Headlines

→ Saturday's game will be the 12th meeting all-time between the Bulldogs and Cowboys. The 'Dogs claimed the series' lead 6-5 after defeating the Pokes 13-7 last season.

→ Fresno State opened conference play on the road last week, defeating Nevada 21-3 to start league play with a win for the fifth time in its seven years in the Mountain West.

→ The Bulldog defense kept their opponent out of the end zone for first time since Oct. 21, 2017 (at San Diego State) in their 21-3 win at Nevada. Under Tedford, the Bulldogs have held opponents to single digit scoring five times in 19 games.

→ Fresno State is one of five teams in the FBS to own a streak of double-digit games allowing 30 points or less (Wisconsin-20, Fresno State-16, LSU-16, Clemson-11, Florida State-10).

→ Fresno State is limiting its opponents to a Mountain West-best 15.6 points per game, which also ranks No. 9 in the FBS.

→ Through five games, Fresno State has produced 16 takeaways - which ranks third-most in the country (based on all teams and all games). Of the teams that have played just five games, the next highest total is 13 produced by Utah State.

→ QB Marcus McMaryion's completion percentage (72.0%) ranks 6th in the FBS while only one of the five in front of him have more attempts.

→ WR KeeSean Johnson is a nation leader in consecutive games with at least one reception checking in at 41. He is also the nation's active leader in career receptions with 213.

→ Fresno State was picked to win the West Division in the 2018 preseason poll released by the Mountain West (selected by the media). The predicted championship game pits the Bulldogs against Boise State for a second consecutive year.

Fresno State and Wyoming to meet for the 12th time

Saturday's game will be the 12th meeting all-time between the Bulldogs and Cowboys. The 'Dogs claimed the series' lead 6-5 after defeating the Pokes 13-7 last season.

The 'Dogs are 4-1 all-time when hosting Wyoming with wins in 1992, 1994, 1997 and 2012. Wyoming's most recent trip to Fresno came in 2014 and the Cowboys left with a 45-17 victory.

All but one of the previous 11 meetings between the two teams have come as conference opponents with six coming as members of the WAC (1992-97) and four in the Mountain West (2012-14, 2017). The two teams split the six meetings as members of the WAC with all three wins for the 'Dogs coming at home. Since moving to the MW in 2012, the Bulldogs are 3-1 against Wyoming with a 1-1 mark at Bulldog Stadium and a 2-0 record on the road.

The lone meeting between the two programs as non-conference opponents came in 2009 at the New Mexico Bowl in Albuquerque. The Cowboys topped the 'Dogs 35-28 as Fresno State was in the WAC at the time while the Cowboys were members of the Mountain West. It was the lone meeting between the two programs from 1998-2011.

Scouting the Wyoming Cowboys

Wyoming enters Saturday night's contest in Fresno versus the Bulldogs with a 2-4 overall record and a 0-2 mark in the Mountain West coming off a 17-13 loss on the road at Hawai'i last week. It will be a challenging turnaround for the Cowboys, having played at Hawai'i and remaining on the road for the Bulldogs, but Fresno State faced the same challenge in November last season facing Hawai'i on Nov. 11 with a kickoff temperature of 76 degrees and a week later at Wyoming with a kickoff temperature of 27 degrees.

Under the direction of fifth-year head coach Craig Bohl, the Cowboys have wins on the road at New Mexico State and at home over Wofford this season. Wyoming opened MW play with a 34-14 loss at home to Boise State before narrowly losing on the Island to the Rainbow Warriors as Hawai'i scored the game-winning touchdown with 1:26 to play in the fourth quarter.

Wyoming is currently last (12th in MW/126th nationally) in the MW in total offense averaging 292.5 yards per game with 148.2 yards passing per game (10th/119th) and 144.3 yards rushing per game (9th/97th).

Redshirt freshman quarterback Tyler Vander Waal has passed for 889 yards and three touchdowns in six games. On the ground, senior running back Nico Evans leads the Mountain West and ranks 14th nationally with 612 rushing yards and has added four rushing touchdowns while playing in only four of the Cowboys' six games. Four Wyoming players are over 100 yards receiving this season with senior wide receiver James Price leading the team with 236 receiving yards and with only 12 receptions, his 19.7 yards per reception ranks fifth in the MW and is 28th in the nation.

On the defensive side of the ball, Wyoming ranks sixth in the MW in total defense and scoring defense allowing 372.3 yards and 25.5 points per game. Junior linebacker Logan Wilson has a team-high 51 tackles to go along with 5.5 tackles for loss and a sack. Senior free safety Andrew Wingard, the preseason MW defensive player of the year, has added 48 stops and has one of the Cowboys' four interceptions this season.



Revisiting the 2017 Fresno State-Wyoming matchup

Earmarked as a game that would be a defensive battle, it lived up to the hype as Fresno State outlasted Wyoming 13-7 on a sub-freezing day at War Memorial Stadium on Nov. 18, 2017.

With the win, Fresno State captured its third West Division title in five seasons joining the 2013 and 2014 seasons when the 'Dogs represented the division in MW Championship game.

Fresno State's defense held Wyoming to 175 yards through the first 55 minutes of the game, 308 total yards in the game and won the turnover battle for the seventh time of the season in 11 tries. Linebackers Jeff Allison and George Helmuth each led the defense with 11 tackles and a fumble recovery apiece.

Quarterback Marcus McMaryion passed for 186 yards and a touchdown on 14-of-23 attempts. McMaryion connected with Ronnie Rivers for a 21-yard touchdown pass and Jimmy Camacho tallied a pair of field goals from 27 and 29 yards, respectively. The running back trio of Josh Hokit (69), Jordan Mims (40) and Ronnie Rivers (33) helped sustain drives and bleed the clock throughout the afternoon on 41 carries in a game the Bulldogs possessed the ball 35:52.

'Dogs in Mountain West home openers

- The 'Dogs are 4-2 in MW home openers with wins in 2012, 2013, 2014 and 2017.
- This will be the second latest date the 'Dogs have played their first Mountain West home game (Oct. 14, 2016).
- This will be first time since 2015 (Utah State) the 'Dogs will start conference play at home with a team from the league's Mountain Division.

Fresno State opens conference play with road win

The Bulldogs began their seventh season in the Mountain West last weekend at Nevada, and kicked it off with a 21-3 win. The victory gave the 'Dogs their fifth win in seven seasons to start conference play and was the second win (2-2) doing so on the road.

Fresno State earned the win behind stout defensive play and two touchdowns from sophomore running back Ronnie Rivers on a cold and rainy evening at Mackay Stadium. Holding Nevada to only a field goal in the contest, the Fresno State defense forced three turnovers and limited the Wolf Pack to 3.8 yards per play on offense. Senior quarterback Marcus McMaryion went 20-of-28 passing, completing better than 70 percent of his throws for the fourth time in five games. He racked up 241 yards and tossed two touchdowns.

Defensively, the Bulldogs' linebacker corps was outstanding as junior linebacker Jeff Allison led the way with a career-high 17 tackles, 10 solo, while adding half-a-sack and half-a-tackle. The secondary ripped off three interceptions, with the wealth being spread around with senior cornerback Anthoula Kelly, junior strong safety Juju Hughes and junior free safety Mike Bell tallying one apiece.

Dogs wrap up nonconference schedule 3-1

Fresno State closed its regular season nonconference schedule with three wins for the first time since 2013.

After defeating FCS foe, Idaho, 77-13, the Bulldogs next two matchups were against Power 5 opponents - at Minnesota (Sept. 8) and at UCLA (Sept. 15) - which Fresno State split, and concluded play with a 49-27 win at home against Toledo. Throw out the Bulldogs drubbing of Idaho and the numbers are still stellar against two P5 opponents and a Toledo squad that won the MAC championship a season ago.

Through five games played, Fresno State has had four respective distinctions for conference player of the week awards with quarterback Marcus McMaryion earning offensive player of the week twice, defensive lineman Mykal Walker picking up defensive player of the week and cornerback Jaron Bryant getting special teams player of the week.

McMaryion's second career weekly MW honor came after the Dinuba native accounted for five total touchdowns (4 rush/1 pass) in the 'Dogs' victory over UCLA at the Rose Bowl on Sept. 15. His third career honor came after he accounted for five total touchdowns (4 pass/1 rush) once again on Sept. 29 vs. Toledo becoming the first Bulldog quarterback since Derek Carr in 2013 to account for five total touchdowns in back-back games. In the UCLA win, McMaryion matched the single game program record of four rushing touchdowns in a game by a quarterback joining Mark Barsotti who also accomplished the feat in a 52-22 win over Utah on Sept. 2, 1989.

Walker earned his award for his performance in the Toledo contest as he made his first career interception and returned it 38 yards for a touchdown to become the first Bulldog defensive lineman since Tristan Okpalauugo in 2012 (at Tulsa) to return an interception for a score. In addition to the pick, he finished with four tackles, two solo, a team-high 2.5 tackles for loss, a sack, forced fumble and pass breakup in the win.

Following the season opener, Bryant earned the league's special teams player of the week award after returning two blocked field goals back for touchdowns in the second quarter of Fresno State's 79-13 season-opening win over Idaho. Bryant's first return went 74 yards after a block by Anthoula "Tank Kelly" and the second return went 71 yards as time expired in the second quarter after a block by Mykal Walker. It was the first time in NCAA history a player returned two blocked field goals for touchdowns in the same quarter. It was the first time a Bulldog player returned a blocked field goal for a TD since Isaiah Green did so on Dec. 3, 2011.

Third downs

Fresno State entered its contest against Nevada owning the fifth-best third-down conversion percentage in the FBS having gone 31-of-55 (56.4 percent) through four games. It was nothing but easy against Nevada, who entered that Oct. 6 contest ranked No. 10 in the FBS in third-down conversion defense having allowed opponents to convert only 20-of-75 (26.7 percent) attempts. The Bulldogs had their most disappointing game in that category going 3-of-13 against the Wolf Pack in a game they produced a season-low 271 yards total offense. Consequently, Fresno State faced more situations needing more than 10 yards on its third downs than the previous four games combined. Entering the game against Nevada, Fresno State's offense had not faced a third-and-long since its second drive of the second half at Minnesota (3rd-and-16). Despite the adversity last time out, Fresno State still ranks tied for 13th-best in the FBS in converting third downs as they have gone 34-of-68 (50 percent) after five games.

When the Bulldogs get off to fast starts, they are tough to beat. In the Tedford era, Fresno State is 12-1 when scoring first and 14-1 when holding a halftime lead.

In those 12 wins when they have scored first, Fresno State has outscored its opponents in the first quarter 118-20 in those games.

In five games in 2018, the 'Dogs have scored on the game-opening drive three times while the defense has made life tough for its opponents holding them scoreless in all five games. The 'Dogs opened up games against Idaho, UCLA and Toledo with scoring drives.

Nation Leader: 41 and counting

Since his redshirt freshman season in 2015, senior KeeSean Johnson has been a steady pass catcher for Bulldog quarterbacks - actually the best in that category in program history. The East Palo Alto native has just one game in his entire career where he has gone without a catch - at Ole Miss in 2015 as a redshirt freshman. Since then, Johnson has caught at least one pass in 41 consecutive games. He shares that top spot with Temple's Ventell Bryant, but Johnson's overall productivity leads Bryant's as he owns 213 career receptions in comparison to Bryant's 140. Last season, Johnson surpassed the program's previous leader in consecutive games with a catch, Henry Ellard. Ellard, who was catching passes from Jeff Tedford in 1981-82, held the record previously catching passes in 34-straight games from 1979-82.

East Palo Alto keeping Fresno right

KeeSean Johnson, an East Palo Alto native, has been the Bulldogs' leading receiver over the past two seasons, and is working his way up the Fresno State record books by putting up consistent numbers over the years. He is chasing down fellow East Palo Alto native Davante Adams in the Fresno State record books. Johnson has risen to No. 4 on the program's all-time top 10 list for pass receptions in a career, which is led by Adams. The current Green Bay Packers' wide receiver is also one of three Bulldogs to ever surpass 3,000 yards receiving, another feat Johnson has his sights on. Currently, Johnson is one of 11 pass catchers to hit the 2,000-yard milestone in program history and sits at No. 8 overall with 2,582 yards.

- Johnson owns a team-best 33 receptions and 459 receiving yards in 2018.
- Johnson trails Charlie Jones' receiving yardage record of 3,344 by 762 yards. He would need to average 108.8 yds/gm over seven games, 95.2 yds/gm over eight games or 84.6 yds/gm over nine games to reach the program record.
- Johnson trails Davante Adams' pass reception record of 233 by 20 catches.

Rice racking up the yards

Junior tight end Jared Rice has become an often sought after target for quarterback Marcus McMaryion this season as Rice added three receptions for a career-high 98 yards at Nevada. His 69-yard reception in the third quarter was also his career-best topping his previous longest reception of 65 yards against Incarnate Word in 2017.

On the season, his 19 receptions and 255 receiving yards both rank second on the team behind standout wide receiver KeeSean Johnson.



Dinuba

They call him Dinuba (die-new-bah). Marcus McMaryion, often called Dinuba by his teammates, returned to the Central Valley last season to play for the Bulldogs after three seasons at Oregon State. He was 9-2 as the starter, leading the Bulldogs to an appearance in the MW Championship game and a Hawai'i Bowl victory against Houston after getting his first Bulldog start on Sept. 30, 2017 vs. Nevada. McMaryion accomplished all that after joining the team on Aug. 12, 2017, midway into training camp. He was eligible immediately as a graduate transfer. Now, with a full spring, summer and fall camp under his belt, the sky is the limit.



Since becoming the first Bulldog quarterback to complete better than 60 percent of his passes in a season since Derek Carr (2013) last year, McMaryion is even more accurate in 2018 completing 72.0 percent of his throws, going 108-of-150 over five games.

→ McMaryion's completion percentage (72.0%) ranks 6th in the FBS while only one of the five in front of him have more attempts.
→ McMaryion ranks 26th in the FBS in completions per game (21.6).

Tone Setters

The Bulldogs first campaign under offensive line coach Ryan Grubb was a stellar one. That offensive line allowed just seven sacks over 12 regular season games and 10 sacks total after a conference championship game and bowl game. Amounting to 0.71 sacks allowed per game, which ranked No. 3 in the nation. But in that season, all five Bulldog linemen started all 14 games in 2017.

After losing two offensive linemen to graduation, Fresno State returned three starters with 71 career combined starts (Netane Muti, Christian Cronk, Micah St. Andrew) going into the 2018 season opener ... in doing so, the line tinkered with its lineup to the point that Fresno State joined Western Kentucky and UTSA as the only offensive lines in the nation to start the season with all five position starters each earning their first career starts at their respective position to start 2018 ... the change continued losing Muti to a season-ending achilles injury during the Bulldogs' week two contest at Minnesota. In spite of the constant change, Fresno State has allowed only four sacks in 2018.

Nick Abbs, a transfer from Fresno City College, popped in at left guard for his first career Fresno State starts and Christian Cronk returned to left tackle - a position Cronk lined up and started 26 consecutive games at before the first two games of 2018.

Stingy on third down

When third downs come, Fresno State's defense is at its best whether long or short yardage. The Bulldogs have held opponents to 25.4 percent on the third down this season which ranks fifth in the FBS. Fresno State has allowed 18 conversions on the third down in 2018, the seventh-least nationally.

→ In games 1, 3 and 5, the 'Dogs held opponents to less than 25 percent on third down, winning by a margin of at least 18 points in all three contests.

→ Fresno State held UCLA to a season-best 1-of-10 on third down on Sept. 15.

→ Third-and-short: Fresno State has held opponents to 3-of-11 on third downs when needing two yards or less. Nevada was 0-of-3 on 3rd-and-1's last time out.

Defending the red zone

With opponents cashing in on just 54.5 percent of its trips to the red zone, that percentage that Fresno State's defense has defended ranks No. 1 in the FBS. In total, Fresno State's opponents have reached the red zone 11 times - which ranks as the fifth-fewest trips to the red zone in the FBS.

→ The six scores by opponents in the red zone are the fewest in the FBS.

→ Fresno State has stopped an opponent in the red zone in three of its five games. The Bulldogs held Idaho and Toledo to 1-of-3 on red zone chances.

Stifling Defense

After 19 total games in the Tedford era, the defense has actually been the hallmark of the "quarterback guru's" tenure. Fresno State has allowed opponents to 17.3 points per game under Tedford. Furthermore, the Bulldogs have not allowed an opponent to score 30 or more points since Sept. 16, 2017 at Washington (L, 48-16). Fresno State is one of five teams in the FBS to own a streak of double-digit games allowing 30 points or less.

Don't cross that line

Fresno State did not allow Nevada to score a touchdown and allowed only three points by virtue of a 41-yard field goal in the second quarter in its 21-3 victory. It marked the first time this season that the Bulldog defense kept their opponent out of the end zone and first time overall since Oct. 21, 2017 (at San Diego State). In 2018, Fresno State is limiting its opponents to a Mountain West-best 15.6 points per game, which also ranks No. 9 in the FBS. It was the Bulldogs' first time to hold an opponent to single digits points this season, but they have held their opponents to 14 points or less in three of five games. Under Tedford in his first season guiding the Bulldogs, Fresno State's defense held its opponents to single digits four times, including two shutouts and three times without a TD. Wyoming was one of the four team not to post double-digits against Fresno State in 2017 as they beat the Cowboys 13-7 in Laramie.

The details

Preaching attention to detail and being disciplined, Jeff Tedford's squad ranks in the top 20 in the FBS in fewest penalties (12th - 22), fewest penalties per game (13th - 4.4), fewest penalty yards (10th - 195) and fewest penalty yards per game (12th - 39.00). Fresno State ranks second in the Mountain West in each category.

→ In 2017, the Bulldogs averaged 5.2 penalties per game and 43.6 penalty yards per game.



Manufacturing takeaways

Through five games, Fresno State has produced 16 takeaways - which ranks third-most in the country (based on all teams and all games). Of the teams that have played just five games, the next highest total is 13 produced by Utah State. The Bulldogs' 11 interceptions ranks tied for the second-most in the FBS. The Bulldogs turnover margin ranks tied for second-best in the country having turned the ball over six times - equaling a +2.00 turnover margin.

→ 11 different Bulldogs have accounted for a takeaway this season. Jeff Allison, James Bailey and Patrick Belony have each recorded two takeaways while Tank Kelly leads the team with three.

→ Fresno State has won the turnover battle in three of its five games this season, winning all three games.

Points off turnovers

Fresno State has recorded 69 points off turnovers through five games, a number that has already surpassed season totals from the past three seasons and 20 points away from the 2014 team's 89 point total over 14 games.

→ The Bulldogs had 38 points off turnovers in their contest against Idaho, scoring five touchdowns and a field goal. Looking back, it's the first time since 2013 that the Bulldogs posted 30 or more points off turnovers - having done so against Idaho scoring 35 points off turnovers in that game.

Aerial pursuit

While Fresno State remains one of the top team's in the FBS in takeaways, its strength has been when attacking a team's passing games. The Bulldogs rank tied for No. 2 in the FBS in interceptions with 11. The 'Dogs 2.2 INT's per game rank No. 1 in the nation.

→ Eight different Bulldogs have recorded an interception this season.

→ Six of Fresno State's picks have come from its secondary, three from its linebackers and two from the linemen up front.

Using non-traditional methods

Through five games, Fresno State has scored four touchdowns without the use of its offense, the latest coming by way of a 38-yard pick six by defensive end Mykal Walker against Toledo on Sept. 29. It was the second interception for a touchdown this season after Tank Kelly returned one 39 yards in the season opener versus Idaho. Jaron Bryant also scored twice on blocked field goal returns against the Vandals.

→ The four non-offensive touchdowns is the most for a Bulldog team since recording five in 2013.

A force in the middle

As one of the nation's leading tacklers a season ago with 126, middle linebacker Jeff Allison has continued 2018 where he left off, leading Fresno State with 53 tackles through the first five games - an average of 10.6 per game.

Playing just over half of the season opener, he still led the Bulldogs in tackles, and a week later at Minnesota, Allison was everywhere racking up a career-high 15 tackles, one more than the 14 he produced in Week 2 last year at Alabama. At UCLA, Allison was one tackle short of leading the team once again with six. He returned to leading the team in tackles in week four with nine versus Toledo and again at Nevada with a new career-high 17 tackles, his second double-digit game of the season.

→ In 19 career starts, Allison has led the Bulldogs in tackles 12 times. He has collected 10 or more tackles on eight occasions.

→ Allison ranks fourth in the MW in tackles per game at 10.6, good for 20th in the FBS.

→ He began the season on both the Bednarik (top defensive player) and Butkus (top linebacker) Award watch lists.

Shutdown senior

Anthoula "Tank" Kelly has been everything that his name entails through the first five games of 2018. The senior cornerback has been a destructive force thus far providing big hits, big plays and has locked down opposing receivers. Kelly leads the Mountain West and the FBS in passes defended with 12 after recording four at Nevada on Oct. 6. He ranks fourth in the FBS with three interceptions.

→ The 5-foot-10 defensive back has three interceptions, one blocked field goal and one forced fumble on the year. The Bulldogs have scored 21 points off of the fifth-year senior's big plays.

→ Kelly's 83 INT return yards is the 11th-most in the FBS.

→ Kelly has recorded three firsts in his Bulldog career this season: return an interception for a touchdown, block a field goal and force a fumble.

Defensive legacy

In his first season on the field for the Bulldogs, junior Mykal Walker is making an immediate impact where his father Michael once played (1985-86). Through five games, the younger Walker is already creating his own legacy at defensive end. The 6-foot-3, 220-pound athlete has been all over the field for the Bulldogs as he leads all Mountain West defensive linemen in tackles with 26 (5.2 per game). His 15 solo stops is second among the league's defensive linemen.

→ Walker ranks third in the MW and 15th in the FBS in forced fumbles with two.

→ In his first game in a Bulldog uniform, Walker blocked a field that was returned for a touchdown.

→ Against Toledo, Walker became the first Bulldog defensive lineman to return an interception for a touchdown since Tristan Okpalaugo on Sept. 22, 2012.

Flipping field position

One of the Bulldogs' key assets through five games has been punter Blake Cusick. The junior has placed 14 of his 25 punts inside the opponents' 20-yard line, with just four punts returned for a total of 16 yards.

→ Has placed nine punts inside the opponents' 10-yard line.

→ Booted a career-long 72-yarder vs. Nevada. Seven total have gone for 50-plus yards.

→ Fresno State ranks first in the Mountain West in net punting at 40.5 yards.

→ Through five games, Cusick has an average of 43.6 yards per punt which ranks third in the Mountain West.



Conference preseason predictions

The 'Dogs were predicted to finish first in the West Division of the Mountain West in the 2018 MW preseason poll and are coming off winning the West Division in 2017 after going 7-1 in conference play. It was the fourth time in six years the 'Dogs have won their division or a share of the Mountain West title since moving to the league in 2012.

→ The Bulldogs have been predicted to win their division twice before being picked to repeat as West Division champs in 2018. Previously when the 'Dogs were picked to represent the West in the MW Championship Game in 2013 and 2014, they did just that.

Much different from a year ago, the Fresno State football team was picked to win the West Division by the media, announced by the Mountain West on Tuesday morning prior to the 2018 media summit getting underway at the Cosmopolitan of Las Vegas.

Fresno State turned the 2017 predicted order of finish upside down after being picked to finish last with a 10-4 run and a West Division crown guided by then-first year head coach Jeff Tedford. Now, the Bulldogs will make its run for a second-straight appearance in the MW Championship game as the favorite in Tedford's sophomore season.

This is the third time in six seasons (2013, 2014 and 2018) the Bulldogs have been the favorite to win the West since the inception of the divisional format instituted by the league to start the 2013 season. In the previous two occasions the Bulldogs were picked the win the West in the league's preseason poll, Fresno State carried out that forecast each time.

In addition to the predicted order of finish, the 2018 All-Mountain West Preseason Football Team was announced. This year's team included two Fresno State selections in senior wide receiver KeeSean Johnson and junior linebacker Jeff Allison. Johnson was a 2017 second-team All-MW pick while Allison was the Bulldogs' sole first-team selection a season ago.

JEFF TEDFORD

HEAD COACH**2ND SEASON | FRESNO STATE (1992)**

Jeff Tedford, 56, was named the 19th head football coach in Fresno State history on Nov. 10, 2016. He enters his second season after engineering one of the greatest turnarounds in FBS history in his first year back in the Valley.

With a 10-4 record in his first season, Fresno State became the second team in FBS history to turn a double-digit loss season (2016) into a double-digit win season (2017) the following year. The season included an appearance in the nation's top 25, clinching the Mountain West's West Division crown and leading the 'Dogs to their first appearance in the MW Championship Game since 2014. He also guided the 'Dogs to the program's first bowl victory since 2007 with their win at the Hawai'i Bowl.

Great success brought great notoriety as Tedford was named the 2017 Mountain West Coach of the Year, was a semifinalist for the George Munger College Coach of the Year Award presented by the Maxwell Football Club, a finalist for the Eddie Robinson Coach of the Year Award presented on behalf of the Football Writers Association of America in conjunction with the Allstate Sugar Bowl, and the AFCA Region-5 Coach of the Year.

While Tedford was honored as the league's coach of the year, the team had 16 student-athletes recognized with MW postseason honors - the most for the Bulldogs in a single-season since joining the conference in 2012. In the classroom, the 'Dogs also set a team-best number since joining the conference as they had 24 named to the Fall Academic All-Mountain West team.

Tedford, a former Bulldog quarterback and Fresno State assistant coach, returned to the Valley after holding the position of offensive consultant for the Washington Huskies - a 2016 College Football Playoff team.

Tedford assumed the role of acting head coach on Nov. 27, following the conclusion of the 2016 season as interim head coach Eric Kiesau carried out his duties for the remaining two games following Tedford's introduction.

Tedford, who is a proven winner on the West Coast, came to the Valley with 11 years of head coaching experience at the Division I level - having led the California Golden Bears to 82 wins from 2002-2012. He left as the school's all-time winningest coach.

Tedford's ties to the Valley and Fresno State run deep. He played quarterback at Fresno State in 1981-82 under Jim Sweeney and coached at Fresno State under Sweeney from 1987-88 and 1992-96, and under a then-first-year head coach Pat Hill in 1997.

Tedford's coaching career started at Fresno State, volunteering as an assistant for the 1987-88 seasons. From there he picked up his first full-time position as an assistant for the Calgary Stampeders of the Canadian Football League - a familiar league in which he played quarterback for six seasons after his collegiate career at Fresno State.

He returned to Fresno State in 1992 as the quarterbacks coach and served as the offensive coordinator for the Bulldogs over the ensuing five seasons.

Tedford held the same position at Oregon (1998-2001) before he became the head coach at Cal. He was named the Pac-10 Coach of the Year twice, leading the Golden Bears to a school record seven consecutive bowl games and to a conference title in 2006.

Following Tedford's stint at Cal, he moved on to the NFL in 2014 as the Tampa Bay Buccaneers' offensive coordinator. The stop did not last long due to health issues during the preseason that evolved into an indefinite leave of absence, which resulted in the two sides mutually agreeing to part ways.

Tedford made his return to the CFL in 2015 as he was named the head coach of the B.C. Lions. At the conclusion of the season, Tedford elected to exercise an option in his contract to resign and pursue opportunities in college football.

Tedford made his return to college football as an offensive consultant for the Washington Huskies under head coach Chris Peterson in 2016. A relationship rekindled after their time together as assistants at Oregon under then-coach Mike Belotti. Washington's staff also included associate head coach Bob Gregory, who served as Tedford's defensive coordinator at Cal for eight seasons.

Tedford graduated from Warren High School in Downey, California and attended Cerritos Junior College for two seasons before becoming the Bulldogs' quarterback in 1981.

He and his wife Donna have two children, Taylor and Quinn.

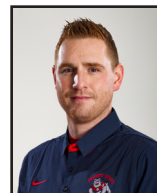

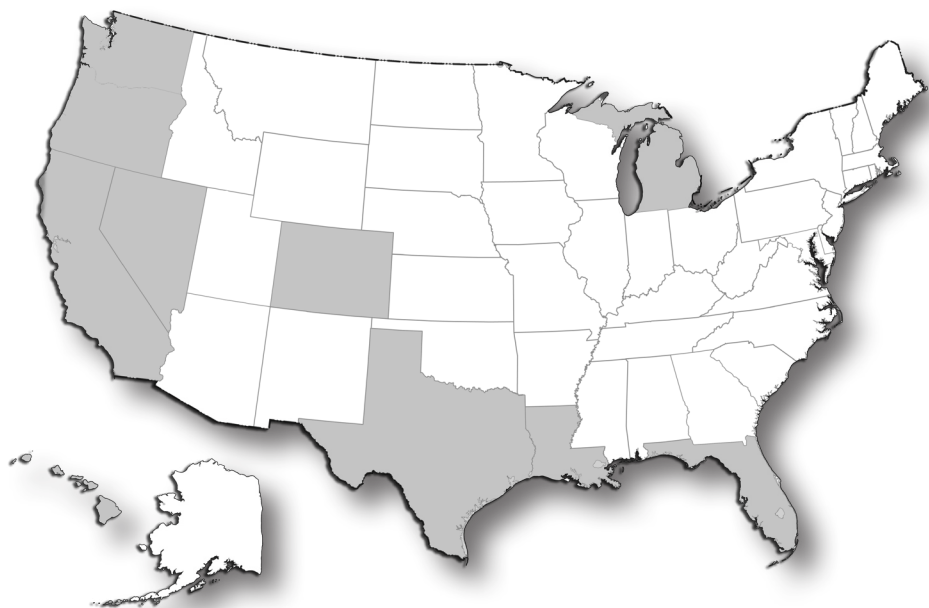

FRESNO, Calif. - Scoring its most points since 1991 using five interceptions, two special teams returns for touchdowns and one pick-six, the Fresno State football team rolled to a 79-13 season-opening rout of the Idaho Vandals on Saturday night at Bulldog Stadium.

Fresno State (1-0) scored its most points in 27 years using a balanced offensive approach passing for 247 yards while rushing for 239 and seven scores on the ground.

Senior quarterback Marcus McMaryion had an efficient passing night going 19-for-26 for 207 yards. The 'Dogs used a balanced attack on the ground as five running backs each went for better than 35 yards with Romello Harris leading the way with 47 followed by Saevion Johnson (45), Deonte O'Neal (41), Josh Hokit (40) and Jordan Mims (36). Mims led the group with three touchdowns.

Senior wide receiver KeeSean Johnson tallied his sixth career 100-yard receiving game going for 118 yards on six receptions while extending his consecutive games with a reception streak to a nation-leading 37 games.

Defensively, junior linebacker Jeff Allison led the team with six tackles while senior cornerback Tank Kelly had a pair of interceptions, one returned for a touchdown, five tackles and three pass breakups. Junior defensive tackle Jasad Haynes had five tackles, three tackles for loss, a sack and a forced fumble while Jaron Bryant returned two blocked field goals for touchdowns.

How It Happened

The Bulldogs got the scoring started on their first offensive series of the contest going on an 11-play, 56-yard drive that saw McMaryion complete five of six passes for 42 yards connecting on passes to three different receivers, including three to junior tight end Jared Rice.

Facing a 3rd-and-5 from the Idaho 27, McMaryion connected on back-to-back passes for nine and 11 yards, respectively, to Rice getting the 'Dogs down to the Vandals 7. A six-yard gain by O'Neal got the Bulldogs on the doorstep of Idaho's goal line setting up a one-yard touchdown plunge by Mims.

After forcing the Vandals' to a second straight three-and-out, the 'Dogs took over at their own 20-yard line and marched down the field on a 12-play, 80-yard drive as the 'Dogs found little resistance from the Idaho defense. Faced with a 3rd-and-16 at their own 26, McMaryion found Johnson down the middle of the field for a 19 yard gain.

An 11-yard connection from Johnson and McMaryion on a 3rd-and-1 kept the drive alive and got the 'Dogs down to the Vandals' 28 and two plays later, the 'Dogs capitalized with a 26-yard scamper through the left side by O'Neal for his second career rushing touchdown.

The 'Dogs defense continued to wreck havoc as Haynes forced his first career fumble setting up the Bulldog's offense at the Idaho 19. After compiling 136 yards of offense on its first two drives, the Bulldog offense was only able to move four yards on its third drive setting up a 33-yard field goal by redshirt freshman kicker Asa Fuller who made his first career field goal to give the 'Dogs a 16-0 lead.

Holding the Vandals to negative 16 yards of offense on its first two drives, Idaho needed only two plays to drive 75 yards as quarterback Mason Petrino found wide receiver Jeff Cotton down the sideline for 73 yards to break up the 'Dogs shutout bid. The Vandals bobbled the PAT attempt as the Bulldogs led 16-6 with five seconds remaining in the first quarter.

Fresno State carried its hot offense into the second quarter going on a 7-play, 75-yard drive passing for 39 yards and running for 36 yards as Mims punched in his second touchdown run with a 12-yard scamper up the middle to extend the 'Dogs lead to 23-6.

The Vandals put together their most substantial drive of the game to that point with a 10-play, 46-yard drive down to the Bulldog 26 setting up a 36-yard field goal attempt by Cade Coffey, but Kelly broke through line blocking Coffey's kick as Bryant picked it up and returned it 74 yards putting the Bulldogs up 30-6.

The 'Dogs defense continued to pour it as Kelly picked off his second pass of the game stepping in front of a Petrino pass and returned it 39 yards for a touchdown to push the lead to 37-6.

Idaho made one final push to score in the first half going on a 9-play, 43-yard drive down to the Bulldog 22 to set up a 39-yard attempt by Coffey with one second remaining in the half. The 'Dogs special teams again came up clutch as redshirt junior Mykal Walker broke through the line for the block and was picked up by Bryant for 71 yards as Fresno State took a commanding 44-6 lead into halftime.

The Bulldogs added two touchdowns in the third quarter, a two-yard run by Mims and a 33-yard pass from Jorge Reyna to Derrion Grim (watch) on his first career attempt to take a 58-6 lead. The Vandals scored once more in the game in the third frame, a six-yard run by Isaiah Saunders to make it 58-13 in favor of the 'Dogs.

Fresno State completed the scoring with three more touchdowns in the fourth quarter as a pair of 'Dogs scored their first career touchdowns. S. Johnson had a five-yard plunge up the middle followed by a 27-yard run by Harris before S. Johnson found the end zone one more time with a one-yard run.

MINNEAPOLIS - The Fresno State football team lost a heartbreaker at Minnesota on Saturday evening, falling 21-14 at TCF Bank Stadium.



After converting a fourth-and-3 from the Minnesota 10-yard line, Fresno State was set up with first-and-goal from the Golden Gopher 4-yard line with 1:24 remaining in the game. The 'Dogs pulled a play out of the book from 2017, a halfback pass attempt from Josh Hokit to try and knot the game. But this one, intended for tight end Jared Rice in the back of the end zone, was intercepted by Minnesota defensive back Antoine Winfield Jr. to dash the Bulldogs' hopes of winning their first game on Big Ten soil since defeating Illinois 53-52 in 2009.

Fresno State was stymied for much of the first half by the Gophers' defense, totaling 104 yards offense, but came alive in the second half. Entering the third quarter trailing 10-0, the Bulldogs scored two touchdowns in the second half and took a one-point lead in the fourth quarter, 14-13. Minnesota regained the lead with 3:28 left in the contest and it proved to be enough to win the game.

Fresno State senior quarterback Marcus McMaryion went 23-of-32 through the air for 205 yards with a pair of touchdowns and his first interception of the season while adding 15 yards on the ground. Sophomore running back Jordan Mims led the 'Dogs rushing attack with 41 yards on 10 carries. The Bulldogs rushed for 87 yards as a team. On the receiving end, senior wide receiver KeeSean Johnson led the team with six receptions for 89 yards and a touchdown while Rice added five catches for 31 yards and a score.

Defensively, junior linebacker Jeff Allison had a career-high 15 tackles while junior safety Mike Bell chipped in a career-best 11 tackles, including five solo. The Bulldog defense did force one turnover in the third quarter as senior cornerback Tank Kelly forced a fumble that was recovered by senior defensive lineman Patrick Belony. The Bulldogs manufactured their first points of the game off that turnover.

How It Happened

Minnesota started the scoring on its second offensive drive by manufacturing a lengthy 14-play, 80-yard drive that ran 7:17 off the clock. Gopher redshirt sophomore Seth Green punched the ball in from one-yard out to give Minnesota a 7-0 lead.

Facing its first deficit of the season, the 'Dogs looked to get its offense going, but McMaryion threw his first interception of the season on the ensuing possession to give Minnesota the ball back at the Bulldogs' 41-yard line.

The 'Dogs defense came up big allowing only one yard after that turnover and nearly had a turnover of their own as Allison snagged a pass attempt on third-and-9, but was unable to stay in bounds. Minnesota finished the half with a 10-play, 55-yard drive that ended with a 53-yard field goal by Emmit Carpenter to take a 10-0 lead into the locker room.

After the teams traded punts to start the second half, the Bulldogs defense produced their first turnover of the game deep in the Gophers' own territory. Anthoula Kelly forced the fumble and Patrick Belony pounced on top of it to spark the Bulldogs' offense. Fresno State took advantage going on a four-play, 17-yard drive to score with 20 seconds remaining in the third quarter to pull within three, 10-7. Rice capped the drive with a one-yard touchdown catch from McMaryion.

Carpenter added his second 50-plus yard field goal of the game (50 yards) to put Minnesota ahead 13-7 before a quick strike by the 'Dogs gave Fresno State its lone lead of the game.

The 'Dogs went on a five-play, 75-yard drive that was capped by McMaryion connecting with Johnson for 45 yards to push the 'Dogs in the lead, 14-13.

The lead was short-lived as the Gophers, as they did all game, pounded the ball on the ground for a 10-play, 74-yard drive that ate up 4:52 off the clock. Green ran in from three yards out and after a successful two-point conversion, the Gophers held a 21-14 lead. The drive was kept alive after a 13-yard completion along the sideline on a third-and-nine by a scrambling Zack Annexstad in Minnesota territory. That was followed by a 15-yard sideline infraction penalty called on Fresno State to set the Gophers up at the Bulldogs' 28-yard line.

Facing a fourth-and-3 from the Gophers 10-yard line, McMaryion found Justin Allen for six yards and a first down to extend the game, but after a timeout, the Gophers came up with the play that seal the game.

PASADENA, Calif. - Led by senior quarterback Marcus McMaryion's five total touchdowns on Saturday night at the Rose Bowl, the Fresno State football team defeated UCLA 38-14 in front of 60,867 fans with a large contingent being the Red Wave that filled up the visitors section in the southeast endzone. The Bulldogs closed the game with 22-answered points during the final 24 minutes to earn their third-straight win over the Bruins to the delight of the fans that made the trip.

With four touchdowns on the ground, McMaryion became just the second Fresno State quarterback to rush for four touchdowns in a game - joining Mark Barsotti's feat in 1989. McMaryion finished 22-of-33 passing for 270 yards and added a 10-yard touchdown pass to senior tight end Kyle Riddering. Nine different 'Dogs caught a pass from McMaryion with senior KeeSean Johnson registering a team-leading eight receptions for 85 yards as the senior caught his 200th career pass becoming only the fifth Bulldog receiver to join the 200 career reception club. The Bulldogs totaled 420 yards of offense adding 150 yards on the ground rushing the ball 52 times as sophomore Jordan Mims tied his career-best with 21 carries on his way to 85 rushing yards.

The Fresno State defense was again stingy, forcing four UCLA turnovers while limiting the Bruins to 270 yards of offense with 151 yards through the air and 119 yards on the ground. Junior safety Mike Bell had a team-high seven tackles, five solo, adding two pass breakups and tackle for loss. Junior linebacker Jeff Allison snagged his first two career interceptions while getting in on six tackles. The 'Dogs also forced a pair of UCLA fumbles that were recovered by Patrick Belony and James Bailey.

How It Happened

Fresno State got its offense going from the outset as the 'Dogs received the opening kickoff and went on a 13-play, 75-yard drive that burned 4:57 off the clock as McMaryion ran in a one-yard touchdown run (watch) to cap the drive. The 'Dogs converted all three third downs on the opening drive while being balanced with 39 yards rushing and passing for 36 yards, including a pair of passes to Johnson for 19 yards.

After holding UCLA to 17 yards on five plays on their first offensive possession, the Bulldogs got the ball back and continued their hot offense with a 8-play, 75-yard drive that was finished by McMaryion finding Riddering down the left hash (watch) to put the 'Dogs ahead 13-0.

For a second straight week, Belony recovered an opponent's fumble as the senior defensive tackle hopped on a Bruins' botched snap at the UCLA 38-yard line (watch). The 'Dogs offense continued to hum along going down the field on a 6-play, 27-yard drive that finished with a 28-yard field goal by Asa Fuller (watch) to extend the 'Dogs lead to 16-0. The Bulldog offense finished the first quarter with 147 yards of offense while UCLA only countered with 38 yards, but the roles reversed in the second quarter as the 'Dogs were held to 30 yards and UCLA churned out 122 yards.

The Bruins took advantage of forcing a McMaryion fumble to strike quickly on a 45-yard touchdown pass from quarterback Dorian Thompson-Robinson to wide receiver Theo Howard, but that would be all the scoring for the Bruins the first half.

The Bulldogs took a 16-7 lead into the locker room at halftime and UCLA continued to take advantage of Fresno State miscues early in the second half. A botched punt return by Johnson set UCLA up at the Bulldogs' 17-yard line. The Bruins' capped the short scoring drive with a two-yard touchdown run by Bolu Olorunfunmi to cut the 'Dogs lead to 16-14 with 12:59 left in the third quarter.

Fresno State's offense got back to firing as it was in the first quarter halfway through the third quarter, closing the game with 22-answered points over the final 24 minutes. It started with an 8-play, 73-yard drive that was punctuated by a one-yard touchdown run by McMaryion (watch), his second of the game, and a successful two-point conversion pass from Jorge Reyna to Gunner Javernick (watch) to put the Bulldogs out front, 24-14, at the 6:19 mark in the third.

The defense played its part in the Bulldogs' late explosion as Allison snagged his first career interception to put the Bulldogs' offense at the 49-yard line (watch) to start their next scoring drive. The 'Dogs used a 5-play, 51-yard drive that was capped by McMaryion's third rushing score of the night, a one-yard plunge (watch), that put the 'Dogs up 31-14 with 3:43 to play in the third quarter.

Allison kept the 'Dogs defensive pressure up and grabbed his second interception of the game (watch) on the Bruins' next offensive possession. The Bulldogs made it three straight scoring drives capped by a McMaryion touchdown, this time a two-yard score (watch) that proved to be the final score of the game as Fresno State walked out of the Rose Bowl with a 38-14 win.

Toledo - Jamal Hines (1-4-0)

FRESNO, Calif. - Using a run of 42 unanswered points, Fresno State overcame an early 13-7 deficit to roll to a convincing 49-27 win over Toledo on Saturday evening at Bulldog Stadium.

Fresno State, who finished nonconference play with a 3-1 record, accounted for a season-high 554 yards of offense in the contest with 368 yards through the air and 186 yards rushing.

After picking up the offensive player of the week award after his last performance against UCLA accounting for five total touchdowns, senior quarterback Marcus McMaryion produced five more scores, tossing a season-high four through the air while running for one on the ground. McMaryion completed 24-of-31 passes for 368 yards, the most by a Bulldog quarterback since Derek Carr passed for 404 against Utah State on Dec. 7, 2013. McMaryion also became the first quarterback since Carr in 2013 (New Mexico and San Jose State) to account for five touchdowns in back-to-back games.

Sophomore running back Jordan Mims made a career-high six receptions for 126 yards and became the first Bulldog running back since Paris Gaines on Dec. 31, 2000 to account for 100 or more receiving yards in a game. Senior wide receiver KeeSean Johnson added six catches for 102 yards and two touchdowns for his seventh career 100-yard game and sixth career multi-score contest.

On the ground, Mims and junior running back Josh Hokit each accounted for 59 yards as the 'Dogs ran the ball 38 times in the game for an average of 4.9 yards per carry.

Defensively, junior linebacker Jeff Allison led the team in tackles for the third time this season making nine stops in the game. Senior defensive back Anthoula Kelly made a career-high seven tackles while accounting for three of the Bulldogs' five pass breakups in the game while junior defensive end Mykal Walker returned a 38-yard interception for a touchdown (watch), a sack, 2.5 tackles for loss and a pass breakup.

How It Happened

For a third time this season, the 'Dogs took their first offensive drive for a touchdown going on a 12-play, 75-yard journey down the field that ended with a four-yard touchdown run by Mims (watch). McMaryion went a perfect 7-of-7 for 58 yards connecting with five different teammates as junior tight end Cam Sutton made his first career reception with an 18-yard gain.

After being held to six yards and a three-and-out on its first drive, Toledo wasted little time responding with a 10-play, 75-yard drive that finished with a 19-yard touchdown pass from Rockets' quarterback Mitchell Guadagni to running back Shakif Seymour.

With the total yardage at 98 yards for each side and the score tied 7-7 after the opening quarter, Toledo opened the second quarter with a 36-yard run by Guadagni followed by a 15-yard personal foul penalty that sent the Rockets down to the Bulldog 30. The Bulldogs' defense held strong from that point, holding Toledo to a 46-yard field goal by Jameson Vest that gave the Rockets' a 10-7 lead.

With the Bulldogs trailing for the first time since Sept. 8 at Minnesota, McMaryion found Johnson on a bubble screen that he took upfield for 24 yards before McMaryion was intercepted for only the second time this season as Toledo defensive tackle Reggie Howard batted McMaryion's arm to force the ball in the air and into the awaiting arms of defensive end Jamal Hines.

It did not end in six points, but Toledo took advantage of the 'Dogs miscue connecting on a 43-yard field goal by Vest that extended the Rockets' lead to 13-7.

The 'Dogs responded to the Rockets' pair of field goals in a hurry with a 6-play, 76-yard drive in 1:43 to re-gain a one-point advantage, 14-13. McMaryion found Mims who scampered for 55 yards after a short pass, and on the ensuing play connected with Johnson on a seven-yard bubble screen that he took to the end zone to push the Bulldogs ahead.

One three-and-out later forced by the Bulldog defense, allowed McMaryion to guide the offense to a 6-play, 78-yard drive that featured a season-long 21-yard run by Hokit and a 36-yard flip from McMaryion to Jamir Jordan that was finished off by a two-yard touchdown toss from McMaryion to senior tight end Kyle Riddering to put the 'Dogs ahead 21-13.

The defense again made life tough for the Rockets as junior defensive end Kwami Jones came up with his first sack of the season that forced the Rockets to punt, which was returned by Ronnie Rivers for 18 yards as the sophomore running back made his season debut.

The next Fresno State score was set up by McMaryion finding Mims out of the backfield down the right sideline for a 47-yard touchdown that gave the 'Dogs their third straight touchdown and pushed the lead to 28-13.

After gaining 346 yards of offense in the first half with 286 yards coming through the air and 60 yards on the ground, the 'Dogs opened the second half and put together a 6-play, 75-yard drive that ended with a 12-yard touchdown pass from McMaryion to Johnson in the left corner of the end zone to push the 'Dogs lead to 35-13.

On the drive, McMaryion went 3-for-3 for 64 yards finding Johnson for a 39-yard connection that pushed him into eighth all-time in program history in receiving yards passing Isaiah Burse (2010-13).

The 'Dogs added two more touchdowns in the third quarter as Walker's 38-yard interception return was the Bulldogs' fourth non-offensive return for a touchdown this season and was the second interception returned for a touchdown this season by a Bulldog.

McMaryion added his fifth touchdown of the game with a six-yard rush to 2:48 to play in the third quarter to give the 'Dogs a 49-13 lead (watch). Toledo added two fourth quarter touchdowns as Eli Peters connected with Jon'Vea Johnson for a 54-yard score followed by a 24-yard score.

RENO, Nev. - Behind stout defense from the Bulldogs and two touchdowns from sophomore running back Ronnie Rivers, Fresno State defeated Nevada 21-3 in its Mountain West opener on Saturday evening at Mackay Stadium.

Holding Nevada to only a field goal in the contest, the Fresno State defense forced three turnovers and limited the Wolf Pack to 3.8 yards per play on offense.

Senior quarterback Marcus McMaryion went 20-of-28 passing, completing better than 70 percent of his throws for the fourth time in five games. He racked up 241 yards and tossed two touchdowns.



The beneficiary to each of McMaryion's touchdown throws were senior wide receiver KeeSean Johnson (27-yard TD) and Rivers (19-yard TD). Johnson had a team-high seven receptions for 65 yards and a touchdown while Rivers' TD grab was his sole reception on the evening. Junior tight end Jared Rice tallied a team-high and career-high 98 yards on three receptions which included a career-long 69-yard reception.

Defensively, the 'Dogs linebacker corps was outstanding as junior linebacker Jeff Allison led the way with a career-high 17 tackles, 10 solo, while adding half-a-sack and half-a-tackle. Senior linebacker George Helmuth added 11 tackles, 1.5 tackles for loss and 0.5 sack and fellow senior James Bailey tacked on 10 tackles, 2.5 tackles for loss and one sack.

The secondary ripped off three interceptions, with the wealth being spread around with senior cornerback Anthoula Kelly, junior strong safety Juju Hughes and junior free safety Mike Bell tallying one apiece.

How It Happened

With neither team able to generate much offense in the early going, the game was scoreless after the opening quarter. The 'Dogs edged the Wolf Pack in total yards, 73-58.

With the ball at the Nevada 30-yard line and a fresh set of downs to open the second quarter, Fresno State finished their first scoring drive with McMaryion finding Rivers in the flat for a 19-yard touchdown pass to cap a nine play, 69-yard drive that spanned four minutes, nine seconds.

Nevada responded to the Bulldogs' touchdown drive with an 11-play, 51-yard drive that resulted in a 41-yard field goal by Wolf Pack kicker Ramiz Ahmed to cut the 'Dogs lead to 7-3. Nevada converted a key 4th-and-2 with a 13-yard rush by quarterback Christian Solano which helped set up the Wolf Pack's only scoring drive of the night.

Later in the second quarter, Kelly intercepted Solano and returned it 43 yards to the Wolf Pack 11 for his third interception of the season. Unfortunately for the 'Dogs, a play later McMaryion's pass to Jamire Jordan was jarred loose from Jordan causing the 'Dogs only turnover on Saturday.

Hughes made it two Bulldog interceptions over the final 2:35 of the first half by picking off Solano on a 3rd-and-10 with 11 seconds remaining in the half to end the threat of a Wolf Pack score. Fresno State held a 7-3 lead heading into the locker room at the break.

Limited to only 125 yards of offense to that point, the 'Dogs broke out on its second offensive drive of the third quarter as McMaryion found Rice for a 69-yard reception, taken down at the Nevada 11 to ultimately set up the Bulldogs' next score. Nevada wouldn't make it easy for Fresno State as they were able to convert a 4th-and-1 from the Nevada 2 to increase the lead to 14-3. Rivers delivered the score with his second touchdown of the night punching it in on fourth down.

Bell became the eighth Bulldog this season to notch an interception early in the fourth quarter as the 'Dogs defense continued to wreak havoc on Nevada.

The 'Dogs added one final score with 8:28 to play in the fourth quarter as McMaryion found Johnson for a 27-yard score to give the Bulldogs a 21-3 lead. Nevada made one last push for the end zone driving the ball 61 yards on 16 plays over five minutes, but the defense stood tall forcing a turnover on downs at the Fresno State 10-yard line with 3:18 left in the game.
