LINCOLN, Neb. - Down two scores in the second quarter to Nebraska, Fresno State fought back in front of 90,013 fans at Memorial Stadium to pull within four points heading into halftime at 14-10, but it was the Huskers who prevailed 43-10 after the home team separated itself with 22 points in the fourth quarter.

In his return to the Bulldog football team after missing the 2015 season to an injury suffered in fall camp, Aaron Peck set career highs in receptions and yards, catching nine passes for 112 yards and a touchdown. On the defensive side of the ball Jeff Camilli led the unit with his fifth career game compiling double-digit tackles (10).

In the first quarter, the Bulldogs starting quarterback Chason Virgil completed his first five pass attempts on the Bulldogs' opening possession, until missing the sixth on a third-and-3 from the Nebraska 15-yard line. Kody Kroening missed the ensuing 32-yard attempt and the Huskers grabbed the games momentum back.

Nebraska drove the ball 80 yards on 13 plays to open the scoring, 7-0, following the 'Dogs miss at getting the games first points. After a three-and-out by the Bulldogs on the next possession, the Cornhuskers gave the ball to Devin Ozigbo four straight times as he put them up 14-0 early in the second quarter. In back-to-back drives, the Cornhuskers rushed 16 times in their 17 plays that totaled 107 yards.

Fresno State turned the tide when linebacker Robert Stanley shot through a gap on special teams and blocked a Cornhusker punt. The play ignited the Bulldog offense, earning points off the block by going seven plays for 32 yards, capped by a Virgil to Peck 7-yard TD. Virgil connected on five-of-six attempts on the scoring drive.

With under four minutes remaining in the first half, and the Bulldogs backed up against their own end zone, a late hit to Virgil by Nebraska's Luke Gifford on a third-and-13, which was eventually called a targeting penalty, extended the Bulldogs' drive. Zach Kline entered the game for Virgil and drove the ball down field without a hiccup, going 4-of-5 for 50 yards. He led the 'Dogs as far as the Nebraska 8-yard-line with 0:02 left in the half. Kroening knocked home a 26-yard field goal to leave Fresno State trailing 14-10 as time expired.

In the second half the Bulldogs' offense posted 128 total yards of their 274 compiled in the game and could not find the end zone while Nebraska amassed 257 total yards in the second half that led to 29 points.

Quotable

Head Coach Tim DeRuyter on the final score:

"You know the final score is the final score. You lose by one or you lose by whatever you lost by it doesn't matter. What matters is you keep fighting, which I thought our guys did. Our guys know that the final score is probably not indicative of the game. I think the Nebraska coaches would say the same thing. But you know it is what it is, they scored that many points, and we scored 10 points so there are no moral victories. But our guys realize when we play well and we don't turn the ball over we can make some plays. We've got a chance to be a good football team."

Notables

- In remembrance of Sam Foltz (Nebraska punter that passed), Nebraska used 10 men in its formation for its first punt attempt, no punter. Fresno State declined the delay of game penalty.
- Robert Stanley blocked the first punt of his career. The last time the 'Dogs blocked a punt was on Nov. 8, 2014 (vs. San Jose State).
- In his second-career start, Chason Virgil was 17-of-32 for 133 yards and one touchdown.
- Senior Jeff Camilli recorded a team-high 10 tackles - his fifth career double-digit game.
- Aaron Peck had six catches for 60 yards and a TD in the first half en route to his career highs of nine receptions for 112 yards.
- KeeSean Johnson recorded a career-high eight catches.
- Trent Soechting, in his Bulldog debut, posted seven tackles, including the 'Dogs sole TFL.

FRESNO, Calif. - The Fresno State football team used a 21-point fourth quarter in front of an announced crowd of 31,817 at Bulldog Stadium Saturday night to separate itself from a pesky Sacramento State Hornets squad for a 31-3 win in their 2016 home opener.

The Bulldog defense highlighted the game, holding Sacramento State to 185 total yards offense, the lowest output from an opponent since 2008 when Fresno State held New Mexico State to 183.

The defensive backfield duo of Tyquwan Glass and Jamal Ellis each posted interceptions, giving the 'Dogs a win in the last nine-straight games when recording multiple interceptions in a game. The 'Dogs also recorded three sacks between Justin Green, Nathan Madsen and Nela Otukolo while James Bailey led the team with eight tackles.

With his first career touchdown, Deonte O'Neal started the scoring Saturday with an eight-yard TD in the first quarter with 1:02 remaining. Those points were produced thanks to Ellis' interception that set the 'Dogs up in Hornets territory at the 48-yard line.

After that Ellis interception the defense forced four-straight three-and-outs, of the eight amassed on the night. In that span the 'Dogs tacked on three more points after Kody Kroening knocked home a 21-yard field goal during the second quarter. As time expired on the half, the Hornets scored three points with a 44-yard kick, which was set up by a line drive punt that bounced off a Bulldog and was recovered by Sacramento State defender on the Fresno State 27-yard line with six seconds left on the clock.

Neither team was able to put points on the board in the third. A period the 'Dogs outgained the Hornets 106 to 39.

It was the fourth when the Bulldogs broke through and put the game away, scoring on their final three possessions.

Dontel James crossed the plane on a 17-yard run for a touchdown with 14:24 left in the fourth to put the Bulldogs on top 17-3. That run put James over the 100-yard threshold on a night he posted 121 on the ground -- the most by a Fresno State running back since Martez Waller opened the 2015 season with 154 against Abilene Christian.

Back-to-back touchdown connections between Chason Virgil and KeeSean Johnson followed the James score, which put a stamp on the Bulldogs' win. Entering the game, Johnson owned two career TDs before the two scores in the fourth.

Virgil finished the game 22-of-42 for 274 yards and two scores. The redshirt freshman quarterback set career highs in completions, attempts and yards in the win.

Quotable

Head Coach Tim DeRuyter on this game being a mirror image of the Nebraska game:

"Give Sacramento State credit, they held in. That is a group with a lot of pride and a great coach. They are a young team and they came out with a lot of fire. In a lot of ways they are very similar to us, they are very young. They got punched in the nose last week at home and we knew they were going to respond. We give them credit, but eventually we were able to block a little better to wear them down a little and get some takeaways and that momentum helped us to get the running game going and be able to seal the deal."

TOLEDO, Ohio – In its first trip to the Glass Bowl since 2008, Fresno State was unable to recreate the magic from that day as the Bulldogs fell 52-17 on Saturday afternoon.

After holding the Rockets on their first possession of the game, Toledo scored on four of its next five drives while the Bulldogs' offense struggled to find their stride.

Toledo held a 24-0 advantage at the half and outgained Fresno State 267-73 in that span.

Third down efficiency was the root of the Bulldogs trying first half as they went 0-for-8 over the first two quarters and 0-for-13 in the game.

In the second half, Fresno State bounced back with producing 181 yards of offense while scoring 17 points. A large chunk of that yardage came when Chason Virgil connected with Jamire Jordan for an 85-yard touchdown down the stretch, which set career long plays for the duo (throw and reception).

Virgil also linked up with KeeSean Johnson for a 9-yard score, the third time in the last two games those two have connected for scores.

Toledo amassed 619 total yards in the game, the most by a Bulldog opponent since Wyoming manufactured 694 in 2014.

Key stat

Toledo outgained Fresno State by 196 yards in the first half as it took a 24-0 lead into the locker room.

Quotable

Head coach Tim DeRuyter's initial postgame thoughts...

"We got beat physically. We blew assignments. We got outplayed and outcoached. There's no excuse for it. It's going to change. We've got a bunch of guys who have pride, but we've got to play much better than we did today."

Head coach Tim DeRuyter's on what the team needs to hear when they return to practice Sunday...

"We have to be more physical. That's the big thing. We did not match their physicality early and late we had some blown coverage's where it got away from us. But we have to do a much better job being physical."

Quarterback Chason Virgil on third down efficiency...

"It comes back to us doing what we have to do on first down and second down to put ourselves in a more manageable third down. Early on we were getting stuck in first and long and second and long, that just becomes third and long. We were fighting from behind the sticks from the start. To be good on third downs you have to put yourself in a manageable situations."

- Safeties Stratton Brown (10) and DeShawn Potts (8) each collected a career-high in tackles.
- KeeSean Johnson caught his third touchdown of the season. He only had two during the 2015 season.

FRESNO, Calif. – On a sunny Saturday afternoon at Bulldog Stadium, the Fresno State football team raced out to a 31-0 lead over the Tulsa Golden Hurricane in the first half, only to see it evaporate in a 48-41 defeat in double overtime.

In the second period of extra time after neither team scored in the first, Tulsa's Dane Evans scored from 18 yards out, but the Bulldogs had their chance to push it to a third. An incomplete pass on first down was followed with a sack that dropped the 'Dogs to a third-and-17, which was followed by a failed fourth-and-17 that capped the Golden Hurricane comeback.

The game saw 1,070 total yards on 189 total plays, but like the score, Tulsa topped Fresno State with 617 yards offense on 100 plays.

Not to be lost, the Bulldogs flourished offensively, particularly in the first half as they took a 31-21 lead into halftime. It was the most points scored in an opening half by a Bulldog team since the 2013 team scored 42 at San Jose State on Nov. 29.

Fresno State took a 21-0 lead to the second quarter after three rushing scores by three different Bulldogs – Jordan (44 yards), Chason Virgil (14 yards) and Dontel James (2 yards). Kody Kroening then capped a nine-play, 62-yard drive with a 25-yard field goal 3:29 into the second quarter, before Jordan caught a 65-yard pass from Virgil to put the 'Dogs up 31-0.

From that point forward, Tulsa began seizing momentum with three-straight touchdown drives (Evans' passes of 23, 40 and 40 yards) while the Bulldogs went three-and-out on their next three drives – putting Tulsa behind 31-21 going into the second half.

Fresno State responded with its first possession in the second half by eating up 6 minutes, 48 seconds of clock on a 15-play, 67-yard drive that results in a 25-yard Kroening field goal to open third quarter.

Tulsa countered by outscoring Fresno State 27-7 the rest of the way. The three scores in regulation were drives of nine, 11, 11 and 16.

Despite the Golden Hurricane success, the Bulldogs were not going down without a fight. The final seven points the Bulldogs would score was a fourth quarter TD that put the 'Dogs up 41-38 with 5:02 remaining in the game.

Tulsa's 16-play drive that sent the game to overtime, ended with a 28-yard field goal on a drive that the Golden Hurricane went 3-of-4 on third downs.

Quotable

Head Coach Tim DeRuyter on losing the 31-0 lead...

"We did not have any anticipation that we were going to shut Tulsa out. We kept telling our guys on the sideline, 'Hey, this team is going to fight back, they are going to counter-punch.' They were able to run the ball while running the same plays that we practiced this week, the same plays that they ran the first four series. They executed better than we did. We didn't tackle very well. We tried to switch the coverage and we had a guy not see it on a fourth down. Again, you make a stop there and they don't score. There are a half dozen plays that were critical in that ball game that put us into overtime. I don't want it to sound bad, but we caused a lot of them and there are things in our control that we need to fix."

Notables

- Jeff Camilli deflected a pass and made a sack to force a 3-and-out on Tulsa's opening possession – in all four games this season the 'Dogs have held their opponent scoreless on their opening drive and allowed one first down in those games.
- The Bulldogs scored on their first offensive possession, the first time since Oct. 16, 2015 vs. UNLV, with a 44-yard rush by Jamire Jordan.
- The last game the 'Dogs scored 14 in the first quarter was at Air Force on Oct. 24, 2015.
- The last time the 'Dogs led a game 21-0 in the first quarter was on Nov. 29, 2014 vs. Hawai'i.
- Entering the game, Jeff Camilli had one career sack, he had two in the first quarter vs. Tulsa.
- Jamire Jordan's 65-yard TD marked the seventh TD out of eight career touchdowns to go for more than 20 yards.
- DeJonte O'Neal recorded a 59-yard kickoff return in the third quarter. The longest kick return since Da'mari Scott returned a kick 66 yards vs. San Jose State on Sept. 26, 2015.
- Jamal Ellis entered the season with 1 career INT, he's got two in four games in 2016.
- The Bulldogs' four sacks are the most since recording six vs. UNLV in Oct. 16, 2015.

LAS VEGAS – Despite a career night from senior wide receiver Aaron Peck, Fresno State fell 45-20 to UNLV on Saturday night at Sam Boyd Stadium. Peck accounted for 194 of the Bulldogs' 360 yards of total offense.

Chason Virgil threw for 296 yards and two scores for the 'Dogs, but the Rebels' ground attack amassed 364 yards and five touchdowns.

After neither team could find their footing through the opening 14 minutes, UNLV then began a 14-play drive, with 13 coming on the ground, which ended in a 1-yard touchdown by Lexington Thomas. The Bulldogs quickly responded with a 52-yard pass to Peck on the ensuing drive. Virgil connected with the senior two plays later for a 15-yard score to knot-up the game.

The Rebels took a 14-7 lead on the ensuing possession with a seven-play 69-yard drive. After forcing the Bulldogs to punt, UNLV quarterback Dalton Sneed tossed a 61-yard touchdown pass to Elijah Troscclair, to double the home team's lead.

Fresno State cut its deficit to 11 with a 42-yard field goal from Kody Kroening with 8:39 to play in the third quarter. James Bailey then nearly forced a fumble deep in UNLV territory, but the play was overturned. Sneed then escaped the pocket on the following play and rushed for a 91-yard score to give the Rebels a 28-10 advantage.

With the score sitting at 31-10, Virgil and Peck made it a 31-17 game late in the third quarter as the two hooked up for an 80-yard touchdown, the longest of Peck's career. The Bulldogs then forced a quick three-and-out and put together a 10-play drive that Kroening capped off with a career-long 47-yard field goal to pull the 'Dogs within 11.

Fresno State was unable to pull any closer and UNLV tacked on 14 points during the final three minutes of the game.

Key Play

Trailing by 11 midway through the third quarter, Bailey appeared to force a fumble that Nathan Madsen picked up inside the Rebel's 10-yard line, but the play was ultimately overturned. UNLV then scored on a 91-run on the next play to push its lead to 28-10.

Quotable

Head coach Tim DeRuyter on the execution being a one-play snap shot of the season...

"Absolutely. Both sides of the ball. We didn't protect our quarterback well at times. We dropped footballs when balls hit us. Our quarterback didn't hit receivers when they were open. On the defensive side, we were fitting gaps, but we didn't have multiple guys to the ball and we had guys miss tackles. The blame is everywhere."

Notables

- Aaron Peck accounted for 67 of Fresno State's 76 yards on its first scoring drive. Peck hauled in a 15-yard score after catching a 52-yard pass.
- Fresno State converted seven of 20 third downs. Five of the seven were on plays with needing nine or more yards.
- Fresno State and UNLV equally owned three, three and outs.
- Fresno State allowed 300-plus yards rushing for the third consecutive game.
- UNLV attempted 16 passes; the Bulldogs did not make a sack on one of those attempts. It marks the third game this year without a quarterback sack.
- Kody Kroening hit a career-long 47-yard field goal in the loss; Kroening has successfully made seven straight kicks since missing his first attempt of the season.
- Jeff Camilli led the team in tackles for the second straight game; he led the team with 10 at UNLV.
- James Bailey registered three pass break ups; he owned three career pass break ups entering the game.
- Aaron Peck recorded a career-high 194 yards; it was the 17th most receiving yards in a single game in school history.
- There were 16 games in school history with a pass completion of over 80 yards entering the 2016 season. Peck's 80-yard TD catch at UNLV marked the 18th in school history after Jamire Jordan recorded an 85-yard TD pass play at Toledo earlier this season.
- Aaron Peck's 100-yard game marked the fourth Fresno State 100-yard game for a wideout; the most since the 2013 season.
- Fresno State has not allowed an opening series score in all five games; UNLV gained two first downs on its opening drive, equaling three first downs allowed all season to opponents.

RENO, Nev. – A career night of 169 yards on the ground from junior running back Dontel James was not enough for Fresno State as Nevada held on to a 27-22 lead with a defensive stand in the final minute of play, Saturday night at Mackay Stadium.

James' 169 yards (27 carries) were the most single game rushing yards by a Bulldog since Robbie Rouse ran for 261 yards at Nevada on Nov. 10, 2012. It was the junior's second 100-yard rushing game this season.

On the Bulldogs' first play from scrimmage, James started his career night by breaking off the longest run of his career, a 34-yard burst down the left side of the field. That started a 9-play, 59-yard drive that resulted in a 44-yard field goal by Kody Kroening.

Aided by Fresno State miscues, a sack turned personal foul, and a 19-yard gain on 3rd-and-20 followed by a 4th-and-1 conversion, Nevada answered the Bulldogs' score with a touchdown to take its first lead, 7-3. The scoring play came via a backward pass from quarterback Tyler Stewart to wide receiver Andrew Celis, Celis then threw downfield to Wyatt Demps for a 36-yard touchdown.

The Bulldogs responded the very next possession with a drive that Kroening capped for the 'Dogs, making it a 7-6 game at the end of the first quarter with a 25-yard field goal. The junior's first quarter field goals were his eighth and ninth consecutive makes this season.

Despite allowing a 14-yard drive to the Wolf Pack to open the second, Fresno State's special teams unit came up big as Malik Forrester blocked Brent Zuzo's 24-yard field goal attempt. Zach Kline, who saw action for the third time this season, fumbled three plays later and Nevada turned it into points with a 4-yard touchdown run from Stewart. Nevada scored again to close the second as Stewart found Demps for a 3-yard touchdown pass to take a 21-6 lead into the half.

The Bulldogs narrowed Nevada's lead to a one score game with just over a minute remaining in the third quarter as they capitalized on a 15-play drive. A drive that Virgil found Jared Rice on a 4th-and-goal from the 1-yard line for the score. It was Rice's first career catch and touchdown.

Two plays later, a forced fumble by Stratton Brown and recovery by Nick Kristofors led to Kroening's third field goal of the night to close the gap to 21-16.

Nevada answered with a 14-play scoring drive to take a 27-16 advantage, with nine plays coming from James Butler on the ground, with 7:56 to play.

The Bulldogs would not go quietly. Virgil engineered a 75-yard drive that James finished off with this first TD of the night to bring the score to 27-22 in Nevada's favor with 5:08 left in the game. The Fresno State defense held tough, forcing a three-and-out, and gave the offense one final shot for the come-from-behind win.

With less than three minutes on the clock, the Bulldogs pushed the ball down to as far as Nevada's 4-yard line, but the 'Dogs were unable to get the ball into the end zone on four passing plays that fell incomplete.

Key Stat

In the second quarter, Fresno State fumbled twice and punted once on their three possessions, while Nevada scored two touchdowns on its three possessions. The Wolf Pack outgained the Bulldogs 175-75 in that frame.

Quotable

Head coach Tim DeRuyter on the final series of the game...

"We only had one timeout left. Once we got the first down, the clock was running and we thought we had a good matchup with Aaron (Peck), so we threw the fade. At that point we probably could have run the ball, but we thought we had some plays that we practiced all week down there in the red zone and we just didn't execute. Give Nevada credit, their kid knocked the ball out of Aaron's hand and they executed in the red zone better than we did."

- Jeff Camilli hit double-digit tackles for the fourth time this season – he has played in five of six games this year.
- Jeffrey Allison surpassed his season-high of four tackles at Toledo with seven.
- Nick Kristofors posted a career-high in tackles at six (had eight tackles all of 2015).

FRESNO, Calif. – On homecoming, Fresno State held the ball for just under 23 minutes as San Diego State controlled the clock in a 17-3 game on Friday at Bulldog Stadium.

The Aztecs held the narrowest of margins throughout the game: 3-0 after one quarter, 10-0 at halftime and 17-3 following three quarters of play. It was a combination of an Aztec defense that limited the Bulldogs to 10 first downs and 217 yards offense and San Diego State's ground attack that kept them off the field.

Behind a combined 53 carries from Donnell Pumphrey and Rashaad Penny, San Diego State used its run game to control the game, holding a near 15-minute advantage in time of possession. The running back duo accounted for 269 of the Aztecs' 364 yards.

Fresno State's defense held tight on the opening drive, a possession Jeff Camilli and Tobenna Okeke stuffed Pumphrey on a fourth-and-goal from the 1-yard line. The Aztecs accounted for 92 yards offense to the Bulldogs' 30 in the opening quarter, but only mustered a 3-0 lead after the first 15 minutes.

Behind a 2-yard TD run, Pumphrey gave the Aztecs a 10-0 lead as he capped an 11-play drive with 9:15 to play in the second quarter. The Bulldogs made a charge late in the half in part to a 28-yard rush by Chason Virgil and an 15-yard unsportsmanlike conduct penalty against the Aztecs that moved the ball to the opponents' 38-yard line. The drive was halted on a fourth-and-8 fake punt from the 36-yard line in which punter Blake Cusick's pass was intercepted.

For the third time in the last four games, the Bulldogs opened the second half by putting points on the scoreboard as Kody Kroening connected for a 39-yard field goal to cap a 13-play, 54-yard drive to begin the third quarter.

The Aztecs continued to pound the ball on the ground in the second half and broke through late in the third quarter with a 13-yard run by Pumphrey. His second score of the night to make it a 17-3 game.

Pumphrey finished with 220 yards on 38 carries.

Fresno State will travel to Utah State for its first Mountain West pairing in Logan since joining the conference. The game will be aired on the CBS Sports Network on Saturday, Oct. 22 at 7:30 p.m. PT.

LOGAN, Utah – The Fresno State football team held tight in the first half on the road at Utah State, trailing by three at the break, but the Aggies outscored the Bulldogs 21-6 in second half to produce the final defeat of 38-20 on Saturday night at Maverick Stadium. It was the 'Dogs seventh loss of the season, eliminating them from bowl game contention.

Chason Virgil finished the game completing 27-of-44 passes for 205 yards and one touchdown. The redshirt freshman had a stretch of 14 consecutive completions that spanned from the second quarter into third. Dontel James added 80 yards and a touchdown on the ground.

After Utah State scored a touchdown on its opening drive of the game to take an early lead, the Bulldog defense held tough on the Aggies' next two drives before the Fresno State offense put together a 15-play drive which James finished off with a 10-point run to tie the game at 7-7. Midway through the second quarter, Austin Cheney gave the Aggies a 10-point lead as he blocked a Blake Cusick punt that was recovered in the end zone, to swing the games' momentum.

Fresno State battled through the special teams set back, trailing 17-7. Virgil orchestrated a 77-yard scoring drive that ended with a one-yard pass to Jared Rice to close out the first half. It was Rice's second touchdown and second reception of his career. Virgil went 8-of-8 on the drive that closed the half to pull the 'Dogs within three.

For the first of three second half touchdowns, the Aggies extended its lead to 24-14 to start the second half.

The Bulldogs countered with their longest drive of the season (18 plays) with their first possession in the third quarter, but the 'Dogs drive resulted in a 27-yard field goal, which put them within seven. USU would tack on two more touchdown scores that were only answered by an additional Bulldog field goal, albeit, it was a career-long 49-yard kick by Kody Kroening.

Our guys are right there. At some point, we're going to make those plays. We just have to keep chopping wood. Guys are crushed. You put everything you have to win a football game. FRESNO, Calif. – In a 31-21 Fresno State loss on Friday night at Bulldog Stadium to Air Force, the Bulldogs' air attack came up short against the Falcons' ground game. KeeSean Johnson and Jamire Jordan combined for 257 yards receiving, becoming the Bulldogs' first pair of 100-yard receivers since the 2013 Mountain West Championship game, while the Air Force rush attack amassed 327 yards on 73 carries.

Johnson, who had a career-high 142 yards, became the first Bulldog to catch three touchdowns in a game since Davante Adams on Nov. 29, 2013 and Jordan joined Johnson with a 100-yard receiving game (115), his second of the season.

The quarterback, Chason Virgil, notched his first 300-yard passing game and three touchdown game of his young career as he finished with 303 yards, but it also came with a career-high four interceptions.

Virgil and his receivers started clicking during their second drive as the redshirt freshman lofted a 21-yard pass to Jordan before finding Johnson streaking down the middle of the field for a 36-yard touchdown. At the end of the first quarter, Virgil began orchestrating a 10-play, 80-yard drive in which he was 4-of-4 and connected with Johnson for a two-yard score to put the Bulldogs up 14-0.

An interception by Air Force's Brodie Hicks late in the first half led to the Falcon's first score. The Falcons marched 51 yards, with 33 of them coming on a touchdown pass from Nate Romine to Ronald Cleveland with 41 seconds to go to pull within seven, 14-7.

The Falcons would tack on a field goal on its opening drive to start the second half. Three plays later, Air Force grabbed its first lead of the game as Patrick Healy returned an interception 35 yards for a touchdown. Unaffected, Virgil found Johnson open deep on the ensuing Fresno State possession for a 52-yard score, his third of the game.

As the Falcons were driving heading into the fourth, four straight runs from Arion Worthman set them up inside the five-yard line. Two plays later, the quarterback provided the go-ahead score for the visitors, 24-21.

With under four minutes remaining, Air Force looked to put the game away, but the Bulldog defense held strong with a goal-line stand. The offense though could only manage three yards on its next possession and turned the ball over on downs at the seven-yard line. Worthman would make it a 31-21 advantage for the Falcons two plays later.

Key Stat

Air Force rushed for 114 yards and two touchdowns on 24 carries while holding the ball for 10:21 in the final quarter.

FORT COLLINS, Colo. – The Fresno State football team lost to Colorado State 37-0 on Saturday afternoon at Hughes Stadium. It was the first time the Bulldogs have been shutout since Nov. 19, 2010.

The Bulldogs' offense struggled to find their rhythm early, going three-and-out with its first three drives. All while the Rams could do no wrong despite falling short on a fourth-and-1 at the 11-yard line during their first drive. Jeff Camilli and James Bailey converged on Izzy Matthews for a 1-yard loss to stop a 12-play, 65-yard drive.



From that point forward, Colorado State scored on its next six possessions – five touchdowns and one field goal. The Rams registered 380 yards on their six scoring drives.

Fresno State meanwhile turned to quarterback Zach Kline after Chason Virgil exited the game with a shoulder injury following the 'Dogs' first drive.

The offense recorded 68 total yards in the first half and trailed in the first downs margin 18-2 at halftime. The 'Dogs' posted 59 yards in third quarter and 105 yards in the final frame, resulting in a season-low 232 yards offense.

Kline finished with 147 yards passing, going 11-of-24. He connected with Jamire Jordan for a 48-yard pitch-and-catch in the fourth quarter – the Bulldogs' longest play from scrimmage in the game. Kline also gained 26 yards on the ground with 17 carries.

Stratton Brown led Fresno State in tackles for the fourth-straight game. He posted nine stops.

Fresno State (1-9, 0-6 MW) dropped its eighth-straight game, marking the longest losing streak in school history.

Quotables

Interim head coach Eric Kiesau on Colorado State...

"You've got to give a lot of credit to Colorado State. They did a very good job. They played a very physical brand of football. They gave us some pressures and we had them picked up, but they played really physical. You have to give a lot of credit to them."

Interim head coach Eric Kiesau on Zach Kline's performance off the bench...

"It's tough. He had a lot of pressure around him. There were a few times he should have settled his feet down and thrown the ball. Without looking at the tape and really looking at it, I don't want to speak prematurely, but he had a few mistakes obviously, he had a lot of stress around. I think he was giving it everything he had and he gave great effort. It just wasn't our night tonight."

Key Stat

• Known for striking fast, Colorado State had scored 72 points in the first quarter entering the game, the most out of any frame. That average was built on as the Rams took a 10-0 lead and outgained Fresno State 179-20 in the first quarter. Colorado State possessed the ball 10:06 to Fresno State's 3:48.

Notables

- RB Justin Rice and DB Tank Kelly earned their first career starts at Colorado State; filling the holes missed from injuries to RB Dontel James and DB Tyquan Glass.
- RB Bryson Oglesby played in his first career game; his first career rush was a 21-yard run in third quarter that put the 'Dogs into Colorado State territory for the first time in the contest.
- Colorado State pitched its first shutout since Nov. 4, 1997, a 63-0 win over Hawai'i.
- The Bulldogs were shut out for the first time since Nov. 19, 2010, a 51-0 loss to No. 3 Boise State.
- Colorado State scored 16 points and had 12 first downs before Fresno State posted its first, first down; Kline picked up the first down at the 11:20 mark in the second quarter on an 11-yard scramble.
- Jeff Camilli registered five of his eight tackles in the first quarter.

FRESNO, Calif. – Hawai'i took its final drive 76 yards on 12 plays for a go-ahead touchdown, leaving Fresno State with the ball trailing 14-13 and 59 seconds left in the game. Quarterbacked by Zach Kline, the Bulldogs drove the ball to the Hawai'i 26-yard line only to see Kody Kroening's 43-yard game-winning attempt blocked as time expired on Saturday night's game at Bulldog Stadium.

The loss dropped Fresno State to 1-10 (0-7 MW) while Hawai'i kept its bowl chances alive, improving to 5-7 (4-4 MW).

Prior to the Rainbow Warriors' taking the lead with under a minute remaining, the Bulldogs punched through a 27-yard field goal to increase its lead to six, 13-7, capping a 15-play, 78-yard drive that lasted six minutes and six seconds. The Bulldogs' drive started with 9:09 on the clock in the fourth quarter and pushed its lead to six, giving way to the 'Bows' offense with 3:03 remaining in the game.

Fresno State limited Hawai'i to 276 yards offense and held the visiting team to 49 yards on the ground. The Bulldogs had allowed their opponent to rush for more than 200 yards in eight-straight games leading into Saturday's game.

The Bulldogs also stopped a six-game streak without an interception as Tyquwan Glass picked off his second pass of the season.

A game that saw a slow start, as nearly a quarter and half passed in which neither team could sustain a drive of more than six plays, Hawai'i broke the deadlock with a five-play 58-yard touchdown drive with 5:43 left in the first half. Running back Steven Lakalaka ended the drive with a 1-yard run.

On the ensuing Fresno State possession, it was the Bulldogs who put points on the board. The 'Dogs drove the ball 75 yards (13 plays) and with 10 seconds remaining in the half and on the 1-yard line, the Bulldogs capped the drive with some trickery as Kline rolled to right and threw back to his left side, behind the line of scrimmage, to offensive lineman Christian Cronk for a 1-yard rushing TD. Nine of the 13 plays during the possession went to Josh Hokit, who rushed for 48 yards on the drive.

The Bulldogs posted the only points of the third quarter, again aided by the rushing attack. Fresno State went to Dontel James seven times before Kody Kroening connected on a field goal from 47-yards out.

Kroening's 47-yarder was the Lou Groza Award semifinalists' 14th-straight made field goal, and the 27-yard field in the fourth tied Kevin Goessling's 2009 season record of making 15-straight tries.

Quotables

Interim head coach Eric Kiesau on how this loss feels compared to the others...

"This one is probably one of the tougher ones. Obviously the way that it revealed itself at the end. It burns because these kids are working really hard and I would like for it to pay off for them on just one Saturday afternoon. I am really proud of them, they had great effort and they fought. Even when we had our backs against the wall with a minute left, they fought all the way down. It was unfortunate and it was just how the day went today. I thought our guys played with a lot of class. There were some things in that game that were going on that they really represented themselves well, especially when it got a little feisty in there. I am proud of these kids."

Quarterback Zach Kline on getting his first start...

"I've had a really long road. So I've waited my whole career for this. When I got the nod, I just felt like everything happens for a reason. God works in mysterious ways and he's taught me a lot. These are the types of moments that change the culture of an entire university and program. These are the learning moments. We're going to get out there and put it all on the line again, look up at the scoreboard and see what happens."

Notable

- Quarterback Zach Kline picked up his first career start; Fresno State now has 13 first-time career starters this season.
- Six different Bulldogs recorded carries in the first quarter; by roster spot they were quarterback Zach Kline, wide receivers KeeSean Johnson, Jamire Jordan and Justin Allen, linebacker Josh Hokit and running back Dontel James. For the game, nine registered carries.
- Stratton Brown led the team in tackles (10) for the fifth-straight game. Brown has recorded double-digit tackle games in seven out of the last nine games.
- Stratton Brown now leads the team with 100 tackles. The last Bulldogs to record triple-digit tackles since Ben Jacobs recorded 106 tackles in 2009.
- Hawai'i was held to 11 first downs, the least amount of first downs by a Bulldogs' opponent since Boise State totaled 11 in the 2014 Mountain West Championship.
- Third down conversions: Fresno State was 11-of-21 (52.3) while Hawai'i was 1-of-11. It was the first time this season Fresno State has been over 50 percent in third down conversions this season and first time better than 50 percent overall since vs. UNLV on Oct. 16, 2015.
- Christian Cronk was the first Bulldogs' offensive lineman to score a touchdown since Austin Wentworth vs. Cal Poly on Sept. 7, 2013.

FRESNO, Calif. – A 23-yard field goal by San Jose State in the fourth quarter turned out to be the difference on Saturday afternoon as Fresno State dropped its final game of the season 16-14 to the Spartans at Bulldog Stadium.

The Bulldogs (1-11, 0-8 MW) finished with 245 total yards of offense with 149 coming through the air and 96 on the ground. SJSU (4-8, 3-5 MW) countered with 322 total yards, 211 on the ground and 111 passing.

Senior quarterback Zach Kline, making his second start of the season, finished 10-for-17 passing for 145 yards and added a 32-yard touchdown run. Junior running back Dontel James led the 'Dogs with 42 yards rushing and a touchdown while freshman Josh Hokit added 33 yards.

Senior wide receiver Aaron Peck, playing in his 44th and final career game as a Bulldog, led all Fresno State receivers with six catches for 63 yards. Sophomore KeeSean Johnson added one reception, a career-long 53-yard catch in the first quarter.

Defensively, the senior duo of Stratton Brown and Jeff Camilli finished their careers with standout performances as Brown had 15 tackles, seven solo, one tackle for a loss, a pass breakup and his first career interception. Camilli added 12 stops, two tackles for a loss and a sack. Junior linebacker Robert Stanley also finished with double-digit tackles, a career-best 12, and half-a-sack.

After a nearly scoreless first quarter, the Spartans put a stop to that by blocking a punt late in the frame, gaining possession at the Fresno State 11-yard line. SJSU broke through on the scoreboard with an 8-yard strike from quarterback Kenny Potter to Tim Crawley with 41 seconds remaining in the quarter to take a 7-0 lead.

Special teams swung in the favor of the Bulldogs next, thanks to a Fresno State punt that bounced off of a Spartan defender and landed into the hands of sophomore DeShawn Potts at the SJSU 48-yard line.

Fresno State possessed the ball for the six minutes and seven seconds, ending in a Dontel James 1-yard rush, his fifth rushing score of the season. The 13-play drive featured a 12-yard strike from Kline to Peck and an 11-yard pass to Jamire Jordan along with eight rushes for 14 yards.

The Bulldogs would score again next, taking a 14-7 lead with 5:45 left in the first half, although it would be the final time the Bulldogs would score in Saturday's game. After forcing the Spartans to turn the ball over on downs, the 'Dogs took over at their own 44-yard line with 6:41 left in the frame. A nine-yard pass to senior Michael Martens and a 15-yard rush by Hokit put the ball into Spartans territory before Kline scampered for a career-long run of 32 yards for his first touchdown run as a Bulldog.

The Spartans looked as if they were going to counter the Bulldogs' touchdown to end the first half, but Brown came up with a timely interception, his first career, in the endzone to keep the 'Dogs in the lead going into the break - the fourth time this season Fresno State has been in the lead at the half.

A quick three-and-out by the Bulldogs started the third quarter, which signaled how the frame would play out. The Spartans controlled the clock in the third quarter, possessing the ball for 11:31 compared to 3:29 for the 'Dogs. A 12-play, 59-yard drive by SJSU ate up 5:09 as Bryce Crawford nailed a 28-yard field goal to cut the Bulldogs lead to 14-10. The ensuing Fresno State possession was a fumble on the first play of the drive at the Fresno State 27-yard line.

San Jose State capitalized on the turnover, but with a field goal. A seven-play, 23-yard drive stalled at the 4-yard line when Camilli stuffed the Spartans on a third-and-1 to force Crawford into a 23-yard field goal that trimmed the 'Dogs lead to 14-13 with 4:24 left in the third.

After trading possessions without much action, a Fresno State punt from its own 12-yard line, which traveled 25 yards to the Fresno State 37-yard line set up San Jose State's next three points, which turned out to be the decisive three points.

The Spartans ran six consecutive runs for 32 yards down to the 5-yard line, but again stalled at the goal-line. Crawford connected on a 23-yard field goal, which would turn out to be the game-winner with 6:25 remaining in the game, for the 16-14 advantage.

Quotables

Interim head coach Eric Kiesau on what he's going to take away from this season...

"The best thing that I'm taking away from this season are the relationships I've built with the players. Even during a hard time, they really took to the message we were trying to instill in this program. I went from being the new guy coming in to being placed into the head coaching role, they really bought in and brought great effort. Wins and losses aside, this is a team I will never forget. There are some really great guys on this team, especially the seniors. I'm so glad that our paths crossed."

Notable

- Stratton Brown posted his sixth-straight game with double-digit tackles. He finished with 115 tackles. The most since 2007 when Marcus Riley recorded 132.
- Jeff Camilli finished with 108 tackles in 2016. He joins Stratton Brown to become the first Fresno State duo to have triple-digit tackles in a season since Tim Skipper (107) and Orlando Huff (105) did so in 2000.
- Fresno State lost 11 games in a single-season for the first time in school history.
- In three seasons at Fresno State, Stratton Brown recorded 115 of his 136 career tackles in 2016.
- Fresno State posted games with interceptions in back-to-back games for the first time since Nov. 5, 2015 – Nov. 12, 2015.
- Fresno State registered 12 first downs vs. San Jose State; for the season Fresno State averaged 17.2 per game.
- Aaron Peck posted his highest reception total (6) since Oct. 14 vs. San Diego State.
- Fresno State was limited to two first downs and 47 yards total offense in the second half.
- San Jose State had not won a game when trailing at halftime since trailing Wyoming in 2013.
