IT'S PALADINS

We're the "Pala-dins", NOT "Pah-ladins", "Pah-ladians", or "Purple" Paladins, just as South Carolina isn't called the "Garnet" Gamecocks or Clemson the "Orange" Tigers.

WHAT'S A PALADIN?

A "Paladin" is a knight on a horse, a paragon of chivalry; a heroic champion; a strong supporter or defender of a cause; and any of the 12 peers of French emperor Charlemagne's court. While history reveals knights were not always mounted men-at-arms, the modern image of a knight, mounted and in full armor, has undoubtedly influenced the concept of Furman's mascot.

WE'VE BEEN PLAYING THIS SPORT A LONG TIME

The 2025 campaign marks the 120th season of football at Furman, which has played 1,194 games (649-507-38) in its history (began in 1889). Furman's 649 victories are tops among all current Southern Conference schools.

SETTING THE SCENE

A 23-21 season opening winner over William & Mary at Paladin Stadium on Saturday, Furman returns to action this Saturday for another home contest, this time against Presbyterian, which opened its season with a 15-10 upset win over previously FCS 11th-ranked and reigning Southern Conference champion Mercer on Saturday in Macon. The Furman-Presbyterian game is sponsored by Greenville YMCA and highlights Youth Day.



SERIES NOTES

Saturday's game will mark the 57th meeting in football between Furman and Presbyterian but first since 2014. Furman leads the series, 43-12-1, but PC won the last meeting, 10-7, in a contest played in Clinton in 2014. Prior to that Furman had reeled off 15 consecutive wins in the series, including 14 straight in Greenville dating back to 1980. The last Blue Hose win in Greenville, a 17-10 verdict, came in 1979 at Sirrine Stadium. Furman owns a 13-0 record versus PC in Paladin Stadium and is 37-8-1 all-time against the Blue Hose in Greenville.

LAST MEETING

CLINTON, S.C. (Sept. 13, 2014) — Heys McMath connected with Kris Hurley on a 9-yard touchdown pass midway through the fourth quarter to lift Presbyterian to a 10-7 victory over FCS 12th-ranked Furman at Bailey Memorial Stadium.

The win, which came after lightning delayed the game's start for one hour and 47 minutes, marked the first victory by PC over Furman since 1979, halting a 15-game series losing skid.

Furman led 7-3 in the tight affair until DaRon Dickey set up the go-ahead score by swatting an option pitch by Paladin quarterback **Dillon Woodruff** and recovering the fumble at the Paladin 35. The Blue Hose used seven consecutive rushing plays to move the ball to the Furman 6. After a holding penalty erased a touchdown, the Blue Hose faced third-and-goal from the nine and converted when McMath avoided a heavy third down rush to connect with Hurley on a crossing route in the corner of the end zone for the go-ahead score with 8:15 to go.

The Paladins had two chances to erase the deficit but were forced to punt on their next to last possession. On its final possession Furman converted a fourth-and-four play with a Woodruff 8-yard completion to **Duncan Fletcher** to the PC 36 before the drive ended following four straight incompletions.

The Paladins managed only 78 yards total offense in the second half and finished with 214 total yards.

PC produced only four total yards in the first quarter and finished with 192.

Woodruff completed 10-of-24 passes for 114 yards and a touchdown and led Furman with 16 rushes for 41 yards.

McMath passed for 79 yards, completing 9-of-18 passes and a score.

Cory Magwood topped Furman defensively with eight tackles, and **DeAndre Thornton**, making his first career start at defensive tackle, had six stops and two of Furman's four sacks.

LAST TIME OUT

GREENVILLE, S.C. (Aug. 30, 2025) — Preseason All-American placekicker **Ian Williams** connected on three second-half field goals as Furman rallied to top William & Mary, 23-21, in the season opener for both schools at Paladin Stadium.

Trailing 21-20 with under seven minutes remaining in the fourth quarter, **Trey Hedden** went 3-for-3 through the air to engineer a seven-play, 43-yard drive that resulted in a go-ahead field goal by Williams, his third of the afternoon, with 2:43 to play. William & Mary faced a third down and one at its own 34 on its next drive when **Taylen Blaylock** dropped Rashad Raymond for a four-yard loss. The Tribe elected to leave its offense on the field on fourth down, but Blaylock broke up Tyler Hughes' pass attempt over the middle and Furman's **Jayquan Smith** carried the ball three times for 15 yards to pick up a first down and run out the clock to secure the Paladin victory.

Blaylock finished the game with six tackles, two tackles-for-a-loss, a pass breakup, and a 43-yard interception return for a touchdown in his Paladin debut. The pick-six from Blaylock came on the opening drive of the game to give the Paladins a 7-0 lead. William & Mary evened the score on Raymond's three-yard touchdown run with 10:18 left in the half before freshman **Evan James** hauled in a four-yard touchdown pass from Hedden on Furman's next possession to give the Paladins a 14-7 lead at the half.

Hughes capped a four-play, 80-yard drive with a one-yard touchdown plunge to knot the game at 14-14 midway through the second quarter. On the Tribe's next possession Hughes connected with Sean McElwain on a nine-yard scoring toss to put William & Mary in front 21-14 with 5:26 left in the period.

Furman answered as Williams capped a nine-play, 41-yard drive with a 50-yard field goal to trim the deficit to 21-17 with 1:37 to go in the third quarter. On Furman's next possession,

the Paladins drove 39 yards on six plays before Williams cut the margin to 21-20 with a field goal from 42 yards out.

Along with Williams' go-ahead field goal, the Paladin defense provided three stops in the final quarter to seal the season-opening victory.

Furman offense accounted for just 237 yards, but Hedden went 21-of-29 through the air for 179 yards and a touchdown. **Gavin Hall** rushed 16 times for 55 yards while James recorded seven receptions for 68 yards and a score.

Hughes finished 19-of-31 for 208 yards, a touchdown, and an interception. The junior also led the Tribe with 57 rushing yards on 15 carries.

PRESEASON POLLS

Furman was a preseason No. 6 pick in a poll conducted by Southern Conference head coaches. The Paladins posted a 3-8 record a year ago, including a 2-5 SoCon mark that produced a sixth-place league finish. Presbyterian was a preseason No. 7 selection in a poll by Pioneer Football League head coaches. The Blue Hose went 6-6 overall last year and 4-4 in PFL play, tying for sixth place.

FURMAN VERSUS THE PFL

Furman has faced only three current members of the Pioneer Football League (PFL) — Presbyterian, Davidson, and Stetson — but only one game against an active PFL foe. That came last year against Stetson in a contest the Paladins won, 48-7, in Paladin Stadium. The Paladins' series histories to date versus Presbyterian (Furman leads 43-12-1) and Davidson (Furman leads 39-15) were registered prior to the Blue and Wildcats joining the PFL.

FURMAN, PC NOTES

Furman safeties coach and special teams coordinator **Tommy Spangler**, now in his fourth season on the Paladin staff, served as PC's assistant head coach/defensive coordinator from 1997-00 and two stints as head coach — 2001-06 and 2017-20. He coached the Blue Hose to a 2005 South Atlantic Conference championship with a 10-2 overall record and 7-0 league mark, and was named SAC Coach of the Year. A Spangler signee at PC, quarterback **Tyler Huff**, spent three years in the Blue Hose program and, following graduation, enrolled at Furman, where he etched his name into Paladin football history. As Furman's signal caller for the 2022 and '23 seasons he helped the Paladins go 19-4 as a starter, including a 13-0 mark versus SoCon opposition. Recipient of the prestigious 2023 Armed Forces Merit Award, he was named 2023 SoCon Offensive Player of the Year after leading the Paladins to a league championship, NCAA quarterfinal round playoff appearance, and No. 6 final national ranking. Huff secured his master's degree from Furman in December of 2023.

FIVE PALADINS LAND PRESEASON ALL-SOCON HONORS

Furman placed five players on the preseason All-Southern Conference team, which was announced in late July at the league's media day in Greenville. The selections include four first team picks — offensive tackle **Eli Brasher**, tight end **Jackson Pryor**, linebacker **Ryan Earl**, and placekicker **Ian Williams**. Offensive guard **Luke Petit** garnered second team recognition. Coaches were not allowed to vote for their own teams or players.

Brasher, a 6-foot-4, 288-pound redshirt junior from Black Mountain, N.C., made 10 starts at left tackle and logged 685 play participations a year ago. He is among a group of four returning starters along Furman's offensive line.

Pryor fashioned a solid true freshman campaign in 2024, catching 16 passes for 239 yards and two touchdowns. The 6-foot-5 Boone, N.C. product hauled in a six-yard touchdown pass in the final minute to beat The Citadel, 17-16, in Charleston, and was named to the SoCon All-Freshman Team.

Earl, a 6-foot-2, 231-pound Peachtree City, Ga., native, tallied 49 tackles in 2024 and was selected to the SoCon All-Freshman Team.

Furman's most decorated returnee is Williams, a Charlotte, N.C., native and one of the FCS's most effective three-way specialist, excelling in placements, kickoffs, and punting. A year ago he connected on 14-of-20 field goal attempts, 24-of-25 PATs, and registered 43 touchbacks of 49 kickoffs. In addition he averaged 40.6 yards on 60 punts.

Williams set a new Furman record with a SoCon season best 57-yard field goal in a 48-7 win over Stetson and matched it with another 57-yarder in the season finale versus Mercer. His 64.0 kickoff yards average in 2024 led the league and 87.8 touchback/kickoff percentage easily paced the SoCon, with the second highest percentage at 48.2 percent. Only five of his kickoffs last fall were returned and for only a 12.0 average — the lowest (best) in the FCS.

WILLIAMS PICKS UP WHERE HE LEFT OFF

Furman preseason first team All-America placekicker **Ian Williams** has gotten off to a start befitting his tab as the top kicker in the FCS. On Saturday he stepped up in a big way in the Paladins' 23-21 win over William & Mary, accounting for all nine Furman second half points with three field goals that rallied Furman from a 21-14 second half deficit. His first field goal covered 50 yards in the third quarter, and he connected from 42 and 32 yards in the fourth period, his final conversion coming with 2:43 remaining for the game winning points. In addition to totaling 11 of Furman's points, he averaged 46.6 yards on five punts, including a long of 61 yards, and tallied five touchbacks on six kickoffs. His work earned him SoCon Special Teams Player of the Week (the fourth of his career) and Stats Perform National Special Teams Player of the Week accolades.

NINE IN A ROW, CAREER NUMBERS

In converting all three field goal attempts in Saturday's win over William & Mary, Ian Williams extended his streak of made field goals to nine, a run that includes makes from 57 and 50 yards. Williams' 50-yard field goal in Saturday's victory was his fourth from 50+ yards and upped his career numbers to 45-of-59 (.763). His kickoff touchback percentage (.714), composed of 152 touchbacks on 213 kicks, includes 48-of-55 (.873) over the last 12 games (2024-Present).

BLAYLOCK STEPS UP BIG

It didn't take Paladin graduate safety **Taylen Blaylock** long to make a big impression — actually one minute and 34 seconds of clock time in Saturday's 23-21 win over William & Mary. That's when Blaylock crossed the goal line to complete a 43-yard interception return to help give Furman the early 7-0 lead. He followed that with two critical defensive plays late in the fourth quarter — the first coming on a third-and-one play at the William & Mary 34 when he burst through the line on a safety blitz to record a four-yard loss. On the next play, he batted down a fourth down pass attempt to give Furman possession on downs with 1:56 remaining. He finished the game with six tackles, including two for-loss, to go along with his pick-six and pass breakup.

FIRST TIME STARTERS

Saturday's 2025 season opening win over William & Mary featured 10 first-time starters for Furman, including sophomore **Jackson Pryor**, TE; redshirt freshman **Chase Gregorek**, OT; true freshman **Evan James**, WR; sophomore **Gavin Hall**, RB; redshirt sophomore **Joshua Stoneking**, DE; redshirt freshman **Demetrius Baldwin**, DT; redshirt junior **Dylan Chiedo**, BAN; graduate **Keon Jones**, CB; graduate **AJ Seay**, CB; and graduate **Taylen Blaylock**, S.

SOCON LEADER

Furman produced a league best eight Southern Conference All-Freshman Team selections a year ago, and seven are counted among the returnees — RB **Gavin Hall**, QB **Trey Hedden**, TE **Jackson Pryor**, DT **Caldwell Bussey**, LB **Ryan Earl**, S **Billy Lewis**, and LS **Riley Smith**.

WELCOME BACK...

Furman welcomed back several players who were sidelined for much — if not all — of the 2024 season. The most notable return is redshirt junior running back **Jayquan Smith**, who was sidelined after sustaining a knee injury versus The Citadel in 2023 — an injury that keep him out for the 2024 season, in addition to spring practices in both 2024 and '25. Smith had six rushes for 21 yards against William & Mary, including a game clinching eight-yard run on a third-and-three play that gave Furman a first down at the Tribe 15, allowing the Paladins to run out the clock. Graduate tight end **Joshua Burrell** is back after a 2023 season that saw register starts versus Ole Miss and Charleston Southern before he suffered a season ending ankle injury four plays into the CSU contest. His return saw him catch five passes for 26 yards against William & Mary. Two players, safeties **AK Burrell**, a redshirt sophomore, and graduate **Justin Hartwell**, who a year ago were projected to start before injuries in the preseason sidelined them for the year, are also back this fall.



TWINS REUNITED

The 2025 season brings with it a reunion of twins **Joshua** and **Jordan Burrell**, both graduate members of the Paladin program and Blythewood, S.C. products. It's year two in Greenville for Joshua, a tight end and December 2023 graduate of Florida State who saw his 2024 season at Furman end early with an ankle injury. Jordan, meanwhile, is in his first year with the Paladins after playing the last two years at Lenoir-Rhyne prior to graduating last December. He spent the first two years of his football career at Army-West Point.

NEW LOOK SECONDARY

Three of the five starters in Furman's secondary against William & Mary are graduate transfers. They included cornerbacks **Keon Jones** (Prarie View A&M) and **A.J. Seay** (North Alabama), and safety **Taylen Blaylock** (Lindenwood). Jones was credited with 25 tackles, an interception, and five pass breakups a year ago at Prarie View. Seay earned playing time in 22 games and 12 starts over his last two seasons (2023 & '24) at North Alabama, where he totaled 38 tackles, two interceptions, and three pass breakups. Seay spent his first two seasons (2021 & '22) at Presbyterian. Blaylock, meanwhile, spent the last three seasons at Lindenwood, where he tallied 38 tackles and three interceptions in 2023. He began his collegiate career at Sam Houston State in 2021.

HENDRIX VS. THE SOCON, ETC.

Head coach **Clay Hendrix** owns a 41-21 record (.661) vs. Southern Conference foes — his .661 winning percentage ranking third behind his former head coach **Dick Sheridan** (.798) and **Jimmy Satterfield** (.702), which he served as an assistant. Combining his now 54 wins with the 155 he had a hand in as Paladin assistant coach for 19 years (1988-06) and 39 registered during his playing tenure (1982-85), Hendrix been part of 248 Furman triumphs over 30+ years.

NOTABLE DEPARTURE

Furman's most significant loss off last year's squad was All-America linebacker **Evan DiMaggio**, who racked up a SoCon leading 120 tackles, including 10.5 for-loss, and pair of sacks. DiMaggio was a veteran of 54 games and 18 starts, and finished his career with 285 tackles, including 25.5 for-loss.

NO LONGER IN UNIFORM BUT STILL PLUGGED IN

Furman All-SoCon safety **Hugh Ryan** concluded his outstanding playing career in 2023 but is still part of Paladin football's operation, having begun his coaching tenure last year as a defensive assistant working with the safeties and also Paladin special teams.

THREE SCRUBBED GAMES IN HENDRIX ERA

Due to devastating effects of Hurricane Helene last year's Furman-Samford game was canceled, marking the third Paladin contest — all home games — to get canceled in head coach **Clay Hendrix's** eight seasons as head coach. Other games canceled during the Hendrix era include a Sept. 15, 2018, home game versus Colgate, and a Apr. 17, 2021, home contest versus Wofford after the Terriers opted out of the pandemic spring finale. The canceled Colgate game was likely very costly, because the Paladins claimed a share of the 2018 SoCon championship in a 6-4, 6-2 SoCon campaign, but the six wins all but crushed their chances to earn an at-large playoff bid.

NFL PALADINS

Furman has four players on NFL rosters — wide receiver **Ryan Miller '23** of the Tampa Bay Buccaneers, cornerback Micah Robinson '23 of the Green Bay Packers, long snapper Julian Ashby '24 of the New England Patriots, and tight end Mason Pline of the New Orleans Saints. Miller made Tampa Bay's 53-man roster, announced on Tuesday, as did both Robinson with Green Bay and Ashby with New England. Pline is on New Orleans' injured reserve squad after being sidelined in a preseason contest.

Miller, a three-time All-America selection for the Paladins, played in 54 games and made 43 starts during his Paladin tenure (2019-22) on the way to recording 151 receptions (4th in FU history) for 2,146 yards (5th in FU history) and a school career standard 28 touchdown catches. He signed as a free agent with the Buccaneers in spring of 2023.

Robinson was a four-year letterman (2020-23) for the Paladins who saw playing time in 42 games and made 22 starts while registering 103 tackles, five interceptions, and 21 passes defended. As a senior he tallied 34 tackles and two pickoffs in helping the Paladins to a 10-3 record, SoCon championship, and quarterfinal round appearance in the FCS playoffs. After securing his undergraduate degree in communications from Furman, he played the 2024 season at Tulane, where he totaled 33 tackles and a pair of interceptions. He was selected by the Packers the seventh round of the 2025 draft.

Ashby was also a four-year letterman (2020-23) for Furman and one of the school's most highly decorated student-athletes. He received the Dr. John M. Block Academic Award, which is presented to the male senior with the highest highest GPA, and the Dr. Gary Clark Student-Athlete Achievement Award that "recognizes a senior, female or male, who has embodied throughout their entire Furman career what it truly means to be a Paladin student-athlete through academics, athletics, campus involvement, and community service."

A summa cum laude graduate with a 3.96 grade point average in physics, he landed both Phil Steele All-America honors and College Sports Coordinators Academic All-America laurels for Division I, encompassing both Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) and Football Championship Subdivision (FCS). He handled snapping duties for all Furman PATs, field goals, and punts over his four seasons, successfully executing 412 snaps. He also played a key role in Furman's 10-3 campaign in 2023 that was highlighted by the Paladins' SoCon championship and quarterfinal round appearance in the FCS playoffs. Furman finished the campaign ranked sixth in the AFCA FCS Poll.

Ashby played the 2024 season at Vanderbilt, where he saw action in all 13 games and collected the second CSC Academic All-America citation of his collegiate career.

Pline played for Furman in 2023 after graduating from Ferris State. As a Paladin he caught 32 passes and two touchdowns on the way to earning All-SoCon honors. He inked a free agent deal with San Francisco in the spring of 2024 and was on the 49ers' practice roster all last season before being cut ear earlier this month and signed by the Saints.

Introduced as Furman's new head football coach on December 19, 2016, Clay Hendrix in eight seasons has returned Paladin football to its long respected level of national prominence and securely fixed his winning stamp on a program he has served for 31 years spanning four decades.

The latest evidence of Hendrix's successful work came in 2023 when Furman posted another 10-win season, reeled off eight straight victories, and claimed the program's Southern Conference best 15th championship, thereby clinching the league's FCS playoff berth and first-round bye. After knocking off Chattanooga, 26-7, in a round of 16 clash, the Paladins dropped a 35-28 overtime decision at second-ranked Montana, the eventual national runner-up. Furman completed the season ranked No. 6 in the AFCA final poll — the Paladins' highest finish since 2005.

The FCS playoff appearance in 2023 marked the fourth for the Paladins under Hendrix, who has compiled a 54-37 overall (.593) record and 42-21 (.651) SoCon worksheet as a head coach.

Furman's success under Hendrix, honored in 2023 as SoCon and AFCA Region II Coach of the Year, has been the product of many factors, including solid recruiting and player development/retention. That season five Paladins earned All-America honors and 19 players landed All-SoCon laurels, led by league offensive player of the year, quarterback Tyler Huff, and Jacobs Blocking Award recipient, offensive guard Jacob Johannung. In addition, two Paladins — Johannung and tight end Mason Pline — signed free agent contracts with the Las Vegas Raiders and San Francisco 49ers, respectively. This past spring two other program graduates, long snapper Julian Ashby and cornerback, Micah Robinson, were seventh round draft selections of the New England Patriots and Green Bay Packers, respectively.

In addition to on-the-field accolades, Furman registered impressive performances in other areas, including Huff capturing the prestigious Armed Forces Merit Award, as selected by the Football Writers Association of America. Approximately 60 percent

of the program's student-athletes over the last two years have earned SoCon Academic Honor Roll recognition, and Paladin football has remained a major factor in ranking among the nation's best in NCAA Academic Performance Rating (APR) and Graduation Success Rate (GSR) metrics.

Furman's results under Hendrix have extended his winning legacy, evidenced in the fact that in now 43 years of collegiate football, spanning his years as a player, assistant coach, and head coach, he has been part of 35 winning teams that have combined to go 336-188-3 (.640).

Hendrix returned to his alma mater in Dec. of 2016, following a decade as an assistant coach at the United States Air Force Academy. In his first season at the helm, he engineered Furman to an 8-5 campaign and FCS playoff appearance, improving on a three-win 2016 season and defying a preseason No. 7 SoCon tab by playing for a share of the league title in the regular season finale en route to finishing as a consensus No. 20 in two major FCS polls — a body of work that netted him SoCon Coach of the Year honors.

In 2018 Furman took another step under Hendrix's guidance, overcoming an 0-3 start and having its home opener against Colgate canceled due to Hurricane Florence by winning six of its final seven games, including a 34-14 triumph over FCS No. 4 Wofford. The Paladins' 35-30 road victory over Mercer in the regular season finale secured a 6-4 record and share of the program's 14th SoCon championship — the most by any school in league history.

In 2019 the Paladins delivered again, posting an 8-5 record and earning an at-large bid to the FCS

playoffs and AFCA No. 19 final national ranking.

After navigating through the pandemic season of 2020, Hendrix's 2021 squad won its final two games to finish 6-5 and set the stage for the 10-3 campaign in 2022 — the program's best since 2005. Furman paced the FCS in turnovers gained (29) and blocked kicks (10) in 2022, and produced the first three-time All-American in program history in tight end Ryan Miller, now with the Tampa Bay Buccaneers.

That Hendrix has orchestrated an impressive rebound of Paladin football was just what Furman football supporters envisioned when he was named the 23rd head coach in program history, which dates from 1889.

While at Air Force, where he coached the offensive line and served as offensive coordinator for five seasons, as well as associate head coach over the final seven campaigns, Hendrix played a pivotal role in the Falcons producing some of the top rushing attacks in the Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS). That productivity translated into a 77-53 record (.592), nine bowl game appearances, and four Commander-in-Chief Trophies, which is awarded annually based on head-to-head results among the three service academies.

Air Force led the Mountain West Conference (MWC) in rushing and ranked in the top 10 nationally eight times in the last 10 years due, in part, to the quality work of Hendrix-directed offensive lines. All told 19 Falcon offensive linemen garnered all-conference recognition and 21 players under Hendrix's guidance landed Academic All-MWC honors during his tenure in Colorado Springs.

In 2016 Air Force posted a 10-3 record and 5-3





mark in the MWC, won its fourth Commander-in-Chief Trophy this decade, and defeated South Alabama in the Arizona Bowl following a 27-20 win over 19th-ranked Boise State on Nov. 25. The Falcons ranked third nationally in rushing offense (322.8 ypg), seventh in FBS in third down conversion percentage (51.4), and averaged over 451.4 yards per game in total offense along with 34.3 points per game.

The victory over Boise State represented the final win in an impressive list of Air Force triumphs with Hendrix on staff. In 2014 the Falcons defeated 21st-ranked Colorado State (27-24) during the regular season and knocked off Western Michigan (38-24) in the Idaho Potato Bowl to complete a 10-3 campaign. In 2010 Air Force downed Georgia Tech (14-7) in the Independence Bowl, a year after beating 25th-ranked Houston (45-20) in the Armed Forces Bowl. In his first season there, the Falcons handed Notre Dame its biggest setback (41-24) to a service academy since 1963.

Hendrix paved his way to Air Force with an exemplary 19-year record of accomplishment as an assistant coach at Furman, where he served as offensive line coach each year, recruiting coordinator for three seasons, and assistant head coach over his final five campaigns. From 1988-2006 he helped the Paladins post a 155-77-1 record (.667), including a 100-45 Southern Conference mark (.690) that led to six league championships, 11 NCAA FCS (formerly I-AA) playoff appearances, a national runner-up finish in 2001, and the 1988 national championship — the first by a SoCon member school and a private university in FCS history.

Over his final eight seasons on the Paladin staff (1999-06), Furman registered a 73-28 record (.723) and 47-14 worksheet (.770) against SoCon competition en route to three league championships, seven FCS playoff berths, 2001 national runner-up campaign, and seven top 10 final national rankings.

Hendrix-directed offensive lines and powerful rushing attacks were central in one of the greatest eras in Furman history. In 1999 Furman knocked off North Carolina (28-3) on the strength of a 177-yard rushing performance by tailback Louis Ivory, and in 2000 averaged a school record 307.1 yards per game rushing to spearhead Ivory's run to the Walter Payton Award, the FCS equivalent to the Heisman Trophy. The next year a Paladin line featuring three All-Americans keyed a 12-3 campaign, highlighted by a 24-17 playoff semifinal road win over Georgia Southern that halted the Eagles' NCAA record 39-game home winning streak.

In 2005 a potent Paladin ground game was central to Furman scoring 64 touchdowns and averaging 470.0 yards per game — both school standards.

In recognition terms, 25 Hendrix-coached players earned first team all-conference honors and 13 garnered All-America laurels during his Paladin assistant coaching tenure. In addition, five products — center Steve Duggan (1990), guard Ben Hall (1999), tackle Josh Moore (2000), tackle Donnie Littlejohn (2001), and tackle Ben Bainbridge (2004) — captured the SoCon's Jacobs Blocking Award. A sixth recipient,

tackle Joel Bell, who was recruited and developed by Hendrix, garnered the award in 2008 and was inducted into the university's athletic hall of fame in 2022. Tackle Matthew Schmidt became the seventh Hendrix player to land the prestigious Jacobs Blocking Award in 2017, and guard Jacob Johanning selection in 2023 made it eight honorees.

Four of Furman's SoCon leading 15 Academic All-Americans — guards Eric Walter (1990 & '91), Adi Filipovic (2006), and Julian Ashby (2023) — are Hendrix products.

A native of Commerce, Ga., where he was a three-sport standout in football, wrestling, and golf as a prep, he starred as an offensive guard on the gridiron, helping Commerce High School to a 13-1 record and 1981 Class 2A state championship.

He came to Furman in 1982 on scholarship under head coach Dick Sheridan and over the next four years, including three seasons as a starter under the tutelage of offensive line coach Robbie Caldwell, played a role in the Paladins posting a 39-10-1 record, winning SoCon championships in 1982, '83, and '85, and finishing as national runner-up his senior year — a season that netted him all-state recognition. Furman also recorded impressive wins over South Carolina (1982), Georgia Tech (1983), and North Carolina State (1984 & '85) during his playing tenure.

Following graduation in 1986, he joined Sheridan's staff at N.C. State for the 1986 and '87 seasons — the first of which featured a Peach Bowl appearance. The Wolfpack beat ACC regular season cham-

pion Clemson in 1986 and the seventh-ranked Tigers again the following year.

He returned to Furman in 1988 as offensive line coach under head coach Jimmy Satterfield, and his influence quickly led to success as Furman registered a 13-2 record and claimed the NCAA FCS championship with a 17-12 triumph over Georgia Southern — the first national title by a SoCon school and first by a private institution in division history.

He and his wife, LeeAnn Hedgpeth '90 of Taylors, S.C., have two sons, Cal and Mac.
