## 'Dogs in Season Openers

Fresno State begins its 97th season of football in the Sept. 1 opener against Idaho. Saturday's contest will be the 1,050th game played in Fresno State football history as they go for the program's 600th all-time win. When it comes to season openers, Fresno State has a 12-6 record since the year 2000 - with four of those six losses succumbed to top 25 teams (Ohio State-2000, Wisconsin-2002, Tennessee-2003 and USC-2014).

→ When opening the season at home, Fresno State has not lost since an overtime bout with Oregon in 1997 (Aug. 31) - falling 30-27 to the Ducks. The 'Dogs have since won 11 consecutive games which includes wins against Rutgers, Cincinnati and Nevada.

→ The Bulldogs are 56-36-4 overall in season openers all-time.

## Scouting Idaho Vandals

Idaho was 4-8 in 2017 under sixth-year head coach Paul Petrino. Idaho, a former WAC rival, makes its first trip to Fresno since 2010. Since leaving the WAC after the 2012 season, the Vandals played as an independent in 2013 (1-11) before joining the Sun Belt for the last four seasons. They compiled an 18-30 overall record and a 13-19 conference mark from 2014-17. This season, Idaho enters the year as a member of the Big Sky Conference. The Vandals will become the first program to drop down from the Football Bowl Subdivision to FCS since 1982, and the only one to do so without the NCAA forcing a decision. With the move, Idaho football joins where all of its other teams compete as league members. Idaho played football in the Big Sky Conference from 1965-1995, winning nine conference championships. All UI sports left the Big Sky in 1996, with most other sports other than football returning in 2014.

The Idaho football team returns 35 lettermen and 11 starters from a season ago.

The Vandals return a pair of quarterbacks with some playing experience in junior Mason Petrino who has appeared in 16 career games over the last two seasons throwing for 271 yards and three touchdowns while sophomore Colton Richardson played in a pair of games as a freshman in 2017, including making a start in the season finale, a 24-10 win against Georgia State. There is an "or" on the official two-deep for week one so who starts between the duo is TBD for Sept. 1. In the backfield, the Vandals lose running back Aaron Duckworth who rushed for 1,025 yards a season ago, but do return the services of redshirt senior Isaiah Saunders who ran for 506 yards in 2017 and has 1,277 career rushing yards. Senior wide receiver David Ungerer is Idaho's top returning receiver after making 39 receptions for 432 receiving yards and six touchdowns a season ago.

On the defensive side of the ball, the Vandals return five of their top 10 tacklers from 2017. Senior linebacker Christian Elliss, a second-team All-Sun Belt selection a season ago, returns after ranking second on the team with 80 tackles while ranking third in the Sun Belt with 16 tackles for loss and fifth in the conference with six sacks.

## 'Dogs vs. FCS Opponents

Saturday's game will be Fresno State's 14th against an FCS school since 2000 and the previous 13 have been Fresno State victories at Bulldog Stadium. The Bulldogs have won each meeting this decade against their FCS opponents by an average of 28.5 points per game. In 2017, Fresno State defeated Incarnate Word, 66-0, to open the season.

→ This will be the fourth time since joining the Mountain West in 2012 that the 'Dogs will have started their season at home against an FCS opponent.

## Dogs vs. current Big Sky teams

The 'Dogs are 89-38-4 (.679) all-time against the 13 current members of the Big Sky. Fresno State most recently defeated Sacramento State, 31-3, at home in 2016.

→ The last loss Fresno State suffered to a team currently affiliated with the Big Sky came against Montana State on Nov. 17, 1984.

→ Head coach Jeff Tedford is 5-0 all-time against current Big Sky members with wins over Sacramento State (2005), Portland State (2006), Eastern Washington (2009), UC Davis (2010) and Southern Utah (2012) while coaching at Cal. The Golden Bears averaged 48.8 points per game and an average margin of victory of 36.8 in those five contest.

## Conference preseason predictions

The 'Dogs were predicted to finish first in the West Division of the Mountain West in the 2018 MW preseason poll and are coming off winning the West Division in 2017 after going 7-1 in conference play. It was the fourth time in six years the 'Dogs have won their division or a share of the Mountain West title since moving to the league in 2012.

→ The Bulldogs have been predicted to win their division twice before being picked to repeat as West Division champs in 2018. In the previous such occasions in 2013 and 2014 when the 'Dogs were picked to represent the West in the Mountain West Championship Game, they did just that.

## Team Captains

Seniors Marcus McMaryion (QB) and George Helmuth (LB) were named the Bulldogs' 2018 team captains. The duo will serve as the team's permanent captains throughout the season while two other individuals will be named on a game-by-game basis. This 2 & 2 format was instituted in year one under Jeff Tedford.

Last season, under Tedford's captain system, four juniors (now seniors) represented the Bulldogs as game-by-game picks. Those players were James Bailey (5x), KeeSean Johnson (4x), Kyle Riddering (3x) and Micah St. Andrew (1x).

## From walk-on, to team captain

Fifth-year senior George Helmuth has had quite the journey over the course of his career that started in 2014 as a walk-on. The local product, who saw action early, but primarily on special teams, turned his Fresno State football career upside down in 2017. After a redshirt season in 2014, and limited time in 2015-16 that resulted in 24 career tackles entering the 2017 season, Helmuth racked up 89 tackles last season and finished second on the team and 16th in the MW in that category. And he did all that while not making his first career start until game No. 4 of the season (vs Nevada). But from that point on he has not relinquished his spot in the lineup. He earned his first career Mountain West Defensive Player of the Week honor after tallying a career-high 11 tackles, seven solo, and recovered a critical fumble in the Bulldogs' 13-7 MW West Division clinching win at Wyoming on Nov. 18. And for the year, he was named an All-Mountain West honorable mention selection.

## Bulldogs sporting national watch list similarities to its last championship season

There are a few preseason notables that make the 2018 preseason feel a bit like the Bulldogs' preseason leading into the 2013 season - the last time the 'Dogs won the Mountain West Championship. It starts with the preseason poll released by the league as voted upon by the media that Fresno State is predicted to win its division. Another, individually.

The catalysts of that magical 2013 season was the lethal combo of Derek Carr and Davante Adams, and the services of other future NFL players in Derron Smith and Marcel Jensen.

In particular, there are five national award watch lists that were given to the likes of Adams, Carr, Jensen and Smith in 2013, that players on the 2018 team share the same distinction.

## Nation's Best: 36 and counting

Since his redshirt freshman season, in 2015, senior KeeSean Johnson has been a steady pass catcher for Bulldog quarterbacks. The East Palo Alto native has one game in his entire career where he went without a catch - at Ole Miss in 2015 as a redshirt freshman. Since then, Johnson has caught at least one pass in 36 consecutive games. The next closest pass catcher owns 30.

## On his way to being an all-timer

KeeSean Johnson, the Bulldogs' leading receiver over the past two seasons, is working his way up the Fresno State record books by putting up consistent numbers over the years. With a single-season best 77 receptions as a junior, Johnson has risen to No. 8 on the Fresno State all-time top 10 for pass receptions in a career. Johnson is poised to break the program's all-time record held by current Green Bay Packers wide receiver and fellow Bay Area native Davante Adams' all-time record established in 2013; if he meets his average set over his sophomore and junior seasons (71.5) as a senior, he can break it as he is 53 catches shy of that record.

## O-Line movement

The 'Dogs lost two offensive linemen with 64 career starts between them (Aaron Mitchell, David Patterson) but return three with 71 career combined starts (Netane Muti, Christian Cronk, Micah St. Andrew) going into the 2018 season opener.

**Sr. Micah St. Andrew:** RG > C

The challenge ahead in matching last year's dominance also comes with the challenge that the three offensive linemen that return are each holding court with a new position on the line in 2018.

Pegged to fill the shoes of the other two starters lost is senior Markus Boyer, who will go to right guard, and redshirt freshman Syrus Tuitlele at right tackle.

Fresno State allowed just seven sacks through 12 regular season games a year ago; that unit allowed 10 sacks over 14 games, equaling 0.71 sacks allowed per game, which ranked No. 3 in the nation. There were just four other teams that held its opponent under 1.00 sacks per game (Army, Marshall, Appalachian State) in 2017. Of those four, Fresno State was the only team that played 14 or more games. All five linemen started all 14 games in 2017, respectively.

→ Micah St. Andrew is the Bulldogs' current leader in consecutive starts, owning 29.

→ The 'Dogs allowed more than one sack in a game just twice in 2017 (at Alabama/at Boise State).

→ Fresno State held six opponents without a sack in 2017.

## Kid in a candy store

As quoted from quarterback Marcus McMaryion, he's like a "kid in a candy store," as it relates to his aerial weapons. McMaryion will have at his disposal fourth-year starters KeeSean Johnson and Jamire Jordan and Mackey Award watch list tight end Jared Rice - a group that is responsible for 83 percent of team's receiving yardage production in 2017. Add in Michiah Quick, a transfer from Oklahoma, and Delvon Hardaway, who was granted a sixth-year of eligibility after suffering a season-ending injury during his 2017 fall camp, and it's well stated that McMaryion will be like a kid in a candy store in 2018 when he is in the pocket.

## They're all back

In 2017, running backs Josh Hokit, Jordan Mims, Deonte O'Neal and Ronnie Rivers, and quarterback Marcus McMaryion combined for 2,098 yards rushing. It put the Bulldogs over 2,000 yards for a season for only the second time since 2010. Fresno State's balanced attack should continue this season as all five players return to the Bulldog backfield.

→ Prior to 2010, Fresno State recorded seven straight seasons (2003-09) with over 2,000 yards on the ground.

## QB1

For a second straight season and for the fifth time in the last six seasons, the Bulldogs will open the season with a different starting quarterback in the season opener.

With Marcus McMaryion expected to get the start under center against the Vandals, he will become the sixth different Bulldog quarterback to start a season opener since 2009 joining Ryan Colburn (2009-10), Derek Carr (2011-13), Brian Burrell (2014), Zack Greenlee (2015) and Chason Virgil (2016-17).

## Follow-up campaign?

Fresno State's 10-win season in 2017 gave the program its 10th double-digit win season in its history and the first 10-plus win season for the Bulldogs since 2013 when they won 11. Only once during the program's history have the 'Dogs strung together back-to-back seasons with double-digit wins.

→ Following a 10-2 campaign in 1988, Fresno State posted its best winning percentage in the last 30 years in 1989 at 11-1.

→ It would also mark the first time in Tedford's career for back-to-back double-digit win seasons as his two double-digit win campaigns at Cal came in 2004 and 2006.

## A dominating presence

The Bulldogs' lone All-Mountain West First-Team selection in 2017, Jeff Allison again looks to be the anchor in the middle for one of the nation's top defenses. Recording only 21 tackles as a freshman, he had a monster sophomore season racking up 126 stops, the most by a Bulldog since Marcus Riley's 132 in 2007. It was the ninth-most in program history.

→ Nearly 63 percent of Allison's tackles in 2017 were solo (79), ranking him seventh in the FBS in total solo tackles.

## Bulldogs return their top seven tackles leaders

The 'Dogs return their top seven tacklers from a season ago, including all three linebackers and all four secondary members. Five of the seven earned All-Mountain West honors with Allison being named to the first team while Helmuth, Bell, Hughes and Bryant garnered honorable mention accolades.

→ James Bailey, who has been making starts since his true freshman season, enters 2018 as the Bulldogs' active leader in career tackles with 177.

## New Look D-Line

While the 'Dogs return all their starts in the back seven, the defensive line (4-3) lost all four 2017 starters Robert Stanley, Nathan Madsen, Malik Forrester and Tobenna Okeke. And while on paper it's a scary thought, the d-line saw plenty of rotation last season so the learning curve will not be as dramatic as most believe. Projected interior lineman Kevin Atkins saw five starts last year while fellow interior lineman Jasad Haynes racked up 21 tackles and 2.0 TFLs and a fumble recovery last season. On the outside, Emeka Ndoh and Mykal Walker figure to get the nods. Ndoh registered nine tackles last year but five were TFLs. It will be Walker's first action as a Bulldog.

## Legacy

Mykal Walker is projected to start in his first career game with the Bulldogs on Saturday against Idaho. Mykal transferred to Fresno State after two years at Azusa Pacific in 2015-16 and redshirt at Fresno State in 2017. He is following in the footsteps of his late father Michael Walker who similarly played defensive end at Fresno State in 1985-86 after redshirting as a Bulldog in 1984. He transferred to Fresno State from College of Marin. Michael Walker tallied 65 tackles and 6.5 sacks at Fresno State under Jim Sweeney.



## Fresno State returns to national scene

Despite not earning a bid to host the 2017 Mountain West Championship game, Fresno State's regular season finale win over then-No. 23 Boise State on Nov. 25, 2017 resulted in the Bulldogs breaking into the College Football Playoff committee's top 25, checking in at No. 25 on Nov. 28, marking the first time Fresno State entered the CFP rankings since it was instituted in 2014. Furthermore, Fresno State broke into the Associated Press Top 25 poll, checking in at No. 25 on Nov. 26, 2017. It marked the first time in nearly four years that the Bulldogs were ranked by the AP - Fresno State was ranked No. 21 on Dec. 8, 2013, prior to suffering a Las Vegas bowl loss to USC and dropping from the final rankings.

→ The Bulldogs received votes in both the AP Top 25 and USA Today Coaches end of season polls in 2017.

→ Fresno State continued to receive votes in both the AP Top 25 and USA Today Coaches poll in the initial 2018 preseason polls released in August.

## Home Cooking

During the history of Bulldog Stadium, Fresno State recorded at least five wins at home 21 times, including the 2017 season in which the 'Dogs were 5-1. In the year following a home schedule that saw at least five wins, the Bulldogs have reached five or more wins on 13 occasions.

→ The last time Fresno State recorded back-to-back seasons with at least five wins in Bulldog Stadium was 2012-13 when the 'Dogs were a combined 13-0 (6-0 and 7-0) and won back-to-back Mountain West championships.

→ The majority of Fresno State's seasons with at least five home wins came during two stretches, 1985-93 (nine straight) and 1999-2003 (five straight).

## This N' That

- The Bulldogs, coming off their first double-digit win season since 2013 (10-4), will look to be the first Fresno State team to win double-digit games in back-to-back seasons since 1988-89.
- Fresno State was one of 26 schools to finish 2017 with double-digit wins. Of those 26, four were in the pacific time zone: Fresno State, San Diego State, USC and Washington.
- The Bulldogs were one of six teams in the FBS to have played five or more opponents in 2017 that owned double-digit wins. Of those six teams, Fresno State, Ohio State and Auburn were the only three to own double-digit wins at the same time.
- Fresno State received votes in both end-of-year polls (AP Top 25/USA Today Coaches Poll).
- Fresno State returns 43 lettermen and 17 starters.
- Projected fourth-year starters: WR KeeSean Johnson, WR Jamire Jordan.
- Projected third-year starters: OL Christian Cronk, OL Micah St. Andrew, TE Kyle Riddering, LB James Bailey, P Blake Cusick.
- Despite not taking home the most coveted trophy (MW Championship), the 'Dogs collected four trophies during Tedford's first season. All three regular season rivalry trophies were won - the Valley Trophy (vs. San Jose State), the Old Oil Can (vs. San Diego State) and the Milk Can (vs. Boise State) as well as the Hawai'i Bowl win (vs. Houston).
- Tedford earned Fresno State its first bowl win since the 2007 Humanitarian Bowl with a 33-27 win against Houston on Christmas Eve at the 2017 Hawai'i Bowl.
- Jeff Tedford was named the 2017 Mountain West Coach of the Year.
- Fresno State returns 10 of its 16 all-conference selections.

## What to know offensively:

- Fresno State returns eight of 11 starters on offense.
- Of the starters lost, the 'Dogs lose two offensive linemen with 64 career starts between them (Aaron Mitchell, David Patterson) but return three with 71 career starts (Netane Muti, Christian Cronk, Micah St. Andrew). All five linemen started all 14 games in 2017, respectively.
- Senior offensive lineman Micah St. Andrew enters the 2018 campaign with the most consecutive starts (29) on the team. He has started 31 career games.
- The Bulldogs return 95% of their rushing yards and 83% of their receiving yards.
- Presumed 2018 starting quarterback Marcus McMaryion was 9-2 as a starter last year. He joined the team in the middle of fall camp in 2017 and earned the starting job over the final 11 games of the season.
- Marcus McMaryion completed 62.1 percent of his passes (218-of-351) in 2017; he is the first Bulldog to own a completion percentage better than 60 percent since Derek Carr in 2013.
- KeeSean Johnson enters 2018 needing 54 receptions and 1,222 receiving yards to become the programs all-time leader in each of those categories.
- KeeSean Johnson enters 2018 as the nation's leader in consecutive games with a reception at 36.
- RBs Jordan Mims and Ronnie Rivers owned 11 combined starts as true freshmen a season ago. That youthful rushing attack accounted for 1,107 yards while then-sophomore Josh Hokit logged 583 yards - in total the three underclassmen accounted for 78% (1,690) of the team's rushing yards.

## What to know defensively:

- Fresno State returns seven of 11 starters on defense.
- Of the starters lost, the 'Dogs lose all four members up front on the defensive line while keeping their linebackers and defensive backs intact.
- The Bulldogs' starting defensive line accounted for 18 of Fresno State's 34 sacks in 2017. Overall, the team returns 13 sacks of the 34 recorded a season ago.
- Fresno State returns 78% of its tackles, including its top seven leaders from a season ago.
- Jeff Allison, the Bulldogs' sole first-team All-Mountain West selection in 2017, anchored the defense at middle linebacker leading the team with 126 total tackles. With 126 tackles, Allison registered the most tackles in a single-season at Fresno State since 2007 when Marcus Riley made 132 stops and was one of 15 FBS players with 126 or more total tackles (of those 15, just two were underclassmen).
- James Bailey, who has been making starts since his true freshman season, enters 2018 as the Bulldogs' active leader in career tackles with 177.
- The 'Dogs return eight of their nine interceptions.
- Jaron Bryant, a 13-game starter in 2017, was one of 13 FBS players to record multiple interception touchdown returns in 2017. He led Fresno State with four interceptions - returned two for TDs.
- Fresno State's scoring defense ranked 10th in the nation in 2017 allowing only 17.9 points per game.

## SEVEN 'DOGS ON PRESEASON WATCH LISTS

### **Jeff Allison - Bednarik (top defensive player) & Butkus (top linebacker) Awards**

Junior Jeff Allison is on two national watch lists as he was named to the Bednarik Award watch list on July 16 given to the nation's top defensive player and was named to the Butkus Award watch list on July 23 presented to the nation's top linebacker.

Fresno State's lone First-Team All-Mountain West selection last season, Allison led the 'Dogs and finished 15th in the nation with 126 tackles while finishing tied for seventh in the country with 79 solo tackles. The Miami native led the team and ranked 31st in the nation in tackles per game with 9.0 while tallying 5.5 tackles for loss, two sacks, two forced fumbles and three pass breakups.

### **Blake Cusick - Mortell Award (top field goal holder)**

Junior Blake Cusick was named to the Mortell Award watch list on Aug. 16 given to the nation's top holder. Now in its fourth season as an award, Cusick is one of 28 student-athletes on the watch list with the winner having the opportunity to raise money for a charity of his choice and is based on quality of cadence, fluidity of hands (catch to hold), position of laces, and post-hold celebrations.

Cusick, a fourth-year junior, has been the 'Dogs field goal holder the last two seasons helping former Bulldog kicker Jimmy Camacho make a program-record 25 field goals in 2017 while also handling the punting duties.

### **KeeSean Johnson - Biletnikoff Award (top wide receiver)**

Senior KeeSean Johnson became the third 'Dog to be recognized this preseason as the wide receiver was one of 50 players nationally named to the 2018 Biletnikoff Award Preseason Watch List as announced by the Tallahassee Quarterback Club Foundation on July 19.

Given to college football's outstanding receiver at any position, the Biletnikoff Award was created and is sponsored by the Tallahassee Quarterback Club Foundation.

Johnson, a native of Palo Alto, California, is coming off being named to the All-Mountain West Second Team in 2017 starting all 14 games for the 'Dogs leading the team in receptions (77), receiving yards (1,013) and receiving touchdowns (8). Johnson finished third in the MW in receiving yards (1,013) & touchdown receptions (8) and was fourth in receptions per game (5.50) & receiving yards per game (72.4).

### **Marcus McMaryion - Maxwell (top player), Wuerffel & Johnny Unitas (quarterback) Awards**

Senior Marcus McMaryion was named to the Maxwell Award watch list on July 16 given to the nation's player of the year, the Wuerffel Trophy Watch List on July 26 given to the college football student-athlete who best combines exemplary community service with athletic and academic achievement and finally on Aug. 14 was named to the Johnny Unitas Golden Arm watch list given to the nation's top quarterback.

An All-Mountain West honorable mention selection last season, McMaryion passed for 2,726 yards and 14 touchdowns through the air in his first season as a 'Dog while rushing for 302 yards and four touchdowns and helped Fresno State claim its first bowl victory since 2007 throwing for a season-high 342 yards against Houston in the Hawai'i Bowl completing 33 of 48 passes while rushing for 50 yards and two touchdowns.

### **Netane Muti - Polynesian Player of the Year**

Sophomore Netane Muti was named to the 2018 Polynesian College Football Player of the Year Award Watch List on Aug. 9 which is presented annually to the most outstanding Polynesian college football player that epitomizes great ability and integrity.

One of 50 players from 34 different FBS programs named to the watch list, Muti enters his sophomore season with the 'Dogs having started all 14 games as a redshirt freshman on his way to earning All-Mountain West honorable mention honors and was a member of an offensive line unit that ranked third in the nation in sacks allowed, having allowed just 10 sacks all season, a clip of 0.71 per game. The offensive line unit also ranked third in the nation in tackles for loss allowed, having allowed 46 TFLs, a rate of 3.29 TFLs allowed per game.

### **Jared Rice - Mackey Award (top tight end)**

Junior Jared Rice was named to the John Mackey Award Preseason Watch List on July 20 given to the most outstanding collegiate tight end. One of 64 student-athletes on the initial watch list for the 2018 John Mackey Award, Rice, a native of Modesto, Calif., is coming off a sophomore season that saw him play in 13 of the 'Dogs 14 games a season ago making six starts on the year. The 6'5, 228-pound fourth-year junior ranked fourth on the team with 388 receiving yards and 22 receptions while his two receiving touchdowns ranked third on the club.

### **Jacob Westberry - David Binn Award (top long snapper)**

Redshirt sophomore Jacob Westberry, who was the team's primary long snapper in 2017, was named to the inaugural David Binn Award watch list on July 1 given to the nation's top long snapper. In its first season as an award, the award is named after 18-year NFL veteran David Binn who played 17 seasons for the San Diego Chargers (1994-2010) & one season for the Denver Broncos (2011).



Much different from a year ago, the Fresno State football team was picked to win the West Division by the media, announced by the Mountain West on Tuesday morning prior to the 2018 media summit getting underway at the Cosmopolitan of Las Vegas.

Fresno State turned the 2017 predicted order of finish upside down after being picked to finish last with a 10-4 run and a West Division crown guided by then-first year head coach Jeff Tedford. Now, the Bulldogs will make its run for a second-straight appearance in the MW Championship game as the favorite in Tedford's sophomore season.

This is the third time in six seasons (2013, 2014 and 2018) the Bulldogs have been the favorite to win the West since the inception of the divisional format instituted by the league to start the 2013 season. In the previous two occasions the Bulldogs were picked the win the West in the league's preseason poll, Fresno State carried out that forecast each time.

In addition to the predicted order of finish, the 2018 All-Mountain West Preseason Football Team was announced. This year's team included two Fresno State selections in senior wide receiver KeeSean Johnson and junior linebacker Jeff Allison. Johnson was a 2017 second-team All-MW pick while Allison was the Bulldogs' sole first-team selection a season ago.

# JEFF TEDFORD

HEAD COACH

2ND SEASON | FRESNO STATE (1992)

Jeff Tedford, 56, was named the 19th head football coach in Fresno State history on Nov. 10, 2016. He enters his second season after engineering one of the greatest turnarounds in FBS history in his first year back in the Valley.

With a 10-4 record in his first season, Fresno State became the second team in FBS history to turn a double-digit loss season (2016) into a double-digit win season (2017) the following year. The season included an appearance in the nation's top 25, clinching the Mountain West's West Division crown and leading the 'Dogs to their first appearance in the MW Championship Game since 2014. He also guided the 'Dogs to the program's first bowl victory since 2007 with their win at the Hawai'i Bowl.

Great success brought great notoriety as Tedford was named the 2017 Mountain West Coach of the Year, was a semifinalist for the George Munger College Coach of the Year Award presented by the Maxwell Football Club, a finalist for the Eddie Robinson Coach of the Year Award presented on behalf of the Football Writers Association of America in conjunction with the Allstate Sugar Bowl, and the AFCA Region-5 Coach of the Year.

While Tedford was honored as the league's coach of the year, the team had 16 student-athletes recognized with MW postseason honors - the most for the Bulldogs in a single-season since joining the conference in 2012. In the classroom, the 'Dogs also set a team-best number since joining the conference as they had 24 named to the Fall Academic All-Mountain West team.

Tedford, a former Bulldog quarterback and Fresno State assistant coach, returned to the Valley after holding the position of offensive consultant for the Washington Huskies - a 2016 College Football Playoff team.

Tedford assumed the role of acting head coach on Nov. 27, following the conclusion of the 2016 season as interim head coach Eric Kiesau carried out his duties for the remaining two games following Tedford's introduction.

Tedford, who is a proven winner on the West Coast, came to the Valley with 11 years of head coaching experience at the Division I level - having led the California Golden Bears to 82 wins from 2002-2012. He left as the school's all-time winningest coach.

Tedford's ties to the Valley and Fresno State run deep. He played quarterback at Fresno State in 1981-82 under Jim Sweeney and coached at Fresno State under Sweeney from 1987-88 and 1992-96, and under a then-first-year head coach Pat Hill in 1997.

Tedford's coaching career started at Fresno State, volunteering as an assistant for the 1987-88 seasons. From there he picked up his first full-time position as an assistant for the Calgary Stampeders of the Canadian Football League - a familiar league in which he played quarterback for six seasons after his collegiate career at Fresno State.

He returned to Fresno State in 1992 as the quarterbacks coach and served as the offensive coordinator for the Bulldogs over the ensuing five seasons.

Tedford held the same position at Oregon (1998-2001) before he became the head coach at Cal. He was named the Pac-10 Coach of the Year twice, leading the Golden Bears to a school record seven consecutive bowl games and to a conference title in 2006.

Following Tedford's stint at Cal, he moved on to the NFL in 2014 as the Tampa Bay Buccaneers' offensive coordinator. The stop did not last long due to health issues during the preseason that evolved into an indefinite leave of absence, which resulted in the two sides mutually agreeing to part ways.

Tedford made his return to the CFL in 2015 as he was named the head coach of the B.C. Lions. At the conclusion of the season, Tedford elected to exercise an option in his contract to resign and pursue opportunities in college football.

Tedford made his return to college football as an offensive consultant for the Washington Huskies under head coach Chris Peterson in 2016. A relationship rekindled after their time together as assistants at Oregon under then-coach Mike Belotti. Washington's staff also included associate head coach Bob Gregory, who served as Tedford's defensive coordinator at Cal for eight seasons.

Tedford graduated from Warren High School in Downey, California and attended Cerritos Junior College for two seasons before becoming the Bulldogs' quarterback in 1981.

He and his wife Donna have two children, Taylor and Quinn.




