FRESNO, Calif. - Scoring its most points since 1991 using five interceptions, two special teams returns for touchdowns and one pick-six, the Fresno State football team rolled to a 79-13 season-opening rout of the Idaho Vandals on Saturday night at Bulldog Stadium.

Fresno State (1-0) scored its most points in 27 years using a balanced offensive approach passing for 247 yards while rushing for 239 and seven scores on the ground.

Senior quarterback Marcus McMaryion had an efficient passing night going 19-for-26 for 207 yards. The 'Dogs used a balanced attack on the ground as five running backs each went for better than 35 yards with Romello Harris leading the way with 47 followed by Saevion Johnson (45), Deonte O'Neal (41), Josh Hokit (40) and Jordan Mims (36). Mims led the group with three touchdowns.

Senior wide receiver KeeSean Johnson tallied his sixth career 100-yard receiving game going for 118 yards on six receptions while extending his consecutive games with a reception streak to a nation-leading 37 games.

Defensively, junior linebacker Jeff Allison led the team with six tackles while senior cornerback Tank Kelly had a pair of interceptions, one returned for a touchdown, five tackles and three pass breakups. Junior defensive tackle Jasad Haynes had five tackles, three tackles for loss, a sack and a forced fumble while Jaron Bryant returned two blocked field goals for touchdowns.

How It Happened

The Bulldogs got the scoring started on their first offensive series of the contest going on an 11-play, 56-yard drive that saw McMaryion complete five of six passes for 42 yards connecting on passes to three different receivers, including three to junior tight end Jared Rice.

Facing a 3rd-and-5 from the Idaho 27, McMaryion connected on back-to-back passes for nine and 11 yards, respectively, to Rice getting the 'Dogs down to the Vandals 7. A six-yard gain by O'Neal got the Bulldogs on the doorstep of Idaho's goal line setting up a one-yard touchdown plunge by Mims.

After forcing the Vandals' to a second straight three-and-out, the 'Dogs took over at their own 20-yard line and marched down the field on a 12-play, 80-yard drive as the 'Dogs found little resistance from the Idaho defense. Faced with a 3rd-and-16 at their own 26, McMaryion found Johnson down the middle of the field for a 19 yard gain.

An 11-yard connection from Johnson and McMaryion on a 3rd-and-1 kept the drive alive and got the 'Dogs down to the Vandals' 28 and two plays later, the 'Dogs capitalized with a 26-yard scamper through the left side by O'Neal for his second career rushing touchdown.

The 'Dogs defense continued to wreck havoc as Haynes forced his first career fumble setting up the Bulldog's offense at the Idaho 19. After compiling 136 yards of offense on its first two drives, the Bulldog offense was only able to move four yards on its third drive setting up a 33-yard field goal by redshirt freshman kicker Asa Fuller who made his first career field goal to give the 'Dogs a 16-0 lead.

Holding the Vandals to negative 16 yards of offense on its first two drives, Idaho needed only two plays to drive 75 yards as quarterback Mason Petrino found wide receiver Jeff Cotton down the sideline for 73 yards to break up the 'Dogs shutout bid. The Vandals bobbled the PAT attempt as the Bulldogs led 16-6 with five seconds remaining in the first quarter.

Fresno State carried its hot offense into the second quarter going on a 7-play, 75-yard drive passing for 39 yards and running for 36 yards as Mims punched in his second touchdown run with a 12-yard scamper up the middle to extend the 'Dogs lead to 23-6.

The Vandals put together their most substantial drive of the game to that point with a 10-play, 46-yard drive down to the Bulldog 26 setting up a 36-yard field goal attempt by Cade Coffey, but Kelly broke through line blocking Coffey's kick as Bryant picked it up and returned it 74 yards putting the Bulldogs up 30-6.

The 'Dogs defense continued to pour it as Kelly picked off his second pass of the game stepping in front of a Petrino pass and returned it 39 yards for a touchdown to push the lead to 37-6.

Idaho made one final push to score in the first half going on a 9-play, 43-yard drive down to the Bulldog 22 to set up a 39-yard attempt by Coffey with one second remaining in the half. The 'Dogs special teams again came up clutch as redshirt junior Mykal Walker broke through the line for the block and was picked up by Bryant for 71 yards as Fresno State took a commanding 44-6 lead into halftime.

The Bulldogs added two touchdowns in the third quarter, a two-yard run by Mims and a 33-yard pass from Jorge Reyna to Derrion Grim (watch) on his first career attempt to take a 58-6 lead. The Vandals scored once more in the game in the third frame, a six-yard run by Isaiah Saunders to make it 58-13 in favor of the 'Dogs.

Fresno State completed the scoring with three more touchdowns in the fourth quarter as a pair of 'Dogs scored their first career touchdowns. S. Johnson had a five-yard plunge up the middle followed by a 27-yard run by Harris before S. Johnson found the end zone one more time with a one-yard run.

MINNEAPOLIS - The Fresno State football team lost a heartbreaker at Minnesota on Saturday evening, falling 21-14 at TCF Bank Stadium.



After converting a fourth-and-3 from the Minnesota 10-yard line, Fresno State was set up with first-and-goal from the Golden Gopher 4-yard line with 1:24 remaining in the game. The 'Dogs pulled a play out of the book from 2017, a halfback pass attempt from Josh Hokit to try and knot the game. But this one, intended for tight end Jared Rice in the back of the end zone, was intercepted by Minnesota defensive back Antoine Winfield Jr. to dash the Bulldogs' hopes of winning their first game on Big Ten soil since defeating Illinois 53-52 in 2009.

Fresno State was stymied for much of the first half by the Gophers' defense, totaling 104 yards offense, but came alive in the second half. Entering the third quarter trailing 10-0, the Bulldogs scored two touchdowns in the second half and took a one-point lead in the fourth quarter, 14-13. Minnesota regained the lead with 3:28 left in the contest and it proved to be enough to win the game.

Fresno State senior quarterback Marcus McMaryion went 23-of-32 through the air for 205 yards with a pair of touchdowns and his first interception of the season while adding 15 yards on the ground. Sophomore running back Jordan Mims led the 'Dogs rushing attack with 41 yards on 10 carries. The Bulldogs rushed for 87 yards as a team. On the receiving end, senior wide receiver KeeSean Johnson led the team with six receptions for 89 yards and a touchdown while Rice added five catches for 31 yards and a score.

Defensively, junior linebacker Jeff Allison had a career-high 15 tackles while junior safety Mike Bell chipped in a career-best 11 tackles, including five solo. The Bulldog defense did force one turnover in the third quarter as senior cornerback Tank Kelly forced a fumble that was recovered by senior defensive lineman Patrick Belony. The Bulldogs manufactured their first points of the game off that turnover.

How It Happened

Minnesota started the scoring on its second offensive drive by manufacturing a lengthy 14-play, 80-yard drive that ran 7:17 off the clock. Gopher redshirt sophomore Seth Green punched the ball in from one-yard out to give Minnesota a 7-0 lead.

Facing its first deficit of the season, the 'Dogs looked to get its offense going, but McMaryion threw his first interception of the season on the ensuing possession to give Minnesota the ball back at the Bulldogs' 41-yard line.

The 'Dogs defense came up big allowing only one yard after that turnover and nearly had a turnover of their own as Allison snagged a pass attempt on third-and-9, but was unable to stay in bounds. Minnesota finished the half with a 10-play, 55-yard drive that ended with a 53-yard field goal by Emmit Carpenter to take a 10-0 lead into the locker room.

After the teams traded punts to start the second half, the Bulldogs defense produced their first turnover of the game deep in the Gophers' own territory. Anthoula Kelly forced the fumble and Patrick Belony pounced on top of it to spark the Bulldogs' offense. Fresno State took advantage going on a four-play, 17-yard drive to score with 20 seconds remaining in the third quarter to pull within three, 10-7. Rice capped the drive with a one-yard touchdown catch from McMaryion.

Carpenter added his second 50-plus yard field goal of the game (50 yards) to put Minnesota ahead 13-7 before a quick strike by the 'Dogs gave Fresno State its lone lead of the game.

The 'Dogs went on a five-play, 75-yard drive that was capped by McMaryion connecting with Johnson for 45 yards to push the 'Dogs in the lead, 14-13.

The lead was short-lived as the Gophers, as they did all game, pounded the ball on the ground for a 10-play, 74-yard drive that ate up 4:52 off the clock. Green ran in from three yards out and after a successful two-point conversion, the Gophers held a 21-14 lead. The drive was kept alive after a 13-yard completion along the sideline on a third-and-nine by a scrambling Zack Annexstad in Minnesota territory. That was followed by a 15-yard sideline infraction penalty called on Fresno State to set the Gophers up at the Bulldogs' 28-yard line.

Facing a fourth-and-3 from the Gophers 10-yard line, McMaryion found Justin Allen for six yards and a first down to extend the game, but after a timeout, the Gophers came up with the play that seal the game.

PASADENA, Calif. - Led by senior quarterback Marcus McMaryion's five total touchdowns on Saturday night at the Rose Bowl, the Fresno State football team defeated UCLA 38-14 in front of 60,867 fans with a large contingent being the Red Wave that filled up the visitors section in the southeast endzone. The Bulldogs closed the game with 22-answered points during the final 24 minutes to earn their third-straight win over the Bruins to the delight of the fans that made the trip.

With four touchdowns on the ground, McMaryion became just the second Fresno State quarterback to rush for four touchdowns in a game - joining Mark Barsotti's feat in 1989. McMaryion finished 22-of-33 passing for 270 yards and added a 10-yard touchdown pass to senior tight end Kyle Riddering. Nine different 'Dogs caught a pass from McMaryion with senior KeeSean Johnson registering a team-leading eight receptions for 85 yards as the senior caught his 200th career pass becoming only the fifth Bulldog receiver to join the 200 career reception club. The Bulldogs totaled 420 yards of offense adding 150 yards on the ground rushing the ball 52 times as sophomore Jordan Mims tied his career-best with 21 carries on his way to 85 rushing yards.

The Fresno State defense was again stingy, forcing four UCLA turnovers while limiting the Bruins to 270 yards of offense with 151 yards through the air and 119 yards on the ground. Junior safety Mike Bell had a team-high seven tackles, five solo, adding two pass breakups and tackle for loss. Junior linebacker Jeff Allison snagged his first two career interceptions while getting in on six tackles. The 'Dogs also forced a pair of UCLA fumbles that were recovered by Patrick Belony and James Bailey.

How It Happened

Fresno State got its offense going from the outset as the 'Dogs received the opening kickoff and went on a 13-play, 75-yard drive that burned 4:57 off the clock as McMaryion ran in a one-yard touchdown run (watch) to cap the drive. The 'Dogs converted all three third downs on the opening drive while being balanced with 39 yards rushing and passing for 36 yards, including a pair of passes to Johnson for 19 yards.

After holding UCLA to 17 yards on five plays on their first offensive possession, the Bulldogs got the ball back and continued their hot offense with a 8-play, 75-yard drive that was finished by McMaryion finding Riddering down the left hash (watch) to put the 'Dogs ahead 13-0.

For a second straight week, Belony recovered an opponent's fumble as the senior defensive tackle hopped on a Bruins' botched snap at the UCLA 38-yard line (watch). The 'Dogs offense continued to hum along going down the field on a 6-play, 27-yard drive that finished with a 28-yard field goal by Asa Fuller (watch) to extend the 'Dogs lead to 16-0. The Bulldog offense finished the first quarter with 147 yards of offense while UCLA only countered with 38 yards, but the roles reversed in the second quarter as the 'Dogs were held to 30 yards and UCLA churned out 122 yards.

The Bruins took advantage of forcing a McMaryion fumble to strike quickly on a 45-yard touchdown pass from quarterback Dorian Thompson-Robinson to wide receiver Theo Howard, but that would be all the scoring for the Bruins the first half.

The Bulldogs took a 16-7 lead into the locker room at halftime and UCLA continued to take advantage of Fresno State miscues early in the second half. A botched punt return by Johnson set UCLA up at the Bulldogs' 17-yard line. The Bruins' capped the short scoring drive with a two-yard touchdown run by Bolu Olorunfunmi to cut the 'Dogs lead to 16-14 with 12:59 left in the third quarter.

Fresno State's offense got back to firing as it was in the first quarter halfway though the third quarter, closing the game with 22-answered points over the final 24 minutes. It started with an 8-play, 73-yard drive that was punctuated by a one-yard touchdown run by McMaryion (watch), his second of the game, and a successful two-point conversion pass from Jorge Reyna to Gunner Javernick (watch) to put the Bulldogs out front, 24-14, at the 6:19 mark in the third.

The defense played its part in the Bulldogs' late explosion as Allison snagged his first career interception to put the Bulldogs' offense at the 49-yard line (watch) to start their next scoring drive. The 'Dogs used a 5-play, 51-yard drive that was capped by McMaryion's third rushing score of the night, a one-yard plunge (watch), that put the 'Dogs up 31-14 with 3:43 to play in the third quarter.

Allison kept the 'Dogs defensive pressure up and grabbed his second interception of the game (watch) on the Bruins' next offensive possession. The Bulldogs made it three straight scoring drives capped by a McMaryion touchdown, this time a two-yard score (watch) that proved to be the final score of the game as Fresno State walked out of the Rose Bowl with a 38-14 win.

FRESNO, Calif. - Using a run of 42 unanswered points, Fresno State overcame an early 13-7 deficit to roll to a convincing 49-27 win over Toledo on Saturday evening at Bulldog Stadium.

Fresno State, who finished nonconference play with a 3-1 record, accounted for a season-high 554 yards of offense in the contest with 368 yards through the air and 186 yards rushing.

After picking up the offensive player of the week award after his last performance against UCLA accounting for five total touchdowns, senior quarterback Marcus McMaryion produced five more scores, tossing a season-high four through the air while running for one on the ground. McMaryion completed 24-of-31 passes for 368 yards, the most by a Bulldog quarterback since Derek Carr passed for 404 against Utah State on Dec. 7, 2013. McMaryion also became the first quarterback since Carr in 2013 (New Mexico and San Jose State) to account for five touchdowns in back-to-back games.

Sophomore running back Jordan Mims made a career-high six receptions for 126 yards and became the first Bulldog running back since Paris Gaines on Dec. 31, 2000 to account for 100 or more receiving yards in a game. Senior wide receiver KeeSean Johnson added six catches for 102 yards and two touchdowns for his seventh career 100-yard game and sixth career multi-score contest.

On the ground, Mims and junior running back Josh Hokit each accounted for 59 yards as the 'Dogs ran the ball 38 times in the game for an average of 4.9 yards per carry.

Defensively, junior linebacker Jeff Allison led the team in tackles for the third time this season making nine stops in the game. Senior defensive back Anthoula Kelly made a career-high seven tackles while accounting for three of the Bulldogs' five pass breakups in the game while junior defensive end Mykal Walker returned a 38-yard interception for a touchdown (watch), a sack, 2.5 tackles for loss and a pass breakup.

How It Happened

For a third time this season, the 'Dogs took their first offensive drive for a touchdown going on a 12-play, 75-yard journey down the field that ended with a four-yard touchdown run by Mims (watch). McMaryion went a perfect 7-of-7 for 58 yards connecting with five different teammates as junior tight end Cam Sutton made his first career reception with an 18-yard gain.

After being held to six yards and a three-and-out on its first drive, Toledo wasted little time responding with a 10-play, 75-yard drive that finished with a 19-yard touchdown pass from Rockets' quarterback Mitchell Guadagni to running back Shakif Seymour.

With the total yardage at 98 yards for each side and the score tied 7-7 after the opening quarter, Toledo opened the second quarter with a 36-yard run by Guadagni followed by a 15-yard personal foul penalty that sent the Rockets down to the Bulldog 30. The Bulldogs' defense held strong from that point, holding Toledo to a 46-yard field goal by Jameson Vest that gave the Rockets' a 10-7 lead.

With the Bulldogs trailing for the first time since Sept. 8 at Minnesota, McMaryion found Johnson on a bubble screen that he took upfield for 24 yards before McMaryion was intercepted for only the second time this season as Toledo defensive tackle Reggie Howard batted McMaryion's arm to force the ball in the air and into the awaiting arms of defensive end Jamal Hines.

It did not end in six points, but Toledo took advantage of the 'Dogs miscue connecting on a 43-yard field goal by Vest that extended the Rockets' lead to 13-7.

The 'Dogs responded to the Rockets' pair of field goals in a hurry with a 6-play, 76-yard drive in 1:43 to re-gain a one-point advantage, 14-13. McMaryion found Mims who scampered for 55 yards after a short pass, and on the ensuing play connected with Johnson on a seven-yard bubble screen that he took to the end zone to push the Bulldogs ahead.

One three-and-out later forced by the Bulldog defense, allowed McMaryion to guide the offense to a 6-play, 78-yard drive that featured a season-long 21-yard run by Hokit and a 36-yard flip from McMaryion to Jamir Jordan that was finished off by a two-yard touchdown toss from McMaryion to senior tight end Kyle Riddering to put the 'Dogs ahead 21-13.

The defense again made life tough for the Rockets as junior defensive end Kwami Jones came up with his first sack of the season that forced the Rockets to punt, which was returned by Ronnie Rivers for 18 yards as the sophomore running back made his season debut.

The next Fresno State score was set up by McMaryion finding Mims out of the backfield down the right sideline for a 47-yard touchdown that gave the 'Dogs their third straight touchdown and pushed the lead to 28-13.

After gaining 346 yards of offense in the first half with 286 yards coming through the air and 60 yards on the ground, the 'Dogs opened the second half and put together a 6-play, 75-yard drive that ended with a 12-yard touchdown pass from McMaryion to Johnson in the left corner of the end zone to push the 'Dogs lead to 35-13.

On the drive, McMaryion went 3-for-3 for 64 yards finding Johnson for a 39-yard connection that pushed him into eighth all-time in program history in receiving yards passing Isaiah Burse (2010-13).

The 'Dogs added two more touchdowns in the third quarter as Walker's 38-yard interception return was the Bulldogs' fourth non-offensive return for a touchdown this season and was the second interception returned for a touchdown this season by a Bulldog.

McMaryion added his fifth touchdown of the game with a six-yard rush to 248 to play in the third quarter to give the 'Dogs a 49-13 lead (watch). Toledo added two fourth quarter touchdowns as Eli Peters connected with Jon'Vea Johnson for a 54-yard score followed by a 24-yard score.

RENO, Nev. - Behind stout defense from the Bulldogs and two touchdowns from sophomore running back Ronnie Rivers, Fresno State defeated Nevada 21-3 in its Mountain West opener on Saturday evening at Mackay Stadium.

Holding Nevada to only a field goal in the contest, the Fresno State defense forced three turnovers and limited the Wolf Pack to 3.8 yards per play on offense.

Senior quarterback Marcus McMaryion went 20-of-28 passing, completing better than 70 percent of his throws for the fourth time in five games. He racked up 241 yards and tossed two touchdowns.

The beneficiary to each of McMaryion's touchdown throws were senior wide receiver KeeSean Johnson (27-yard TD) and Rivers (19-yard TD). Johnson had a team-high seven receptions for 65 yards and a touchdown while Rivers' TD grab was his sole reception on the evening. Junior tight end Jared Rice tallied a team-high and career-high 98 yards on three receptions which included a career-long 69-yard reception.

Defensively, the 'Dogs linebacker corps was outstanding as junior linebacker Jeff Allison led the way with a career-high 17 tackles, 10 solo, while adding half-a-sack and half-a-tackle. Senior linebacker George Helmuth added 11 tackles, 1.5 tackles for loss and 0.5 sack and fellow senior James Bailey tacked on 10 tackles, 2.5 tackles for loss and one sack.

The secondary ripped off three interceptions, with the wealth being spread around with senior cornerback Anthoula Kelly, junior strong safety Juju Hughes and junior free safety Mike Bell tallying one apiece.

How It Happened

With neither team able to generate much offense in the early going, the game was scoreless after the opening quarter. The 'Dogs edged the Wolf Pack in total yards, 73-58.

With the ball at the Nevada 30-yard line and a fresh set of downs to open the second quarter, Fresno State finished their first scoring drive with McMaryion finding Rivers in the flat for a 19-yard touchdown pass to cap a nine play, 69-yard drive that spanned four minutes, nine seconds.

Nevada responded to the Bulldogs' touchdown drive with an 11-play, 51-yard drive that resulted in a 41-yard field goal by Wolf Pack kicker Ramiz Ahmed to cut the 'Dogs lead to 7-3. Nevada converted a key 4th-and-2 with a 13-yard rush by quarterback Christian Solano which helped set up the Wolf Pack's only scoring drive of the night.

Later in the second quarter, Kelly intercepted Solano and returned it 43 yards to the Wolf Pack 11 for his third interception of the season. Unfortunately for the 'Dogs, a play later McMaryion's pass to Jamire Jordan was jarred loose from Jordan causing the 'Dogs only turnover on Saturday.

Hughes made it two Bulldog interceptions over the final 2:35 of the first half by picking off Solano on a 3rd-and-10 with 11 seconds remaining in the half to end the threat of a Wolf Pack score. Fresno State held a 7-3 lead heading into the locker room at the break.

Limited to only 125 yards of offense to that point, the 'Dogs broke out on its second offensive drive of the third quarter as McMaryion found Rice for a 69-yard reception, taken down at the Nevada 11 to ultimately set up the Bulldogs' next score. Nevada wouldn't make it easy for Fresno State as they were able to convert a 4th-and-1 from the Nevada 2 to increase the lead to 14-3. Rivers delivered the score with his second touchdown of the night punching it in on fourth down.

Bell became the eighth Bulldog this season to notch an interception early in the fourth quarter as the 'Dogs defense continued to wreak havoc on Nevada.

The 'Dogs added one final score with 8:28 to play in the fourth quarter as McMaryion found Johnson for a 27-yard score to give the Bulldogs a 21-3 lead. Nevada made one last push for the end zone driving the ball 61 yards on 16 plays over five minutes, but the defense stood tall forcing a turnover on downs at the Fresno State 10-yard line with 3:18 left in the game.

FRESNO, Calif. - The Fresno State football team defeated Wyoming 27-3 on Saturday evening at Bulldog Stadium to improve to 5-1 on the season and 2-0 in Mountain West play.

Fresno State's defense limited Wyoming to 221 total yards and forced one turnover while the Bulldog offense totaled 391 yards and did not commit a turnover.

Senior quarterback Marcus McMaryion accounted for four total touchdowns in the game, two passing and two rushing. He completed 22-of-32 passes for 287 yards and ran for a season-high 53 yards on seven carries. McMaryion has now accounted for 18 touchdowns this season - 11 passing and seven rushing.

Junior tight end Jared Rice had a career-high seven receptions for 94 yards and caught a touchdown while senior wide receiver KeeSean Johnson added five receptions for 51 yards. Sophomore running back Ronnie Rivers added 90 all-purpose yards with 53 yards receiving, 22 yards rushing and 15 punt return yards.

Defensively, junior linebacker Jeff Allison posted his third double-figure tackle performance of the season finishing with 13 tackles. Junior free safety Mike Bell made his second interception of the season and senior defensive end Emeka Ndoh added a tackle for loss and a sack.

How It Happened

Allowing their opponent to score first for only the second time this season, Wyoming opened the game with a 8-play, 47-yard drive that was capped by Cowboy kicker Cooper Rothe nailing a 44-yard field goal to give the visitors a 3-0 lead.

From that point forward, the Bulldogs' defense shutout the Cowboys and rolled to 27 consecutive points.

After Fresno State's opening drive was unsuccessful, the Bulldogs' next drive would take two plays as McMaryion found Rice for a 35-yard touchdown pass to take a 6-3 lead. The point after was missed.

The Cowboys outgained the 'Dogs 74-70 in the opening quarter, but the Bulldogs' defense held the Wyoming offense to 44 yards in the second quarter.

The Bulldogs' sole second quarter scoring drive covered 46 yards over 12 plays and five minutes, 48 seconds, that included converting a crucial fourth-and-1 with a three-yard carry by Jordan Mims to keep their drive alive. Three plays later they faced a third-and-13 from the Cowboy 37-yard line and McMaryion found Rice for 16 yards down to the 21-yard line and followed that with a 20-yard connection to Cam Sutton as the junior tight end nearly found the end zone reaching out for the score before being knocked out at the 1-yard line. After three plays of not finding the checkbook, the Bulldogs converted a second fourth down as they scored on fourth-and-goal with McMaryion sneaking it in himself to give Fresno State a 13-3 lead with 52 seconds remaining in the half. The half would close with the 'Dogs holding the 10 point lead.

The Bulldog defense forced Wyoming into negative four yards on its opening offensive drive of the second half and for the third time in the game, the 'Dogs started a drive in Wyoming territory. The Bulldogs proceeded to go on a 6-play, 47-yard drive that was capped with a three-yard touchdown pass from McMaryion to senior tight end David Tangipa to put Fresno State ahead 20-3.

The 'Dogs closed out the scoring for the night on its next offensive drive with a 6-play, 85-yard drive that was finished off with a six-yard touchdown run by McMaryion.

The third quarter was capped off with the 'Dogs forcing their only takeaway of the game as Mike Bell came up with an interception with 29 seconds remaining in the frame.

The Bulldogs had two drives in the final quarter for 71 yards, but were stopped on fourth down and forced to punt as neither side scored in the final quarter, marking the first time since the 'Dogs were at San Diego State in 2017, a span of 12 games, that saw no scoring in the final frame by either team.

ALBUQUERQUE, N.M. - Winning its fifth straight game and clinching bowl eligibility for a second straight season, Fresno State rolled to a 38-7 win at New Mexico on Saturday evening at Dreamstyle Stadium.

Fresno State (6-1, 3-0 MW) finished with 433 total yards in the contest passing for 280 yards while rushing for 153 yards. The 'Dogs limited New Mexico (3-4, 1-2 MW) to 280 yards as the Lobos nearly evenly split their yards rushing for 148 yards and passing for 132 yards.

Senior quarterback Marcus McMaryion went 20-of-30 for 280 yards while passing for three touchdowns as it was his fourth straight game with multiple touchdown passes. Senior wide receiver KeeSean Johnson had a career-high 149 receiving yards while matching his season-high with eight receptions and grabbed two touchdown receptions for his second multi-touchdown game of the season. Sophomore running back Ronnie Rivers totaled 146 all-purpose yards and tallied his first career three-touchdown game appearing all over the field for the 'Dogs. Rivers finished with 69 receiving yards, 48 rushing yards and 29 punt return yards, scoring two of his touchdowns on the ground while tacking on one more through the air.

Defensively, junior linebacker Jeff Allison finished with a team-high 10 tackles, eight solo, while junior defensive end Mykal Walker totaled six tackles. Junior free safety Mike Bell gave the 'Dogs their 13th interception of the season, snagging a pick for the third straight game.

How It Happened

Scoring first for the fifth time this season, the Bulldogs matched their opening drive that went scoreless, venturing on an identical 10-play, 44-yard drive that was highlighted by a 26-yard pass from McMaryion to Rivers down to the Lobos 17-yard line. A four-yard rush by Josh Hokit got the 'Dogs down to the 4-yard line, but a false start by the Bulldogs pushed them back to the 9-yard line and a Lobo sack of four yards on third down set up a 30-yard field goal by Fuller to give the 'Dogs a 3-0 lead.

The Bulldogs' defense forced its second-straight three-and-out after picking up its first points of the game on the previous drive, and picked up excellent field position obtaining the ball back at the Lobos' 46-yard line. The Bulldogs made quick work of its next drive as Rivers took home a 16-yard rushing touchdown on the ground to put Fresno State up 10-0 after the PAT.

After the Bulldog defense held the Lobos to 30 total yards and one first down in the first quarter, Fresno State's defense continued to make life difficult for the Lobos as free safety Mike Bell came up with his third interception in as many games to give the 'Dogs the ball back at Lobos 26-yard-line. A 13-yard run by McMaryion put the 'Dogs at the UNM 1-yard line before Rivers ran in his second rushing touchdown of the game to put the 'Dogs ahead 17-0.

New Mexico broke up the Bulldogs' shutout bid with 57 seconds remaining in the first half as the Lobos connected on a 16-yard touchdown pass from quarterback Sheriron Jones to wide receiver Elijah Lilly. The touchdown pass finished off a 7-play, 71-yard drive and momentarily cut the Fresno State lead to 17-7.

Fresno State wasted little time to counter the Lobos' score before the half, capitalizing on two 15-yard penalties on an 11-yard pass from McMaryion to Rivers. That was followed by a 34-yard touchdown strike from McMaryion to Johnson to extend the 'Dogs lead back to 24-7 with 36 second left to cap a lighting quick 21 second drive.

With the offense getting the ball to start the second quarter, the 'Dogs continued to roll on offense going on a 14-play, 75-yard drive that consumed 6:28 off the clock as McMaryion found Johnson across the middle for a 15-yard touchdown score which put the Bulldogs up 31-7.

Fresno State was again aided by two 15-yard Lobo penalties on the same play on its next drive, quickly racing down the field on an 80-yard, four-play drive that McMaryion capped off by connecting with Rivers for a 23-yard pass for his third touchdown pass of the night giving the 'Dogs a 38-7 lead.

FRESNO, Calif. - Fresno State made it six straight wins with a 50-20 Homecoming victory over Hawai'i on Saturday night at Bulldog Stadium. The Bulldogs (7-1, 4-0 MW) totaled a season-high 562 yards of offense passing for 348 yards and rushing for 214 while holding Hawai'i (6-4, 3-2 MW), who came in averaging 34.9 points per game, to their second fewest points scored this season.

Senior wide receiver KeeSean Johnson matched his season-high with eight receptions and had his fourth 100-yard receiving game of the season finishing with a team-high 102 yards. With his final reception of the night, Johnson became the program's all-time receptions leader with 234 passing current Green Bay Packer wide receiver and former Bulldog Davante Adams (2012-13).

Senior quarterback Marcus McMaryion continued his outstanding play with his fifth straight game with multiple touchdown passes tossing four scores to four different receivers while connecting on 21-of-31 passes for 284 yards. On the ground, sophomore running back Ronnie Rivers ran for a career-best 125 yards on 11 carries and scored the Bulldogs' lone rushing touchdown with a 76-yard burst in the second quarter.

Defensively, the Bulldog defense was led by junior defensive end Mykal Walker who finished with a team-high nine tackles, six solo, 3.5 tackles for loss, one sack and a fumble recovery. The 'Dogs nabbed their 14th interception of the season as junior free safety Juju Hughes made his second interception of the year. The Bulldog defense has now forced 20 turnovers on the season.

How It Happened

Allowing their opponent to score first for the third time this season, Hawai'i got on scoreboard first on an eight-play, 50-yard drive as Rainbow Warriors kicker Ryan Meskell nailed a 43-yard field goal to take a 3-0 lead.

After the Bulldog defense forced a three-and-out on the next Hawai'i offensive drive, Rivers returned a punt eight yards to the Hawai'i 41-yard line and after two rushes by the sophomore running back brought the ball down to the Hawai'i 30-yard line, the game went into a 29-minute delay due to a portion of the stadium lights malfunctioning.

With the game resuming play at 8:30 p.m. PT, the Bulldogs quickly found the end zone two plays later as McMaryion found Rice for a 19-yard touchdown to give the 'Dogs a 7-3 lead.

The Bulldog defense held the Rainbow Warriors to four yards on its next drive, getting the ball back at their own 29-yard line and quickly made their way down the field before McMaryion connected on a 49-yard touchdown pass to Jamire Jordan for the senior wide receiver's first touchdown reception of the season.

With the 'Dogs leading 14-3 after the opening quarter, Hawai'i quickly responded with a four-play, 75-yard drive as Hawai'i quarterback Cole McDonald found wide receiver Jolo Ward down the right hash for a 50-yard touchdown to cut the Bulldogs' lead to four.

A game featuring two high-flying offenses, and the offensive fireworks continued on the first play of the next offensive drive as Rivers broke loose for a 76-yard touchdown run, the longest touchdown run by a Bulldog running back since Martezee Waller in 2014, to give the 'Dogs a 21-10 lead. Holding Hawai'i to its third three-and-out of the game, the 'Dogs quickly got the ball back and went on their fourth straight scoring drive, marching down the field on a seven-play, 52 yard drive as kicker Asa Fuller connected on a 22-yard field goal to extend the lead to 24-10.

The Rainbow Warriors answered back with a nine-play, 65-yard drive that took 4:22 off the clock as Meskell connected on his second field goal of the night making it from 28-yards out to cut Fresno State's lead down to 24-13. The 'Dogs answered back with its fifth straight scoring drive as McMaryion tossed his third touchdown pass of the game with a 21-yard strike to Jordan Mims to complete a nine-play, 74-yard drive and push the Bulldogs' lead to 30-13.

The Bulldogs completed the barrage of first-half scoring in the final seconds of the second quarter as the Rainbow Warriors' 53-yard field goal attempt came up well short and allowed Jordan to return it from the end zone. After a few key blocks by the Bulldogs, the Lancaster, Calif. native was off to the races for a 100-yard missed field goal return for a touchdown to give the 'Dogs a 37-13 advantage.

Getting the ball to start the third quarter, the 'Dogs scored on a season-high sixth straight drive with a methodical 14-play, 61-yard drive that took 5:05 off the clock as Fuller hit his second field goal of the night making it from 32-yards out to increase the lead to 40-13.

Hughes quickly gave the ball back to the 'Dogs with his second interception of the season returning the ball 31 yards to the Hawai'i 16-yard line to set up another Bulldog touchdown as McMaryion found Derrion Grim for a 6-yard score to make it 23 straight points for the 'Dogs to push their lead to 47-13 (watch).

Fuller added his third field goal of the night, a 21-yarder, in the fourth quarter to complete the Bulldog scoring. Hawai'i ended Fresno State's run of 26 straight points with a 27-yard touchdown pass with 1:43 to play in the fourth quarter for the final result, 50-20.

LAS VEGAS – No. 20/23 Fresno State earned its seventh consecutive win on Saturday night with a 48-3 road win over UNLV at Sam Boyd Stadium. The Bulldogs (8-1, 5-0 MW) totaled 466 yards of offense, passing for 274 yards and rushing for 192 while holding UNLV (2-6, 0-5 MW) to one field goal, marking the third time this season Fresno State held a team out of the end zone.

It was a team effort against UNLV as Fresno State's six touchdowns were scored by six different Bulldogs, four rushing and two passing.

Senior quarterback Marcus McMaryion had his sixth straight game with multiple touchdown passes throwing for two to two different receivers while finishing the game 26-of-35 for 274 yards. On the ground, nine different Bulldogs recorded rushes with Ronnie Rivers leading that category with 12 (for 33 yards and one touchdown). Saevion Johnson led the team in rushing yards with 47 yards on three carries, including a long of 37 yards to score the Bulldogs final touchdown of the game.

Defensively the Bulldogs were led by Juju Hughes who finished with a team-high 11 tackles, six solo. The 'Dogs grabbed their 15th interception of the season as junior defensive back Jaron Bryant recorded his first interception of the season. The Bulldog defense has now forced 21 turnovers on the season.

How It Happened

After a pair of first downs by UNLV to open the game, Fresno State's defense held tough, forcing UNLV into a punt. On that punt, Mykal Walker got through the line and partially blocked the punt to set back the kick for a net of just 15 yards to give the Bulldogs field position at the Rebels' 45-yard line for their first offensive drive. The 'Dogs moved the ball 45 yards in six plays as McMaryion hit Jamire Jordan on a slant across the middle for a 12-yard touchdown to put Fresno State in front 7-0 with 10:39 left in the first quarter.

Looking to get on the board midway through the quarter, Evan Pantels lined up for a 46-yard field goal attempt but missed wide to the right. The 'Dogs capitalized, marching nine plays down the field to the Rebels' two-yard line as time expired in the first quarter. Ronnie Rivers scored on a two-yard rush to the right side on the first play of the second frame to increase Fresno State's lead to 14-0.

With three minutes remaining before halftime, Blake Cusick pinned UNLV at its own 8-yard line. Fresno State held the Rebels to a three-and-out and set the 'Dogs up at their own 42-yard line. The Bulldogs used the short field to their advantage, picking up three points with an Asa Fuller 35-yard field goal as they took a 17-0 lead into the half.

Receiving the ball out of the break, Fresno State scored on its first drive of the second half for the third consecutive game as McMaryion led the 'Dogs 65 yards down the field before connecting with Kyle Riddering for a nine-yard touchdown. It was Riddering's fifth catch and third touchdown of the season.

Seven plays into the Rebels' ensuing drive, Jaron Bryant grabbed his first pick of the season, returning it 39 yards to the UNLV five-yard line. It took just one play for the Bulldogs to push their lead to 31-0 with 8:22 left in the third quarter as Josh Hokit rushed to the left side and snuck inside the pylon.

After holding UNLV to its fourth three-and-out of the game, Fresno State moved the ball to the Rebel 29-yard line on its next possession. Asa Fuller knocked in his second field goal of the game, a season-long 47 yards to extend the lead to 34-0 with 4:42 remaining in the third quarter.

Forcing UNLV to punt on its next drive, Fresno State did just what it did to end the third, drive the ball down into the red zone. On the first play from scrimmage to start the fourth quarter, Derrion Grim scored his first-career rushing touchdown, running into the end zone from 10 yards out to give the Bulldogs a 41-0 advantage.

With 10:13, UNLV ended the Bulldogs' bid for a shutout as Pantels hit a 28-yard field goal.

Starting with the ball at their own 45-yard line, it took just four plays for the Bulldogs to find the end zone one more time. After Saevion Johnson broke loose for a 37-yard run, the sophomore ended the drive with a two-yard touchdown plunge to put Fresno State on top 48-3.

BOISE, Idaho – No. 16/17 Fresno State fell to Boise State 24-17, losing its first Mountain West game of the season on Friday night at Albertsons Stadium after a furious second half comeback by the Broncos who registered 21 unanswered points. The Bulldogs (8-2, 5-1 MW) totaled 390 yards of offense, passing for 283 yards while Boise State (8-2, 5-1 MW) finished the game with 448 yards of offense, the most allowed by Fresno State this season.

Senior quarterback Marcus McMaryion threw for one touchdown and connected on 24-of-35 passes for 283 yards. Senior wide receiver KeeSean Johnson matched his season-high of eight receptions and finished with a team-high 95 yards. Johnson scored the Bulldogs' first touchdown of the night, a three-yard reception. On the ground, sophomore running back Ronnie Rivers had 33 yards on seven carries and scored the Bulldogs' lone rushing touchdown which gave the 'Dogs a 17-3 lead early in the third quarter.

Junior linebacker Jeff Allison led the team on defense with 14 tackles, seven solo. The 'Dogs grabbed their 16th interception of the season as junior free safety Juju Hughes had the only turnover of the game. It was his fourth career interception and third of the season. The Bulldog defense has forced 22 turnovers on the season while surrendering just seven.

How It Happened

Brett Rypien opened the game with a 41-yard pass to Sean Modster on the first play from scrimmage to put Boise State on the Fresno State 30-yard line. After that, the Bulldogs defense tightened up and the Broncos settled for a Haden Hoggarth 50-yard field goal attempt that sailed wide left.

After the Broncos forced a punt on the Bulldogs' first offensive drive, they moved the ball down inside the red zone. But again, BSU settled for a field goal attempt but this attempt was true, connecting on a 35-yard attempt for a 3-0 lead and 6:37 left on the clock in the first quarter.

Late in the first quarter, Fresno State's offense got things going, using just four plays to flip the field and get the ball into the red zone following a 38-yard reception by Johnson. Two plays later, McMaryion found Johnson for a three-yard score to give the 'Dogs a 7-3 lead with 14:12 remaining in the second quarter.

With Boise State methodically marching down the field, the Bulldogs' defense stood tall inside the red zone, on the 15th play of the Broncos' drive, they lined up for a field goal on fourth-and-3 at the 12-yard line, but the Broncos opted for trickery. On the fake, James Bailey snuffed it out and wrapped the legs of Hoggarth to stop them short and turn the ball over on downs. On Fresno State's ensuing possession, the 'Dogs moved the ball 66 yards on 10 plays, but missed a 38-yard field goal attempt.

With the Broncos looking to take advantage of the missed field goal before the half, Juju Hughes picked off Rypien in the end zone to end the threat and left the offense with 1:14 to capitalize. The 'Dogs drove it 37 yards and gave Asa Fuller an attempt of 47 yards that he snuck inside the right upright to give the Bulldogs a 10-3 lead as time expired on the first half.

Fresno State opened up the second half with the ball, and as they did they did the previous three games, they manufactured points. The 'Dogs went 75 yards on seven plays and extended its lead to 14 with Rivers capping the drive with a one-yard touchdown plunge on fourth down.

From that point on, it was all Boise State. Down 17-3, the Broncos answered the Bulldogs first possession score with a TD of their own using a 12-play drive to pull their deficit back to seven, 17-10. The linchpin of the drive was registering 15 yards on third-and-16 from the FS 47-yard line that was followed by a fourth down conversion. Alex Mattison capped the drive with a seven-yard run. It was the first score for a Bulldog opponent on their opening possession of the second half this season.

At the 14:57 mark in the fourth quarter, Boise State tied the game 17-17. The Broncos moved the ball 58 yards down to the one-yard line at the close of the third quarter and Mattison knotted the game with a one-yard score to start the fourth. The Broncos struck again with 9:22 remaining in the game for the go-ahead score, 24-17, as they moved the ball 34 yards before Rypien found Khalil Shakir down the middle for a 49-yard touchdown on third-and-8 to take the lead.

Fresno State moved the ball into Boise State territory on their final two possessions. The first try fell short as a 50-yard field attempt was blocked on fourth-and-10 from the 30-yard line. The 'Dogs forced a three-and out and got the ball back for once last chance with 5:11 on the clock. The 'Dogs made it as far as the Boise State 29-yard line, but on fourth-and-11 McMaryion's pass attempt down the middle for Johnson was broken up to seal the game for Boise State.

FRESNO, Calif. – Clinching a second straight West Division crown and a trip back to the Mountain West championship game, Fresno State overcame a four-point halftime deficit to defeat San Diego State, 23-14, on Saturday evening at Bulldog Stadium.

Holding on to the Oil Can Trophy for a second consecutive season, the Bulldogs rallied from a 14-10 halftime deficit by shutting out SDSU in the second half and limiting them to just 57 yards of offense. Meanwhile, the 'Dogs racked up 178 yards offense and went 4-of-6 on third downs in the second half en route to the comeback.

Overall, Fresno State (9-2, 6-1 MW) tallied 390 yards of offense, passing for 267 yards and rushing for 123.

Bulldog quarterback Marcus McMaryion finished 17-of-24 for 267 yards and tossed an 86-yard touchdown to Jamire Jordan while adding 16 rushing yards. The senior from Dinuba has now thrown for at least 200 yards in all 11 games this season. Senior wide receiver KeeSean Johnson matched his career-high with 10 receptions for 141 yards and sophomore running back Ronnie Rivers had a career-high 22 carries totaling 78 yards and a touchdown.

Defensively, safety Juju Hughes led the 'Dogs with nine tackles as the Bulldog defense held the Aztecs rushing attack to 64 yards. SDSU came into the game averaging 166.1 yards per game. The 'Dogs only allowed SDSU to complete eight passes for 218 yards with 145 of those yards coming on 75, and 70-yard touchdowns passes to wide receiver Fred Trevillion.

How It Happened

After Fresno State held San Diego State to a three-and-out, the Bulldogs opened the game on their own 6-yard line after a 55-yard punt. On the third play, McMaryion caught the Aztec defense offside on a third-and-2 and took advantage of the free play, connecting with Jamire Jordan for an 86-yard touchdown down the left sideline to open up the scoring 12:08 into the game.

San Diego State leveled the game in the first quarter, 7-7, with a deep ball of their own, a 75-yard touchdown pass from Christian Chapman that found Fred Trevillion in stride with 6:21 on the clock in the first.

The 'Dogs regained the lead with 6:40 remaining in the second quarter as they put together a 10-play, 63-yard drive that ended with a 25-yard field goal from Asa Fuller. It was quick lived though, as the Aztecs went to the air again, this time with different quarterback under center in Ryan Agnew. Agnew connected with Trevillion for a 70-yard touchdown pass on their first play following the Bulldogs' field goal to regain the lead, 14-10. The Aztecs took that lead into the half to mark the second time this season the 'Dogs trailed at the break.

For the fifth straight game, Fresno State took its first possession of the second half in for points. Aided by a 32-yard reception from KeeSean Johnson, the Bulldogs worked the ball 75 yards down the field as Ronnie Rivers ran it from two yards out on a pitch to give the 'Dogs a 17-14 lead. San Diego State looked to tie up the game with just over two minutes remaining in the third, but John Baron's 47-yard attempt stayed left of the upright with 2:16 remaining in the third quarter.

Fresno State went right to work on its ensuing drive. Keyed by a 37-yard reception by Johnson inside the Aztec 5-yard line, the Bulldogs moved the ball 70 yards on 10 plays to extend its lead to 23-14 on a one-yard touchdown plunge from Jordan Mims with 12:40 left in the game.

The 'Dogs forced a three-and-out on SDSU's next possession and Isaiah Johnson ended the Aztecs final drive with a sack on fourth-and-nine.

FRESNO, Calif. – Overcoming a sluggish start in the first half, Fresno State used four second-half touchdowns to ease to a 31-13 victory over San Jose State on Senior Day at Bulldog Stadium.

Fresno State (10-2, 7-1 MW) totaled 515 yards of offense with 326 of that coming in the second half as the Bulldogs scored 28 of their 31 points over their final 30 minutes.

Marcus McMaryion and KeeSean Johnson sparked the offense during the second half as McMaryion went 11-of-12 for 242 yards and two touchdowns with Johnson catching six of those passes for 165 yards and one of McMaryion's two TD throws.



McMaryion totaled 347 yards offense in his final start at Bulldog Stadium, passing for 317 yards on 20-of-29 attempts and added 30 rushing yards. Johnson finished with a career-high 173 receiving yards on seven receptions while scoring on a 31-yard touchdown in the third quarter (watch) to become the program's all-time leader in receiving yards passing former Bulldog wideout Charlie Jones. On the ground, the Bulldogs totaled 198 yards as sophomore running back Ronnie Rivers led the way with 92 yards on 17 carries. Jordan Mims added 55 yards on eight carries and scored his sixth rushing touchdown of the season.

Defensively, the Bulldogs limited San Jose State (1-11, 1-7 MW) to 60 rushing yards and 367 total yards. Junior defensive end Mykal Walker led the way for the second time this season, recording eight tackles, 1.5 tackles for loss and two quarterback hurries while Arron Mosby put the game away scoring the Bulldogs final touchdown with a 95-yard pick-six with less than five minutes remaining in the game.

How It Happened

After a scoreless first quarter, SJSU looked to be the first team on the scoreboard midway through the second quarter after completing an 18-yard pass from quarterback Michael Carrillo to wide receiver Tre Walker that set up a 4th-and-1 at the Fresno State 30-yard line, but the 'Dogs came up with a key defensive stop by Mike Bell (watch) to get the Bulldogs the ball back. The 'Dogs capitalized on the turnover-on-downs with a 13-play, 54-yard drive that took the ball down to the Spartans 15-yard line to set up a 32-yard field goal by Asa Fuller to put the Bulldogs ahead 3-0 at halftime. Despite only three points, the Bulldogs registered 189 yards offense to the Spartans' 130.

The third quarter saw the Bulldogs' offense catch fire scoring a pair of touchdowns. The first came on a quick five-play, 77-yard drive in 1:49 that used a 17-yard run by Mims and a 45-yard pass from McMaryion to Johnson to set up a 1-yard touchdown run by Mims (watch). Fresno State extended its lead to 17-0 on its next offensive drive using back-to-back receptions by Johnson, one for 37 yards (watch) which was then followed by a 31-yard touchdown.

On the first play of fourth quarter, the Spartans answered back breaking up the Bulldogs' shutout bid with a 73-yard touchdown pass from Carrillo to running back Malike Roberson that cut the lead to 17-7.

Fresno State then made it three straight offensive drives with a touchdown, going on a six-play, 78-yard drive, that was capped by an 18-yard pass from McMaryion to Rivers (watch) to put the 'Dogs ahead 24-7 with 11:59 to go in the game.

After the Bulldogs' second turnover of the game, a fumble by running back Josh Hokit, it gave the Spartans the ball back at their own 25-yard line, the Spartans drove the ball 66 yards in four plays before Mosby picked off a Carrillo pass at the Fresno State 5-yard line (watch) and returned it 95 yards for a touchdown, the longest interception return for a touchdown by a Bulldog since 2004.

SJSU added one final touchdown on its last offensive drive with a four-yard touchdown pass from Carrillo to Walker to make it the final score 31-13.

BOISE, Idaho — With the Mountain West Championship game in the balance in overtime on a snow covered field, sophomore running back Ronnie Rivers skated in from one-yard on an option pitch from senior quarterback Marcus McMaryion for a touchdown to give Fresno State a 19-16 win over Boise State, its third Mountain West title, and avenged its 2014 and 2017 championship game road losses to BSU in its fourth overall championship game appearance.

The loss was just the ninth for the Broncos at Albertsons Stadium since 2000 and their first overtime loss at home since 2007. It was Fresno State's first win on the blue turf and first win at Boise State since 1984.

Rivers finished the game with 63 yards rushing and the game's final score. McMaryion passed for 170 yards and a touchdown on 20-of-32 attempts to go with 40 yards on six carries. Michiah Quick caught the Bulldogs' one TD reception.

Junior Mykal Walker was named the Defensive MVP, finishing the night with 11 tackles, 2.0 tackles for loss, one sack and a fumble recovery that led to the game's opening touchdown. Fellow juniors Jeff Allison and Mike Bell were all over the field, joining Walker with double-digit tackle totals with 12 and 10, respectively.

How It Happened

Fresno State produced the game's first turnover as Brett Rypien lost the handle of a wet ball before his pass attempt on the Broncos' first play of their second drive of the game. Walker pounced on the loose ball, and the Bulldogs took over at the Broncos' 20-yard line. Three plays later, McMaryion lofted a ball to the left corner of the end zone into the awaiting hands of Quick for a 15-yard TD reception to put the 'Dogs on top, 7-0, with 9:03 left in the first quarter.

Boise State answered with a 15-play drive that used nearly half of the first quarter. On third-and-9 from the Bulldogs' 10-yard line, Rypien's pass to the back of the end zone was nearly intercepted by Jaron Bryant, but instead it found the hands of Sean Modster who got a toe inbounds for the touchdown to knot the game, 7-7, at 1:56 mark in the first quarter.

On the Bulldogs' ensuing possession and facing a third-and-6, McMaryion found Quick for the first down, but he was stood up and stripped of the ball. The Broncos' Avery Williams recovered the ball at the Bulldogs' 41-yard line. In spite of the turnover, Fresno State's defense forced a turnover on downs six play later when BSU went for it on fourth-and-8. Rypien's throw fell just beyond the outstretch hands of Akilian Butler in the end zone.

Fresno State capitalized on the Broncos' turnover on downs, driving 51 yards to set up place kicker Asa Fuller for a 44-yard field goal with 3:20 left to play in the half, which was made during a point in the game where the snow was falling the heaviest. The 'Dogs took a 10-7 advantage into the half.

The Bulldogs added to their lead on the opening drive of the third quarter with Fuller's second field goal of the game, a 38-yard attempt with 11:07 on the clock to start the scoring in the second half, giving Fresno State a 13-7 lead.

With neither side being able to find points for nearly 20 minutes, Boise State tied the contest with 8:01 remaining in the game. Alexander Mattison found a hole up the middle for the Broncos and raced to a 34-yard touchdown, capping a seven-play, 87-yard drive. Fresno State's Matt Boateng, though, got off the edge and blocked the point after attempt to leave the game knotted at 13-13, a play that would ultimately send the Mountain West Championship game into its first-ever overtime.

Fresno State won the overtime coin toss and elected to start on defense. Boise State opened overtime with four consecutive Mattison rushes until Rypien went to the air on third-and-goal from the six-yard line. The Broncos settled for a 23-yard field goal from Haden Hoggarth, which put them ahead 16-13.

Knowing they needed at least three points, McMaryion found Jared Rice across the middle of the field on second down for a 16-yard gain. Rivers then found a hole and picked up eight yards on the next play to put the Bulldogs at the 1-yard line with second down coming up. After being stopped for no gain, McMaryion pitched out to Rivers on third down as the sophomore back scampered into the end zone for the win.

LAS VEGAS — For the first time in program history, Fresno State earned its 12th win in a single season, defeating Arizona State 31-20 at the 2018 Mitsubishi Motors Las Vegas Bowl on Saturday afternoon at Sam Boyd Stadium.

Sophomore running back Ronnie Rivers was named the game's Most Valuable Player after accounting for 286 all-purpose yards, the fourth-most in program history. He totaled 212 yards rushing and two touchdowns on 24 carries, while also posting 41 punt return yards and 33 receiving yards.

While Rivers accounted for nearly half of the Bulldogs' 436 yards of offense on the ground, senior quarterback Marcus McMaryion passed for 176 yards on 15-of-29 attempts while rushing for 41 yards.

Having surrendered 230 yards and 17 points to Arizona State in the first half, the Bulldog defense shut down the explosive backfield duo of running back Eno Benjamin and quarterback Manny Wilkins in the second half as the Sun Devils gained only 63 yards and registered one field goal during the final 30 minutes.

The Bulldogs forced two turnovers while giving away three. Juju Hughes and Anthoula Kelly each recorded their fourth interceptions of the season for the Bulldogs' two turnovers gained. Kelly's INT was returned 70 yards for a touchdown that put the 'Dogs on top 10-0 midway through the first quarter.

Jeff Allison and George Helmuth each had a game-high 11 tackles.

How It Happened

Fresno State struck first, moving the ball 45 yards on their second possession of the game to the ASU 21-yard line. Asa Fuller lined up a 39-yard field goal and split the uprights to give the Bulldogs a 3-0 lead with 7:02 on the clock.

On the ensuing Sun Devil possession, Wilkins looked to throw left but he found the awaiting hands of Kelly as he broke on the release of ball. The senior sprinted down the sideline, stopped, and cut back across the field with 30 yards to go before being caught, and cut back again toward the right side before trotting into the end zone for a 70-yard pick-six to give Fresno State a 10-0 advantage seven minutes into the game.

Arizona State answered with a nine-play drive. After three rushes for 16 yards by Benjamin, Wilkins rushed once for 11 yards and went 3-of-4 on the drive as he connected with Kyle Williams for a three-yard touchdown to bring the Sun Devils within three with 1:25 to go in the first.

ASU grabbed the lead early in the second quarter, 14-10, as Benjamin had three rushes on an eight-play, 58-yard drive, capping it off with a 17-yard run.

Fresno State had an answer though. The 'Dogs opened up with Ronnie Rivers breaking loose for runs of 15 and 19 yards. The Bulldogs then worked the ball down to the ASU 10-yard line where McMaryion found a hole up the middle to get into the end zone and retake the lead for Fresno State, 17-14, with 8:03 remaining in the half.

The Sun Devils worked nearly the remainder of the time left on the clock in the first half on its next drive, moving the ball down to the Fresno State two-yard line. The Bulldogs held ASU to a 20-yard field goal from Brandon Ruiz after the Sun Devils had a first-and-goal from the eight-yard line. ASU knotted the game, 17-17, heading into the half.

After holding Arizona State to a three-and-out to open the third quarter, the Bulldogs looked to take the lead on a 29-yard scamper by Deonte O'Neal, but he lost control of the ball diving toward the end zone where Shannon Forman recovered the fumble for ASU. That started a string of three-straight turnovers for the Bulldogs as McMaryion tossed back-to-back interceptions. The defense stood tall though in the quarter, allowing just 31 yards and a 44-yard Ruiz field goal as the Sun Devils held a slim 20-17 lead late in period.

With a minute left in the third, on second-and-10 from the Bulldogs' own 32-yard line, Rivers burst through a hole in the middle of the line and broke free for a 68-yard touchdown run. The sophomore's run gave Fresno State a 24-20 lead heading into the final quarter.

Fresno State scored once more with 5:19 left in the game to gain a two possession lead, 31-20. A drive that started on their own 45-yard line. The 'Dogs drove seven plays for 55 yards. A key play on the scoring drive was on a third-and-3, McMaryion slipped through the line and scrambled for 23 yards to put the 'Dogs at the ASU 25-yard line. Four plays later, Rivers put the game out of reach with a five-yard touchdown run up the middle.
