The University prefers to never be referenced as just Fresno, only Fresno State or Fresno St. For graphics or abbreviations, we ask that you please use FS - not FSU, CSUF or Fresno. Another acceptable abbreviation is Fresno St.

BULLDOG STADIUM



Bulldog Stadium has been the home of the Fresno State football team since it first opened in 1980. Entering its 37th full season hosting the football team in 2017, the 41,031-seat facility has established itself as one of the most difficult places to play for visiting teams.

Fresno State has found great success in its home facility, owning a record of 168-54-2, a winning percentage of 75 percent. Since the turn of the century, the 'Dogs have posted a 70-30 record.

Some of the monumental home victories at Bulldog Stadium include winning back-to-back Mountain West Championships on its home field in 2012 and 2013. The 2013 edition was the inaugural Mountain West Championship game, led by quarterback Derek Carr and the 'Dogs over Utah State.

Other notable games include a 44-24 win over No. 10 Oregon State - the highest ever ranked opponent to come to Fresno at that time - in 2001, a 17-3 win over Cal in 2000 and a 28-14 win over Cincinnati in 2010. In 2011, No. 5 Boise State became the highest-ranked opponent to ever play in Bulldog Stadium.

Fresno State has been able to bring in some of the nation's top teams to Bulldog Stadium over the years. Included in that list are Baylor, BYU, Cal, Cincinnati, Colorado, Illinois, Kansas State, Nebraska, Ole Miss, Oregon, Oregon State (twice), Rutgers and Wisconsin.

The Red Wave has packed Bulldog Stadium to its limit countless times over the years. In 2000, the Bulldogs set a new single-season attendance record when they averaged 42,410 fans, the 22nd-best mark in the nation. The following season, in which Fresno State achieved a program-record national ranking of No. 8, was even better. The Bulldogs set a new record by averaging 42,802 fans, including stadium single-game records of 42,881 in each of the last five contests of that year. In all, Fresno State has played 33 games in the stadium with 40,000 or more fans in the stands.

In the summer of 2011, Bulldog Stadium received a face-lift when FieldTurf was installed as the new playing surface. The \$1.2 million project was funded completely by private donations.

Fresno State now has bigger plans for the future of Bulldog Stadium, a plan that was initially rolled out in the summer of 2015 by athletic director Jim Bartko. A vision for improved accessibility and amenities for every fan who will enter the stadium, updated suites on the east side

of the stadium, a new press box and added suite tower on the west side, a new south end zone facility for the football program and south end zone video board. Already executed from that same vision was a new high definition video and ribbon board that were installed in the north end zone before the start of the 2015 season and new fencing before the start of the 2016 season.

On Oct. 14, 2016, the vision that Bartko revealed for a new Bulldog Stadium in the summer of 2015 took a big step toward reality as AECOM was selected as the project architect. AECOM's work spans from master planning the London and Rio Olympics, to designing the first-ever LEED Platinum arena for the Sacramento Kings, to campus planning, stadium renovation and enhancement for dozens of collegiate programs across the country.

- Ave.) to Cedar Ave.
- •Turn right on Cedar. Proceed approximately five miles to Bulldog Lane. Turn left and proceed less than one block to Gate 10.





BULLDOG STADIUM

Original construction of Bulldog Stadium began in June of 1979, following what was then the most successful capital fundraising project ever undertaken in the San Joaquin Valley. Local residents raised in excess of \$7 million for the project. No state tax dollars or student fees were used to build the stadium.

Built partially below ground level with the playing field 37 feet below grade, the bowl features a low profile appearance. A unique cantilevered lighting system extends toward the field and is directed downward to concentrate lighting on the playing surface.

Bulldog Stadium underwent a two-phase expansion project in 1991, which included the addition of more than 10,000 seats -- increasing the stadium's capacity from 30,000 to 41,031 -- and the construction of 22 sky suites. Other improvements included additional restrooms and concession facilities.

The first phase entailed filling in the panels beyond the north and south end zones with bench seating and the reconfiguration of the seating on the stadium's east side. The second phase, completed prior to the 1992 season, featured the addition of 22 sky suites, each of which includes seating for 20, among other amenities.

At its present state, chair seating is available for more than 5,000 spectators on the west side of the stadium between the 18-yard lines to accommodate the contributors of the \$7 million. There are also 4,240 chair-back seats on the east side and the rest of the stadium seating is on aluminum benches.

Fresno State defeated Montana State 21-14 on Nov. 25, 1980, in the first game played in the stadium. The first fill season began in 1981, starting with a 23-16 win over Oregon on Sept. 5 led by then-quarterback and now-head coach Jeff Tedford.

Bulldog Stadium was also home to the California Raisin Bowl from 1981-91. Fresno State played in the game five times, winning the title on four occasions. In 1994, the Stadium hosted friendly matches prior to the FIFA World Cup.

PAST MEETS PRESENT FOR BULLDOG FOOTBALL

An outlook leading into the 2017 Fresno State fooball season

The Fresno State football program will have a revamped look in 2017, blending its past with the future as former Bulldog quarterback and assistant coach Jeff Tedford was hired on Nov. 10, 2016 to take over the reins at his alma mater 20 years after last departing the Central Valley.

With 40 lettermen returning, including 25 starters, 10 on the offensive side the ball, Tedford and Co. will have the pieces to help guide Fresno State back to where it had once been. The experience on the field will combine with a new-look coaching staff that is hungry for success and revitalize the Red Wave.

Calling plays for Tedford is a three-time NAIA champion head coach in Kalen DeBoer who comes to Fresno State after three years as the offensive coordinator at Eastern Michigan where he turned around the Eagles offense, helping the team to a six-win improvement and the program's first bowl appearance since 1987. On the defensive side, Orlondo Steinauer will lead the Bulldogs after a successful seven-year run as a coach in the Canadian Football League, most recently being the assistant head coach and defensive coordinator for the Hamilton Tiger-Cats.

Returning to the program under Tedford are three familiar faces who spent their fall Saturdays competing in front of the Red Wave. Defensive backs coach J.D. Williams was an All-American cornerback in late 80's for the 'Dogs before being drafted 16th overall in the 1990 NFL Draft by the Buffalo Bills and playing in the Super Bowl in four consecutive seasons (1991-94). Running backs coach and special teams coordinator Jamie Christian, who came over from UNLV with Williams during the offseason, began his collegiate career with the Bulldogs as a fullback in the early 90's when Tedford joined

the staff in 1992. Tight ends coach Scott Thompson reunites with his former offensive coordinator where he played under Tedford from 1995-97.

Also joining the Bulldogs on the offensive side of the ball is DeBoer's former offensive coordinator at the University of Sioux Falls and offensive line coach at Eastern Michigan, Ryan Grubb. Former Boise State wide receiver Kirby Moore takes over as the team's wide receivers coach after spending last season as an offensive graduate assistant at Washington where Tedford served as an offensive consultant.

Along with Steinauer and Williams, Jamar Cain takes over as the team's defensive line coach after working in the same capacity with North Dakota State, helping the Bison win FCS championships in 2014 and 2015. Bert Watts, a former safety under Tedford at Cal, rejoins his former coach as the Bulldogs' linebacker coach after serving as the defensive coordinator at UC Davis the last four seasons.

OFFENSE

The Bulldogs' offense returns 10 starters from last season, with the lone loss coming from wide receiver Aaron Peck. Despite the departure of Peck, Fresno State's strength once again remains on the outside as the team welcomes back one of the Mountain West's top duos in KeeSean Johnson and Jamire Jordan. The two combined for 1,486 yards receiving in 2016, with both ranking in the top 10 in the conference in receiving yards, receiving yards per game and receptions per game. Jordan, who had a breakout freshman season in 2015 remained a reliable target in 2016, while Johnson's production more than doubled from his sophomore campaign as he led the team in receptions (66), yards (773) and touchdowns (6).



Along with senior Delvon Hardaway, who has played in 33 career games with nine starts, senior Da'Mari Scott will return after redshirting the 2016 season. Scott provides another big-play threat to Fresno State's receiving corps as he averages 17.6 yards per reception in 35 career games.

Overall, the Bulldogs return 1,734 of their 2,557 yards (67.8 percent) gained during the 2016 season from their returning pass catchers and 10 of their 13 touchdowns (76.9 percent) scored through the air. Jordan enters 2017 with the most career receiving yards with 1,253 along with nine total scores.

Kyle Riddering and Jared Rice return at the tight end position for Fresno State. Utilized primarily as a blocker, Riddering started nine games, while Rice and his 6-foot-5 frame was used as a red zone threat as he caught two scores in 2016 in limited action.

With a plethora of options to throw to, thirdyear sophomore quarterback Chason Virgil heads into fall camp with the most experience under center at Fresno State. Also battling for reps this seasons under center is Jorge Reyna, a junior college transfer who joined the fold during the spring out of West Los Angeles College. The Bulldogs' newest quarterback led the California Community College Athletic Association in completions (316), completion percentage (70.5 percent) and passing yards (3,646) in 2016. Senior Christian Rossi, also a CCCAA product, joined Bulldogs' roster in 2016 after transferring from Fresno City College will seek reps entering his senior season.

The leader coming out of spring camp though was Virgil, an 11-game starter over the last two seasons. He was a one-game starter as a true freshman in 2015 due to injury - he obtained a medical redshirt - and came back for year two and threw for 2,021 yards on 166-of-322 passing as a redshirt freshman season in 10 starts. The Mesquite, Texas native became the third freshman quarterback in Fresno State history to throw for more than 2,000 yards in a single season, joining Paul Pinegar (2,929) and Kevin Sweeney (2,359), and was one of nine freshmen in FBS football to throw for more than 2,000 yards in 2016. Virgil ranked seventh in passing yards per game among all FBS freshman with 202.1 and ranked fourth in the Mountain West in passing yards per game and sixth in the league in total offense per game (214.3)

Against Air Force on Oct. 28, Virgil threw for a career-high 303 yards and a career-high three touchdowns. With big-play threats surrounding him, the Bulldog quarterback recorded the second and third-longest pass completions of the season in the Mountain West with an 85-yard connection to Jordan on Sept. 17 vs. Toledo and an 80-yard completion to Peck on Oct. 1 at UNLV – the 85-yard completion made Virgil the ninth Bulldog quarterback in Fresno State history to complete a pass of more than 85 yards: joining Derek Carr (4), Paul Pinegar, Kevin Sweeney, Ryan Colburn, Michael Ross, Mark Barsotti, Dave Telford and Jeff Tedford. Virgil completed six passes for 50 yards or more, four of which were touchdowns.

The offensive line will be stocked this season with returners as the team has all five starters back from the 2016 team - senior Christian Cronk (left tackle), junior Logan Hughes (left guard), senior Aaron Mitchell (center), junior Micah St. Andrew (right guard) and senior David Patterson (right tackle). Ćronk, Patterson and St. Andrew started all 12 games at their positions, while Mitchell opened the season with four starts at left guard before shifting to center where he started the final eight games of the season. Hughes made six starts as a first-year Bulldog a season ago.

Looking to push for spots across the line this season are redshirt freshman Netane Muti, who made a strong statement for a starting position in spring ball - he missed his first year due to an injury prior to fall camp. Newcomer Quireo Woodley and 6-foot-7 senior Ryan Popolizo will also be working their was into the conversation moving into fall camp as well as a handful of fall newcomers.

The Dogs will look to increase its production from the running game this year after rushing for just 116.2 yards per game in 2016. Dontel James, the team's leading running back in 2016 returns after compiling 697 yards on the ground as a junior. The versatile Josh

Hokit will return to the Bulldogs backfield after racking up 130 yards on the ground in the final two games of the season. The sophomore who played linebacker, fullback, and on special teams, has made the shift to running back full time after earning the starting nod in the final game of the 2016 season. Local product Dejonte O'Neal will bring his versatility on offense and special teams back where he was fifth in all-purpose yards with 316 playing in just four games a year ago before his season was cut short due to injury. Also in the mix after redshirting last year is Saevion Johnson, along with incoming freshman Ronnie Rivers and Jordan Mims.

DEFENSE

With Orlondo Steinauer taking over as the new defensive coordinator, the defense will look much different than in previous years as it returns to the 4-3 defense. With three of the defense's five starters lost due to graduation coming from the secondary, defensive pressure from the front four could play a significant role in 2017 as the Bulldogs totaled just 14 sacks a season ago with 3.5 of those coming from its three-down lineman.

After featuring at defensive end and nose guard the past two seasons, Nathan Madsen shifted to the interior of the front four last spring, and will presumably slide inside next to senior Malik Forrester. The two combined for 60 tackles with 6.5 for a loss last season. Madsen is the most experienced player on the defensive side of the ball for the Bulldogs, entering the season with 26 career starts while Forrester saw 11 in year one after transferring from L.A. Pierce College. Depth inside will be provided from junior Patrick Belony (295 lbs.), sophomore Jasad Haynes (275 lbs.) and redshirt freshman Kevin Atkins (297 lbs.). Three outside linebackers from last season - Justin Green, Tobenna Okeke, and Stephen Van Hook - have made the switch to defensive end with the formation change to help bolster the position. While all three are seasoned veterans, Okeke has seen the most time on the field during his three seasons, making 12 starts during the last two years and is coming off of a career-high 52 tackles and 2.5 sacks.

Steinauer's strength this season appears to be in the middle with two starters and two significant contributors returning at linebacker. One of the biggest losses from last season though was the departure of Jeff Camilli, who recorded 184 tackles in his past two seasons and was as staple in the middle of the Bulldogs' defense. With 15 combined starts and significant time on the field, inside linebackers Robert Stanley and Nela Otukolo will look to fill the void left by Camilli. The two former Bishop Gorman players who left the high school two years apart are the third and fifth-leading returning tacklers from the 2016 squad. Adding depth behind them is junior Trent Soechting who recorded 36 tackles in his first year as a Bulldog.

On the outside as the SAM linebacker, junior James Bailey is one of the most experienced players for the Bulldogs having played in all 24 games during his first two seasons in Fresno while making 15 starts, including three as a true freshman in 2015. With 59 stops in 2016, he enters this season tied for the team lead in tackles by a returner. His 47 tackles the previous year were the most by any Bulldog true freshmen since linebacker Kevin Adams also posted 47 stops in 1995.

While the secondary was littered with experience last year, the team lost a combined 77 starts between Stratton Brown, Jamal Ellis, Tyquawn Glass, Dalen Jones and Alan Wright. Junior Tank Kelly and sophomores Jaron Bryant and Juju Hughes all saw time with the ones during the spring. Kelly has seen time in 16 games during his career, earning a start at Utah State last season. Bryant and Hughes primarily saw time on the special teams unit, while Hughes broke through at corner during the latter half the season, recording 13 of his 18 tackles during the final four games of the season. Also in the mix is redshirt sophomore Ka'Lonn Milton, who joined the Bulldogs in 2016 after a year at Fresno City College,

and junior college transfer Matt Boetang who joined the team during the spring.

The back-end of the secondary will be anchored by junior DeShawn Potts, who made 11 of his 13 career starts in 2016, and sophomore Mike Bell. Along with Bailey, Potts is the team's leading returning tackler with 59 to go with five pass breakups. Like Potts, who came on late during his freshman year to solidify his starting spot, the 6-foot-3 Bell did the same after making the transition from corner, stringing together a five-game stretch during the second-half of the season in which he compiled 26 of his 37 tackles and earned his first-career start in the season finale. Adding competition to the mix is sophomore Justin Rice who made the move from running back to safety during spring.

SPECIALISTS

Fresno State returns 2016 Lou Groza semifinalist Kody Kroening and the team's top scorer from a year ago. The senior spent much of last season as one of the country's most accurate kickers, converting on 15-straight field goals after missing his first attempt of the year. As the Bulldogs' leading scorer in 2016, compiling 68 points, he connected on 15-of-17 field goal attempts and was a perfect 23-of-23 on PATs. Of his 17 attempts, he was 6-of-7 on kicks beyond 40 yards, including a career-long of 49. Jimmy Camacho, who was 2-of-4 on kicks in 2015, spent last season splitting kickoff duties, averaging 60.8 yards per kick.

Sophomore Blake Cusick solidified his job as the team's first-string punter last year, punting 78 times for a 38.3 average. After redshirting his first year, he did not allow a team to return a punt for positive yards until the ninth game of the season. Fresno State ended the season 28th in punt return defense, allowing 10 returns for a 5.2 yard average. With the departure of Justin Verrell, the long snapper position will need to be filled. Redshirt freshmen Patrick Williams Jr., and Jacob Westberry will vie for the spot in the fall.

THE SCHEDULE

In 2017, Fresno State will open the season at Bulldog Stadium for the fourth time since 2012, hosting Incarnate Word (Southland-FCS) on Sept. 2. The Bulldogs will then leave California to face a pair of 2016 College Football Playoff teams in back-to-back weeks with Alabama on Sept. 9 and Washington on Sept. 16. The matchup in Tuscaloosa, Ala., will be the first-ever meeting between the two sides and will air on ESPN2. Fresno State's trip to Seattle, Wash., will mark its first since the 2006 season and second since the turn of the century.

Following games against the two Power 5 opponents, the 'Dogs will have their bye week prior to starting Mountain West play. The 2017 conference schedule pairs Fresno State with its West Division foes (Hawai'i, Nevada, San Jose State, San Diego State) along with games against Boise State, New Mexico and Wyoming from the Mountain Division.

The Bulldogs will kick-off its MW slate on Sept. 30, hosting Nevada after the bye. The tilt with the Wolf Pack begins a stretch of four West Division opponents in five weeks.

It also starts a run where the 'Dogs do not leave the state of California from their return from Washington before the bye, until the second week of November.

The 'Dogs will see just one division opponent after October (at Hawai'i, Nov. 11). Fresno State will host its first non-divisional contest against New Mexico on Homecoming on Oct. 14.

November begins with the Bulldogs' final nonconference game of the season when BYU comes to Fresno for the first time since 1998. Fresno State is 3-2 at home in the series, winning the last contest 31-21. After traveling to Hawai'i, the Bulldogs head to Wyoming for the first time since 2013 when they defeated the Cowboys 48-10 at War Memorial Stadium. The 'Dogs close the season with Boise State on Senior Day, hosting the Broncos at Bulldog Stadium for the first time since defeating them in 2013, 41-40.
