### Headlines

→ Jeff Tedford was announced as the 19th head coach in Fresno State football history on Nov. 10; he will serve in a consultant role for the remainder of the 2016 season.

→ Eric Kiesau, named interim head coach on Oct. 23, will continue to lead the Bulldogs through their final two games of the season.

→ Eric Kiesau was hired on Dec. 31, 2015 to be Fresno State's offensive coordinator. The Pasadena, Calif. native most recently had stops at Alabama (2015), Kansas (2014), Washington (2012-13) and Cal (2011) prior to Fresno State.

→ Fresno State has won five-straight games against Hawai'i.

→ Fresno State set season-highs in points scored (42), first downs (27) total offense (455) and turnovers gained (4) in their win at Hawai'i last year. Each of those marks have not been bested in an FBS game in 2016.

→ The Bulldogs have forced six turnovers in 2016 - the fewest of any team in FBS football; Hawai'i has turned the ball over a league-high 23 times this season.

→ The Bulldogs have gone three-and-out and produced a total of 20 yards with their game opening drive over the last four games; Hawai'i has allowed an opening drive touchdown by its opponent in four straight games.

→ The Bulldogs have seen 12 players make their first career starts this season, while 30 players have seen their first career action.

→ Kody Kroening, who has hit on 13-straight field goal attempts, is one of 20 semifinalists for the Lou Groza Place-Kicker Award.

→ Stratton Brown owned 21 career tackles in 23 career games entering his senior season; through 10 games he owns the team-lead with 90.

→ Fresno State is in the midst of a program record eight-game losing streak.

## Fresno State names Jeff Tedford 19th head coach in Fresno State Football History

Jeff Tedford, 55, was named the next Fresno State head football coach, as announced by Director of Athletics Jim Bartko on Nov. 10. Tedford was formally introduced at a press conference on Nov. 11. Tedford is a Fresno State alum and was most recently an offensive consultant for the Washington Huskies.

Tedford will assume the role as the acting head coach at the conclusion of the 2016 season. Interim head coach Eric Kiesau will continue to carry out his duties for Saturday's matchup vs. Hawai'i as well as the finale vs. San Jose State.

Tedford comes to Fresno State with 11 years of head coaching experience at the Division I level – having led the California Golden Bears

to 82 wins from 2002-2012. He left as the school's all-time winningest coach. He played quarterback at Fresno State in 1981-82 under Jim Sweeney and coached at Fresno State under Sweeney from 1987-88 and 1992-96, and under a then-first-year head coach Pat Hill in 1997.

Tedford's coaching career started at Fresno State, volunteering as an assistant for the 1987-88 seasons, from there he picked up his first full-time position as an assistant for the Calgary Stampeders of the Canadian Football League – a familiar league in which he played quarterback for six seasons after his collegiate career at Fresno State.

He returned to Fresno State in 1992 as the quarterbacks coach and served as the offensive coordinator for the Bulldogs over the ensuing five seasons.

Tedford held the same position at Oregon (1998-2001) before he became the head coach at Cal. He was named the Pac-10 coach of the year twice, led the Golden Bears to a school record seven consecutive bowl games and to a conference title in 2006.

Following Tedford's stint at Cal, he moved on to the NFL in 2014 as the Tampa Bay Buccaneers' offensive coordinator. The stop did not last long due to health issues during the preseason that evolved into an indefinite leave of absence which resulted in the two sides mutually agreeing to part ways.

Tedford made his return to the CFL in 2015 as he was named the head coach of the B.C. Lions. At the conclusion of the season, Tedford elected to exercise an option in his contract to resign and pursue opportunities in college football.

He has since been an offensive consultant for the Washington Huskies under head coach Chris Peterson. A relationship rekindled after their time together as assistants at Oregon under then-coach Mike Belotti. Washington's staff also included associate head coach Bob Gregory, who served as Tedford's defensive coordinator at Cal for eight seasons.

## Still in charge

For the remaining two games of the 2016 season, interim head coach Eric Kiesau will continue to be at the helm of the staff and lead the 'Dogs onto the field on game day. The Bulldogs' offensive coordinator was designated the interim head coach by Jim Bartko on Oct. 23 upon Tim DeRuyter being relieved of his duties as head coach.

Getting to know Eric Kiesau:

- 43-years-old, from Pasadena, Calif.
- Played quarterback and earned bachelors degree (1996) at Portland State.
- Is serving as a head coach for the first time in his coaching career.
- Is 0-2 since taking over the team.
- First Division-I coaching position was at Utah State in 2000 (running backs coach).
- Prior to Fresno State, was last an offensive analyst for the 2015 National Championship Alabama football team.
- Hired as Fresno State's offensive coordinator on Dec. 31, 2015.
- In addition to Fresno State, he has served as an offensive coordinator at Kansas in 2014 (interim), at Washington in 2012-13 and at Colorado in 2009-10.

## Scouting Hawai'i

Hawai'i will enter Bulldog Stadium on Saturday with a 4-7 overall record (3-4 MW), and sporting a season-long three-game losing streak. The Warriors have won two road games (2-3) this season; it's first road win on Oct. 8 at San Jose State (34-17) snapped a nine-game road losing streak. The second road win came at Air Force in overtime (34-27).

- UH is 7-32 all-time in the Mountain West and 3-16 in conference road games.
- UH is 3-28 in its last 31 games away from Aloha Stadium.
- UH has allowed an opening drive touchdown by its opponent in four straight games.
- UH will finish with a losing record in the regular-season for the sixth straight season.
- UH has turned the ball over at least once in each game this season and in 20-straight dating back to last season; Fresno State has forced a turnover in only four of 10 games this season.
- UH ranks No. 125 in rushing defense, allowing 258.0 yards per game; Fresno State ranks No. 126 in rushing defense, allowing 270.9 per game.
- UH has been outscored 107-16 over its last two games, losses to Boise State (52-16) and at San Diego State (55-0).
- UH has a scoring defense that ranks last in the MW and No. 121 in the FBS, allowing 39.5 points per game.
- While Fresno State ranks last in the conference in turnover margin (-1.10), UH has turned the ball over a league-high 23 times.
- UH has not missed a field goal (11-of-11) all season behind the leg of Rigoberto Sanchez, who happens to be the Warriors' full-time punter and kickoff man as well. Sanchez has connected on the longest field goal by a MW kicker this season, a 55-yarder at Michigan.

## Fresno State vs. Hawai'i - the series

Fresno State leads the all-time series with Hawai'i 26-21-1 entering Saturday's contest. It will be the 49th meeting between the two schools. The Bulldogs will be going after their sixth straight win in the series with three of the past five games being decided by one score. Both programs have been in the same conference since 1992 when Fresno State joined the WAC. In conference matchups the 'Dogs own a 13-11 advantage, in part to its 4-0 record against UH since both schools joined the Mountain West in 2012. The Bulldogs will look for a fast start, which has eluded them this season, as they have outscored Hawai'i 119-13 in the first half in its last four meetings.

## Flashback - 2015

In his fourth start of the season on Nov. 14, 2015 and first since Oct. 3, 2015, quarterback Zack Greenlee threw six touchdown passes in a 42-14 win at Hawai'i last year - an individual passing mark that tied for the second all-time in school history (trailing Derek Carr's seven TD passes vs. New Mexico in 2013). Fresno State set season-highs in points scored (42), first downs (27) total offense (455) and turnovers gained (4) in their win at Hawai'i last year. Each of those marks have not been bested in an FBS game in 2016. The win was the Bulldogs' fourth straight win on the Islands against the Warriors.

### Kline gets his shot

Graduate transfer and backup quarterback Zach Kline saw extended playing time for the first time this season in the Bulldogs' last game, at Colorado State. After Chason Virgil started the game, he exited after the first series due to re-aggravating a shoulder injury suffered in the season opener at Nebraska. Kline, who had seen action in three games and registered a total of 15 attempts all season, went 11-of-24 for 147 yards while throwing one interception. He also picked up 26 yards on the ground with 17 carries. The Bulldogs totaled 232 yards, unaided by the run game that failed to crack 100 yards for the sixth time this season. It was the second-lowest output for the offense this year, second to the Bulldogs' 217 yards produced vs. San Diego State. Although, Fresno State was shut out for the first time (37-0) since facing No. 3 Boise State on Nov. 19, 2010.

### Freshmen 2,000

Despite being under center for just three plays last time out at Colorado State, Chason Virgil remains in select company with seven freshmen quarterbacks who have produced 2,000-yard passing seasons in 2016. Virgil entered his 10th game of the season at Colorado State being one of three freshmen quarterbacks with 2,000 yards. In his short stint vs. the Rams, he was 1-of-1 for eight yards.

### A formidable duo

The combo of seniors Stratton Brown (90) and Jeff Camilli (89) make up 179 tackles between the two of them - all those stops rank the pair as one of the top duo's among players in FBS football. The next most tackles by an individual on the Bulldogs' roster is James Bailey, who has posted 53 tackles this season.

Notes on Stratton Brown (90 tackles):

Entering his senior season, safety Stratton Brown had just 21 tackles in 23 games, but this year leads the team. Brown has led Fresno State in tackles in its last four games and averaged 12.75 per game in that span. Brown has posted double-digit tackle performances in six of his last eight games.

Notes on Jeff Camilli (89 tackles):

Despite missing one game this year, inside linebacker Jeff Camilli trails for the team lead in tackles by one. He surpassed his total of 76 tackles that he recorded in 12 games as a junior through nine games played in 2016. And for his career, Camilli surpassed 200 tackles for his career after the Bulldogs' Oct. 28 game vs. Air Force. Camilli's 9.9 tackles per game ranks 15th nationally and is second in the Mountain West.





## Slow starts

Fresno State was held under 100 total yards offense during the first half for the third time this season last time out against Colorado State - it was a season-low 68. Furthermore, the 'Dogs accounted for zero first downs in the first quarter for the second time this year (vs. Toledo) and posted a total of two first downs in the first half. Fresno State is keeping pace on the scoreboard, having scored 48 points to its opponents' 48 points in the first quarter, but when it comes to the second quarter, Fresno State's opponents are outscoring them 113-44 - the greatest disparity of all four quarters.

→ Game opening drives: Fresno State has not manufactured a first down on its opening drive since Oct. 8 at Nevada. Over the last four games, the Bulldogs have gone three-and-out and produced a total of 20 yards; conversely, Fresno State's last four opponents have cumulatively produced 245 yards and 14 first downs with its first drive, in spite of the success, the Bulldogs' opponents have converted points once - a touchdown by Utah State.

→ Hawai'i has allowed an opening drive touchdown by its opponent in four straight games.

## First time/true freshmen starters

The Bulldogs have seen 12 players make their first career starts this season, including two freshmen (underlined):

• NG Patrick Belony, DB Stratton Brown, OL Christian Cronk, NG Malik Forrester, FB/LB Josh Hokit, OL Logan Hughes, RB Dontel James, DB Tank Kelly, DE Nick Kristofors, OL David Patterson, RB Justin Rice and TE Kyle Riddering.

→ 31 different Bulldogs (any class) have made starts this season.

→ 30 different Bulldogs have seen action for the first time in thier careers, including seven true freshmen (linebackers Jeffrey Allison and Josh Hokit, defensive backs Jaron Bryant and Juju Hughes, running back Justin Rice, defensive lineman Elijah Piper and kickoff specialist Nick Van Valkenburg).

• In 2015, Fresno State had 30 players see their first game action (four true freshmen) and 21 players make starts for the first time.

• In 2014, Fresno State had 22 players see their first game action in a Bulldog uniform (eight true freshmen).

## Turnover drought

The Bulldogs' defense failed to manufacture a turnover for the sixth time in 10 games last time out. In total, the Bulldogs have forced six turnovers all season - the fewest of any team in FBS football. The 'Dogs are on pace with the 2011 Fresno State team that produced nine turnovers (tied Minnesota for the fewest turnovers in the FBS). Through 10 games, that 2011 team had posted seven turnovers.

→ Of Fresno State's six turnovers, three are INTs and three are fumble recoveries.

→ There five FBS teams with three or less INTs this season.

→ Fresno State has not logged an interception in six-straight games.

→ Hawai'i has turned the ball over a league-high 23 times and UH has turned the ball over at least once in each game this season and in 20-straight dating back to last season.

## Ogelsby sees his first career action

RB Bryson Ogelsby, a touted Texas recruit from the 2015 class, played in his first career game at Colorado State and led the Bulldogs in rushing with 39 yards. Ogelsby redshirted a season ago while completing his initial eligibility waiver from the NCAA, and caught a bad break in the spring of 2016, suffering a knee injury that lingered so long it kept him from fall camp this past August. Ogelsby, who has NFL roots as his late father Alfred was a third round selection of the 1990 NFL Draft (University of Houston), garnered first-team all-district honors out of the Houston area following his senior season in 2014.

→ Ogelsby's first career run was a 21-yard scamper that put Fresno State in plus territory for the first time in the game during the third quarter at Colorado State.

## Multiple starts streaks snapped at Colorado State

The Bulldogs were out a few regular staples in their starting lineup at Colorado State, snapping a few starts streaks:

- DB Tyquan Glass: snapped 17-game start streak at cornerback due to an ankle injury.
- RB Dontel James: started all nine games in 2016 leading up to missing the Colorado State game due to leg injury.
- WR Delvon Hardaway: missed the CSU game after starting two games in a row in place of the injured Aaron Peck. Hardaway was a late scratch due to a family emergency, Peck returned to the starting lineup in his place.

## Kody Kroening named Lou Groza award semifinalist

On Nov. 3, junior Kody Kroening was named one of 20 semifinalists for the Lou Groza Collegiate Place-Kicker Award, announced by the Palm Beach County Sports Commission. He is one of 20 semifinalists for the 2016 award; three finalists will be named on Nov. 22. Since the announcement, Kroening was held without an attempt at Colorado State and the Bulldogs entered their bye week, the following week. At the time of the announcement was and still is 13-of-14 on field goals this season, and has connected on his last 13 attempts after missing his first attempt on the road at Nebraska in the first quarter of the first drive during week one of the season. He owns a 92.9 accuracy percentage, which ranks sixth-best in the FBS. He has done so by converting on six of his last eight attempts being greater than 35 yards. He has made all five attempts of 40 yards-plus this season, including a career-long 49 set on Oct. 22 at Utah State.

## Jacob Vazquez honored by CoSIDA with academic honor

On Nov. 3, Fresno State offensive lineman Jacob Vazquez to the 2016 Academic All-District 8 team as announced by the College Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA). Vazquez now advances to the CoSIDA Academic All-America® Team ballot, where first-, second-and third-team All-America honorees will be selected. His inclusion marks the seventh time that a Fresno State football student-athlete has been named to the Academic All-District team during the last five seasons. He was one of two Bulldogs to earn the honor in 2015.

→ Vazquez is also a 2016 William V. Campbell Trophy semifinalist and a nominee for the Allstate American Football Coaches Association Good Works Team and Wuerffel Trophy.

## Fresno Athletic Hall of Fame nets Bulldog football player

Billy Volek, a four-year letterman that played from 1996-99, was inducted to the Fresno Athletic Hall of Fame on Nov. 4. Volek left Fresno State as the No. 4 all-time career leader in passing yards, adding up 6,532 in his time, and still ranks No. 8 to this day. His senior season ended with a WAC title and trip to the Las Vegas Bowl. That year he registered 2,706 yards with 30 touchdowns against only three interception as a first-team All-WAC selection. Despite going undrafted, Volek went on to have a 12-year NFL career, splitting time with the San Diego Chargers and Tennessee Titans.

→ Volek played under then-offensive coordinator Jeff Tedford in 1996 and 1997.

The scope of work includes utility infrastructure and ADA upgrades, new concession and restroom facilities, new premium seating and club lounge areas, and improved spectator access to seating. # ERIC KIESAU

**INTERIM HEAD COACH / OFFENSIVE COORDINATOR****1ST SEASON | PORTLAND STATE (1996)**

A year after winning the national championship at Alabama, Eric Kiesau began his first season at Fresno State in the role of assistant head coach/offensive coordinator on Dec. 31, 2015. On Oct. 23, Kiesau was named the interim head coach - he will continue to carry on with his duties as the OC.

In 2015, Kiesau served as an analyst at Alabama helping direct the Crimson Tide's offense that produced Heisman Trophy winner in running back Derrick Henry, in addition to winning the College Football Playoff.

Prior to his time at Alabama, Kiesau was the wide receivers' coach at Kansas in 2014 and its interim offensive coordinator and play-caller for the last five games of that season. He was the OC at Washington from 2012-13 and also has coaching experience from his time at Cal (2002-05, 2011) and Colorado (2006-10).

At Washington his offense produced the 2013 John Mackey Award winner as the nation's top tight end in Austin Seferian-Jenkins. Seferian-Jenkins along with running back Bishop Sankey both garnered All-American accolades in 2013 under his play-calling.

Sankey was the first running back selected in the 2014 NFL Draft after he was one of three finalists for the Doak Walker Award given to the nation's top running back in 2013. That year, Sankey ranked fourth in the country in rushing with 143.8 yards per game and he set a new Washington single-season rushing record with 1,775 yards.

Kiesau's 2013 Huskie offense ranked No. 13 nationally in total offense by averaging 499.3 yards per game and was 18th in the FBS in scoring at 37.9 points per game.

At Colorado, Kiesau developed walk-on receiver Scotty McKnight, who finished his career in 2010 as the school's all-time leader in receptions (219), yards (2,588) and receiving touchdowns (22). McKnight is one of many wide receivers who have excelled playing under Kiesau.

At Cal, he coached highly decorated receivers in Keenan Allen, Geoff McArthur as well as DeSean Jackson during his freshman season when the future NFL All-Pro set Cal freshman records for receptions and receiving yards. Allen won the 2013 NFL Rookie of the Year Award with the San Diego Chargers while McArthur earned second-team All-American accolades in 2003 under Kiesau when he was second in the nation with 115.7 receiving yards per game.

In his first Division I job at Utah State in 2000, he coached All-American running back Emmitt White who led the nation in all-purpose yards when Kiesau was the running backs coach. In 2001 taking over the wide receivers position, he coached Kevin Curtis to All-America honors after Curtis led the nation in receptions with 100.

Kiesau is a native of Pasadena, Calif., and graduate of Glendale High in the Los Angeles area. He earned a bachelor's degree in communications from Portland State, where he played quarterback, starting in 1995. He began his college playing career at Glendale CC and garnered All-American honors there.

He and his wife, Wendy, have two children.

**LINCOLN, Neb.** - Down two scores in the second quarter to Nebraska, Fresno State fought back in front of 90,013 fans at Memorial Stadium to pull within four points heading into halftime at 14-10, but it was the Huskers who prevailed 43-10 after the home team separated itself with 22 points in the fourth quarter.

In his return to the Bulldog football team after missing the 2015 season to an injury suffered in fall camp, Aaron Peck set career highs in receptions and yards, catching nine passes for 112 yards and a touchdown. On the defensive side of the ball Jeff Camilli led the unit with his fifth career game compiling double-digit tackles (10).



In the first quarter, the Bulldogs starting quarterback Chason Virgil completed his first five pass attempts on the Bulldogs' opening possession, until missing the sixth on a third-and-3 from the Nebraska 15-yard line. Kody Kroening missed the ensuing 32-yard attempt and the Huskers grabbed the games momentum back.

Nebraska drove the ball 80 yards on 13 plays to open the scoring, 7-0, following the 'Dogs miss at getting the games first points. After a three-and-out by the Bulldogs on the next possession, the Cornhuskers gave the ball to Devin Ozigbo four straight times as he put them up 14-0 early in the second quarter. In back-to-back drives, the Cornhuskers rushed 16 times in their 17 plays that totaled 107 yards.

Fresno State turned the tide when linebacker Robert Stanley shot through a gap on special teams and blocked a Cornhusker punt. The play ignited the Bulldog offense, earning points off the block by going seven plays for 32 yards, capped by a Virgil to Peck 7-yard TD. Virgil connected on five-of-six attempts on the scoring drive.

With under four minutes remaining in the first half, and the Bulldogs backed up against their own end zone, a late hit to Virgil by Nebraska's Luke Gifford on a third-and-13, which was eventually called a targeting penalty, extended the Bulldogs' drive. Zach Kline entered the game for Virgil and drove the ball down field without a hiccup, going 4-of-5 for 50 yards. He led the 'Dogs as far as the Nebraska 8-yard-line with 0:02 left in the half. Kroening knocked home a 26-yard field goal to leave Fresno State trailing 14-10 as time expired.

In the second half the Bulldogs' offense posted 128 total yards of their 274 compiled in the game and could not find the end zone while Nebraska amassed 257 total yards in the second half that led to 29 points.

#### Quotable

*Head Coach Tim DeRuyter on the final score:*

"You know the final score is the final score. You lose by one or you lose by whatever you lost by it doesn't matter. What matters is you keep fighting, which I thought our guys did. Our guys know that the final score is probably not indicative of the game. I think the Nebraska coaches would say the same thing. But you know it is what it is, they scored that many points, and we scored 10 points so there are no moral victories. But our guys realize when we play well and we don't turn the ball over we can make some plays. We've got a chance to be a good football team."

#### Notables

- In remembrance of Sam Foltz (Nebraska punter that passed), Nebraska used 10 men in its formation for its first punt attempt, no punter. Fresno State declined the delay of game penalty.
- Robert Stanley blocked the first punt of his career. The last time the 'Dogs blocked a punt was on Nov. 8, 2014 (vs. San Jose State).
- In his second-career start, Chason Virgil was 17-of-32 for 133 yards and one touchdown.
- Senior Jeff Camilli recorded a team-high 10 tackles - his fifth career double-digit game.
- Aaron Peck had six catches for 60 yards and a TD in the first half en route to his career highs of nine receptions for 112 yards.
- KeeSean Johnson recorded a career-high eight catches.
- Trent Soechting, in his Bulldog debut, posted seven tackles, including the 'Dogs sole TFL.

**FRESNO, Calif.** - The Fresno State football team used a 21-point fourth quarter in front of an announced crowd of 31,817 at Bulldog Stadium Saturday night to separate itself from a pesky Sacramento State Hornets squad for a 31-3 win in their 2016 home opener.



The Bulldog defense highlighted the game, holding Sacramento State to 185 total yards offense, the lowest output from an opponent since 2008 when Fresno State held New Mexico State to 183.

The defensive backfield duo of Tyquwan Glass and Jamal Ellis each posted interceptions, giving the 'Dogs a win in the last nine-straight games when recording multiple interceptions in a game. The 'Dogs also recorded three sacks between Justin Green, Nathan Madsen and Nela Otukolo while James Bailey led the team with eight tackles.

With his first career touchdown, Deonte O'Neal started the scoring Saturday with an eight-yard TD in the first quarter with 1:02 remaining. Those points were produced thanks to Ellis' interception that set the 'Dogs up in Hornets territory at the 48-yard line.

After that Ellis interception the defense forced four-straight three-and-outs, of the eight amassed on the night. In that span the 'Dogs tacked on three more points after Kody Kroening knocked home a 21-yard field goal during the second quarter. As time expired on the half, the Hornets scored three points with a 44-yard kick, which was set up by a line drive punt that bounced off a Bulldog and was recovered by Sacramento State defender on the Fresno State 27-yard line with six seconds left on the clock.

Neither team was able to put points on the board in the third. A period the 'Dogs outgained the Hornets 106 to 39.

It was the fourth when the Bulldogs broke through and put the game away, scoring on their final three possessions.

Dontel James crossed the plane on a 17-yard run for a touchdown with 14:24 left in the fourth to put the Bulldogs on top 17-3. That run put James over the 100-yard threshold on a night he posted 121 on the ground -- the most by a Fresno State running back since Martezee Waller opened the 2015 season with 154 against Abilene Christian.

Back-to-back touchdown connections between Chason Virgil and KeeSean Johnson followed the James score, which put a stamp on the Bulldogs' win. Entering the game, Johnson owned two career TDs before the two scores in the fourth.

Virgil finished the game 22-of-42 for 274 yards and two scores. The redshirt freshman quarterback set career highs in completions, attempts and yards in the win.

#### Quotable

*Head Coach Tim DeRuyter on this game being a mirror image of the Nebraska game:*

"Give Sacramento State credit, they held in. That is a group with a lot of pride and a great coach. They are a young team and they came out with a lot of fire. In a lot of ways they are very similar to us, they are very young. They got punched in the nose last week at home and we knew they were going to respond. We give them credit, but eventually we were able to block a little better to wear them down a little and get some takeaways and that momentum helped us to get the running game going and be able to seal the deal."

- Junior running back Dontel James rushed for his first career 100-yard game, carrying the ball 27 times for 121 yards and one touchdown.
- Jamire Jordan caught 100 yards on the night, his second career 100-yard receiving game.
- Sophomore wide receiver KeeSean Johnson caught a career best two touchdowns.
- It was the second time in Virgil's young career that he has recorded a multi-touchdown game.
- Senior defensive back Jamal Ellis collected the second interception of his career.
- Senior defensive back Tyquwan Glass grabbed his fourth interception in his last six games
- Glass had the second multi-pass breakup game of his career.

**TOLEDO, Ohio** – In its first trip to the Glass Bowl since 2008, Fresno State was unable to recreate the magic from that day as the Bulldogs fell 52-17 on Saturday afternoon.

After holding the Rockets on their first possession of the game, Toledo scored on four of its next five drives while the Bulldogs' offense struggled to find their stride.

Toledo held a 24-0 advantage at the half and outgained Fresno State 267-73 in that span.

Third down efficiency was the root of the Bulldogs trying first half as they went 0-for-8 over the first two quarters and 0-for-13 in the game.

In the second half, Fresno State bounced back with producing 181 yards of offense while scoring 17 points. A large chunk of that yardage came when Chason Virgil connected with Jamire Jordan for an 85-yard touchdown down the stretch, which set career long plays for the duo (throw and reception).

Virgil also linked up with KeeSean Johnson for a 9-yard score, the third time in the last two games those two have connected for scores.

Toledo amassed 619 total yards in the game, the most by a Bulldog opponent since Wyoming manufactured 694 in 2014.

### Key stat

Toledo outgained Fresno State by 196 yards in the first half as it took a 24-0 lead into the locker room.

**FRESNO, Calif.** – On a sunny Saturday afternoon at Bulldog Stadium, the Fresno State football team raced out to a 31-0 lead over the Tulsa Golden Hurricane in the first half, only to see it evaporate in a 48-41 defeat in double overtime.

In the second period of extra time after neither team scored in the first, Tulsa's Dane Evans scored from 18 yards out, but the Bulldogs had their chance to push it to a third. An incomplete pass on first down was followed with a sack that dropped the 'Dogs to a third-and-17, which was followed by a failed fourth-and-17 that capped the Golden Hurricane comeback.

The game saw 1,070 total yards on 189 total plays, but like the score, Tulsa topped Fresno State with 617 yards offense on 100 plays.

Not to be lost, the Bulldogs flourished offensively, particularly in the first half as they took a 31-21 lead into halftime. It was the most points scored in an opening half by a Bulldog team since the 2013 team scored 42 at San Jose State on Nov. 29.

Fresno State took a 21-0 lead to the second quarter after three rushing scores by three different Bulldogs – Jordan (44 yards), Chason Virgil (14 yards) and Dontel James (2 yards). Cody Kroening then capped a nine-play, 62-yard drive with a 25-yard field goal 3:29 into the second quarter, before Jordan caught a 65-yard pass from Virgil to put the 'Dogs up 31-0.

From that point forward, Tulsa began seizing momentum with three-straight touchdown drives (Evans' passes of 23, 40 and 40 yards) while the Bulldogs went three-and-out on their next three drives – putting Tulsa behind 31-21 going into the second half.

Fresno State responded with its first possession in the second half by eating up 6 minutes, 48 seconds of clock on a 15-play, 67-yard drive that results in a 25-yard Kroening field goal to open third quarter.

Tulsa countered by outscoring Fresno State 27-7 the rest of the way. The three scores in regulation were drives of nine, 11, 11 and 16.

Despite the Golden Hurricane success, the Bulldogs were not going down without a fight. The final seven points the Bulldogs would score was a fourth quarter TD that put the 'Dogs up 41-38 with 5:02 remaining in the game.

Tulsa's 16-play drive that sent the game to overtime, ended with a 28-yard field goal on a drive that the Golden Hurricane went 3-of-4 on third downs.

### Quotable

*Head Coach Tim DeRuyter on losing the 31-0 lead...*

"We did not have any anticipation that we were going to shut Tulsa out. We kept telling our guys on the sideline, 'Hey, this team is going to fight back, they are going to counter-punch.' They were able to run the ball while running the same plays that we practiced this week, the same plays that they ran the first four series. They executed better than we did. We didn't tackle very well. We tried to switch the coverage and we had a guy not see it on a fourth down. Again, you make a stop there and they don't score. There are a half dozen plays that were critical in that ball game that put us into overtime. I don't want it to sound bad, but we caused a lot of them and there are things in our control that we need to fix."

### Notables

- Jeff Camilli deflected a pass and made a sack to force a 3-and-out on Tulsa's opening possession – in all four games this season the 'Dogs have held their opponent scoreless on their opening drive and allowed one first down in those games.
- The Bulldogs scored on their first offensive possession, the first time since Oct. 16, 2015 vs. UNLV, with a 44-yard rush by Jamire Jordan.
- The last game the 'Dogs scored 14 in the first quarter was at Air Force on Oct. 24, 2015.
- The last time the 'Dogs led a game 21-0 in the first quarter was on Nov. 29, 2014 vs. Hawai'i.
- Entering the game, Jeff Camilli had one career sack, he had two in the first quarter vs. Tulsa.
- Jamire Jordan's 65-yard TD marked the seventh TD out of eight career touchdowns to go for more than 20 yards.
- DeJonte O'Neal recorded a 59-yard kickoff return in the third quarter. The longest kick return since Da'mari Scott returned a kick 66 yards vs. San Jose State on Sept. 26, 2015.
- Jamal Ellis entered the season with 1 career INT, he's got two in four games in 2016.

**LAS VEGAS** – Despite a career night from senior wide receiver Aaron Peck, Fresno State fell 45-20 to UNLV on Saturday night at Sam Boyd Stadium. Peck accounted for 194 of the Bulldogs' 360 yards of total offense.

Chason Virgil threw for 296 yards and two scores for the 'Dogs, but the Rebels' ground attack amassed 364 yards and five touchdowns.

After neither team could find their footing through the opening 14 minutes, UNLV then began a 14-play drive, with 13 coming on the ground, which ended in a 1-yard touchdown by Lexington Thomas. The Bulldogs quickly responded with a 52-yard pass to Peck on the ensuing drive. Virgil connected with the senior two plays later for a 15-yard score to knot-up the game.

The Rebels took a 14-7 lead on the ensuing possession with a seven-play 69-yard drive. After forcing the Bulldogs to punt, UNLV quarterback Dalton Sneed tossed a 61-yard touchdown pass to Elijah Troscclair, to double the home team's lead.

Fresno State cut its deficit to 11 with a 42-yard field goal from Kody Kroening with 8:39 to play in the third quarter. James Bailey then nearly forced a fumble deep in UNLV territory, but the play was overturned. Sneed then escaped the pocket on the following play and rushed for a 91-yard score to give the Rebels a 28-10 advantage.

With the score sitting at 31-10, Virgil and Peck made it a 31-17 game late in the third quarter as the two hooked up for an 80-yard touchdown, the longest of Peck's career. The Bulldogs then forced a quick three-and-out and put together a 10-play drive that Kroening capped off with a career-long 47-yard field goal to pull the 'Dogs within 11.

Fresno State was unable to pull any closer and UNLV tacked on 14 points during the final three minutes of the game.

### Key Play

Trailing by 11 midway through the third quarter, Bailey appeared to force a fumble that Nathan Madsen picked up inside the Rebel's 10-yard line, but the play was ultimately overturned. UNLV then scored on a 91-run on the next play to push its lead to 28-10.

### Quotable

Head coach Tim DeRuyter on the execution being a one-play snap shot of the season...  
 "Absolutely. Both sides of the ball. We didn't protect our quarterback well at times. We dropped footballs when balls hit us. Our quarterback didn't hit receivers when they were open. On the defensive side, we were fitting gaps, but we didn't have multiple guys to the ball and we had guys miss tackles. The blame is everywhere."

- Aaron Peck accounted for 67 of Fresno State's 76 yards on its first scoring drive. Peck hauled in a 15-yard score after catching a 52-yard pass.
- Fresno State converted seven of 20 third downs. Five of the seven were on plays with needing nine or more yards.
- Fresno State and UNLV equally owned three, three and outs.
- Fresno State allowed 300-plus yards rushing for the third consecutive game.

**RENO, Nev.** – A career night of 169 yards on the ground from junior running back Dontel James was not enough for Fresno State as Nevada held on to a 27-22 lead with a defensive stand in the final minute of play, Saturday night at Mackay Stadium.

James' 169 yards (27 carries) were the most single game rushing yards by a Bulldog since Robbie Rouse ran for 261 yards at Nevada on Nov. 10, 2012. It was the junior's second 100-yard rushing game this season.

On the Bulldogs' first play from scrimmage, James started his career night by breaking off the longest run of his career, a 34-yard burst down the left side of the field. That started a 9-play, 59-yard drive that resulted in a 44-yard field goal by Kody Kroening.

Aided by Fresno State miscues, a sack turned personal foul, and a 19-yard gain on 3rd-and-20 followed by a 4th-and-1 conversion, Nevada answered the Bulldogs' score with a touchdown to take its first lead, 7-3. The scoring play came via a backward pass from quarterback Tyler Stewart to wide receiver Andrew Celis, Celis then threw downfield to Wyatt Demps for a 36-yard touchdown.

The Bulldogs responded the very next possession with a drive that Kroening capped for the 'Dogs, making it a 7-6 game at the end of the first quarter with a 25-yard field goal. The junior's first quarter field goals were his eighth and ninth consecutive makes this season.

Despite allowing a 14-yard drive to the Wolf Pack to open the second, Fresno State's special teams unit came up big as Malik Forrester blocked Brent Zuzo's 24-yard field goal attempt. Zach Kline, who saw action for the third time this season, fumbled three plays later and Nevada turned it into points with a 4-yard touchdown run from Stewart. Nevada scored again to close the second as Stewart found Demps for a 3-yard touchdown pass to take a 21-6 lead into the half.

The Bulldogs narrowed Nevada's lead to a one score game with just over a minute remaining in the third quarter as they capitalized on a 15-play drive. A drive that Virgil found Jared Rice on a 4th-and-goal from the 1-yard line for the score. It was Rice's first career touchdown.

Two plays later, a forced fumble by Stratton Brown and recovery by Nick Kristofors led to Kroening's third field goal of the night to close the gap to 21-16.

Nevada answered with a 14-play scoring drive to take a 27-16 advantage, with nine plays coming from James Butler on the ground, with 7:56 to play.

The Bulldogs would not go quietly. Virgil engineered a 75-yard drive that James finished off with this first TD of the night to bring the score to 27-22 in Nevada's favor with 5:08 left in the game. The Fresno State defense held tough, forcing a three-and-out, and gave the offense one final shot for the come-from-behind win.

With less than three minutes on the clock, the Bulldogs pushed the ball down to as far as Nevada's 4-yard line, but the 'Dogs were unable to get the ball into the end zone on four passing plays that fell incomplete.

### Key Stat

In the second quarter, Fresno State fumbled twice and punted once on their three possessions, while Nevada scored two touchdowns on its three possessions. The Wolf Pack outgained the Bulldogs 175-75 in that frame.

Head coach Tim DeRuyter on the final series of the game...  
 "We only had one timeout left. Once we got the first down, the clock was running and we thought we had a good matchup with Aaron (Peck), so we threw the fade. **FRESNO, Calif.** – On homecoming, Fresno State held the ball for just under 23 minutes as San Diego State controlled the clock in a 17-3 game on Friday at Bulldog Stadium.

The Aztecs held the narrowest of margins throughout the game: 3-0 after one quarter, 10-0 at halftime and 17-3 following three quarters of play. It was a combination of an Aztec defense that limited the Bulldogs to 10 first downs and 217 yards offense and San Diego State's ground attack that kept them off the field.

Behind a combined 53 carries from Donnell Pumphrey and Rashaad Penny, San Diego State used its run game to control the game, holding a near 15-minute advantage in time of possession. The running back duo accounted for 269 of the Aztecs' 364 yards.

Fresno State's defense held tight on the opening drive, a possession Jeff Camilli and Tobenna Okeke stuffed Pumphrey on a fourth-and-goal from the 1-yard line. The Aztecs accounted for 92 yards offense to the Bulldogs' 30 in the opening quarter, but only mustered a 3-0 lead after the first 15 minutes.

Behind a 2-yard TD run, Pumphrey gave the Aztecs a 10-0 lead as he capped an 11-play drive with 9:15 to play in the second quarter. The Bulldogs made a charge late in the half in part to a 28-yard rush by Chason Virgil and an 15-yard unsportsmanlike conduct penalty against the Aztecs that moved the ball to the opponents' 38-yard line. The drive was halted on a fourth-and-8 fake punt from the 36-yard line in which punter Blake Cusick's pass was intercepted.

For the third time in the last four games, the Bulldogs opened the second half by putting points on the scoreboard as Kody Kroening connected for a 39-yard field goal to cap a 13-play, 54-yard drive to begin the third quarter.

The Aztecs continued to pound the ball on the ground in the second half and broke through late in the third quarter with a 13-yard run by Pumphrey. His second score of the night to make it a 17-3 game.

Pumphrey finished with 220 yards on 38 carries.

Fresno State will travel to Utah State for its first Mountain West pairing in Logan since joining the conference. The game will be aired on the CBS Sports Network on Saturday, Oct. 22 at 7:30 p.m. PT.

**LOGAN, Utah** – The Fresno State football team held tight in the first half on the road at Utah State, trailing by three at the break, but the Aggies outscored the Bulldogs 21-6 in second half to produce the final defeat of 38-20 on Saturday night at Maverick Stadium. It was the 'Dogs seventh loss of the season, eliminating them from bowl game contention.

Chason Virgil finished the game completing 27-of-44 passes for 205 yards and one touchdown. The redshirt freshman had a stretch of 14 consecutive completions that spanned from the second quarter into third. Dontel James added 80 yards and a touchdown on the ground.

After Utah State scored a touchdown on its opening drive of the game to take an early lead, the Bulldog defense held tough on the Aggies' next two drives before the Fresno State offense put together a 15-play drive which James finished off with a three-point run to tie the game at 7-7. Midway through the second quarter, Austin Cheney gave the Aggies a 10-point lead as he blocked a Blake Cusick punt that was recovered in the end zone, to swing the games' momentum.

Fresno State battled through the special teams set back, trailing 17-7. Virgil orchestrated a 77-yard scoring drive that ended with a one-yard pass to Jared Rice to close out the first half. It was Rice's second touchdown and second reception of his career. Virgil went 8-of-8 on the drive that closed the half to pull the 'Dogs within three.

For the first of three second half touchdowns, the Aggies extended its lead to 24-14 to start the second half.

The Bulldogs countered with their longest drive of the season (18 plays) with their first possession in the third quarter, but the 'Dogs drive resulted in a 27-yard field goal, which put them within seven. USU would tack on two more touchdown scores that were only answered by an additional Bulldog field goal, albeit, it was a career-long 49-yard kick by Kody Kroening.

Our guys are right there. At some point, we're going to make those plays. We just have to keep chopping wood. Guys are crushed. You put everything you have to win a football game. To have it there in the second half. Going to the fourth quarter, we felt it was exactly what we wanted. It was a one score game... We have to continue to coach with detail and play with detail. There's too many little things that we aren't doing to win a football game on the road... Defensively, we have to tackle better... The bottom line is: we didn't make enough plays and they (Utah State) did.

**FRESNO, Calif.** – In a 31-21 Fresno State loss on Friday night at Bulldog Stadium to Air Force, the Bulldogs' air attack came up short against the Falcons' ground game. KeeSean Johnson and Jamire Jordan combined for 257 yards receiving, becoming the Bulldogs' first pair of 100-yard receivers since the 2013 Mountain West Championship game, while the Air Force rush attack amassed 327 yards on 73 carries.

Johnson, who had a career-high 142 yards, became the first Bulldog to catch three touchdowns in a game since Davante Adams on Nov. 29, 2013 and Jordan joined Johnson with a 100-yard receiving game (115), his second of the season.

The quarterback, Chason Virgil, notched his first 300-yard passing game and three touchdown game of his young career as he finished with 303 yards, but it also came with a career-high four interceptions.

Virgil and his receivers started clicking during their second drive as the redshirt freshman lofted a 21-yard pass to Jordan before finding Johnson streaking down the middle of the field for a 36-yard touchdown. At the end of the first quarter, Virgil began orchestrating a 10-play, 80-yard drive in which he was 4-of-4 and connected with Johnson for a two-yard score to put the Bulldogs up 14-0.

An interception by Air Force's Brodie Hicks late in the first half led to the Falcon's first score. The Falcons marched 51 yards, with 33 of them coming on a touchdown pass from Nate Romine to Ronald Cleveland with 41 seconds to go to pull within seven, 14-7.

The Falcons would tack on a field goal on its opening drive to start the second half. Three plays later, Air Force grabbed its first lead of the game as Patrick Healy returned an interception 35 yards for a touchdown. Unaffected, Virgil found Johnson open deep on the ensuing Fresno State possession for a 52-yard score, his third of the game.

As the Falcons were driving heading into the fourth, four straight runs from Arion Worthman set them up inside the five-yard line. Two plays later, the quarterback provided the go-ahead score for the visitors, 24-21.

With under four minutes remaining, Air Force looked to put the game away, but the Bulldog defense held strong with a goal-line stand. The offense though could only manage three yards on its next possession and turned the ball over-on-downs at the seven-yard line. Worthman would make it a 31-21 advantage for the Falcons two plays later.

Air Force rushed for 114 yards and two touchdowns on 24 carries while holding the ball for 10:21 in the final quarter.

**FORT COLLINS, Colo.** – The Fresno State football team lost to Colorado State 37-0 on Saturday afternoon at Hughes Stadium. It was the first time the Bulldogs have been shutout since Nov. 19, 2010.

The Bulldogs' offense struggled to find their rhythm early, going three-and-out with its first three drives. All while the Rams could do no wrong despite falling short on a fourth-and-1 at the 11-yard line during their first drive. Jeff Camilli and James Bailey converged on Izzy Matthews for a 1-yard loss to stop a 12-play, 65-yard drive.



From that point forward, Colorado State scored on its next six possessions – five touchdowns and one field goal. The Rams registered 380 yards on their six scoring drives.

Fresno State meanwhile turned to quarterback Zach Kline after Chason Virgil exited the game with a shoulder injury following the 'Dogs' first drive.

The offense recorded 68 total yards in the first half and trailed in the first downs margin 18-2 at halftime. The 'Dogs' posted 59 yards in third quarter and 105 yards in the final frame, resulting in a season-low 232 yards offense.

Kline finished with 147 yards passing, going 11-of-24. He connected with Jamire Jordan for a 48-yard pitch-and-catch in the fourth quarter – the Bulldogs' longest play from scrimmage in the game. Kline also gained 26 yards on the ground with 17 carries.

Stratton Brown led Fresno State in tackles for the fourth-straight game. He posted nine stops.

Fresno State (1-9, 0-6 MW) dropped its eighth-straight game, marking the longest losing streak in school history.

"You've got to give a lot of credit to Colorado State. They did a very good job. They played a very physical brand of football. They gave us some pressures and we had them picked up, but they played really physical. You have to give a lot of credit to them."

"It's tough. He had a lot of pressure around him. There were a few times he should have settled his feet down and thrown the ball. That average was built on as the Rams took a 10-0 lead and outgained Fresno State 179-20 in the first quarter. Colorado State possessed the ball 10:06 to Fresno State's 3:48.

#### Notables

- RB Justin Rice and DB Tank Kelly earned their first career starts at Colorado State; filling the holes missing from injuries to RB Dontel James and DB Tyquan Glass.
- RB Bryson Oglesby played in his first career game; his first career rush was a 21-yard run in third quarter that put the 'Dogs into Colorado State territory for the first time in the contest.
- Colorado State pitched its first shutout since Nov. 4, 1997, a 63-0 win over Hawai'i.
- The Bulldogs were shut out for the first time since Nov. 19, 2010, a 51-0 loss to No. 3 Boise State.
- Colorado State scored 16 points and had 12 first downs before Fresno State posted its first, first down; Kline picked up the first down at the 11:20 mark in the second quarter on an 11-yard scramble.
- Jeff Camilli registered five of his eight tackles in the first quarter.
- Saturday was the sixth game (of 10) that the Bulldogs did not force a turnover in a game.
- Saturday's game marked the fifth time this season that Fresno State did not record a sack.
