rushing titles ... Only player among the top 25 all-time NCAA rushers with fewer than 800 carries ...

Other NCAA Division IA career ranks include: 1st in points per game (12.1), 3rd in career points (376), sixth in rushing yards per game (148.0), sixth in career rushing touchdowns (57) and seventh in all-purpose yardage per game (180.5) ... Finished in the top nine of the Heisman Trophy balloting in all three of his seasons, including second in 1992 and fourth in 1993 ... Career totals included school-record 766 carries for 4,589 yards and 57 touchdowns ... Rushed for at least 100 yards in 23 of his 32 career outings ... Posted seven 200-yard games and two 300-yard games ... Rushed 201 times for 1,429 yards and 21 touchdowns in 1991 to become first freshman in NCAA history to lead nation in scoring (15.6 ppg) and rushing (158 ypg.) ... Set a career high and then-NCAA freshman record with 386 rushing yards and seven touchdowns on 37 carries vs. Pacific in second collegiate game ... Recorded four NCAA freshman records and tied Emmitt Smith for earliest game for freshman to surpass 1,000 yards by doing so in seventh game ... Second overall pick by Indianapolis in 1994 NFL Draft ... A seven-time NFL Pro Bowl selection, he earned league most valuable player honors in 2000 ... Won the world championship with St. Louis in Super Bowl XXXIV on Jan. 30, 2000.

### Gary Garrison

**Little All-American (1964 *Little All-American*)**

A two-year letterwinner for the Aztecs (1964, 65) ... Set San Diego State records with 26 career touchdown receptions and 1,272 receiving yards in 1964 ... Was the first Aztec player to participate in the East-West Shrine Game ... Drafted in the first round of the 1965 futures draft by the San Diego Chargers ... A two-time Pro Bowl selection (1971, 73) ... Inducted into the Aztec Hall of Fame in 1988.

### Don Horn

**Little All-American (1966 *Little All-American*)**

A two-year player at San Diego State (1965, 66), he produced a remarkable senior season ... Led the Aztecs to a perfect 10-0 mark by passing for 2,234 yards, completing 134-of-253 passes (50.9 percent) ... He also threw for 18 touchdowns and rushed for three more ... Led an offense that averaged 28.9 points and 426.6 yards per game ... One of eight Aztec players taken in the 1967 draft, he was selected in the first round by the Green Bay Packers.



## Mike Malano

**All-American (1999 Football Writer's Assoc.)**

A four-year letterwinner, Malano earned All-America honors as a senior by the Football Writer's Association ... All-Mountain West Conference first-team choice as a senior ... Started every game at center, recording 30 knockdowns while not allowing a quarterback sack for the entire season ... Helped an offense that generated 373.3 yards per game... Had a season-high five knockdowns as the team gained 414 total yards vs. South Florida (9/4) ... Instrumental in helping the Aztecs pick up 572 total yards vs. Kansas (9/25) ... ## Dr. Stephen L. Weber - University President



Stephen L. Weber, the seventh president of San Diego State University, provides dynamic leadership to an institution that ranks among the largest in the nation and third-largest in California. Educated as a philosopher, President Weber began his tenure at SDSU in July 1996 and shortly afterward initiated a broad-based dialog intended to set the course for the university's future.

Under President Weber's guidance, students, faculty, staff, alumni and community leaders participated in shaping this "Shared Vision." SDSU is now moving boldly ahead toward goals set by those discussions: reinforcing academic excellence, nurturing students, honoring diversity and social justice, carefully stewarding resources and further developing global programs.

In the process, SDSU has become an increasingly popular and selective choice among college-bound students. For fall 2003, SDSU has received more than 39,000 undergraduate applicants for 7,283 vacancies. Not surprisingly, the overall academic quality of SDSU students is also rising. In addition, alumni involvement and private financial support of the university have never been stronger.

A champion of community involvement as well as academic excellence, President Weber has been an advocate for community service.

Leading by example, he is immediate past chair of the American Association of State Colleges and Universities Board of Directors and co-chairs Partners for K-12 School Reform. He also serves on the boards of governors of The Peres Center for Peace and the San Diego Foundation, and on the boards of directors of the San Diego Regional Economic Development Corporation, the San Diego Science and Technology Council, and the California Healthcare Institute.

In addition, President Weber is a member of the international advisory board for the Foundation for Children of the Californias, the advisory council of the San Diego Performing Arts League, and co-chair of the Technology, Entrepreneurship and Management Advisory Council.

He is a member of the San

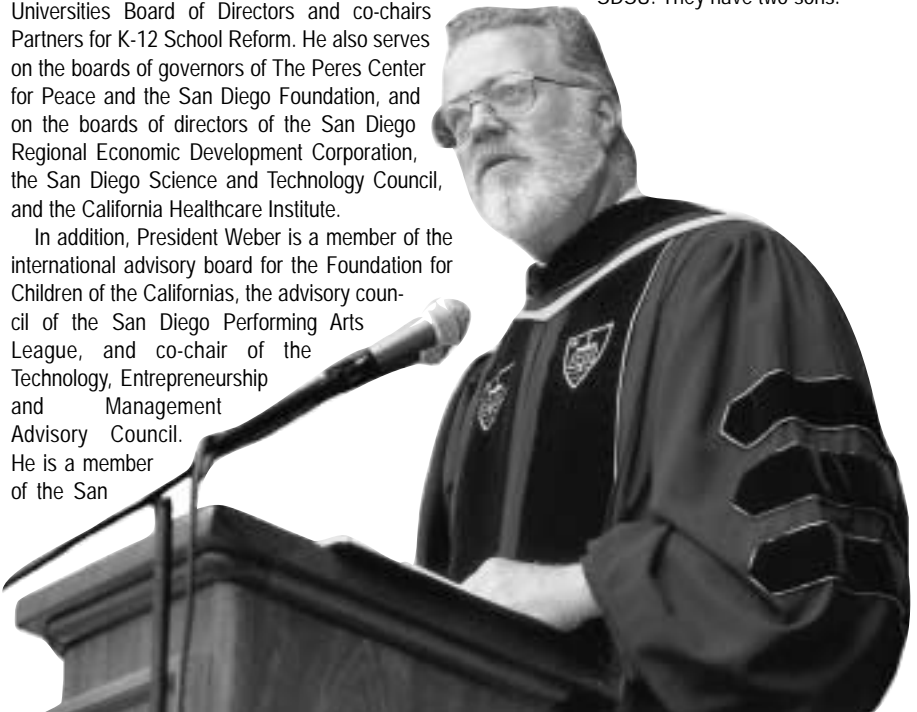
Diego Rotary Club, an honorary director of the Japan Society of San Diego and Tijuana, and a member of the advisory board for Bahcesehir University in Turkey.

Born in Boston, President Weber is a graduate of Bowling Green University with a B.A. in philosophy. He received his Ph.D. in philosophy from the University of Notre Dame in 1969 and is the author of numerous articles on philosophy and higher education.

President Weber's many awards include an honorary degree from Beijing Capital Normal University. He was named among the 1997 Headliners of the Year by the San Diego Press Club. Also in 1997, the San Diego Mediation Center honored him with its Peacemaker Award. In 1999, President Weber received the Executive Director's Award from the San Diego Education Association and the Gold Key Award from the San Diego Hospitality Association. He was recognized as a Leader of Vision by the League of Women Voters of San Diego in 2000.

Before coming to San Diego State University, President Weber served as interim provost of the State University of New York (SUNY). He also served seven years as president of the SUNY Oswego campus. Prior to that he was vice president of academic affairs at St. Cloud State University in Minnesota, dean of arts and sciences at Fairfield University in Connecticut, and assistant to the president of the University of Maine. While a faculty member at the University of Maine, he was recognized as the outstanding professor in humanities.

President Weber is married to Susan Keim Weber, who shares his enthusiastic commitment to SDSU. They have two sons.

Gene Bartow, one of the most respected and experienced figures in intercollegiate athletics, joined the San Diego State administration in June of 2003 to serve as the interim athletics director. He oversees the day-to-day operations of the athletic department and will run the Aztec operation until October.

Bartow returned to the NCAA ranks after taking a leave of absence from the Memphis Grizzlies, where he served as a special advisor and was involved in the basketball and business operations, as well as special projects. He will return to his position with the Grizzlies in October.

Bartow is a legendary figure in Memphis, stemming from his days as head basketball coach at Memphis State. He led the Tigers to the 1973 national-championship game. He is also the former head coach at UCLA, Illinois, Valparaiso, Central Missouri State and Alabama-Birmingham. In his coaching career, Bartow made two trips to the Final Four, three regional-final appearances and participated in 12 NCAA Tournaments.

He coached at UCLA for two seasons and posted a 52-9 record while following in the footsteps of John Wooden. He led the 1976 Bruins to the Final Four just three years after coaching Memphis State to the championship game.

When he retired from coaching, he left the game with 647 victories to rank 17th all-time in that category.

"We are pleased and fortunate to have someone as accomplished and skilled as Mr. Bartow assume interim leadership of our athletic program," said San Diego State President Dr. Stephen L. Weber. "He brings everything we could possibly ask for in expe-

rience and eagerness. He is an accomplished leader who will serve our student-athletes, our coaches, our staff and our fans well."

Despite his success on the hardwood, Bartow's greatest achievement may have come as an administrator. He is considered the "Father of Athletics" at Alabama-Birmingham, where he built the Division I athletic program. Bartow served as athletic director at the school from 1977-2000 and for 18 years he served as the athletic director as well as head basketball coach. He led the UAB athletic department through three league changes and eventually into Conference USA prior to his retirement.

Under his direction, the UAB athletic program grew to 17 sports with more than 400 student-athletes.

Bartow is a member of five hall of fames, including the Alabama Sports Hall of Fame, the Missouri Sports Hall of Fame and the Northeast Missouri Athletic Hall of Fame. In addition, the UAB arena is now known as Bartow Arena. The facility at St. Charles High School (Mo.), which Bartow coached to the 1957 state championship, plays its games in Gene Bartow-Ernie Hedge Gymnasium.

Bartow was named by the *Birmingham News* as one of the 10 most influential sports figures in Alabama for the past century.

"San Diego State has state-of-the-art facilities, a large base of alumni and an exciting cadre of coaches who have their programs on the right track," Bartow said. "My goal is to help this department run as smoothly as possible."

Bartow and his wife, Ruth, have three children and six grandchildren.

# Aztec Athletic Compliance



## What Boosters Need to Know About NCAA Rules and Regulations

San Diego State University and the Department of Athletics are genuinely grateful for your support of Aztec Athletics. Although there are restrictions regarding your involvement with student-athletes, you can help assure compliance with NCAA rules and regulations by becoming familiar with the following information that applies to you when interacting with student-athletes or prospective student-athletes. The eligibility of SDSU student-athletes depends greatly upon your understanding of these rules.

NCAA Bylaw 13.01.5.1: In Division I, representatives of an institution's athletics interests are prohibited from making in-person, on- or off-campus recruiting contacts, or written or telephonic communications with a prospect or the prospect's relatives or legal guardians.

### Remember, As a Booster You May Not:

- Be involved in the recruitment of a student-athlete.
- Provide any benefit, inducement or arrangement such as cash, clothing, equipment, cars, transportation, gifts, or loans to a prospective or current student-athlete.
- Engage in any conversation more than a "hello" with a prospective student-athlete, his/her parents or guardians.
- Make in-person recruiting contacts with a prospect, his/her parents or guardians.
- Make telephone calls or write letters to a prospect, his/her parents or guardians.

### Who Are Representatives or Boosters?

**You are considered a booster or representative of SDSU if:**

- You have made financial contributions to any organization which promotes Aztec Athletics - Aztec Athletic Foundation, Big 50, Big 64, or the RBI Club, etc.
- You are a member of an organization that promotes an athletic team.
- You have assisted in the recruitment of a student-athlete.
- You have employed a student-athlete.
- You have assisted in a student-athlete in locating a job.
- You have provided assistance or a benefit to a student-athlete or their family.

Once you are an SDSU booster, you will forever be known as a "SDSU booster."

### Who Are Prospective Student-Athletes?

**A student-athlete is considered to be a prospective student-athlete if:**

- He/She is enrolled in the ninth grade or above.
- He/She is enrolled in a two-year college.
- He/She has officially withdrawn from a four-year institution.
- He/She was recruited by a staff member or representative of athletics interests.

### Boosters and Job Programs

If you are interested in employing any student-athlete, you must first contact the Athletics Compliance Office to follow proper hiring procedures. Please contact the Athletics Compliance Office for more information at (619) 594-0394.

- You must complete an Athletics Department form prior to employment.
- Your employment records will be subject to spot checks by the Athletics Department Compliance Office.
- You may only pay for the work actually performed.
- You may pay only the going rate in that locality for similar services.
- You may not provide transportation to and from the job site unless the employer transports all employees.

### Extra Benefits

A staff member or booster may not offer or provide any benefits to a prospect or the prospect's relatives or friends other than those expressly permitted by NCAA legislation. An extra benefit is any special arrangement to provide a student-athlete or the student-athlete's relatives or friends a benefit which is not available to the general student body.

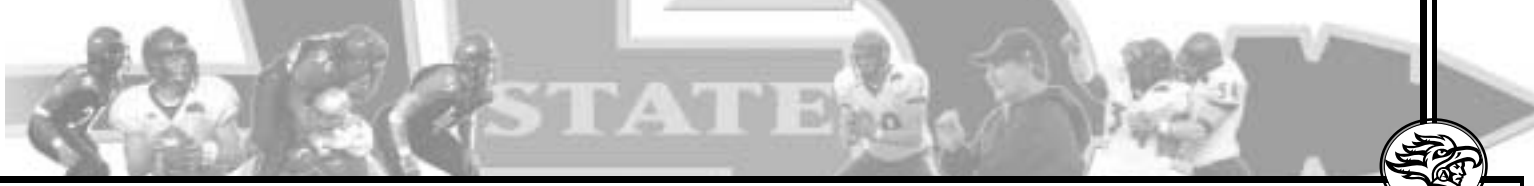
**Examples of extra benefits are:**

- Arrangements of employment for prospect's relatives.
- Gifts of clothing or equipment.
- Co-signing of loans.
- Loans to relatives or friends.
- Cash or like items.
- Any tangible items, like merchandise.
- Free or reduced-cost services, rentals or purchases.
- Free or discount meals at a local restaurant.
- Free or reduced-cost housing.
- Use of an institution's athletics equipment.

The Mountain West Conference was conceived on May 26, 1998, when the presidents of eight institutions - Air Force, Brigham Young, Colorado State, New Mexico, San Diego State, UNLV, Utah and Wyoming - met in Denver and decided to form the MWC.

The cornerstone of the conference's formation was the maintenance of long standing athletic rivalries among its member institutions. Hence the Mountain West Conference was formed. Located in Colorado Springs, Colo., when the MWC's doors opened for business the new league had in place a seven-year contract with ESPN giving the broadcaster exclusive national television rights to MWC football and men's basketball; and three-year agreements to send the league's football champion to the Liberty Bowl and a second team to the Las Vegas Bowl.

The Conference officially began operations on July 1, 1999. Prior to opening its doors an executive committee was established and named Craig Thompson commissioner. Thompson had less than one-year to name the new league, settle on a city to serve as the league's headquarters, find a television partner, arrange for bowl tie-ins, hire staff, and develop a logo.

The Mountain West Conference is noted for its geographic diversity. Some of the most beautiful geography in the nation can be found within Mountain West Conference boundaries, including the unparalleled Rocky Mountain range, which borders four MWC schools (Utah, BYU, Air Force and Colorado State). The high plains of Wyoming (elevation 7,000 feet) contrast with the desert city of Las Vegas (the fastest growing metropolitan area in the West), the balmy weather and Pacific Ocean locale of San Diego State and the southwestern flavor of New Mexico.

Highlights through the MWC's first four years include three women's cross country national championships; participation in 12 bowl games; sending six of the eight teams to postseason bowls; the only conference each of the last two seasons to send 75 percent of its men's basketball teams to postseason play; 11 berths in the NCAA Women's Basketball Tournament, including three "Sweet 16" appearances; sending five of eight men's golf teams to NCAAs each of the last four years; 11 NCAA Volleyball berths with two teams advancing to the "Sweet 16" three of the last four years; and being the only conference with multiple bowl games to go unbeaten in the 2000 postseason - posting a 3-0 mark.

In addition to the 19 MWC-sponsored sports, programs like Utah and BYU have national titles in non-league sports. The Utes have won a total of 21 national championships in the sports of women's gymnastics and skiing, while BYU captured the 2001 and 1998 NCAA men's volleyball championship.

## Mountain West Bowl Tie-Ins

### AXA Liberty Bowl

During the 2002 off-season, the Mountain West Conference announced a three-year extension of its contract with the AXA Liberty Bowl through the 2004 season. The AXA Liberty Bowl features the only guaranteed champion-vs.-champion match-up outside the BCS system, pitting the MWC champion against the winner of Conference USA. The AXA Liberty Bowl was the first bowl tie-in for the Mountain West following its formation in 1999. The game will be played on Dec. 31st and will be aired by ESPN.



### Las Vegas Bowl

The Mountain West Conference extended its agreement for three more years with the Las Vegas Bowl in 2002. The Las Vegas Bowl involves the second place MWC team and the fifth-place finisher from the Pac-10. This year's game has been moved up a day to Dec. 24 at 4:30 p.m. at UNLV's Sam Boyd Stadium and will be televised by ESPN.



### Diamond Walnut San Francisco Bowl

The San Francisco Bowl was one of three post-season games added to the Bowl lineup by the NCAA Certification Committee for the 2002 season. The Mountain West Conference entered into a four-year contract to send its third choice to the San Francisco Bowl, where it will face a team from the Big East. Last year's inaugural game was played at Pac Bell Park under the cameras of ESPN on New Year's Eve.
