NCAA BATON ROUGE REGIONAL

BEARKATS IN BACK-TO-BACK NCAA REGIONALS

For the second-consecutive season, Sam Houston State (37-20) has earned an at-large selection to the NCAA Baseball Tournament as the No. 3 seed. This will be the school's eighth regional appearance and second as an at-large selection. The Kats have earned berths in the NCAA postseason in five of the past seven years, representing the Southland three years in a row in 2007, 2008 and 2009. Last season, SHSU fell in the Houston Regional final against Arkansas after eliminating the hosts Rice. The Kats will open regional play with No. 2 seed Louisiana-Lafayette, Friday at 7:05 p.m.



NCAA TOURNAMENT HISTORY

In eight NCAA postseason appearances, Sam Houston State has made it to two regional finals. Until last season, SHSU's best regional performance came at Ole Miss in 2007. The Bearkats bounced back to defeat Troy, 5-4, and Southern Mississippi, 12-11 (11 innings), to meet host Mississippi in the finals. In 2012 the Kats again bounced back from an opening round loss to eliminate Prairie View A&M, 4-2, and Rice, 4-1, to meet Arkansas in the finals.

Twice, SHSU has knocked off the No. 1 seed in the first round of the playoffs, defeating Oklahoma, 5-1, in Austin in 1987 and knocking off Miami (the No. 2 team in the country), 5-4, in Austin in 1996. Sam Houston also held leads late against host Texas and UCLA before losing in the 1996 regional.

The win over Miami in 1996 is the Kats last opening round win in a regional. The 'Canes went on to play in the 1996 College World Series and lost in the national championship game.

KATS VERSUS TOURNAMENT TEAMS

Sam Houston State put up an impressive 8-3 record against tournament teams in 2013. The Bearkats knocked off Conference-USA regular season and tournament champion, Rice, twice this season before splitting two games with Texas A&M and winning a single game at Texas-San Antonio. The Kats swept three games against UCA. The only tourney team to hold an advantage over SHSU is Connecticut who took two-of-three in March.

NEWS & NOTES

SOUTHLAND CHAMPIONS AGAIN

The Bearkats swept Central Arkansas in the final conference series of the season to claim their second consecutive regular-season championship and its third overall. No. 28 Sam Houston won the Southland by three games, finishing league play with a 20-7 record. The Kats dropped only two league series all year while picking up seven series wins and four sweeps. Third baseman Kevin Miller hit over .400 in conference games while driving in 20 runs and scoring 21. Catcher Anthony Azar batted .379 and drove in a team-high 29 runs. Azar and leftfielder Luke Pluchek each hit four homers in league play.

BEARKATS NO. 28 IN COLLEGIATE BASEBALL POLL

Sam Houston State dropped a spot to No. 28, in the latest Collegiate Baseball poll after being ranked at No. 27 a week ago. The Kats and the Rice Owls (No. 23) are the only teams from the state of Texas to currently be ranked. Three teams fell out of the top 30 this week in Seton Hall (1-2 last week), Campbell (3-1) and Western Carolina (1-2). New to the poll is Virginia Tech., Oklahoma, and San Diego. SHSU is also receiving votes in the USA Today Coaches polls.

NINE BEARKATS ALL-SOUTHLAND

For the second consecutive season, third baseman Kevin Miller and catcher Anthony Azar have been voted to the All-Southland Conference first team. They top a list of nine Sam Houston players who have been voted to the 2013 All-Southland Conference baseball squad. Second baseman Jessie Plumlee, outfielder Luke Pluchek, and pitcher Caleb Smith are members of the second team. Honorable mention selections for the Bearkats are shortstop Carter Burgess, outfielder Colt Atwood, designated hitter Hayden Simerly, and pitcher Cody Dickson.

PIERCE COACH OF THE YEAR

After guiding the Bearkats to a second consecutive regular-season title, Sam Houston's David Pierce repeated as the Southland coach of the year. Sam Houston finished 20-7 in conference play and heads to the NCAA Regionals for the second straight year. The Kats picked up big non-conference wins over Baylor, Houston, Rice, Texas, and Texas A&M. Pierce is the first Southland coach to win consecutive honors since Texas-San Antonio's Sherman Corbett (2007-08).

SECOND-LONGEST DIVISION I WIN STREAK IN PROGRAM HISTORY

The Bearkats 11-game winning streak from April 21 to May 12 was the second-longest in school history at the Division I level. Last season's 13 consecutive wins ranks as the team's longest. During the streak the Kats batted .305 as a team while smashing 21 doubles and 10 home runs. The pitching staff combined for a 1.95 ERA with 84 strikeouts while teams were batting just .206 off of them. Sam Houston finished the regular season with wins in 14 of their final 15 games, capped off by a sweep of Central Arkansas.

DICKSON ON A ROLL

Junior lefthander Cody Dickson finished the regular season on a roll. In his five outings leading up to the Southland Tournament, Dickson tossed 26 consecutive scoreless innings while allowing just eight hits over that stretch. The Mansfield, Texas, product was outstanding in his final regular-season start, throwing a four-hit, complete-game shutout against the UCA Bears. He struck out ten and didn't issue any free passes. His only start in the conference tournament was marred by one bad inning. Dickson battled through 6 2/3 innings of work but gave up five runs in the third as the Kats lost 5-3 to Southeastern Louisiana.

SENIOR JESSIE PLUMLEE DEFINES UTILITY PLAYER

Senior Jessie Plumlee has been the ultimate utility man in his Sam Houston career. This season he has started at second, catcher, and most recently first base. Plumlee has led off and played first base in the Bearkats last eight games. The senior from Rowlett, Texas, has played six different positions in his four-year Sam Houston career. Plumlee is one of the team's leading hitters with a .313 batting average that includes 51 total hits, nine doubles, two home runs and 26 runs batted in.

EMERGENCE OF EPPLER

Tyler Eppler was a big part of the Kats midweek success, picking up wins over Texas, Rice and Houston. The sophomore from Navasota, Texas, was at his best against the ranked opponents. Eppler is 5-2 with a 3.41 ERA with 44 strikeouts in 13 starts. "There have been some unusual things with this year's team," Pierce said. "Tyler Eppler has been one of those good, unusual things. It's great to be able to have the same starting pitcher for the midweek games. Tyler is a young pitcher but he's been able to step up and has helped build the team's confidence going into big games." Eppler has made three weekend starts, in wins over Northwestern State, Nicholls, and Central Arkansas. He also pitched the Bearkats to an 8-3 win over McNeese State in the team's Southland Tournament opener.

MIDWEEK WARRIORS

Sam Houston has played arguably the toughest midweek schedule in the Southland Conference this season and faired pretty well, with a 9-3 record. The Bearkats picked up a pair of wins over nationally ranked Rice and split series with Houston, Baylor, and Texas A&M. SHSU also knocked off No. 22 Texas on the road early in the season. The Kats picked up wins over Texas-Arlington and Texas-San Antonio in the final two midweeks.

BURGESS QUARTERFINALIST FOR BROOKS WALLACE

Sam Houston State shortstop Carter Burgess was named as a quarterfinalist for the Brooks Wallace Shortstop of the Year Award. Burgess is one of the Bearkats offensive leaders, with a .318 average in 57 games this season. The sophomore is just one of two Kats to have started every game in 2013. The Brooks Wallace Award, sponsored by Mizuno, recognizes the nation's top shortstop and will be presented during the College Baseball Hall of Fame's Night of Champions on June 29 in Lubbock, Texas.

BURCHETT ON STOPPER OF THE YEAR WATCHLIST

Bearkat senior relief pitcher Michael Burchett was among 75 players named to the NCBWA Preseason Stopper of the Year Watch List. Primarily the closer in 2012, Burchett led the Bearkats with 10 saves and struck out 27 batters in 48.1 innings. This season he has produced a 3.49 ERA in 21 appearances and has recorded four saves.

BEARKATS PICKED NO. 1 IN SLC PRESEASON POLL

The Bearkats were the overwhelming favorites in the 2013 Southland Conference preseason head coaches' poll. Sam Houston returned 17 letter winners, six starters and four pitchers from a 40-22 Bearkat squad.

DEFENDING SOUTHLAND CONFERENCE CHAMPS

Sam Houston State produced its first Southland Conference regular season championship since 1989 last year. The Bearkats rolled up a 40-22 overall record, only the third time in SHSU's 26 seasons at the NCAA Division I level for the squad to compile 40 or more victories. Sam Houston earned the 2012 conference title by a margin of four games.

The 24 Southland victories tied the league record for most conference wins in a season. For the first time in their 12 trips to the Southland post-season tournament, the Kats were the No. 1 seed. After a Southland tournament semifinals loss, the Kats earned an at-large berth in the Houston regional for SHSU's first at-large Division I berth.

In their seventh NCAA Division I baseball regional appearance, the Bearkats defeated No. 1 seed Rice and reached the finals against World Series participant Arkansas to equal the program's best NCAA post-season performance ever.

BATON ROUGE REGIONAL TEAM CAPSULES

NO. 1-SEED LOUISIANA STATE

The LSU Tigers (52-9, 23-7 SEC) enter the regional on a roll after winning four of five games in the SEC Tournament, including a victory over No. 1-ranked Vanderbilt in the championship game. The Tigers earned the No. 4 overall seed after a 52-9 regular season. In his seventh season at LSU, head coach Paul Mainieri has continued LSU's dominance in college baseball. They have reached the NCAA postseason five times including trips to the College World Series in 2008 and 2009, winning the title that year. On the diamond, the Tigers are led by SEC pitcher of the year Aaron Nola. The right-handed pitcher boasts a 10-0 record and a 1.98 ERA. The Tigers placed a total of six players on the All-SEC team including five first-team picks. As a team, LSU is hitting .308 with 42 home runs. Mason Klotz leads the club in homers (14) and RBI (64), while his .377 average is just a point below team leader and SEC Freshman of the Year Alex Bergman (.378). The LSU pitching staff has an ERA of 2.48 and a 3-to-1 strike out to walk ratio. Closer Chris Cotton is 11th in the country with 15 saves and a 4-1 record.

NO. 2-SEED LOUISIANA-LAFAYETTE

The Kats first round opponent, Louisiana-Lafayette (41-18, 19-11 Sun Belt) is set to appear in the NCAA Baseball Championship for the 13th time and first since 2010. For head coach Tony Robichaux, it will be his ninth time leading the Ragin' Cajuns into the NCAA Championship. The Cajuns bring one of the nation's top offensive units into the Baton Rouge regional with top-10 rankings nationally in batting average, runs, hits, doubles, home runs and slugging percentage. The team is hitting .352 and slugging .587 since May 1, scoring five-plus runs each game during the timeframe. ULL has won 15 of its last 20 contests to secure the program's first 40-win season since 2007. Louisiana-Lafayette's all-time NCAA Baseball Championship record is 20-25 and includes Super Regional appearances in 1999 and 2000 and a College World Series berth in 2000. Dex Kjerstad is the team's hottest hitter with a 13-game hitting streak intact and a team and Sun Belt-best .398 average. He has accrued 94 base hits which leaves him seven hits shy of the school record.

NO. 4-SEED JACKSON STATE

Jackson State (34-20, 19-5) enters the regional as the champions of the SWAC Conference. They posted a 34-20 record under head coach Omar Johnson. In eight years guiding the Jackson State program, Johnson has posted a record of 237-146, earning his first trip to the postseason. The Tigers rolled off a 19-5 record in league play and have won 13 of their last 15 games including seven straight. As a team the Tigers hit .285 with Charles Tilery leading the way with a .344 average. The team doesn't have a lot of power, hitting just 12 homers, led by Ethan Bright with 4. When the Tigers get on base, expect them to run. They are 125-of-156 on stolen base attempts and have six players with double-digit swipes including Aneko Knowles (26) and Tilery (25). The pitching staff has an ERA of 4.66. Juday Alexander has the best stats among starters with a 3.14 ERA, 7-4 record and a team-best 60 strikeouts.

SLC PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

AZAR HITTER OF THE WEEK TWICE

Azar was honored this season for his offensive efforts against Dallas Baptist and Central Arkansas. Against DBU, he returned from injury to bat .667 and drive in six runs. The junior from The Woodlands, Texas, carried the Kats to a win in the series finale with a 4-for-6 game with two doubles and a homer, driving in five. Against UCA, Azar was 6 for 12 with five RBI, three doubles and two runs scored in the series. He ripped two doubles in Thursday night's 5-1 win and drove in three runs in a 2-for-4 effort.

SMITH COMPLETE GAME EARNS WEEKLY HONOR

Smith notched his first complete-game shutout of the season, allowing just three hits against Southeastern Louisiana. The junior from Huntsville, Texas, struck out three batters and pitched around two Bearkat errors while inducing two double plays. Smith's win clinched the series for Sam Houston and allowed Sam Houston to maintain its two-game lead in the league standings.

DICKSON PITCHER OF THE WEEK AFTER ONE-HITTER

Dickson tossed a one-hit shutout in the conference opener against Texas A&M-Corpus Christi. The junior from Mansfield, Texas (Summit H.S.) did not allow a hit until the sixth inning and allowed only two base runners the whole game. He tied a career high in strikeouts (11) while striking out the side in the fifth. Dickson did not issue any walks in the Bearkats 5-0 win.



HEAD COACH DAVID PIERCE

After his first season as the Bearkats head coach, David Pierce already has a place in the Sam Houston State baseball record book.

The former Rice assistant led the Kats to their second Southland Conference regular season championship, a feat that SHSU had not accomplished since 1989.

Along the way, Pierce was honored as a "Regional Coach of the Year" by the American Baseball Coaches Association (ABCA) as well as being named Southland Conference "Coach of the Year." He also was named by PerfectGame.org as one of ten rising stars in the NCAA Division I college baseball coaching ranks.

Sam Houston won the 2012 conference title by a margin of four games and earned the No. 1 seed in the Southland post-season tournament for the first time. The 24 Southland victories tied the league record for most conference wins in a season.

Sam Houston State rolled up a 40-22 overall record, only the third time in the Bearkats' 26 seasons at the NCAA Division I level for the squad to compile 40 or more victories. For the first time in program history, the Bearkats earned national rankings in each of the major college baseball polls, climbing as high as No. 20 in one poll.

The 2012 Bearkats made their seventh NCAA Division I baseball regional appearance, earning an at-large berth in the Houston regional. Sam Houston defeated No. 1 seed Rice and reached the finals against World Series participant Arkansas to equal the program's best NCAA post-season performance ever.

The regular season record included victories over Rice, Dallas Baptist, San Diego, Louisiana-Monroe, Prairie View and UT-Arlington (other teams that received NCAA bids).

Beginning with a three-game sweep of preseason Southland favorite Texas State in late March, 2012, Sam Houston ran off 13 straight victories, the longest baseball winning streak in the program's 26 seasons at the NCAA Division I level.

Pierce was an assistant coach for nine years for a Rice Owl team that has been one of the best in college baseball. He served as hitting coach from 2003-2005. In his first season at Rice, the team hit .313 with 51 homeruns and 449 runs driven in on their way to the school's first ever National Championship.

As pitching coach from 2006-2011, he produced a pitching staff ranked in the top 30 in the NCAA in staff ERA for five years, including a No. 4 national mark in 2007. Eight Pierce-coached pitchers were selected in the major league draft, including left-handed starter Joe Savery as the 19th overall pick in the first round.

Senior Ryne Tacker was named the 2007 Conference-USA Pitcher of the Year and Owl freshman pitcher Ryan Berry was named the league's freshman of the year.

Pierce joined the college coaching ranks at Houston in 2001. He helped coach the Cougars to an appearance in the NCAA Tournament in his first season. In his second year, he helped take the team further with an NCAA Super Regional appearance, a game away from the College World Series.

Under Pierce's direction, UH sluggers pounded out nearly 700 hits and finished the season with a .310 batting average, the fifth-best single-season performance in team history.

He tutored a trio of Cougar hitters, who established themselves as one of the finest groups of sluggers in school history. Brett Cooley (18) and Chris Snyder (15) tied a school record with 33 home runs by a Cougar duo. Add in Jesse Crain's 11 home runs and that group posted the greatest home run totals by a Cougar trio in school history.

Pierce got his first top job as a head coach for five seasons at Pasadena's Dobie High School, where he led the Longhorns to three District 23-5A championships and three berths in the Region III semifinals.

Among his honors at Dobie was winning the district "Coach of the Year" award three times, being tabbed a coach for the Houston area all-star series, and a coach in the United States Junior Olympic trials.

In his five years at Dobie, Pierce produced three all-state players, 36 all-district stars, and 10 players who went on to perform at the college level. His star pupil at Dobie was former college all-America Shane Nance, who went on to pitch in the major leagues for the Milwaukee Brewers.

Other coaching stops were at Episcopal and St. Pius X, both high schools in Houston. He also worked as a batting practice pitcher for the Houston Astros from 1994 through 2000.

Pierce's playing career began at St. Pius X High School in Houston. He then went on to Wharton County Junior College (1982-83) and the University of Houston (1984-85). He helped pace the Cougars to an appearance in the NCAA Tournament as a senior in 1985. He completed his degree at Houston in 1988.

Pierce and his wife Susan have two children, Chelsea and Shea. Their son, Shea is a sophomore catcher on the Bearkat baseball team.





ASSISTANT COACHES

Sean Allen joined Sam Houston head baseball coach David Pierce's staff as assistant coach in August 2011, playing a major role in directing the Bearkats to the Southland Conference regular season championship in 2012.

Allen came to Sam Houston from Florida International University in Miami, Fla., where he was an assistant for a program that rolled up a 130-103-1 record and earned NCAA Division I regional berths in 2010 and 2011.

From 2002 to 2007 he was an assistant coach at the University of Houston.

"Sean is one of the most respected young coaches in college baseball," Pierce said. "He has proven he can recruit and develop talent. His resume extends in many directions. He has coached hitters, infielders and pitchers with two strong programs and knows what it takes to create a winner."

Allen served as recruiting coordinator, pitching coach and infield coach at FIU, helping build a program that went from a 20-36 record his first year as an assistant in 2008 to a 40-20-1 mark in 2011.

Florida International won the Sun Belt Conference tournament championship in 2010 and participated in the NCAA Division I regional in Coral Gables, Fla. The following year FIU earned an at-large NCAA berth and appeared in the Chapel Hill, NC, regional.

While at the University of Houston, Allen served in a similar capacity working with the Cougar infielders and as the hitting coach. His teams were exemplary at the plate and on the diamond, helping the Cougars earn NCAA Tournament berths in 2002, 2003 and 2006, and advance to the NCAA Super Regionals in 2002 and 2003.

He played a major role in the offensive development of consensus All-American and later Pittsburgh Pirate pitcher, Brad Lincoln, who was named the National Player of the Year by four different entities in 2006.

In 2006, Allen's lineup hit 71 home runs -- the fifth-highest total in UH single-season history -- with All-Conference USA First-Team performer Matt Weston leading the way with 16 homers.

Philip Miller, as a member of staffs under Mark Johnson and David Pierce, has played a key role in the direction of Sam Houston baseball squads that earned four NCAA Division I regional playoff berths.

He returned to Sam Houston State as an assistant to head baseball coach David Pierce in August 2011, helping direct the Bearkats to the 2012 Southland Conference regular season title and an at-large NCAA berth.

In 2009-11, Miller was an assistant coach at Northwestern State. Previously, he was volunteer assistant for former Bearkat skipper Mark Johnson for SHSU squads that won three Southland Conference post season tournament championship to advance to the NCAA Division I regionals.

"Philip is a tireless worker with expertise in all facets of running a Division I program," Pierce said. "He has great organizational skills on and off the field and will be a great contributor in many ways."

At Northwestern State, Miller served as the Demons' infield and defensive coach as well as first base coach. He assisted with the Demon hitters, recruiting responsibilities, and field maintenance. In 2009, he helped guide the team to a second place finish in the Southland Conference and advance to the Southland Conference Tournament.

The 2010 Demons finished second in the SLC in batting average (.322) and tied for fourth in fielding percentage (.963). The Demons placed a league-best seven student-athletes on the All-Southland Conference honor squad. Two Northwestern State position players were drafted in the 2010 MLB Amateur Baseball Draft.

During his stint with the Bearkats, Miller was outfield and first base coach and assisted with hitters, infielders and catchers. He coached three All-Americans, six All-Southland Conference outfielders and four Southland All-Tournament selections.

The Kats made NCAA regional appearances at the University of Mississippi (2007) and Rice University (2008)
