Headlines

- → Fresno State entered both the AP Top 25 (20) and Amway Coaches Poll (23) this week. It is the first time since Dec. 8, 2013 that the Bulldogs were ranked in both polls at the same time. Fresno State entered the AP Top 25 and College Football Playoff polls after defeating Boise State on Nov. 25, 2017, but did not enter the Amway Coaches Poll.
- → Fresno State is the only team in California ranked in either the AP or Coaches Poll.
- → Fresno State has won six straight games and 16 of its last 19 overall.
- → Fresno State owns the nation's lead in limiting opponents under 30 points in consecutive games (19). They are one of four FBS teams with double-digit games in that category.
- → Fresno State is one of six teams ranked in the Top 20 nationally in both offensive and defensive efficiency Alabama, Clemson, Georgia, Michigan, West Virginia and Fresno State.
- → The Bulldogs rank No. 4 in the FBS in turnovers margin (+1.75), having turned it over six times versus taking it away 20 times. Fresno State has not turned the ball over since a second quarter fumble on Oct. 6 at Nevada. The three-game stretch without a turnover is the best stretch since 2002.
- → Marcus McMaryion was named a semifinalist for the Maxwell Award on Oct. 29.
- → KeeSean Johnson leads the nation in consecutive games with at least one catch (44) and is also the nation's leader in active career receptions (234). He broke Davante Adams' Fresno State program record of 233 receptions last time out.
- → The 'Dogs have played at UNLV twice since 1996, playing two MW conference games in 2014 and 2016, and lost on each trip. Their last win at UNLV was in 1996.
- → Fresno State is undefeated on the road in regular season MW games under Jeff Tedford (6-0).

Fresno State and UNLV meet for 21st time

Saturday's game will be the 21st meeting all-time between the Bulldogs and Rebels. The Bulldogs currently lead the series 13-7, despite dropping three of five to UNLV as Mountain West foe.

The 'Dogs are 5-4 all-time at UNLV. This will be just the third time Fresno State will have traveled to face the Rebels since 1996. Fresno State dropped both Mountain West contests on the road (2014, 2016). That 1996 game marks the last Bulldog win in Las Vegas (W, 34-23).

UNLV, one of the founding members of the Mountain West's inaugural 1999 season, left the WAC, a conference affiliation they shared with the Bulldogs for just two seasons (1996-97). There was a gap from that 1997 season until 2013 when the two became conference foes again in the MW (the two schools were not scheduled for competition in the Bulldogs' inaugural 2012 MW season).

The first meeting, in 1979 at Ratcliff Stadium (Fresno), was a 31-28 loss. Fresno State lost four of its first six all-time contests, but have won 11 of its last 14 games versus the Rebels. The teams met 10 straight times in the Big West from 1982-1991 and again in 1996-97 in the WAC.

UNLV won the latest matchup between the two teams, handing the Bulldogs their lone Mountain West loss in 2017, a 26-16 defeat at Bulldog Stadium. Since that defeat, the 'Dogs are 12-2 and have not lost at home - winning six straight at Bulldog Stadium.

Scouting the UNLV Rebels

UNLV enters Saturday night's contest in Las Vegas versus the Bulldogs with a 2-6 overall record and a 0-4 mark in the Mountain West play, most recently falling 50-37 at San Jose State last Saturday. It was the Spartans' first win of the 2018 season (1-7).

Under the direction of fourth-year head coach Tony Sanchez, the Rebels have lost five straight games after starting the season 2-1 with wins over UTEP (52-24) and Prairie View A&M (46-17) at home.

The Rebels rank seventh in the MW in scoring offense averaging 31.6 points per game and are

last in the league (12th/121st) in scoring defense allowing 38.9 points per game.

UNLV is currently seventh in the MW in total offense averaging 404.9 yards per game. On the ground, the Rebels rank second in the league and 21st in the nation averaging 231.1 yards per game. Through the air, UNLV is averaging 173.8 yards passing per game, which ranks ninth in the MW and 109th nationally.

After losing starting quarterback Armani Rogers after the fourth game of the season to a toe injury, sophomore Max Gilliam has started the last four games and leads the team with 1,021 passing yards and 12 touchdowns while being intercepted six times.

On the ground, preseason All-Mountain West running back selection Lexington Thomas ranks second in the MW with 721 rushing yards and eight rushing touchdowns. Freshman wide receiver Tyleek Collins leads the team with 387 receiving yards and six touchdowns (5th in MW) and shares the team lead with 23 receptions with junior wideout Brandon Presley.

Defensively, the Rebels rank 11th in the MW and 115th nationally in total defense allowing 467.6 yards per game. Senior defensive back Dalton Baker has been a tackling machine with 89 tackles, 48 solo, as the Las Vegas native has 35 more tackles than his closest teammate. Baker has added three tackles for loss, two pass breakups and an interception.

As a team, UNLV leads the conference and ranks second in the country with 10 fumble recoveries, but has only been able to nab a MW-low two interceptions this season.



Revisiting the 2017 Fresno State-UNLV matchup

The lone Mountain West regular season loss the Bulldogs suffered in 2017 came against UNLV as the 'Dogs lost 26-16 at Bulldog Stadium. The Bulldogs did not force a turnover in the game while UNLV had one takeaway.

With the score tied 16-16 with 1:56 left in the third quarter, the 'Dogs forced the Rebels to punt for the first time in the game, but a costly mishandled punt by KeeSean Johnson set the Rebels up on a short field, needing 23 yards for a score. It took them four plays to capitalize, capped by a 2-yard rush by Lexington Thomas to give UNLV a 23-16 lead. The 'Dogs started their next drive at their own 15, with 10:12 left in the game and down seven. The Bulldogs were able to move the ball 40 yards until being stalled with a 4th-and-2 at the UNLV 45-yard line. Fresno State took a timeout and elected to punt coming out of it, the snap sailed over punter Blake Cusick's head for a loss of 36 yards. The ball was recovered by Cusick at the Fresno State 19-yard line and the ball turned over to the Rebels. The Bulldog defense held UNLV to negative six yards, but a 25-yard field goal by Gutierrez put the visitors ahead 26-16 to seal the win.

Vegas Connections

- → Fresno State running backs coach and special team coordinator, Jamie Christian, spent the 2015 and '16 seasons at UNLV as its RB coach. Christian was a fullback at Fresno State from 1991-93.
- → Fresno State defensive backs coach, J.D. Williams, spent the 2015 and '16 seasons at UNLV in the same capacity. Williams was a player at Fresno State from 1986-89.
- → Fresno State defensive graduate assistant, Matt Lea, played at UNLV in 2016. He started eight games and played in all 12 as a senior. Lea is a 2012 graduate of Central HS in Fresno.
- → Senior OL Logan Hughes, the sole Bulldog who calls Las Vegas home, attended Green Valley HS in the Las Vegas metro area.
- → DT Leevel Tutum III, a participant of all eight games this season, sat out last season after transferring from UNLV's roster in 2016 he hails from Edison HS in Fresno.
- → LB David Tate, Jr., who was a redshirt freshman on the Rebels' 2017 team, is a member of the 2018 Bulldogs' roster. He is a Fresno native that attended Edison HS.
- → UNLV has one player that call Fresno home, junior RB Charles Williams (Bullard HS).
- \rightarrow First-year UNLV OLB coach Eric Brown played at FS in 2007 and on the Bulldogs coaching staff as a student assistant (2008-10) and then as a GA (2011-12).
- \rightarrow First-year UNLV DC Tim Skipper played linebacker for the Bulldogs from 1997-2000 and spent six seasons on the Bulldogs coaching staff from 2006-11.

Bulldogs on a hot streak

With their win over Hawai'i on Saturday, the 'Dogs have now won six straight games since their lone loss of the season, at Minnesota on Sept. 8.

It is Fresno State's longest winning streak since 2013 when they started that season with 10 straight wins. The 'Dogs won four straight games twice in 2017, but suffered losses to UNLV and Boise State that saw each of those streaks come to an end.

Coach Tedford's longest winning streak came in 2006, at Cal, as the Golden Bears reeled off a eight-game winning streak after a season-opening loss at No. 23 Tennessee.

4-0 conference start

With the 'Dogs win over Hawai'i, Fresno State is off to its third 4-0 start in Mountain West action since joining in 2012 (2013/2017). The 'Dogs started last season 4-0 in MW play before falling at home to UNLV for their lone conference loss of the season, and started conference play 7-0 in 2013.

→ Fresno State is undefeated on the road in regular season Mountain West games under Jeff Tedford (6-0).

Fifth fastest date to bowl-clinching

Clinching bowl eligibility on Oct. 20 with their win at New Mexico, it was the fifth-earliest date on the calendar the 'Dogs have done that in program history. The earliest date came on Oct. 13 in 2001, followed by Oct. 14 in 1989 and Oct. 19 in 1991 and 2013.

Winning the halftime adjustments

Fresno State, who has received the ball to open the second half seven times this year, have marched down the length of the field and scored four times (three touchdowns/one field goal). Over the last two games, the Bulldogs have registered lengthy drives in their contests at New Mexico (Oct. 20) and versus Hawai'i (Oct. 27). The Bulldogs used 6:28, their longest scoring

drive of the season, to open the second half at New Mexico to push their lead to 31-7. Against Hawaii, Fresno State ran 14 plays over 5:05 for 61 yards that resulted in a 32-yard field goal to push the Bulldogs' lead to 40-13.

On the flip side, the defense is also making the right halftime adjustments to confuse the opposition's offense. Eight games into the season, the Bulldogs have not allowed their opponent to score with its first possession of the second half. In total, opponents have compiled three first downs and 46 total yards with their first touch of the ball.

Field Position Advantage

In eight games, Fresno State has yet to have a game where it faced longer fields than its opponent. The closest it has come to that is an exact tie on Sept. 29 versus Toledo when both team's average field position start was at its own 28-yard line.

Lots of green in front: The Bulldogs' opponents this season have faced drives starting inside their own 20-yard line 31 times and have faced drives starting inside their own 10-yard line 15 times.

Not so secret weapon

One of the Bulldogs' top assets through eight games has been punter Blake Cusick. The junior has placed 61.1 percent (22-of-36) of his punts inside the opponents' 20-yard line forcing teams to put together sustained drives to score points. Only five of his punts have been returned this season - totaling just 19 yards on those returns.

- Eight punts have been placed inside the opponents' 10-yard line.
- Fresno State ranks first in the MW and 21st in the nation in net punting at 40.6 yards.
- Nine of Cusick's punts have gone for 50-plus yards, including a career-long 72-yarder at Nevada
- Three of his 36 punts have gone for touchbacks this season.

Nation's leader keeping opponents under 30

After 22 total games in the Tedford era, the defense has actually been the hallmark of the "quarterback guru's" tenure. Fresno State has allowed opponents to 16.3 points per game under Tedford. Furthermore, the Bulldogs have not allowed an opponent to score 30 or more points since Sept. 16, 2017 at Washington (L, 48-16), a stretch of 19 straight games, which is the longest streak in the FBS.

Offensive explosion

Prior to Saturday's offensive explosion over Hawai'i, the last time the 'Dogs scored 50 or more points against a Mountain West opponent came on Nov. 29, 2013 when the Bulldogs hung 52 at San Jose State. With UNLV allowing an average of 38.9 points per game, the 'Dogs could potentially register back-to-back 50 points games against MW competition for the first time since scoring 69 points against New Mexico and 52 against the Spartans in 2013.

First down, Bulldogs!

Fresno State generated a season-high 29 first downs during its seventh contest of the season at New Mexico on Oct. 20. It was the most first downs the Bulldogs' offense produced in a single-game since defeating Hawai'i 42-14 on Nov. 14, 2015. In that game the 'Dogs generated 455 yards offense, possessed the ball 37:13 and went 10-of-18 on third downs. Likewise, at New Mexico on Oct. 20, Fresno State generated 433 yards offense, possessed the ball 37:42 and went 9-of-16 on third downs.

Fresno State tallied 29 first downs in an earlier game at Nevada on Nov. 22, 2014 (W, 40-20), and the last time Fresno State broke the 30+ threshold was on Sept. 26, 2014 - the last time the Bulldogs traveled to New Mexico - posting 30 first downs in that game in a 35-24 win.

→ Fresno State totaled 24 first downs against Hawai'i last time out, marking the fifth time this season Fresno State has compiled 24 or more first downs in a game.

Avoiding 3rd-and-longs

Despite matching a season-worst five third-and-long situations, the Bulldogs managed to go 46.2 percent (6-of-13) on third conversations against Hawai'i. The last time Fresno State faced five third-and-longs was against Nevada on Oct. 6, and the results were drastically different. Against Nevada, they converted just 3-of-13 third downs and produced a season-low 271 yards

Marcus McMaryion returned to the Central Valley last season to play for the Bulldogs after three seasons at Oregon State. He was 9-2 as the starter in year one, leading the Bulldogs to an appearance in the MW Championship game and a Hawai'i Bowl victory against Houston after getting his first Bulldog start on Sept. 30, 2017 vs. Nevada. McMaryion accomplished all that after joining the team on Aug. 12, 2017, midway into training camp. He was eligible immediately as a graduate transfer.

Since becoming the first Bulldog quarterback to complete better than 60 percent of his passes in a season since Derek Carr (2013) last year, this season he has:

- McMaryion's completion percentage (70.4%) ranks 8th in the FBS while only three of the seven in front of him have more attempts.
- McMaryion enters the UNLV game with 141 consecutive pass attempts without throwing an interception. McMaryion had a streak of 149 consecutive pass attempts without an interception in 2017, which ranked as the sixth-best streak in program history.
- McMaryion has posted a completion percentage 66.7 or better in all eight games this season.
- McMaryion matched a Fresno State career-high four TD throws against Hawai'i. It was the second time this season and third of his two-year career at FS. He once tossed five in a game while at Oregon State.
- → McMaryion is 16-3 as a starting quarterback at Fresno State.

Since his redshirt freshman season in 2015, senior KeeSean Johnson has been a steady pass catcher for Bulldog quarterbacks - actually the best in that category in program history. The East Palo Alto native has just one game in his entire career where he has gone without a catch - at Ole Miss in 2015 as a redshirt freshman in his second career game. Since then, Johnson has caught at least one pass in 44 consecutive games. Last season, Johnson surpassed the program's previous leader in consecutive games with a catch, Henry Ellard. Ellard, who was catching passes from Jeff Tedford in 1981-82, held the record previously catching passes in 34-straight games from 1979-82.

KeeSean Johnson, an East Palo Alto native, has been the Bulldogs' leading receiver over the past two seasons, and is working his way up the Fresno State record books by putting up consistent numbers over the years and has been chasing down fellow East Palo Alto native Davante Adams in several categories in the Fresno State record books. Last time out, Johnson broke Adams' career pass receptions record and is now tracking down the career receiving yards record. Currently, Johnson is one of 11 pass catchers to hit the 2,000-yard milestone in program history and sits at No. 7 overall with 2,782 yards.

- Johnson owns a team-best 54 receptions and 761 receiving yards in 2018.
- Johnson trails Charlie Jones' receiving yardage record of 3,344 by 460 yards. He would need to average 115.0 yds/gm over four games, 92.0 yds/gm over five games or 76.7 yds/gm over six games to reach the program record.

Protecting the football

Fresno State has not turned the ball over since a second quarter fumble on Oct. 6 at Nevada. The last interception was thrown on Sept. 29 versus Toledo. Fresno State ranks No. 4 in the FBS in turnovers lost, having turned the ball over just six times.

→ Having not turned the ball over in three-straight games, it marks the first three-game run since 2002. In 2002, the Bulldogs did not turn the ball over in games versus Rice (9/28), Colorado State (10/4) and SMU (10/12).



Rivers runs deep

From what has been a running back by committee, looks to be trending towards sophomore Ronnie Rivers as the Bulldogs' feature back. Rivers carried the ball 11 times out of the 33 total rushes last time out, and received all seven carries in the first quarter, and 10 of the 14 rushes by a running back in the first half. While Rivers saw the bulk, he is still part of a trio in junior Josh Hokit and sophomore Jordan Mims. Those three a season ago were 20 yards shy of becoming the eighth Bulldog team to have three rushers with 500 yards or more in a single season as Rivers fell short with 480. Looking back at the 2017 season, those three had two games where all three of them carried the ball double-digit times - Oct. 7 vs. San Jose State and Nov. 11 vs. Hawai'i. On Oct. 20 against New Mexico, all three picked up double-digit carries for the first time in 2018.

- → Rivers registered a 76-yard TD run against Hawai'i. A career-long and the longest rush from scrimmage by a Bulldog since Marteze Waller broke loose for a 76-yard TD on Oct. 17, 2014 at Boise State.
- → Rivers has scored four touchdowns (3 rushing/1 receiving) over the past two games and has led the team in all-purpose yardage with 298 in that span (173 rush, 78 receiving, 47 punt return).

Plug and Play

Fresno State used its fourth different starting lineup on the offensive line in eight games against Hawai'i. In spite of the lack of continuity, like starting the same five in all 14 games a season ago, the results have been just the same. With its lineup versus Hawai'i, the 'Dogs did not surrender a sack, utilizing Dontae Bull at right tackle for his first career start.

Fresno State has kept a clean sheet three times, at Minnesota and hosting Wyoming and Hawai'i, and allowed one apiece in the five other contests.

Fresno State returned three starters with 71 career combined starts (Netane Muti, Christian Cronk, Micah St. Andrew) going into the 2018 season opener ... in doing so, the line tinkered with its lineup to the point that Fresno State joined Western Kentucky and UTSA as the only offensive lines in the nation to start the season with all five position starters each earning their first career starts at their respective position to start 2018 ... the change continued losing Muti to a season-ending achilles injury during the Bulldogs' week two contest at Minnesota. Cronk moved back to left tackle (where he started in 2016-17) in the absence of Muti and junior college transfer Nick Abbs slid in at left guard. A new lineup emerged against Wyoming, having St. Andrew and Boyer flip positions (center-right guard) while Logan Hughes picked up his first start at left guard since 2016. The 'Dogs only steady presence had been Syrus Tuitele at right tackle this season, until Bull replaced him last week due to an injury.

Defending the red zone

With opponents cashing in on just 57.1 percent of its trips to the red zone, Fresno State's defense ranks No. 2 in the FBS defending red zone opportunities. In total, Fresno State's opponents have reached the red zone 14 times - which ranks as the second-fewest trips to the red zone in the FBS.

- → The eight scores by opponents in the red zone are tied for the fewest in the FBS with UAB. The Blazers, though, have allowed eight scores on 10 attempts.
- → Fresno State has stopped an opponent in the red zone in half of its games. The Bulldogs held Idaho and Toledo to 1-of-3 on red zone chances.
- → Fresno State has recorded at least one red zone stop in three of the last five games.
- → The 'Dogs kept Wyoming out of the red zone on Oct. 13.

Elite

Following a season in which the Bulldogs' defense was the program's best since the late 1980's, this year's group is on track to be even better. The Bulldogs are currently suffocating opposing offenses, holding them to the fourth-lowest points per game (13.5) in the FBS. Fresno State has allowed 12 touchdowns this season, the third-least in the FBS.

→ During the last 50 years, Fresno State has held opponents to 15.0 points per game or less during four seasons.

→ Only once has a Bulldog defense held 2. 1986 - 13.6 ppg opponents below 14 points per game for 3. 1988 - 14.1 ppg an entire season (1986 - 13.6).

Dominance in league play

Through four games in Mountain West play, Fresno State's defense has elevated its play even more than its first four games, allowing just 8.3 points per game during its last four outings. The 33 points allowed is the least through its first four conferences games since the beginning of the modern era.

Manufacturing takeaways

Through eight games, Fresno State has produced 20 takeaways which ranks tied for the fourth-most in the country (based on all teams and all games). The Bulldogs' 14 interceptions ranks tied for the most in the FBS. The Bulldogs turnover margin ranks fourth-best in the country having turned the ball over six times equaling a +1.75 turnover margin.

Aerial pursuit

While Fresno State remains one of the top team's in the FBS in takeaways, its strength has been when attacking a team's passing games. The Bulldogs rank tied for No. 1 in the FBS in interceptions with 14.

The fear of ball-hawking defenders has led quarterbacks to be off their game, holding them to the third-lowest passing efficiency in the nation at 97.39. Quarterbacks have been held to a 48.8 percent completion percentage.

- → Eight different Bulldogs have hauled in an interception this season. Tank Kelly and Mike Bell lead the team with three while Jeff Allison and Juju Hughes have accounted for two
- → Nine of Fresno State's picks have come from its secondary, three from its linebackers and two from the linemen up front.
- → Fresno State has defended 54 passes this season, 6.8 per game. Kelly has accounted for a nation-leading 18, doubling Bell's total of nine which ranks second on the team and third in the Mountain West (No. 20 FBS).

Playing catch with the opposition

Ranking No. T-1 in the FBS in interceptions, Fresno State has recorded at least one in each of the last six games. It is the longest streak since the 2012 season when the Bulldogs grabbed at least one in 11 straight games.

→ During this year's six-game streak, six Bulldogs have combined to intercept 9 passes.

Taking more than they allow

Fresno State is one of 21 teams in the country to have more interceptions than allowed passing touchdowns. The Bulldogs intercept 1.75 passes per touchdown allowed through the air which is tied for No. 2 nationally.

→ No other team in the Mountain West has forced more interceptions than allowed passing touchdowns (8 TD/14 INT).

Spreading it around

Of Fresno State's 14 interceptions, four players have accounted for multiple picks (Tank Kelly - 3, Mike Bell, 3, Jeff Allison - 2, Juju Hughes - 2). The last time the Bulldogs have had at least four players record at least two INTs in a season was 2004 (Marcus McCauley - 3, James Sanders - 3, Richard Marshall, Nate Ray - 2).

The offense doesn't have to do all the scoring

Through eight games, Fresno State has scored five touchdowns without the use of its offense, the latest coming by way of Jamire Jordan catching a Hawai'i missed field goal eight yards deep into the end zone and returning it for a touchdown. The Bulldogs are tied with Temple for the FBS lead in defensive touchdowns with five.

- *According to NCAA statistic generation, blocked field goal returns and field goal attempt returns are categorized as fumble returns, in addition to more tradional defensive touchdowns such as interceptions returns and fumble returns.
- → The Bulldogs have run two interceptions back for touchdowns this season, a 38-yard return by Mykal Walker against Toledo on Sept. 29 and a 39-yard return from Tank Kelly versus Idaho in the season opener.
- → Against Idaho, Jaron Bryant became the first player in FBS history to return two blocked punts for touchdowns in the same game, doing it in the only second quarter. No team in FBS history had ever performed the feat twice in one game.
- → The five touchdown returns is the most for a Bulldog team since 2013. That team returned two interceptions, two punts and one fumble.

<u>Jeff Allison - the Dog in the middle</u>

As one of the nation's leading tacklers a season ago with 126, middle linebacker Jeff Allison has continued 2018 where he left off. He is currently on pace to surpass his 2017 total as he leads Fresno State with 84 tackles - an average of 10.5 per game. He is 39 tackles ahead of Mykal Walker who sits second on the team with 45.

Playing just over half of the season opener vs. Idaho, he still led the Bulldogs in tackles (6), and a week later at Minnesota, Allison was everywhere racking up a career-high 15 tackles, one more than the 14 he produced in Week 2 last year at Alabama. At UCLA, Allison was one tackle short of leading the team once again with six. He returned to leading the team in tackles against Toledo (9), Nevada (17), Wyoming (13) and New Mexico (10).

- → In 22 career starts, Allison has led the Bulldogs in tackles 14 times. He has collected 10 or more tackles on 10 occasions.
- → Allison ranks fourth in the MW in tackles per game at 10.5, good for 19th in the FBS.
- → His 5.6 solo stops per game is second in the MW and ranks No. 25 in the FBS.
- → He began the season on both the Bednarik (top defensive player) and Butkus (top linebacker) Award watch lists.

Not to be underestimated

Anthoula "Tank" Kelly has been everything that his name entails through the first eight games of 2018. The senior cornerback has been a destructive force thus far providing big hits, big plays and has locked down opposing receivers. Kelly is tied for the FBS lead in passes defended with 18 with Virginia's Bryce Hall. He is tied for second in the MW and ranks tied for 14th in the FBS with three interceptions with teammate Mike Bell.

- → Kelly recorded 13 of 18 passes defended in three games (Idaho 5; Nevada 4; Wyoming 4).
- → The 5-foot-10 defensive back has three interceptions, one blocked field goal and one forced fumble on the year. The Bulldogs have scored 21 points off of the fifth-year senior's big plays.
- → Kelly has recorded three firsts in his Bulldog career this season: return an interception for a touchdown, block a field goal and force a fumble.

Holding opponents below their averages

Fresno State has had no trouble this season keeping its opponents below their averages. Among total offense, rushing yards, passing yards and points, only once has Fresno State allowed a team to earn a total above its season average (Toledo: 238 passing yards).

Not your average pass rusher

- Through eight games, Mykal Walker ranks second in the Mountain West among defensive linemen in tackles with 45 (5.6 per game).
- Walker ranks fifth in the MW in forced fumbles with two and recovered the first of his career last weekend against Hawai'i.
- In his first game in a Bulldog uniform, Walker blocked a field that was returned for a touchdown.
- · Against Toledo, Walker became the first Bulldog defensive lineman to return an interception for a touchdown since Tristan Okpalaugo on Sept. 22, 2012.
- · Against Hawai'i, Walker tallied a team-high nine tackles to become the first defensive lineman to lead the Bulldogs in tackles since Tyeler Davison led team with eight versus Nevada in 2014.

Keeping offenses in front of them

Fresno State has not allowed an opponent to record more than 400 yards of total offnese in 10 consecutive games. The Bulldogs' streak is the third-longest active streak in the FBS.

→ The Bulldogs have held three opponents under 300 yards in 2018 (UCLA, Wyoming, New Mexico).

Through his first 22 games at Fresno State, he is 17-5. Tedford is coaching in his 13th career season as a collegiate head coach (Cal, 2002-12).

Much different from a year ago, the Fresno State football team was picked to win the West Division by the media, announced by the Mountain West on Tuesday morning prior to the 2018 media summit getting underway at the Cosmopolitan of Las Vegas.

Fresno State turned the 2017 predicted order of finish upside down after being picked to finish last with a 10-4 run and a West Division crown guided by thenfirst year head coach Jeff Tedford. Now, the Bulldogs will make its run for a second-straight appearance in the MW Championship game as the favorite in Tedford's sophomore season.

This is the third time in six seasons (2013, 2014 and 2018) the Bulldogs have been the favorite to win the West since the inception of the divisional format instituted by the league to start the 2013 season. In the previous two occasions the Bulldogs were picked the win the West in the league's preseason poll, Fresno State carried out that forecast each time.

In addition to the predicted order of finish, the 2018 All-Mountain West Preseason Football Team was announced. This year's team included two Fresno State selections in senior wide receiver KeeSean Johnson and junior linebacker Jeff Allison. Johnson was a 2017 second-team All-MW pick while Allison was the Bulldogs' sole first-team selection a season ago.

JEFF TEDFORD

HEAD COACH

2ND SEASON | FRESNO STATE (1992)

Jeff Tedford, 56, was named the 19th head football coach in Fresno State history on Nov. 10, 2016. He enters his second season after engineering one of the greatest turnarounds in FBS history in his first year back in the Valley.

With a 10-4 record in his first season, Fresno State became the second team in FBS history to turn a double-digit loss season (2016) into a double-digit win season (2017) the following year. The season included an appearance in the nation's top 25, clinching the Mountain West's West Division crown and leading the 'Dogs to their first appearance in the MW Championship Game since 2014. He also guided the 'Dogs to the program's first bowl victory since 2007 with their win at the Hawai'i Bowl.

Great success brought great notoriety as Tedford was named the 2017 Mountain West Coach of the Year, was a semifinalist for the George Munger College Coach of the Year Award presented by the Maxwell Football Club, a finalist for the Eddie Robinson Coach of the Year Award presented on behalf of the Football Writers Association of America in conjunction with the Allstate Sugar Bowl, and the AFCA Region-5 Coach of the Year.

While Tedford was honored as the league's coach of the year, the team had 16 student-athletes recognized with MW postseason honors - the most for the Bulldogs in a single-season since joining the conference in 2012. In the classroom, the 'Dogs also set a teambest number since joining the conference as they had 24 named to the Fall Academic All-Mountain West team.

Tedford, a former Bulldog quarterback and Fresno State assistant coach, returned to the Valley after holding the position of offensive consultant for the Washington Huskies - a 2016 College Football Playoff team.

Tedford assumed the role of acting head coach on Nov. 27, following the conclusion of the 2016 season as interim head coach Eric Kiesau carried out his duties for the remaining two games following Tedford's introduction.

Tedford, who is a proven winner on the West Coast, came to the Valley with 11 years of head coaching experience at the Division I level - having led the California Golden Bears to 82 wins from 2002-2012. He left as the school's all-time winningest coach.

Tedford's ties to the Valley and Fresno State run deep. He played quarterback at Fresno State in 1981-82 under Jim Sweeney and coached at Fresno State under Sweeney from 1987-88 and 1992-96, and under a then-first-year head coach Pat Hill in 1997.

Tedford's coaching career started at Fresno State, volunteering as an assistant for the 1987-88 seasons. From there he picked up his first full-time position as an assistant for the Calgary Stampeders of the Canadian Football League - a familiar league in which he played quarterback for six seasons after his collegiate career at

He returned to Fresno State in 1992 as the quarterbacks coach and served as the offensive coordinator for the Bulldogs over the

Tedford held the same position at Oregon (1998-2001) before he became the head coach at Cal. He was named the Pac-10 Coach of the Year twice, leading the Golden Bears to a school record seven consecutive bowl games and to a conference title in 2006.

Following Tedford's stint at Cal, he moved on to the NFL in 2014 as the Tampa Bay Buccaneers' offensive coordinator. The stop did not last long due to health issues during the preseason that evolved into an indefinite leave of absence, which resulted in the two sides mutually agreeing to part ways.

Tedford made his return to the CFL in 2015 as he was named the head coach of the B.C. Lions. At the conclusion of the season, Tedford elected to exercise an option in his contract to resign and pursue opportunities in college football.

Tedford made his return to college football as an offensive consultant for the Washington Huskies under head coach Chris Peterson in 2016. A relationship rekindled after their time together as assistants at Oregon under then-coach Mike Belotti. Washington's staff also included associate head coach Bob Gregory, who served as Tedford's defensive coordinator at Cal for eight seasons.

Tedford graduated from Warren High School in Downey, California and attended Cerritos Junior College for two seasons before becoming the Bulldogs' quarterback in 1981.

He and his wife Donna have two children, Taylor and Quinn.

FRESNO, Calif. - Scoring its most points since 1991 using five interceptions, two special teams returns for touchdowns and one opening rout of the Idaho Vandals on Saturday night at Bulldog Stadium. pick-six, the Fresno State football team rolled to a 79-13 season

Fresno State (1-0) scored its most points in 27 years using a balanced offensive approach passing for 247 yards while rushing for 239 and seven scores on the ground.

Senior quarterback Marcus McMarvion had an efficient passing night going 19-for-26 for 207 yards. The 'Dogs used a balanced attack on the ground as five running backs each went for better than 35 yards with Romello Harris leading the way with 47 followed Saevion Johnson (45). Deionte O'Neal (41). Josh Hokit (40) and Jordan Mims (36). Mims led the group with three touchdo



Senior wide receiver KeeSean Johnson tallied his sixth career 100-yard receiving game going for 118 yards on six receptions while extending his consecutive games with a reception streak to a nation-leading 37 ga

Defensively, junior linebacker Jeff Allison led the team with six tackles while senior cornerback Tank Kelly had a pair of interceptions one returned for a touchdown, five tackles and three pass breakups. Junior defensive tackle Jasad Haynes had five tackles, three tackles for loss, a sack and a forced fumble while Jaron Bryant returned two blocked field goals for touchdowns.

How It Happened

The Bulldogs got the scoring started on their first offensive series of the contest going on an 11-play, 56-yard drive that saw McMaryion complete five of six passes for 42 yards connecting on passes to three different receivers, including three to junior tight end Jared Rice.

Facing a 3rd-and-5 from the Idaho 27. McMaryion connected on back-to-back passes for nine and 11 yards, respectively, to Rice getting the 'Dogs down to the Vandals 7. A six-yard gain by O'Neal got the Bulldogs on the doorstep of Idaho's goal line setting up a one-yard touchdown plunge by Mims.

After forcing the Vandals' to a second straight three-and-out, the 'Dogs took over at their own 20-yard line and marched down the field on a 12-play, 80-yard drive as the 'Dogs found little resistance from the Idaho defense. Faced with a 3rd-and-16 at their own 26, McMaryion found Johnson down the middle of the field for a 19 yard gain.

An 11-yard connection from Johnson and McMaryion on a 3rd-and-1 kept the drive alive and got the 'Dogs down to the Vandals' 28 and two plays later, the 'Dogs capitalized with a 26-yard scamper through the left side by O'Neal for his second career rushing

The 'Dogs defense continued to wreck havoc as Haynes forced his first career fumble setting up the Bulldog's offense at the Idaho 19. After compiling 136 yards of offense on its first two drives, the Bulldog offense was only able to move four yards on its third drive setting up a 33-yard field goal by redshirt freshman kicker Asa Fuller who made his first career field goal to give the 'Dogs a 16-0 lead.

Holding the Vandals to negative 16 yards of offense on its first two drives, Idaho needed only two plays to drive 75 yards as quarterback Mason Petrino found wide receiver Jeff Cotton down the sideline for 73 yards to break up the 'Dogs shutout bid. The Vandals bobbled the PAT attempt as the Bulldogs led 16-6 with five seconds remaining in the first quarter

Fresno State carried its hot offense into the second quarter going on a 7-play, 75-yard drive passing for 39 yards and running for 36 yards as Mims punched in his second touchdown run with a 12-yard scamper up the middle to extend the 'Dogs lead to 23-6.

The Vandals put together their most substantial drive of the game to that point with a 10-play, 46-yard drive down to the Bulldog 26 setting up a 36-yard field goal attempt by Cade Coffey, but Kelly broke through line blocking Coffey's kick as Bryant picked it up and returned it 74 yards putting the Bulldogs up 30-6.

The 'Dogs defense continued to pour it as Kelly picked off his second pass of the game stepping in front of a Petrino pass and returned it 39 yards for a touchdown to push the lead to 37-6.

Idaho made one final push to score in the first half going on a 9-play, 43-yard drive down to the Bulldog 22 to set up a 39-yard attempt by Coffey with one second remaining in the half. The 'Dogs special teams again came up clutch as redshirt junior Mykal Walker broke through the line for the block and was picked up by Bryant for 71 yards as Fresno State took a commanding 44-6 lead into halftime.

The Bulldogs added two touchdowns in the third quarter, a two-yard run by Mims and a 33-yard pass from Jorge Reyna to Derrion Grim (watch) on his first career attempt to take a 58-6 lead. The Vandals scored once more in the game in the third frame, a six-yard run by Isaiah Saunders to make it 58-13 in favor of the 'Dogs.

Fresno State completed the scoring with three more touchdowns in the fourth quarter as a pair of 'Dogs scored their first career touchdowns. S. Johnson had a five-yard plunge up the middle followed by a 27-yard run by Harris before S. Johnson found the end zone one more time with a one-yard run.

MINNEAPOLIS - The Fresno State football team lost a heartbreaker at Minnesota on Saturday evening, falling 21-14 at TCF Bank Stadium.

After converting a fourth-and-3 from the Minnesota 10-yard line, Fresno State was set up with first-and goal from the Golden Gopher 4-yard line with 1:24 remaining in the game. The 'Dogs pulled a play out of the book from 2017, a halfback pass attempt from Josh Hokit to try and knot the game. But this one, intended for tight end Jared Rice in the back of the end zone, was intercepted by Minnesota defensive back Antonie Winfield Jr. to dash the Bulldogs' hopes of winning their first game on Big Ten soil since defeating Illinois 53-52 in 2009.



Fresno State was stymied for much of the first half by the Gophers' defense, totaling 104 yards offense, but came alive in the second half. Entering the third quarter trailing 10-0, the Bulldogs scored two touchdowns in the second half and took a one-point lead in the fourth quarter, 14-13. Minnesota regained the lead with 3:28 left in the contest and it proved to be enough to win the game.

Fresno State senior quarterback Marcus McMaryion went 23-of-32 through the air for 205 yards with a pair of rresno State sentor quarterback Marcus McMaryton went 23-01-32 through the air for 205 yards with a pair of touchdowns and his first interception of the season while adding 15 yards on the ground. Sophomore running back Jordan Mims led the 'Dogs rushing attack with 41 yards on 10 carries. The Bulldogs rushed for 87 yards as a team. On the receiving end, senior wide receiver KeeSean Johnson led the team with six receptions for 89 yards and a touchdown while Rice added five catches for 31 yards and a score.

Defensively, junior linebacker Jeff Allison had a career-high 15 tackles while junior safety Mike Bell chipped in a career-best 11 tackles, including five solo. The Bulldog defense did force one turnover in the third quarter as senior cornerback Tank Kelly forced a fumble that was recovered by senior defensive lineman Patrick Belony. The Bulldogs manufactured their first points of the game off that turnover.

How It Happened

Minnesota started the scoring on its second offensive drive by manufacturing a lengthy 14-play, 80-yard drive that ran 7:17 off the clock. Gopher redshirt sophomore Seth Green punched the ball in from one-yard out to give Minnesota a 7-0 lead.

Facing its first deficit of the season, the 'Dogs looked to get its offense going, but McMaryion threw his first interception of the season on the ensuing possession to give Minnesota the ball back at the Bulldogs' 41-yard

The 'Dogs defense came up big allowing only one yard after that turnover and nearly had a turnover of their own as Allison snagged a pass attempt on third-and-9, but was unable to stay in bounds. Minnesota finished the half with a 10-play, 55-yard drive that ended with a 53-yard field goal by Emmit Carpenter to take a 10-0

After the teams traded punts to start the second half, the Bulldogs defense produced their first turnover of the game deep in the Gophers' own territory. Anthoula Kelly forced the fumble and Patrick Belony pounced on top of it to spark the Bulldogs' offense. Fresno State took advantage going on a four-play, 17-yard drive to score with 20 seconds remaining in the third quarter to pull within three, 10-7. Rice capped the drive with a one-yard touchdown catch from McMaryion.

Carpenter added his second 50-plus yard field goal of the game (50 yards) to put Minnesota ahead 13-7 before a quick strike by the 'Dogs gave Fresno State its lone lead of the game.

The 'Dogs went on a five-play, 75-yard drive that was capped by McMaryion connecting with Johnson for 45 yards to push the 'Dogs in the lead, 14-13.

The lead was short-lived as the Gophers, as they did all game, pounded the ball on the ground for a 10-play, 74-yard drive that ate up 4:52 off the clock. Green ran in from three yards out and after a successful two-point conversion, the Gophers held a 21-14 lead. The drive was kept alive after a 13-yard completion along the sideline on a third-and-nine by a scrambling Zack Annexstad in Minnesota territory. That was followed by a 15-yard sideline infraction penalty called on Fresno State to set the Gophers up at the Bulldogs' 28-yard line

Facing a fourth-and-3 from the Gophers 10-vard line. McMarvion found Justin Allen for six vards and a first down to extend the game, but after a timeout, the Gophers came up with the play that seal the game.



PASADENA, Calif. - Led by senior quarterback Marcus McMaryion's five total touchdowns on Saturday night at the Rose Bowl, the Fresno State football team defeated UCLA 38-14 in front of 60,867 fans with a large contingent being the Red Wave that filled up the visitors section in the southeast endzone. The Bulldogs closed the game with 22-unanswered points during the final 24 minutes to earn their thirdstraight win over the Bruins to the delight of the fans that made the trip.

With four touchdowns on the ground, McMaryion became just the second Fresno State quarterback to rush for four touchdowns in a game - joining Mark Barsotti's feat in 1989. McMaryion finished 22-of-33



The Fresno State defense was again stingy, forcing four UCLA turnovers while limiting the Bruins to 270 yards of offense with 151 yards through the air and 119 yards on the ground. Junior safety Mike Bell had a team-high seven tackles, five solo, adding two pass breakups and tackle for loss. Junior linebacker Jeff Allison snagged his first two career interceptions while getting in on six tackles. The 'Dogs also forced a pair of UCLA fumbles that were recovered by Patrick Belony and James Bailey

How It Happened

Fresno State got its offense going from the outset as the 'Dogs received the opening kickoff and went on a 13-play, 75-yard drive that burned 4:57 off the clock as McMaryion ran in a one-yard touchdown run (watch) to cap the drive. The 'Dogs converted all three third downs on the opening drive while being balanced with 39 yards rushing and passing for 36 yards, including a pair of passes to Johnson for 19 yards.

After holding UCLA to 17 yards on five plays on their first offensive possession, the Bulldogs got the ball back and continued their hot offense with a 8-play, 75-yard drive that was finished by McMaryion finding Riddering down the left hash (watch) to put the 'Dogs ahead 13-0.

For a second straight week, Belony recovered an opponent's fumble as the senior defensive tackle hopped on a Bruins' botched snap at the UCLA 38-yard line (watch). The 'Dogs offense continued to hum along going down the field on a 6-play, 27-yard drive that finished with a 28-yard field goal by Asa Fuller (watch) to extend the 'Dogs lead to 16-0. The Bulldog offense finished the first quarter with 147 yards of offense while UCLA only countered with 38 yards, but the roles reversed in the second quarter as the 'Dogs were held to 30 yards and UCLA churned out 122 yards.

The Bruins took advantage of forcing a McMaryion fumble to strike quickly on a 45-yard touchdown pass from quarterback Dorian Thompson-Robinson to wide receiver Theo Howard, but that would be all the scoring for the Bruins the first half.

The Bulldogs took a 16-7 lead into the locker room at halftime and UCLA continued to take advantage of Fresno State miscues early in the second half. A botched punt return by Johnson set UCLA up at the Bulldogs' 17-yard line. The Bruins' capped the short scoring drive with a two-yard touchdown run by Bolu Olorunfunmi to cut the 'Dogs lead to 16-14 with 12:59 left in the third quarter.

Fresno State's offense got back to firing as it was in the first quarter halfway though the third quarter, closing the game with 22-unanswered points over the final 24 minutes. It started with an 8-play, 73-yard drive that was punctuated by a one-yard touchdown run by McMaryion (watch), his second of the game, and a successful vo-point conversion pass from Jorge Reyna to Gunner Javernick (watch) to put the Bulldogs out front, 24-14, at the 6:19 mark in the third.

The defense played its part in the Bulldogs' late explosion as Allison snagged his first career interception to put the Bulldogs' offense at the 49-yard line (watch) to start their next scoring drive. The 'Dogs used a 5-play, 51-yard drive that was capped by McMaryion's third rushing score of the night, a one-yard plunge (watch), that put the 'Dogs up 31-14 with 3:43 to play in the third quarter.

Allison kept the 'Dogs defensive pressure up and grabbed his second interception of the game (watch) on the Bruins' next offensive possession. The Bulldogs made it three straight scoring drives capped by a McMaryion touchdown, this time a two-yard score (watch) that proved to be the final score of the game as Fresno State walked out of the Rose Bowl with a 38-14 win.

FRESNO, Calif. - Using a run of 42 unanswered points, Fresno State overcame an early 13-7 deficit to roll to a convincing 49-27 win over Toledo on Saturday evening at Bulldog Stadium.

Fresno State, who finished nonconference play with a 3-1 record, accounted for a season-high 554 yards of offense in the contest with 368 yards through the air and 186 yards rushing.

After picking up the offensive player of the week award after his last performance against UCLA accounting for five total touchdowns, senior quarterback Marcus McMaryion produced five more scores, tossing a season-high four through the air while running for one on the ground. McMaryion completed 24-of-31 passes for 368 yards, the most by a Bulldog quarterback since Derek Carr passed for 404 against Utah State on Dec. 7, 2013. McMaryion also became the first quarterback since Carr in 2013 (New Mexico and San Jose State) to account for five touchdowns in back-to-back games.



Sophomore running back Jordan Mims made a career-high six receptions for 126 yards and became the first Bulldog running back since Paris Gaines on Dec. 31, 2000 to account for 100 or more receiving yards in a game. Senior wide receiver KeeSean Johnson added six catches for 102 yards and two touchdowns for his seventh career 100-yard game and sixth career multi-score contest.

On the ground, Mims and junior running back Josh Hokit each accounted for 59 yards as the 'Dogs ran the ball 38 times in the game for an average of 4.9 yards per carry.

Defensively, junior linebacker Jeff Allison led the team in tackles for the third time this season making nine stops in the game. Senior defensive back Anthoula Kelly made a career-high seven tackles while accounting for three of the Bulldogs' five pass breakups in the game while junior defensive end Mykal Walker returned a 38-yard interception for a touchdown (watch), a sack, 2.5 tackles for loss and a pass breakup.

For a third time this season, the 'Dogs took their first offensive drive for a touchdown going on a 12-play, 75-yard journey down the field that ended with a four-yard touchdown run by Mims (watch). McMaryion went a perfect 7-of-7 for 58 yards connecting with five different teammates as junior tight end Cam Sutton made his first career reception with an 18-yard gain.

After being held to six yards and a three-and-out on its first drive, Toledo wasted little time responding with a 10-play, 75-yard drive that finished with a 19-yard touchdown pass from Rockets' quarterback Mitchell Guadagni to running back Shakif Seymour.

With the total yardage at 98 yards for each side and the score tied 7-7 after the opening quarter, Toledo opened the second quarter with a 36-yard run by Guadagni followed by a 15-yard personal foul penalty that sent the Rockets down to the Bulldog 30. The Bulldogs' defense held strong from that point, holding Toledo to a 46-yard field goal by Jameson Vest that gave the Rockets' a 10-7 lead.

With the Bulldogs trailing for the first time since Sept. 8 at Minnesota, McMaryion found Johnson on a bubble screen that he took upfield for 24 yards before McMaryion was intercepted for only the second time this season as Toledo defensive tackle Reggie Howard batted McMaryion's arm to force the ball in the air and into the awaiting arms of defensive end Jamal Hines.

It did not end in six points, but Toledo took advantage of the 'Dogs miscue connecting on a 43-yard field goal by Vest that extended the Rockets' lead to 13-7.

The 'Dogs responded to the Rockets' pair of field goals in a hurry with a 6-play, 76-yard drive in 1:43 to re-gain a one-point advantage, 14-13. McMaryion found Mims who scampered for 55 yards after a short pass, and on the ensuing play connected with Johnson on a seven-yard bubble screen that he took to the end zone to push the Bulldogs ahead.

One three-and-out later forced by the Bulldog defense, allowed McMaryion to guide the offense to a 6-play, 78-yard drive that featured a season-long 21-yard run by Hokit and a 36-yard flip from McMaryion to Jamire Jordan that was finished off by a two-yard touchdown toss from McMaryion to senior tight end Kyle Riddering to put the 'Dogs ahead 21-13.

The defense again made life tough for the Rockets as junior defensive end Kwami Jones came up with his first sack of the season that forced the Rockets to punt, which was returned by Ronnie Rivers for 18 yards as the sophomore running back made his season debut.

The next Fresno State score was set up by McMaryion finding Mims out of the backfield down the right sideline for a 47-yard touchdown that gave the 'Dogs their third straight touchdown and pushed the lead to 28-13.

After gaining 346 yards of offense in the first half with 286 yards coming through the air and 60 yards on the ground, the 'Dogs opened the second half and put together a 6-play, 75-yard drive that ended with a 12-yard touchdown pass from McMaryion to Johnson in the left corner of the end zone to push the 'Dogs lead to 35-13.

On the drive, McMaryion went 3-for-3 for 64 yards finding Johnson for a 39-yard connection that pushed him into eighth all-time in program history in receiving yards passing Isaiah Burse (2010-13)

The 'Dogs added two more touchdowns in the third quarter as Walker's 38-vard interception return was the Bulldogs' fourth non-offensive return for a touchdown this season and was the second interception returned for a touchdown this season by a Bulldog

McMaryion added his fifth touchdown of the game with a six-yard rush with 2:48 to play in the third quarter to give the 'Dogs a 49-13 lead (watch). Toledo added two fourth quarter touchdowns as Eli Peters connected with Jon Vea Johnson for a 54-yard score followed by a 24-

RENO, Nev. - Behind stout defense from the Bulldogs and two touchdowns from sophomore running back Ronnie Rivers, Fresno State defeated Nevada 21-3 in its Mountain West opener on Saturday evening at Mackay

Holding Nevada to only a field goal in the contest, the Fresno State defense forced three turnovers and limited the Wolf Pack to 3.8 yards per play on offense

Senior quarterback Marcus McMaryion went 20-of-28 passing, completing better than 70 percent of his throws for the fourth time in five games. He racked up 241 vards and tossed two touchdowns.



The beneficiary to each of McMaryion's touchdown throws were senior wide receiver KeeSean Johnson (27yard TD) and Rivers (19-yard TD). Johnson had a team-high seven receptions for 65 yards and a touchdown while Rivers' TD grab was his sole reception on the evening. Junior tight end Jared Rice tallied a team-high and career-high 98 yards on three receptions which included a career-long 69-yard reception.

Defensively, the 'Dogs linebacker corps was outstanding as junior linebacker Jeff Allison led the way with a career-high 17 tackles, 10 solo, while adding half-a-sack and half-a-tackle. Senior linebacker George Helmuth added 11 tackles, 1.5 tackles for loss and 0.5 sack and fellow senior James Bailey tacked on 10 tackles, 2.5

The secondary ripped off three interceptions, with the wealth being spread around with senior cornerback Anthoula Kelly, junior strong safety Juju Hughes and junior free safety Mike Bell tallying one apiece.

With neither team able to generate much offense in the early going, the game was scoreless after the opening quarter. The 'Dogs edged the Wolf Pack in total yards, 73-58.

With the ball at the Nevada 30-yard line and a fresh set of downs to open the second quarter, Fresno State finished their first scoring drive with McMaryion finding Rivers in the flat for a 19-yard touchdown pass to cap a nine play, 69-yard drive that spanned four minutes, nine seconds.

Nevada responded to the Bulldogs' touchdown drive with an 11-play, 51-yard drive that resulted in a 41-yard field goal by Wolf Pack kicker Ramiz Ahmed to cut the 'Dogs lead to 7-3. Nevada converted a key 4th-and-2 with a 13-yard rush by quarterback Christian Solano which helped set up the Wolf Pack's only scoring drive of the night.

Later in the second quarter, Kelly intercepted Solano and returned it 43 yards to the Wolf Pack 11 for his third interception of the season. Unfortunately for the 'Dogs, a play later McMaryion's pass to Jamire Jordan was jarred loose from Jordan causing the 'Dogs only turnover on Saturday.

Limited to only 125 yards of offense to that point, the 'Dogs broke out on its second offensive drive of the third quarter as McMaryion found Rice for a 69-yard reception, taken down at the Nevada 11 to ultimately set up the Bulldogs' next score. Nevada wouldn't make it easy for Fresno State as they were able to convert a 4th-and-1 from the Nevada 2 to increase the lead to 14-3. Rivers delivered the score with his second touchdown of the

Bell became the eighth Bulldog this season to notch an interception early in the fourth quarter as the 'Dogs

The 'Dogs added one final score with 8:28 to play in the fourth quarter as McMaryion found Johnson for a 27-yard score to give the Bulldogs a 21-3 lead. Nevada made one last push for the end zone driving the ball 61 yards on 16 plays over five minutes, but the defense stood tall forcing a turnover on downs at the Fresno State 10-yard line with 3:18 left in the game

FRESNO, Calif. - The Fresno State football team defeated Wyoming 27-3 on Saturday evening at Bulldog Stadium to improve to 5-1 on the season and 2-0 in Mountain West play.

Fresno State's defense limited Wyoming to 221 total yards and forced one turnover while the Bulldog offense totaled 391 yards and did not commit a

Senior quarterback Marcus McMarvion accounted Senior quarterback Marcus Memaryion accomined for four total touchdowns in the game, two passing and two rushing. He completed 22-of-32 passes for 287 yards and ran for a season-high 53 yards on seven carries. McMaryion has now accounted for 18 touchdowns this season - 11 passing and seven rushing



Junior tight end Jared Rice had a career-high seven receptions for 94 yards and caught a touchdown while senior wide receiver KeeSean Johnson added five receptions for 51 yards. Sophomore running back Ronnie Rivers added 90 all-purpose yards with 53 yards receiving, 22 yards rushing and 15 punt return yards.

Defensively, junior linebacker Jeff Allison posted his third double-figure tackle performance of the season finishing with 13 tackles. Junior free safety Mike Bell made his second interception of the season and senior defensive end Emeka Ndoh added a tackle for loss and a sack.

How It Happened

Allowing their opponent to score first for only the second time this season, Wyoming opened the game with a 8-play, 47-yard drive that was capped by Cowboy kicker Cooper Rothe nailing a 44-yard field goal to give the visitors a 3-0 lead

From that point forward, the Bulldogs' defense shutout the Cowboys and rolled to 27 consecutive points.

After Fresno State's opening drive was unsuccessful, the Bulldogs' next drive would take two plays as McMaryion found Rice for a 35-yard touchdown pass to take a 6-3 lead. The point after was missed.

The Cowboys outgained the 'Dogs 74-70 in the opening quarter, but the Bulldogs' defense held the Wyoming offense to 44 yards in the second quarter.

The Bulldogs' sole second quarter scoring drive covered 46 yards over 12 plays and five minutes, 48 seconds, that included converting a crucial fourth-and-1 with a three-yard carry by Jordan Mims to keep their drive alive. Three plays later they faced a third-and-13 from the Cowboy 37-yard line and McMaryion found Rice for 16 yards down to the 21-yard line and followed that with a 20-yard connection to Cam Sutton as the junior tight end nearly found the end zone reaching out for the score before being knocked out at the 1-yard line. After three plays of not finding the checkboard, the Bulldogs converted a second fourth down as they scored on fourth-andgoal with McMaryion sneaking it in himself to give Fresno State a 13-3 lead with 52 seconds remaining in the half. The half would close with the 'Dogs holding the 10 point lead.

The Bulldog defense forced Wyoming into negative four yards on its opening offensive drive of the second half and for the third time in the game, the 'Dogs started a drive in Wyoming territory. The Bulldogs proceeded to go on a 6-play, 47-yard drive that was capped with a three-yard touchdown pass from McMaryion to senior tight end David Tangipa to put Fresno State ahead 20-3.

The 'Dogs closed out the scoring for the night on its next offensive drive with a 6-play, 85-yard drive that was finished off with a six-vard touchdown run by McMarvion.

The third quarter was capped off with the 'Dogs forcing their only takeaway of the game as Mike Bell came up with an interception with 29 seconds remaining in the frame.

The Bulldogs had two drives in the final quarter for 71 yards, but were stopped on fourth down and forced to punt as neither side scored in the final quarter, marking the first time since the 'Dogs were at San Diego State in 2017, a span of 12 games, that saw no scoring in the final frame by either team.

ALBUQUERQUE, **N.M.** - Winning its fifth straight game and clinching bowl eligibility for a second straight season, Fresno State rolled to a 38-7 win at Mexico on Saturday evening at Dreamstyle Stadium.

Fresno State (6-1, 3-0 MW) finished with 433 total yards in the contest passing for 280 yards while rushing for 153 yards. The 'Dogs limited New Mexico (3-4, 1-2 MW) to 280 yards as the Lobos nearly evenly split their yards rushing for 148 yards and passing for 132 yards.

Senior quarterback Marcus McMarvion went 20-of-30 for 280 yards while passing for three touchdowns

as it was his fourth straight game with multiple touchdown passes. Senior wide receiver KeeSean Johnson had a career-high 149 receiving yards while matching his season-high with eight receptions and grabbed two touchdown receptions for his second multi-touchdown game of the season. Sophomore running back Ronnie Rivers totaled 146 all-purpose yards and tallied his first career three-touchdown game appearing all over the field for the 'Dogs. Rivers finished with 69 receiving yards, 48 rushing yards and 29 punt return yards, scoring two of his touchdowns on the ground while tacking on one more through the air.

Defensively, junior linebacker Jeff Allison finished with a team-high 10 tackles, eight solo, while junior defensive end Mykal Walker totaled six tackles. Junior free safety Mike Bell gave the 'Dogs their 13th interception of the season, snagging a pick for the third straight game.

How It Happened

Scoring first for the fifth time this season, the Bulldogs matched their opening drive that went scoreless, venturing on an identical 10-play, 44-yard drive that was highlighted by a 26-yard pass from McMaryion to Rivers down to the Lobos 17-yard line. A four-yard rush by Josh Hokit got the 'Dogs down to the 4-yard line, but a false start by the Bulldogs pushed them back to the 9-yard line and a Lobo sack of four yards on third down set up a 30-yard field goal by Fuller to give the 'Dogs a 3-0 lead.

The Bulldogs' defense forced its second-straight three-and-out after picking up its first points of the game on the previous drive, and picked up excellent field position obtaining the ball back at the Lobos' 46-yard line. The Bulldogs made quick work of its next drive as Rivers took home a 16-yard rushing touchdown on the ground to put Fresno State up 10-0 after the PAT.

After the Bulldog defense held the Lobos to 30 total yards and one first down in the first quarter, Fresno State's defense continued to make life difficult for the Lobos as free safety Mike Bell came up with his third interception in as many games to give the 'Dogs the ball back at Lobos 26-yard-line. A 13-yard run by McMaryion put the 'Dogs at the UNM 1-yard line before Rivers ran in his second rushing touchdown of the game to put the 'Dogs ahead 17-0

New Mexico broke up the Bulldogs' shutout bid with 57 seconds remaining in the first half as the Lobos connected on a 16-yard touchdown pass from quarterback Sheriron Jones to wide receiver Elijah Lilly. The touchdown pass finished off a 7-play, 71-yard drive and momentarily cut the Fresno State lead to 17-7

Fresno State wasted little time to counter the Lobos' score before the half, capitalizing on two 15-yard penalties on an 11-yard pass from McMaryion to Rivers. That was followed by a 34-yard touchdown strike from McMaryion to Johnson to extend the 'Dogs lead back to 24-7 with 36 second left to cap a lighting quick 21

With the offense getting the ball to start the second quarter, the 'Dogs continued to roll on offense going on a 14-play, 75-yard drive that consumed 6:28 off the clock as McMaryion found Johnson across the middle for a 15-yard touchdown score which put the Bulldogs up 31-7

Fresno State was again aided by two 15-yard Lobo penalties on the same play on its next drive, quickly racing down the field on an 80-yard, four-play drive that McMaryion capped off by connecting with Rivers for a 23yard pass for his third touchdown pass of the night giving the 'Dogs a 38-7 lead.

FRESNO, Calif. - Fresno State made it six straight wins with a 50-20 Homecoming victory over Hawai'i on Saturday night at Bulldog Stadium. The Bulldogs (7-1, 4-0 MW) totaled a season-high 562 yards of offense passing for 348 yards and rushing for 214 while holding Hawai'i (6-4, 3-2 MW), who came in averaging 34.9 points per game, to their second fewest points scored this season.

Senior wide receiver KeeSean Johnson matched his season-high with eight receptions and had his fourth 100-yard receiving game of the season finishing with a team-high 102 yards. With his final reception of the night, Johnson became the program's all-time receptions leader with 234 passing current Green Bay Packer wide receiver and former Bulldog Davante Adams (2012-13).

Senior quarterback Marcus McMaryion continued his outstanding

play with his fifth straight game with multiple touchdown passes tossing four scores to four different receivers while connecting on 21-of-31 passes for 284 yards. On the ground, sophomore running back Romine Rivers ran for a career-best 125 yards on 11 carries and scored the Bulldogs' lone rushing touchdown with a 76-yard burst in the second quarter

Defensively, the Bulldog defense was led by junior defensive end Mykal Walker who finished with a team-high nine tackles, six solo, 3.5 tackles for loss, one sack and a fumble recovery. The 'Dogs nabbed their 14th interception of the season as junior free safety Juju Hughes made his second interception of the year. The Bulldog defense has now forced 20 turnovers on the season.

Allowing their opponent to score first for the third time this season, Hawai'i got on scoreboard first on an eight-play, 50-yard drive as Rainbow Warriors kicker Ryan Meskell nailed a 43-yard field goal to take a 3-0 lead.

After the Bulldog defense forced a three-and-out on the next Hawai'i offensive drive, Rivers returned a punt eight yards to the Hawai'i 41-yard line and after two rushes by the sophomore running back brought the ball down to the Hawai'i 30-yard line, the game went into a 29-minute delay due to a portion of the stadium lights malfunctioning.

With the game resuming play at 8:30 p.m. PT, the Bulldogs quickly found the end zone two plays later as McMaryion found Rice for a 19-yard touchdown to give the 'Dogs a 7-3 lead.

The Bulldog defense held the Rainbow Warriors to four yards on its next drive, getting the ball back at their own 29-yard line and quickly made their way down the field before McMaryion connected on a 49-yard touchdown pass to Jamire Jordan for the senior wide receiver's first touchdown reception of the season

With the 'Dogs leading 14-3 after the opening quarter, Hawai'i quickly responded with a four-play, 75-yard drive as Hawai'i quarterback Cole McDonald found wide receiver JoJo Ward down the right hash for a 50-yard touchdown to cut the Bulldogs' lead to four.

A game featuring two high-flying offenses, and the offensive fireworks continued on the first play of the next offensive drive as Rivers broke loose for a 76-yard touchdown run, the longest touchdown run by a Bulldog running back since Marteze Waller in 2014, to give the 'Dogs at 21-10 lead. Holding Hawai'i to its hird three-and-out of the game, the 'Dogs quickly got the hall back and went on though straight scoring drive, marching down the field on a seven-play, 52 yard drive as kicker Asa Fuller connected on a 22-yard field goal to extend the lead to 24-10.

The Rainbow Warriors answered back with a nine-play, 65-yard drive that took 4.22 off the clock as Meskell connected on his second field goal of the night making it from 28-yards out to cut Fresno State's lead down to 24-13. The 'Dogs answered back with its fifth straight scoring drive as McMaryion tossed his third touchdown pass of the game with a 21-yard strike to Jordan Mims to complete a nine-play, 74-yard drive and push the Bulldogs 'lead to 30-13.

The Bulldogs completed the barrage of first-half scoring in the final seconds of the second quarter as the Rainbow Warriors' 53-vard field goal attempt came up well short and allowed Jordan to return it from the end zone. After a few key blocks by the Bulldogs, the Lancaster, Calif. native was off to the races for a 100-yard missed field goal return for a touchdown to give the 'Dogs a 37-13 advantage.

Getting the ball to start the third quarter, the 'Dogs scored on a season-high sixth straight drive with a methodical 14-play, 61-yard drive that took 5:05 off the clock as Fuller hit his second field goal of the night making it from 32-yards out to increase the lead to 40-13.

Hughes quickly gave the ball back to the 'Dogs with his second interception of the season returning the ball 31 yards to the Hawai'i 16-yard line to set up another Bulldog touchdown as McMaryion found Derrion Grim for a 6-yard score to make it 23 straight points for the 'Dogs to push their lead to 47-13 (watch).

Fuller added his third field goal of the night, a 21-varder, in the fourth quarter to complete the Bulldog scoring, Hawai'i ended Fresno State's run of 26 straight points with a 27-yard touchdown pass with 1:43 to play in the fourth quarter for the final result, 50-20.
