EMERGENCY SERVICES

Please report any emergency to a member of the event staff wearing white shirts or a public safety officer and they will alert the appropriate stadium personnel. Announcements and paging for emergencies are coordinated by contacting event staff.

First Aid stations are located on the concourse level across from the concession area. An ambulance will be available for emergency service at all games.

ENTRANCE & ADMISSION

All guests must have a valid ticket to enter. Once in the stadium, guests may not exit and re-enter. All patrons are asked to enter Bailey Memorial Stadium through the front gate. Gates will open 90 minutes prior to kickoff.

FAN BEHAVIOR

Presbyterian College hopes to provide a memorable game day experience for all fans. Please help us to enhance the fan experience by demonstrating sportsmanship at all times. If you encounter unruly behavior, please contact a game management representative. Event Staff will be wearing white shirts or yellow jackets with ShowPros on the back. Spectators must remain off the playing field until 15 minutes after the game ends. Presbyterian College reserves the right to remove from the stadium, without refund, any individuals disrupting other fans, team representatives, or officials.

TOBACCO USE

Presbyterian College is a tobacco free campus, which includes all athletic venues. The use of any tobacco products, including but not limited to traditional cigarettes, e-cigarettes, chewing tobacco, pipes and cigars, is prohibited in Bailey Memorial Stadium.

WILL CALL & DAY OF GAME TICKETS

Will Call is located at the Ticket Booth located at the front of Bailey Memorial Stadium. Will Call will open 90 minutes before kickoff and close at halftime. Will Call pick ups will require a photo ID.

If available, day-of-game sales will take place at the PC Ticket Office. Game day sales are cash and credit card only.

HEAT-RELATED ISSUES

In South Carolina, particularly in August and September, development of heat related problems are a common occurrence during football games at Bailey Memorial Stadium. A high heat index increases the body temperature leading to significant sweating and fluid loss. Unless fluids are appropriately replaced, heat-related illness may occur. Fans with cardiac, respiratory or gastrointestinal problems are at higher risk for heat illness. Heat problems can usually be prevented by:

- Applying sunscreen 15-30 SPF
- Wearing a hat
- Wearing light, loose fitting clothes
- Drinking plenty of water or sports drinks
- Limiting alcohol intake

If you become hot, sweaty, fatigued and thirsty, you should get out of the sun immediately and begin to replenish your fluids. If these symptoms continue or you develop dizziness or muscle cramps, you should go to the aid station for further evaluation and treatment.

Other medical problems may occur during a game. Should you become ill and feel the need for medical attention during a game, Event Staff or Security Personnel can direct you to find the nearest aid station or they can summon Emergency Medical Personnel if you are too sick to be moved. If you have significant medical problems, please bring a list of your medications with you to the game in case you have to be seen in our aid stations.

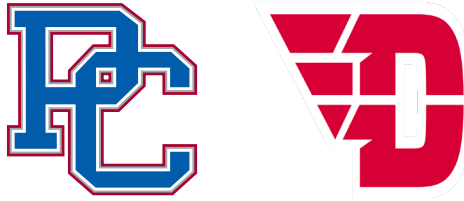

Last Time Out

- Continuing their struggles away from Bailey Memorial, Presbyterian was unable to get the offense cranking against Marist last weekend in their ninth consecutive week of competition, falling by a 37-7 clip to the Red Foxes in Poughkeepsie, N.Y.
- George Wilder, Keegan Halloran, and Alex Herriott added up for 28 stops in PC's first ever visit to Tenney Stadium, holding Marist to a handful of missed opportunities throughout the opening half. However, the Red Foxes were able to apply the same amount of pressure to a banged up Blue Hose line of scrimmage, attributing to the one-sided decision. The result gaved Marist head coach Jim Parady his 150th career victory since taking over the reigns in 1992, the longest-tenured active HC in NCAA Division I football.

Opponent Profile

- One of three teams entwined in a tie for the 2nd-place spot in the current Pioneer Football League standings, the Flyers will visit Bailey Memorial for the very first time this Saturday, winning three in a row over Marist, Stetson, and Valparaiso by a combined score of 78-51.
- Dayton and head coach Rick Chamberlin have been one of the most clutch teams in all of FCS this season, emerging as the victor in three separate contests decided by a single score. Each of their last two appearances saw that same notion, as the Flyers were gifted a 31-24 triumph over the Beacons last weekend thanks to a 23-yard touchdown sprint from Jake Chisholm with 18 ticks on the clock.
- Senior defensive tackle Sam Schadek rampaged through the Valpo O-line in the thrilling victory, named the league's Defensive Player of the Week after accumulating 4.5 tackles for a loss to back up Valpo's offense for a total of 35 yards, erupting for 3.5 sacks.
- While Dayton hasn't necessarily been overwhelming across five wins in the last six attempts, the Flyers' rushing defense certainly has been. Conceding an average of only 87 yards on the ground in their eight matchups (ranking 6th in the nation), Dayton's red zone D sits just outside the Top 30 in all of FCS. Additionally, the Flyers have turned the ball over the fewest number of times in the 10-team PFL, just four behind FCS leaders Holy Cross and Princeton (4).

Around the PFL

- Three weeks remain in the 2022 season and the PFL race still has six teams in contention for the league title and five in the hunt for the league's automatic bid to the FCS Playoffs. There will be plenty of action between the league's leaders in the closing weeks, as 1st-place St. Thomas visits Valparaiso in Week 10, as well as a marquee matchup in San Diego between the Toreros and Butler.
- As the 2022 season comes to a close, three PFL members near significant program victory milestones. Dayton enters the week two wins away from recording its 700th all-time victory, becoming the 9th current FCS program to record 700 all-time wins. Stetson also needs three wins to reach the 200-win mark in program history.
- Dayton's Shane Hamm and Jake Chisholm each rushed for 100 yards in the win against Valparaiso, Hamm finishing with 129 yards and Chisholm adding 103 yards next to the game-winning touchdown with less than a minute left.

Presbyterian College and the Blue Hose athletic department announced the 17th head coach in PC football's 110-year history in January 2022, awarding the honor to Steve Englehart. A head coach for 13 years at Florida Institute of Technology and Rose-Hulman Institute of Technology, Englehart's hiring came after a national search conducted by the Parker Executive Search firm, working with a committee including Presbyterian faculty, staff, coaches, and members of the College's Board of Trustees.

The search committee decided unanimously to hire Englehart as PC's next football coach following an extensive review of a strong candidate pool. A majority of the 120 candidates had significant college coaching experience.

Englehart, a two-time Gulf South Conference Coach of the Year recipient, has compiled a record of 71-55 during his 11-year head coaching career and has coached two teams to the NCAA Division II playoffs.

In his last head coaching position, Englehart assisted in starting and guiding the Florida Tech Panthers football program from 2011-20, compiling a 44-35 record. In 2014, the Panthers' second season as a football program, he guided the team to a 6-5 record garnering Gulf South Conference Coach of the Year honors.

In 2015, he guided the Panthers to a 7-4 record with wins over two teams ranked in the Top Five of the D-II national rankings. He was named Gulf South Conference Coach of the Year for the second straight season.

In 2016 and '18, he led the Panthers to the NCAA D-II playoffs. Prior to his coaching stint at Florida Tech, Englehart served one season as offensive coordinator for his alma mater, Indiana State.

In 2010, Englehart coached a Sycamores' offense that finished 14th in the nation in scoring after tallying a school-record 351 points.

In 2006, Englehart was hired as the youngest head coach in the NCAA, spending four seasons at Rose-Hulman in Terre-Haute, Ind., where he led the program to four consecutive seasons with at least six wins. In 2007, he guided the Fightin' Engineers to a 7-3 record, the program's best since 1994.

The Terre Haute native graduated from Indiana State with a degree in health education in 2000. During his playing career from 1996-99, he played quarterback and was a three-time GTE Scholar-Athlete award winner.

Englehart and his wife, Carrie, reside in Clinton and have three children, Ty, who is a freshman quarterback for the Blue Hose, Caden, and Lila.

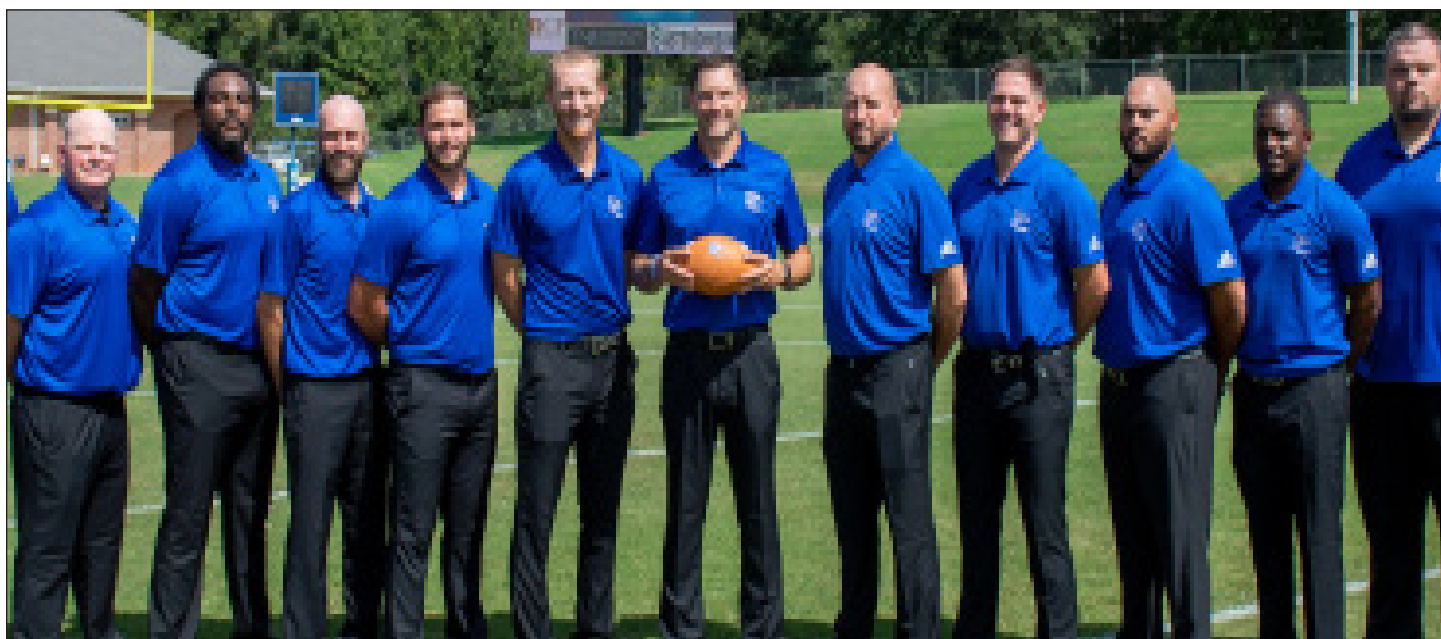

WHAT'S A BLUE HOSE?

It began in the early 1900s when sportswriters referred to the Presbyterian College sports teams as the "Blue Stockings" because of the blue socks (or hose) they wore.

Former PC Public Relations specialist Ben Hay Hammet noted in his 1982 centennial history of PC that blue-stockings Presbyterians also refers to "Presbyterians with strong puritan leanings."

"The sports nickname was shortened to 'Blue Hose' in 1954," Hammet wrote, "presumably under the assumption that it sounded somewhat fiercer to carry onto the field of athletic battle."





MATTHEW VANDENBERG

PRESIDENT



vandenBerg's selection follows a national search that began in May 2020. More than 100 individuals representing all major institutional sectors applied to become the next president of PC. Applicants including sitting presidents vied for the opportunity to lead PC, which Money magazine lists as the highest-ranked private institution in South Carolina in its "Best Colleges in America, Ranked by Value" and the U.S. News and World Report ranks as one of the nation's best liberal arts colleges for advancing social mobility.

During his tenure at Alma College, vandenBerg led the five most productive fundraising years in the college's history. Alma College averaged raising \$17 million a year since vandenBerg arrived in 2015. As Alma College's chief external relations officer, vandenBerg worked closely with the Alma, Mich., community in a variety of ways, including promoting economic development, facilitating community service projects and internship opportunities, and meeting with elected officials.

Alma College set records for annual giving and overall philanthropic support during vandenBerg's nearly six-year tenure as vice president for advancement. In addition to Alma College averaging \$17 million per year in philanthropic production since vandenBerg has served as vice president, budget-related annual giving at Alma College has averaged more than \$1.6 million per year.

vandenBerg holds a doctorate in higher education management from the University of Pennsylvania. He earned a Master of Public Affairs (M.P.A.) from the Indiana University School of Public and Environmental Affairs, where he concentrated in nonprofit management and public policy analysis. vandenBerg graduated summa cum laude and Phi Beta Kappa from Alma College.

vandenBerg and his wife, Melissa, recently celebrated their 10th wedding anniversary and have two children, Jackson (9) and Sylvia (5), as well as a pet dog named Penny. Both lifelong Presbyterians (PCUSA), Matt and Melissa were married just blocks from where they met, at New York Avenue Presbyterian Church in Washington, D.C.

Following several years as a pre-kindergarten teacher, Melissa is a stay-at-home mom who enjoys reading, gardening, hiking, and volunteering with Meals on Wheels. She earned her Bachelor of Arts in English from The George Washington University. Matt and Melissa relish time together as a family and enjoy taking their children on outdoor adventures. All five members of the vandenBerg Family are excited about fully and actively engaging in the life of the campus.

"Melissa and I almost instantly felt at home upon arriving on campus," Matt said. "We are eager to begin this exciting new calling and to embrace the PC community."



ROBERT ACUNTO

ATHLETIC DIRECTOR | 4TH YEAR

Robert Acunto is in his fourth year as Director of Athletics after assuming the role in August of 2019.

Acunto comes to PC after a year at UTEP as Senior Associate Athletic Director for Development and External Operations. He oversaw the Development, Marketing, Video Production & Graphic Design, and Ticketing areas, while serving as the sport supervisor for football and men's golf.

Acunto has over 20 years of experience in all aspects of intercollegiate athletics. Before taking his position at UTEP he served as Interim Director of Athletics at The Citadel from December, 2017 to August, 2018. He was also The Citadel's Interim Director of Athletics during the summer of 2014. Acunto was a member of The Citadel athletic department staff for eight years, beginning as Assistant Athletic Director for Compliance & Academic Services in 2010 before working his way up the ranks.

Acunto's responsibilities at The Citadel included identifying, cultivating and stewarding all sources of major gifts and sponsorships. He enjoyed regular engagement with donors, alumni, local and regional business owners and operators, as well as the general public to create interest, excitement, loyalty and revenue for the department.

He was Associate Athletic Director for External Operations at The Citadel from 2015-16, prior to being elevated to Senior Associate Athletic Director for External Operations in August, 2016. During that time he provided oversight for the athletic communications, concessions, corporate sales & sponsorships, marketing & promotions, athletic special events, ticket operations & outbound sales and video production areas. He took each revenue-generating unit to new heights, achieving record numbers in attendance and broadcast viewership, while implementing qualitative improvements in relationship building, budget management, fiscal integrity and communications planning. His vision and leadership also produced record ticket revenue, significant increases in corporate sponsorship revenue, record-setting licensing revenue, and increased exposure and visibility for the department through strategic communication efforts and coordinated broadcast opportunities.

Acunto also acted as the sport supervisor for football and women's soccer and, previously, for the men's tennis and co-ed rifle programs. He served on the executive leadership team for both the athletic department and the college.

He came to The Citadel after working at the Atlantic 10 Conference as Assistant Commissioner for Business and Internal Operations from 2009-10.

Acunto spent over five years (2004-09) at American University as Assistant and Associate Director of Athletics for Compliance. This included a nine-month stint (2006-07) as Interim Director of Athletics and Recreation. He also shepherded the facilities and event operations, strength & conditioning, athletic equipment services, men's and women's soccer and wrestling programs while at American University. In addition, he served as the athletic department liaison between admissions, financial aid, human resources and the office of general counsel.

He received his Bachelor of Science degree in Business Administration from Bryant College (Smithfield, R.I.) in May 1992, graduating cum laude. He was a member of the soccer team at Bryant College, a two-time captain, All-Region honoree and a part of the 1988 NCAA Division II national semifinalists.

While pursuing his Masters of Education from Springfield College (Springfield, Mass.) – which he received in 1996 – Acunto was an assistant men's soccer coach for the NCAA Division III program. He went on to become the head men's soccer coach at Bard College (1996-97) and assistant men's soccer coach at Vanderbilt (1997-01). At one time Acunto served as the Olympic Development Program State Head Coach and as Administrator for the Tennessee Olympic Development Program. Formerly, Acunto held a USSF "A" Coaching License.

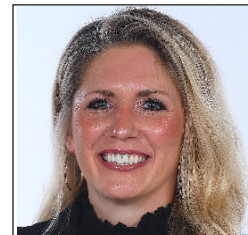

"REPRESENTATIVES OF ATHLETICS' INTERESTS" ARE ALL ALUMNI AND FRIENDS OF PRESBYTERIAN COLLEGE ATHLETICS PROGRAMS; YOU ARE BOUND UNDER THE SAME RULES AND REGULATIONS AS THE ATHLETES, COACHES, AND STAFF. THIS CONTAINS A BRIEF OVERVIEW, AND IF FUTURE QUESTIONS/SITUATIONS ARISE PLEASE BE SURE TO "ASK BEFORE YOU ACT" BECAUSE CONSEQUENCES OF NCAA VIOLATIONS INCLUDE:

- ENROLLED STUDENT-ATHLETES DECLARED INELIGIBLE
- ELIGIBILITY OF PROSPECTIVE STUDENT-ATHLETES JEOPARDIZED
- NCAA REGULATIONS AND SANCTIONS PLACED ON THE COLLEGE AND ATHLETIC DEPARTMENT
- ATHLETICS REPRESENTATIVES FORCED TO DISASSOCIATE FROM THE COLLEGE AND/OR LOSS OF TICKET PRIVILEGES

WHAT IS A REPRESENTATIVE OF ATHLETICS INTERESTS (BOOSTER/DONOR)?

ALL ALUMNI, FRIENDS, AND EMPLOYEES OF THE COLLEGE ARE CATEGORIZED AS "REPRESENTATIVES OF ATHLETICS INTEREST." THE NCAA STIPULATES THAT ONCE AN INDIVIDUAL HAS BEEN IDENTIFIED AS A "REPRESENTATIVE" OR "BOOSTER/DONOR" HE/SHE RETAINS THIS STATUS FOREVER EVEN IF THE INDIVIDUAL IS NO LONGER ASSOCIATED WITH THE ATHLETICS PROGRAM. FURTHERMORE, THE NCAA STATES THAT IT IS POSSIBLE FOR A PERSON TO BE A REPRESENTATIVE OF MORE THAN ONE INSTITUTION AT THE SAME TIME.

A REPRESENTATIVE OF ATHLETICS INTEREST IS ANYONE WHO HAS EVER:

- MADE ANY TYPE OF CONTRIBUTION TO THE ATHLETICS DEPARTMENT OR TO A BOOSTER CLUB,
- JOINED THE INSTITUTION'S BOOSTER CLUB OR ANY SPORT SPECIFIC GROUP,
- PROVIDED OR HELPED ARRANGE EMPLOYMENT FOR A STUDENT-ATHLETE,
- PROVIDED BENEFITS TO ENROLLED STUDENT-ATHLETES OR THEIR FAMILIES,
- ASSISTED IN ANY MANNER IN THE RECRUITMENT OF PROSPECTIVE STUDENT-ATHLETES,
- PROMOTED THE INSTITUTION'S ATHLETICS PROGRAMS IN ANY MANNER.

AS A REPRESENTATIVE OF ATHLETICS INTEREST YOU MAY NOT:

- CONTACT A PROSPECT'S COACH, PRINCIPAL OR COUNSELOR IN AN EFFORT TO EVALUATE A PROSPECT,
- VISIT THE PROSPECT'S INSTITUTION TO PICK UP FILM OR TRANSCRIPTS,
- CONTACT A PROSPECT, HIS/HER PARENTS, LEGAL GUARDIANS, OR SPOUSE ON OR OFF CAMPUS,
- CONTACT A PROSPECT BY TELEPHONE OR LETTER,
- MAKE SPECIAL ARRANGEMENTS TO ENTERTAIN A RECRUIT,
- PROVIDE EXTRA BENEFITS TO A PROSPECT OR STUDENT-ATHLETE, OR TO THE PARENTS, FAMILY AND/OR GUARDIANS OF A PROSPECT OR STUDENT-ATHLETE.

WHO IS A PROSPECTIVE STUDENT-ATHLETE?

A PROSPECTIVE STUDENT-ATHLETE IS A PERSON WHO HAS STARTED NINTH (9TH) GRADE, REGARDLESS OF HIS/HER ATHLETIC ABILITY AND/OR PARTICIPATION. PLEASE REMEMBER THAT A PROSPECTIVE STUDENT-ATHLETE REMAINS A PROSPECT EVEN AFTER SIGNING A NATIONAL LETTER OF INTENT (NLI) OR ACCEPTS AN OFFER OF FINANCIAL AID FROM THE INSTITUTION. A PERSON REMAINS A PROSPECT UNTIL HE/SHE REPORTS FOR THE FIRST DAY OF CLASSES FOR A REGULAR (FALL/SPRING) TERM.

WHAT IS AN "EXTRA BENEFIT"?
