Welcome To 2001

Thank you for your attendance at the 2001 San Diego State Football Media Day. The session will begin at noon with Ted Tollner available in the meeting room for writers with the electronic media conducting player interviews in the courtyard. We will switch at 12:30 with Coach Tollner in the courtyard and player interviews in the meeting room for one-on-one sessions.

The Coach

Ted Tollner is back at San Diego State for his eighth season. He is 40-40 at the school, including a 1998 Las Vegas Bowl berth and three seasons with at least seven wins. Under Tollner, the Aztecs have a pair of wins over Cal and a victory over Oklahoma. Tollner's tenure is currently fourth in the Mountain West, behind Fisher DeBerry of Air Force, Sonny Lubick of Colorado State and Ron McBride of Utah. His heavyweight non-conference slate has included Minnesota, Cal (twice), Oklahoma (twice), Washington, Wisconsin, Arizona, Arizona State, USC (twice) and two games against Illinois. This year Arizona and Arizona State return to the schedule, along with Ohio State. Future Aztec schedules include UCLA, Colorado, Washington and Washington State.

Aztecs At A Glance

San Diego State returns 23 starters and 43 lettermen from 2000 and figures to be improved across the board. The Aztec defense returns 10 starters and nine starters are back on the offensive side of the ball. The Aztecs return a league-high in both starters and lettermen and have been recognized by at least one publication as "the most improved team in the country". Along with its position players, San Diego State returns second-team all-Mountain West punter Brian Simnjanvoski.

The New Guys

Including walkons, San Diego State welcomed 30 newcomers on Aug. 3rd, including Darryl Conyer of Mission Bay High School and Cameron Casper, who attended Mt. Carmel before heading to Brigham Young.

Aztecs On The Air

The 2001-2002 academic year marks the return of San Diego State University football and basketball to XTRA Sports 690. Clear Channel Communications, owner of XTRA, and SDSU have signed a new three-year agreement that will assure Aztec football is broadcast on the most powerful station on the West Coast. XTRA 690, with its all-sports format, is a 77,000-watt station. Although the studio is located in San Diego, XTRA's coverage extends as far north as Santa Barbara and encompasses Los Angeles, Riverside, Orange and San Diego counties. The station has over 500,000 loyal listeners throughout southern California.



Prognosticators

A 3-8 team returning a load of players seems to have confused the prognosticators. The Aztecs are predicted to finish as high as second by one publication and seem to be a consensus upper division team, but not a unanimous selection for any spot. *The Sporting News* has San Diego State ranked 42nd nationally and the *2001 College Football Preview* magazine lists San Diego State as the nation's most improved team and 40th nationally. Aztecs In The Mountain West

San Diego State is 6-8 in two years of play in the Mountain West. Both seasons SDSU has finished 3-4. The Aztecs have defeated five of their seven conference opponents, but are 0-2 vs. Utah and Air Force since the conference switch. San Diego State tied for a conference high last season with three league road wins, including victories at Wyoming, Brigham Young and New Mexico.

New Home

The San Diego State football team, as well as the rest of the athletic department, will be changing homes this month as the University opens the new Aztec Athletics Center. The four-floor structure will house all facets of the athletic department. The football offices and meeting rooms will be on the second floor, overlooking the new strength and conditioning center. The first floor will house the weight room, equipment room, athletic medicine, the new Hall of Fame, locker rooms for each sport, a video suite, auditorium and the Aztec Athletic Foundation. The move is expected to take place over the next four weeks.

Another Senior Season

Two Aztecs who were listed as seniors a year ago are back in uniform. Running back Larry Ned, a Doak Walker finalist entering 2000, was granted another year of play after he earned his degree in criminal justice in four years. He is currently pursuing a second degree in economics. Defensive end Akbar Gbaja Biamila is back after regaining a year due to injury. He was lost for the 2000 season with an Achilles injury after playing in just one game.

New Kids On The Block

Newcomers who could make a quick impact include redshirt defenders Jason Perry (defensive end), Stephen Larsen (linebacker), Kirk Morrison (linebacker), Marviel Underwood (defensive back) and Josh Dean (defensive back). Of the newcomers who reported on Friday, keep an eye on new kicker Tommy Kirovski, receivers Ronnie Davenport and Jeff Webb, Louisiana products Hubert Caliste (defensive back) and Michael Franklin (running back/return specialist) and defensive back Marcus Demps, the younger brother of all-conference safety Will Demps.

Speaking Of Brothers

The Aztecs continue to keep things in the family. San Diego State enters fall camp with several family ties:

- ▶ Defensive back Josh Dean is the son of former Aztec and NFL star Vernon Dean.
- ▶ Freshman defensive back Marcus Demps is the younger brother of returning all-conference safety Will Demps.
- ▶ Defensive lineman Akbar Gbaja Biamila is the younger brother of former Aztec and current Green Bay Packer Kabeer Gbaja Biamila.
- ▶ Receiver Daniel Gourdine is the younger brother of former Aztec receiver and return man Damon Gourdine.
- ▶ Linebacker Loo Heather is the brother of George Heather, an SDSU defensive lineman who ended his career in 2000.
- ▶ Kickers Tommy Kirovski and Brian Simnjanvoski are second cousins.
- ▶ Safety Garret Pavelko is the son of former Aztec Galen Pavelko.
- ▶ Freshman defensive back Shane Russell is the younger brother of former Aztec and current Minnesota Viking Brian Russell.

Returning Champs

San Diego State returns several players who led the Mountain West in their particular categories last season:

- ▶ Linebacker Jomar Butler led the MWC with 91 tackles in league play.
- ▶ Wide receiver Derrick Lewis led the nation in yards per reception (25.2 per catch).
- ▶ Quarterback Lon Sheriff led the Mountain West in passing yards in conference games (264.4 yards per game).
- ▶ Sheriff also led the league in total offense in MWC play (1,744 yards).
- ▶ Wide receiver J.R. Tolver led the league with 6.8 catches per conference game.

The Opener

San Diego State opens the season Aug. 30th against Arizona on ESPN2. The game is the first of three straight against a first-year coach. Along with Arizona and John Mackovic, the Aztecs travel to Tempe to meet Dirk Koetter's Arizona State Sun Devils on Sept. 8th and then it is on to Columbus to meet Ohio State on Sept. 15th as Jim Tressel continues his maiden voyage with the Buckeyes. The Aztecs will meet their fourth first-year coach during conference play, when the Aztecs host BYU and Gary Crowton on Oct. 27.

TV Time

If you want to follow the Aztecs in 2001, it won't be difficult. San Diego State has five games set for telecast on a national cable outlet or a network regional telecast.
