
Davidson's Mari Adams and Mason Sheron have combined

for 611 rushing yards and 10 touchdowns this season.

1ST AND 10

- Coming off a week four bye, Davidson will open Pioneer Football League action at Presbyterian.
- The two teams have met 34 times on the gridiron with Saturday's meeting being the fourth Carolina Border Clash / Battle for the 1919 Cup.
- The Wildcats enter 2-1 overall following a 42-12 win over Point University Sept. 14.
- Mari Adams led the 'Cats with 207 yards on the ground and a pair of touchdowns against the Skyhawks.
- The junior running back is the just seventh player in school history to go over the 200-yard mark in a contest.
- Adams and backfield mate **Mason Sheron** are tied for fourth nationally with five touchdowns each.
- The duo has also combined to rush for 611 yards.
- ◆ The Wildcats are 5-1 in conference openers under head coach Scott Abell, who has a 31-14 PFL mark, while capturing two regular

season crowns and leading the 'Cats to three FCS Playoff appearances.



• Davidson, which leads the nation in rushing offense at 368.0 yards per game, also ranks among FCS leaders in total offense (461.3 / 5th), scoring offense (38.3 / 9th), passing yards allowed (151.0 / 10th), 1st down defense (52 / 15th) and time of possession (34:48 / 5th).

INSIDE THE SERIES

- Davidson and Presbyterian first met on Nov. 22, 1919. The game ended in a scoreless tie.
- Saturday's meeting will be the 35th all-time, with the Wildcats leading the series, 18-14-2.
- Since Presbyterian joined the PFL in 2020, Davidson is 4-1 against the league foes.
- In 2021, the two teams formed the Carolina Border Clash / Battle for the 1919 Cup.

LAST TIME OUT | DAVIDSON 42, POINT UNIVERSITY 12 - SEPT. 14, 2024 | DAVIDSON, N.C.

- Mari Adams rushed for a career-high 207 yards and scored a pair of touchdowns as the Wildcats pulled away from Point University 42-12 September 14 inside Davidson College Stadium.
- The first since Wesley Dugger (231 vs. San Diego, 11/10/18), Adams is just the seventh back in program history to go over the 200-yard mark in a contest.
- Davidson finished the night with 482 yards on the ground on 68 carries (7.1 yards per carry).
- * After Point made it a two-point game to open the third quarter, the Wildcats responded with 28 straight points high-

lighted by three scoring plays of 25 yards or more — an Adams 28-yard rush, **Jaleel Sales**' 27-yard pass from **LJ Phillips Jr.** and **Will Jones**' 29 rush.

- Davidson, which led 14-6 at the half, needed just six plays on its opening drive, capped by a **Brody Reina** 7-yard reception from **Luke Durkin** to grab the early lead.
- Adams' first score came on an 11-yard scamper that finished off a 13-play, 90-yard drive. He had a long run of 40 yards on the opening drive, and his 33-yard run in the third quarter helped set up **Mason Sheron**'s 3-yard score.
- Point cut the deficit to 14-12 when Michael Gossett connected with Quintravious Teasley on a 15-yard pass in the corner of the end zone. Davidson's **Daniel Carter** intercepted the Skyhawks' two-point attempt in the end zone halting their momentum.

LAST MEETING | DAVIDSON 45, PRESBYTERIAN - OCT 28, 2023 | DAVIDSON, N.C.

- The 1919 Cup is staying in Davidson. The Wildcats made sure of that with a 45-28 victory over Presbyterian in the Third Annual Carolina Border Clash Saturday night at Richardson Stadium.
- Running back **Mason Sheron** rushed 23 times for 139 yards, and his 43-yard touchdown made it 21-10 early in the second quarter.
- Fellow back Mari Adams added 43 rushing yards and provided the Wildcats' first two scores on 1- and 4-yard touchdown runs.
- Quarterback **Coulter Cleland** was efficient through the air, finishing 7-of-8 passing for 69 yards and three scores. He hit Brody Reina for a 12-yard touchdown with 1:04 left in the half, making it 31-13 at the break, and started the second half with a 27-yard Cleland touchdown pass to Mark McCurdy to push the lead to 25. In the fourth, Cleland connected with Aaron Maione on a 4-yard scoring play.
- Davidson kicker **Adam Zouagui** capped a 12-play drive in the second quarter with a 50-yard field goal, his longest to date.
- ◆ Defensive end Jonathan Hammond led the defense with eight tackles and a sack, while defensive back Amare Hill added seven tackles.
- Presbyterian quarterback Tyler Wesley was the top Blue Hose threat, rushing for 198 yards and a score and throwing for two touchdowns.

UP NEXT

• Davidson will continue its stretch of eight straight conference games to conclude the regular season when Marist comes to town for a 1 p.m. kick off next weekend.

ADAMS NAMED TO 2024 WALTER PAYTON AWARD PRESEASON WATCH LIST

- Davidson running back Mari Adams has been named to the preseason watch list for the 2024 Walter Payton Award, which is presented annually to the national offensive player of the year in Division I FCS football.
- The award, in its 38th season and affectionately known as the Heisman of the FCS, is named for legendary running back Walter Payton, who starred at Jackson State as part of his Hall of Fame career. Past recipients include Steve McNair, Tony Romo, Brian Westbrook, Jimmy Garoppolo, Cooper Kupp and Trey Lance.
- As a sophomore, Adams led the Pioneer Football League and finished fifth nationally in rushing touchdowns with 15, while ranking among conference leaders in rushing yards (1,019 / 3rd), yards per rush (6.21 / 4th) and yards per game (92.6 / 3rd).
- Adams, a native of nearby Shelby, N.C., ran for over 100 yards in a game five times, including 150 twice highlighted by a career-best 171 yards and three scores at Butler.
- ◆ All 13 FCS conferences are represented on the watch list, which includes 2023 Payton recipient Mark Gronowski of national champion South Dakota State as one of its 10 past finalists. Only quarterbacks Armanti Edwards from Appalachian State (2008 and '09) and Jeremiah Briscoe of Sam Houston State (2016 and '17) have won the award more than once.

RAWLINS NAMED TO PRESTIGIOUS ALLSTATE AFCA GOOD WORKS TEAM®

- Senior Julian Rawlins of the Davidson College football team has been named to the 2024 Allstate AFCA Good Works Team®.
- An all-conference defensive end from nearby Huntersville, N.C., Rawlins is just one of 22 student-athletes from across the country to earn this prestigious honor for their work not just on the field, but in the community and classroom.
- This year's Allstate AFCA Good Works Team was selected from a record 178
 nominees, representing players and coaches from colleges and universities across the
 country for their unwavering commitment to community service and their "good works"
 off the field.
- The Allstate Wuerffel Trophy, announced later this year, is presented to one of the 11 NCAA Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) players elected to the Allstate AFCA Good Works Team.
- "Each year, I'm inspired by the way these young men use their gifts to make a positive impact on their communities," said Tim Tebow, two-time national champion, Heisman Trophy winner, 2009 Good Works Team member and 2008 Allstate Wuerffel Trophy recipient. "I'm once again honored to help celebrate this award and the outstanding work it highlights."

PRESEASON ALL-CONFERENCE

- Davidson's Mari Adams (RB), Malik McDaniel (OL), Julian Rawlins (DE) and Daniel Carter (S) have been selected preseason all-conference, as announced by the Pioneer Football League.
- Named to the 2024 Walter Payton Award watch list, Adams led the PFL and finished fifth nationally in rushing touchdowns a year ago with 15, while ranking among league leaders in rushing yards (1,019 / 3rd), yards per rush (6.21 / 4th) and yards per game (92.6 / 3rd).
- Adams, a native of nearby Shelby, N.C., ran for over 100 yards in a game five times, including 150 twice, highlighted by a career-best 171 yards and three scores at Butler.
- A second-team all-conference selection a year ago, McDaniel started every game for the 'Cats in 2023, while helping anchor an offensive line that led to the nation's leading rushing attack for the fourth straight season.
- Last year, Rawlins led Davidson's defense in tackles for loss, sacks and quarterback hurries, earning a spot on the PFL's first team.
- Carter, a two-year starter for the Wildcats at safety, led the team in tackles and interceptions a year ago. Like Rawlins, Carter is a two-time all-league selection second-team (2023), honorable mention (2022).

READY, WILLING AND ABELL

- In just 6+ seasons on the Davidson sideline, Head Coach **Scott Abell** is second in program history with 43 coaching victories.
- The 29th head coach in the program's 125 years, Abell is just the 10th to lead the Wildcats for at least five seasons.
- The two-time Conference Coach of the Year has guided the 'Cats to back-to-back PFL titles, the first in school history, while holding a school-best .636 winning percentage.
- Just as impressive, Davidson is 31-14 under Abell's leadership in PFL play.
- Abell is just two wins from becoming the school's all-time wins leader (William Younger 44).

Now in his seventh season on the Wildcat sideline, Scott Abell was named the Davidson football program's 28th head coach in January 2018.

Since taking the helm, Abell has guided the Cats to a 43-24 record, 31-14 conference mark, six straight winning seasons, two Pioneer Football League championships and three FCS Playoff appearances, while twice earning conference Coach of the Year honors. In addition, Abell's .641 winning percentage is the best in school history, while his wins total is currently third all-time.

During the 2023 campaign, the Wildcats put together one their most dominant and successful stretches during the Abell era, winning seven straight games by an average margin of 26.9 points per game.

Davidson, which ended the 2023 season 7-4, finished with the nation's top-rushing attack for the fourth consecutive year. In addition, the 'Cats also led all of FCS in scoring offense (40.0), while ranking among national leaders in total offense (463.2 ypg / 5th), passing efficiency (158.37 / 8th), 3rd down conversion defense (13th), red zone offense (7th) and time of possession (33:25 / 4th).

One of just four teams to make three straight FCS Playoffs from spring of 2021 to fall of 2022, Davidson finished the 2022 campaign 8-4 overall and 6-2 in league play, while leading the nation in rushing offense for the third consecutive season. Along with its ground attack, Abell's squad was once again among the tops in the country in total offense, passing efficiency, scoring offense, total defense and time of possession.

The 'Cats also closed the 2022 season with an undefeated record at home running their win streak at Richardson Stadium to 13 straight.

In 2021, Abell led Davidson to its second straight PFL title going 8-3 overall and 7-1 in league play. In addition to their second FCS Playoff appearance in as many seasons, the Wildcats led the nation in rushing offense (348.4 ypg) and 3rd down conversion percentage (54.3%). Abell's offense also ranked among national leaders in time of possession (2nd), passing efficiency (9th) and total offense (460.4 ypg).

Over the course of the 2021 spring (CoVID-19) and fall seasons, Davidson put together an 11-2 mark in conference play.

Abell's third season at the helm was pushed to the Spring of 2021 due to the CoVID-19 pandemic. It was worth the wait as the Wildcats captured their first conference crown in 52 years, winning the program's first-ever Pioneer Football League crown and earning Davidson's first postseason berth in 52 seasons and a trip to the FCS Playoffs.

In the unorthodox 2020-21 season, Abell and the 'Cats faced the most daunting schedule in the modern era, opening at nationally-ranked Elon and facing another Top-25 foe in San Diego, which the Wildcats would knock off in Southern California to snap the Toreros' FCS record-tying 39-game conference win streak. In addition, it was Davidson's first-ever win over a ranked opponent away from home.

Coming off the program's first winning season in over a decade, year two saw the program take another step forward under Abell's guidance. Along with recording the most FCS wins (6) in a single season, Davidson went 8-4 in 2019, its most successful season in 19 years.

In his first season at the helm, Abell led Davidson to its first winning record since 2007, directing the 'Cats to a 6-5 mark that concluded with a heroic goal-line stand on the final play of the season to secure the successful campaign.

Coach Abell helped lead the Wildcat offense to NCAA FCS statistical championships in total offense (561.9) and rushing offense (442.9), while directing the 'Cats to top-five statistical rankings in third down conversion percentage, offensive red zone and scoring.

The 2018 Wildcats snapped a 17-game Pioneer

Football League losing streak with a 40-35 road victory at Valparaiso and earned national attention for a 91-61 Thursday night shootout victory over Guilford.

Abell's squad rewrote the NCAA FCS history books with a trip west to PFL power San Diego, steering Davidson to a 789-yard rushing performance, shattering a 30-year record set by Missouri State in 1998 (681). Four Wildcats rushed for over 150 yards including Dugger's 231-yard output, the fifth-best single game rushing performance in Davidson football's 117-year history.

The Wildcats reset 10 program records including rushing yards in a season (4765), rushing touchdowns (55) and scoring (494 points).

Under Abell's leadership, the 'Cats have earned 44 all-conference honors with 39 more receiving honorablemention recognition.

Abell joined the Wildcats following a six-year stint as head football coach at Division III Washington & Lee University. While leader of the Generals, Abell posted a 39-24 overall record and won the Old Dominion Athletic Conference Championship three times. His conference peers selected him ODAC Coach of the Year on three occasions and he was tabbed the Willy Lanier Virginia State Coach of the Year twice.

Abell served as the Washington & Lee offensive coordinator until 2012 when he was elevated to head coach. Under Abell, the Generals were transformed into a national rushing powerhouse, leading the NCAA Division III in rushing three of his final six seasons. His 2015 squad went undefeated in the regular season, the first to do so in program history, and set records in total yards (5,439), rushing offense (4,773) and points scored (417).

His head coaching career started uphill in 1997 at Liberty High School, near Lynchburg, Va., where he turned an 0-10 program into district champions in three years. He moved to nearby Amherst High School, which had not brought home a state championship in a dozen years, and led teams to back-to-back state titles.

Prior to landing his first head coaching gig, Abell served as an assistant at Altavista, Western Albemarle and Albemarle High School. His duties ranged from offensive coordinator to coaching the quarterbacks, defensive backs and linebackers.

Abell graduated with a bachelor's degree in education from Longwood College in 1992 where he played both football and baseball. A gifted baseball player, Abell was drafted by the Kansas City Royals and spent two years in the minor leagues, hitting a home run in his first at-bat.

Abell then turned his attention back to football and teaching, eventually earning his master's of administration/supervision at Lynchburg in 2007.
