#### Headlines

→ Fresno State leads the all-time series (28-22-1) and have won seven of the last eight meetings with Hawai'i - dating back to Nov. 19, 2011.

→ The Bulldogs have squared off versus only two other teams more times than the Rainbow Warriors (San Jose State-82 & San Diego State-58).

→ Fresno State owns a five-game win streak on the Island (2009, '11, '13, '15, '17).

→ With San Diego State as the only team with one conference loss, and the Bulldogs' having a Nov. 15 game on the schedule against the Aztecs, and the remainder of the West Division with two losses or greater, the path to staying on track for a third-straight appearance in the MW Championship game starts with a victory on Saturday at Hawai'i.

→ This contest will feature two head coaches that are coaching at their respective alma maters. The duo are among 18 head coaches in the FBS that are leading their alma maters.

→ In each one of Fresno State's wins, third down defense was strong. In losses, opponents converted north of 35 percent. The 'Dogs must contain Hawai'i as they rank No. 1 in the MW in that category.

→ With 17 turnovers gained through seven games, the Bulldogs rank 3rd in the FBS in turnovers gained per game with 2.43.

→ Fresno State has posted 10 rushing TDs over its last two games and 17 for the season.

→ Josh Hokit leads Fresno State with nine touchdowns scored, and leads Fresno State with eight rushing touchdowns scored.

→ KAIL-TV, also known as My Central Valley or MyCV, will bring the Fresno State game against Hawai'i to traditional over-the-air television across the Fresno region. It will reach viewers in the counties of Fresno, Madera, Mariposa, Merced, Kings and Tulare.

## Scouting the Rainbow Warriors

Hawai'i is 5-3 (2-2 MW) this season and coming off of a 45-31 road win at New Mexico that snapped a two-game losing streak.

Hawai'i entered conference play with just one loss to Washington (52-20) and held wins against Arizona (45-38), Oregon State (31-28) and Central Arkansas (35-16). It opened Mountain West action with a win at Nevada (54-3) before suffering back-to-back losses at then-No. 14 Boise State (59-37) and against Air Force (56-26).

The power is in the offense for Hawai'i. The Rainbow Warriors lead the conference in scoring offense (36.6), pass offense (354.5), total offense (488.1), first downs (205) and fourth down conversions (70.0%) – all under the leadership of redshirt junior quarterback Cole McDonald. The La Miranda, Calif. native leads the Mountain West in passing average per game (315.1), pass efficiency (151.4) and total offense (2,857 yards) throughout the season. McDonald is fresh off of a career-best run game as he recorded 140 rushing yards and two rushing touchdowns at New Mexico last week.

Senior defensive back Kalen Hicks leads the Rainbow Warriors with 42 tackles. UH has logged 11 sacks and 35 TFLs for the year. Kaimana Padello leads in both categories with 6.0 TFLs and 2.0 sacks. Senior defensive back Ikem Okeke owns a team-best three interceptions while teammate Kai Kaneshiro has two this season.

The Rainbow Warriors have allowed their last three opponents to total more than 500 yards offense for an average of 48.6 points per game in those contests.

## Series History with the Rainbow Warriors

Fresno State leads the all-time series (28-22-1) and have won seven of the last eight meetings with Hawai'i – dating back to Nov. 19, 2011. That lone loss was a 14-13 heartbreaker at Bulldog Stadium on Nov. 19, 2016. The last time Fresno State visited the islands, they left with a 31-21 victory in 2017; the 'Dogs own a five-game win streak on the Island (2009, '11, '13, '15, '17).

Both programs have been in the same conference since 1992, when Fresno State joined the WAC. In conference matchups the 'Dogs own a 15-12 advantage, in part to its 6-1 record against UH since both schools joined the Mountain West in 2012. The inaugural game was in 1938, a 15-13 Fresno State victory.

→ The Bulldogs have only squared off versus two other teams more times than the Rainbow Warriors (San Jose State-82 & San Diego State-58).

## Double time

In the 2017 season, the last time Fresno State made the trip to the Islands, the team found itself making a pair of trips across the Pacific for two games played within 44 days of each other – its scheduled regular season contest versus Hawai'i on Nov. 11 was paired with a Dec. 24 Hawai'i Bowl bid that pit the 'Dogs against Houston.

It was nothing but paradise for the Bulldogs as they defeated Hawai'i 31-21 and capped their season with their 10th win in the bowl game with a 33-27 victory.

→ Remember this? The Bulldogs and Rainbow Warriors sat through a 41-minute lightning delay in the first half during the last game they played at Hawai'i.

## Hawai'i connections

Fresno State's roster boasts three players that claim a town from the Aloha State as their hometown: Micah Pasion (Ewa Beach), Netane Muti (Wahiawa) & Bula Schmidt (Wahiawa).

Pasion went to Kamehameha HS in Kapalama, Hawai'i; Muti, born in the Polynesian sovereign state, Tonga, in the South Pacific, went to high school in Hawai'i at Leilehua HS; Schmidt went to high school on the mainland in Washington at O'Dea HS.

### The path to repeat is still there, we promise

The Bulldogs are seeking their third-straight trip to the Mountain West Championship game in 2019, and while defending their 2018 title seems far-fetched for a 3-4, 1-2 MW club, Fresno State still controls its own destiny to reach its goal.

Entering week 10 of the 2019 season, the Bulldogs have played just one West Division contest, defeating UNLV 56-27, and is the only team in the Mountain West to of played just three conference games to this point in time - therefore having the most ground to make up.

With San Diego State as the only team with one conference loss, and the Bulldogs' having a Nov. 15 game on the schedule against the Aztecs, and the remainder of the West Division with two losses or greater, the path to staying on track starts with a victory on Saturday at Hawai'i.

→ The winner of the annual Fresno State-San Diego State game has gone on to represent the West Division in the Mountain West Championship game since the inception of the title game in 2013. No other team in the West Division has participated in the MW title game.

→ The Mountain West Championship game will be held on Dec. 7 and will be hosted at the site of the divisional champion with the highest winning percentage in Conference games only.

### Eight-Straight

The Bulldogs closed out nonconference play after the first five weeks of the college football season with a 2-2 record. Following its second bye week on Oct. 5, the Bulldogs entered Mountain West play having played four games and experiencing two byes before entering league play.

→ Fresno State was the only FBS team to have not played a conference game entering its week 7 contest versus Air Force.

### Nonconference recap

Having lost as many games in its first two weeks in 2019 as it did in 2018, it was a tough start for the 2018 Mountain West Champions that finished 12-2 and ranked No. 18 in both major polls last season. Fresno State's 0-2 start was the first for the program since 2014, but it was so close swinging to 1-1 or even 2-0. The 'Dogs average margin of loss in those two games was 5.5 points to USC on the road (Aug. 31) and Minnesota (Sept. 7) at home. Those Trojans are 5-3 with wins against then-ranked No. 10 Utah and No. 23 Stanford while Minnesota is undefeated (8-0) and currently ranked No. 13 in both the AP & Coaches polls.

The 'Dogs bounced back by winning their final two nonconference games by taking care of business defeating Sacramento State 34-20 at home to move to 1-2 and moved to .500 with a win versus New Mexico State in its final nonconference game of 2019.

→ Adding in postseason games, Tedford is 9-5 at Fresno State against teams outside the Mountain West.

### Mountain West recap

League play began on the road for the Bulldogs for the fifth time in the last six seasons as they traveled to Air Force on Oct. 12. Both teams scored with every possession held in the first half of that game, but the 'Dogs could not keep pace in the second half falling 43-24. The Bulldogs' game at Air Force is arguably the one game this season where the team found themselves out of the game. Fresno State rebounded when they hosted its first MW game the next week, routing UNLV 56-27 behind five turnovers gained against zero lost. Most recently, the Bulldogs' dropped their Homecoming game to Colorado State, 41-31. Fresno State allowed the most yards to an opponent since September of 2016 (Tulsa) allowing 500, including 227 in the opening quarter. Despite falling behind 14-0 early, the 'Dogs fought back to take their first lead, 28-24, late in the the third quarter. CSU outscored Fresno State 17-3 in the fourth quarter, which was aided by the Bulldogs' first two turnovers of the game in the frame.

**Gotta grow up some time**

→ There have been 28 players during the 2019 season to see action as a Fresno State player for the first time.

→ There have been 19 players this season to get their first career starts.

→ Fresno State has had 36 different players make a start in 2019. Only BYU (45), Old Dominion (42), UMass (41), New Mexico (40), Akron (39), Wyoming (39), Tennessee (38), N.C. State (38), Houston (38), Troy (37), Oregon State (37), Georgia Tech (37), TCU (36), Florida State (36), Colorado (36), Arkansas State (36), UConn (36) share numbers of that stature.

→ Five true freshman have made starts for Fresno State in 2019; only Alabama (9), UMass (7), Stanford (7), Texas A&M (7), USC (6) and Tennessee (6) have started more true freshman this season. Along with the Bulldogs, Akron, Arizona State, Arkansas, Colorado State, TCU and West Virginia have used five.

→ Fresno State returned three starters on offense and six starters on defense from 2018.

Saturday's contest will feature two head coaches that are leading their respective alma maters. Jeff Tedford a 1992 graduate of Fresno State (but played in 1981-82) and Nick Rolovich, a 2004 graduate of Hawai'i.

### This guy can do it all

Josh Hokit opted out of a scholarship to wrestle at Drexel and walked on to the Fresno State football team as a linebacker at his first fall camp as a freshman in 2016. He ended up playing as a true freshman at linebacker as well as at fullback, running back and on special teams. His role as a running back went full-time after a Nov. 19, 2016 game against Hawai'i where he exploded for 97 yards on 18 carries. A week later he got his first start at running back. Fast forward to 2019 spring football, and Hokit returned back to linebacker midway through the team's 15 practices, because he missed the first half due to being at the NCAA wrestling national championships, earning all-american status by placing fifth in the 197 lb. division. He repped at linebacker for the remainder of spring football and the first 13 practices of fall camp in 2019 before a rash of injuries ultimately turned the team-first player back to running back overnight for practice No. 14. The thought of returning to linebacker was for the future as Hokit intended to redshirt in football in 2019, add weight to his frame and wrestle as a heavyweight in 2019-20, and then play linebacker in 2020 as a redshirt senior. That will not happen as he's already participated in more than four games in 2019.

→ Hokit registered his second career three-touchdown rushing performance against UNLV on Oct. 18, 2019 – his first career trifecta was against San Diego State in 2017.

→ This season, Hokit leads Fresno State with nine touchdowns scored, and leads Fresno State with eight rushing touchdowns scored.

### Run game takes center stage

The Bulldogs rushed for 188 yards against Colorado State, at a tune of 6.26 yards per carry on 30 attempts for four rushing TDs. Statistically it wasn't the top performance of the season, as that came one week prior with 260 yards on the ground using 36 carries, but that game included an 82-yard rush from wide receiver Jalen Cropper on a fly sweep. The contest against Colorado State featured running back Ronnie Rivers having his top game of the year as he tallied his first 100-yard game of the season and fourth career. Rivers rushed for 146 yards against the Rams, which included three explosive run plays of 45, 37 and 20 - all coming in the second half.

→ Fresno State has posted 10 rushing TDs over its last two games and 17 for the season.

→ Rivers and Hokit have recorded multi-TD games in back-to-back games. That is the first time two Bulldog rushers accomplished that feat since (at least) 2000.

**Looking for continuity**

Fresno State has used the same starting five offensive linemen in consecutive games twice in 2019 - between the season opener (at USC) and game two (vs. Minnesota), and then again on Oct. 12 (at Air Force) and Oct. 18 (vs. UNLV). After seeing his first action of the season on the line against UNLV (at left guard), Jace Fuamatu earned his first career start last time out against Colorado State.

In 2019, the Bulldogs have had five different combinations through the first seven games. Fresno State lost Dontae Bull to injury in game three, and Netane Muti the last four games to injury. While Bull missed just one game and returned to the starting lineup, it was declared by Coach Tedford on Oct. 16 that Muti would be lost for the season (Lisfranc).

Muti was an honorable mention all-Mountain West selection in 2017 for his play during his redshirt freshman season. He was named to the 2018 & 2019 preseason Polynesian College Football Player of the Year award watch lists.

**Once a decade tight end**

While 2019 has been a slow start, tight end Jared Rice has arguably been the most productive Fresno State tight end since Bear Pascoe (2005-08), who made himself a seven-year NFL career. Rice, a senior this season, broke Pascoe's single season best marks of receptions and receiving yards by a tight end as a junior - now he's closing in on career records set by Pascoe and Marty Thompson.

→ Bear Pascoe owns the records for career receptions (112) and receiving yards (1,294), respectively, by a tight end.

→ Marty Thompson, brother of current Bulldogs' tight end coach Scott Thompson, owns the most single season touchdowns (8) - set in 1991 - and career touchdowns (11) by a tight end in program history.

**Needs a little help**

Jorge Reyna, the Bulldogs' starting quarterback who had big shoes to fill replacing the previous starter from the 2017-18 seasons, is off to a 3-4 start as a division I starter. The redshirt senior from Pasadena, Calif. ranks fourth in total offense (257.6), fifth in passing (236.4) and fifth in pass efficiency (141.7) in the Mountain West. His completion percentage is 63.1, and is one of five quarterbacks in the league who owns a completion percentage better than 60 percent.

The comparison to McMaryion's two seasons are lofty for anyone as McMaryion was 21-4 as a starting quarterback at Fresno State. One luxury the former signal caller had was an unrelenting defense. In McMaryion's 25 starts, the Bulldogs allowed 14.4 points per game in those games while in Mountain West conference games the Bulldogs allowed just 12.0 points per game. Through seven games in 2019, the Bulldogs are allowing 31.0 points per game and in three MW games are allowing 37.0 points per game.

### Avoid the yellow handkerchiefs

A story line from the Bulldogs' loss to Colorado State was the uncharacteristic penalties against Fresno State. The Bulldogs entered the game ranking No. 7 in the FBS in penalty yards per game and No. 21 in the FBS in penalties per game. The Bulldogs posted season highs in both last time out with nine penalties that cost them 74 yards.

### A large collection of pass catchers

The Bulldogs feature a group of six receivers, two running backs and two tight ends that are actively involved in the Bulldogs' passing game. It is a true team game among those players regarding opportunities as seven different Bulldog players own 10 or more receptions through seven games with sophomore Zane Pope the leader with 27 receptions. Pope along with seniors Derrion Grim and Jared Rice (TE) are the only Bulldogs to have logged a catch in all seven games in 2019. Grim leads the Bulldogs in receiving yards with 284, but tops Pope by just six yards (278) while junior-transfer Kerik Wheatfall joins Grim and Pope as the only other Bulldog above 200 yards receiving this season. Wheatfall leads the team as a deep threat, owning a 22.9 yards per reception average. 13 different players have caught a pass in 2019.

### The art of forced fumbles

Through seven games this season the Bulldogs have forced nine fumbles. Eight have been recovered which ranks tied for 11th nationally. Surprisingly, the first seven recoveries came from a different Bulldog until Justin Rice scooped up No. 8, his second of the season, and returned it 18 yards for a touchdown versus UNLV on Oct. 18.

→ Fresno State is tied for 9th in the FBS in fumble recoveries per game, averaging 1.14.

→ Fresno State is well over halfway to double figure fumble recoveries with at least five games remaining in the season, a mark that only five Bulldog teams have achieved since 2010.

→ The eight recoveries have surpassed the season totals from 2010, 2011, 2016 and 2018, and is one shy of 2013.

### Forcing turnovers

With one takeaway last weekend, the Bulldogs have increased their season total to 17. It is the third-most through seven games for Fresno State during the last decade, one behind 2018 and two behind 2012. Fresno State currently ranks tied for No. 8 in the FBS and No. 2 in the MW in turnovers gained.

→ With 17 turnovers through seven games, the Bulldogs rank 3rd in the FBS in turnovers gained per game with 2.43.

### It's an area to pay attention to

While it isn't an exact indicator, losing the turnover battle hasn't put the Bulldogs in the best position to win games under Jeff Tedford. Six of Fresno State's 10 losses under the Bulldog coach have come when having more turnovers. That trend was evident on Saturday as the 'Dogs were sitting in a 31-31 game with the ball in their possession in the fourth quarter while holding a 1-0 edge in turnovers. That changed in the final minutes as a pair of interceptions turned the takeaways into Colorado State's favor and the final score followed suit.

### Finding the ball in the air

While Fresno State had just two interceptions through its first three games of the season, the Bulldogs' have started to see the ball better in the passing game during the past four games as they have snagged seven picks with five different players each recording an INT. Safeties Wylan Free and Juju Hughes have each grabbed two during that time frame.

→ Free, Hughes and linebacker Justin Rice lead the team with two INTs each.

→ Fresno State ranks tied for 15th in the FBS in interceptions with nine.

→ Free is one of 34 players in the FBS to return an interception for a touchdown this season while also totaling the second-most return yards (104). Free's 91-yard TD on Sept. 28 at New Mexico State is the fourth-longest interception return in the FBS this season.

### Winning formula

There has been a trend with the Bulldogs' defense. In each of Fresno State's wins, third down defense held strong - holding teams below 30 percent. While in its losses, Fresno State's defense allowed teams to convert north of 35 percent on third down. Colorado State was the latest, converting at a clip of 37.5 percent (6-of-16).

### Playing above his class

With four starts this season, including starting the last two games, true freshman Levelle Bailey has been making his presence felt for the Bulldogs. In a growing role, the first-year player ranks seventh on the team in tackles with 23 but is second on the team in tackles for loss with 5.5.

→ Bailey's 5.5 TFLs is the most by a Bulldog freshman since Ben Jacobs in 2007 (6.0).

→ The freshman's most productive games have come against Minnesota (seven tackles, 2.5 TFLs) and New Mexico State (seven tackles, 2.0 TFLs). Bailey picked up his first career fumble and grabbed his first interception versus UNLV on Oct. 18 - both in the first quarter.

### Versatility

After moving to middle linebacker for the 2019 season from defensive end where he was an all-conference player a season ago, Mykal Walker has seen a shift back to the line. Hand up or hand down, or sliding back into coverage, the 6-foot-3, 230-pound athlete is a problem for any opposing offense wherever he lines up. Second on the team in tackles with 63, Walker ranks 33rd in the FBS and fourth in the MW in tackles per game, averaging 9.0.

→ Last time out against Colorado State, Walker gathered a season-high two tackles for loss and his first solo sack of the season.

→ Through seven games, Walker has started three times at middle linebacker in a 4-3, three times at defensive end in a 4-3 and once as an outside linebacker in a 3-4.

→ Against UNLV, the senior recorded nine tackles with all nine being solo stops. It is the first time that has happened since Mike Bell had nine solo stops in the 2018 Mountain West Championship game at Boise State on Dec. 1, 2018.

→ Walker opened the season with a career-high 15 stops at USC.

→ Walker leads the Bulldogs in tackles for loss (6.5) and quarterback hurries (2) and is second in tackles (63) and fumble recoveries (1).

→ Mykal is following in the footsteps of his late father Michael Walker who similarly played at Fresno State in 1985-86 after redshirting as a Bulldog in 1984. His father transferred to Fresno State from College of Marin and tallied 65 tackles and 6.5 sacks at Fresno State under Jim Sweeney.





### Quite possibly the best redshirt ever taken

Last season the Bulldogs were set with a trio of standout linebackers in Jeff Allison (2018 MW Defensive Player of the Year), George Helmuth and James Bailey. With not much room or time available among those behind that group, the then-third year junior Justin Rice and coaching staff mutually agreed for him to shut it down after he played his first four games of 2018 to take a redshirt to prepare for 2019 as all three of the aforementioned departed.

Starting all seven games, playing either the WILL or MIKE positions, Rice has been a disruptive force for the Bulldogs' defense. The first-year starter ranks 10th in the FBS in tackles per game with 10.14. No Bulldog has averaged that many tackles per game in a season since Marcus Riley in 2008 (10.15).

→ Rice has caused 0.86 turnovers per game while also defending 1.3 passes per game.

→ Rice is one of seven players in the nation to have caused at least six turnovers. Rice though has played one less game than the other six.

→ Rice, Luq Barcoo of San Diego State and Amik Robertson of Louisiana Tech are the only players to rank in the top 10 in the FBS in both turnovers caused and passes defended.

→ Rice is one of six players in the FBS to have forced at least four fumbles. He is forcing 0.57 fumbles per game which is tied for the third-highest frequency in the FBS.

→ Rice is the only player in the nation to have four forced fumbles, two fumble recoveries and two interceptions.

→ Rice is the only linebacker in FBS to rank inside the top 30 in passes defended per game.

→ With 11 tackles versus Colorado State, Rice has recorded at least 10 tackles in six of seven games.

→ Rice became the first Bulldog since Ejiro Ederaine on Oct. 26, 2013 to return a fumble recovery for a touchdown when he scooped up a fumble versus UNLV on Oct. 18 and returned it 18 yards.

### Dual threat

After being one of the Bulldog's top receiving threats through the first three games of the season, Chris Coleman made the switch to the defensive side of the ball in Week 5 after a rash of injuries hit Fresno State's secondary. After a meeting with Coach Tedford the Monday following the Sacramento State game and talking about the move, Coleman prepared the next four days and made the start at cornerback against New Mexico State where he played the majority of the team's defensive snaps, making three tackles and breaking up a pass. For the fourth-straight game, Coleman got the start at cornerback versus Colorado State. He's started five games in 2019, four times at corner and once at wide receiver.

## Rice earns MW weekly honors

Redshirt junior linebacker Justin Rice was selected as the Mountain West Defensive Player of the Week on Oct. 21 after his efforts in the Bulldogs' Oct. 18 contest versus UNLV. Rice led the team with 10 tackles, a forced fumble that led to a turnover gained, and a fumble recovery that that he ran 18 yards for a touchdown with 3:49 left in the third quarter that arguably sparked the turning-point in the game. Rice's TD was the start of a 28-0 second half scoring run.

Rice was the first MW Player of the Week for the Bulldogs since Marcus McMaryion (Offensive) and Mykal Walker (Defensive) earned the honors on Oct. 1, 2018. He is the first Bulldog linebacker with the recognition since George Helmuth on Nov. 18, 2017.

## Last time vs. Hawai'i

The two programs met in 2018 for Fresno State's homecoming on Oct. 27. The Bulldogs ran away with a 50-20 victory. Current 'Dogs had a big role in the victory against Hawai'i in 2018 as Ronnie Rivers, Jared Rice and Derrion Grim each found the end zone on that night. Rivers rushed for a team-high 125 yards versus the Rainbow Warriors. Rice had 70 receiving yards on six receptions and Grim had a six-yard reception for a touchdown. Jorge Reyna made an appearance at quarterback going 5-of-7 for 64 yards.

Defensively, the Bulldogs were powered by Mykal Walker with nine tackles, 3.5 TFLs, one sack and a fumble recovery. Juju Hughes contributed with an interception returned 31 yards and two broken up passes.

## How to watch the Bulldogs

KAIL-TV, also known as My Central Valley or MyCV, will bring the Fresno State game against Hawai'i to traditional over-the-air television across the Fresno region. It reaches viewers in the counties of Fresno, Madera, Mariposa, Merced, Kings and Tulare. Due to the KAIL broadcast, the Facebook stream will be geo-blocked from access to viewing online in the six counties it will broadcast to. The game will be produced locally in Hawai'i by Spectrum Sports and only available on the Hawaiian Islands on Spectrum Sports.

## 2019 PRESEASON MOUNTAIN WEST FOOTBALL ALL-CONFERENCE AND AWARDS



The Fresno State football team has been picked to repeat as West Division champions by the media, the Mountain West announced on July 23 prior to kicking off the 2019 football Media Days in Las Vegas.

As the first-place pick for the West, Fresno State has earned its fourth division leading bid in the preseason media polls dating back to 2013, and second in as many years (2013, 2014, 2018 and 2019). The Bulldogs have prevailed and won the West in every season that they have been the first-place pick in the preseason polls.

Along with a predicted first-place finish in its division, Fresno State secured three preseason all-conference selections in senior tight end Jared Rice, senior linebacker Mykal Walker and senior defensive back Juju Hughes.

It was been a busy July for Fresno State's three preseason All-Mountain West selections as each of the senior Bulldogs have been named to seven watch lists for awards in their respective positions.

Rice, Walker and Hughes are continuing their successes from the 2018 season as each were named to either the All-Mountain West first or second team a season ago.

# JEFF TEDFORD

**HEAD COACH****3RD SEASON | FRESNO STATE (1992)**

Jeff Tedford, 57, inherited a 1-11 football program when he took over the reins of his alma mater and in two seasons all he's done as the 19th head football coach in Fresno State history is lead the program to a 22-6 record, a 2018 Mountain West Championship, two MW West division titles and two bowl wins.

In 2018, in addition to defeating Boise State on the road in overtime, 19-16, for Fresno State's first conference championship since 2013, the Bulldogs capped the season with a 31-20 triumph over Arizona State to win the Mitsubishi Motors Las Vegas Bowl. The bowl win left the Bulldogs with their first 12-win season in the 97-year history of the program. This, one season after engineering one of the greatest turnarounds in FBS history guiding the Bulldogs to a 10-4 record, an appearance in the MW title game and a Hawai'i Bowl win over Houston.

The renaissance under Tedford has led to FBS history being made as Fresno State became the first team to secure back-to-back double-digit winning seasons following a double-digit loss season.

The 2018 Bulldogs finished nationally ranked in the final rankings of the season for the first time since 2004. Fresno State finished ranked No. 18 in both the AP Top 25 and Coaches poll, announced Jan. 8, 2019. It was the best finish in the AP Top 25 in program history, besting No. 22 in 2004. The 'Dogs also held a No. 21 ranking in the final College Football Playoff poll released on Dec. 2, 2018.

Individual accolades in 2018 included Tedford being named an Eddie Robinson Award finalist and a Paul "Bear" Bryant Coach of the Year Award finalist. Fresno State sported 15 all-conference honorees in 2018, including the league's Defensive Player of the Year in linebacker Jeff Allison. In addition, 19 student-athletes were named to the Fall Academic All-Mountain West team.

With a 10-4 record in his first season, Fresno State became the third team in FBS history to turn a double-digit loss season (2016) into a double-digit win season (2017) the following year. The season included an appearance in the nation's top 25, clinching the Mountain West's West Division crown and leading the 'Dogs to their first appearance in the MW Championship game since 2014. He also guided the 'Dogs to the program's first bowl victory since 2007 with their win at the Hawai'i Bowl.

Great success brought great notoriety as Tedford was named the 2017 Mountain West Coach of the Year, was a semifinalist for the George

Munger College Coach of the Year Award presented by the Maxwell Football Club, a finalist for the Eddie Robinson Coach of the Year Award, and the AFCA Region-5 Coach of the Year.

While Tedford was honored as the league's coach of the year, the team had 16 student-athletes recognized with MW postseason honors - the most for the Bulldogs in a single-season since joining the conference in 2012. In the classroom, the 'Dogs also set a team-best number since joining the conference as they had 24 named to the Fall Academic All-Mountain West team.

Tedford, a former Bulldog quarterback and Fresno State assistant coach, returned to the Valley after holding the position of offensive consultant for the Washington Huskies – a 2016 College Football Playoff team.

Tedford assumed the role of acting head coach on Nov. 27, 2016, following the conclusion of the 2016 season as Eric Kiesau carried out interim head coaching duties for the remaining two games on the 2016 schedule following Tedford's introductory press conference. Tedford was officially hired on Nov. 10, 2016.

Tedford, who was an already proven winner on the West Coast, came to the Valley with 11 years of head coaching experience at the Division I level – having led the California Golden Bears to 82 wins from 2002-2012. He left as the school's all-time winningest coach.

Tedford's ties to the Valley and Fresno State run deep. He played quarterback at Fresno State in 1981-82 under Jim Sweeney and coached at Fresno State under Sweeney from 1987-88 and 1992-96, and under a then-first-year head coach Pat Hill in 1997.

Tedford's coaching career started at Fresno State, volunteering as an assistant for the 1987-88 seasons. From there he picked up his first full-time position as an assistant for the Calgary Stampeders of the Canadian Football League – a familiar league in which he played quarterback for six seasons after his collegiate career at Fresno State.

He returned to Fresno State in 1992 as the quarterbacks coach and served as the offensive coordinator for the Bulldogs over the ensuing five seasons.

Tedford graduated from Warren High School in Downey, California and attended Cerritos Junior College for two seasons before becoming the Bulldogs' quarterback in 1981.

He and his wife Donna have two children, Taylor and Quinn.

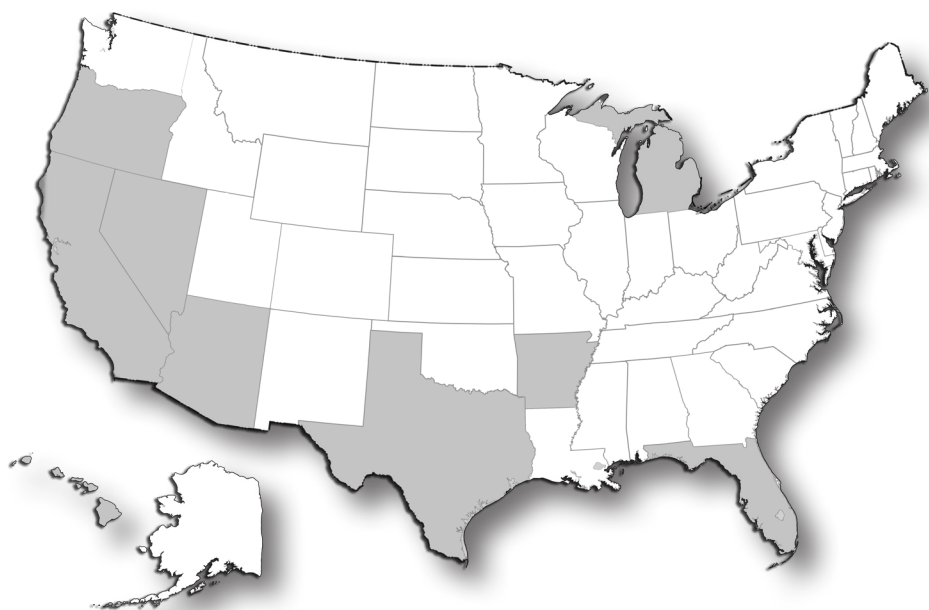

**LOS ANGELES** – Trailing by 18 with less than 17 minutes to play, Fresno State pushed USC to the end, scoring twice in the final quarter before falling short, 31-23, on Saturday night at LA Memorial Coliseum.

In a homecoming for the Los Angeles area product Jorge Reyna, the senior finished with 344 total yards, throwing for 256 and two touchdowns while adding 88 yards on the ground on 20 carries in his first start as a Bulldog. Kicker Cesar Silva accounted for nine of Fresno State's points going 3-for-3 with a long of 46 yards in his first game as a Bulldog.



The defense kept Fresno State in striking distance, forcing four turnovers, and were led by four Bulldogs registering double-digit tackles in Mykal Walker (15), Chris Gaston (12), Juju Hughes (11) and Justin Rice (10).

A critical 100-yard kick off return by Trojans' Velus Jones in the third quarter proved to be arguably the back-breaker in the third quarter after Fresno State pulled within four, and was quickly extended to the 18 points the 'Dogs still nearly overcame.

### Notable

- Jorge Reyna rushed for 88 yards. It was the most rushing yards by a Bulldog quarterback since the turn of the century.
- Cesar Silva, in his Fresno State debut, went 3-for-3 kicking field goals. The last time a Bulldog kicker went 100 percent with at least three attempts was Kody Kroening on Oct. 8, 2016 vs. Nevada.
- Saturday's game was the third game under Jeff Tedford that the Bulldogs surrendered more than 30 points, and it broke a nation-best streak of 25 games that dated back to Sept. 16, 2017.
- In the second quarter, Jorge Reyna tossed his first touchdown of the season and second touchdown pass of his career – a 34-yard TD to Derrion Grim – his first two career TD throws went to Grim.
- Justin Rice, once a starter at running back, recorded his first career interception in the second quarter.
- Fresno State had four players record double-digit tackles: Mykal Walker (15), Chris Gaston (12), Juju Hughes (11) and Justin Rice (10). All four either matched or set career highs. The last time four players had double-digit tackles was against Air Force on Oct. 28, 2016.
- USC tallied 163 yards in the first quarter. The Bulldogs' defense did not allow more than 152 in an opening quarter in 2018 (Hawaii).
- Reyna tossed his second TD pass of the game in the fourth quarter, an 8-yard strike to Chris Coleman for Coleman's first career touchdown.
- USC had 18 first downs in the first half, and were limited to seven in the second half.
- Fresno State forced four turnovers, the most since forcing four on Sept. 15, 2018 at UCLA.
- Fresno State forced two fumbles, the most since forcing two on Sept. 15, 2018 at UCLA.

**FRESNO, Calif.** – Fresno State battled to the bitter end with Big Ten foe Minnesota in its home opener, falling in double overtime 38-35 in front of 34,790 Saturday night at Bulldog Stadium.



Trailing by three points after holding the Gophers to a field goal in the second overtime period, the Bulldogs aired it out on the first play from scrimmage with its next possession, only to be intercepted in the end zone to silence the home crowd to drop Fresno State to 0-2 for the first time since 2014.

In his first start at home, Jorge Reyna went 24-of-35 passing, throwing for 288 yards, along with three touchdowns and two interceptions, the latter being the costly one that sealed the game for the Gophers. Junior running back Ronnie Rivers produced 124 total yards offense (76 rushing/48 receiving) and a career-high two receiving touchdowns.

The defense won the turnover battle for the second consecutive week, forcing three turnovers. Justin Rice led the Bulldogs with 11 tackles, two forced fumbles and one fumble recovery.

Fresno State had the opportunity to close the game out with 46 seconds left on the clock, up by a touchdown, but Minnesota converted a pivotal fourth-and-13 scoring the game-tying touchdown to send the contest into overtime.

### Notable

- Saturday's loss snapped an eight-game home winning streak.
- Fresno State has suffered just six losses in its last 27 games. The Bulldogs have not lost by double-digits since Oct. 28, 2017 – a 10 point loss to UNLV.
- The Bulldogs played in their second overtime game in the last four contests they've played in dating back to 2018. The last overtime game Fresno State participated in was a 19-16 single overtime win to defeat Boise State in the Mountain West championship game.
- Saturday's game was the Bulldogs' seventh multi-period overtime game played in, in program history.
- Fresno State dropped to 8-11 in overtime games in program history. Fresno State's last overtime game at
- Bulldog Stadium was also a double overtime contest, a 48-41 loss to Tulsa on Sept. 24, 2016.

FRESNO, Calif. — A pair of fourth-quarter touchdowns on Saturday night lifted Fresno State to a 34-20 win over Sacramento State at Bulldog Stadium for win No. 1 of 2019 in front of more than 30,000 fans. Senior running back Josh Hokit was key in the Bulldogs' late surge, totaling nine carries for 65 yards and a touchdown during the Bulldogs' final two possessions.



Fresno State totaled a season-high 471 yards of offense with 326 yards passing and 145 yards on the ground. Defensively, the 'Dogs held Sacramento State to 245 yards of offense with only 12 yards coming on the ground. The Bulldogs held a 30-14 advantage in first downs and were able to control the ball with nearly 38 minutes of possession on offense.

Leading the way for the Bulldogs through the air was senior quarterback Jorge Reyna who passed for a career-high 326 yards on 28-of-41 passing while throwing two touchdown passes. Hokit led the way on the ground with 12 carries for 72 yards and two rushing scores while adding three receptions for 22 yards and a touchdown. Sophomore wide receiver Zane Pope tallied career-highs in receptions (6) and receiving yards (72) while junior wideout Kerik Wheatfall went for a season-best 98 yards on three receptions.

Senior cornerback Jaron Bryant led the Bulldogs in tackles with eight, including six solo, and one tackle for loss along with one pass breakup. Junior linebacker Justin Rice added six stops, five solo, one tackle for loss and three pass breakups.

### Notable

- Hokit accounted for three of the Bulldogs' five touchdowns in Saturday's game.
- Hokit had his first career game with a rushing TD (2) and a receiving TD (1).
- Hokit scored his ninth and 10th career rushing touchdowns.
- The Bulldogs improve to 12-2 at home in the Tedford era.
- The Bulldogs all-time series lead against Sacramento State increased to 4-0, following the win. But it was the first time in the series the Bulldogs allowed more than seven points in a game.
- Reyna connected with Grim, 7-yard TD, to put the 'Dogs on top 27-20 (6:41). It was Grim's second receiving score of the season and fifth career.
- Rivers registered a 6-yard TD in the second quarter, his first of the 2019 season and 16th career rushing score.
- Pope topped his career best total in receiving yards in the second quarter (5 rec., 70 yards) while also matching his career best in receptions. He finished with six receptions for 72 yards.
- Cusick placed all three of his punts inside the 10-yard line, including one on the 1-yard line.
- Against the odds — Fresno State won the turnover battle and lost games against USC and Minnesota, but lost the turnover battle to Sacramento State and won the game (2-1).
- Fresno State allowed 12 rushing yards. The Bulldogs have held an opponent under 50 yards rushing three times since 2016. They allowed 49 yards to Hawaii in 2016, -30 yards to Incarnate Word in 2017 and 12 yards to Sacramento State in 2019.

LAS CRUCES, N.M. — Behind 118 yards on the ground from Jalen Cropper and a two-interception night for Wylan Free, Fresno State walked out of Aggie Memorial Stadium on Saturday with a 30-17 win over New Mexico State.



Cropper led the team in all-purpose yardage with 132 yards from scrimmage (118 rushing, 14 receiving), which included 79 on one touch with an electric touchdown run in the second quarter. Redshirt freshman Emoryie Edwards saw the first game action of his career, and led all receivers with 70 yards on eight receptions.

The 'Dogs piled up 239 yards on the ground on 38 carries. Jorge Reyna finished 20-of-31 passing for 147 yards.

Defensively, the Bulldogs (2-2, 0-0 MW) held NMSU (0-5) to 315 total yards and produced three interceptions. Two of those came from Free, who entered the game with one in his career. The sophomore recorded Fresno State's first defensive score of the season with a 91-yard touchdown return on his first pick of the night. Justin Rice grabbed the team's third INT along with leading the 'Dogs with 10 tackles.

### Notable

- Wide receiver Chris Coleman switched to cornerback and started opposite of Jaron Bryant - Coleman finished with three tackles.
- Cropper's 79-yard rushing TD was his first career score and it was the 13th longest run from scrimmage in program history.
- Free's INT touchdown return was the first by a Bulldog since Tank Kelly's 70-yard TD return in the 2018 Las Vegas Bowl against Arizona State and longest since Arron Mosby's 95-yard INT TD return versus San Jose State on Nov. 24, 2018.
- Free's 88-yard INT was the fifth-longest interception return for a touchdown in program history.
- Justin Rice finished with 10 tackles - Rice has double-digit tackles in three of the first four games this season.
- Reyna kept a clean sheet for the second-straight game, not throwing an interception.
- Cropper finished as the Bulldogs' leading rusher with 118 yards on five carries (23.5 yards per rush).
- Fresno State had a season-high three interceptions. The Bulldogs entered the game with two interceptions this season.
- Fresno State was averaging 8.8 yards per rush in the first half, and 6.3 in the game.
- Fresno State matched its season-high of eight TFLs.
- For the second time this season, kicker Cesar Silva was perfect going 3-of-3 on field goals (24, 28, 38) and was also 3-of-3 PATs.

**USAFA, Colo.** – The Fresno State football team led Air Force in its Mountain West conference opener 24-22 at halftime, but fell 43-24 Saturday night at Falcon Stadium as the home team scored 21 unanswered in the second half.

With 69 rushing attempts, Air Force held a 340-59 advantage on the ground to control the clock as the Falcons held the ball for more than 39 minutes. In the second half, AFA held possession for 24:25 to the Bulldogs' 5:35.



After starting the game 13-of-13 passing, and 17-of-18 at the break, Jorge Reyna finished the game 20-of-27 passing for 209 yards and two touchdowns. Emoryie Edwards led the 'Dogs with a season-high 73 yards on four receptions - all in the first half. Defensively, Wylen Free and Justin Rice led Fresno State with 13 tackles each while Mykal Walker (11) and Juju Hughes (10) both finished in double figures as well.

### Notable

- Fresno State opened the first quarter with two touchdowns. It was the first time since Oct. 27, 2018 vs. Hawaii that the Bulldogs scored two TDs in the opening quarter.
- Fresno State was 3-of-3 on third downs in the first quarter; the Bulldogs would go 1-of-5 over the next three quarters.
- Jorge Reyna started the game completing his first 13 passes – his streak would end with a pass deflection in the second quarter with 10:09 remaining on the clock. Reyna finished the half 17-of-18.
- Fresno State led the time of possession battle in the first quarter – 9:52 to 5:08 – the Bulldogs' possessed the ball a total of 10:39 throughout the remainder of the game and held possession just 5:35 in the second half.
- Both teams scored on every one of their drives in the first half. The Bulldogs scored three TDs and a FG on their four drives while Air Force scored touchdowns on each of its three drives.
- Fresno State gave up a season-high 43 points. It was the first time the Bulldogs surrendered 40-plus points since allowing 48 to Washington on Sept. 16, 2017.
- The loss to Air Force was Fresno State's first double-digit loss since falling by 10 points to UNLV 26-16 on Oct. 28, 2017.
- Fresno State dropped to 20-2 under Jeff Tedford when scoring first.
- Fresno State did not force a turnover in a game for the first time since Nov. 17, 2018 against San Diego State.
- Facing Air Force, Fresno State was the last FBS team to play a conference game in the 2019 season.

**FRESNO, Calif.** – Behind 28 points off five turnovers, Fresno State cruised past UNLV, 56-27, on Friday night at Bulldog Stadium. The 'Dogs scored 21 of those points during a nine-minute span in the second half as their lead ballooned from eight to 36 points.



True freshman Levelle Bailey produced his first two takeaways of the year, and first two of the game, picking up a fumble and grabbing an interception both in the first quarter. Bailey's interception was the first of three on the night for Fresno State. Justin Rice forced a fumble and recovered a fumble in the same game for the second time this season - the recovery was an 18-yard touchdown return which gave Fresno State a 15-point advantage late in the third quarter that began a stretch of 28-unanswered points for the 'Dogs. The junior linebacker led Fresno State in tackles for the fourth time in the last five games as he racked up 10.

The Bulldogs' ground game, which had been averaging 141.2 yards per game, totaled 260 on the night compared to UNLV's 157. Fresno State's backfield accounted for six touchdowns, the most since the 2018 season opener, with three coming from Josh Hokit, two from Ronnie Rivers and one from Jorge Reyna. The senior quarterback also threw one touchdown to go with his 229 yards through the air. Jalen Cropper led the 'Dogs in rushing for the second game this season, carrying the ball twice with one an 82-yard gain that left the Bulldogs with first-and-goal from the 1-yard line. Kerik Wheatfall led the receiving corps with 86 yards on four catches.

### Notable

- Fresno State improved to 9-3 all-time in home games against the Rebels.
- The 'Dogs improve to 6-2 in MW home openers with Saturday's win.
- Reyna posted his third game this season not throwing an interception.
- The Bulldogs' five turnovers gained is the most since the 2018 season opener.
- Bailey became the first player to recover a fumble and record an interception in the same game since Mike Bell on Oct. 14, 2017 versus New Mexico.
- Ju. Rice forced his fourth fumble of the season, while Bailey recovered his first career fumble.
- Ronnie Rivers scored his third and fourth touchdowns of the season – it was Rivers' fifth career-multi rushing score game, and first since the 2018 Las Vegas Bowl versus Arizona State on Dec. 15, 2018.
- Jalen Cropper, who recorded a 79-yard run earlier this season – the 13th-longest run from scrimmage in school history – sprinted to an 82-yard run (tackled at the 1-yard line) and set the 10th-longest run from scrimmage in program history. It bumped his 79-yard run to the 14th longest.
- Hokit's registered his second career three-touchdown rushing performance – last time was against San Diego State in 2017.
- Ju. Rice recovered a fumble and returned it 18 yards for a touchdown. It was the first fumble recovered and returned for a touchdown by a Bulldog since Ejiro Ederaine did it against San Diego State on Oct. 26, 2013.
- Mosby recorded his second career interception. His first career INT was a 95-yard touchdown return. His second was an interception returned 16 yards to the UNLV 1-yard line.

**FRESNO, Calif.** — In a game that saw Fresno State climb back from an early deficit, Colorado State scored the final 10 points to spoil Homecoming on Saturday at Bulldog Stadium with a 41-31 win.

Colorado State's fast start came with 227 yards of offense in the first quarter as they outgained Fresno State by 112 yards in the game. In total, CSU recorded 500 yards, the most surrendered by a Bulldog team since September of 2016.



Ronnie Rivers led Fresno State with 215 all-purpose yards, rushing for a season-high 146 yards. The running back also led the 'Dogs in receiving with 42 yards on four catches. Rivers and Josh Hokit accounted for two rushing touchdowns apiece.

Justin Rice recorded double-digit tackles for the sixth time this season, posting 11 stops, nine of which were solo. Juju Hughes grabbed his second interception in as many weeks.

### Notable

- Fresno State allowed 500 yards offense for the first time since allowing 617 yards total offense against Tulsa on Sept. 24, 2016.
- The Bulldogs allowed 227 yards offense in the first quarter, the most allowed by a Tedford team.
- Colorado State's second play from scrimmage was a 69-yard touchdown pass from Patrick O'Brien to Trey McBride – it was the longest play from scrimmage allowed this season.
- Fresno State drops to 1-3 against Colorado State in Mountain West games, and trail the all-time series 5-10.
- The loss was the third on homecoming in the last 10 years.
- Fresno State drops to 1-2 in Mountain West games in 2019, but continues to control its own destiny to win the West Division as four teams have two losses while San Diego State has one.
- Fresno State had a season-high nine penalties called against them for a season-high 74 yards.
- Ronnie Rivers tallied a season-high 146 rushing yards, averaging 10.4 yards per carry on 14 rushes.
- Rivers recorded his fourth career 100-yard rushing game.
- Fresno State had two individuals rush for two touchdowns in back-to-back games (Hokit/Rivers). Records show it was the first time to happen dating back to at least 2002.
- Juju Hughes recorded an interception for the second-straight game. It was his seventh career.
- Josh Hokit recorded his third multi-TD game in the last five games.
- Josh Hokit owns a team-lead eight rushing touchdowns in seven games this season. Rivers led the team with 10 rushing TDs in 2018.
- Justin Rice led the team in tackles for the fifth time in seven games.
- Rice had recorded double-digit tackles in six of seven games.
- Arron Mosby posted a 2.0 career TFLs.
- Jared Rice's streak of 21 games started consecutively ended on Saturday against the Rams.
