Headlines

→ Fresno State returns to the Glass Bowl to face Toledo for the second time in school history and it will be the third pairing between the two schools in the history of their programs.

→ Looking back to the two previous matchups vs. Toledo, the 'Dogs won a 55-54 double overtime thriller on the road in 2008 and their first meeting 44-14 at home in 2005.

→ Coach DeRuyter's win last time out marked the 30th of his career at Fresno State; he became the second-fastest coach to reach No. 30 in school history.

→ Fresno State held it last opponent to 185 total yards offense. It was the lowest output forced by a Bulldog defense since 2008.

→ Between Tyquan Glass and Jamal Ellis, Fresno State recorded its ninth-straight win last time out when producing a game with multiple interceptions.

→ With five more players seeing the field for the first time in a Bulldog uniform during week two, the first-time list rose to 26. That list includes 15 freshmen, five of which are true freshmen.

→ Fresno State's redshirt freshman starting quarterback Chason Virgil set career highs in week two in completions (22), attempts (42) and yards (274). It was his third career start.

→ The quarterback's favorite target has been KeeSean Johnson through two games, Johnson is averaging 7.5 receptions per game - ranking T-17th in FBS football.

→ Fresno State head coach Tim DeRuyter is a former Mid-American Conference defensive coordinator, having spent time at Ohio from 1995-98 and again from 2002-04.

The Power Five David's - vs. Goliath

Since 2003 Fresno State and Toledo have a common bond the two are proud to be on the same side of - they both rank among the elite in wins vs. Power Five programs. There is no sign of backing off for Fresno State as the future holds contests at Alabama and Washington in 2017 while also hosting BYU that year. Other future games include 2018 tilts at Minnesota and UCLA, a 2019 home game vs. Minnesota and a game at USC, 2020 games at Colorado and Texas A&M, 2021 games at Oregon and at UCLA, a 2022 contest at USC, a 2023 contest at Arizona State and another tilt at USC in 2025.

Pair of stingy pass defenses

Entering Saturday afternoon's game, both Fresno State and Toledo sport top 10 FBS pass defenses. The Bulldogs, coming off their week two game where they allowed just 89 yards through the air, enter the game with the No. 8 ranked FBS pass defense. In Fresno State's season opener, Nebraska generated 114 passing yards at Memorial Stadium, which equals two games having allowed a total of 203 yards. Of the total allowed, two are from chunk plays - a 57-yard TD strike from Nebraska's Tommy Armstrong Jr. to Alonzo Moore and a 44-yard completion from Sacramento State's Nathan Ketteringham to Cody Demps. Throw out those two plays and Fresno State's opponents have 102 total passing yards with an average of 2.83 yards per catch. Toledo on the other hand, has been just as stingy by allowing just 94.5 passing yards per game, which ranks No. 5 in the FBS.

→ Did you know that Fresno State has won nine-straight games when it produces multiple interceptions. That stat dates back to the 2012 Hawai'i Bowl, the last time the Bulldogs registered a multi-INT game and lost.

→ Did you know that the last time Fresno State held an opponent to 89 yards passing in a single game was vs. San Diego State on Oct. 3, 2014 (84 yards).

Did that really happen?

More on the Bulldog defense. Sacramento State had a grand total of three plays snapped while in Fresno State territory in the home opener on Sept. 10. And one of those three plays culminated in part to when the Hornets recovered its own punt on the Fresno State 27-yard line - the ball brushed off a Bulldog player in punt coverage, causing a fumble recovery with six seconds left in the first half. Sacramento State followed by converting a 44-yard field goal as time expired - that would be the last play held in Fresno State territory for the remainder of the game.

→ Fresno State held Sacramento State to 185 total yards offense in its week two game. The last time the Bulldogs held an opponent under 200 total yards offense dates back to Nov. 15, 2008 in a game vs. New Mexico State when the 'Dogs allowed 183 total yards offense.

→ By shutting out Sacramento State in the second half, it marked the first time the Bulldogs did so since Nov. 22, 2014 at Nevada - a game that put Fresno State in control of clinching the Mountain West, West Division crown the following week.

DeRuyter's MAC history

Fresno State head coach Tim DeRuyter is no stranger to Toledo and the Mid-American Conference. The fifth-year head coach spent 1995-98 as a defensive coordinator at Ohio and returned to the Bobcats from 2002-04 for a second stint as Ohio's defensive coordinator. Under DeRuyter's direction, Ohio finished 10th in the nation and first in the MAC in scoring defense in 1997. The previous year, the unit ranked among the national leaders in total defense (17th), rushing defense (20th), pass efficiency defense (24th) and scoring defense (29th). He was a part of the Ohio turnaround as the Bobcats improved from 0-11 to 6-6 and then to 8-2 in a three-year span. Included in the 1997 season was an upset win at Maryland. The Bobcats defense returned to prominence once again during tenure No. 2 when DeRuyter helped produce the 25th-ranked defense in the NCAA and the No. 2 defense in the MAC in 2004.





Scouting Toledo

The Rockets enter their first season under Jason Candle after the seven-year assistant assumed the role as head coach last December. Candle has the Rockets flying to start the 2016 season as they have outscored Arkansas State and Maine by a combined score of 76-13. While averaging 186 yards per game on the ground, Toledo has done the majority of its damage through the air. Junior quarterback Logan Woodside has thrown for 700 yards with seven touchdowns to only one interception. Explosive plays have been key to the aerial attack as three of Toledo's receivers have receptions of 60-plus yards. Junior Cody Thompson has been Woodside's top target as he's caught seven receptions for 259 yards. On the defensive side, the Rockets have yet to force turnover, but have stifled opponents, allowing only 250.5 yards per game. The Rockets have been a nuisance in opponents' backfields as thirteen players have combined for 22 tackles for loss, including three players who have registered three apiece.

Fresno State vs. Toledo - The Series

Fresno State and Toledo have met twice before Saturday's matchup with the Bulldogs winning both games. The 'Dogs won their lone trip to the Glass Bowl, a 55-54 double overtime thriller on Sept. 20, 2008. Tom Brandstater led Fresno State as he completed 22-of-28 for 231 yards and four touchdowns. In the second overtime, Toledo decided to go for two, trailing by one, but Nico Herron came up with a pass deflection for the 'Dogs on the two-point attempt.

Unbreakable Glass

Senior Tyquwan Glass hauled in his first interception of 2016 last weekend against Sacramento State. That pick marked the fourth INT (of five career) for Glass over the last six games dating back to 2015. The then-junior transfer made his first career INT vs. No. 21 Utah in week three of his junior season and soon emerged as one of the Bulldogs best cover options. He earned his first career start in week five vs. San Diego State on Oct. 3 and has started the 10 consecutive games for Fresno State since. In addition to Glass' first interception of the year last week, he registered two pass break ups. Glass has five pass break ups over the last five games and notched his second career game with multiple PBUs in the win vs. the Hornets.

Fresno State has a new 100-yard rushing threat

Junior Dontel James showed the Bulldogs fan base last Saturday what all the buzz was about during fall camp. Despite a rocky start vs. the Nebraska Blackshirts, who held James to 20 yards rushing on 12 attempts, he broke through for 121 net yards on 27 carries in Fresno State's home opener - both career bests. It was the most rushing yards by a Bulldog in a single game since Marteze Waller went for 154 vs. Abilene Christian on Sept. 1, 2015.

Pound the rock

In addition to James' 121 rushing yards, Treyvon Green (34), Dejonte O'Neal (28), Zach Kline (9) and Chason Virgil (8) combined for 79 yards to help Fresno State reach the 200-yard rushing benchmark. With that, the Bulldogs improve to 15-1 under head coach Tim DeRuyter when the team exceeds 200 yards on the ground.

Don't forget the punter

- Blake Cusick, in his second career game and first at Bulldog Stadium, placed six of his eight punts inside the 20.
- Three of Cusick's eight punts were inside the 10 and two of those three were inside the 5.
- In the first quarter, he connected for a career-long 59-yard punt that was downed on the 1-yard line.
- Sacramento State tallied zero punt return yards.
- Cusick averaged 35.8 yards per punt on eight attempts.

Bulldogs Partnership with KSEE-24 benefits the Valley

It was announced on Aug. 26 that Fresno State's Sept. 17 contest at Toledo, will air on KSEE-24 TV in the Fresno market. The game will kick off at 12 p.m. Pacific. The announcement marks the third time in the last four seasons at least one game will be available on over-the-air television for the Valley. The game will also be available on ESPN3 for Bulldog fans outside of the KSEE-24 TV viewing area.

Red Zone Perfection

The Bulldogs clicked last Saturday when it came to red zone efficiency in their 31-3 win as all five trips inside the 20 resulted in four touchdowns and a 21-yard field goal. Two touchdown scores came through the air with 4-yard and 11-yard scores, both to KeeSean Johnson from Chason Virgil. Deonte O'Neal punched in an 8-yard score and Dontel James struck for a 17-yard score - both career firsts for both running backs. Looking back to week one, the Bulldogs went 2-for-4 while in the red zone - giving the 'Dogs a 77.8 percent red zone rate (7-for-9) through two games.

Captain O' Captain

Three seniors and the Bulldogs' starting quarterback were elected team captains by their peers prior to the season's first contest. The four players include two each on offense and defense.

Peck is the sole fifth-year of the group while Camilli is a fourth-year senior. Glass and Virgil are both in their second years with the program with Glass being a JC-transfer and Virgil in his second year since playing at West Mesquite High School.

New Season, New Players

Five student-athletes saw their first game action in a Bulldog uniform against Sacramento State, raising the 2016 total to 26 first-time players this season through the first two games. Of that group, 15 are freshman and five are true freshman (Juju Hughes, Josh Hokit, Jeffrey Allison, Elijah Piper and Jaron Bryant).

In addition to the first timers against Sacramento State, Patrick Belony picked up his first career start in place of starting nose guard Malik Forrester. After games against Nebraska and Sacramento State, eight 'Dogs have earned their first career starts. That group consists of RB Dontel James, TE Kyle Riddering, OL Christian Cronk, OL David Patterson and on defense, NG Malik Forrester, DE Nick Kristofors and FS Stratton Brown, along with Belony.

Sophomore wide receiver doubles up

While sophomore wideout KeeSean Johnson was somewhat overlooked due to Aaron Peck's huge game at Nebraska (9 rec., 112 yards, 1 TD), Johnson backed up his eight reception career-high night at Nebraska that went for 61 yards with a seven reception, 82-yard, two touchdown performance vs. Sacramento State. Johnson doubled his career touchdown total from two to four, and helped put away the game with scores on back-to-back drives to put a stamp on the 31-3 win. Johnson leads the team with 15 reception, which ranks T-17th in FBS football at 7.5 grabs per game. The sophomore's 82 yards vs. Sacramento State was eight yards shy of his career-high - set at San Jose State in 2015.

Defense holding explosive plays in check

Through two games the Fresno State defense has allowed only four plays to go for more than 20 yards - three passes and one rush. The longest pass play allowed was a 57-yard TD strike at Nebraska and the long run permitted was a 24-yard rush, also at Nebraska. Compare that to a season ago, that Bulldog defense had allowed nine explosive plays (7 pass/2 rush) through the first two games of the 2015 season.

Headed East

It has been 89 games since the Bulldogs traveled to the Eastern Time zone to face Cincinnati on Sept. 26, 2009 - a 28-20 loss to a then-ranked No. 14 Bearcat squad. The last win Fresno State picked up in the Eastern Time zone was the Bulldogs 55-54 double overtime win at Toledo on Sept. 20, 2008. Oddly enough, the Bulldogs traveled to Rutgers two weeks prior and earned a 24-7 victory to open the 2008 season in New Jersey. It is 2,370 miles from Fresno, Calif. to Toledo, Ohio.





DeRuyter Mile Marker

Head coach Tim DeRuyter recorded his 30th win at Fresno State in the Bulldogs 31-3 win last time out. DeRuyter is the second-fastest Fresno State head football coach to reach 30 wins in school history, trailing only Cecil Coleman who hit that earmark during his fourth season at the helm of the program in 1962. Coleman was 37-13 (.740) in five seasons as head coach of the Bulldog football team and still to this day has the second-highest winning percentage of any coach in school history (trailing James Bradshaw, 1936-42, who was 59-18-5, .750).

Did You Know

- Did you know that the Bulldogs are one of just 26 Football Bowl Subdivision programs and one of just two in the Mountain West that has made at least 12 bowl appearances in the last 15 years?
- Did you know that Fresno State is one of just seven FBS programs that have three or fewer head coaches in the last 36 years going back to 1980?

Fresno State vs. the MAC

The history is short with the Bulldogs against teams from the Mid-American Conference since the year 2000. Saturday's game against Toledo will be the fourth against MAC schools with two prior matchups vs. Toledo and the third a 2010 bowl game against Northern Illinois - a 40-17 2010 Humanitarian Bowl (Boise, Idaho) loss. With wins against Toledo in 2005 and 2008, the 'Dogs are 3-1 in that span against the MAC.

Getting tight ends in the mix

Starting TE Chad Olsen entered his junior season with some steam coming off his first two years in the program. He owned 32 career receptions for 379 yards and seven touchdowns - which are the most touchdown receptions of any returning player on the roster. Through two games, Olsen has three catches for 49 yards - 31 being the long. The production from the tight ends in the passing game will be one to watch as the season goes along. In the last 10 years, Bulldog tight ends have not caught more than 50 passes in a season or combined to have six or more receiving touchdowns in a year. Not since Bear Pascoe, a seven-year NFL veteran, has Fresno State seen its tight ends tally over 40 receptions in a season. That came in Pascoe's junior and senior seasons when the group had 43 and 49 catches, respectively, thanks to 40 receptions from Pascoe as a junior in 2007 and 45 his senior year.

Bulldogs in the NFL

As NFL rosters were trimmed down to 53 on Sept. 3, nine former Bulldogs earned roster spots heading into the 2016 season. The most veteran players in the group include Ryan Mathews and Chris Carter. The youngest include Isaiah Burse, Tyeler Davison, Derron Smith and Cody Wichmann, who all have less than two years' experience in the league. As of Sept. 4, Charles Washington (Detroit Lions) and Curtis Riley (Tennessee Titans) have earned spots on practice squads and Tristan Okpalaugo (Arizona Cardinals) is on the Injured Reserve.

TIM DERUYTER

FRESNO STATE HEAD COACH
5TH SEASON | AIR FORCE (1985)

Tim DeRuyter is set to embark on his fifth season as head coach at Fresno State and has transitioned the Bulldogs into one of the major players in the Mountain West.

DeRuyter (pronounced da-ROOT-er) took over a team that went 4-9 the year before he arrived and turned the tables by leading Fresno State to back-to-back Mountain West championships and back into the top 25 rankings in 2013. With Fresno State joining the Mountain West in 2012, DeRuyter's Bulldogs got right to work establishing their brand as a force in the conference by winning league titles in 2012 and 2013. Before the DeRuyter era launched, Fresno State had not won a conference championship since 1999 -- a drought of 13 years, and hadn't won consecutive league titles since 1992 and 1993.

After losing five players to the NFL off of the 2013 team, including All-Americans Derek Carr, Davante Adams and Austin Wentworth, Fresno State came back in 2014 and won the West Division to reach the MW Championship game for a second consecutive season. The 2014 team started out 0-3 with consecutive losses to Power-5 programs, all three that were ranked at some point during the season, but rebounded to win the West and reach a bowl game. No other Bulldog team in school history had rebounded to win six games and get bowl eligible after an 0-3 start to a season. From 1980-2014 there had been 496 total FBS teams that started 0-3 and the 2014 Bulldogs became just the 21st of that group to make a bowl, playing in the Hawai'i Bowl for the second time in three years.

Those are two of the three bowl appearances DeRuyter has led the Bulldogs to - the other being the 2013 Royal Purple Las Vegas Bowl - and he has a 29-23 overall record. He was hired as Fresno State's 17th head coach in program history on Dec. 14, 2011.

DeRuyter directed Fresno State to one of its finest seasons in program history in 2013. Fresno State went 11-2, won the inaugural Mountain West Championship game and matched the school record for wins in a season. The 'Dogs were ranked as high as No. 13 in the USA Today Coaches Poll and closed out the Bowl Championship Series era ranked No. 20 in the final BCS standings, the highest of any non-automatic qualifying/BCS conference team that year.

Player success under DeRuyter is well documented. Fourteen Bulldogs have been named first-team All-Mountain West in his four seasons, which is the second-most first-team honorees of any school in the conference. Carr in 2012 and again in 2013 was named the MW Offensive Player of the Year and Phillip Thomas in 2012 the league's Defensive Player of the Year.

Along with the All-Americans Adams, Carr, Thomas and Wentworth, DeRuyter has seen six of his Bulldogs be drafted along with another 14 that made training camps or signed as free agents with NFL teams. The five draft picks over the 2014-15 NFL Drafts were the most from any non-Power 5 program in the FBS.

Safety Phillip Thomas in 2012 was named an unanimous All-American and was a finalist for the Jim Thorpe Award after leading the nation in interceptions with eight. Thomas went on to be a fourth round draft pick of the Washington Redskins and started games for them towards the end of the 2014 season.

Prior to coming to Fresno State, DeRuyter was the assistant head coach/defensive coordinator at Texas A&M where he coached one of the elite defensive players in the game in Von Miller. Miller, who in addition to earning All-American honors, was awarded the 2010 Butkus Award given annually to the nation's most outstanding linebacker. He went on to become the second overall pick of the Broncos in the 2011 NFL draft.

DeRuyter came to Fresno State with 22 years of coaching experience. His last game coaching at Texas A&M was in the role as interim head coach for the Aggies in the Meineke Car Care Bowl of Texas, a game Texas A&M won 33-22 over Northwestern on Dec. 31, 2011.

LINCOLN, Neb. - Down two scores in the second quarter to Nebraska, Fresno State fought back in front of 90,013 fans at Memorial Stadium to pull within four points heading into halftime at 14-10, but it was the Huskers who prevailed 43-10 after the home team separated itself with 22 points in the fourth quarter.

In his return to the Bulldog football team after missing the 2015 season to an injury suffered in fall camp, Aaron Peck set career highs in receptions and yards, catching nine passes for 112 yards and a touchdown. On the defensive side of the ball Jeff Camilli led the unit with his fifth career game compiling double-digit tackles (10).

In the first quarter, the Bulldogs starting quarterback Chason Virgil completed his first five pass attempts on the Bulldogs' opening possession, until missing the sixth on a third-and-3 from the Nebraska 15-yard line. Kody Kroening missed the ensuing 32-yard attempt and the Huskers grabbed the games momentum back.

Nebraska drove the ball 80 yards on 13 plays to open the scoring, 7-0, following the 'Dogs miss at getting the games first points. After a three-and-out by the Bulldogs on the next possession, the Cornhuskers gave the ball to Devin Ozigbo four straight times as he put them up 14-0 early in the second quarter. In back-to-back drives, the Cornhuskers rushed 16 times in their 17 plays that totaled 107 yards.

Fresno State turned the tide when linebacker Robert Stanley shot through a gap on special teams and blocked a Cornhusker punt. The play ignited the Bulldog offense, earning points off the block by going seven plays for 32 yards, capped by a Virgil to Peck 7-yard TD. Virgil connected on five-of-six attempts on the scoring drive.

With under four minutes remaining in the first half, and the Bulldogs backed up against their own end zone, a late hit to Virgil by Nebraska's Luke Gifford on a third-and-13, which was eventually called a targeting penalty, extended the Bulldogs' drive. Zach Kline entered the game for Virgil and drove the ball down field without a hiccup, going 4-of-5 for 50 yards. He led the 'Dogs as far as the Nebraska 8-yard-line with 0:02 left in the half. Kroening knocked home a 26-yard field goal to leave Fresno State trailing 14-10 as time expired.

In the second half the Bulldogs' offense posted 128 total yards of their 274 compiled in the game and could not find the end zone while Nebraska amassed 257 total yards in the second half that led to 29 points.

Quotable

Head Coach Tim DeRuyster on the final score:

"You know the final score is the final score. You lose by one or you lose by whatever you lost by it doesn't matter. What matters is you keep fighting, which I thought our guys did. Our guys know that the final score is probably not indicative of the game. I think the Nebraska coaches would say the same thing. But you know it is what it is, they scored that many points, and we scored 10 points so there are no moral victories. But our guys realize when we play well and we don't turn the ball over we can make some plays. We've got a chance to be a good football team."

Notables

- In remembrance of Sam Foltz (Nebraska punter that passed), Nebraska used 10 men in its formation for its first punt attempt, no punter. Fresno State declined the delay of game penalty.
- Robert Stanley blocked the first punt of his career. The last time the 'Dogs blocked a punt was on Nov. 8, 2014 (vs. San Jose State).
- In his second-career start, Chason Virgil was 17-of-32 for 133 yards and one touchdown.
- Senior Jeff Camilli recorded a team-high 10 tackles - his fifth career double-digit game.
- Aaron Peck had six catches for 60 yards and a TD in the first half en route to his career highs of nine receptions for 112 yards.
- KeeSean Johnson recorded a career-high eight catches.
- Trent Soechting, in his Bulldog debut, posted seven tackles, including the 'Dogs sole TFL.

FRESNO, Calif. - The Fresno State football team used a 21-point fourth quarter in front of an announced crowd of 31,817 at Bulldog Stadium Saturday night to separate itself from a pesky Sacramento State Hornets squad for a 31-3 win in their 2016 home opener.

The Bulldog defense highlighted the game, holding Sacramento State to 185 total yards offense, the lowest output from an opponent since 2008 when Fresno State held New Mexico State to 183.

The defensive backfield duo of Tyquan Glass and Jamal Ellis each posted interceptions, giving the 'Dogs a win in the last nine-straight games when recording multiple interceptions in a game. The 'Dogs also recorded three sacks between Justin Green, Nathan Madsen and Nela Otukolo while James Bailey led the team with eight tackles.

With his first career touchdown, Deonte O'Neal started the scoring Saturday with an eight-yard TD in the first quarter with 1:02 remaining. Those points were produced thanks to Ellis' interception that set the 'Dogs up in Hornets territory at the 48-yard line.

After that Ellis interception the defense forced four-straight three-and-outs, of the eight amassed on the night. In that span the 'Dogs tacked on three more points after Kody Kroening knocked home a 21-yard field goal during the second quarter. As time expired on the half, the Hornets scored three points with a 44-yard kick, which was set up by a line drive punt that bounced off a Bulldog and was recovered by Sacramento State defender on the Fresno State 27-yard line with six seconds left on the clock.

Neither team was able to put points on the board in the third. A period the 'Dogs outgained the Hornets 106 to 39.

It was the fourth when the Bulldogs broke through and put the game away, scoring on their final three possessions.

Dontel James crossed the plane on a 17-yard run for a touchdown with 14:24 left in the fourth to put the Bulldogs on top 17-3. That run put James over the 100-yard threshold on a night he posted 121 on the ground - the most by a Fresno State running back since Martezee Waller opened the 2015 season with 154 against Abilene Christian.

Back-to-back touchdown connections between Chason Virgil and KeeSean Johnson followed the James score, which put a stamp on the Bulldogs' win. Entering the game, Johnson owned two career TDs before the two scores in the fourth.

Virgil finished the game 22-of-42 for 274 yards and two scores. The redshirt freshman quarterback set career highs in completions, attempts and yards in the win.

Quotable

Head Coach Tim DeRuyster on this game being a mirror image of the Nebraska game:

"Give Sacramento State credit, they held in. That is a group with a lot of pride and a great coach. They are a young team and they came out with a lot of fire. In a lot of ways they are very similar to us, they are very young. They got punched in the nose last week at home and we knew they were going to respond. We give them credit, but eventually we were able to block a little better to wear them down a little and get some takeaways and that momentum helped us to get the running game going and be able to seal the deal."

Notables

- Junior running back Dontel James rushed for his first career 100-yard game, carrying the ball 27 times for 121 yards and one touchdown.
- Jamire Jordan caught 100 yards on the night, his second career 100-yard receiving game.
- Sophomore wide receiver KeeSean Johnson caught a career best two touchdowns.
- It was the second time in Virgil's young career that he has recorded a multi-touchdown game.
- Senior defensive back Jamal Ellis collected the second interception of his career.
- Senior defensive back Tyquan Glass grabbed his fourth interception in his last six games
- Glass had the second multi-pass breakup game of his career.
