Headlines

→ Saturday's game will be the 10th meeting in the series between Fresno State and Air Force.
→ This year's contest will be the Bulldogs' fourth-ever visit to the Academy. Fresno State owns one win at Air Force, a 20-17 win on Oct. 18, 1997 - Tedford was the OC of that team.
→ Dropping the last two games to Air Force (2015 & 2016), the Bulldogs' last win over the Falcons was a 48-15 victory in 2012 at Bulldog Stadium. That win clinched the Bulldogs a share of the 2012 Mountain West title.
→ With Fresno State opening Mountain West play this week, they represent the last MW team to have yet played a conference game entering week 7.
→ Following its second bye over the first six weeks, Fresno State is staring at eight-straight conference games to finish the season as they vie for a spot in the Dec. 7 Mountain West Championship game.
→ This contest will feature two head coaches that are coaching at their respective alma maters. The duo are among 18 head coaches in the FBS that are leading their alma maters.
→ Jorge Reyna is one of 32 FBS quarterbacks with 140 or more pass attempts and three or less interceptions this season.
→ Cesar Silva's average of 2.0 field goals per game ranks tied for fourth in the FBS
→ WR Keric Wheatfall picked up his first start as a Bulldog at New Mexico State. There have been 17 players this season to get their first career starts as Bulldogs in 2019.
→ With 11 turnovers through four games, the Bulldogs rank sixth in the FBS in turnovers gained per game with 2.75.
→ Fresno State has suffered just six losses in its last 29 games.
→ Air Force hasn't lost a home game since Oct. 27, 2018 against Boise State (48-38).

The quest to repeat as MW Champs starts Saturday

The Bulldogs closed out nonconference play with a 30-17 win at New Mexico State to even their season record to 2-2 on Sept. 28. Following its second bye over the first six weeks of the 2019 season, Fresno State is staring at eight-straight conference games starting with a trip to Air Force on Oct. 12. In order to earn a shot at defending their Mountain West Championship, the Bulldogs must start with securing a bid in the MW title game on Dec. 7 as the West Division representative, which goes to the team with the highest winning percentage in all conference games, both inter-divisional and intra-divisional, among their West Division counterparts (Hawaii, Nevada, San Diego State, San Jose State and UNLV).

→ Fresno State is the only Mountain West team to have not played a conference game entering week 7.

Favorite to Win the West

As the first-place pick in the West, Fresno State earned its fourth division leading bid in the Mountain West preseason media polls dating back to 2013, and second in as many years (2013, 2014, 2018 and 2019). The Bulldogs went on to win the West each season that they were the first-place pick in the annual preseason polls.

Along with a predicted first-place finish in its division, Fresno State secured three preseason all-conference selections in senior tight end Jared Rice, senior linebacker Mykal Walker and senior defensive back Juju Hughes.

Nonconference recap

Having lost as many games in its first two weeks in 2019 as it did in 2018, it's been a tough start for the 2018 Mountain West Champions that finished 12-2 and ranked No. 18 in both major polls last season. Fresno State's 0-2 start was the first for the program since 2014, but it was so close swinging to 1-1 or even 2-0. The 'Dogs average margin of loss in those two games was 5.5 points to USC on the road (Aug. 31) and Minnesota (Sept. 7) at home. Those Trojans are 3-2 with wins against No. 10 Utah and No. 23 Stanford while Minnesota is undefeated (5-0).

The 'Dogs bounced back by winning their next two games by taking care of business defeating Sacramento State 34-20 at home to move to 1-2 and moved to .500 with a win versus New Mexico State in its final nonconference game of 2019.

→ Adding in postseason games, Tedford is 9-5 at Fresno State against teams outside the Mountain West.

Always a Dog fight

→ Fresno State has suffered just six losses in its last 29 games.

→ Fresno State has not lost by double-digits since Oct. 28, 2017 - a 10-point loss to UNLV.

Tedford's first game vs. AFA as Bulldogs' head coach, but not first as a head coach

As Fresno State head coach Jeff Tedford enters his third season of the Mountain West conference four-year schedule rotation, means he'll face intra-divisional opponents Air Force, as well as Colorado State and Utah State for the first time as the HC of the Bulldogs this season. This week, facing Air Force though, will not be his first time leading a team against the Falcons. During Tedford's 11-year stretch (2002-12) at Cal, the Bears played the Falcons three times. Once on each other's home field, while the third was the 2007 Armed Forces Bowl.

In Tedford's first season as a head coach in 2002, the Bears were ranked No. 23 as a 3-0 team until hosting Air Force. Tedford suffered his first loss as a head coach to Air Force on Sept. 21, 2002 with a 23-21 loss. Two years later, Cal traveled to Air Force to open the 2004 season and won 56-14 on Sept. 4. The last time Tedford coached against an Air Force squad was in the 2007 Armed Forces Bowl. He led Cal to its biggest comeback in a bowl game in program history, trailing 21-0 in the game, the Bears fought back to win 42-36.

Last times vs. Air Force

The last time Fresno State played Air Force was in interim head coach Eric Kiesau's debut on Oct. 28, 2016. This after Fresno State started the season 1-7 and relieved its previous head coach, Tim DeRuyter, of duties on Oct. 23, 2016. Kiesau is now in his third season at Boise State and is in his first as the Broncos' co-offensive coordinator in 2019.

2016 hosting Air Force

The Bulldogs fell 31-21 in their 2016 matchup with Air Force at Bulldog Stadium on a Friday night. The Bulldogs' air attack came up short against the Falcons' ground game. Fresno State wide receivers KeeSean Johnson (now of the Arizona Cardinals) and Jamire Jordan combined for 257 yards receiving, while the Air Force rush attack amassed 327 yards on 37 carries. The Bulldogs sprinted out to a 14-0 lead but Air Force used an interception late in the first half to set the Falcons' offense up to pull within a score, 14-7, before the end of the half. Air Force then outscored the 'Dogs 24-7 in the second half to earn a 31-21 win. The Bulldogs were devastated by turnovers in the game, losing the turnover battle 4-1. Air Force owned the fourth quarter, rushing for 114 yards and two touchdowns on 24 carries while holding the ball for 10:21 in the final quarter to complete the comeback.

2015 at Air Force

It was much of the same in 2015 as it was in 2016 when Fresno State last visited the Academy. The Bulldogs similarly opened up a 14-0 lead to start their contest in 2015, but Air Force came back and scored 42-straight to win the game, 42-14. After the Bulldogs had touchdown runs of 64 and 60 yards in the first quarter, over the second and third quarters, Fresno State did not pick up a first down and had -4 total yards. Air Force quarterback Karson Roberts scored four rushing touchdowns and caught another to lead the Falcons back from the early deficit. In all, Air Force outgained the Bulldogs 586-311 with 458 of that yardage coming on the ground.

Saturday's contest will feature two head coaches that are leading their respective alma maters. Jeff Tedford a 1992 graduate of Fresno State (but played in 1981-82) and Troy Calhoun, a 1989 graduate of the Air Force Academy.

Scouting the Air Force Falcons

Air Force is 3-2 (1-1 MW) this season. The Falcons are coming off of a 34-25 nonconference loss in a rivalry game with Navy last Saturday.

Air Force opened Mountain West play on Sept. 20 at then-No. 20 Boise State where they fell 30-19. The Falcons picked up their first conference victory with a 41-24 win against San Jose State on Sept. 27. The Falcons were off to a 2-0 start to the 2019 season with a season-opening 48-7 win versus Colgate followed by a 30-23 overtime win at Colorado before falling to the Broncos.

The running game for Air Force has been above that of its opponents' this season as it leads the Mountain West in rushing offense. The Falcons have averaged 288 rushing yards per game and have two rushers with 300+ rushing yards on the season. The Falcons have totaled 1,439 rushing yards while their opponents have only been allowed 587 this season.

Senior fullback Taven Birdow leads the Falcons' offense with 378 rushing yards, averaging 75.6 yards a game. Birdow has scored three touchdowns this season. Junior quarterback DJ Hammond III owns a 49.1 completion percentage going 28-of-57 passing for the Falcons this season. Hammond has also added a team-high six rushing touchdowns while passing for four. The junior is averaging 114.8 passing yards a game through five games this season.

Air Force has seven defensive players with 20+ tackles on the season, including Demonte Meeks and Jere Fejedelem who have 35 and 33, respectively. The Falcon defense has 23 TFLs and six sacks - Lokota Wills is the leading pass rusher with 2.0 sacks and 5.0 TFLs.

→ Air Force hasn't lost a home game since Oct. 27, 2018 against Boise State (48-38).

Series History vs the Falcons

Saturday's game will be the 10th in the series between Fresno State and Air Force. The Falcons lead the all-time series, 6-3, and have won the last two meetings.

Having only three matchups as Mountain West member schools, five other pairings happened as members of the Western Athletic Conference from 1993-97. Air Force held a 3-2 advantage in those WAC games. The only meeting between the schools outside of conference affiliated games was the 2000 Silicon Valley Football Classic bowl game that the Falcons won 37-34 on New Years Eve.

→ Saturday will be the Bulldogs' fourth-ever visit to the Academy. Fresno State owns one win at Air Force, a 20-17 win on Oct. 18, 1997. In 1997, Air Force was undefeated at the time and ranked No. 18 in the nation. With the game knotted at 17, kicker Jeff Hanna connected on a 51-yard field goal with 9:42 left in the game, which ended up the final points of the game. Prior to that, his longest kick was 28 yards. The offensive coordinator for the Bulldogs in that game was now head coach Jeff Tedford.

→ The Bulldogs' last win over the Falcons was in 2012 in a 48-15 victory at Bulldog Stadium. That win clinched the Bulldogs a share of the 2012 Mountain West title, its first conference title since 1999.

Controlling the clock

One way to defeat your opponent is to simply keep the opposition's offense off the field. The Bulldogs have been doing a solid job of that this season controlling the clock as they rank No. 4 in the Mountain West (No. 19 in FBS) this season in time possession averaging 32:53 total time per game. Controlling the clock is the Air Force M.O. with its well-known running attack. The Falcons rank No. 2 in the MW (No. 14 in FBS) in time of possession averaging 33:14 total time per game.

2019 AIR FORCE RESULTS (3-2, 1-1 MW)

Taking care of the football

Quarterback Jorge Reyna has not thrown an interception since the last play of a crushing double-overtime loss to Minnesota on Sept. 7. He's had 72 straight attempts without throwing an interception since, taking place over the last two games.

→ Reyna is one of 32 FBS quarterbacks with 140 or more attempts and three or less interceptions this season.

Reyna has accounted for 1,125 yards total offense through four games, which amounts to 281.3 yards per game. Reyna's per game average ranks 27th nationally and third in the Mountain West. Reyna fell to 27th nationally from 14th, following just 150 total yards offense last time out against New Mexico State.

This guy can do it all

Josh Hokit opted out of a scholarship to wrestle at Drake and walked on to the Fresno State football team as a linebacker at his first fall camp as a freshman in 2016. He ended up playing as a true freshman at linebacker as well as at fullback, running back and on special teams. His role as a running back went full-time after a Nov. 19, 2016 game against Hawai'i where he exploded for 97 yards on 18 carries. A week later he got his first start at running back. Fast forward to 2019 spring football, and Hokit returned back to linebacker midway through the team's 15 practices, because he missed the first half due to being at the NCAA wrestling national championships, earning all-american status by placing fifth in the 197 lb. division. He repped at linebacker for the remainder of spring football and the first 13 practices of fall camp in 2019 before a rash of injuries ultimately turned the team-first player back to running back overnight for practice No. 14.

→ After seeing just one rush (for zero yards) and one successful two-point conversion carry through the first two games, Hokit has scored three rushing touchdown and one receiving touchdown in his last two games. He owns 25 carries for 116 yards in that span.

Two weapons still subdued

The Bulldogs only two returning starters on offense of the skill player variety, junior running back Ronnie Rivers and senior tight end Jared Rice, continue to be held in check so-to-speak four games into the season. Rivers has been limited to 52.0 yards per game rushing, accounting for 208 yards and a touchdown on 53 attempts, but has been impactful as a receiver recording 12 receptions for 77 yards and two TDs, while Rice owns seven catches for 34 yards and one touchdown.

Rivers entered the season on the Doak Walker and Hornung Award watch lists while Rice was one of four tight ends in the nation to be named to the Biletnikoff Award watch list. Rice was also on the Mackay Award watch list and named a 2019 All-MW preseason pick.



Emerging stars

A couple of San Joaquin Valley natives, Jalen Cropper and Emoryie Edwards, shined in the Land of Enchantment last time out. While Cropper made his debut at USC earlier this season on Aug. 31 in the season opener, it's been a long road for Edwards now in his redshirt freshman season. Edwards, plagued by injuries since becoming a Bulldog, showed on Sept. 28 why he was a much heralded recruit from Tulare Union HS as the California Central Section record holder for career receiving yards (4,267 yards) who held offers from Air Force, BYU, Duke Oregon State and Washington State. After watching the last 17 games from the sidelines, Edwards debuted and led the team in receptions (8) and receiving yards (70). Cropper, meanwhile, showed off what kind of playmaker he can be on one dynamic play - a 79-yard end around touchdown run. He finished with a team-leading 132 all-purpose yards in the game.

→ Cropper's 79-yard rushing TD was his first career score and it was the 13th longest run from scrimmage in program history.

Setting the tone

One thing Fresno State did last time out against New Mexico State that it had not done since Nov. 17, 2018 (vs. San Diego State) was open the game with points in its first drive. The Bulldogs did that five times in 2018 and were 5-0 in those games. Looking back to Tedford's first season, Fresno State scored points on its opening drive four times and were 3-1 in those games.

→ Whether it is scoring on the opening drive, or scoring first overall, it's proven to be significant as the 'Dogs are 20-1 under Jeff Tedford when they are the first to score.

Looking for continuity

It's been a tough start for the Bulldogs' offensive line that's been notoriously stout under third year assistant coach Ryan Grubb. Under Grubb in 2017 and 2018, the offensive line finished in the top 10 in both sacks allowed and TFLs allowed. One trait those lines had though was continuity. In 2017 all five starting linemen started all 14 games, and in 2018 the Bulldogs were not as fortunate, but used five different combinations in 14 games.

In 2019, the Bulldogs have had three different combinations through the first four games. Fresno State lost Dontae Bull to injury in game three, and in game four lost Netane Muti to injury. Senior Nick Aibuedefe filled in at left tackle in Bull's absence in game three, and filled in at left guard in Netane Muti's absence.

→ The Bulldogs entered 2018 with a combined 32 career starts, with 27 owned between Netane Muti and Syrus Tuitiele.

Unsung hero of the offense

While everyone knows six points is better than three points, when called upon place kicker Cesar Silva has been a crucial piece of the Bulldogs' offense. Silva is 8-of-12 on field goals and 12-of-12 on PATs. He's accounted for 36 of the Bulldogs' 122 points this season and ranks second in the Mountain West in points per game (kickers only) with 9.0 ppg. Silva's average of 2.0 field goals per game ranks tied for fourth in the FBS. All this, despite going 0-of-3 in one contest on Sept. 21 versus Sacramento State.

The art of forced fumbles

It hasn't always been a trait of Bulldog football teams but through four games this season the Bulldogs have forced seven. They have recovered six of those which ranks tied for ninth nationally. Surprisingly, all six recoveries have come from a different Bulldog.

→ Fresno State ranks fifth in the FBS in fumble recoveries per game, averaging 1.5.

→ Already more than halfway to double figure fumble recoveries with at least eight games remaining in the season, a mark that only five Bulldog teams have achieved since 2010.

→ The six recoveries has surpassed the season totals from 2010, 2011 and 2016 and is one shy of 2018.

Ballhawks in Las Cruces

Entering the fourth game of the season with only two interceptions, the Bulldogs grabbed three against New Mexico State, with two of those coming from sophomore safety Wyland Free. Since 2017, Fresno State has recorded at least three interceptions in a game four times. Prior to 2017, the 'Dogs had not grabbed three INTs in a game since 2015 and posted a total of five INTs during the 2016 season.

Nothing's Free

With one interception in his career, Wyland Free more than doubled that in one game in Las Cruces, N.M., showing New Mexico State quarterback Josh Adkins that nothing is free when throwing his way. On Sept. 28, the sophomore gave the Bulldogs' a 24-0 second-quarter lead with a 91-yard INT return for a touchdown. Free then ended any hopes of an Aggie comeback with another pick late in the fourth quarter.

→ Free's 91-yard interception return for a touchdown was the fifth-longest in program history.

→ Free is the first Bulldog since Jeff Allison on Sept. 15, 2018 at UCLA to grab two INTs in a game.

→ Free's 104 INT return yards ranks second in the FBS.

→ Free is the seventh Bulldog since 2012 to record a multi-interception game, joining Jeff Allison, Jaron Bryant, Anthoula "Tank" Kelly, Ejiro Ederaine, Phillip Thomas and Sean Alston.

Dual threat

After being one of the Bulldog's top receiving threats through the first three games of the season, Chris Coleman made the switch to the defensive side of the ball in Week 5 after a rash of injuries hit Fresno State's secondary. Less than a week after making the switch, Coleman started at corner against New Mexico State where he played the majority of the team's defensive snaps, making three tackles and breaking up a pass.



Settling in

Through four games, Fresno State's Mykal Walker has settled into his spot in the middle of the defense after moving from end during the offseason. The 6-foot-3 linebacker leads the Bulldogs and sits fourth in the Mountain West and 25th in the FBS in tackles per game averaging 9.5. Walker opened the season with a career-high 15 stops at USC.

→ Walker's 38 tackles and two quarterback hurries leads the team.

→ Mykal is following in the footsteps of his late father Michael Walker who similarly played at Fresno State in 1985-86 after redshirting as a Bulldog in 1984. His father transferred to Fresno State from College of Marin and tallied 65 tackles and 6.5 sacks at Fresno State under Jim Sweeney.

A defensive wrecking ball

No longer in the shadow of his older brother, Justin Rice has been a disruptive force for the Bulldogs' defense through four games, causing one turnover per game while also defending 2.3 passes per game.

→ Rice and Luq Barcoo of San Diego State are the only players to rank in the top five in the FBS in both turnovers caused and passes defended.

→ Rice is one of 11 players in the nation to have caused at least four turnovers. Rice though has played in just four games, averaging one caused turnover per game which ranks second in the FBS.

→ Rice is one of five players in the FBS to have forced at least three fumbles. He is forcing 0.75 fumbles per game which is tied for the third-highest frequency in the FBS.

→ Rice is one of only five players in the FBS averaging at least two passes defended per game. He is averaging 0.9 defended passes per game above the next closest linebacker.

→ With 10 tackles at New Mexico State, Rice has recorded at least 10 tackles in three of his last four games. The last Bulldog to post at least 10 stops in four weeks was Jeff Allison in 2018 (Oct. 6-20). Currently second on the team with 37 tackles, Rice's 9.3 tackles per game ranks fifth in the MW and 30th in the FBS.

Run D returning to normal

After facing two Power 5 opponents during its first two games, Fresno State's rushing defense wasn't stacking up with those of the previous two seasons, allowing 161 yards per game, that average dropped dramatically after facing Sacramento State and New Mexico State. During the following two games, the Bulldogs held the Hornets and Aggies to a combined 117 yards on 39 carries.

→ Fresno State is allowing 109.5 yards per game which ranks third in the Mountain West and 30th in the FBS.

→ The Bulldogs have held an opponent under 50 yards rushing three times since 2016. They allowed 49 yards to Hawaii in 2016, -30 yards to Incarnate Word in 2017 and 12 yards to Sacramento State in 2019.

Making noise

Whether playing due to injury, ejection, sliding in as a fourth linebacker or just to give a starter a rest, true freshman Levelle Bailey has been making his presence felt for the Bulldogs. In a growing role, the first-year player ranks seventh on the team in tackles with 15 but is tied for the team lead in tackles for loss with 4.5.

→ Bailey's most productive game's have come against Minnesota (seven tackles, 2.5 TFLs) and New Mexico State (seven tackles, 2.0 TFLs).

Second line of defense

With a new set of starting linebackers this season, Fresno State's newest trio has continued where last year's veterans left off when it came to backing up the front line. In 14 games in 2018, the Bulldogs' starting linebackers posted a combined 25 or more tackles six times. Comparitively, this year's trio of Mykal Walker, Justin Rice and Arron Mosby have performed that feat three times through four games with a season-high of 30 tackles coming in the season opener at USC. Last time out, the trio posted 28 against New Mexico State with a balanced effort as Rice totaled 10 tackles, and Walker and Mosby had nine.

Pinned

Fresno State senior punter Blake Cusick has been a major force in the field position battle this season. Cusick has continued to do what he does best - pinning teams deep in their own end. Of his 17 attempts, six have been inside the 20. Cusick ranks 36th in the FBS and fourth in the MW in punting with an average of 43.8 yards per punt.

Cusick has also forced six fair catches this season as high lofting kicks have allowed for his coverage team to get down field. That has resulted in the Bulldogs yielding just three yards on three returns this season. The one yard average is ranked ninth in the FBS.

No time better than now

→ The list of first time players continues to grow for the Bulldogs as the most first timers saw the field in game four as they did in the season opener. Six players got to see action for the first time as Bulldogs last time out, growing the 2019 season number to 23 first time players.

→ WR Keric Wheatfall picked up his first start as a Bulldog at New Mexico State. There have been 17 players this season to get thier first career starts as Bulldogs in 2019.

→ Four true freshman have made starts for Fresno State in 2019; eight true freshman have played in 2019.

→ In 2018, the Bulldogs played one true freshman more than the four games allotted to hold on to a redshirt season - now sophomore Isaiah Johnson.

2019 PRESEASON MOUNTAIN WEST FOOTBALL ALL-CONFERENCE AND AWARDS



The Fresno State football team has been picked to repeat as West Division champions by the media, the Mountain West announced on July 23 prior to kicking off the 2019 football Media Days in Las Vegas.

As the first-place pick for the West, Fresno State has earned its fourth division leading bid in the preseason media polls dating back to 2013, and second in as many years (2013, 2014, 2018 and 2019). The Bulldogs have prevailed and won the West in every season that they have been the first-place pick in the preseason polls.

Along with a predicted first-place finish in its division, Fresno State secured three preseason all-conference selections in senior tight end Jared Rice, senior linebacker Mykal Walker and senior defensive back Juju Hughes.

It was been a busy July for Fresno State's three preseason All-Mountain West selections as each of the senior Bulldogs have been named to seven watch lists for awards in their respective positions.

Rice, Walker and Hughes are continuing their successes from the 2018 season as each were named to either the All-Mountain West first or second team a season ago.

JEFF TEDFORD

HEAD COACH**3RD SEASON | FRESNO STATE (1992)**

Jeff Tedford, 57, inherited a 1-11 football program when he took over the reins of his alma mater and in two seasons all he's done as the 19th head football coach in Fresno State history is lead the program to a 22-6 record, a 2018 Mountain West Championship, two MW West division titles and two bowl wins.

In 2018, in addition to defeating Boise State on the road in overtime, 19-16, for Fresno State's first conference championship since 2013, the Bulldogs capped the season with a 31-20 triumph over Arizona State to win the Mitsubishi Motors Las Vegas Bowl. The bowl win left the Bulldogs with their first 12-win season in the 97-year history of the program. This, one season after engineering one of the greatest turnarounds in FBS history guiding the Bulldogs to a 10-4 record, an appearance in the MW title game and a Hawai'i Bowl win over Houston.

The renaissance under Tedford has led to FBS history being made as Fresno State became the first team to secure back-to-back double-digit winning seasons following a double-digit loss season.

The 2018 Bulldogs finished nationally ranked in the final rankings of the season for the first time since 2004. Fresno State finished ranked No. 18 in both the AP Top 25 and Coaches poll, announced Jan. 8, 2019. It was the best finish in the AP Top 25 in program history, besting No. 22 in 2004. The 'Dogs also held a No. 21 ranking in the final College Football Playoff poll released on Dec. 2, 2018.

Individual accolades in 2018 included Tedford being named an Eddie Robinson Award finalist and a Paul "Bear" Bryant Coach of the Year Award finalist. Fresno State sported 15 all-conference honorees in 2018, including the league's Defensive Player of the Year in linebacker Jeff Allison. In addition, 19 student-athletes were named to the Fall Academic All-Mountain West team.

With a 10-4 record in his first season, Fresno State became the third team in FBS history to turn a double-digit loss season (2016) into a double-digit win season (2017) the following year. The season included an appearance in the nation's top 25, clinching the Mountain West's West Division crown and leading the 'Dogs to their first appearance in the MW Championship game since 2014. He also guided the 'Dogs to the program's first bowl victory since 2007 with their win at the Hawai'i Bowl.

Great success brought great notoriety as Tedford was named the 2017 Mountain West Coach of the Year, was a semifinalist for the George

Munger College Coach of the Year Award presented by the Maxwell Football Club, a finalist for the Eddie Robinson Coach of the Year Award, and the AFCA Region-5 Coach of the Year.

While Tedford was honored as the league's coach of the year, the team had 16 student-athletes recognized with MW postseason honors - the most for the Bulldogs in a single-season since joining the conference in 2012. In the classroom, the 'Dogs also set a team-best number since joining the conference as they had 24 named to the Fall Academic All-Mountain West team.

Tedford, a former Bulldog quarterback and Fresno State assistant coach, returned to the Valley after holding the position of offensive consultant for the Washington Huskies - a 2016 College Football Playoff team.

Tedford assumed the role of acting head coach on Nov. 27, 2016, following the conclusion of the 2016 season as Eric Kiesau carried out interim head coaching duties for the remaining two games on the 2016 schedule following Tedford's introductory press conference. Tedford was officially hired on Nov. 10, 2016.

Tedford, who was an already proven winner on the West Coast, came to the Valley with 11 years of head coaching experience at the Division I level - having led the California Golden Bears to 82 wins from 2002-2012. He left as the school's all-time winningest coach.

Tedford's ties to the Valley and Fresno State run deep. He played quarterback at Fresno State in 1981-82 under Jim Sweeney and coached at Fresno State under Sweeney from 1987-88 and 1992-96, and under a then-first-year head coach Pat Hill in 1997.

Tedford's coaching career started at Fresno State, volunteering as an assistant for the 1987-88 seasons. From there he picked up his first full-time position as an assistant for the Calgary Stampeders of the Canadian Football League - a familiar league in which he played quarterback for six seasons after his collegiate career at Fresno State.

He returned to Fresno State in 1992 as the quarterbacks coach and served as the offensive coordinator for the Bulldogs over the ensuing five seasons.

Tedford graduated from Warren High School in Downey, California and attended Cerritos Junior College for two seasons before becoming the Bulldogs' quarterback in 1981.

He and his wife Donna have two children, Taylor and Quinn.

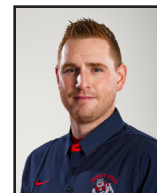

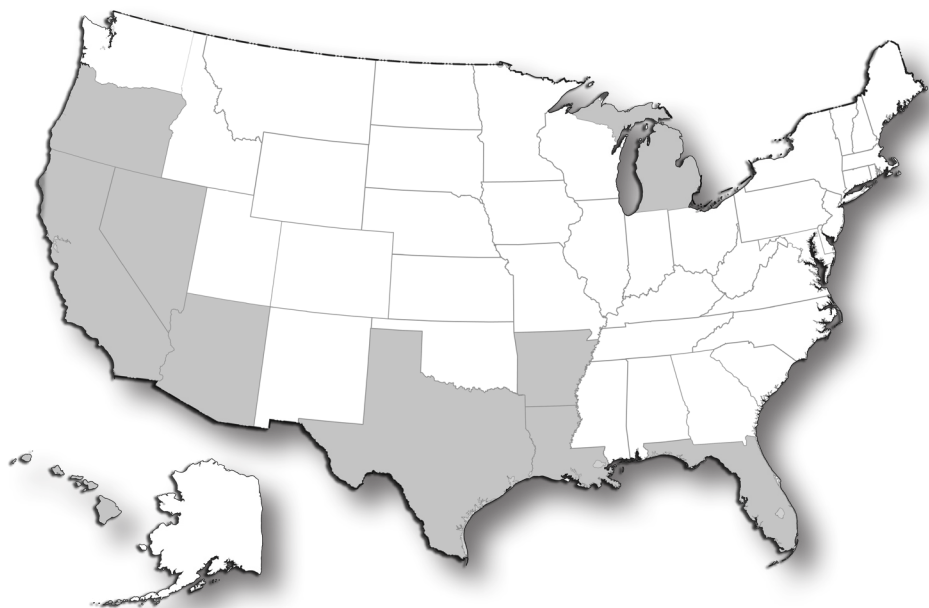

LOS ANGELES – Trailing by 18 with less than 17 minutes to play, Fresno State pushed USC to the end, scoring twice in the final quarter before falling short, 31-23, on Saturday night at LA Memorial Coliseum.

In a homecoming for the Los Angeles area product Jorge Reyna, the senior finished with 344 total yards, throwing for 256 and two touchdowns while adding 88 yards on the ground on 20 carries in his first start as a Bulldog. Kicker Cesar Silva accounted for nine of Fresno State's points going 3-for-3 with a long of 46 yards in his first game as a Bulldog.



The defense kept Fresno State in striking distance, forcing four turnovers, and were led by four Bulldogs registering double-digit tackles in Mykal Walker (15), Chris Gaston (12), Juju Hughes (11) and Justin Rice (10).

A critical 100-yard kick off return by Trojans' Velus Jones in the third quarter proved to be arguably the back-breaker in the third quarter after Fresno State pulled within four, and was quickly extended to the 18 points the 'Dogs still nearly overcame.

Notable

- Jorge Reyna rushed for 88 yards. It was the most rushing yards by a Bulldog quarterback since the turn of the century.
- Cesar Silva, in his Fresno State debut, went 3-for-3 kicking field goals. The last time a Bulldog kicker went 100 percent with at least three attempts was Kody Kroening on Oct. 8, 2016 vs. Nevada.
- Saturday's game was the third game under Jeff Tedford that the Bulldogs surrendered more than 30 points, and it broke a nation-best streak of 25 games that dated back to Sept. 16, 2017.
- In the second quarter, Jorge Reyna tossed his first touchdown of the season and second touchdown pass of his career – a 34-yard TD to Derrion Grim – his first two career TD throws went to Grim.
- Justin Rice, once a starter at running back, recorded his first career interception in the second quarter.
- Fresno State had four players record double-digit tackles: Mykal Walker (15), Chris Gaston (12), Juju Hughes (11) and Justin Rice (10). All four either matched or set career highs. The last time four players had double-digit tackles was against Air Force on Oct. 28, 2016.
- USC tallied 163 yards in the first quarter. The Bulldogs' defense did not allow more than 152 in an opening quarter in 2018 (Hawaii).
- Reyna tossed his second TD pass of the game in the fourth quarter, an 8-yard strike to Chris Coleman for Coleman's first career touchdown.
- USC had 18 first downs in the first half, and were limited to seven in the second half.
- Fresno State forced four turnovers, the most since forcing four on Sept. 15, 2018 at UCLA.
- Fresno State forced two fumbles, the most since forcing two on Sept. 15, 2018 at UCLA.

FRESNO, Calif. – Fresno State battled to the bitter end with Big Ten foe Minnesota in its home opener, falling in double overtime 38-35 in front of 34,790 Saturday night at Bulldog Stadium.



Trailing by three points after holding the Gophers to a field goal in the second overtime period, the Bulldogs aired it out on the first play from scrimmage with its next possession, only to be intercepted in the end zone to silence the home crowd to drop Fresno State to 0-2 for the first time since 2014.

In his first start at home, Jorge Reyna went 24-of-35 passing, throwing for 288 yards, along with three touchdowns and two interceptions, the latter being the costly one that sealed the game for the Gophers. Junior running back Ronnie Rivers produced 124 total yards offense (76 rushing/48 receiving) and a career-high two receiving touchdowns.

The defense won the turnover battle for the second consecutive week, forcing three turnovers. Justin Rice led the Bulldogs with 11 tackles, two forced fumbles and one fumble recovery.

Fresno State had the opportunity to close the game out with 46 seconds left on the clock, up by a touchdown, but Minnesota converted a pivotal fourth-and-13 scoring the game-tying touchdown to send the contest into overtime.

Notable

- Saturday's loss snapped an eight-game home winning streak.
- Fresno State has suffered just six losses in its last 27 games. The Bulldogs have not lost by double-digits since Oct. 28, 2017 – a 10 point loss to UNLV.
- The Bulldogs played in their second overtime game in the last four contests they've played in dating back to 2018. The last overtime game Fresno State participated in was a 19-16 single overtime win to defeat Boise State in the Mountain West championship game.
- Saturday's game was the Bulldogs' seventh multi-period overtime game played in, in program history.
- Fresno State dropped to 8-11 in overtime games in program history. Fresno State's last overtime game at
- Bulldog Stadium was also a double overtime contest, a 48-41 loss to Tulsa on Sept. 24, 2016.
- Fresno State owned a 21-14 lead after the third quarter. Tedford dropped to 20-3 in games with a lead after three quarters.
- Fresno States' defense forced three turnovers, all forced fumbles. The last time Fresno State recovered three fumbles in one game was on Nov. 22, 2014 at Nevada.

FRESNO, Calif. — A pair of fourth-quarter touchdowns on Saturday night lifted Fresno State to a 34-20 win over Sacramento State at Bulldog Stadium for win No. 1 of 2019 in front of more than 30,000 fans. Senior running back Josh Hokit was key in the Bulldogs' late surge, totaling nine carries for 65 yards and a touchdown during the Bulldogs' final two possessions.



Fresno State totaled a season-high 471 yards of offense with 326 yards passing and 145 yards on the ground. Defensively, the 'Dogs held Sacramento State to 245 yards of offense with only 12 yards coming on the ground. The Bulldogs held a 30-14 advantage in first downs and were able to control the ball with nearly 38 minutes of possession on offense.

Leading the way for the Bulldogs through the air was senior quarterback Jorge Reyna who passed for a career-high 326 yards on 28-of-41 passing while throwing two touchdown passes. Hokit led the way on the ground with 12 carries for 72 yards and two rushing scores while adding three receptions for 22 yards and a touchdown. Sophomore wide receiver Zane Pope tallied career-highs in receptions (6) and receiving yards (72) while junior wideout Kerik Wheatfall went for a season-best 98 yards on three receptions.

Senior cornerback Jaron Bryant led the Bulldogs in tackles with eight, including six solo, and one tackle for loss along with one pass breakup. Junior linebacker Justin Rice added six stops, five solo, one tackle for loss and three pass breakups.

Notable

- Hokit accounted for three of the Bulldogs' five touchdowns in Saturday's game.
- Hokit had his first career game with a rushing TD (2) and a receiving TD (1).
- Hokit scored his ninth and 10th career rushing touchdowns.
- The Bulldogs improve to 12-2 at home in the Tedford era.
- The Bulldogs all-time series lead against Sacramento State increased to 4-0, following the win. But it was the first time in the series the Bulldogs allowed more than seven points in a game.
- Reyna connected with Grim, 7-yard TD, to put the 'Dogs on top 27-20 (6:41). It was Grim's second receiving score of the season and fifth career.
- Rivers registered a 6-yard TD in the second quarter, his first of the 2019 season and 16th career rushing score.
- Pope topped his career best total in receiving yards in the second quarter (5 rec., 70 yards) while also matching his career best in receptions. He finished with six receptions for 72 yards.
- Cusick placed all three of his punts inside the 10-yard line, including one on the 1-yard line.
- Against the odds — Fresno State won the turnover battle and lost games against USC and Minnesota, but lost the turnover battle to Sacramento State and won the game (2-1).
- Fresno State allowed 12 rushing yards. The Bulldogs have held an opponent under 50 yards rushing three times since 2016. They allowed 49 yards to Hawaii in 2016, -30 yards to Incarnate Word in 2017 and 12 yards to Sacramento State in 2019.
- This was the ninth time in the Tedford era an opponent was held to less than 100 yards rushing.

LAS CRUCES, N.M. — Behind 118 yards on the ground from Jalen Cropper and a two-interception night for Wylan Free, Fresno State walked out of Aggie Memorial Stadium on Saturday with a 30-17 win over New Mexico State.



Cropper led the team in all-purpose yardage with 132 yards from scrimmage (118 rushing, 14 receiving), which included 79 on one touch with an electric touchdown run in the second quarter. Redshirt freshman Emoryie Edwards saw the first game action of his career, and led all receivers with 70 yards on eight receptions.

The 'Dogs piled up 239 yards on the ground on 38 carries. Jorge Reyna finished 20-of-31 passing for 147 yards.

Defensively, the Bulldogs (2-2, 0-0 MW) held NMSU (0-5) to 315 total yards and produced three interceptions. Two of those came from Free, who entered the game with one in his career. The sophomore recorded Fresno State's first defensive score of the season with a 91-yard touchdown return on his first pick of the night. Justin Rice grabbed the team's third INT along with leading the 'Dogs with 10 tackles.

Notable

- Wide receiver Chris Coleman switched to cornerback and started opposite of Jaron Bryant - Coleman finished with three tackles.
- Cropper's 79-yard rushing TD was his first career score and it was the 13th longest run from scrimmage in program history.
- Free's INT touchdown return was the first by a Bulldog since Tank Kelly's 70-yard TD return in the 2018 Las Vegas Bowl against Arizona State and longest since Arron Mosby's 95-yard INT TD return versus San Jose State on Nov. 24, 2018.
- Free's 88-yard INT was the fifth-longest interception return for a touchdown in program history.
- Justin Rice finished with 10 tackles - Rice has double-digit tackles in three of the first four games this season.
- Reyna kept a clean sheet for the second-straight game, not throwing an interception.
- Cropper finished as the Bulldogs' leading rusher with 118 yards on five carries (23.5 yards per rush).
- Fresno State had a season-high three interceptions. The Bulldogs entered the game with two interceptions this season.
- Fresno State was averaging 8.8 yards per rush in the first half, and 6.3 in the game.
- Fresno State matched its season-high of eight TFLs.
- For the second time this season, kicker Cesar Silva was perfect going 3-of-3 on field goals (24, 28, 38) and was also 3-of-3 PATs.
