Headlines

- → Fresno State will play in its fourth Mountain West Championship game in the six seasons that the game has existed. The Bulldogs will square off against the Broncos for the third time in that span.
- → The Bulldogs won the MW Championship game over Utah State at home in 2013, and fell to Boise State in the title game on the road in 2014 and 2017.
- → Despite matching records, the MW Championship game is being held in Boise by virtue of the head-to-head tie-breaker. Boise State defeated Fresno State 24-17 in Boise earlier this season on Nov. 9.
- → Saturday's Fresno State-Boise State contest will be the fourth game between the two schools over the last 371 days. The combined score over the last three games is Fresno State 59, Boise State 58. The Bulldogs are 1-2 in those games.
- → The 2018 Mountain West Championship game will be between the two teams predicted to play one another in the preseason.
- → The MW Championship game will feature two ranked teams for the first time in the six-year history of the game.
- → The MWC game pits two of the 14 FBS teams that own double-digit wins in 2018.
- → Fresno State earned its 10th win last week, marking back-to-back double-digit win seasons for the 'Dogs. It is the second time in program history that feat was accomplished (1988-89).
- → Fresno State is back in both the AP Top 25 (#25) and Amway Coaches (#23) poll at the same time for the first time since falling to Boise State on Nov. 9 when it was ranked No. 16/17.
- → The Bulldogs faced seven bowl eligible teams in 2018 and were 5-2 in those games.
- → Junior linebacker Jeff Allison was named the 2018 MW Defensive Player of the Year on Wednesday, Nov. 28 (a full list of the 2018 All-MW selections can be found on page 19).

Dogs and Broncos meet for fourth time in last two seasons; 22nd time overall

For the fourth time in the last 371 days, Fresno State will face Boise State having played two regular season contests and now a second consecutive matchup for the Mountain West Championship, over the course of the 2017 and 2018 seasons.

It will be the third consecutive contest against Boise State on the road for Fresno State with the last pairing in Fresno on Nov. 25, 2017.

The 'Dogs trail the all-time series 15-6 and are 1-10 in Boise. The Bulldogs' lone win on the road came in their first-ever trip to Boise, a 37-21 win on Sept. 8, 1984, two years prior to the blue turf being introduced for the first time. (The 'Dogs' first game on the blue was in 2002).

Matching up as conference opponents for 17 of the 21 previous meetings, Fresno State and Boise State were both members of the WAC for 10 games (2001-10) and the Mountain West for the last five regular season conference games and the 2014 and 2017 Mountain West championship games.

After winning the series' first three games (1977, 1984 & 1996), the 'Dogs have won three of the last 18 meetings, with all three wins at home (2005, 2013 & 2017).

Earlier this season, the Bulldogs jumped out to a 17-3 lead in the team's regular season meeting in Boise on Nov. 9 before the Broncos reeled off 21 unanswered points to pull out a 24-17 win and hand the 'Dogs their lone Mountain West loss of the 2018 season.

The two teams split a pair of meetings in 2017 with the 'Dogs winning at home in the regular season finale, 28-17, before the teams met seven days later in Boise in the Mountain West championship game as the Broncos squeezed out a 17-14 win.

Déjà vu

For the second consecutive season and the third time in five seasons, Fresno State will travel to Boise State for the Mountain West championship game.

The Bulldogs and Broncos met in both 2014 and 2017 at Albertsons Stadium in the MW title game with Boise State edging the 'Dogs in both contests winning 28-14 in 2014, and 17-14 last season.

The 'Dogs and Broncos three meetings in the last five conference championship games are the most of any conference in the nation over that stretch. The Big Ten (Ohio State/Wisconsin, 2014 & '17), Pac-12 (Stanford/USC, 2015 & '17), SEC (Florida/Alabama, 2015 & '16), MAC (Bowling Green/Northern Illinois, 2014 & '15) and American Athletic (UCF/Memphis, 2017 & '18) each have had the same matchup twice over the last five seasons.

→ The Mountain West joins the American Athletic Conference (UCF & Memphis) as the only two conferences to have the same two teams in the championship game from a season ago.

Mountain West Championship game snap shot

Following Fresno State's inaugural season in the Mountain West in 2012 when the Bulldogs shared the MW conference title with Boise State and San Diego State, the conference split into the Mountain Division and West Division and held its first conference championship game in 2013.

Going into year six of the title bout, the Bulldogs will play for the fourth time in those six seasons. Fresno State hosted Utah State in the first-ever MW Championship game in 2013 and won 24-17, and was defeated by Boise State on the road in its next two bouts in 2014 and 2017.

Revisiting the 2018 Fresno State-Boise State matchup

The Bulldogs and Broncos will meet for a second time this season after Boise State rallied from a 14-point deficit to score 21 unanswered points on the 'Dogs to win 24-17 at Albertsons Stadium on Nov. 9. Fresno State scored on its opening possession of the second half to take a 17-3 lead, but were shut out the rest of the way. The Bulldogs' last gasp in the fourth quarter saw them move the ball into Boise State territory on their final two possession, but on the second-to-last drive a 50-yard field goal attempt was blocked and on the final try the 'Dogs made it as far as the Boise State 29-yard line, but on fourth-and-11 Marcus McMaryion's pass attempt down the middle for KeeSean Johnson was broken up to seal the game for Boise State.

The Bulldogs totaled 390 yards of offense, passing for 283 yards while Boise State finished the game with 448 yards of offense, the most allowed by Fresno State this season.

McMaryion threw for one touchdown and connected on 24-of-35 passes for 283 yards. Johnson tallied eight receptions and finished with a team-high 95 yards. Johnson scored the Bulldogs' first touchdown of the night, a three-yard reception. On the ground, sophomore running back Ronnie Rivers had 33 yards on seven carries and scored the Bulldogs' lone rushing touchdown which gave the 'Dogs a 17-3 lead early in the third quarter.

Junior linebacker Jeff Allison led the team on defense with 14 tackles, seven solo. Junior free safety Juju Hughes logged the game's only turnover with an interception in the end zone to stave off a Boise State drive late in the second quarter. It was the only turnover of the game and still stands as the only game this season that when Fresno State won the turnover battle, it lost the game.

Revisiting the Bulldogs' last win at Boise State

Fresno State has won once playing against Boise State on the road, and that came over 34 years ago on Sept. 8, 1984, before the "Blue Turf" existed. That Bulldog team was quarterbacked by sophomore Kevin Sweeney, who wore No. 9, one of seven retired Fresno State jerseys. Current junior linebacker Jeff Allison was granted permission to wear that No. 9 by Sweeney last season. The Bulldogs won their 1984 bout 37-21 as Sweeney went 19-of-31 for 270 yards and two touchdowns, two years before the blue turf was installed in 1986.

Looking for redemption

Fresno State, who suffered a difficult 17-14 loss to Boise State in the 2017 Mountain West Championship game, have 38 of the 51 players that participated in that game still on the 2018 roster.

Of the 11 offensive 2017 MW Championship game starters, seven return in 2018: WR Jamire Jordan, RB Dejonte O'Neal, LT Christian Cronk, RG Micah St. Andrew, RB Ronnie Rivers, QB Marcus McMaryion and WR KeeSean Johnson.

Of the 11 defensive 2017 MW Championship game starters, eight return in 2018: DT Kevin Atkins, LB George Helmuth, LB Jeff Allison, LB James Bailey, DB Tank Kelly, DB Jaron Bryant, DB Mike Bell and DB Juju Hughes.

Hard to stomach

Boise State has truly been the thorn in the Bulldogs' side. Not only have they fell in 10-straight road games dating back to 2002, its impacted the Tedford era too. Tedford, who is 18-2 in games when leading after three quarters as the head coach at Fresno State ... those only two losses are to Boise State in the last two games they've squared off in Boise. Overall, Tedford is 1-2 versus Boise State, already facing the Broncos three times in his first 26 career games as the Bulldogs' head coach.

WEST DIVISION CHAMPS!

By virtue of the Bulldogs' 23-14 victory against San Diego State on Nov. 17, Fresno State clinched the West Division with one regular season game remaining. The Bulldogs defeated San Jose State to finish the regular season with one loss in league play (10-2, 7-1 MW) while their West Division counterparts Hawai'i and Nevada each had three MW losses, SDSU had four, UNLV had six and SJSU had seven.

Fresno State knew it would be on the road following its Nov. 17 win no matter what the outcome of the Boise State-Utah State regular season finale was. The 'Dogs knew a Boise State win would send them on the road because BSU owned the head-to-head tie breaker. And if Utah State had won, USU would have been the divisional champion with the highest winning percentage in conference games only.

Back in the Top 25

The Bulldog football program returned to being nationally-ranked in week 13, checking in at No. 23 in the Amway Coaches poll and returned to the AP Top 25 and CFP in week 14, checking in at No. 25 in both.

After the then-No. 16/17 Bulldogs fell in week 11 at Boise State, 24-17, on Friday, Nov. 9, on the end of a back-to-back road swing, Fresno State dropped out of all three week 12 polls. Fresno State will face a similar situation this Saturday looking to remain in the polls this time, but better yet, earn a conference title.

Fresno State vs. the Top 25

Fresno State snapped a 23-game losing streak to ranked opponents with its win versus then-ranked Boise State on Nov. 25, 2017. Boise State was ranked No. 23 in the CFP, No. 24 in the Coaches Poll and No. 25 in the AP Top 25. The last win the Bulldogs picked up against a ranked opponent prior to last season's win was when they defeated No. 18 Virginia 37-34 in overtime at the MPC Computers Bowl in Boise, Idaho on Dec. 27, 2004. The Bulldogs finished that season ranked No. 22 in both major polls as a result of the win. The Broncos were the third ranked opponent the Bulldogs faced in the regular season in 2017 (Alabama/ Washington); this Saturday will mark the first ranked opponent the Bulldogs will have played in 2018.

Fresno State one of 18 programs undefeated at home in 2018

There are 18 Division I programs who have yet to lose a home game as the Bulldogs are one of 10 Group of Five teams who remain unbeaten at home.

Only UCF and Appalachian State have home games remaining as the Knights host the AAC championship game and the Mountaineers host the Sun Belt Championship game on Saturday.





'Dogs clinch first back-to-back 10-win seasons since 1988-89

With Fresno State's victory over San Jose State, the Bulldogs secured back-to-back double-digit win seasons and it marked just the second time in program history a Bulldog team accomplished that.

The 2018 Bulldog team is the 11th team in program history to record double-digit wins, and of all the double-digit win seasons in program history, only once before had there been back-to-back years with double-digit wins (1988-89).

Fresno State nabbed win No. 10 in its 12th game of the season in 2018 while a season ago the Bulldogs earned win No. 10 in its 14th game of the season, defeating Houston at the Hawai'i Bowl one season removed from a 1-11 mark in 2016 before Tedford took over. It was the first 10-plus win season for the 'Dogs since 2013 when they won 11 behind NFL stars Derek Carr and Davante Adams. That 2013 team raced out to 10 wins in its first 10 games.

 \rightarrow In seven of the first 10 seasons the Bulldogs won 10 or more games, they also went on to win conference championships.

Entering week 14, Fresno State is one of 14 teams in the FBS to own double-digit wins.

'Dogs complete 20th season unbeaten at home

Fresno State finished the season 6-0 at home with wins over Idaho, Toledo, Wyoming, Hawai'i, San Diego State and San Jose State with an average margin of victory by 28.2 points.

It is the 20th season in program history Fresno State finished the season unbeaten at home joining 1923, 1924, 1930, 1941, 1955, 1961, 1977, 1982, 1985, 1986, 1988, 1989, 1990, 1991, 1993, 1999, 2000, 2012 and 2013.

Home winning streak

After losing its lone home game of the Jeff Tedford era on Oct. 28, 2017 against UNLV, the 'Dogs won their final two home games of 2017 over BYU and Boise State and with six wins in 2018, Fresno State will ride an eight-game home winning streak going into 2019.

That streak is one of 13 in the nation that is of at least eight games and seventh among Group of Five programs. Alabama has the nation's longest streak at 26 games while UCF is the leader of the Group of Five at 14 games.

Head coach Jeff Tedford earned his 20th win as the Bulldogs' head coach last time out, marking 20 wins in his first 26 games. Tedford joins Tim DeRuyter (2012-16) as the only Bulldog head coach to reach 20 wins over the first two seasons of a Bulldog head coaching tenure in program history. DeRuyter finished his second season as the Bulldogs' head coach 20-6 following a season-ending loss in the 2013 Las Vegas Bowl after earning win No. 20 in the 2013 MW Championship game.

Winning the halftime adjustments

Fresno State has scored points with its first drive of the second half in five of the last six games. Over that span, the Bulldogs have manufactured four touchdown drives and kicked one field goal. In total during the regular season, the Bulldogs scored points with its first drive of the second half seven times (6 TD/1 FG).

On the flip side, the defense is also making the right halftime adjustments to confuse the opposition's offense. In 12 regular season games, the Bulldogs allowed one opponent to score on its first possession of the second half - which happened to be Boise State on Nov. 9. Fresno State received the ball first in that Nov. 9 game and drove 70 yards down the field for the score, Boise State answered with a 75-yard TD drive of its own.

- → Fresno State is outscoring its opponents in the third quarter, 147-21. It is the largest point differential of any quarter during its games (+126).
- → Fresno State has allowed just seven points in the third during conference play (89-7). Only one team, Boise State, has managed more than 100 yards of offense in the third quarter against Fresno State.
- → Fresno State has outgained 11 of its 12 opponents in the third quarter with Boise State being the only opponent to outgain the 'Dogs (138-77). The Broncos were also the only team the Bulldogs have not been able to outscore in the third (7-7) as well.

Protecting the football

Fresno State matched a season-high of two turnovers lost last week against San Jose State, matching marks of two in back-toback game vs. Minnesota (Sept 8) and UCLA (Sept. 15). Since those two games and before last week, the Bulldogs had turned the ball over three times over eight games.

Despite the two fumbles vs. San Jose State, the Bulldogs still rank third in the FBS with nine turnover lost (4 INT/5 fumbles). They are one of five FBS teams with single-digit turnovers.

Marcus McMaryion returned to the Central Valley last season to play for the Bulldogs after three seasons at Oregon State. He was 9-2 as the starter in year one, leading the Bulldogs to an appearance in the MW Championship game and a Hawai'i Bowl victory against Houston after getting his first Bulldog start on Sept. 30, 2017 vs. Nevada. McMaryion accomplished all that after joining the team on Aug. 12, 2017, midway into training camp. He was eligible immediately as a graduate transfer.

Since becoming the first Bulldog quarterback to complete better than 60 percent of his passes in a season since Derek Carr (2013) last year, this season...:

- McMaryion is one of seven FBS quarterbacks with a completion percentage better than 70 percent this season.
- McMaryion's completion percentage (70.5%) ranks 5th in the FBS; he is led by Jack Abraham, Southern Miss (73.1%), Brent Stockstill, Middle Tenn. State (71.2%), Gardner Minshew, Washington State (70.6%) and Kyler Murray, Oklahoma (70.6%).
- McMaryion has thrown 24 touchdowns against three interceptions this season.
- McMaryion currently has a streak of 104 consecutive pass attempts without throwing an interception dating back to a second quarter INT at UNLV on Nov. 3. Entering that game, he had a streak of 155 consecutive pass attempts without throwing an interception.
 - -- McMaryion has one interception over his last 260 attempts (155+1+104).
- McMaryion also had a streak of 149 consecutive pass attempts without an INT in 2017. The two runs rank as the sixth (155) and seventh (149) best streaks in program history.
- · McMaryion is averaging one interception per 122.0 pass attempts which is the secondlowest number pass attempts per interception in the FBS. Tua Tagovailoa (Alabama) is the nation-leader with 134.5 pass attempts per INT.
- McMaryion has posted a completion percentage 66.7 or better in all 12 games this season. He was in jeopardy of losing his run of 66.7 or better by starting the San Jose State game 9-of-17, but he was 11-of-12 in the second half, finishing 20-of-29 (69.0%).
- · McMaryion matched a Fresno State career-high four TD throws against Hawai'i. It was the second time in 2018 and third of his two-year career at FS. He once tossed five in a game while at Oregon State (against Arizona, 11/19/16).
- McMaryion surpassed 300 yards passing for the second time this season last time out vs. SJSU.
- → McMaryion is 19-4 as a starting quarterback at Fresno State.

National Leader: 48 and counting

Since his redshirt freshman season in 2015, senior KeeSean Johnson has been a steady pass catcher for Bulldog quarterbacks - actually the best in that category in program history. The East Palo Alto native has just one game in his entire career where he has gone without a catch - at Ole Miss in 2015 as a redshirt freshman in his second career game. Since then, Johnson has caught at least one pass in 48 consecutive games. Last season, Johnson surpassed the program's previous leader in consecutive games with a catch, Henry Ellard. Ellard, who was catching passes from Jeff Tedford in 1981-82, held the record previously catching passes in 34-straight games from 1979-82.

KeeSean Johnson, who broke Davante Adams' Fresno State record for career receptions earlier this season on Oct. 27, added to his legacy last week against San Jose State by breaking the program record for career receiving yards. Johnson broke Charlie Jones' record of 3,344 yards, a record that stood since 1995.

- Johnson owns a team-best 87 receptions and 1,267 receiving yards in 2018.
- Johnson ranks 8th in the FBS for most receptions (87).
- Johnson ranks 7th in the FBS for most receiving yards (1,267).
- Johnson's 87 receptions ranks sixth-best in program history for a single season. Josh Harper ranks 5th with 90 (2014) while Isaiah Burse ranks 4th with 99 (2013).
- Johnson's 1,267 receiving yards ranks sixth-best in program history for a single season. Davante Adams ranks 5th with 1,312 (2012) while Bernard Berrian ranks 4th with 1,364 (2001).
- · Johnson became the fourth receiver in program history to record back-to-back seasons of 1,000 yards. He joined Larry Willis, Davante Adams and Josh Harper. He is the fifth Bulldog overall with multiple 1,000 yard seasons as Rodney Wright posted 1,000 yards in 1999 & 2001.
- Johnson is the career active leader in the nation in receptions (267).
- Johnson is one of three active FBS players to own 3,000 or more career receiving yards.

Overlooked

While KeeSean Johnson gets a lot of the spotlight, throughout the past four years Jamire Jordan has been opposite of him. Jordan's quick speed has separated him for numerous explosive plays while other times just opening up the field taking a defender away for Johnson's benefit. The Johnson and Jordan duo have both played in 50 career games, and are two of four players on the team with 50 career games under their belts along with linebackers George Helmuth and James Bailey.

- → Jordan entered the Fresno State career pass receptions alltime top 10 as his two catches last week gave him 143 over his fouryear career. He sits at No. 10.
- → Jordan is nearly on the all-time top 10 for receiving yards owning 2,217. He is 151 yards shy of catching Charles Smith (1998-01) at No. 10, who registered 2,368 yards in his Bulldog career.
- → Jordan owns 3,350 career allpurpose yards. It ranks as the 18th-most in program history.

Chasing Bear

Tight end Jared Rice has arguably been the most productive Fresno State tight end since Bear Pascoe (2005-08), who made himself a seven-year NFL career. Rice, a junior this season, broke Pascoe's single season best marks of receptions and receiving yards by a tight end last week against San Jose State. Rice is the first

Bulldog tight end to eclipse 500 yards receiving in a season since Pascoe registered 553 in 2007; he also is the first Bulldog tight end to eclipse 40 receptions in a season since Pascoe did it in back-to-back seasons in 2007-08.

Plug and Play

In total, Fresno State has used five different combinations of starters on the offensive line this season. Despite the lack of continuity, like starting the same five in all 14 games a season ago, the results have been similar to the success a season ago.

Fresno State returned three starters with 71 career combined starts (Netane Muti, Christian Cronk, Micah St. Andrew) going into the 2018 opener ... in doing so, the line tinkered with its lineup to the point that Fresno State joined Western Kentucky and UTSA as the only offensive lines in the nation to start the season with all five position starters each earning their first career starts at their respective position to start 2018 ... the change continued losing Muti to a season-ending achilles injury during the Bulldogs' week two contest at Minnesota. Cronk moved back to left tackle (where he started in 2016-17) in the absence of Muti and junior college transfer Nick Abbs slid in at left guard. A new lineup emerged against Wyoming, having St. Andrew and Boyer flip positions (center-right guard) while Logan Hughes picked up his first start at left guard since 2016. The 'Dogs only steady presence had been Syrus Tuitele at right tackle over the first seven games until an injury allowed Bull to get his first start at right tackle against Hawaii, and a week later versus UNLV, Woodley got his first start at right tackle. Tuitele returned to right tackle against Boise State. Tuitele and Cronk share the most starts at one position this season with 10.

→ Fresno State has not allowed a sack five times (Minnesota, Wyoming, Hawai'i, UNLV & San Jose State) and allowed one apiece in the five other contests.

Not so secret weapon

One of the Bulldogs' best assets this season has been punter Blake Cusick. A Ray Guy Award semifinalist, which is given to the nation's best punter, the junior has placed 51.9 percent (28of-54) of his punts inside the opponents' 20-yard line forcing teams to put together lengthy drives to score points. Only eight of his 54 punts have been returned this season for a total of 25 yards.

- \rightarrow 11 punts have been placed inside the opponents' 10-yard line.
- → Fresno State ranks first in the Mountain West and 15th in the nation in net punting at 40.46
- → Through 12 games, Cusick has an average of 42.4 yards per punt which ranks sixth in the Mountain West and 41st nationally.
- → 12 of Cusick's punts have gone for 50-plus yards, including a career-long 72 yarder at Nevada.

Defending the red zone

With opponents cashing in on just 59.1 percent of its trips to the red zone (13-of-22), Fresno State's defense ranks No. 1 in the FBS defending red zone opportunities. In total, Fresno State's opponents have reached the red zone 22 times - which ranks as the fewest trips allowed to the red zone in the FBS.

- → Fresno State opponents have scored 13 times (9 TD/4 FG) which ranks as the least amount of red zone scores in the FBS. The next closest team in scores allowed is Alabama which has allowed 17.
- → Fresno State has stopped an opponent in the red zone in seven of its 12 games. The Bulldogs stopped Idaho and Toledo twice on red zone chances (1-of-3).
- → Fresno State has recorded at least one red zone stop in six of their last nine games. The 'Dogs kept Wyoming and San Diego State out of the red zone during that span.

Nation's leader keeping opponents under 30

After 26 total games in the Tedford era, the defense has actually been the hallmark of the "quarterback guru's" tenure. Fresno State has allowed opponents to 15.9 points per game under Tedford. Furthermore, the Bulldogs have not allowed an opponent to score 30 or more points since Sept. 16, 2017 at Washington (L, 48-16), a stretch of 23 straight games, which is the longest streak in the FBS.

Elite Company

Following a season in which the Bulldogs' defense was the program's best since the late 1980's, this year's group is on track to be even better. The Bulldogs are currently suffocating opposing offenses, holding them to the second-lowest points per game in the FBS (13.5).

- → During the last 50 years, Fresno State has held opponents to 15.0 points per game or less four times.
- → Only once has a Bulldog defense held 3. 1988 14.1 ppg opponents below 14 points per game for 4. 1972 - 14.4 ppg an entire season (1986 - 13.6).

Manufacturing takeaways

Through 12 games, Fresno State has produced 23 takeaways - which ranks tied for the 16th-most in the country (based on all teams and all games). The Bulldogs' 17 interceptions ranks tied for the fifth-most in the FBS. The Bulldogs turnover margin ranks tied for the fourth-best in the country having turned the ball over nine times - equaling a +1.17 turnover margin.

• Fourteen different Bulldogs have accounted for a takeaway
this season. Jeff Allison, James Bailey and Patrick Belony
own two apiece while Mike Bell, Juju Hughes and Tank
Kelly lead the team with three apiece.

Fresno State has won the turnover battle in seven of its
12 games this season. The Bulldogs are 6-1 in those seven games and are 3-0 when the
turnover battle is tied.

\rightarrow Fresno State is 13-2 when winning the turnover battle under Jeff Tedford with the only
losses coming on the road at Washington in 2017 and at Boise State in 2018.

Points off turnovers

Fresno State has recorded 100 points off turnovers through 12 games, a number that has already surpassed season totals from the past five seasons.

→ The Bulldogs had 38 points off turnovers in their contest against Idaho, scoring five touchdowns and a field goal. Looking back, it's the first time since 2013 that the Bulldogs posted 30 or more points off turnovers - having done so against Idaho scoring 35 points off turnovers in that game.

Aerial pursuit

While Fresno State remains one of the top teams in the FBS in takeaways, its strength has been when attacking a team's passing game. The Bulldogs rank tied for No. 5 in the FBS in interceptions with 17.

- The fear of ball-hawking defenders from all areas of the field has led quarterbacks to be off their game, holding them to the ninth-lowest passing efficiency in the nation at 105.80. Quarterbacks have been held to a 51.2 percent completion percentage.
- Ten different Bulldogs have hauled in an interception this season. Tank Kelly, Mike Bell and Juju Hughes lead the team with three while Jeff Allison has accounted for two.
- Eleven of Fresno State's picks have come from its secondary, four from its linebackers and two from the linemen up front.
- The 75 passes defended is the fourth-most in the nation and is the most by a Bulldog team since 1999 when the 'Dogs had 79.
- Tank Kelly is tied for the second-most pass break-ups in the FBS with 20.

Taking rather than allowing

Fresno State's defense is one of 17 units in the country to have more interceptions than passing touchdowns allowed. The Bulldogs intercept 1.31 passes per touchdown allowed through the air which is tied for No. 7 nationally.

→ Fresno State and Utah State are the only two Mountain West schools to have forced more interceptions than allowed passing touchdowns. Fresno State has allowed 13 pass TDs to its 17 INTs while the Aggies have given up 17 pass TDs to their 18 INTs.

My turn

While Fresno State has totaled 17 interceptions on the year, the INTs have been spread throughout the defense. Don't have a pick? It's just a matter of time. On Nov. 3, Jaron Bryant became the ninth Bulldog to intercept a pass in 2018 after leading the 'Dogs with four picks a season ago. In the regular-season-finale, Arron Mosby became No. 10 as he recorded his first-career interception, returning it 95-yards for a touchdown.

- → The 10 different players with an interception is the most for the Bulldogs since the 2002 team had 11 different players record an interception.
- → Of Fresno State's 17 interceptions, four players have accounted for multiple picks (Tank Kelly - 3, Mike Bell, 3, Juju Hughes - 3, Jeff Allison - 2). The last time the Bulldogs have had at least four players record at least two INTs in a season was 2004 (Marcus McCauley - 3, James Sanders - 3, Richard Marshall, Nate Ray - 2).

Ball Hawks

Ranking No. T-5 in the FBS in interceptions, Fresno State saw its streak of consecutive games with an interception end at eight games two weeks ago versus San Diego State. It was the longest streak since the 2012 season when the Bulldogs grabbed at least one in 11 straight games.

The offense doesn't have to do all of the scoring

Through 12 games, Fresno State has scored six touchdowns without the use of its offense, the latest coming by way of a 95-yard interception return by sophomore linebacker Arron Mosby. The Bulldogs' six defensive TDs rank tied for No. 2 in the FBS behind Temple's seven.

- The Bulldogs have run three interceptions back for touchdowns this season, a 38-yard return by Mykal Walker against Toledo on Sept. 29 and a 39-yard return from Tank Kelly versus Idaho in the season opener. Mosby's 95-yard return was the fourth-longest in program history, and longest since 2004.
- Against Idaho, Jaron Bryant became the first player in FBS history to return two blocked field goals for touchdowns in the same game, and both were in the second quarter. No team in FBS history had ever performed the feat twice in one game.
- On Oct. 27, Jamire Jordan caught a Hawai'i missed field goal eight yards deep into the end zone and returned it for a touchdown. It was the first kick-six in Mountain West history.
- The six non-offensive touchdowns is the most for a Bulldog team since recording nine in 2012.

<u>Jeff Allison - the Dog in the middle</u>

As one of the nation's leading tacklers a season ago with 126, middle linebacker Jeff Allison has continued 2018 where he left off. Despite missing nearly all of the UNLV game (exiting in the 1st qtr.), he is currently on pace to surpass his 2017 total as he leads Fresno State with 109 tackles - an average of 9.1 per game (despite logging zero tackles in the UNLV game that he exited). He is 39 tackles ahead the team's second-leading tackler, LB George Helmuth 70.

- In 26 career starts, Allison has led the Bulldogs in tackles 15 times. He has collected double-digit tackles on 11 occasions.
- Allison ranks sixth in the MW in tackles per game at 9.1, good for 42nd in the FBS after missing nearly all of the UNLV game on Nov. 3.
- His 59 solo stops ranks third in the MW and ranks No. 42 in the FBS.
- · He began the season on both the Bednarik (top defensive player) and Butkus (top linebacker) Award watch lists.



Not to be underestimated

Anthoula "Tank" Kelly has been everything that his name entails throughout 2018. The senior cornerback has been a destructive force thus far providing big hits, big plays and has locked down opposing receivers. Kelly is tied for second in the FBS in passes defended with 20. With three INTs, Kelly is tied for the third-most in the MW with teammate Mike Bell (3) and Juju Hughes (3).

- Kelly recorded 13 of 20 passes defended in three games (Idaho 5; Nevada 4; Wyoming 4).
- Kelly's 20 pass defended is the most by a Bulldog since Steve Wilson recorded 21 in 1995 (two interceptions, 19 breakups)
- The 5-foot-10 defensive back has three interceptions, one blocked field goal and one forced fumble on the year. The Bulldogs have scored 21 points off of the fifth-year senior's big plays.
- Kelly has recorded three firsts in his Bulldog career this season: return an interception for a touchdown, block a field goal and force a fumble.

Do Not Enter

This season, Fresno State has put up a "Do Not Enter" sign on its opponents' end zone. Like last year, the Bulldogs have held three opponents without a touchdown. The 2018 season marks the fifth time in the modern era in which the 'Dogs have recorded at least three games in which their opponents have not found the endzone in a single season. The 1988 team held four teams without a touchdown. Three games were also done in 2017, 2007 and 1986.

→ Fresno State has allowed 19 touchdowns this season, tied for the second-fewest allowed in the FBS behind Mississippi State's 12.

Defensive legacy

In his first season on the field for the Bulldogs, junior Mykal Walker is making an immediate impact where his late father Michael once played (1985-86). Through 12 games, the younger Walker is already creating his own legacy at defensive end. The 6-foot-3, 220-pound athlete has been all over the field for the Bulldogs. He ranks second in the Mountain West among defensive linemen in tackles with 67 (5.6 per game).

- In his first game in a Bulldog uniform, Walker blocked a field that was returned for a touchdown ... he recorded his second block of the season at UNLV on Nov. 3, this time a punt to become the first Bulldog since 2011 to record multiple blocks in a season - his two blocks rank tied for tied for the fifth-most in the FBS. There are only four individuals in the FBS with more than two blocks this season.
- · Against Toledo, Walker became the first Bulldog defensive lineman to return an interception for a touchdown since Tristan Okpalaugo on Sept. 22, 2012.
- Walker has forced two fumbles (back-to-back games vs. UCLA & Toledo) and recovered one (Hawai'i).
- · Against Hawai'i, Walker tallied a team-high nine tackles to become the first defensive lineman to lead the Bulldogs in tackles since Tyeler Davison led team with eight versus Nevada in 2014. He led the 'Dogs in tackles again in the regular-season finale versus San Jose State with eight.

Block that kick

With Mykal Walker's second block of the season coming on a punt at UNLV, Fresno State has recorded three this season. Two have come on field goals and one on a punt. It is the most blocks in a single season for a Bulldog team since 2011 when the 'Dogs had 10 (Marcel Jensen - 3, Cody Wichmann - 4).

Cleaning up open space

With Fresno State's corners locking down receivers on the outside this season, that has allowed the safety duo of Mike Bell and Juju Hughes do what they do best - make plays:

- With both Bell and Hughes recording a team-high three interceptions apiece, the two also sit second on the team in pass breakups with 10 each. They rank tied for third in the MW in interceptions with three apiece, and both are tied for sixth in the league in pass breakups.
- All six of their interceptions have come in Mountain West play. The Bulldogs have converted points off the turnovers on half of those plays (17 points).
- The two sit fifth and sixth on team in tackles with Bell at 67 and Hughes at 64.

30-minute delay

One in every four halves this season, Fresno State has held its opponent scoreless. The Bulldogs have held six teams scoreless in a half as San Jose State was the latest opponent to be shutout in a half.

- → All six teams Fresno State held to a scoreless half of football were Mountain West opponents.
- → UNLV and San Jose State were held without points in the first half. Nevada, Wyoming, New Mexico and San Diego State were held scoreless in the second half.

Slowing backs down

Since Jeff Tedford took over in 2017, Fresno State has faced four players who entered their game with Bulldogs averaging over 100 rushing yards per game. Alexander Mattison will be No. 5 this Saturday (Mattison was averaging 80.7 yards per game entering the Nov. 9 game - he is averaging 101.2 yards per game entering this week's game).

Of the four rushers averaging better than 100 yards per game, the closest player to reach their average was when Dicocemy Saint Juste rushed for 104 yards when he entered averaging 138.3.

- → Alexander Mattison enters Saturday's matchup with the Bulldogs averaging 101.3 yards per game after posting four 100-yard games in four of his last five outings.
- → Fresno State has allowed four individuals to rush for 100 yards under Tedford. Fresno State is 2-2 in those games.
- → Alabama quarterback Jalen Hurts rushed for over 100 yards in 2017. His 154 yards is the most on the ground by a single player against a Bulldog defense under Tedford. The most yards by a running back against the 'Dogs in that span was Mattison's 144 yards on Nov. 9.

Scouting the Boise State Broncos

Boise State enters Saturday night's contest versus the Bulldogs on a seven-game winning streak as the Broncos closed out the regular season 10-2 overall and clinched their second consecutive Mountain Division title by defeating Utah State, 33-24, at home in the final week of the regular season.

Under the direction of fifth-year head coach Bryan Harsin, the Broncos were 5-1 at home and 5-1 on the road in the regular season. Boise State closed out the 2018 slate with three of its four games at home in November, defeating BYU, Fresno State and Utah State,

and New Mexico on the road, in order to keep pace with Utah State in the Mountain Division standings and claim the division title in its home finale.

Boise State ranks second in the MW and 18th in the FBS in total offense averaging 468.7 yards per game and is also second in the league and 19th nationally in scoring offense averaging 37.0 points per game. On the defensive side of the ball, the Broncos rank fifth in the MW and 43rd in the FBS in total defense allowing 361.6 yards per game and are fourth in scoring defense and 36th nationally by surrendering 22.3 points per game.

The Broncos continue to do much of their damage through the air averaging 305.9 yards passing per game, second in the MW and 13th in the country, while going for an average of 162.8 yards per game on the ground (5th/70th). Boise State ranks second in the nation in third down conversion percentage at 54.3 percent and its 100 third down conversions are tied with Army for the most in the nation.

Senior quarterback Brett Rypien, who is the current career passing leader in Division I among active players with 13,453 yards, ranks second in the MW and ninth nationally with 3,580 passing yards while his 29 passing touchdowns also are second-most in the conference and eighth in the nation. Rypien, the MW offensive preseason player of the year, is also first or second in the MW in completion percentage, completions per game, passing efficiency, passing yards per game and total offense. The Broncos have a balanced receiving corps with four wideouts with at least 30 receptions led by senior Sean Modster with a team-high 64 receptions and 933 receiving yards (5th in MW) to go along with seven touchdowns. Senior A.J. Richardson ranks fifth in the MW with eight touchdown receptions and closely follows Modster with 49 receptions and 804 receiving yards. On the ground, junior running back Alex Mattison leads the MW and ranks fifth nationally with 16 rushing touchdowns and is second in the league with 1,215 rushing yards. Mattison's 101.3 yards per game is second in the MW and 23rd in the country.

The Broncos get pressure on the quarterback leading the league and checking in ninth in the nation with 3.08 sacks per game for a total of 37. Boise State has a plus-10 turnover margin, 22 forced and 12 committed, for an average of 0.83 per game to rank ninth in the nation. Junior safety Kekoa Nawahine has a team-high 67 tackles to go along with two fumble recoveries. Boise State leads the nation with 15 fumble recoveries and has added seven interceptions.

Team Captains

Much different from a year ago, the Fresno State football team was picked to win the West Division by the media, announced by the Mountain West on July $24\ prior$ to the $2018\ media\ summit\ getting\ underway\ at\ the\ Cosmopolitan\ of$ Las Vegas.

Fresno State turned the 2017 predicted order of finish upside down after being picked to finish last with a 10-4 run and a West Division crown guided by thenfirst year head coach Jeff Tedford. Now, the Bulldogs will make its run for a second-straight appearance in the MW Championship game as the favorite in Tedford's sophomore season.

This is the third time in six seasons (2013, 2014 and 2018) the Bulldogs have been the favorite to win the West since the inception of the divisional format instituted by the league to start the 2013 season. In the previous two occasions the Bulldogs were picked the win the West in the league's preseason poll, Fresno State carried out that forecast each time.

In addition to the predicted order of finish, the 2018 All-Mountain West Preseason Football Team was announced. This year's team included two Fresno State selections in senior wide receiver KeeSean Johnson and junior linebacker Jeff Allison. Johnson was a 2017 second-team All-MW pick while Allison was the Bulldogs' sole first-team selection a season ago.

HEAD COACH

2ND SEASON | FRESNO STATE (1992)

Jeff Tedford, 56, was named the 19th head football coach in Fresno State history on Nov. 10, 2016. He enters his second season after engineering one of the greatest turnarounds in FBS history in his first year back in the Valley.

With a 10-4 record in his first season, Fresno State became the second team in FBS history to turn a double-digit loss season (2016) into a double-digit win season (2017) the following year. The season included an appearance in the nation's top 25, clinching the Mountain West's West Division crown and leading the 'Dogs to their first appearance in the MW Championship Game since 2014. He also guided the 'Dogs to the program's first bowl victory since 2007 with their win at the Hawai'i Bowl.

Great success brought great notoriety as Tedford was named the 2017 Mountain West Coach of the Year, was a semifinalist for the George Munger College Coach of the Year Award presented by the Maxwell Football Club, a finalist for the Eddie Robinson Coach of the Year Award presented on behalf of the Football Writers Association of America in conjunction with the Allstate Sugar Bowl, and the AFCA Region-5 Coach of the Year.

While Tedford was honored as the league's coach of the year, the team had 16 student-athletes recognized with MW postseason honors - the most for the Bulldogs in a single-season since joining the conference in 2012. In the classroom, the 'Dogs also set a teambest number since joining the conference as they had 24 named to the Fall Academic All-Mountain West team.

Tedford, a former Bulldog quarterback and Fresno State assistant coach, returned to the Valley after holding the position of offensive consultant for the Washington Huskies - a 2016 College Football Playoff team.

Tedford assumed the role of acting head coach on Nov. 27, following the conclusion of the 2016 season as interim head coach Eric Kiesau carried out his duties for the remaining two games following Tedford's introduction.

Tedford, who is a proven winner on the West Coast, came to the Valley with 11 years of head coaching experience at the Division I level - having led the California Golden Bears to 82 wins from 2002-2012. He left as the school's all-time winningest coach.

Tedford's ties to the Valley and Fresno State run deep. He played quarterback at Fresno State in 1981-82 under Jim Sweeney and coached at Fresno State under Sweeney from 1987-88 and 1992-96, and under a then-first-year head coach Pat Hill in 1997.

Tedford's coaching career started at Fresno State, volunteering as an assistant for the 1987-88 seasons. From there he picked up his first full-time position as an assistant for the Calgary Stampeders of the Canadian Football League - a familiar league in which he played quarterback for six seasons after his collegiate career at

He returned to Fresno State in 1992 as the quarterbacks coach and served as the offensive coordinator for the Bulldogs over the

Tedford held the same position at Oregon (1998-2001) before he became the head coach at Cal. He was named the Pac-10 Coach of the Year twice, leading the Golden Bears to a school record seven consecutive bowl games and to a conference title in 2006.

Following Tedford's stint at Cal, he moved on to the NFL in 2014 as the Tampa Bay Buccaneers' offensive coordinator. The stop did not last long due to health issues during the preseason that evolved into an indefinite leave of absence, which resulted in the two sides mutually agreeing to part ways.

Tedford made his return to the CFL in 2015 as he was named the head coach of the B.C. Lions. At the conclusion of the season, Tedford elected to exercise an option in his contract to resign and pursue opportunities in college football.

Tedford made his return to college football as an offensive consultant for the Washington Huskies under head coach Chris Peterson in 2016. A relationship rekindled after their time together as assistants at Oregon under then-coach Mike Belotti. Washington's staff also included associate head coach Bob Gregory, who served as Tedford's defensive coordinator at Cal for eight seasons.

Tedford graduated from Warren High School in Downey, California and attended Cerritos Junior College for two seasons before becoming the Bulldogs' quarterback in 1981.

He and his wife Donna have two children, Taylor and Quinn.

FRESNO, Calif. - Scoring its most points since 1991 using five interceptions, two special teams returns for touchdowns and one pick-six, the Fresno State football team rolled to a 79-13 season pening rout of the Idaho Vandals on Saturday night at Bulldog Stadium.

Fresno State (1-0) scored its most points in 27 years using a balanced offensive approach passing for 247 yards while rushing for 239 and seven scores on the ground.

Senior quarterback Marcus McMarvion had an efficient passing night going 19-for-26 for 207 yards. The 'Dogs used a balanced attack on the ground as five running backs each went for better than 35 yards with Romello Harris leading the way with 47 followed Saevion Johnson (45). Deionte O'Neal (41). Josh Hokit (40) and Jordan Mims (36). Mims led the group with three touchdo

Senior wide receiver KeeSean Johnson tallied his sixth career 100-yard receiving game going for 118 yards on six receptions while extending his consecutive games with a reception streak to a nation-leading 37 ga

Defensively, junior linebacker Jeff Allison led the team with six tackles while senior cornerback Tank Kelly had a pair of interceptions one returned for a touchdown, five tackles and three pass breakups. Junior defensive tackle Jasad Haynes had five tackles, three tackles for loss, a sack and a forced fumble while Jaron Bryant returned two blocked field goals for touchdowns.

How It Happened

The Bulldogs got the scoring started on their first offensive series of the contest going on an 11-play, 56-yard drive that saw McMaryion complete five of six passes for 42 yards connecting on passes to three different receivers, including three to junior tight end Jared Rice.

Facing a 3rd-and-5 from the Idaho 27. McMaryion connected on back-to-back passes for nine and 11 yards, respectively, to Rice getting the 'Dogs down to the Vandals 7. A six-yard gain by O'Neal got the Bulldogs on the doorstep of Idaho's goal line setting up a one-yard touchdown plunge by Mims.

After forcing the Vandals' to a second straight three-and-out, the 'Dogs took over at their own 20-yard line and marched down the field on a 12-play, 80-yard drive as the 'Dogs found little resistance from the Idaho defense. Faced with a 3rd-and-16 at their own 26, McMaryion found Johnson down the middle of the field for a 19 yard gain.

An 11-yard connection from Johnson and McMaryion on a 3rd-and-1 kept the drive alive and got the 'Dogs down to the Vandals' 28 and two plays later, the 'Dogs capitalized with a 26-yard scamper through the left side by O'Neal for his second career rushing

The 'Dogs defense continued to wreck havoc as Haynes forced his first career fumble setting up the Bulldog's offense at the Idaho 19. After compiling 136 yards of offense on its first two drives, the Bulldog offense was only able to move four yards on its third drive setting up a 33-yard field goal by redshirt freshman kicker Asa Fuller who made his first career field goal to give the 'Dogs a 16-0 lead.

Holding the Vandals to negative 16 yards of offense on its first two drives, Idaho needed only two plays to drive 75 yards as quarterback Mason Petrino found wide receiver Jeff Cotton down the sideline for 73 yards to break up the 'Dogs shutout bid. The Vandals bobbled the PAT attempt as the Bulldogs led 16-6 with five seconds remaining in the first quarter

Fresno State carried its hot offense into the second quarter going on a 7-play, 75-yard drive passing for 39 yards and running for 36 yards as Mims punched in his second touchdown run with a 12-yard scamper up the middle to extend the 'Dogs lead to 23-6.

The Vandals put together their most substantial drive of the game to that point with a 10-play, 46-yard drive down to the Bulldog 26 setting up a 36-yard field goal attempt by Cade Coffey, but Kelly broke through line blocking Coffey's kick as Bryant picked it up and returned it 74 yards putting the Bulldogs up 30-6.

The 'Dogs defense continued to pour it as Kelly picked off his second pass of the game stepping in front of a Petrino pass and returned it 39 yards for a touchdown to push the lead to 37-6.

Idaho made one final push to score in the first half going on a 9-play, 43-yard drive down to the Bulldog 22 to set up a 39-yard attempt by Coffey with one second remaining in the half. The 'Dogs special teams again came up clutch as redshirt junior Mykal Walker broke through the line for the block and was picked up by Bryant for 71 yards as Fresno State took a commanding 44-6 lead into halftime.

The Bulldogs added two touchdowns in the third quarter, a two-yard run by Mims and a 33-yard pass from Jorge Reyna to Derrion Grim (watch) on his first career attempt to take a 58-6 lead. The Vandals scored once more in the game in the third frame, a six-yard run by Isaiah Saunders to make it 58-13 in favor of the 'Dogs.

Fresno State completed the scoring with three more touchdowns in the fourth quarter as a pair of 'Dogs scored their first career touchdowns. S. Johnson had a five-yard plunge up the middle followed by a 27-yard run by Harris before S. Johnson found the end zone one more time with a one-yard run.

MINNEAPOLIS - The Fresno State football team lost a heartbreaker at Minnesota on Saturday evening, falling 21-14 at TCF Bank Stadium.

After converting a fourth-and-3 from the Minnesota 10-yard line, Fresno State was set up with first-and goal from the Golden Gopher 4-yard line with 1:24 remaining in the game. The 'Dogs pulled a play out of the book from 2017, a halfback pass attempt from Josh Hokit to try and knot the game. But this one, intended for tight end Jared Rice in the back of the end zone, was intercepted by Minnesota defensive back Antonie Winfield Jr. to dash the Bulldogs' hopes of winning their first game on Big Ten soil since defeating Illinois 53-52 in 2009.



Fresno State was stymied for much of the first half by the Gophers' defense, totaling 104 yards offense, but came alive in the second half. Entering the third quarter trailing 10-0, the Bulldogs scored two touchdowns in the second half and took a one-point lead in the fourth quarter, 14-13. Minnesota regained the lead with 3:28 left in the contest and it proved to be enough to win the game.

Fresno State senior quarterback Marcus McMaryion went 23-of-32 through the air for 205 yards with a pair of rresno State sentor quarterback Marcus McMaryton went 23-01-32 through the air for 205 yards with a pair of touchdowns and his first interception of the season while adding 15 yards on the ground. Sophomore running back Jordan Mims led the 'Dogs rushing attack with 41 yards on 10 carries. The Bulldogs rushed for 87 yards as a team. On the receiving end, senior wide receiver KeeSean Johnson led the team with six receptions for 89 yards and a touchdown while Rice added five catches for 31 yards and a score.

Defensively, junior linebacker Jeff Allison had a career-high 15 tackles while junior safety Mike Bell chipped in a career-best 11 tackles, including five solo. The Bulldog defense did force one turnover in the third quarter as senior cornerback Tank Kelly forced a fumble that was recovered by senior defensive lineman Patrick Belony. The Bulldogs manufactured their first points of the game off that turnover.

How It Happened

Minnesota started the scoring on its second offensive drive by manufacturing a lengthy 14-play, 80-yard drive that ran 7:17 off the clock. Gopher redshirt sophomore Seth Green punched the ball in from one-yard out to give Minnesota a 7-0 lead.

Facing its first deficit of the season, the 'Dogs looked to get its offense going, but McMaryion threw his first interception of the season on the ensuing possession to give Minnesota the ball back at the Bulldogs' 41-yard

The 'Dogs defense came up big allowing only one yard after that turnover and nearly had a turnover of their own as Allison snagged a pass attempt on third-and-9, but was unable to stay in bounds. Minnesota finished the half with a 10-play, 55-yard drive that ended with a 53-yard field goal by Emmit Carpenter to take a 10-0

After the teams traded punts to start the second half, the Bulldogs defense produced their first turnover of the game deep in the Gophers' own territory. Anthoula Kelly forced the fumble and Patrick Belony pounced on top of it to spark the Bulldogs' offense. Fresno State took advantage going on a four-play, 17-yard drive to score with 20 seconds remaining in the third quarter to pull within three, 10-7. Rice capped the drive with a one-yard touchdown catch from McMaryion.

Carpenter added his second 50-plus yard field goal of the game (50 yards) to put Minnesota ahead 13-7 before a quick strike by the 'Dogs gave Fresno State its lone lead of the game.

The 'Dogs went on a five-play, 75-yard drive that was capped by McMaryion connecting with Johnson for 45 yards to push the 'Dogs in the lead, 14-13.

The lead was short-lived as the Gophers, as they did all game, pounded the ball on the ground for a 10-play, 74-yard drive that ate up 4:52 off the clock. Green ran in from three yards out and after a successful two-point conversion, the Gophers held a 21-14 lead. The drive was kept alive after a 13-yard completion along the sideline on a third-and-nine by a scrambling Zack Annexstad in Minnesota territory. That was followed by a 15-yard sideline infraction penalty called on Fresno State to set the Gophers up at the Bulldogs' 28-yard line

Facing a fourth-and-3 from the Gophers 10-vard line. McMarvion found Justin Allen for six vards and a first down to extend the game, but after a timeout, the Gophers came up with the play that seal the game.

PASADENA, Calif. - Led by senior quarterback Marcus McMaryion's five total touchdowns on Saturday night at the Rose Bowl, the Fresno State football team defeated UCLA 38-14 in front of 60,867 fans with a large contingent being the Red Wave that filled up the visitors section in the southeast endzone. The Bulldogs closed the game with 22-unanswered points during the final 24 minutes to earn their thirdstraight win over the Bruins to the delight of the fans that made the trip.

With four touchdowns on the ground, McMaryion became just the second Fresno State quarterback to rush for four touchdowns in a game - joining Mark Barsotti's feat in 1989. McMaryion finished 22-of-33



The Fresno State defense was again stingy, forcing four UCLA turnovers while limiting the Bruins to 270 yards of offense with 151 yards through the air and 119 yards on the ground. Junior safety Mike Bell had a team-high seven tackles, five solo, adding two pass breakups and tackle for loss. Junior linebacker Jeff Allison snagged his first two career interceptions while getting in on six tackles. The 'Dogs also forced a pair of UCLA fumbles that were recovered by Patrick Belony and James Bailey

How It Happened

Fresno State got its offense going from the outset as the 'Dogs received the opening kickoff and went on a 13-play, 75-yard drive that burned 4:57 off the clock as McMaryion ran in a one-yard touchdown run (watch) to cap the drive. The 'Dogs converted all three third downs on the opening drive while being balanced with 39 yards rushing and passing for 36 yards, including a pair of passes to Johnson for 19 yards.

After holding UCLA to 17 yards on five plays on their first offensive possession, the Bulldogs got the ball back and continued their hot offense with a 8-play, 75-yard drive that was finished by McMaryion finding Riddering down the left hash (watch) to put the 'Dogs ahead 13-0.

For a second straight week, Belony recovered an opponent's fumble as the senior defensive tackle hopped on a Bruins' botched snap at the UCLA 38-yard line (watch). The 'Dogs offense continued to hum along going down the field on a 6-play, 27-yard drive that finished with a 28-yard field goal by Asa Fuller (watch) to extend the 'Dogs lead to 16-0. The Bulldog offense finished the first quarter with 147 yards of offense while UCLA only countered with 38 yards, but the roles reversed in the second quarter as the 'Dogs were held to 30 yards and UCLA churned out 122 yards.

The Bruins took advantage of forcing a McMaryion fumble to strike quickly on a 45-yard touchdown pass from quarterback Dorian Thompson-Robinson to wide receiver Theo Howard, but that would be all the scoring for the Bruins the first half.

The Bulldogs took a 16-7 lead into the locker room at halftime and UCLA continued to take advantage of Fresno State miscues early in the second half. A botched punt return by Johnson set UCLA up at the Bulldogs' 17-yard line. The Bruins' capped the short scoring drive with a two-yard touchdown run by Bolu Olorunfunmi to cut the 'Dogs lead to 16-14 with 12:59 left in the third quarter.

Fresno State's offense got back to firing as it was in the first quarter halfway though the third quarter, closing the game with 22-unanswered points over the final 24 minutes. It started with an 8-play, 73-yard drive that was punctuated by a one-yard touchdown run by McMaryion (watch), his second of the game, and a successful vo-point conversion pass from Jorge Reyna to Gunner Javernick (watch) to put the Bulldogs out front, 24-14, at the 6:19 mark in the third.

The defense played its part in the Bulldogs' late explosion as Allison snagged his first career interception to put the Bulldogs' offense at the 49-yard line (watch) to start their next scoring drive. The 'Dogs used a 5-play, 51-yard drive that was capped by McMaryion's third rushing score of the night, a one-yard plunge (watch), that put the 'Dogs up 31-14 with 3:43 to play in the third quarter.

Allison kept the 'Dogs defensive pressure up and grabbed his second interception of the game (watch) on the Bruins' next offensive possession. The Bulldogs made it three straight scoring drives capped by a McMaryion touchdown, this time a two-yard score (watch) that proved to be the final score of the game as Fresno State walked out of the Rose Bowl with a 38-14 win.

FRESNO, Calif. - Using a run of 42 unanswered points, Fresno State overcame an early 13-7 deficit to roll to a convincing 49-27 win over Toledo on Saturday evening at Bulldog Stadium.

Fresno State, who finished nonconference play with a 3-1 record, accounted for a season-high 554 yards of offense in the contest with 368 yards through the air and 186 yards rushing.

After picking up the offensive player of the week award after his last performance against UCLA accounting for five total touchdowns, senior quarterback Marcus McMaryion produced five more scores, tossing a season-high four through the air while running for one on the ground. McMaryion completed 24-of-31 passes for 368 yards, the most by a Bulldog quarterback since Derek Carr passed for 404 against Utah State on Dec. 7, 2013. McMaryion also became the first quarterback since Carr in 2013 (New Mexico and San Jose State) to ccount for five touchdowns in back-to-back games



Sophomore running back Jordan Mims made a career-high six receptions for 126 yards and became the first Bulldog running back since Paris Gaines on Dec. 31, 2000 to account for 100 or more receiving yards in a game. Senior wide receiver KeeSean Johnson added six catches for 102 yards and two touchdowns for his seventh career 100-yard game and sixth career multi-score contest.

On the ground, Mims and junior running back Josh Hokit each accounted for 59 yards as the 'Dogs ran the ball 38 times in the game for an average of 4.9 vards per carry.

Defensively, junior linebacker Jeff Allison led the team in tackles for the third time this season making nine stops in the game. Senior defensive back Anthoula Kelly made a career-high seven tackles while accounting for three of the Bulldogs' five pass breakups in the game while junior defensive end Mykal Walker returned a 38-yard interception for a touchdown (watch), a sack, 2.5 tackles for loss and a pass breakup.

For a third time this season, the 'Dogs took their first offensive drive for a touchdown going on a 12-play, 75-yard journey down the field that ended with a four-yard touchdown run by Mims (watch). McMaryion went a perfect 7-of-7 for 58 yards connecting with five different teammates as junior tight end Cam Sutton made his first career reception with an 18-yard gain.

After being held to six yards and a three-and-out on its first drive, Toledo wasted little time responding with a 10-play, 75-yard drive that finished with a 19-yard touchdown pass from Rockets' quarterback Mitchell Guadagni to running back Shakif Seymour.

With the total yardage at 98 yards for each side and the score tied 7-7 after the opening quarter, Toledo opened the second quarter with a 36-yard run by Guadagni followed by a 15-yard personal foul penalty that sent the Rockets down to the Bulldog 30. The Bulldogs' defense held strong from that point, holding Toledo to a 46-yard field goal by Jameson Vest that gave the Rockets' a 10-7 lead.

With the Bulldogs trailing for the first time since Sept. 8 at Minnesota, McMaryion found Johnson on a bubble screen that he took upfield for 24 yards before McMaryion was intercepted for only the second time this season as Toledo defensive tackle Reggie Howard batted McMaryion's arm to force the ball in the air and into the awaiting arms of defensive end Jamal Hines.

It did not end in six points, but Toledo took advantage of the 'Dogs miscue connecting on a 43-yard field goal by Vest that extended the

The 'Dogs responded to the Rockets' pair of field goals in a hurry with a 6-play, 76-yard drive in 1:43 to re-gain a one-point advantage, 14-13. McMaryion found Mims who scampered for 55 yards after a short pass, and on the ensuing play connected with Johnson on a seven-yard bubble screen that he took to the end zone to push the Bulldogs ahead.

One three-and-out later forced by the Bulldog defense, allowed McMaryion to guide the offense to a 6-play, 78-yard drive that featured a season-long 21-yard run by Hokit and a 36-yard flip from McMaryion to Jamire Jordan that was finished off by a two-yard touchdown toss from McMaryion to senior tight end Kyle Riddering to put the 'Dogs ahead 21-13.

The defense again made life tough for the Rockets as junior defensive end Kwami Jones came up with his first sack of the season that forced the Rockets to punt, which was returned by Ronnie Rivers for 18 yards as the sophomore running back made his season debut

The next Fresno State score was set up by McMaryion finding Mims out of the backfield down the right sideline for a 47-yard touchdown that gave the 'Dogs their third straight touchdown and pushed the lead to 28-13.

After gaining 346 yards of offense in the first half with 286 yards coming through the air and 60 yards on the ground, the 'Dogs opened the second half and put together a 6-play, 75-yard drive that ended with a 12-yard touchdown pass from McMaryion to Johnson in the left corner of the end zone to push the 'Dogs lead to 35-13.

On the drive, McMaryion went 3-for-3 for 64 yards finding Johnson for a 39-yard connection that pushed him into eighth all-time in program history in receiving yards passing Isaiah Burse (2010-13)

The 'Dogs added two more touchdowns in the third quarter as Walker's 38-vard interception return was the Bulldogs' fourth non-offensive return for a touchdown this season and was the second interception returned for a touchdown this season by a Bulldog

McMaryion added his fifth touchdown of the game with a six-yard rush with 2:48 to play in the third quarter to give the 'Dogs a 49-13 lead (watch). Toledo added two fourth quarter touchdowns as Eli Peters connected with Jon Vea Johnson for a 54-yard score followed by a 24-

RENO, Nev. - Behind stout defense from the Bulldogs and two touchdowns from sophomore running back Ronnie Rivers, Fresno State defeated Nevada 21-3 in its Mountain West opener on Saturday evening at Mackay

Holding Nevada to only a field goal in the contest, the Fresno State defense forced three turnovers and limited the Wolf Pack to 3.8 yards per play on offense

Senior quarterback Marcus McMaryion went 20-of-28 passing, completing better than 70 percent of his throws for the fourth time in five games. He racked up 241 vards and tossed two touchdowns.



The beneficiary to each of McMaryion's touchdown throws were senior wide receiver KeeSean Johnson (27yard TD) and Rivers (19-yard TD). Johnson had a team-high seven receptions for 65 yards and a touchdown while Rivers' TD grab was his sole reception on the evening. Junior tight end Jared Rice tallied a team-high and career-high 98 yards on three receptions which included a career-long 69-yard reception.

Defensively, the 'Dogs linebacker corps was outstanding as junior linebacker Jeff Allison led the way with a career-high 17 tackles, 10 solo, while adding half-a-sack and half-a-tackle. Senior linebacker George Helmuth added 11 tackles, 1.5 tackles for loss and 0.5 sack and fellow senior James Bailey tacked on 10 tackles, 2.5

The secondary ripped off three interceptions, with the wealth being spread around with senior cornerback Anthoula Kelly, junior strong safety Juju Hughes and junior free safety Mike Bell tallying one apiece.

With neither team able to generate much offense in the early going, the game was scoreless after the opening quarter. The 'Dogs edged the Wolf Pack in total yards, 73-58.

With the ball at the Nevada 30-yard line and a fresh set of downs to open the second quarter, Fresno State finished their first scoring drive with McMaryion finding Rivers in the flat for a 19-yard touchdown pass to cap a nine play, 69-yard drive that spanned four minutes, nine seconds

Nevada responded to the Bulldogs' touchdown drive with an 11-play, 51-yard drive that resulted in a 41-yard field goal by Wolf Pack kicker Ramiz Ahmed to cut the 'Dogs lead to 7-3. Nevada converted a key 4th-and-2 with a 13-yard rush by quarterback Christian Solano which helped set up the Wolf Pack's only scoring drive of the night.

Later in the second quarter, Kelly intercepted Solano and returned it 43 yards to the Wolf Pack 11 for his third interception of the season. Unfortunately for the 'Dogs, a play later McMaryion's pass to Jamire Jordan was jarred loose from Jordan causing the 'Dogs only turnover on Saturday.

Hughes made it two Bulldog interceptions over the final 2:35 of the first half by picking off Solano on a 3rdand-10 with 11 seconds remaining in the half to end the threat of a Wolf Pack score. Fresno State held a 7-3 lead heading into the locker room at the break.

Limited to only 125 yards of offense to that point, the 'Dogs broke out on its second offensive drive of the third quarter as McMaryion found Rice for a 69-yard reception, taken down at the Nevada 11 to ultimately set up the Bulldogs' next score. Nevada wouldn't make it easy for Fresno State as they were able to convert a 4th-and-1 from the Nevada 2 to increase the lead to 14-3. Rivers delivered the score with his second touchdown of the

Bell became the eighth Bulldog this season to notch an interception early in the fourth quarter as the 'Dogs

The 'Dogs added one final score with 8:28 to play in the fourth quarter as McMaryion found Johnson for a 27-yard score to give the Bulldogs a 21-3 lead. Nevada made one last push for the end zone driving the ball 61 yards on 16 plays over five minutes, but the defense stood tall forcing a turnover on downs at the Fresno State 10-yard line with 3:18 left in the game

FRESNO, Calif. - The Fresno State football team defeated Wyoming 27-3 on Saturday evening at Bulldog Stadium to improve to 5-1 on the season and 2-0 in Mountain West play.

Fresno State's defense limited Wyoming to 221 total yards and forced one turnover while the Bulldog offense totaled 391 yards and did not commit a

Senior quarterback Marcus McMarvion accounted Senior quarterback Marcus Memaryion accomined for four total touchdowns in the game, two passing and two rushing. He completed 22-of-32 passes for 287 yards and ran for a season-high 53 yards on seven carries. McMaryion has now accounted for 18 touchdowns this season - 11 passing and seven rushing



Junior tight end Jared Rice had a career-high seven receptions for 94 yards and caught a touchdown while senior wide receiver KeeSean Johnson added five receptions for 51 yards. Sophomore running back Ronnie Rivers added 90 all-purpose yards with 53 yards receiving, 22 yards rushing and 15 punt return yards.

Defensively, junior linebacker Jeff Allison posted his third double-figure tackle performance of the season finishing with 13 tackles. Junior free safety Mike Bell made his second interception of the season and senior defensive end Emeka Ndoh added a tackle for loss and a sack.

How It Happened

Allowing their opponent to score first for only the second time this season, Wyoming opened the game with a 8-play, 47-yard drive that was capped by Cowboy kicker Cooper Rothe nailing a 44-yard field goal to give the visitors a 3-0 lead

From that point forward, the Bulldogs' defense shutout the Cowboys and rolled to 27 consecutive points.

After Fresno State's opening drive was unsuccessful, the Bulldogs' next drive would take two plays as McMaryion found Rice for a 35-yard touchdown pass to take a 6-3 lead. The point after was missed.

The Cowboys outgained the 'Dogs 74-70 in the opening quarter, but the Bulldogs' defense held the Wyoming offense to 44 yards in the second quarter.

The Bulldogs' sole second quarter scoring drive covered 46 yards over 12 plays and five minutes, 48 seconds, that included converting a crucial fourth-and-1 with a three-yard carry by Jordan Mims to keep their drive alive. Three plays later they faced a third-and-13 from the Cowboy 37-yard line and McMaryion found Rice for 16 yards down to the 21-yard line and followed that with a 20-yard connection to Cam Sutton as the junior tight end nearly found the end zone reaching out for the score before being knocked out at the 1-yard line. After three plays of not finding the checkboard, the Bulldogs converted a second fourth down as they scored on fourth-andgoal with McMaryion sneaking it in himself to give Fresno State a 13-3 lead with 52 seconds remaining in the half. The half would close with the 'Dogs holding the 10 point lead.

The Bulldog defense forced Wyoming into negative four yards on its opening offensive drive of the second half and for the third time in the game, the 'Dogs started a drive in Wyoming territory. The Bulldogs proceeded to go on a 6-play, 47-yard drive that was capped with a three-yard touchdown pass from McMaryion to senior tight end David Tangipa to put Fresno State ahead 20-3.

The 'Dogs closed out the scoring for the night on its next offensive drive with a 6-play, 85-yard drive that was finished off with a six-vard touchdown run by McMarvion.

The third quarter was capped off with the 'Dogs forcing their only takeaway of the game as Mike Bell came up with an interception with 29 seconds remaining in the frame.

The Bulldogs had two drives in the final quarter for 71 yards, but were stopped on fourth down and forced to punt as neither side scored in the final quarter, marking the first time since the 'Dogs were at San Diego State in 2017, a span of 12 games, that saw no scoring in the final frame by either team.



Fresno State (6-1, 3-0 MW) finished with 433 total yards in the contest passing for 280 yards while rushing for 153 yards. The 'Dogs limited New Mexico (3-4, 1-2 MW) to 280 yards as the Lobos nearly evenly split their yards rushing for 148 yards and passing for 132 yards.



as it was his fourth straight game with multiple touchdown passes. Senior wide receiver KeeSean Johnson had a career-high 149 receiving yards while matching his season-high with eight receptions and grabbed two touchdown receptions for his second multi-touchdown game of the season. Sophomore running back Ronnie Rivers totaled 146 all-purpose yards and tallied his first career three-touchdown game appearing all over the field for the 'Dogs. Rivers finished with 69 receiving yards, 48 rushing yards and 29 punt return yards, scoring two of his touchdowns on the ground while tacking on one more through the air.

Defensively, junior linebacker Jeff Allison finished with a team-high 10 tackles, eight solo, while junior defensive end Mykal Walker totaled six tackles. Junior free safety Mike Bell gave the 'Dogs their 13th interception of the season, snagging a pick for the third straight game

How It Happened

Scoring first for the fifth time this season, the Bulldogs matched their opening drive that went scoreless, venturing on an identical 10-play, 44-yard drive that was highlighted by a 26-yard pass from McMaryion to Rivers down to the Lobos 17-yard line. A four-yard rush by Josh Hokit got the 'Dogs down to the 4-yard line, but a false start by the Bulldogs pushed them back to the 9-yard line and a Lobo sack of four yards on third down set up a 30-yard field goal by Fuller to give the 'Dogs a 3-0 lead.

The Bulldogs' defense forced its second-straight three-and-out after picking up its first points of the game on the previous drive, and picked up excellent field position obtaining the ball back at the Lobos' 46-yard line. The Bulldogs made quick work of its next drive as Rivers took home a 16-yard rushing touchdown on the ground to put Fresno State up 10-0 after the PAT.

After the Bulldog defense held the Lobos to 30 total yards and one first down in the first quarter, Fresno State's defense continued to make life difficult for the Lobos as free safety Mike Bell came up with his third interception in as many games to give the 'Dogs the ball back at Lobos 26-yard-line. A 13-yard run by McMaryion put the 'Dogs at the UNM 1-yard line before Rivers ran in his second rushing touchdown of the game to put the 'Dogs ahead 17-0

New Mexico broke up the Bulldogs' shutout bid with 57 seconds remaining in the first half as the Lobos connected on a 16-yard touchdown pass from quarterback Sheriron Jones to wide receiver Elijah Lilly. The touchdown pass finished off a 7-play, 71-yard drive and momentarily cut the Fresno State lead to 17-7

Fresno State wasted little time to counter the Lobos' score before the half, capitalizing on two 15-yard penalties on an 11-yard pass from McMaryion to Rivers. That was followed by a 34-yard touchdown strike from McMaryion to Johnson to extend the 'Dogs lead back to 24-7 with 36 second left to cap a lighting quick 21

With the offense getting the ball to start the second quarter, the 'Dogs continued to roll on offense going on a 14-play, 75-yard drive that consumed 6:28 off the clock as McMaryion found Johnson across the middle for a 15-yard touchdown score which put the Bulldogs up 31-7

Fresno State was again aided by two 15-yard Lobo penalties on the same play on its next drive, quickly racing down the field on an 80-yard, four-play drive that McMaryion capped off by connecting with Rivers for a 23yard pass for his third touchdown pass of the night giving the 'Dogs a 38-7 lead.

FRESNO, Calif. - Fresno State made it six straight wins with a 50-20 Homecoming victory over Hawai'i on Saturday night at Bulldog Stadium. The Bulldogs (7-1, 4-0 MW) totaled a season-high 562 yards of offense passing for 348 yards and rushing for 214 while holding Hawai'i (6-4, 3-2 MW), who came in averaging 34.9 points per game, to their second fewest points scored this season.

Senior wide receiver KeeSean Johnson matched his season-high with eight receptions and had his fourth 100-yard receiving game of the season finishing with a team-high 102 yards. With his final reception of the night, Johnson became the program's all-time receptions leader with 234 passing current Green Bay Packer wide receiver and former Bulldog Davante Adams (2012-13).

Senior quarterback Marcus McMaryion continued his outstanding play with his fifth straight game with multiple touchdown passe

tossing four scores to four different receivers while connecting on 21-of-31 passes for 284 yards. On the ground, sophomore running back Ronnie Rivers ran for a career-best 125 yards on 11 carries and scored the Bulldogs' lone rushing touchdown with a 76-yard burst in the second quarter

Defensively, the Bulldog defense was led by junior defensive end Mykal Walker who finished with a team-high nine tackles, six solo, 3.5 tackles for loss, one sack and a fumble recovery. The 'Dogs nabbed their 14th interception of the season as junior free safety Juju Hughes made his second interception of the year. The Bulldog defense has now forced 20 turnovers on the season.

Allowing their opponent to score first for the third time this season, Hawai'i got on scoreboard first on an eight-play, 50-yard drive as Rainbow Warriors kicker Ryan Meskell nailed a 43-yard field goal to take a 3-0 lead.

After the Bulldog defense forced a three-and-out on the next Hawai' i offensive drive, Rivers returned a punt eight yards to the Hawai' i 41-yard line and after two rushes by the sophomore running back brought the ball down to the Hawai' i 30-yard line, the game went into a 29-minute delay due to a portion of the stadium lights malfunctioning.

With the game resuming play at 8:30 p.m. PT, the Bulldogs quickly found the end zone two plays later as McMaryion found Rice for a 19-yard touchdown to give the 'Dogs a 7-3 lead.

The Bulldog defense held the Rainbow Warriors to four yards on its next drive, getting the ball back at their own 29-yard line and quickly made their way down the field before McMaryion connected on a 49-yard touchdown pass to Jamire Jordan for the senior wide receiver's first touchdown reception of the season

With the 'Dogs leading 14-3 after the opening quarter, Hawai'i quickly responded with a four-play, 75-yard drive as Hawai'i quarterback Cole McDonald found wide receiver JoJo Ward down the right hash for a 50-yard touchdown to cut the Bulldogs' lead to four.

A game featuring two high-flying offenses, and the offensive fireworks continued on the first play of the next offensive drive as Rivers broke loose for a 76-yard touchdown run, the longest touchdown run by a Bulldog running back since Marteze Waller in 2014, to give the 'Dogs at 21-10 lead. Holding Hawai'i to its hird three-and-out of the game, the 'Dogs quickly got the hall back and went on though straight scoring drive, marching down the field on a seven-play, 52 yard drive as kicker Asa Fuller connected on a 22-yard field goal to extend the lead to 24-10.

The Rainbow Warriors answered back with a nine-play, 65-yard drive that took 4.22 off the clock as Meskell connected on his second field goal of the night making it from 28-yards out to cut Fresno State's lead down to 24-13. The 'Dogs answered back with its fifth straight scoring drive as McMaryion tossed his third touchdown pass of the game with a 21-yard strike to Jordan Mims to complete a nine-play, 74-yard drive and push the Bulldogs 'lead to 30-13.

The Bulldogs completed the barrage of first-half scoring in the final seconds of the second quarter as the Rainbow Warriors' 53-yard field goal attempt came up well short and allowed Jordan to return it from the end zone. After a few key blocks by the Bulldogs, the Lancaster, Calif. native was off to the races for a 100-yard missed field goal return for a touchdown to give the 'Dogs a 37-13 advantage.

Getting the ball to start the third quarter, the 'Dogs scored on a season-high sixth straight drive with a methodical 14-play, 61-yard drive that took 5:05 off the clock as Fuller hit his second field goal of the night making it from 32-yards out to increase the lead to 40-13.

Hughes quickly gave the ball back to the 'Dogs with his second interception of the season returning the ball 31 yards to the Hawai'i 16-yard line to set up another Bulldog touchdown as McMaryion found Derrion Grim for a 6-yard score to make it 23 straight points for the 'Dogs to push their lead to 47-13 (watch).

Fuller added his third field goal of the night, a 21-varder, in the fourth quarter to complete the Bulldog scoring. Hawai'i ended Fresno State's run of 26 straight points with a 27-yard touchdown pass with 1:43 to play in the fourth quarter for the final result, 50-20.

LAS VEGAS - No. 20/23 Fresno State earned its seventh consecutive win on Saturday night with a 48-3 road win over UNLV at Sam Boyd Stadium. The Bulldogs (8-1, 5-0 MW) totaled 466 yards of offense, passing for 274 yards and rushing for 192 while holding UNLV (2-6, 0-5 MW) to one field goal, marking the third time this season Fresno State held a team out of

It was a team effort against UNLV as Fresno State's six touchdowns were scored by six different Bulldogs, four rushing and two passing

Senior quarterback Marcus McMaryion had his sixth straight game with multiple touchdown passes throwing

for two to two different receivers while finishing the game 26-of-35 for 274 yards. On the ground, nine different Bulldogs recorded rushes with Ronnie Rivers leading that category with 12 (for 33 yards and one touchdown). Saevion Johnson led the team in rushing yards with 47 yards on three carries, including a long of 37 yards to score the Bulldogs final touchdown of the game.

Defensively the Bulldogs were led by Juju Hughes who finished with a team-high 11 tackles, six solo. The 'Dogs grabbed their 15th interception of the season as junior defensive back Jaron Bryant recorded his first interception of the season. The Bulldog defense has now forced 21 turnovers on the season.

After a pair of first downs by UNLV to open the game, Fresno State's defense held tough, forcing UNLV into a punt. On that punt, Mykal Walker got through the line and partially blocked the punt to set back the kick for a net of just 15 yards to give the Bulldogs field position at the Rebels' 45-yard line for their first offensive drive. The 'Dogs moved the ball 45 yards in six plays as McMaryion hil Jamire Jordan on a slant across the middle for a 12-yard touchdown to put Fresno State in front 7-0 with 10:39 left in the first quarter.

Looking to get on the board midway through the quarter, Evan Pantels lined up for a 46-yard field goal attempt but missed wide to the right. The 'Dogs capitalized, marching nine plays down the field to the Rebels' two-yard line as time expired in the first quarter. Ronnie Rivers scored on a two-yard rush to the right side on the first play of the second frame to increase Fresno State's lead to 14-0.

With three minutes remaining before halftime, Blake Cusick pinned UNLV at its own 8-yard line. Fresno State held the Rebels to a three-and-out and set the 'Dogs up at their own 42-yard line. The Bulldogs used the short field to their advantage, picking up three points with an Asa Fuller 35-yard field goal as they took a 17-0 lead into the half

Receiving the ball out of the break. Fresno State scored on its first drive of the second half for the third consecutive game as McMaryion led the 'Dogs 65 yards down the field before connecting with Kyle Riddering for a nine-yard touchdown. It was Riddering's fifth catch and third touchdown of the season.

Seven plays into the Rebels' ensuing drive, Jaron Bryant grabbed his first pick of the season, returning it 39 yards to the UNLV five-yard line. It took just one play for the Bulldogs to push their lead to 31-0 with 8:22 left in the third quarter as Josh Hokit rushed to the left side and snuck inside the pylon.

After holding UNLV to its fourth three-and-out of the game, Fresno State moved the ball to the Rebel 29-yard line on its next possession. As a Fuller knocked in his second field goal of the game, a season-long 47 yards to extend the lead to 34-0 with 4:42 remaining in the third quarter.

Forcing UNLV to punt on its next drive, Fresno State did just what it did to end the third, drive the ball down into the red zone. On the first play from scrimmage to start the fourth quarter, Derrion Grim scored his first-career rushing touchdown, running into the end zone from 10 yards out to give the Bulldogs a 41-0 advantage.

With 10:13, UNLV ended the Bulldogs' bid for a shutout as Pantels hit a 28-yard field goal.

Starting with the ball at their own 45-yard line, it took just four plays for the Bulldogs to find the end zone one more time. After Saevion Johnson broke loose for a 37-yard run, the sophomore ended the drive with a two-yard touchdown plunge to put Fresno State on top 48-3.

BOISE, Idaho - No. 16/17 Fresno State fell to Boise State 24-17, losing its first Mountain West game of the season on Friday night at Albertsons Stadium after a furious second half comeback by the Broncos who registered 21 unanswered points. The Bulldogs (8-2, 5-1 MW) totaled 390 yards of offense, passing for 283 yards while Boise State (8-2, 5-1 MW) finished the game with 448 yards of offense, the most allowed by Fresno State this season.

Senior quarterback Marcus McMaryion threw for one touchdown and connected on 24-of-35 passes for 283 yards. Senior wide receiver KeeSean Johnson matched



his season-high of eight receptions and finished with a team-high 95 yards. Johnson scored the Bulldogs' first touchdown of the night, a three-yard reception. On the ground, sophomore running back Ronnie Rivers had 33 yards on seven carries and scored the Bulldogs' lone rushing touchdown which gave the 'Dogs a 17-3 lead early in the third quarter.

Junior linebacker Jeff Allison led the team on defense with 14 tackles, seven solo. The 'Dogs grabbed their 16th interception of the season as junior free safety Juju Hughes had the only turnover of the game. It was his fourth career interception and third of the season. The Bulldog defense has forced 22 turnovers on the season while surrendering just seven.

How It Happened

Brett Rypien opened the game with a 41-yard pass to Sean Modster on the first play from scrimmage to put Boise State on the Fresno State 30-yard line. After that, the Bulldogs defense tightened up and the Broncos settled for a Haden Hoggarth 50-yard field goal attempt that sailed wide left.

After the Broncos forced a punt on the Bulldogs' first offensive drive, they moved the ball down inside the red zone. But again, BSU settled for a field goal attempt but this attempt was true, connecting on a 35-yard attempt for a 3-0 lead and 6:37 left on the clock in the first quarter.

Late in the first quarter, Fresno State's offense got things going, using just four plays to flip the field and get the ball into the red zone following a 38-yard reception by Johnson. Two plays later, McMaryion found Johnson for a three-yard score to give the 'Dogs a 7-3 lead with 14:12 remaining in the second quarter.

With Boise State methodically marching down the field, the Bulldogs' defense stood tall inside the red zone, on the 15th play of the Broncos' drive, they lined up for a field goal on fourth-and-3 at the 12-yard line, but the Broncos opted for trickery. On the fake, James Bailey sniffed it out and wrapped the legs of Hoggarth to stop them short and turn the ball over on downs. On Fresno State's ensuring possession, the 'Dogs moved the ball 66 yards on 10 plays, but missed a 38-yard field goal attempt.

With the Broncos looking to take advantage of the missed field goal before the half, Juju Hughes picked off Rypien in the end zone to end the threat and left the offense with 1:14 to capitalize. The 'Dogs drove it 37 yards and gave Asa Fuller an attempt of 47 yards that he snuck inside the right upright to give the Bulldogs a 10-3 lead as time expired on the first half.

Fresno State opened up the second half with the ball, and as they did they did the previous three games, they manufactured points. The 'Dogs went 75 yards on seven plays and extended its lead to 14 with Rivers capping the drive with a one-yard touchdown plunge on fourth down.

From that point on, it was all Boise State. Down 17-3, the Broncos answered the Bulldogs first possession score with a TD of their own using a 12-play drive to pull their deficit back to seven, 17-10. The linchpin of the drive was registering 15 yards on third-and-16 from the FS 47-yard line that was followed by a fourth down conversion. Alex Mattison capped the drive with a seven-yard run. It was the first score for a Bulldog opponent on their opening possession of the second half this season.

At the 14:57 mark in the fourth quarter, Boise State tied the game 17-17. The Broncos moved the ball 58 yards down to the one-yard line at the close of the third quarter and Mattison knotted the game with a one-yard score to start the fourth. The Broncos struck again with 9:22 remaining in the game for the go-ahead score, 24-17, as they moved the ball 34 yards before Rypien found Khalil Shakir down the middle for a 49-yard touchdown on third-and-8 to take the lead.

Fresno State moved the ball into Boise State territory on their final two possessions. The first try fell short as a 50-yard field attempt was blocked on fourth-and-10 from the 30-yard line. The 'Dogs forced a three-and out and got the ball back for once last chance with 5:11 on the clack. The 'Dogs made it as far as the Boise State 29-yard line, but on fourth-and-11 McMaryion's pass attempt down the middle for Johnson was broken up to



FRESNO, Calif. - Clinching a second straight West Division crown and a trip back to the Mountain West championship game, Fresno State overcame a four-point halftime deficit to defeat San Diego State, 23-14, on Saturday evening at Bulldog Stadium.

Holding on to the Oil Can Trophy for a second consecutive season, the Bulldogs rallied from a 14-10 balltime deficit by shutting out SDSU in the second half and limiting them to just 57 yards of offense. Meanwhile, the 'Dogs racked up 178 yards offense and went 4-of-6 on third downs in the second half en route to the comeback



Bulldog quarterback Marcus McMaryion finished 17-of-24 for 267 yards and tossed an 86-yard touchdown to Jamire Jordan while adding 16 rushing yards. The senior from Dinuba has now thrown for at least 200 yards in all 11 games this season. Senior wide receiver KeeSean Johnson matched his career-high with 10 receptions for 141 yards and sophomore running back Ronnie Rivers had a career-high 22 carries totaling 78 yards and

Defensively, safety Juju Hughes led the 'Dogs with nine tackles as the Bulldog defense held the Aztecs rushing attack to 64 yards. SDSU came into the game averaging 166.1 yards per game. The 'Dogs only allowed SDSU to complete eight passes for 218 yards with 145 of those yards coming on 75, and 70-yard touchdowns passes to wide receiver Fred Trevillion.

How It Happened

After Fresno State held San Diego State to a three-and-out, the Bulldogs opened the game on their own 6-yard line after a 55-yard punt. On the third play, McMaryion caught the Aztec defense offside on a third-and-2 and took advantage of the free play, connecting with Jamire Jordan for an 86-yard touchdown down the left sideline to open up the scoring 12:08 into the game

San Diego State leveled the game in the first quarter, 7-7, with a deep ball of their own, a 75-yard touchdown pass from Christian Chapman that found Fred Trevellion in stride with 6:21 on the clock in the first.

The 'Dogs regained the lead with 6:40 remaining in the second quarter as they put together a 10-play, 63-yard drive that ended with a 25-yard field goal from Asa Fuller. It was quick lived though, as the Aztecs went to the air again, this time with different quarterback under center in Ryan Agnew. Agnew connected with Trevellion for a 70-yard touchdown pass on their first play following the Bulldogs' field goal to regain the lead, 14-10. The Aztecs took that lead into the half to mark the second time this season the 'Dogs trailed at the break.

For the fifth straight game, Fresno State took its first possession of the second half in for points. Aided by a 32-yard reception from KeeSean Johnson, the Bulldogs worked the ball 75 yards down the field as Ronnie Rivers ran it from two yards out on a pitch to give the 'Dogs a 17-14 lead. San Diego State looked to tie up the game with just over two minutes remaining in the third, but John Baron's 47-yard attempt stayed left of the upright with 2:16 remaining in the third quarter.

Fresno State went right to work on its ensuing drive. Keyed by a 37-yard reception by Johnson inside the Aztec 5-yard line, the Bulldogs moved the ball 70 yards on 10 plays to extend its lead to 23-14 on a one-yard touchdown plunge from Jordan Mims with 12:40 left in the game

The 'Dogs forced a three-and-out on SDSU's next possession and Isaiah Johnson ended the Aztecs final drive

FRESNO, Calif. - Overcoming a sluggish start in the first half, Fresno State used four second-half touchdowns to ease to a 31-13 victory over San Jose State on Senior Day at Bulldog Stadium.

Fresno State (10-2, 7-1 MW) totaled 515 yards of offense with 326 of that coming in the second half as the Bulldogs scored 28 of their 31 points over their final 30 minutes.

McMaryion and KeeSean Johnson sparked the offense during the second half as McMaryion went 11-of-12 for 242 yards and two touchdowns with Johnson catching six of those

passes for 165 yards and one of McMaryion's two TD throws.



McMaryion totaled 347 yards offense in his final start at Bulldog Stadium, passing for 317 yards on 20-of-29 attempts and added 30 rushing yards. Johnson finished with a career-high 173 receiving yards on seven receptions while scoring on a 31-yard touchdown in the third quarter (watch) to become the program's all-time leader in receiving yards passing former Bulldog wideout Charlie Jones. On the ground, the Bulldogs totaled 198 yards as sophomore running back Ronnie Rivers led the way with 92 yards on 17 carries. Jordan Mims added 55 yards on eight carries and scored his sixth rushing touchdown of the season.

Defensively, the Bulldogs limited San Jose State (1-11, 1-7 MW) to 60 rushing yards and 367 total yards. Junior defensive end Mykal Walker led the way for the second time time this season, recording eight tackles, 1.5 tackles for loss and two quarterback hurries while Arron Mosby put the game away scoring the Bulldogs final touchdown with a 95-yard pick-six with less than five minutes remaining

How It Happened

After a scoreless first quarter, SJSU looked to be the first team on the scoreboard midway through the second quarter after completing an 18-yard pass from quarterback Michael Carrillo to wide receiver Tre Walker that set up a 4th-and-1 at the Fresno State 30-yard line, but the 'Dogs came up with a key defensive stop by Mike Bell (watch) to get the Bulldogs the ball back. The 'Dogs capitalized on the turnover-on-downs with a 13-play, 54-yard drive that took the ball down to the Spartans 15-yard line to set up a 32-yard field goal by Asa Fuller to put the Bulldogs ahead 3-0 at halftime. Despite only three points, the Bulldogs registered 189 yards offense to the Spartans' 130.

The third quarter saw the Bulldogs' offense catch fire scoring a pair of touchdowns. The first came on a quick five-play, 77-yard drive in 1:49 that used a 17-yard run by Mims and a 45-yard pass from McMaryion to Johnson to set up a 1-yard touchdown run by Mims (watch). Fresno State extended its lead to 17-0 on its next offensive drive using back-to-back receptions by Johnson, one for 37 yards (watch) which was then followed by a 31-yard touchdown.

On the first play of fourth quarter, the Spartans answered back breaking up the Bulldogs' shutout bid with a 73-yard touchdown pass from Carrillo to running back Malike Roberson that cut the lead to 17-7.

Fresno State then made it three straight offensive drives with a touchdown, going on a six-play, 78-yard drive, that was capped by an 18-yard pass from McMaryion to Rivers (watch) to put the 'Dogs ahead 24-7 with 11:59 to go in the game.

After the Bulldogs' second turnover of the game, a fumble by running back Josh Hokit, it gave the Spartans the ball back at their own 25-yard line, the Spartans drove the ball 66 yards in four plays before Mosby picked off a Carrillo pass at the Fresno State 5-yard line (watch) and returned it 95 yards for a touchdown, the longest interception return for a touchdown by a Bulldog since 2004

SJSU added one final touchdown on its last offensive drive with a four-yard touchdown pass from Carrillo to Walker to make it the final score 31-13.
