Headlines

→ Fresno State head coach Tim DeRuyter, now in his fifth season leading the program, enters Saturday's game against Sacramento State with a 3-1 record in home openers. Since 2000, Fresno State has lost only two home openers in that span, both being against ranked opponents entering Bulldog Stadium - No. 10 Wisconsin (2007) & No. 21 Nebraska (2014).

→ Although just a mere 174 miles from Hornet Stadium to Bulldog Stadium, Saturday's contest will be the third time Fresno State and Sacramento State will have met. The 'Dogs own a 2-0 record in those games with the previous games happening in 1972 and 2007.

→ Tim DeRuyter's teams own a 26.0 margin of victory over FCS opponents in four wins since 2012. Fresno State is 26-1 against the FCS since 1982.

→ Last Saturday, 21 Bulldogs saw their first game action, including five true freshman.

→ Aaron Peck and KeeSean Johnson both set career highs in receptions with nine and eight, respectively. The duo combined for 17 of the 24 completed passes against Nebraska.

→ Did you know? Last time the Bulldogs hosted Sacramento State in 2007, Fresno State retired David Carr's No. 8 jersey during a halftime ceremony.

→ On Saturday, the NFL trimmed down its rosters to the 53-man units that will start week one this coming Sunday, 11 Bulldogs are on active rosters while two are on practice squads.

→ Fresno State's new look sideline features six first-year coaches that will grace the sideline at Bulldog Stadium for the first time this Saturday; it includes offensive coordinator Eric Kiesau (Alabama, 2015), defensive coordinator Lorezno Ward (South Carolina, 2009-15) and assistant coaches Joe Bernardi, Burl Toler, Dave Ungerer and Mark Weber.

The Bulldogs Against FCS Schools

Saturday's game will be Fresno State's 12th against an FCS school since 2000 and the past 11 of them have been home victories. Four of those have been under DeRuyter's direction, and in those four wins, it's been by an average of 26.0 points per game. Last season, Fresno State defeated Abilene Christian 34-13 in front of 32,547 fans at Bulldog Stadium. Looking back over the past 35 years, Fresno State is 26-1 against FCS opponents.

Scouting Sacramento State

The Hornets enter their third season under head coach Jody Sears in 2016, a graduate of Washington State ('91). Following a season opening 38-30 loss to Western Oregon, Sears is 9-15 in his time leading the Hornets. Western Oregon, a Div. II opponent, was Sacramento State's first loss to a non-Div. I team since facing UC Davis in the 2002 Causeway Classic. The Hornets had won seven consecutive games when playing teams from a lower division until last week. Sacramento State returned 19 players from last season's team who started at least five of the team's 11 games. Included in that list are six players (three offense, three defense) that started every game. The Hornets return five players who took snaps at quarterback last season, including three who started games. Sophomore Nate Ketteringham finished the season starting the final five games and started the Hornets' opener last Saturday. Ketteringham took every snap in the Hornets' opener and was 34-of-58 for a career-high 370 yards and three touchdowns against two interceptions. He spread the ball around to 10 different receivers, leading that group was Isiah Hennie with six catches for 73 yards. Jaelin Ratliff was the benefactor of two of Ketteringham's TD throws while Johnnie Rucker caught the third. Explosive plays may have sealed the Hornets' fate as Western Oregon scored 21 points from a 74-yard punt return, 36-yard pass and 30-yard run for three of its scores.

Fresno State vs. Sacramento State - The Series

Fresno State and Sacramento State have met twice before Saturday's home opener for the Bulldogs. The last matchup coming in 2007, a 24-3 victory led by Fresno State's defense holding Sacramento State to 102 total yards offense. Tom Brandstater quarterbacked that Bulldogs team, going 16-of-27 for 199 yards and a touchdown. Bear Pascoe caught the TD pass and led the team with 91 yards receiving that day. Prior to 2007, the two schools first matchup was back in 1972, a game the Bulldogs won 24-7 under head coach Darryl Rogers.

New Season, New Players

In Saturday's season opener at Nebraska, the 2016 team saw new faces see game action for the first time. In all, 21 players suited up and saw action for the first time while seven earned their first career starts. The first time offensive starters were RB Dontel James, TE Kyle Riddering, OL Christian Cronk and OL David Patterson. On defense, NG Malik Forrester, DE Nick Kristofors and FS Stratton Brown all picked up their first career starts as Bulldogs. Of the 21 first time players, 11 were freshman and five were true freshman (Juju Hughes, Josh Hokit, Jeffrey Allison, Elijah Piper and Jaron Bryant).

What Derek Carr and Chason Virgil have in common

Comparing Derek Carr to anyone but his older brother David is as far as one will usually go with one of the all-time greats to play at Fresno State, but looking back to when the Bulldogs traveled to Nebraska in 2011, that was Carr's second career start - just as last Saturday's game was for Chason Virgil. Carr played in front of 85,101 at Memorial Stadium that year and went 20-of-41 (.488) for 254 yards and one touchdown. In Virgil's start at Nebraska in front of 90,013, he went 17-of-32 (.531) for 133 yards and one touchdown. In Carr's third career start, which was against an FCS opponent, North Dakota, just as Virgil's upcoming start will be against an FCS opponent (Sacramento State), Carr went 11-of-17 for 235 yards and two touchdowns.

Stay Ready

One of the top jobs of the backup quarterback is to always stay ready, and that's exactly what the Bulldogs' No. 2 quarterback Zach Kline was at Nebraska. Chason Virgil, sidelined with under three minutes remaining in the first half after a targeting penalty ended the Huskers' Luke Gifford's day, left the game for the remainder of the half. All Kline did was go 4-of-5 for 50 yards and help put three points on the board as time expired thanks to Kody Kroening converting a 26-yard field goal. Kline also saw action in the final series of the evening for Fresno State, that drive was stopped short after an interception was thrown in the end zone by the graduate transfer. Up until that throw he was 3-of-5 for 60 yards.

Third down Passing

Fresno State went 5-of-14 converting its third downs against Nebraska. And all five were picked up via the passing game with quarterback Chason Virgil under center. All but one play in an attempt to convert a third down was via the passing game when a 3rd-and-1 was stopped short in the second quarter on the ground. Virgil connected with Chad Olsen on 3rd-and-3 to extend the opening series, in the second quarter during the Bulldogs touchdown drive, Virgil linked up with KeeSean Johnson on a 3rd-and-8 and Aaron Peck on a 3rd-and-9. Virgil again hooked up with Peck on a 3rd-and-8 in the third quarter and completed a 3rd-and-6 to Jamire Jordan in the fourth quarter. Those five plays equaled to 51 yards of his 133 passing.

Explosive Plays

Fresno State limited to Nebraska in the season opener to three explosive plays (plays more than 20 yards); two of the three were passing plays, one a 57-yard TD, the other a 23 yard completion. The 57-yard scoring play as well as the sole rush to go for over 20 yards, both happened in the fourth quarter when the Huskers added 22 points to their 21-10 lead entering the final quarter. On the other hand, Fresno State's offense was also limited with two explosive plays, both Zach Kline passes of 25 and 32.

Protecting Bulldog Stadium

When it comes to homefield advantage, Bulldog Stadium has been one of the toughest venues in the nation to play in. With a 76.4 percent winning percentage since it opened in 1980, Fresno State has the 15th-best home winning percentage among the 128 FBS schools across the country. And under head coach Tim DeRuyter, the Bulldogs are 19-6 (.760) under his direction

Notable Debuts

As far as the stat sheet goes, sophomore transfer inside linebacker Trent Soechting and graduate transfer quarterback Zach Kline made the most of stuffing it in their debuts. Soechting, a transfer from Blinn College in Texas, registered seven tackles and tallied the night's sole tackle for a loss for the Bulldogs defense. Kline, a former California and Indiana State quarterback, made the most of his time backing up Chason Virgil in a two minute drive to close the first half as well as leading the offense for its final drive in the fourth quarter. He was 7-of-11 for 110 yards (1 INT). Not be forgotten, nose guard Malik Forrester, and left tackle Christian Cronk played pivotal roles up front, getting the majority of the snaps at their respective positions throughout the game.

Loud Noises

The Bulldogs season opener at Nebraska was attended by 90,013 ruckus fans at Memorial Stadium. It was the fourth-largest opposing crowd Fresno State has gone up against in school history. The largest came in 2003, a trip to Tennessee that flooded 103,860 to Neyland Stadium.

Outside Receivers Emerge for the Bulldogs in Opener

The combination of Aaron Peck and KeeSean Johnson accounted for 17 of the 24 passes completed by the Bulldogs, and every yard but 70 of the 243 yards passing Saturday night at Nebraska. Peck, after missing the 2015 season to injury, set career highs with nine receptions and 112 yards receiving, to go along with one touchdown. Johnson set a career-high with eight passes caught. He picked up 61 yards, which was short of the 90 he gained at San Jose State last season.

It was recently announced that Fresno State's next road game, a Sept. 17 contest at Toledo, will air on KSEE-24 TV. The game will kick off at 12 p.m. Pacific. The announcement marks the third time in the last four seasons at least one game will be available on over-the-air television for the Valley.





More than Football

Fresno State honored Nebraska's Sam Foltz, who died in a car wreck in July, this past Saturday by wearing a helmet sticker on the back of it and went on to do more once the game got underway. After Nebraska went three-and-out on their first possession, they lined up with 10 players and no punter. While the play clock winded down to zero and players on both sides of the ball clapped along with the fans in attendance, the delay of game penalty was declined by Fresno State. DeRuyter said after the game, "No hesitation. It is tragic. I was talking with our coaches, and I can't imagine losing a son. And if we can't teach our guys to not do something classy like that then what is college for? I said we were going to decline the penalty. We were going to do that."

Back at home, tragedy struck on game day while the 'Dogs were at Nebraska as former Bulldog football player and current correctional officer Toamalama Scanlan was shot in an incident inside the downtown Fresno jail lobby that morning and remains in critical condition (as of Sunday, Sept. 4) Scanlan played defensive end at Fresno State in 1996. In his single season as a Bulldog, he started all 11 games and posted 43 tackles and had the second-most sacks on the team with 4.0. He majored in law enforcement at Fresno State. Scanlan will be recognized during Saturday's game against Sacramento State.

Robert Stanley's presence felt on special teams

For the first time since Nov. 8, 2014 Fresno State blocked a punt and it was thanks to junior linebacker Robert Stanley shooting the gap during the second quarter last Saturday evening at Nebraska. Dalen Jones recovered the block on Nebraska's 32 yard line and seven plays later the 'Dogs were in the end zone for their first touchdown of 2016. Stanley, who received his second career start at inside linebacker, also tallied four tackles in the game. Looking back to 2014, Da'Mari Scott blocked a punt against San Jose State in the second quarter that was recovered by T.J. Thomas in the end zone to give the 'Dogs a 28-14 lead en route to their 38-24 win.

Jamire Jordan getting it done

Jamire Jordan has made at least one reception in every game he has played. Now in his sophomore campaign after making 11 starts and playing in all 12 games as a redshirt freshman, Jamire Jordan extended his streak to consecutive games with a reception to 13. The 2015 Mountain West freshman leader in receptions, yards and touchdowns, caught five passes for 52 yards in the Bulldogs opener at Nebraska.

Winning the Turnover Battle

Winning the turnover battle has always been frequent staple of Coach DeRuyter's comments uttered and as one would assume, it leads to wins. The Bulldogs have won the turnover battle 25 times under DeRuyter and got the W in 17 of those contests. Going further, the Bulldogs have fell in the turnover battle 19 times and tied it eight times since 2012. Fresno State threw two interceptions at Nebraska and did not force a turnover in the loss.

Bulldogs in the NFL

As NFL rosters were trimmed down to 53 on Sept. 3, 11 former Bulldogs earned roster spots heading into the 2016 season. The most veteran players in the group include Ryan Mathews and Chris Carter. The youngest include Isaiah Burse, Tyeler Davison, Tristan Okpalauugo, Derron Smith and Cody Wichmann, who all have less than two years experience in the league. As of Sept. 4, Charles Washington (Detroit Lions) and Curtis Riley (Tennessee Titans) have earned spots on practice squads.

The Bulldogs

Fresno State returns 31 letterwinners this season and will welcome 44 newcomers to its roster. Despite having a young team - 67 of its 103 players on the opening day roster are freshmen or sophomores, and there are only 15 seniors on this 2016 team. The Bulldogs do have some experience entering the year as last season they had 30 members on their roster play in their first career game in a Bulldog uniform, and 21 that made their first career start. That number tied for the sixth-most first-time starters among any FBS program in 2015.

New Direction on Offense

Eric Kiesau was hired as Fresno State's new offensive coordinator this offseason, coming in fresh off a national championship season at Alabama where he was an offensive analyst for the Crimson Tide in 2015. Kiesau's role at Alabama in 2015 was to help install an up-tempo aspect to the Tide's offense. His impact was felt in the results with the national championship and the fact that Alabama's offense produced the 2015 Heisman Trophy winner in running back Derrick Henry. The stats also showed his impact. Alabama ran the fifth-most plays of any FBS team last season, averaged 427.1 yards per game and ranked fourth in the SEC in scoring at 35.1 points per game.

Kiesau has been an offensive coordinator before at Washington (2012-13) and Colorado (2009-10). In 2014 at Kansas, he took over as a interim offensive coordinator for the last five games of that season. He has said that he sees his 2016 Bulldog offense as being a blend of what he did when he was a coordinator at Washington and of Alabama's offense last season.

Here is Kiesau's body of work during his time as a coordinator at Washington and Colorado, which shows great improvement from his first year to his second, and from his time at Alabama from 2014 before he arrived to 2015 in his one year there as an offensive analyst.

New Look on the Sideline

Fresno State sports six new assistants on its sidelines in 2016; it includes offensive coordinator Eric Kiesau (Alabama, 2015), defensive coordinator Lorezno Ward (South Carolina, 2009-15), assistant coaches Joe Bernadi (TEs), Burl Toler (WRs), Dave Ungerer (RBs & ST) and Mark Weber (OL). Fresno State, along with Utah State and Western Kentucky are the only three FBS schools who has a returning head coach with as many as six new assistant coaches. USC - who had an interim coach last year, which was retained and given the head coaching position, has seven new assistants.





Strong Academic Marks

The Bulldog football program has achieved high academic marks under head coach Tim DeRuyter. Here is a look at some of the academic highlights:

- Back in April the National Football Foundation announced its Hampshire Honor Society, which is comprised of college football players from all divisions who each maintained a cumulative 3.2 GPA or better throughout their college careers. It honors student-athletes in their last year of eligibility. Fresno State had six honorees from its 2015 team, which tied for the second-most of any FBS program in the country.
- Justin Northern was named a 2015 CoSIDA Academic All-American. He is the second Bulldog, along with Derek Carr in 2013, to receive the high academic honor. In the 90 seasons of program history before DeRuyter took over as head coach, there were only four previous Academic All-Americans.
- The Bulldogs had 19 selections on the 2015 Fall Academic All-Mountain West team. It marked the fourth-straight year that the Bulldog football team has had 15 or more student-athletes selected to the fall Academic All-MW team. Fresno State and Boise State are the only two schools in that time frame to have 15 or more honorees from football each year.
- In the 2014-15 academic year, the program posted its highest team GPA seen in eight years, finishing with a GPA of 2.785. Fresno State followed that up with a 2.72 team GPA in 2015-16 and was at 2.738 in 2013-14. The football program has also seen its number of student-athletes with a 3.0 GPA or better rise every year under DeRuyter.

Preseason Polls | Preseason Teams

Fresno State was voted by league media to finish in fourth place in the West Division in the 2016 Mountain West preseason poll. Although it is the lowest the Bulldogs have been selected in a preseason poll going all the way back through 2004, it should not be lost that the 'Dogs are one of the most successful teams in the Mountain West. Fresno State's 21 league victories since joining the conference in 2012 is the third most, trailing San Diego State (26) and Boise State (25). The Bulldogs are also the only program to have played in two Mountain West Championship games since its inception in 2013.

Adding on to the chip on this team's shoulder was the fact no Bulldog was selected on the preseason all-conference team. Even with no selections this year, Fresno State's 17 selections since joining the league still rank as the second-most of any team in the conference. Only Boise State has had more preseason all-conference selections over the last five preseason polls.

→ Although Fresno State did not have a first-team All-Mountain West honoree in 2015, the first time no Bulldog has been named first-team all-conference since 1952, Fresno State still ranks No. 2 in the Mountain West in first-team selections since the Bulldogs joined the league in 2012. Only Boise State with 19 has had more on the postseason All-MW teams.

This-N-That

- Last time the Bulldogs hosted Sacramento State, Fresno State retired David Carr's No. 8 jersey during a halftime ceremony. Carr led the nation in yards passing and touchdowns in 2001 and finished fifth in the Heisman voting that year.
- Chason Virgil completed his first five throws at Nebraska, and was 10-of-13, and 15-of-21 during the game.
- Fresno State's longest rush vs. Nebraska by a running back was five yards. The longest rush was a 19-yard scramble by quarterback Chason Virgil.
- Thanks to Robert Stanley, Fresno State was one of 18 FBS teams to block a punt on the opening weekend of the 2016 season.
- Aaron Peck's nine receptions ranked tied for 11th in the FBS for the most passes caught in a single game over the weekend.
- Fresno State has led the Mountain West in attendance two of the last three years, averaging 33,609 per game during that span.

5TH SEASON | AIR FORCE (1985)

Tim DeRuyter is set to embark on his fifth season as head coach at Fresno State and has transitioned the Bulldogs into one of the major players in the Mountain West.

DeRuyter (pronounced da-ROOT-er) took over a team that went 4-9 the year before he arrived and turned the tables by leading Fresno State to back-to-back Mountain West championships and back into the top 25 rankings in 2013. With Fresno State joining the Mountain West in 2012, DeRuyter's Bulldogs got right to work establishing their brand as a force in the conference by winning league titles in 2012 and 2013. Before the DeRuyter era launched, Fresno State had not won a conference championship since 1999 -- a drought of 13 years, and hadn't won consecutive league titles since 1992 and 1993.

After losing five players to the NFL off of the 2013 team, including All-Americans Derek Carr, Davante Adams and Austin Wentworth, Fresno State came back in 2014 and won the West Division to reach the MW Championship game for a second consecutive season. The 2014 team started out 0-3 with consecutive losses to Power-5 programs, all three that were ranked at some point during the season, but rebounded to win the West and reach a bowl game. No other Bulldog team in school history had rebounded to win six games and get bowl eligible after an 0-3 start to a season. From 1980-2014 there had been 496 total FBS teams that started 0-3 and the 2014 Bulldogs became just the 21st of that group to make a bowl, playing in the Hawai'i Bowl for the second time in three years.

Those are two of the three bowl appearances DeRuyter has led the Bulldogs to - the other being the 2013 Royal Purple Las Vegas Bowl - and he has a 29-23 overall record. He was hired as Fresno State's 17th head coach in program history on Dec. 14, 2011.

DeRuyter directed Fresno State to one of its finest seasons in program history in 2013. Fresno State went 11-2, won the inaugural Mountain West Championship game and matched the school record for wins in a season. The 'Dogs were ranked as high as No. 13 in the USA Today Coaches Poll and closed out the Bowl Championship Series era ranked No. 20 in the final BCS standings, the highest of any non-automatic qualifying/BCS conference team that year.

Player success under DeRuyter is well documented. Fourteen Bulldogs have been named first-team All-Mountain West in his four seasons, which is the second-most first-team honorees of any school in the conference. Carr in 2012 and again in 2013 was named the MW Offensive Player of the Year and Phillip Thomas in 2012 the league's Defensive Player of the Year.

Along with the All-Americans Adams, Carr, Thomas and Wentworth, DeRuyter has seen six of his Bulldogs be drafted along with another 14 that made training camps or signed as free agents with NFL teams. The five draft picks over the 2014-15 NFL Drafts were the most from any non-Power 5 program in the FBS.

Safety Phillip Thomas in 2012 was named an unanimous All-American and was a finalist for the Jim Thorpe Award after leading the nation in interceptions with eight. Thomas went on to be a fourth round draft pick of the Washington Redskins and started games for them towards the end of the 2014 season.

Prior to coming to Fresno State, DeRuyter was the assistant head coach/defensive coordinator at Texas A&M where he coached one of the elite defensive players in the game in Von Miller. Miller, who in addition to earning All-American honors, was awarded the 2010 Butkus Award given annually to the nation's most outstanding linebacker. He went on to become the second overall pick of the Broncos in the 2011 NFL draft.

DeRuyter came to Fresno State with 22 years of coaching experience. His last game coaching at Texas A&M was in the role as interim head coach for the Aggies in the Meineke Car Care Bowl of Texas, a game Texas A&M won 33-22 over Northwestern on Dec. 31, 2011.

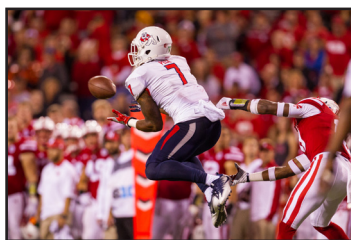

LINCOLN, Neb. - Down two scores in the second quarter to Nebraska, Fresno State fought back in front of 90,013 fans at Memorial Stadium to pull within four points heading into halftime at 14-10, but it was the Huskers who prevailed 43-10 after the home team separated itself with 22 points in the fourth quarter.

In his return to the Bulldog football team after missing the 2015 season to an injury suffered in fall camp, Aaron Peck set career highs in receptions and yards, catching nine passes for 112 yards and a touchdown. On the defensive side of the ball Jeff Camilli led the unit with his fifth career game compiling double-digit tackles (10).



In the first quarter, the Bulldogs starting quarterback Chason Virgil completed his first five pass attempts on the Bulldogs' opening possession, until missing the sixth on a third-and-3 from the Nebraska 15-yard line. Kody Kroening missed the ensuing 32-yard attempt and the Huskers grabbed the games momentum back.

Nebraska drove the ball 80 yards on 13 plays to open the scoring, 7-0, following the 'Dogs miss at getting the games first points. After a three-and-out by the Bulldogs on the next possession, the Cornhuskers gave the ball to Devin Ozigbo four straight times as he put them up 14-0 early in the second quarter. In back-to-back drives, the Cornhuskers rushed 16 times in their 17 plays that totaled 107 yards.

Fresno State turned the tide when linebacker Robert Stanley shot through a gap on special teams and blocked a Cornhusker punt. The play ignited the Bulldog offense, earning points off the block by going seven plays for 32 yards, capped by a Virgil to Peck 7-yard TD. Virgil connected on five-of-six attempts on the scoring drive.

With under four minutes remaining in the first half, and the Bulldogs backed up against their own end zone, a late hit to Virgil by Nebraska's Luke Gifford on a third-and-13, which was eventually called a targeting penalty, extended the Bulldogs' drive. Zach Kline entered the game for Virgil and drove the ball down field without a hiccup, going 4-of-5 for 50 yards. He led the 'Dogs as far as the Nebraska 8-yard-line with 0:02 left in the half. Kroening knocked home a 26-yard field goal to leave Fresno State trailing 14-10 as time expired.

In the second half the Bulldogs' offense posted 128 total yards of their 274 compiled in the game and could not find the end zone while Nebraska amassed 257 total yards in the second half that led to 29 points.

Quotable

Head Coach Tim DeRuyster on the final score:

"You know the final score is the final score. You lose by one or you lose by whatever you lost by it doesn't matter. What matters is you keep fighting, which I thought our guys did. Our guys know that the final score is probably not indicative of the game. I think the Nebraska coaches would say the same thing. But you know it is what it is, they scored that many points, and we scored 10 points so there are no moral victories. But our guys realize when we play well and we don't turn the ball over we can make some plays. We've got a chance to be a good football team."

Notables

- In remembrance of Sam Foltz (Nebraska punter that passed), Nebraska used 10 men in its formation for its first punt attempt, no punter. Fresno State declined the delay of game penalty.
- Robert Stanley blocked the first punt of his career. The last time the 'Dogs blocked a punt was on Nov. 8, 2014 (vs. San Jose State).
- In his second-career start, Chason Virgil was 17-of-32 for 133 yards and one touchdown.
- Senior Jeff Camilli recorded a team-high 10 tackles - his fifth career double-digit game.
- Aaron Peck had six catches for 60 yards and a TD in the first half en route to his career highs of nine receptions for 112 yards.
- KeeSean Johnson recorded a career-high eight catches.
- Trent Soechting, in his Bulldog debut, posted seven tackles, including the 'Dogs sole TFL.
