Headlines

→ The Bulldogs, coming off their first double-digit win season since 2013, are seeking to become the first Fresno State team to win double-digit games in back-to-back seasons since 1988-89.

→ Fresno State was picked to win the West Division in the 2018 preseason poll released by the Mountain West - selected by the media. The predicted championship game pits the Bulldogs against Boise State for a second consecutive year.

→ Fresno State led the NCAA in points scored with 79 in week one; what helped get them there were seven turnovers gained (5 INT/2 FF) and zero turnovers lost.

→ Fresno State scored 38 points off turnovers against Idaho.

→ A total of 24 players participated in their first game for Fresno State in week one.

→ Five players earned their first career starts for Fresno State in the season opener.

→ Jaron Bryant was named the Mountain West Special Teams Player of the Week following his historic game with two touchdown returns off blocked field goals. It's the first time since 2013 a Bulldog has been the league's special teams player of the week.

→ What does the duo of Marcus McMaryion and KeeSean Johnson have in common with Derek Carr and Davante Adams? For the first time since 2013, Fresno State has a one-two punch of a Johnny Unitas Golden Arm award watch lister and a Biletnikoff award watch lister heading into the year.

Anybody, Anytime, Anywhere

Since 2000 Fresno State has squared up against opponents from the Power Five on 44 different occasions. In those games, the Bulldogs have come out on top 16 times.

The 'Dogs are currently on a nine-game skid in those games since last defeating Colorado in 2012, 69-14. Following that win against the Buffaloes, Fresno State was 16-19 against the P5.

There is no sign of backing off its tradition of playing against the best competition in the nation. Fresno State played Alabama and Washington in 2017, travels to Minnesota and UCLA this season, has a home game vs. Minnesota and a game at USC in 2019, 2020 games at Colorado and Texas A&M, 2021 games at Oregon and UCLA, a 2022 contest at USC, a 2023 contest at Arizona State, a 2024 contest back at UCLA and another tilt at USC in 2025.

Scouting the Minnesota Golden Gophers

The Bulldogs are set for their first-ever meeting with the Golden Gophers as Minnesota enters 1-0 after defeating New Mexico State 48-10 at home on Aug. 30. Coming off a 5-7 overall record in 2017 under first-year head coach P.J. Fleck, the Gophers started last season 3-0 before a 2-7 mark in the Big Ten saw them finish sixth in the seven-team West Division.

One of the nation's youngest teams with 60 freshman or redshirt freshman on its roster, Minnesota has youth all over the field as true freshman walk-on quarterback Zack Annexstad went 16-for-33 for 220 yards and two touchdowns against the Aggies last time out.

While very young under center, the Gophers do rely on two veteran offensive playmakers in senior running back Rodney Smith and junior wide receiver Tyler Johnson. Smith, who was an All-Big Ten honorable mention selection last season and is a Maxwell and Doak Walker Award watch list candidate this season, has rushed for 2,958 career yards and is coming off a 24-carry, 153-yard outing against NMSU. Johnson, also a Big Ten honorable mention pick last season, is coming off a five reception, 100-yard and two touchdown performance against the Aggies and provide the Gophers' with a big play threat.

On the defensive side of the ball, the Gophers rely heavily on upperclassmen to lead the way as senior linebacker Blake Cashman led the team with eight tackles against NMSU to go along with four tackles for loss and a sack. Junior linebacker Thomas Barber, a Bednarik & Butkus Award watch lister, returns after leading the team with 115 tackles last season. Junior defensive end Carter Coughlin, also Big Ten honorable mention a season ago, had a team-high 11.5 tackles for loss and 6.5 sacks and redshirt sophomore defensive back Antonie Winfield, Jr. had a 76-yard punt return against the Aggies to go along with five tackles.

'Dogs in Road Openers

→ The 'Dogs last won their road opener in 2013 when they downed Hawai'i, 42-37 after its original road opener at Colorado was canceled due to flooding in Boulder.

→ The last time the Bulldogs won their first road game of the season against a Power Five opponent was in 2004 when they defeated Washington, 35-16, in week one.

Tedford on the road

In year one under Jeff Tedford, Fresno State went 4-3 on the road. Those road losses were to No. 1 Alabama and No. 12 Washington on back-to-back weekends in September while the last was a narrow 17-14 defeat suffered against Boise State in the Mountain West Championship Game. In conference play, the 'Dogs were a perfect 4-0 away from home.

→ Tedford has previously coached a game at Minnesota's TCF Bank Stadium, the stadium's inaugural season, when he brought his Cal Bears to Minneapolis in 2009 for the club's road opener and left with a 35-21 win in front of 50,805 fans.

Win Number 600

→ With Saturday's 79-13 win over Idaho, the Bulldogs won their 600th game in program history becoming the 58th FBS program to accomplish that feat.

→ Fresno State becomes only the seventh non-Power 5 program to join this elite club as Navy, Miami (Ohio), Tulsa, Central Michigan, Louisiana Tech and Cincinnati are the only programs with more wins than the Bulldogs..

→ Of the 48 Power Five programs with more victories, 13 are from the SEC followed by 12 from the Big Ten, 10 from the Pac-12, nine from the ACC and four from the Big 12. Notre Dame, who is the second-winningest program behind Michigan, along with Army are Independents.

Conference preseason predictions

The 'Dogs were predicted to finish first in the West Division of the Mountain West in the 2018 MW preseason poll and are coming off winning the West Division in 2017 after going 7-1 in conference play. It was the fourth time in six years the 'Dogs have won their division or a share of the Mountain West title since moving to the league in 2012.

→ The Bulldogs have been predicted to win their division twice before being picked to repeat as West Division champs in 2018. In the previous such occasions in 2013 and 2014 when the 'Dogs were picked to represent the West in the MW Championship Game, they did just that.

Lucky No. 7

In Fresno State's 79-13 rout of Idaho, the Bulldogs registered seven takeaways (5INT/2FF) and seven rushing touchdowns. It was the most takeaways recorded by a Bulldogs team since 2002 when they forced seven takeaways (6INT/1FF) vs. Georgia Tech in the Silicon Valley Football Classic III. The mark on the ground was the most since 2004. The 'Dogs had a November run in 2004 with a game of six rushing scores on Nov. 27 vs. San Jose State and two weeks before that on Nov. 12 vs. Hawaii they registered nine rushing scores.

Changing history

Entering Sept. 1, 2018, only one team in the FBS had ever returned multiple blocked field goals for touchdowns in a season—Louisiana in 2003. Fifteen years later, Fresno State one-upped the Rajin' Cajuns by becoming the first team in FBS history to record two in a single game. Both touchdowns against Idaho came in the second quarter, both coming from Jaron Bryant. Tank Kelly and Mykal Walker produced the blocks.

→ Going into 2018, Fresno State had returned four blocked fields for touchdowns. This season is the first time the 'Dogs have recorded two in the same year.

That's a lot of scoring

Fresno State led the country in scoring in week 1, totaling 79 points in its win against Idaho. It was the most points the Bulldogs have scored in a game since posting a school record 94 versus New Mexico on Oct. 5, 1991. The last time the 'Dogs broke into the 70's was on Nov. 12, 2004 when they defeated Hawaii 70-14.

Bryant career return TDs

By returning two blocked field goals for touchdowns on Saturday, Jaron Bryant moved to second-all time at Fresno State in career non-offensive touchdowns scored. With four total touchdowns, two interceptions and two blocked field goals, the junior is tied with Bernard Berrian, A.J. Jefferson and Phillip Thomas for the second-most behind Clifton Smith's five.

→ Bryant is the fourth Fresno State player to score multiple non-offensive touchdowns in a game, joining Isaiah Burse (Sept. 7, 2013 vs. Cal Poly), Clifton Smith (Sept. 10 vs. Weber State) and Phillip Thomas (Sept. 15, 2012 vs. Colorado).

→ Bryant has found the end zone three times in his last two games (Hawaii Bowl).

→ Bryant is only the second Bulldog to ever record two career touchdowns from blocked kicks. Rodney Wright returned two blocked punts for TDs during his career.

→ Fresno State has 136 non-offensive TDs in its history, 20 have come on blocks.

Mountain West Special Teams Player of the Week

Jaron Bryant was named the Mountain West Special Teams Player of the Week on Sept. 3, it was the first special teams honor for a Bulldog since Marcel Jensen on Oct. 28, 2013. Bryant earned the award after returning two blocked field goals back for touchdowns in the second quarter of Fresno State's 79-13 season-opening win over Idaho on Saturday.

Bryant's first return went 74 yards after a block by Anthoula Kelly and the second return went 71 yards as time expired in the second quarter after a block by Mykal Walker.

Fresno State became only the fifth FBS program to block two field goals in the same quarter with Bryant being the first Bulldog since Isaiah Green on Dec. 3, 2011 to return a blocked field goal for a touchdown.



Non-offensive explosion

On 17 occasions, Fresno State has recorded multiple defensive or special teams touchdowns in a game. With three in the season-opener versus Idaho, the Bulldogs matched the program's single-game high which had previously occurred twice (Sept. 4, 2004 at Washington; Nov. 12 at Nevada).

→ The 2018 opener is the first time in program history that the Bulldogs have scored three non-offensive touchdowns in one quarter.

Shutdown D

Fresno State limited Idaho to 13 points in its season opener with defensive coordinator Bert Watts in command for the first time. He stepped into that role left by Orlando Steinauer who guided the 'Dogs to limiting teams to 17.9 points per game in 2017.

→ Idaho registered 307 yards offense, with 73 of those yards coming on one play in the first quarter. Negate that one busted play and Idaho averaged 3.7 yards per play on the evening.

I'll take that

With 21 turnovers forced in 2017, the Bulldogs are already a third of the way to matching that total in 2018 after one game. With seven forced turnovers against Idaho, it was the most turnovers forced in a single game by the 'Dogs since recording seven takeaways versus Georgia Tech on Dec. 31, 2002.

→ Fresno State forced seven turnovers on 15 Idaho offensive possessions.

→ The seven turnovers currently leads the FBS.

No fly zone

→ With five interceptions on Sept. 1, the Bulldogs posted their most INTs in a single game since grabbing five against Oregon State on Sept. 5, 2003.

→ The team record for single game interceptions is seven, set in 1968 against Idaho State.

→ James Bailey, Wylan Free and Leevil Tatum III each recorded the first interception of their careers.

→ Tank Kelly grabbed the second and third of his career, while his second of the game was returned for the first touchdown of his career.

→ The five interceptions leads the FBS after week one.

Causing devastation

Playing in 30 games during the last three seasons, making 10 starts in 2017, Anthoula "Tank" Kelly proved to be a devastating force in multiple ways against Idaho on Sept. 1 as he produced the best game of his career. The fifth-year senior doubled his career interception total with two in the second quarter, returning the second 39 yards for his first-career touchdown. The touchdown came less than seven minutes after he blocked a field goal that found the hands of Jaron Bryant who ran 74 yards into the end zone.

→ Kelly's two interceptions is tied for the most in the FBS. Ten different players own two interceptions through week 1, but seven of those players have played in two games (week 0).

Impact Leg

Many Bulldogs have made great strides since spring football, but it can be argued the Bulldog that has made the greatest stride over that time is kicker Asa Fuller. The redshirt freshman bested two kickers that were brought on to the roster to challenge him for the position after Jimmy Camacho graduated. Neither one beat him for the job; he came out on Saturday in his first game and racked up 13 points for the 'Dogs. He was 1-of-2 on field goals, connecting from 33 yards on his first career attempt. He missed from 50 yards. Fuller was 10-of-11 on PATs.

Familiar territory for McMaryion

Although he did not log game action, Marcus McMaryion has experience facing Minnesota. While a member of the Oregon State football team, McMaryion made the trip to TCF Bank Stadium on Sept. 1, 2016 for a contest against the Gophers. Minnesota topped the Beavers 30-23 in front of 44,582 fans with McMaryion serving as a back-up to starter Darell Garretson.

McMaryion wins season opening start

For the fifth time in the last six seasons, the Bulldogs opened the season with a different starting quarterback in the season opener as Marcus McMaryion made his first season-opening start as a Bulldog.

McMaryion joins Ryan Colburn in 2009 and Zack Greenlee in 2015 as Bulldog quarterbacks to win their first season-opening start in the last 10 seasons with the victory over the Vandals.

Bulldogs sporting national watch list similarities to its last championship season

There are a few preseason notables that make the 2018 preseason feel a bit like the Bulldogs' preseason leading into the 2013 season - the last time the 'Dogs won the Mountain West Championship. It starts with the preseason poll released by the league as voted upon by the media that Fresno State is predicted to win its division. Another, individually. The catalysts of that magical 2013 season was the lethal combo of Derek Carr and Davante Adams, and the services of other future NFL players in Derron Smith and Marcel Jensen.

In particular, there are five national award watch lists that were given to the likes of Adams, Carr, Jensen and Smith in 2013, that players on the 2018 team share the same distinction.

Nation's Best: 37 and counting

Since his redshirt freshman season, in 2015, senior KeeSean Johnson has been a steady pass catcher for Bulldog quarterbacks. The East Palo Alto native has one game in his entire career where he went without a catch - at Ole Miss in 2015 as a redshirt freshman. Since then, Johnson has caught at least one pass in 37 consecutive games. The next closest pass catcher owns 31.

East Palo Alto keeping Fresno right

KeeSean Johnson, an East Palo Alto native, has been the Bulldogs' leading receiver over the past two seasons, and is working his way up the Fresno State record books by putting up consistent numbers over the years. He is chasing down fellow East Palo Alto native Davante Adams in the Fresno State record books. Johnson has risen to No. 8 on the program's all-time top 10 for pass receptions in a career, which is led by Adams. The current Green Bay Packers' wide receiver is also one of three Bulldogs to ever surpass 3,000 yards receiving, another feat Johnson has his sights on.

→ Johnson opened the season on Sept. 1 with six reception for 118 yards.

→ Johnson trails Charlie Jones' receiving yardage record of 3,344 by 1,103 yards.

→ Johnson trails Davante Adams' pass reception record of 233 by 47 catches.

→ With 77 receptions, Johnson owned the 17th-most receptions by any FBS player in 2017. With 1,013 receiving yards, Johnson was one of 30 FBS players to break the 1,000-yard threshold in 2017.

They're all back

In 2017, running backs Josh Hokit, Jordan Mims, Deonte O'Neal and Ronnie Rivers, and quarterback Marcus McMaryion combined for 2,098 yards rushing. It put the Bulldogs over 2,000 yards for a season for only the second time since 2010. Fresno State's balanced attack should continue this season as all five players return to the Bulldog backfield.

Moving forward to 2018, the balanced attack saw five different running backs carry the ball ranging from four to 10 carries total. The horses will continue to be Mims, Hokit and O'Neal but Romello Harris and Saevion Johnson got in the mix in the opener. All five backs rushed for better than 35 yards. Mims led the group with three TDs of the seven total scored by the group.

→ Prior to 2010, Fresno State recorded seven straight seasons (2003-09) with over 2,000 yards on the ground.

The 'Dogs lost two offensive linemen with 64 career starts between them (Aaron Mitchell, David Patterson) but returned three with 71 career combined starts (Netane Muti, Christian Cronk, Micah St. Andrew) going into the 2018 season opener.

The challenge ahead in matching last year's dominance also comes with the challenge that the three offensive linemen that returned each made starts at a new position on the line against Idaho.

→ Fresno State joined Western Kentucky and UTSA as the only offensive lines in the nation to have all five position starters each earn their first career starts at their position.

→ Micah St. Andrew is the Bulldogs' current leader in consecutive starts, owning 30.

Fresno State allowed just seven sacks through 12 regular season games a year ago; that unit allowed 10 sacks over 14 games, equaling 0.71 sacks allowed per game, which ranked No. 3 in the nation. There were just four other teams that held its opponent under 1.00 sacks per game (Army, Marshall, Appalachian State) in 2017. Of those four, Fresno State was the only team that played 14 or more games. All five linemen started all 14 games in 2017, respectively.

→ The 'Dogs allowed more than one sack in a game just twice in 2017 (at Alabama/at Boise State).

→ Fresno State held six opponents without a sack in 2017.

A dominating presence

The Bulldogs' lone All-Mountain West First-Team selection in 2017, Jeff Allison again looks to be the anchor in the middle for one of the nation's top defenses. Recording only 21 tackles as a freshman, he had a monster sophomore season racking up 126 stops, the most by a Bulldog since Marcus Riley's 132 in 2007. It was the ninth-most in program history.

→ Nearly 63 percent of Allison's tackles in 2017 were solo (79), ranking him seventh in the FBS in total solo tackles.

→ Allison started his junior campaign by being the team's leading tackler with six stops in relatively limited action.

Bulldogs return their top seven tackles leaders

The 'Dogs returned their top seven tacklers from a season ago, including all three linebackers and all four secondary members. Five of the seven earned All-Mountain West honors with Allison being named to the first team while Helmuth, Bell, Hughes and Bryant garnered honorable mention accolades.

→ James Bailey, who has been making starts since his true freshman season, enters 2018 as the Bulldogs' active leader in career tackles with 177.

New Look D-Line

While the 'Dogs return all their starts in the back seven, the defensive line (4-3) lost all four 2017 starters Robert Stanley, Nathan Madsen, Malik Forrester and Tobenna Okeke. And while on paper it's a scary thought, the d-line saw plenty of rotation last season so the learning curve will not be as dramatic as most believe. First-time starters in the Bulldogs' week one game were interior lineman Kevin Atkins and Jasad Haynes. Atkins saw five starts last year while Haynes racked up 21 tackles and 2.0 TFLs and a fumble recovery in 2017. On the outside, Emeka Ndohe and Mykal Walker got the nods vs. Idaho. Ndohe registered nine tackles last year but five were TFLs. It was Walker's first action as a Bulldog.

Fresno State returns to national scene

Despite not earning a bid to host the 2017 Mountain West Championship game, Fresno State's regular season finale win over then-No. 23 Boise State on Nov. 25, 2017 resulted in the Bulldogs breaking into the College Football Playoff committee's top 25, checking in at No. 25 on Nov. 28, marking the first time Fresno State entered the CFP rankings since it was instituted in 2014. Furthermore, Fresno State broke into the Associated Press Top 25 poll, checking in at No. 25 on Nov. 26, 2017. It marked the first time in nearly four years that the Bulldogs were ranked by the AP - Fresno State was ranked No. 21 on Dec. 8, 2013, prior to suffering a Las Vegas bowl loss to USC and dropping from the final rankings.

→ The Bulldogs received votes in both the AP Top 25 and USA Today Coaches end of season polls in 2017.

→ Fresno State continued to receive votes in both the AP Top 25 and USA Today Coaches poll in the initial 2018 preseason polls released in August.

Follow-up campaign?

Fresno State's 10-win season in 2017 gave the program its 10th double-digit win season in its history and the first 10-plus win season for the Bulldogs since 2013 when they won 11. Only once during the program's history have the 'Dogs strung together back-to-back seasons with double-digit wins.

→ Following a 10-2 campaign in 1988, Fresno State posted its best winning percentage in the last 30 years in 1989 at 11-1.

→ It would also mark the first time in Tedford's career for back-to-back double-digit win seasons as his two double-digit win campaigns at Cal came in 2004 and 2006.

From walk-on, to team captain

Fifth-year senior George Helmuth has had quite the journey over the course of his career that started in 2014 as a walk-on. The local product, who saw action early, but primarily on special teams, turned his Fresno State football career upside down in 2017. After a redshirt season in 2014, and limited time in 2015-16 that resulted in 24 career tackles entering the 2017 season, Helmuth racked up 89 tackles last season and finished second on the team and 16th in the MW in that category. And he did all that while not making his first career start until game No. 4 of the season (vs Nevada). But from that point on he has not relinquished his spot in the lineup. He earned his first career Mountain West Defensive Player of the Week honor after tallying a career-high 11 tackles, seven solo, and recovered a critical fumble in the Bulldogs' 13-7 MW West Division clinching win at Wyoming on Nov. 18. And for the year, he was named an All-Mountain West honorable mention selection.

'Dogs with Bachelors degrees

There are five Bulldog football players on the 2018 roster that own bachelors degrees. Those five who are starting masters programs this fall are:

1. George Helmuth - Graduated spring '18 with a bachelor's degree in agricultural business. Starting the agricultural business MBA program this fall.
2. Jamire Jordan - Graduated spring '18 with a bachelor's degree in criminal justice- corrections. Starting the curriculum and instruction program this fall.
3. Marcus McMaryion - currently in kinesiology-sport administration masters program. Earned bachelor's in public health at Oregon State.
4. Micah St. Andrew - Graduated spring '18 with a bachelor's degree in economics. Starting either the MBA or curriculum and instruction program this fall.
5. David Tangipa - Graduated spring '18 with a bachelor's degree in political science. Starting the political science MBA program this fall.

SEVEN 'DOGS ON PRESEASON WATCH LISTS

Jeff Allison - Bednarik (top defensive player) & Butkus (top linebacker) Awards

Junior Jeff Allison is on two national watch lists as he was named to the Bednarik Award watch list on July 16 given to the nation's top defensive player and was named to the Butkus Award watch list on July 23 presented to the nation's top linebacker.

Fresno State's lone First-Team All-Mountain West selection last season, Allison led the 'Dogs and finished 15th in the nation with 126 tackles while finishing tied for seventh in the country with 79 solo tackles. The Miami native led the team and ranked 31st in the nation in tackles per game with 9.0 while tallying 5.5 tackles for loss, two sacks, two forced fumbles and three pass breakups.

Blake Cusick - Mortell Award (top field goal holder)

Junior Blake Cusick was named to the Mortell Award watch list on Aug. 16 given to the nation's top holder. Now in its fourth season as an award, Cusick is one of 28 student-athletes on the watch list with the winner having the opportunity to raise money for a charity of his choice and is based on quality of cadence, fluidity of hands (catch to hold), position of laces, and post-hold celebrations.

Cusick, a fourth-year junior, has been the 'Dogs field goal holder the last two seasons helping former Bulldog kicker Jimmy Camacho make a program-record 25 field goals in 2017 while also handling the punting duties.

KeeSean Johnson - Biletnikoff Award (top wide receiver)

Senior KeeSean Johnson became the third 'Dog to be recognized this preseason as the wide receiver was one of 50 players nationally named to the 2018 Biletnikoff Award Preseason Watch List as announced by the Tallahassee Quarterback Club Foundation on July 19.

Given to college football's outstanding receiver at any position, the Biletnikoff Award was created and is sponsored by the Tallahassee Quarterback Club Foundation.

Johnson, a native of Palo Alto, California, is coming off being named to the All-Mountain West Second Team in 2017 starting all 14 games for the 'Dogs leading the team in receptions (77), receiving yards (1,013) and receiving touchdowns (8). Johnson finished third in the MW in receiving yards (1,013) & touchdown receptions (8) and was fourth in receptions per game (5.50) & receiving yards per game (72.4).

Marcus McMaryion - Maxwell (top player), Wuerffel & Johnny Unitas (quarterback) Awards

Senior Marcus McMaryion was named to the Maxwell Award watch list on July 16 given to the nation's player of the year, the Wuerffel Trophy Watch List on July 26 given to the college football student-athlete who best combines exemplary community service with athletic and academic achievement and finally on Aug. 14 was named to the Johnny Unitas Golden Arm watch list given to the nation's top quarterback.

An All-Mountain West honorable mention selection last season, McMaryion passed for 2,726 yards and 14 touchdowns through the air in his first season as a 'Dog while rushing for 302 yards and four touchdowns and helped Fresno State claim its first bowl victory since 2007 throwing for a season-high 342 yards against Houston in the Hawai'i Bowl completing 33 of 48 passes while rushing for 50 yards and two touchdowns.

Netane Muti - Polynesian Player of the Year

Sophomore Netane Muti was named to the 2018 Polynesian College Football Player of the Year Award Watch List on Aug. 9 which is presented annually to the most outstanding Polynesian college football player that epitomizes great ability and integrity.

One of 50 players from 34 different FBS programs named to the watch list, Muti enters his sophomore season with the 'Dogs having started all 14 games as a redshirt freshman on his way to earning All-Mountain West honorable mention honors and was a member of an offensive line unit that ranked third in the nation in sacks allowed, having allowed just 10 sacks all season, a clip of 0.71 per game. The offensive line unit also ranked third in the nation in tackles for loss allowed, having allowed 46 TFLs, a rate of 3.29 TFLs allowed per game.

Jared Rice - Mackey Award (top tight end)

Junior Jared Rice was named to the John Mackey Award Preseason Watch List on July 20 given to the most outstanding collegiate tight end. One of 64 student-athletes on the initial watch list for the 2018 John Mackey Award, Rice, a native of Modesto, Calif., is coming off a sophomore season that saw him play in 13 of the 'Dogs 14 games a season ago making six starts on the year. The 6'5, 228-pound fourth-year junior ranked fourth on the team with 388 receiving yards and 22 receptions while his two receiving touchdowns ranked third on the club.

Jacob Westberry - David Binn Award (top long snapper)

Redshirt sophomore Jacob Westberry, who was the team's primary long snapper in 2017, was named to the inaugural David Binn Award watch list on July 1 given to the nation's top long snapper. In its first season as an award, the award is named after 18-year NFL veteran David Binn who played 17 seasons for the San Diego Chargers (1994-2010) & one season for the Denver Broncos (2011).



Much different from a year ago, the Fresno State football team was picked to win the West Division by the media, announced by the Mountain West on Tuesday morning prior to the 2018 media summit getting underway at the Cosmopolitan of Las Vegas.

Fresno State turned the 2017 predicted order of finish upside down after being picked to finish last with a 10-4 run and a West Division crown guided by then-first year head coach Jeff Tedford. Now, the Bulldogs will make its run for a second-straight appearance in the MW Championship game as the favorite in Tedford's sophomore season.

This is the third time in six seasons (2013, 2014 and 2018) the Bulldogs have been the favorite to win the West since the inception of the divisional format instituted by the league to start the 2013 season. In the previous two occasions the Bulldogs were picked the win the West in the league's preseason poll, Fresno State carried out that forecast each time.

In addition to the predicted order of finish, the 2018 All-Mountain West Preseason Football Team was announced. This year's team included two Fresno State selections in senior wide receiver KeeSean Johnson and junior linebacker Jeff Allison. Johnson was a 2017 second-team All-MW pick while Allison was the Bulldogs' sole first-team selection a season ago.

JEFF TEDFORD

HEAD COACH

2ND SEASON | FRESNO STATE (1992)

Jeff Tedford, 56, was named the 19th head football coach in Fresno State history on Nov. 10, 2016. He enters his second season after engineering one of the greatest turnarounds in FBS history in his first year back in the Valley.

With a 10-4 record in his first season, Fresno State became the second team in FBS history to turn a double-digit loss season (2016) into a double-digit win season (2017) the following year. The season included an appearance in the nation's top 25, clinching the Mountain West's West Division crown and leading the 'Dogs to their first appearance in the MW Championship Game since 2014. He also guided the 'Dogs to the program's first bowl victory since 2007 with their win at the Hawai'i Bowl.

Great success brought great notoriety as Tedford was named the 2017 Mountain West Coach of the Year, was a semifinalist for the George Munger College Coach of the Year Award presented by the Maxwell Football Club, a finalist for the Eddie Robinson Coach of the Year Award presented on behalf of the Football Writers Association of America in conjunction with the Allstate Sugar Bowl, and the AFCA Region-5 Coach of the Year.

While Tedford was honored as the league's coach of the year, the team had 16 student-athletes recognized with MW postseason honors - the most for the Bulldogs in a single-season since joining the conference in 2012. In the classroom, the 'Dogs also set a team-best number since joining the conference as they had 24 named to the Fall Academic All-Mountain West team.

Tedford, a former Bulldog quarterback and Fresno State assistant coach, returned to the Valley after holding the position of offensive consultant for the Washington Huskies - a 2016 College Football Playoff team.

Tedford assumed the role of acting head coach on Nov. 27, following the conclusion of the 2016 season as interim head coach Eric Kiesau carried out his duties for the remaining two games following Tedford's introduction.

Tedford, who is a proven winner on the West Coast, came to the Valley with 11 years of head coaching experience at the Division I level - having led the California Golden Bears to 82 wins from 2002-2012. He left as the school's all-time winningest coach.

Tedford's ties to the Valley and Fresno State run deep. He played quarterback at Fresno State in 1981-82 under Jim Sweeney and coached at Fresno State under Sweeney from 1987-88 and 1992-96, and under a then-first-year head coach Pat Hill in 1997.

Tedford's coaching career started at Fresno State, volunteering as an assistant for the 1987-88 seasons. From there he picked up his first full-time position as an assistant for the Calgary Stampeders of the Canadian Football League - a familiar league in which he played quarterback for six seasons after his collegiate career at Fresno State.

He returned to Fresno State in 1992 as the quarterbacks coach and served as the offensive coordinator for the Bulldogs over the ensuing five seasons.

Tedford held the same position at Oregon (1998-2001) before he became the head coach at Cal. He was named the Pac-10 Coach of the Year twice, leading the Golden Bears to a school record seven consecutive bowl games and to a conference title in 2006.

Following Tedford's stint at Cal, he moved on to the NFL in 2014 as the Tampa Bay Buccaneers' offensive coordinator. The stop did not last long due to health issues during the preseason that evolved into an indefinite leave of absence, which resulted in the two sides mutually agreeing to part ways.

Tedford made his return to the CFL in 2015 as he was named the head coach of the B.C. Lions. At the conclusion of the season, Tedford elected to exercise an option in his contract to resign and pursue opportunities in college football.

Tedford made his return to college football as an offensive consultant for the Washington Huskies under head coach Chris Peterson in 2016. A relationship rekindled after their time together as assistants at Oregon under then-coach Mike Belotti. Washington's staff also included associate head coach Bob Gregory, who served as Tedford's defensive coordinator at Cal for eight seasons.

Tedford graduated from Warren High School in Downey, California and attended Cerritos Junior College for two seasons before becoming the Bulldogs' quarterback in 1981.

He and his wife Donna have two children, Taylor and Quinn.

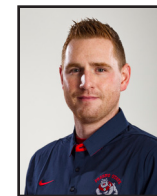

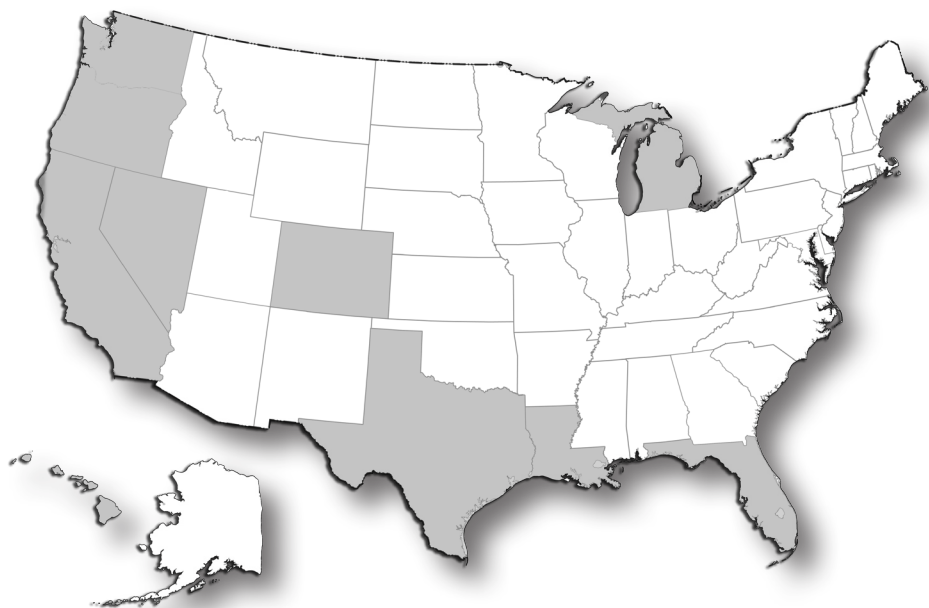
