Headlines

→ Fresno State will host San Diego State for homecoming on Friday night, it will be aired nationally on the CBS Sports Network. The 'Dogs most recently hosted SDSU for their homecoming game in 2012.

→ Fresno State has won eight of its last 10 homecoming games. Each of the eight wins came by an average of 13.5 points.

→ The 2016 edition of the SDSU-FS rivalry will be the sixth season of the "Battle for the Old Oil Can" Trophy, given to the winning team. The Aztecs reclaimed the trophy in 2015 after the Bulldogs held it for three-straight seasons.

→ As it pertains to Bulldog Stadium, the Bulldogs have been defeated by the Aztecs once since the stadium opened in 1980 - a one-point loss (20-19) in 1997.

→ In what was a career game for junior running back Dontel James at Nevada, his output of 169 yards rushing was the most by a Bulldog since Robbie Rouse ran for 261 yards at Nevada on Nov. 10, 2012.

→ The Fresno State offense averaged 5.9 yards per play last time out. Its best output since facing UNLV in 2014 (6.3).

→ Kody Kroening is one of five active FBS kickers with double-digit consecutive makes. The junior kicker was 3-of-3 at Nevada, extending his streak to 10 straight made field goals.

→ All with 400-plus receiving yards, the trio of KeeSean Johnson, Jamire Jordan and Aaron Peck own 1,286 of Virgil's 1,366 passing yards this season.

→ The Bulldogs have lost five-straight twice since the year 2000. Once in 2006 and again in 2015. The 'Dogs streak of seven losses during that 2006 season matched a school record set back in 1929.

Scouting San Diego State

The Aztecs enter Friday's game with a 4-1 record after opening Mountain West play last weekend with a 26-7 victory over UNLV. San Diego State held the Rebels to 122 yards offense, the fourth-fewest yards allowed by SDSU in its Division I history. UNLV's 122 yards were its fifth fewest in a game in at least 20 years (since 1996). The Aztecs' offense meanwhile was yet again led by Donnel Pumphrey (MW-leading 178.2 rushing/game), who rushed for 141 yards on 31 carries (one touchdown). He also added a career-high seven receptions for 57 yards. The senior RB moved from 17th in NCAA history to 14th with now 5,163 career rushing yards. With the win, the Aztecs won their 12th consecutive game against a conference opponent (including the win over Air Force in the 2015 Mountain West Championship), which is tied with Clemson for the longest active conference winning streak in the FBS. Through five games, the Aztecs' rank third in scoring offense (33.6) and scoring defensive (23.4), respectively. As for total offense, San Diego State ranks fourth in the conference as they are producing 420.8 yards per game. The defensive unit ranks No. 1 in the MW in total defense, surrendering only 314.8 yards per game - which also ranks No. 15 in the FBS. San Diego State is led by Calvin Munson on defense. The senior linebacker is averaging a team-best 9.6 tackles per game.

Fresno State vs. San Diego State - the Series

San Diego State leads the all-time series with Fresno State, 28-23-4, although Fresno State has won the last three out of four meetings against the Aztecs since joining the Mountain West - the 'Dogs suffered a 21-7 loss last season in San Diego. The two in-state rivals have been league affiliates of four different conferences throughout the history of the series that dates back to 1924. In intra-conference play, SDSU has the slight edge, 20-18-4, but the Bulldogs lead that mark MW play under fifth-year head coach Tim DeRuyter.

The Bulldogs and Aztecs renewed their rivalry in 2011 with a nonconference game after an 8-year hiatus and have played as Mountain West foe since (2012-present). Prior to 2011 the two schools paired for a nonconference game in 2002 after a run from 1992-98 playing as WAC league members.

→ The Bulldogs lone home defeat to the Aztecs in the last 30 years was (20-19) in 1995.

Home Sweet Home

With a 3-of-4 game stretch on the road behind the Bulldogs, Fresno State enters the second half of the season with four of its six remaining games on the schedule at Bulldog Stadium. History says the homefield advantage for Fresno State has made Bulldog Stadium one of the toughest venues in the nation to play in. With a 75.7 percent winning percentage since it opened in 1980, Fresno State has the 14th-best home winning percentage among the 128 FBS schools across the country. And under head coach Tim DeRuyter, the Bulldogs are 20-7 (.741) under his direction.

“Battle for the Old Oil Can” Trophy

This is the sixth season of the “Battle for the Old Oil Can” Trophy, given to the winning team in the rivalry series between San Diego State and Fresno State. The trophy stems from the discovery of an old oil can from Fresno (circa 1935) that was recovered during a San Diego State campus building project, said Jacquelyn K. Glasener, executive director of the Fresno State Alumni Association.

“The old oil can,” she said, “likely came from a time when Aztec and Bulldog fans traveled to football games between the two schools via the old, twisting, precipitous Grapevine section of Highway 99 over Tejon Pass.”

“Cars in those days carried extra oil and water to be sure they could make it through difficult trips,” added Jim Herrick, executive director of the San Diego State Alumni Association.

The alumni associations of the two schools purchased an antique oil can to be the basis of the trophy to be awarded to the winner of the rivalry game each time the schools meet.

Homecoming Success

- The Bulldogs have won eight of its last 10 Homecoming games. Each of the eight wins came by an average of 13.5 points.
• Over the last 10 Homecoming contests, Fresno State’s two Homecoming defeats came on Oct. 14, 2006 to Hawai’i and Oct. 10, 2015 to Utah State. That defeat in 2006 dropped the Bulldogs’ record to 1-5, similarly, the 2015 defeat dropped the Bulldogs’ record to 1-5.
• The last time Fresno State hosted San Diego State for homecoming was in 2012, a 52-40 Bulldogs’ win. That game was orchestrated by then-junior Derek Carr, who amassed a Fresno State single-game school record 570 yards total offense.

Homecoming Throwback

In what was the first-ever Mountain West game for Fresno State, the Bulldogs got one of many record-setting performances by Bulldog-great Derek Carr in a 52-40 victory over San Diego State. Carr set a school and then-Mountain West record with 570 yards of total offense. Of the 570, 536 yards were from the air, which shares the school single-game record with Dave Telford. He finished the game 42-of-56 passing with five touchdowns, two interceptions and 43 yards rushing. Two turnovers on its first three possessions put Fresno State in an early 21-7 hole after the first quarter. Then with a 36-34 lead early in the third quarter, SDSU’s Leon McFadden picked off Carr and returned it 96 yards for a touchdown to give the Aztecs back the lead. Carr and the Bulldogs did not get down as they marched back to outscore the Aztecs 16-0 to end the game with their first MW conference victory.

Moving in the right direction

The Bulldogs are in the midst of tough times, but the needle is moving in the right direction if there was any indication from last time out. Fresno State registered single-game season-highs (vs. FBS opponents) in first downs (25), rushing yards (255), and had its top third-down conversion percentage (42.9) while not going three-and-out for the first time this year. They were one yard shy of besting its total yards-high vs. Tulsa (453) – a double overtime game. The ‘Dogs punted the fewest times (2) this season and held Nevada to 111 yards offense in the second half.

→ The offense averaged 5.9 yards per play. Its best output since facing UNLV in 2014 (6.3).

Working on the ground

For the first time since the second game of the season, running back Dontel James hit the century mark on the ground. Not only did the junior pass the 100-yard mark at Nevada, he did so in the first half. On 13 carries, James rushed for 112 yards in the opening 30 minutes in Reno with 34 of those coming on the Bulldogs’ opening play from scrimmage. He added another 57 second half yards to post a new career-high of 169.

→ His output was the most by a Bulldog since Robbie Rouse ran for 261 yards at Nevada on Nov. 10, 2012.

→ It ranked as the 45th best output in Bulldog history.

→ James’ 169 yards was key to the Bulldogs rushing for 255 yards, the most for a Fresno State team since the ‘Dogs registered 389 on the ground on Sept. 20, 2013.

→ The Bulldogs had won their last eight games when rushing for 250 yards or more, until travelling to Nevada.

The man can't miss

Since missing on his first attempt of the season at Nebraska, junior kicker Kody Kroening has connected on his last 10 attempts, including a career-long 47-yarder at UNLV on Oct. 3. With his 10th field goal this season, it surpassed Kroening's single-season high of nine, set as a freshman in 2014.

→ Kroening is one of five active FBS kickers with double-digit consecutive makes.

→ Kroening's 0.90 (9-of-10) field goal percentage ranks T-8th best in the FBS.

→ Kroening's current streak of 10 consecutive made field goals is a career-best, six more than his career long streak of four, which he set in 2014.

→ With an average of 1.67 field goals per game, Kroening rankings 15th in the NCAA and first in the Mountain West.

→ Four of his last seven attempts have been for 42 yards or longer.

Leaving it all out there

After missing the entire 2015 season due to a foot injury sustained in fall camp, redshirt senior Aaron Peck has been a leader for not just the receiving corps, but for the offense as a whole. Entering his final campaign without a 100-yard receiving game to his credit, he has posted two in six games, including 194 yards and two touchdowns on five receptions in a career game at UNLV on Oct. 3. His total was more than half of the team's offensive total yardage (360) for the game.

→ Peck's 194 yards was the 17th most receiving yards in a single game in school history.

→ During the game at UNLV, Peck caught an 80-yard touchdown pass. It was the 18th reception of 80 or more yards in program history.

→ Peck posted his second 100-yard receiving game of the season in game five, matching teammate Jamire Jordan who posted two 100-yard games in the first four games. The Bulldog wideouts have matched the number of 100-yard games recorded in 2014 (3) and 2015 (1).

→ With a team-leading 479 receiving yards through six games, Peck has totaled 60 more yards than he had during the entire 2014 season (14 games). His three TDs in 2016 has also doubled his career total to six.

Strange, but true

Jared Rice's first career catch was his first career touchdown. He joins a group of 21 FBS student-athletes that made their introductions with a TD catch as their first career reception. There have been 12 wideouts, six tight ends, two running backs and a quarterback to do so.

→ The ball was distributed to eight different pass catchers last time out at Nevada, the most this season. The last time eight Bulldogs caught a pass in a single game was last season at Hawai'i on Nov. 14. Kyle Riddering had one catch for 12 yards at Nevada and the last time he logged a receptions was at Hawai'i. Treyvon Green also caught his career pass vs. the Pack.





Sustaining Drives

The Bulldogs controlled the time of possession for more than 32 minutes for the second time this season – vs. Tulsa & at Nevada. What differentiates the Tulsa game is the ‘Dogs had a drive that lasted eight minutes, 13 seconds against Nevada. It was the longest single-game drive since holding the ball 10 minutes, 19 seconds at Hawai’i last season. Furthermore regarding last time out at Nevada, the Bulldogs sustained drives with 10 or more plays four times in which three of those lasted four-plus minutes.

→ Aiding to the ‘Dogs sustained drives were zero three-and-outs against Nevada.

Virgil’s trio

Ranking second in the Mountain West in passing yards, redshirt freshman Chason Virgil has had three primary targets: the trio of KeeSean Johnson, Jamire Jordan and Aaron Peck own 1,286 of Virgil’s 1,366 passing yards this season. The three WR have caught 88 of Virgil’s 112 completions. Each of the three ranks in the top 10 of the MW in receptions per game, while Johnson is 28th in the FBS with 6.0 per game. Peck ranks 31st nationally, and fourth in the MW with 479 receiving yards while also ranking 46th in the FBS in receiving yards per game at 79.8.

→ With four 100-yard receiving games (Jordan 2, Peck 2), the Bulldog wideouts have matched the number of 100-yard games recorded in 2014 (3) and 2015 (1).

→ Of Virgil’s nine passing touchdowns, three have gone for 65 yards or longer (Jordan 2, Peck 1).

Flash Jordan

The speedy Jamire Jordan continues to impress with his explosive playmaking ability, unfortunately his 75-yard race to the endzone was called back last time out vs. Nevada, which negating adding to his list of explosive plays. Jordan has 11 career receptions of 20 yards or more and a career-long 85-yard touchdown, which he recorded at Toledo on Sept. 17. He also posted a 65-yard TD versus Tulsa on Sept. 24. Six of Jordan’s seven career touchdown receptions have been over 20 yards, including four over 60 yards.

→ With a reception in each of his first 18 games as a Bulldog, the sophomore has looked even more explosive through six games in 2016 as his yards per reception has increased from 12.8 in 2015 to 16.9 in 2016, and his yards per game has increased from 46.4 to 67.5.

→ Jordan’s 85-yard TD reception was the longest since Davante Adams caught an 89-yard heave from Derek Carr on Oct. 27, 2012.

→ Jordan registered the 12th pass completion in Fresno State history to go for 85 yards or more; all 12 of the 85-yard plus receptions have gone for touchdowns.

→ Chason Virgil became the ninth Bulldog quarterback in Fresno State history to complete a pass of more than 85 yards - joining Derek Carr (4), Paul Pinegar, Kevin Sweeney, Ryan Colburn, Michael Ross, Mark Barsotti, Dave Telford and Jeff Tedford.

→ With his second 100-yard game of the season at Toledo, Jordan became the fastest Bulldog receiver to register two 100-yard receiving games since Davante Adams and Isaiah Burse in 2013.

A change under center

The Bulldogs no doubt have a young offensive line, their most experienced offensive lineman, Aaron Mitchell, added a first to his resume two weeks ago at UNLV as he made his first career start at center. Mitchell entered the season owning 12 of the 24 career starts that the Bulldogs returned to the front line for offensive line coach Mark Weber - that ranked as a tie for the seventh fewest returning starts combined from any offensive line in FBS football. Jacob Vazquez, who returned the second most career starts to begin the season (7), is who Mitchell is replacing at center. Vazquez made the start at left guard in the last two games, a place he has some experience having started at right guard for two games in 2015.

Taking care of the football

A part of the reason Chason Virgil won the starting spot in fall camp was his ability to take care of the football. Last time out, Chason Virgil did not turn the ball over. It was the second time in six games that he did not throw an interception. And looking back two weeks prior, Virgil threw a late game INT at UNLV as time expired on the game. Virgil's first interception of the season at Nebraska popped out of KeeSean Johnson's hands with 0:47 left in the third quarter.

Covering returns

Under special teams coordinator Dave Ungerer, Fresno State has been one of the top teams in the FBS in 2016 in both punt and kick coverage. While the Bulldogs' net punt average ranks only 63rd nationally at 37.9 yards, teams have been unable find anywhere to run. Of redshirt freshman Blake Cusick's 44 punts, teams have averaged 0.0 yards per return, which ranks fourth in the FBS (punt return defense). Fresno State's kick return coverage has been just as strong as its punt coverage, holding opponents to a mere 16.8 yards on kickoff returns, which ranks 12th in the FBS and second in the Mountain West.

→ The 'Dogs 12th-ranked FBS kick return defense will face off against the Aztecs' 13th-ranked FBS kick return team led by Donnel Pumphrey.

Holding down the middle of the defense

Entering the 2016 season as the returning tackles leader with 76 a season ago, Jeff Camilli has shown why many thought he would be a force in the middle for the Bulldog defense this season. Though playing in only five of six games, he leads the team with 52 tackles (he missed the 'Dogs' game vs. Sacramento State). Camilli's 10.4 tackles per game ranks 11th nationally and is second in the Mountain West. He sits eighth in the country and first in the conference in solo tackles per game at 6.2.

→ The senior linebacker has posted double-digit tackles in four of his five games.

→ In 2015, Camilli averaged 6.9 total tackles per game, a number that has increased to 10.4 in 2016.

→ Camilli posted a career-best 15 tackles versus Tulsa on Sept. 24, passing the previous high of 14 that he corralled on two occasions during the 2015 season (SDSU/AFA).

→ Camilli has matched his double-digit tackle games' total of four in 2015, through five games in 2016.

→ Against Tulsa, the middle linebacker also recorded two sacks in the first quarter, twice as many as he had in his career entering the game.

Bulldogs in the NFL

With the announcement that the Jacksonville Jaguars signed offensive tackle Bryce Harris on Oct. 5, it increased the former Bulldogs in the NFL total to 10 on current 53-man rosters. The most veteran players in the group include Ryan Mathews and Chris Carter. The youngest include Tyeler Davison, Derron Smith and Cody Wichmann, who all have less than two years' experience in the league. In addition, Charles Washington (Detroit Lions) and Isaiah Burse (San Diego Chargers) are active members of practice squads and Phillip Thomas is on the injured reserve (Buffalo Bills).

TIM DERUYTER

FRESNO STATE HEAD COACH
5TH SEASON | AIR FORCE (1985)

Tim DeRuyter is set to embark on his fifth season as head coach at Fresno State and has transitioned the Bulldogs into one of the major players in the Mountain West.

DeRuyter (pronounced da-ROOT-er) took over a team that went 4-9 the year before he arrived and turned the tables by leading Fresno State to back-to-back Mountain West championships and back into the top 25 rankings in 2013. With Fresno State joining the Mountain West in 2012, DeRuyter's Bulldogs got right two work establishing their brand as a force in the conference by winning league titles in 2012 and 2013. Before the DeRuyter era launched, Fresno State had not won a conference championship since 1999 -- a drought of 13 years, and hadn't won consecutive league titles since 1992 and 1993.

After losing five players to the NFL off of the 2013 team, including All-Americans Derek Carr, Davante Adams and Austin Wentworth, Fresno State came back in 2014 and won the West Division to reach the MW Championship game for a second consecutive season. The 2014 team started out 0-3 with consecutive losses to Power-5 programs, all three that were ranked at some point during the season, but rebounded to win the West and reach a bowl game. No other Bulldog team in school history had rebounded to win six games and get bowl eligible after an 0-3 start to a season. From 1980-2014 there had been 496 total FBS teams that started 0-3 and the 2014 Bulldogs became just the 21st of that group to make a bowl, playing in the Hawai'i Bowl for the second time in three years.

Those are two of the three bowl appearances DeRuyter has led the Bulldogs to - the other being the 2013 Royal Purple Las Vegas Bowl - and he has a 29-23 overall record. He was hired as Fresno State's 17th head coach in program history on Dec. 14, 2011.

DeRuyter directed Fresno State to one of its finest seasons in program history in 2013. Fresno State went 11-2, won the inaugural Mountain West Championship game and matched the school record for wins in a season. The 'Dogs were ranked as high as No. 13 in the USA Today Coaches Poll and closed out the Bowl Championship Series era ranked No. 20 in the final BCS standings, the highest of any non-automatic qualifying/BCS conference team that year.

Player success under DeRuyter is well documented. Fourteen Bulldogs have been named first-team All-Mountain West in his four seasons, which is the second-most first-team honorees of any school in the conference. Carr in 2012 and again in 2013 was named the MW Offensive Player of the Year and Phillip Thomas in 2012 the league's Defensive Player of the Year.

Along with the All-Americans Adams, Carr, Thomas and Wentworth, DeRuyter has seen six of his Bulldogs be drafted along with another 14 that made training camps or signed as free agents with NFL teams. The five draft picks over the 2014-15 NFL Drafts were the most from any non-Power 5 program in the FBS.

Safety Phillip Thomas in 2012 was named a unanimous All-American and was a finalist for the Jim Thorpe Award after leading the nation in interceptions with eight. Thomas went on to be a fourth round draft pick of the Washington Redskins and started games for them towards the end of the 2014 season.

Prior to coming to Fresno State, DeRuyter was the assistant head coach/defensive coordinator at Texas A&M where he coached one of the elite defensive players in the game in Von Miller. Miller, who in addition to earning All-American honors, was awarded the 2010 Butkus Award given annually to the nation's most outstanding linebacker. He went on to become the second overall pick of the Broncos in the 2011 NFL draft.

DeRuyter came to Fresno State with 22 years of coaching experience. His last game coaching at Texas A&M was in the role as interim head coach for the Aggies in the Meineke Car Care Bowl of Texas, a game Texas A&M won 33-22 over Northwestern on Dec. 31, 2011.

LINCOLN, Neb. - Down two scores in the second quarter to Nebraska, Fresno State fought back in front of 90,013 fans at Memorial Stadium to pull within four points heading into halftime at 14-10, but it was the Huskers who prevailed 43-10 after the home team separated itself with 22 points in the fourth quarter.



In his return to the Bulldog football team after missing the 2015 season to an injury suffered in fall camp, Aaron Peck set career highs in receptions and yards, catching nine passes for 112 yards and a touchdown. On the defensive side of the ball Jeff Camilli led the unit with his fifth career game compiling double-digit tackles (10).

In the first quarter, the Bulldogs starting quarterback Chason Virgil completed his first five pass attempts on the Bulldogs' opening possession, until missing the sixth on a third-and-3 from the Nebraska 15-yard line. Kody Kroening missed the ensuing 32-yard attempt and the Huskers grabbed the games momentum back.

Nebraska drove the ball 80 yards on 13 plays to open the scoring, 7-0, following the 'Dogs miss at getting the games first points. After a three-and-out by the Bulldogs on the next possession, the Cornhuskers gave the ball to Devin Ozigbo four straight times as he put them up 14-0 early in the second quarter. In back-to-back drives, the Cornhuskers rushed 16 times in their 17 plays that totaled 107 yards.

Fresno State turned the tide when linebacker Robert Stanley shot through a gap on special teams and blocked a Cornhusker punt. The play ignited the Bulldog offense, earning points off the block by going seven plays for 32 yards, capped by a Virgil to Peck 7-yard TD. Virgil connected on five-of-six attempts on the scoring drive.

With under four minutes remaining in the first half, and the Bulldogs backed up against their own end zone, a late hit to Virgil by Nebraska's Luke Gifford on a third-and-13, which was eventually called a targeting penalty, extended the Bulldogs' drive. Zach Kline entered the game for Virgil and drove the ball down field without a hiccup, going 4-of-5 for 50 yards. He led the 'Dogs as far as the Nebraska 8-yard-line with 0:02 left in the half. Kroening knocked home a 26-yard field goal to leave Fresno State trailing 14-10 as time expired.

In the second half the Bulldogs' offense posted 128 total yards of their 274 compiled in the game and could not find the end zone while Nebraska amassed 257 total yards in the second half that led to 29 points.

Quotable

Head Coach Tim DeRuyter on the final score:

"You know the final score is the final score. You lose by one or you lose by whatever you lost by it doesn't matter. What matters is you keep fighting, which I thought our guys did. Our guys know that the final score is probably not indicative of the game. I think the Nebraska coaches would say the same thing. But you know it is what it is, they scored that many points, and we scored 10 points so there are no moral victories. But our guys realize when we play well and we don't turn the ball over we can make some plays. We've got a chance to be a good football team."

FRESNO, Calif. - The Fresno State football team used a 21-point fourth quarter in front of an announced crowd of 31,817 at Bulldog Stadium Saturday night to separate itself from a pesky Sacramento State Hornets squad for a 31-3 win in their 2016 home opener.



The Bulldog defense highlighted the game, holding Sacramento State to 185 total yards offense, the lowest output from an opponent since 2008 when Fresno State held New Mexico State to 183.

The defensive backfield duo of Tyquwan Glass and Jamal Ellis each posted interceptions, giving the 'Dogs a win in the last nine-straight games when recording multiple interceptions in a game. The 'Dogs also recorded three sacks between Justin Green, Nathan Madsen and Nela Otukolo while James Bailey led the team with eight tackles.

With his first career touchdown, Dejonte O'Neal started the scoring Saturday with an eight-yard TD in the first quarter with 1:02 remaining. Those points were produced thanks to Ellis' interception that set the 'Dogs up in Hornets territory at the 48-yard line.

After that Ellis interception the defense forced four-straight three-and-outs, of the eight amassed on the night. In that span the 'Dogs tacked on three more points after Kody Kroening knocked home a 21-yard field goal during the second quarter. As time expired on the half, the Hornets scored three points with a 44-yard kick, which was set up by a line drive punt that bounced off a Bulldog and was recovered by Sacramento State defender on the Fresno State 27-yard line with six seconds left on the clock.

Neither team was able to put points on the board in the third. A period the 'Dogs outgained the Hornets 106 to 39.

It was the fourth when the Bulldogs broke through and put the game away, scoring on their final three possessions.

Dontel James crossed the plane on a 17-yard run for a touchdown with 14:24 left in the fourth to put the Bulldogs on top 17-3. That run put James over the 100-yard threshold on a night he posted 121 on the ground - the most by a Fresno State running back since Martezee Waller opened the 2015 season with 154 against Abilene Christian.

Back-to-back touchdown connections between Chason Virgil and KeeSean Johnson followed the James score, which put a stamp on the Bulldogs' win. Entering the game, Johnson owned two career TDs before the two scores in the fourth.

Virgil finished the game 22-of-42 for 274 yards and two scores. The redshirt freshman quarterback set career highs in completions, attempts and yards in the win.

Quotable

Head Coach Tim DeRuyter on this game being a mirror image of the Nebraska game:

"Give Sacramento State credit, they held in. That is a group with a lot of pride and a great coach. They are a young team and they came out with a lot of fire. In a lot of ways they are very similar to us, they are very young. They got punched in the nose last week at home and we knew they were going to respond. We give them credit, but eventually we were able to block a little better to wear them down a little and get some takeaways and that momentum helped us to get the running game going and be able to seal the deal."

TOLEDO, Ohio – In its first trip to the Glass Bowl since 2008, Fresno State was unable to recreate the magic from that day as the Bulldogs fell 52-17 on Saturday afternoon.

After holding the Rockets on their first possession of the game, Toledo scored on four of its next five drives while the Bulldogs' offense struggled to find their stride.

Toledo held a 24-0 advantage at the half and outgained Fresno State 267-73 in that span.

Third down efficiency was the root of the Bulldogs trying first half as they went 0-for-8 over the first two quarters and 0-for-13 in the game.

In the second half, Fresno State bounced back with producing 181 yards of offense while scoring 17 points. A large chunk of that yardage came when Chason Virgil connected with Jamire Jordan for an 85-yard touchdown down the stretch, which set career long plays for the duo (throw and reception).

Virgil also linked up with KeeSean Johnson for a 9-yard score, the third time in the last two games those two have connected for scores.

Toledo amassed 619 total yards in the game, the most by a Bulldog opponent since Wyoming manufactured 694 in 2014.

Key stat Toledo outgained Fresno State by 196 yards in the first half as it took a 24-0 lead into the locker room.

Quotable Head coach Tim DeRuyter's initial postgame thoughts...

"We got beat physically. We blew assignments. We got outplayed and outcoached. There's no excuse for it. It's going to change. We've got a bunch of guys who have pride, but we've got to play much better than we did today."

Head coach Tim DeRuyter's on what the team needs to hear when they return to practice Sunday... "We have to be more physical. That's the big thing. We did not match their physicality early and late we had some blown coverage's where it got away from us. But we have to do a much better job being physical."

Quarterback Chason Virgil on third down efficiency... "It comes back to us doing what we have to do on first down and second down to put ourselves in a more manageable third down. Early on we were getting stuck in first and long and second and long, that just becomes third and long. We were fighting from behind the sticks from the start. To be good on third downs you have to put yourself in a manageable situations."

FRESNO, Calif. – On a sunny Saturday afternoon at Bulldog Stadium, the Fresno State football team raced out to a 31-0 lead over the Tulsa Golden Hurricane in the first half, only to see it evaporate in a 48-41 defeat in double overtime.

In the second period of extra time after neither team scored in the first, Tulsa's Dane Evans scored from 18 yards out, but the Bulldogs had their chance to push it to a third. An incomplete pass on first down was followed with a sack that dropped the 'Dogs to a third-and-17, which was followed by a failed fourth-and-17 that capped the Golden Hurricane comeback.

The game saw 1,070 total yards on 189 total plays, but like the score, Tulsa topped Fresno State with 617 yards offense on 100 plays.

Not to be lost, the Bulldogs flourished offensively, particularly in the first half as they took a 31-21 lead into halftime. It was the most points scored in an opening half by a Bulldog team since the 2013 team scored 42 at San Jose State on Nov. 29.

Fresno State took a 21-0 lead to the second quarter after three rushing scores by three different Bulldogs – Jordan (44 yards), Chason Virgil (14 yards) and Dontel James (2 yards). Cody Kroening then capped a nine-play, 62-yard drive with a 25-yard field goal 3:29 into the second quarter, before Jordan caught a 65-yard pass from Virgil to put the 'Dogs up 31-0.

From that point forward, Tulsa began seizing momentum with three-straight touchdown drives (Evans' passes of 23, 40 and 40 yards) while the Bulldogs went three-and-out on their next three drives – putting Tulsa behind 31-21 going into the second half.

Fresno State responded with its first possession in the second half by eating up 6 minutes, 48 seconds of clock on a 15-play, 67-yard drive that results in a 25-yard Kroening field goal to open third quarter.

Tulsa countered by outscoring Fresno State 27-7 the rest of the way. The three scores in regulation were drives of nine, 11, 11 and 16.

Despite the Golden Hurricane success, the Bulldogs were not going down without a fight. The final seven points the Bulldogs would score was a fourth quarter TD that put the 'Dogs up 41-38 with 5:02 remaining in the game.

Tulsa's 16-play drive that sent the game to overtime, ended with a 28-yard field goal on a drive that the Golden Hurricane went 3-of-4 on third downs.

Quotable Head Coach Tim DeRuyter on losing the 31-0 lead...

"We did not have any anticipation that we were going to shut Tulsa out. We kept telling our guys on the sideline, 'Hey, this team is going to fight back, they are going to counter-punch.' They were able to run the ball while running the same plays that we practiced this week, the same plays that they ran the first four series. They executed better than we did. We didn't tackle very well. We tried to switch the coverage and we had a guy not see it on a fourth down. Again, you make a stop there and they don't score. There are a half dozen plays that were critical in that ball game that put us into overtime. I don't want it to sound bad, but we caused a lot of them and there are things in our control that we need to fix."

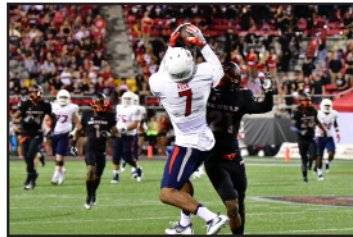

LAS VEGAS – Despite a career night from senior wide receiver Aaron Peck, Fresno State fell 45-20 to UNLV on Saturday night at Sam Boyd Stadium.



Chason Virgil threw for 296 yards and two scores for the 'Dogs, but the Rebels' ground attack amassed 364 yards and five touchdowns.

After neither team could find their footing through the opening 14 minutes, UNLV then began a 14-play drive, with 13 coming on the ground, which ended in a 1-yard touchdown by Lexington Thomas.

The Rebels took a 14-7 lead on the ensuing possession with a seven-play 69-yard drive. After forcing the Bulldogs to punt, UNLV quarterback Dalton Sneed tossed a 61-yard touchdown pass to Elijah Troscclair, to double the home team's lead.

Fresno State cut its deficit to 11 with a 42-yard field goal from Kody Kroening with 8:39 to play in the third quarter. James Bailey then nearly forced a fumble deep in UNLV territory, but the play was overturned. Sneed then escaped the pocket on the following play and rushed for a 91-yard score to give the Rebels a 28-10 advantage.

With the score sitting at 31-10, Virgil and Peck made it a 31-17 game late in the third quarter as the two hooked up for an 80-yard touchdown, the longest of Peck's career. The Bulldogs then forced a quick three-and-out and put together a 10-play drive that Kroening capped off with a career-long 47-yard field goal to pull the 'Dogs within 11.

Fresno State was unable to pull any closer and UNLV tacked on 14 points during the final three minutes of the game.

Key Play

Trailing by 11 midway through the third quarter, Bailey appeared to force a fumble that Nathan Madsen picked up inside the Rebel's 10-yard line, but the play was ultimately overturned. UNLV then scored on a 91-run on the next play to push its lead to 28-10.

Quoteable

Head coach Tim DeRuyter on the execution being a one-play snap shot of the season... 'Absolutely. Both sides of the ball. We didn't protect our quarterback well at times. We dropped footballs when balls hit us. Our quarterback didn't hit receivers when they were open. RENO, Nev. – A career night of 169 yards on the ground from junior running back Dontel James was not enough for Fresno State as Nevada held on to a 27-22 lead with a defensive stand in the final minute of play, Saturday night at Mackay Stadium.



James' 169 yards (27 carries) were the most single game rushing yards by a Bulldog since Robbie Rouse ran for 261 yards at Nevada on Nov. 10, 2012. It was the junior's second 100-yard rushing game this season.

On the Bulldogs' first play from scrimmage, James started his career night by breaking off the longest run of his career, a 34-yard burst down the left side of the field. That started a 9-play, 59-yard drive that resulted in a 44-yard field goal by Kody Kroening.

Aided by Fresno State miscues, a sack turned personal foul, and a 19-yard gain on 3rd-and-20 followed by a 4th-and-1 conversion, Nevada answered the Bulldogs' score with a touchdown to take its first lead, 7-3. The scoring play came via a backward pass from quarterback Tyler Stewart to wide receiver Andrew Celis, Celis then threw downfield to Wyatt Demps for a 36-yard touchdown.

The Bulldogs responded the very next possession with a drive that Kroening capped for the 'Dogs, making it a 7-6 game at the end of the first quarter with a 25-yard field goal. The junior's first quarter field goals were his eighth and ninth consecutive makes this season.

Despite allowing a 14-yard drive to the Wolf Pack to open the second, Fresno State's special teams unit came up big as Malik Forrester blocked Brent Zuzo's 24-yard field goal attempt. Zach Kline, who saw action for the third time this season, fumbled three plays later and Nevada turned it into points with a 4-yard touchdown run from Stewart. Nevada scored again to close the second as Stewart found Demps for a 3-yard touchdown pass to take a 21-6 lead into the half.

The Bulldogs narrowed Nevada's lead to a one score game with just over a minute remaining in the third quarter as they capitalized on a 15-play drive. A drive that Virgil found Jared Rice on a 4th-and-goal from the 1-yard line for the score. It was Rice's first career catch and touchdown.

Two plays later, a forced fumble by Stratton Brown and recovery by Nick Kristofors led to Kroening's third field goal of the night to close the gap to 21-16.

Nevada answered with a 14-play scoring drive to take a 27-16 advantage, with nine plays coming from James Butler on the ground, with 7:56 to play.

The Bulldogs would not go quietly. Virgil engineered a 75-yard drive that James finished off with this first TD of the night to bring the score to 27-22 in Nevada's favor with 5:08 left in the game. The Fresno State defense held tough, forcing a three-and-out, and gave the offense one final shot for the come-from-behind win.

With less than three minutes on the clock, the Bulldogs pushed the ball down to as far as Nevada's 4-yard line, but the 'Dogs were unable to get the ball into the end zone on four passing plays that fell incomplete.

Key Stat

In the second quarter, Fresno State fumbled twice and punted once on their three possessions, while Nevada scored two touchdowns on its three possessions. The Wolf Pack outgained the Bulldogs 175-75 in that frame.

Quoteable

Head coach Tim DeRuyter on the final series of the game... 'We only had one timeout left. Once we got the first down, the clock was running and we thought we had a good matchup with Aaron (Peck), so we threw the fade. At that point we probably could have run the ball, but we thought we had some plays that we practiced all week down there in the red zone and we just didn't execute. Give Nevada credit, their kid knocked the ball out of Aaron's hand and they executed in the red zone better than we did.'
