#### Headlines

→ Fresno State will have spent 27 days in between home games when they host UNLV for Friday Fest, Oct. 18. The Bulldogs' last home game was on Sept. 21.

→ Friday's game will be the 22nd meeting all-time between the Bulldogs and Rebels.

→ Split down the middle: the Bulldogs and Rebels share a 3-3 mark against one another as Mountain West foes.

→ The Bulldogs return home after opening Mountain West play last weekend at Air Force. Fresno State has opened conference play on the road five of the last six seasons.

→ The Bulldogs are 12-2 at Bulldog Stadium under Jeff Tedford. One of his two losses is to UNLV (Oct. 28, 2017).

→ Fresno State entered last year's matchup on the road against UNLV ranked No. 20/23 and won 48-3 to improve to 8-1 (5-0 MW) at the time.

→ Last year's win at UNLV was Coach Tedford's 100th career victory.

→ Since making his Fresno State debut at New Mexico State and participating in the next game at Air Force, Emoryie Edwards has led the Bulldogs in receiving.

→ Despite not forcing a turnover for the first time since Nov. 17, 2018 (vs. San Diego State) in their contest at Air Force, the Bulldogs still rank eighth in the FBS in fumble recoveries per game, averaging 1.2.

→ Fresno State has had 34 different players make a start in 2019. Only New Mexico (39), UMass (39), Old Dominion (37), N.C. State (36), Oregon State (36) and Colorado (34) share numbers of that stature.

→ OL Bula Schmidt (Fr.) and DE Alex Dumais (RFr.) picked up their first career starts, respectively, as Bulldogs at Air Force. There have been 19 players this season to get their first career starts at Fresno State in 2019.

#### - #20 RONNIE RIVERS (JR.)

- Leads the team in all-purpose yards with 362.

- Tied his career high in tackles in the season opener at USC (8/31) with 11.

- Holds Fresno State's most game experience having played in 44 career games.
- Named an All-Mountain West second team selection in 2018.



### BRONCO NAGURSKI AWARD & CHUCK BEDNARIK AWARD & BUTKUS AWARD

#### - #3 MYKAL WALKER (SR.)

- Ranks 23rd in the FBS and fourth in the MW in tackles per game, averaging 9.8.
- Racked up a career-high 15 tackles in the season opener at USC (8/31).
- Recorded nine or more tackles in four of five games.
- Has made 19 consecutive starts.
- Shifted to MLB from DE during the spring of 2019.
- Named an All-Mountain West first team selection as a junior playing defensive end.



- Fresno State has one of eight defensive back duos in the nation to represent its respective team on the Thorpe watch list.
- Out of the 50 candidates named to the Biletnikoff watch list, Jared Rice was one of only four tight ends.
- Fresno State is one of 17 teams in the nation to have two individuals named to the 2019 watch list and is the only California team to have the distinction.

### POLYNESIAN COLLEGE FOOTBALL PLAYER OF THE YEAR

#### - #52 NETANE MUTI (JR.)

- Started first three games of the season at left guard. Missed last two games due to injury.
- Suffered season-ending injury during the second half of the Sept. 8 contest at Minnesota – started two games in 2018 at left tackle.
- Was on 2018 preseason Polynesian College Football Player of the Year watch list.
- Was an All-Mountain West honorable mention selection as a red-shirt freshman in 2017.





## Eight-Straight

The Bulldogs closed out nonconference play on Sept. 28 with a 30-17 win at New Mexico State to even their record at 2-2 in nonconference games. Following its second bye over the first six weeks of the 2019 season, Fresno State entered week seven versus Air Force (Oct. 12) staring at eight-straight conference games. In order to earn an opportunity to defend their Mountain West Championship, the Bulldogs must start with securing a bid in the MW title game on Dec. 7 as the West Division representative, which goes to the team with the highest winning percentage in all conference games, both inter-divisional and intra-divisional, among their West Division counterparts (Hawaii, Nevada, San Diego State, San Jose State and UNLV).

→ Fresno State was the only FBS team to have not played a conference game entering week 7.

## Favorite to Win the West

As the first-place pick in the West, Fresno State earned its fourth division leading bid in the Mountain West preseason media polls dating back to 2013, and second in as many years (2013, 2014, 2018 and 2019). The Bulldogs went on to win the West each season that they were the first-place pick in the annual preseason polls.

Along with a predicted first-place finish in its division, Fresno State secured three preseason all-conference selections in senior tight end Jared Rice, senior linebacker Mykal Walker and senior defensive back Juju Hughes.

## Nonconference recap

Having lost as many games in its first two weeks in 2019 as it did in 2018, it's been a tough start for the 2018 Mountain West Champions that finished 12-2 and ranked No. 18 in both major polls last season. Fresno State's 0-2 start was the first for the program since 2014, but it was so close swinging to 1-1 or even 2-0. The 'Dogs average margin of loss in those two games was 5.5 points to USC on the road (Aug. 31) and Minnesota (Sept. 7) at home. Those Trojans are 3-3 with wins against then-ranked No. 10 Utah and No. 23 Stanford while Minnesota is undefeated (6-0) and currently ranked No. 20 in both polls.

The 'Dogs bounced back by winning their final two game nonconference games by taking care of business defeating Sacramento State 34-20 at home to move to 1-2 and moved to .500 with a win versus New Mexico State in its final nonconference game of 2019.

→ Adding in postseason games, Tedford is 9-5 at Fresno State against teams outside the Mountain West.

### 'Dogs in Mountain West home openers

- The 'Dogs are 5-2 in MW home openers with wins in 2012, 2013, 2014, 2017 and 2018.
- This will be the latest date the 'Dogs have played their first Mountain West home game, surpassing the Oct. 14, 2016 contest against San Diego State.
- Fresno State was the last FBS team in the nation to open conference play - Oct. 12.

### They all count, but this one means a lot

Fresno State is sitting below .500 through five games (2-3) for the first time since the 2016 season, and are 0-1 in conference play after dropping its opener last time out. But a loss to Air Force doesn't mean the Bulldogs' goal of defending their Mountain West championship is dashed. As the only team in the conference with seven league games ahead of them, and matchups against all five West division rivals, who each have at least one loss to date already, Fresno State still holds the keys to its own fate. The march to the title game starts with a win on Friday against West division rival UNLV.

### Vegas Connections

→ Fresno State running backs coach and special team coordinator, Jamie Christian, spent the 2015 and '16 seasons at UNLV as its RB coach. Christian was a fullback at Fresno State from 1991-93.

→ Fresno State defensive backs coach, J.D. Williams, spent the 2015 and '16 seasons at UNLV in the same capacity. Williams was a player at Fresno State from 1986-89.

→ Fresno State defensive graduate assistant, Matt Lea, played at UNLV in 2016. He started eight games and played in all 12 as a senior. Lea is a 2012 graduate of Central HS in Fresno.

→ Fresno State DT Leveel Tatum III, sat out the 2017 season after transferring from UNLV's roster in 2016 - he is a Fresno native that played high school football at Edison.

→ Fresno State TE David Tate, Jr., sat out the 2018 season after transferring from UNLV's roster in 2017 - he, alike Tatum, is a Fresno native that played high school football at Edison.

→ UNLV has one player that calls Fresno home, junior RB Charles Williams (Bullard HS).

→ Second-year UNLV OLB coach Eric Brown played at FS in 2007 and was on the Bulldogs coaching staff as a student assistant (2008-10) and then as a GA (2011-12).

→ Second-year UNLV DC Tim Skipper played linebacker for the Bulldogs from 1997-2000 and spent six seasons on the Bulldogs coaching staff from 2006-11.

### The one conference game blemish - UNLV

Since Jeff Tedford took over as the head coach at Fresno State, the Bulldogs are 12-2 at home. The second loss came earlier this season, a double-overtime loss on Sept. 14 to Minnesota out of the Big Ten. Before that, the only other loss was suffered against UNLV on Oct. 28, 2017 - the last time UNLV visited Fresno.

### Hey, it's a school day

The last time Fresno State did not host a football game on a Saturday was in 2016 - prior to Jeff Tedford's arrival. In 2016, Fresno State held two Friday games at Bulldog Stadium - San Diego State (Oct. 14) and Air Force (Oct. 28). Last season, Fresno State traveled for a Friday game at Boise State on Nov. 9, 2018, and did not have any games away from Saturdays in 2017.

→ The Bulldogs last win at home in a weekday game was against UNLV on Friday, Oct. 16, 2015.

### Bad Omen?

Fresno State has appeared in the Mountain West Championship game a West Division best four times (2013, 2014, 2017, 2018) ... each of those seasons the Bulldogs started conference play 1-0. The Bulldogs finished conference play 5-3 in 2014 and won the West title. The 'Dogs won the title finishing with a 7-1 conference record in 2013, 2017 and 2018.

### Scouting the UNLV Rebels

UNLV is coming off of its first-ever road win over a SEC opponent as it defeated Vanderbilt, 34-10, on Saturday. This win snapped the Rebels' four-game losing streak and was their first over a Power Five opponent since 2008.

The Rebels are 2-4 (0-2 MW) in 2019. UNLV opened its season with a 56-23 win against Southern Utah. Its four losses have been to Arkansas State (43-17), Northwestern (30-14), Wyoming (53-17) and Boise State (38-13). The matchup with Vanderbilt is the first road win for UNLV out of its three this season.

The Rebels have been outscored 197-151 this season. UNLV hasn't found a way to score more than 17 points in its road losses this season. It is averaging 25.2 points per game this year.

The Rebel offense has threats in the passing and running games. Junior running back Charles Williams leads the way for UNLV with 598 rushing yards this season. Williams, a Fresno native and graduate of Bullard High School, will return to Fresno with a team-high seven rushing touchdowns in 2019. Williams has had the most touches for the Rebels this season with 90.

UNLV has a pair of quarterbacks that have been utilized this season, redshirt freshman Kenyon Oblad and junior Armani Rogers. Oblad picked up his second career-start for the Rebels at Vanderbilt last week and went 11-of-16 for 172 yards and two touchdowns in SEC territory. The redshirt freshman has a 52.6 completion percentage this season. Rogers' abilities highlight more on his run game as he is second on the team with 204 rushing yards and two touchdowns this season.

Defensively, the Rebels are led by senior strong safety Evan Austrie. Austrie has accumulated 46 tackles, 3.5 TFLs, two broken up passes and a sack this season. Austrie picked up six tackles and broke up a pass at Vanderbilt. The senior is in his first injury-free season with the Rebels and is beginning to approach his single-season career high in tackles (66 in 2018) through just six games this season.

### Series history with the Rebels

Friday's game will be the 22nd meeting all-time between the Bulldogs and Rebels. Fresno State leads the series with UNLV, 14-7. The matchup dates back to 1979, and has been a WAC, Big West and Mountain West battle for decades.

The first meeting, in 1979 at Ratcliff Stadium (Fresno), was a 31-28 loss. Fresno State lost four of its first six all-time contests, but have won 12 of its last 15 games versus the Rebels. The teams met 10 straight times in the Big West from 1982-1991 and again in 1996-97 in the WAC.

UNLV, one of the founding members of the Mountain West's inaugural 1999 season, left the WAC, a conference affiliation they shared with the Bulldogs for just two seasons (1996-97). There was a gap from that 1997 season until 2013 when the two became conference foes again in the MW (the two schools were not scheduled for competition in the Bulldogs' inaugural 2012 MW season).

The teams last met in 2018 and the Bulldogs won big on the road with a 48-3 victory for Coach Tedford's 100th career win as a head coach. It was just the third time Fresno State traveled to face the Rebels since 1996, but was the first win in Sin City since 1996.

**Revisiting the last two Fresno State-UNLV matchups**
**2018 - at UNLV**

The then No. 20/23 ranked Bulldogs earned their seventh consecutive win with a 48-3 win over UNLV at Sam Boyd Stadium on Nov. 3. The Bulldogs totaled 466 yards of offense, passing for 274 yards and rushing for 192, while holding UNLV to one field goal. The Rebels managed to post 302 yards offense but could not cross the goal line.

It was a team effort against UNLV as Fresno State's six touchdowns were scored by six different Bulldogs, four rushing and two passing. Senior quarterback Marcus McMaryion threw for 274 yards on 26-of-35 passing. Defensively, the Bulldogs were led by Juju Hughes who finished with a team-high 11 tackles.

**2017 - at Bulldog Stadium**

The lone Mountain West regular season loss the Bulldogs suffered in 2017 came against UNLV as the 'Dogs lost 26-16 at Bulldog Stadium. The 2017 loss to UNLV was the first home loss to the Rebels since 1983. Then-sophomore wide receiver Derrion Grim led the Bulldogs that night with four receptions for 68 yards.

With the score tied 16-16 with 1:56 left in the third quarter, the 'Dogs forced the Rebels to punt for the first time in the game, but a costly mishandled punt by KeeSean Johnson set the Rebels up on a short field, needing 23 yards for a score. It took them four plays to capitalize, a 2-yard rushing touchdown by Lexington Thomas that gave UNLV a 23-16 lead. The 'Dogs started their next drive at their own 15, with 10:12 left in the game and down seven. The Bulldogs were able to move the ball 40 yards until being stalled with a 4th-and-2 at the UNLV 45-yard line. Fresno State took a timeout and elected to punt coming out of it, the snap sailed over punter Blake Cusick's head for a loss of 36 yards. The ball was recovered by Cusick at the Fresno State 19-yard line and the ball turned over to the Rebels. The Bulldog defense held UNLV to negative six yards, but a 25-yard field goal by Daniel Gutierrez put the visitors ahead 26-16 to help seal the win.

**Had a rhythm, lost the rhythm**

Against Air Force last Saturday, quarterback Jorge Reyna started the game connecting on his first 13 attempts and finished the first half 17-of-18 for 190 yards and two touchdowns. In the second half, he was 3-of-9 for 19 yards and one interception. The Falcons' dominant triple-option rush attack led to the home team limiting the Bulldogs to owning possession of the ball for just five minutes, and 35 seconds in the second half. Able to have just four drives, Fresno State picked up one first down in the second half when they had the ball.

**Limiting turnovers**

Jorge Reyna had 95 straight attempts in between interceptions until surrendering one against Air Force. With 173 attempts this season, Reyna has thrown four interceptions. He had a run from the final play of the game in double-overtime against Minnesota (Sept. 14) until the fourth quarter against Air Force (Oct. 12).

**Roommates**

Fresno State's 2017 and 2018 starting quarterback, Marcus McMaryion, continues to be a leader for the Bulldogs as he was not only close with Jorge Reyna in the quarterback room over those seasons, but now as a mentor, slash, roommate as the two live together in Fresno.

2018 - McMaryion: 108-of-150 | 1,291 yards | 9 TDs | 2 Ints

2019 - Reyna: 111-of-173 | 1,226 yards | 9 TDs | 4 Ints

→ McMaryion was named on Oct. 8, 2019 as a part of group 2 for the XFL Draft.



### Emoryie emerging

Redshirt freshman wide receiver Emoryie Edwards, who debuted as a Bulldog on Sept. 28 at New Mexico State, and played his second game last time out versus Air Force, has led Fresno State in receiving both times. It's been a long road for Edwards, plagued by injuries since becoming a Bulldog has shown why he was a much heralded recruit from Tulare Union HS as the California Central Section record holder for career receiving yards (4,267 yards) - holding offers from Air Force, BYU, Duke, Oregon State and Washington State. After watching the first 17 games from the sidelines, Edwards led the team in receptions (8) and receiving yards (70) at New Mexico State. At Air Force, he surpassed that yardage total in the first quarter with 73 yards on four receptions - one his first career touchdown. That would be all the stats he'd record, but it was again a team-lead in yards, and he shared the team-lead in catches (4) with Zane Pope. The Valley product will get to play in front of the home crowd for the first time on Friday.

### Looking for continuity

It's been a tough start for the Bulldogs' offensive line that's been notoriously stout under third year assistant coach Ryan Grubb. Under Grubb in 2017 and 2018, the offensive line finished in the top 10 in both sacks allowed and TFLs allowed. One trait those lines had though was continuity. In 2017 all five starting linemen started all 14 games, and in 2018 the Bulldogs were not as fortunate, but used five different combinations in 14 games.

In 2019, the Bulldogs have had four different combinations through the first five games. Fresno State lost Dontae Bull to injury in game three, and in game four and five lost Netane Muti to injury. Senior Nick Aibuedefer filled in at left tackle in Bull's absence in game three, and filled in at left guard in Netane Muti's absence in game four. True freshman Bula Schmidt started in place of Muti in game five.

→ Muti and Schmidt, two of the team's three players from Hawai'i, share the hometown of Wahiawa.

### This guy can do it all

Josh Hokit opted out of a scholarship to wrestle at Drexel and walked on to the Fresno State football team as a linebacker at his first fall camp as a freshman in 2016. He ended up playing as a true freshman at linebacker as well as at fullback, running back and on special teams. His role as a running back went full-time after a Nov. 19, 2016 game against Hawai'i where he exploded for 97 yards on 18 carries. A week later he got his first start at running back. Fast forward to 2019 spring football, and Hokit returned back to linebacker midway through the team's 15 practices, because he missed the first half due to being at the NCAA wrestling national championships, earning all-american status by placing fifth in the 197 lb. division. He repped at linebacker for the remainder of spring football and the first 13 practices of fall camp in 2019 before a rash of injuries ultimately turned the team-first player back to running back overnight for practice No. 14.

### Unsung hero of the offense

While everyone knows six points is better than three points, when called upon place kicker Cesar Silva has been a crucial piece of the Bulldogs' offense. Silva is 9-of-13 on field goals and 15-of-15 on PATs. He's accounted for 42 of the Bulldogs' 146 points this season and ranks second in the Mountain West in points per game (kickers only) with 8.4 ppg. Silva's average of 1.80 field goals per game ranks tied for 16th in the FBS. All this, despite going 0-of-3 in one contest on Sept. 21 versus Sacramento State.

**The art of forced fumbles**

Through five games this season the Bulldogs have forced seven fumbles, recovering six of those which ranks tied for 11th nationally. Surprisingly, all six recoveries have come from a different Bulldog.

→ Fresno State ranks eighth in the FBS in fumble recoveries per game, averaging 1.2.

→ Fresno State is already more than halfway to double figure fumble recoveries with at least seven games remaining in the season, a mark that only five Bulldog teams have achieved since 2010.

→ The six recoveries have surpassed the season totals from 2010, 2011 and 2016 and is one shy of 2018.

**Forcing turnovers under Tedford**

With 11 turnovers through their first five games, the Bulldogs were unable to gain one last time out at Air Force. Still, Fresno State ranks tied for 33rd in the FBS in turnovers gained.

→ With 11 turnovers through five games, the Bulldogs rank 11th in the FBS in turnovers gained per game with 2.2.

→ Until last weekend, Fresno State had not gone a game without gaining a turnover since Nov. 17, 2018 versus San Diego State.

**Losing the turnover battle**

For the first time since Sept. 8, 2018 at Minnesota, Fresno State dropped a game when losing the turnover battle after Air Force outgained the Bulldogs 1-0 in takeaways last Saturday night. The 'Dogs had previously won their last four games when losing the battle.

→ Fresno State is 4-5 when losing the turnover battle under Jeff Tedford.

**Racking up tackles**

For the first time since last facing Air Force on Oct. 28, 2016, Fresno State had four players on Saturday record at least 10 tackles. Justin Rice and Wylan Free each totaled a career-best 13 tackles while Mykal Walker added 11 and Juju Hughes had 10. Arron Mosby just missed double figures with nine.

→ Fresno State was credited with 93 tackles against the Falcons.

**Alex<sup>2</sup>**

Against Air Force, defensive ends Alex Dumais and Alex Cruz each posted seven tackles, a career high for both. Two of Dumais' tackles also went for loss, a career-best for the redshirt freshman who was starting for the first time.

**It's been awhile**

When the clock struck zeros at Falcon Stadium, Air Force had totaled 340 yards rushing on 69 carries. It was the first time since facing Alabama on Sept. 9, 2017 that the Bulldogs had given up more than 300 yards rushing in a game as the Tide totaled 305 on 39 attempts. Coincidentally, Alabama also scored more than 40 points in that contest.

→ Air Force's 69 carries were the most against a Bulldog team since the Falcons and 'Dogs last squared off on Oct. 28, 2016 when Air Force rushed 73 times.





### Settling in

Through five games, Fresno State's Mykal Walker has settled into his spot in the middle of the defense after moving from end during the offseason. The 6-foot-3 linebacker leads the Bulldogs and sits fourth in the Mountain West and 23rd in the FBS in tackles per game averaging 9.8. Walker opened the season with a career-high 15 stops at USC.

→ Walker's 49 tackles is second on the team and his two quarterback hurries is tied for the team lead.

→ Mykal is following in the footsteps of his late father Michael Walker who similarly played at Fresno State in 1985-86 after redshirting as a Bulldog in 1984. His father transferred to Fresno State from College of Marin and tallied 65 tackles and 6.5 sacks at Fresno State under Jim Sweeney.

### Dual threat

After being one of the Bulldog's top receiving threats through the first three games of the season, Chris Coleman made the switch to the defensive side of the ball in Week 5 after a rash of injuries hit Fresno State's secondary. After a meeting with Coach Tedford the Monday following the Sacramento State game and talking about the move, Coleman prepared the next four days and made the start at cornerback against New Mexico State where he played the majority of the team's defensive snaps, making three tackles and breaking up a pass. For the second-straight game, Coleman got the start at cornerback at Air Force. He's started three games in 2019, twice at corner and once at wide receiver.

### Second line of defense

With a new set of starting linebackers this season, Fresno State's newest trio has continued where last year's veterans left off when it came to backing up the front line. In 14 games in 2018, the Bulldogs' starting linebackers posted a combined 25 or more tackles six times. Comparatively, this year's trio of Mykal Walker, Justin Rice and Arron Mosby have performed that feat four times through five games with a season-high of 33 tackles coming last time out at Air Force. The trio also posted 30 in the season opener at USC.

### A defensive wrecking ball

No longer in the shadow of his older brother, Justin Rice has been a disruptive force for the Bulldogs' defense through five games, causing four total turnovers while also defending 1.8 passes per game.

→ Rice is the only player in the FBS to rank in the top 10 in both forced fumbles (third, 0.6) and passes defended per game (sixth, 1.8).

→ Rice is one of five players in the FBS to have at least one interception and forced three fumbles.

→ Rice is one of 14 players in the FBS to have forced at least three fumbles. He is forcing 0.6 fumbles per game which is tied for the third-highest frequency in the FBS.

→ Rice is one of seven players in the FBS averaging at least 1.8 passes defended per game. He is averaging 0.6 defended passes per game above the next closest linebacker which ranks 37th.

→ With a career-high 13 tackles at Air Force, Rice has recorded at least 10 tackles in four of his first five games. The last Bulldog to post at least 10 stops four times in a five-game span was Stratton Brown in 2016. The safety recorded five double-digit tackle games during the final six games of the 2016 season.

→ Rice currently leads the team with 50 tackles and his 10.0 tackles per game ranks third in the MW and 16th in the FBS.

Jeff Tedford, 57, inherited a 1-11 football program when he took over the reins of his alma mater and in two seasons all he's done as the 19th head football coach in Fresno State history is lead the program to a 22-6 record, a 2018 Mountain West Championship, two MW West division titles and two bowl wins.

In 2018, in addition to defeating Boise State on the road in overtime, 19-16, for Fresno State's first conference championship since 2013, the Bulldogs capped the season with a 31-20 triumph over Arizona State to win the Mitsubishi Motors Las Vegas Bowl. The bowl win left the Bulldogs with their first 12-win season in the 97-year history of the program. This, one season after engineering one of the greatest turnarounds in FBS history guiding the Bulldogs to a 10-4 record, an appearance in the MW title game and a Hawai'i Bowl win over Houston.

The renaissance under Tedford has led to FBS history being made as Fresno State became the first team to secure back-to-back double-digit winning seasons following a double-digit loss season.

The 2018 Bulldogs finished nationally ranked in the final rankings of the season for the first time since 2004. Fresno State finished ranked No. 18 in both the AP Top 25 and Coaches poll, announced Jan. 8, 2019. It was the best finish in the AP Top 25 in program history, besting No. 22 in 2004. The 'Dogs also held a No. 21 ranking in the final College Football Playoff poll released on Dec. 2, 2018.

Individual accolades in 2018 included Tedford being named an Eddie Robinson Award finalist and a Paul "Bear" Bryant Coach of the Year Award finalist. Fresno State sported 15 all-conference honorees in 2018, including the league's Defensive Player of the Year in linebacker Jeff Allison. In addition, 19 student-athletes were named to the Fall Academic All-Mountain West team.

With a 10-4 record in his first season, Fresno State became the third team in FBS history to turn a double-digit loss season (2016) into a double-digit win season (2017) the following year. The season included an appearance in the nation's top 25, clinching the Mountain West's West Division crown and leading the 'Dogs to their first appearance in the MW Championship game since 2014. He also guided the 'Dogs to the program's first bowl victory since 2007 with their win at the Hawai'i Bowl.

Great success brought great notoriety as Tedford was named the 2017 Mountain West Coach of the Year, was a semifinalist for the George

Munger College Coach of the Year Award presented by the Maxwell Football Club, a finalist for the Eddie Robinson Coach of the Year Award, and the AFCA Region-5 Coach of the Year.

While Tedford was honored as the league's coach of the year, the team had 16 student-athletes recognized with MW postseason honors - the most for the Bulldogs in a single-season since joining the conference in 2012. In the classroom, the 'Dogs also set a team-best number since joining the conference as they had 24 named to the Fall Academic All-Mountain West team.

Tedford, a former Bulldog quarterback and Fresno State assistant coach, returned to the Valley after holding the position of offensive consultant for the Washington Huskies - a 2016 College Football Playoff team.

Tedford assumed the role of acting head coach on Nov. 27, 2016, following the conclusion of the 2016 season as Eric Kiesau carried out interim head coaching duties for the remaining two games on the 2016 schedule following Tedford's introductory press conference. Tedford was officially hired on Nov. 10, 2016.

Tedford, who was an already proven winner on the West Coast, came to the Valley with 11 years of head coaching experience at the Division I level - having led the California Golden Bears to 82 wins from 2002-2012. He left as the school's all-time winningest coach.

Tedford's ties to the Valley and Fresno State run deep. He played quarterback at Fresno State in 1981-82 under Jim Sweeney and coached at Fresno State under Sweeney from 1987-88 and 1992-96, and under a then-first-year head coach Pat Hill in 1997.

Tedford's coaching career started at Fresno State, volunteering as an assistant for the 1987-88 seasons. From there he picked up his first full-time position as an assistant for the Calgary Stampeders of the Canadian Football League - a familiar league in which he played quarterback for six seasons after his collegiate career at Fresno State.

He returned to Fresno State in 1992 as the quarterbacks coach and served as the offensive coordinator for the Bulldogs over the ensuing five seasons.

Tedford graduated from Warren High School in Downey, California and attended Cerritos Junior College for two seasons before becoming the Bulldogs' quarterback in 1981.

He and his wife Donna have two children, Taylor and Quinn.

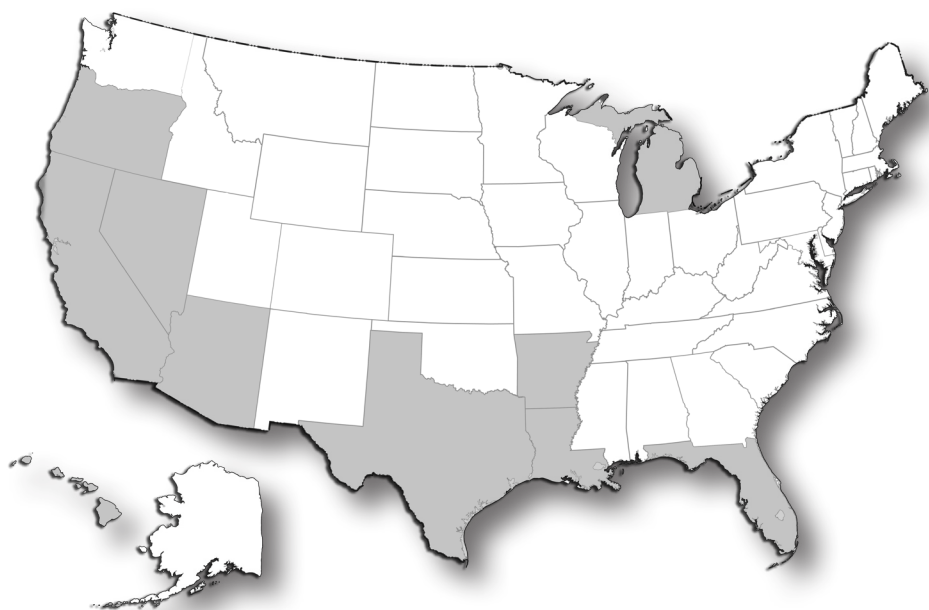

**LOS ANGELES** – Trailing by 18 with less than 17 minutes to play, Fresno State pushed USC to the end, scoring twice in the final quarter before falling short, 31-23, on Saturday night at LA Memorial Coliseum.

In a homecoming for the Los Angeles area product Jorge Reyna, the senior finished with 344 total yards, throwing for 256 and two touchdowns while adding 88 yards on the ground on 20 carries in his first start as a Bulldog. Kicker Cesar Silva accounted for nine of Fresno State's points going 3-for-3 with a long of 46 yards in his first game as a Bulldog.



The defense kept Fresno State in striking distance, forcing four turnovers, and were led by four Bulldogs registering double-digit tackles in Mykal Walker (15), Chris Gaston (12), Juju Hughes (11) and Justin Rice (10).

A critical 100-yard kick off return by Trojans' Velus Jones in the third quarter proved to be arguably the back-breaker in the third quarter after Fresno State pulled within four, and was quickly extended to the 18 points the 'Dogs still nearly overcame.

### Notable

- Jorge Reyna rushed for 88 yards. It was the most rushing yards by a Bulldog quarterback since the turn of the century.
- Cesar Silva, in his Fresno State debut, went 3-for-3 kicking field goals. The last time a Bulldog kicker went 100 percent with at least three attempts was Kody Kroening on Oct. 8, 2016 vs. Nevada.
- Saturday's game was the third game under Jeff Tedford that the Bulldogs surrendered more than 30 points, and it broke a nation-best streak of 25 games that dated back to Sept. 16, 2017.
- In the second quarter, Jorge Reyna tossed his first touchdown of the season and second touchdown pass of his career – a 34-yard TD to Derrion Grim – his first two career TD throws went to Grim.
- Justin Rice, once a starter at running back, recorded his first career interception in the second quarter.
- Fresno State had four players record double-digit tackles: Mykal Walker (15), Chris Gaston (12), Juju Hughes (11) and Justin Rice (10). All four either matched or set career highs. The last time four players had double-digit tackles was against Air Force on Oct. 28, 2016.
- USC tallied 163 yards in the first quarter. The Bulldogs' defense did not allow more than 152 in an opening quarter in 2018 (Hawaii).
- Reyna tossed his second TD pass of the game in the fourth quarter, an 8-yard strike to Chris Coleman for Coleman's first career touchdown.
- USC had 18 first downs in the first half, and were limited to seven in the second half.
- Fresno State forced four turnovers, the most since forcing four on Sept. 15, 2018 at UCLA.
- Fresno State forced two fumbles, the most since forcing two on Sept. 15, 2018 at UCLA.

**FRESNO, Calif.** – Fresno State battled to the bitter end with Big Ten foe Minnesota in its home opener, falling in double overtime 38-35 in front of 34,790 Saturday night at Bulldog Stadium.



Trailing by three points after holding the Gophers to a field goal in the second overtime period, the Bulldogs aired it out on the first play from scrimmage with its next possession, only to be intercepted in the end zone to silence the home crowd to drop Fresno State to 0-2 for the first time since 2014.

In his first start at home, Jorge Reyna went 24-of-35 passing, throwing for 288 yards, along with three touchdowns and two interceptions, the latter being the costly one that sealed the game for the Gophers. Junior running back Ronnie Rivers produced 124 total yards offense (76 rushing/48 receiving) and a career-high two receiving touchdowns.

The defense won the turnover battle for the second consecutive week, forcing three turnovers. Justin Rice led the Bulldogs with 11 tackles, two forced fumbles and one fumble recovery.

Fresno State had the opportunity to close the game out with 46 seconds left on the clock, up by a touchdown, but Minnesota converted a pivotal fourth-and-13 scoring the game-tying touchdown to send the contest into overtime.

### Notable

- Saturday's loss snapped an eight-game home winning streak.
- Fresno State has suffered just six losses in its last 27 games. The Bulldogs have not lost by double-digits since Oct. 28, 2017 – a 10 point loss to UNLV.
- The Bulldogs played in their second overtime game in the last four contests they've played in dating back to 2018. The last overtime game Fresno State participated in was a 19-16 single overtime win to defeat Boise State in the Mountain West championship game.
- Saturday's game was the Bulldogs' seventh multi-period overtime game played in, in program history.
- Fresno State dropped to 8-11 in overtime games in program history. Fresno State's last overtime game at
- Bulldog Stadium was also a double overtime contest, a 48-41 loss to Tulsa on Sept. 24, 2016.
- Fresno State owned a 21-14 lead after the third quarter. Tedford dropped to 20-3 in games with a lead after three quarters.
- Fresno States' defense forced three turnovers, all forced fumbles. The last time Fresno State recovered three fumbles in one game was on Nov. 22, 2014 at Nevada.

FRESNO, Calif. — A pair of fourth-quarter touchdowns on Saturday night lifted Fresno State to a 34-20 win over Sacramento State at Bulldog Stadium for win No. 1 of 2019 in front of more than 30,000 fans. Senior running back Josh Hokit was key in the Bulldogs' late surge, totaling nine carries for 65 yards and a touchdown during the Bulldogs' final two possessions.



Fresno State totaled a season-high 471 yards of offense with 326 yards passing and 145 yards on the ground. Defensively, the 'Dogs held Sacramento State to 245 yards of offense with only 12 yards coming on the ground. The Bulldogs held a 30-14 advantage in first downs and were able to control the ball with nearly 38 minutes of possession on offense.

Leading the way for the Bulldogs through the air was senior quarterback Jorge Reyna who passed for a career-high 326 yards on 28-of-41 passing while throwing two touchdown passes. Hokit led the way on the ground with 12 carries for 72 yards and two rushing scores while adding three receptions for 22 yards and a touchdown. Sophomore wide receiver Zane Pope tallied career-highs in receptions (6) and receiving yards (72) while junior wideout Kerik Wheatfall went for a season-best 98 yards on three receptions.

Senior cornerback Jaron Bryant led the Bulldogs in tackles with eight, including six solo, and one tackle for loss along with one pass breakup. Junior linebacker Justin Rice added six stops, five solo, one tackle for loss and three pass breakups.

### Notable

- Hokit accounted for three of the Bulldogs' five touchdowns in Saturday's game.
- Hokit had his first career game with a rushing TD (2) and a receiving TD (1).
- Hokit scored his ninth and 10th career rushing touchdowns.
- The Bulldogs improve to 12-2 at home in the Tedford era.
- The Bulldogs all-time series lead against Sacramento State increased to 4-0, following the win. But it was the first time in the series the Bulldogs allowed more than seven points in a game.
- Reyna connected with Grim, 7-yard TD, to put the 'Dogs on top 27-20 (6:41). It was Grim's second receiving score of the season and fifth career.
- Rivers registered a 6-yard TD in the second quarter, his first of the 2019 season and 16th career rushing score.
- Pope topped his career best total in receiving yards in the second quarter (5 rec., 70 yards) while also matching his career best in receptions. He finished with six receptions for 72 yards.
- Cusick placed all three of his punts inside the 10-yard line, including one on the 1-yard line.
- Against the odds — Fresno State won the turnover battle and lost games against USC and Minnesota, but lost the turnover battle to Sacramento State and won the game (2-1).
- Fresno State allowed 12 rushing yards. The Bulldogs have held an opponent under 50 yards rushing three times since 2016. They allowed 49 yards to Hawaii in 2016, -30 yards to Incarnate Word in 2017 and 12 yards to Sacramento State in 2019.
- This was the ninth time in the Tedford era an opponent was held to less than 100 yards rushing.

LAS CRUCES, N.M. — Behind 118 yards on the ground from Jalen Cropper and a two-interception night for Wylan Free, Fresno State walked out of Aggie Memorial Stadium on Saturday with a 30-17 win over New Mexico State.



Cropper led the team in all-purpose yardage with 132 yards from scrimmage (118 rushing, 14 receiving), which included 79 on one touch with an electric touchdown run in the second quarter. Redshirt freshman Emoryie Edwards saw the first game action of his career, and led all receivers with 70 yards on eight receptions.

The 'Dogs piled up 239 yards on the ground on 38 carries. Jorge Reyna finished 20-of-31 passing for 147 yards.

Defensively, the Bulldogs (2-2, 0-0 MW) held NMSU (0-5) to 315 total yards and produced three interceptions. Two of those came from Free, who entered the game with one in his career. The sophomore recorded Fresno State's first defensive score of the season with a 91-yard touchdown return on his first pick of the night. Justin Rice grabbed the team's third INT along with leading the 'Dogs with 10 tackles.

### Notable

- Wide receiver Chris Coleman switched to cornerback and started opposite of Jaron Bryant - Coleman finished with three tackles.
- Cropper's 79-yard rushing TD was his first career score and it was the 13th longest run from scrimmage in program history.
- Free's INT touchdown return was the first by a Bulldog since Tank Kelly's 70-yard TD return in the 2018 Las Vegas Bowl against Arizona State and longest since Arron Mosby's 95-yard INT TD return versus San Jose State on Nov. 24, 2018.
- Free's 88-yard INT was the fifth-longest interception return for a touchdown in program history.
- Justin Rice finished with 10 tackles - Rice has double-digit tackles in three of the first four games this season.
- Reyna kept a clean sheet for the second-straight game, not throwing an interception.
- Cropper finished as the Bulldogs' leading rusher with 118 yards on five carries (23.5 yards per rush).
- Fresno State had a season-high three interceptions. The Bulldogs entered the game with two interceptions this season.
- Fresno State was averaging 8.8 yards per rush in the first half, and 6.3 in the game.
- Fresno State matched its season-high of eight TFLs.

**USAFA, Colo.** – The Fresno State football team led Air Force in its Mountain West conference opener 24-22 at halftime, but fell 43-24 Saturday night at Falcon Stadium as the home team scored 21 unanswered in the second half.



With 69 rushing attempts, Air Force held a 340-59 advantage on the ground to control the clock as the Falcons held the ball for more than 39 minutes. In the second half, AFA held possession for 24:25 to the Bulldogs' 5:35.

After starting the game 13-of-13 passing, and 17-of-18 at the break, Jorge Reyna finished the game 20-of-27 passing for 209 yards and two touchdowns. Emoryie Edwards led the 'Dogs with a season-high 73 yards on four receptions - all in the first half. Defensively, Wyland Free and Justin Rice led Fresno State with 13 tackles each while Mykal Walker (11) and Juju Hughes (10) both finished in double figures as well.

### Notable

- Fresno State opened the first quarter with two touchdowns. It was the first time since Oct. 27, 2018 vs. Hawaii that the Bulldogs scored two TDs in the opening quarter.
- Fresno State was 3-of-3 on third downs in the first quarter; the Bulldogs would go 1-of-5 over the next three quarters.
- Jorge Reyna started the game completing his first 13 passes – his streak would end with a pass deflection in the second quarter with 10:09 remaining on the clock. Reyna finished the half 17-of-18.
- Fresno State led the time of possession battle in the first quarter – 9:52 to 5:08 – the Bulldogs' possessed the ball a total of 10:39 throughout the remainder of the game and held possession just 5:35 in the second half.
- Both teams scored on every one of their drives in the first half. The Bulldogs scored three TDs and a FG on their four drives while Air Force scored touchdowns on each of its three drives.
- Fresno State gave up a season-high 43 points. It was the first time the Bulldogs surrendered 40-plus points since allowing 48 to Washington on Sept. 16, 2017.
- The loss to Air Force was Fresno State's first double-digit loss since falling by 10 points to UNLV 26-16 on Oct. 28, 2017.
- Fresno State dropped to 20-2 under Jeff Tedford when scoring first.
- Fresno State did not force a turnover in a game for the first time since Nov. 17, 2018 against San Diego State.
- Facing Air Force, Fresno State was the last FBS team to play a conference game in the 2019 season.
