Headlines

→ Tedford has not lost back-to-back games since road bouts at No. 4 Alabama (Sept. 9) and No. 12 Washington (Sept. 16) in 2017.

→ Fresno State has not started a season 0-2 since 2014. The Bulldogs opened 2014 also with USC. It was also the last time Fresno State opened with back-to-back Power 5 opponents.

→ The Bulldogs will host Minnesota for the first time in program history on Saturday.

→ Minnesota was one of the Bulldogs' two losses in their historic 12-win season in 2018. It was the first time in the 97-year history of the program that FS won 12 games in a season.

→ Fresno State will look to snap Minnesota's 16-game win streak against nonconference opponents on Saturday - that is the nation's longest streak for games versus nonconference teams.

→ Fresno State's current eight-game home winning streak ranks as tied for the 13th best streak in the FBS.

→ There were 13 Bulldogs that made their playing debut in last Saturday's week one contest at USC. Even more impressive, four of those 13 players started for Fresno State. Six of those 13 were true freshman that played; two true freshman started.

→ Cesar Silva, the Bulldogs' new place kicker, was one of 14 FBS kickers in week one to attempt three or more field goals and go 100 percent converting those tries.

→ Fresno State became the first team in FBS history to secure back-to-back double-digit winning seasons following a double-digit loss season (2016: 1-11, 2017: 10-4, 2018: 12-2).

→ Fresno State was picked to win the West Division in the 2019 preseason poll released by the Mountain West (selected by the media). The prediction pits the Bulldogs to face Boise State in the MW title game for a third consecutive year.

JIM THORPE AWARD

- #14 JARON BRYANT (SR.)

- Named an All-Mountain West honorable mention selection in 2018.
- Logged 12 pass breakups for Fresno State, second-most on the team in 2018.
- Recorded one interception, which was returned 39 yards to the 5-yard line on Nov. 3, 2018 against UNLV.
- Posted 50 tackles in 2018, 43 of which were solo stops.
- Became the first player in NCAA history to return two blocked field goals for touchdowns in the same quarter in the Bulldogs' season opener – was named MW special teams player of the week (Sept. 3).

- #47 BLAKE CUSICK (SR.)

- 2018 Ray Guy Award semifinalist.
- Named an All-Mountain West second team selection in 2018.
- Finished the 2018 season with an average of 42.2 yards per punt on a total of 65 attempts.
- In 2018, landed 31 punts inside the 20-yard line, 11 of which were inside the 10-yard line.
- In 2018, only 12 of his punts were returned by opponents – for a total of 42 yards.
- Kicked a career-long 72-yard punt in the Bulldogs' 21-3 win over Nevada on Oct. 6, 2018.

- #23 JUJU HUGHES (SR.)

- Named an All-Mountain West second team selection in 2018.
- Recorded four interceptions in 2018, tying for the Mountain West lead.

- Made 78 tackles in 2018.
- Started all 14 games in 2018 – has started 28 consecutive games.
- One of two current players to have played in a program-high 40 career games (Blake Cusick).

- #52 NETANE MUTI (JR.)

- Suffered season-ending injury during the second half of the Sept. 8 contest at Minnesota – started two games in 2018 at left tackle.
- Was on 2018 preseason Polynesian College Football Player of the Year watch list.
- Was an All-Mountain West honorable mention selection as a redshirt freshman in 2017.
- Started all 14 games in 2017 as a first-year player.
- As a member of the 2017 offensive line unit, helped hold six opponents without a sack over the season's 14 games while the maximum allowed was two, recorded by Alabama (Sept. 9) and Boise State (Dec. 2).

- #16 JARED RICE (SR.)

- Named a 2018 all-MW second team selection.
- As a junior in 2018, owned the fourth-most receptions (55) among all FBS tight ends and the sixth-most receiving yards (664) among all FBS tight ends.
- Was the team's second-leading receiver in both receptions and yards in 2018 behind sixth round NFL draft pick KeeSean Johnson.
- Caught a pass in all 14 games in 2018, capping junior season catching at least one pass in 20-straight games.
- Had a career-high seven receptions for 94 yards and one touchdown versus Wyoming on Oct. 13, 2018.



DOAK WALKER AWARD

& PAUL HORNUNG AWARD

- #20 RONNIE RIVERS (JR.)

- Closed sophomore season as the MVP of the Las Vegas Bowl – posting the fourth-most all-purpose yards in school history with 286 (212 rush/41 punt return/33 receiving) in the Bulldogs' win over Arizona State.
- Recorded 108.4 all-purpose yards per game in 2018, ranking as the fourth-most in the Mountain West.
- Averaged 5.6 yards per carry as a sophomore.
- Rushed for 63 yards on 17 carries and scored the game-winning touchdown in overtime against Boise State in the 2018 Mountain West Championship on Dec. 1.
- Appeared in 11 games after missing the first three games of the season. Made six starts coming off an injury prior to the season that occurred during the spring.

- #3 MYKAL WALKER (SR.)

- Started all 14 games in his first season on the field for Fresno State in 2018 – transferred from Azusa Pacific.
- Named an All-Mountain West first team selection as a junior playing defensive end.
- Shifted to MLB from DE during the spring of 2019.
- Named the Defensive MVP of the 2018 Mountain West Championship game producing 12 tackles, 2.5 TFLs, 1.5 sacks and a fumble recovery in the win.
- In 2018, owned the second-most tackles on the team with 87 behind MW Defensive Player of the Year Jeff Allison.
- Led all defensive linemen in the Mountain West in tackles per game in 2018, averaging 6.1 per game.



- Fresno State has one of eight defensive back duos in the nation to represent its respective team on the Thorpe watch list.
- Out of the 50 candidates named to the Biletnikoff watch list, Jared Rice was one of only four tight ends.
- Fresno State is one of 17 teams in the nation to have two individuals named to the 2019 watch list and is the only California team to have the distinction.



Building on a Championship

Fresno State had a season for the ages in 2018, recording its most wins in a single season in the 97-year history of the program by going 12-2. The 'Dogs claimed their third Mountain West conference title since joining the league in 2012 by defeating Boise State in overtime on the road and capped 2018 with their second win in as many tries against a Pac-12 opponent by defeating Arizona State in the Las Vegas Bowl. Fresno State finished ranked No. 18 in both the AP Top 25 and Coaches poll, and the 'Dogs also held a No. 21 ranking in the final College Football Playoff poll.

→ One of Fresno State's two losses in its 14 game schedule in 2018 was to Minnesota.

Preseason favorite to Win the West

The Bulldogs were picked to repeat as West Division champions by the media, the Mountain West announced on July 23. As the first-place pick for the West, Fresno State has earned its fourth division leading bid in the preseason media polls dating back to 2013, and second in as many years (2013, 2014, 2018 and 2019). The Bulldogs have won the West in every season that they have been the first-place pick in the preseason polls.

Along with a predicted first-place finish in its division, Fresno State secured three preseason all-conference selections in senior tight end Jared Rice, senior linebacker Mykal Walker and senior defensive back Juju Hughes.

Last Week

Trailing by 18 with less than 17 minutes to play, Fresno State pushed USC to the end, scoring twice in the final quarter before falling short, 31-23, on Saturday night at LA Coliseum.

In a homecoming for Los Angeles area product Jorge Reyna, the senior finished with 344 total yards, throwing for 256 and two touchdowns while adding 88 yards on the ground on 20 carries in his first start as a Bulldog. Kicker Cesar Silva accounted for nine of Fresno State's points going 3-for-3 with a long of 46 yards in his first game as a Bulldog. The defense kept Fresno State in striking distance, forcing four turnovers, and were led by four Bulldogs registering double-digit tackles in Mykal Walker (15), Chris Gaston (12), Juju Hughes (11) and Justin Rice (10).

A critical 100-yard kickoff return by 'Trojans' Velus Jones in the third quarter proved to be arguably the back-breaker in the third quarter after Fresno State pulled within four, and was quickly extended to the 18 points the 'Dogs still nearly overcame.

Always a Dog fight

→ Fresno State has suffered just five losses in its last 26 games.

→ Fresno State has not lost by double-digits since Oct. 28, 2017 - a 10-point loss to UNLV.

Worth the price of admission

Fans were treated to 3:41 of game action when Fresno State took USC down to the final minutes of Saturday's game at LA Coliseum. It was the eighth-longest game over the weekend - and two of the seven games in front of them held weather delays, and another had three overtimes.

Home Sweet Home

When opening the season at home, whether the first, second or third game of the season, Fresno State has two losses since the turn of the century ... so Fresno State fans are used to being welcomed back to college football with a W.

This week will pose a challenge though, because despite that 17-2 record since 2000, the two losses are both to Big Ten teams (Wisconsin-2008/Nebraska-2014).

Wins in that span include Cal, Oregon State, Rutgers, Cincinnati and Nevada.

Since Tedford started guiding the Bulldogs, Fresno State is 11-1 on its home field and were 6-0 in 2018. The one loss they suffered under Tedford was on Oct. 28, 2017 to UNLV.

→ Fresno State's current eight-game home winning streak ranks tied for the 13th-best streak in the FBS.

Team Captains

Seniors Jorge Reyna (QB), Juju Hughes (DB), Mykal Walker (LB) and junior Netane Muti (OL) were named the Bulldogs' 2019 team captains on Friday, Aug. 23. The captains are elected by votes from their peers.

This is the first time in Tedford's three seasons that four were named captains and not two. In the previous two seasons a duo served as the team's permanent captains throughout the season while two other individuals would be named on a game-by-game basis. It is anticipated that two of the four 2019 captains could step down on an alternating basis to allow game-by-game captains similar to 2017-18 during the 2019 season.

Run of 25-straight games allowing under 30 ends

As USC's 31-23 win halted the Bulldogs' four-game win streak that dated back to last season, the Bulldogs' nation-best streak of 25 games holding opponents to 30 points or less that dated back two seasons also came to an end.

The last time Fresno State allowed an opponent to score more than 30 points was on Sept. 16, 2017 - also to a Pac-12 opponent - Washington (L, 48-16). The next best mark entering week 1 was 14 games, shared by Mississippi State and Notre Dame.

→ In 29 career games at Fresno State, when an opponent scores more than 30 points against Tedford, the Bulldogs are 0-3.

Scouting the Minnesota Golden Gophers

Minnesota is off to a 1-0 start in 2019 after avoiding an upset to South Dakota State in its home opener on Aug. 29. The Gophers gave up a 14-point third quarter to the Jackrabbits and nearly saw their winning chances go out the window until a one-yard touchdown run would ultimately seal the game with 5:39 remaining. The win for the Golden Gophers was their 16th consecutive nonconference win, a nation-leading streak.

The Gophers were led by sophomore wide receiver Rashod Bateman who recorded five receptions for 132 yards and a touchdown in their contest against South Dakota State. This was Bateman's third-career game with over 100 receiving yards, his last being 175 yards at Illinois on Nov. 3, 2018.

Defensively, Minnesota is led by sophomore Jordan Howden who charted a career-high 12 tackles (nine solo) in the Gopher's season opener. Howden also contributed two pass breakups against the Jackrabbits.

Sophomore quarterback Tanner Morgan completed 13 of his 18 passes for 176 yards and a touchdown in the opener. The Gophers also completed a successful two-point conversion in which Morgan caught the pass from wide receiver Tyler Johnson. In 2018, Morgan shined as a redshirt freshman when called upon to replace injured Zack Annestad. He completed 58.5 percent of his passes a season ago, sitting at eighth place in single-season completion percentage in Minnesota history.

Series History vs. Minnesota

This is just the second meeting between Fresno State and Minnesota with the Golden Gophers leading the series after a 21-14 victory in Minneapolis on Sept. 8, 2018. The loss to Minnesota was just one of two that the Bulldogs would suffer in their historic 12-win season. The Bulldogs started the game down 10-0 through the first half but took advantage of a Gopher turnover and scored with 20 seconds to go in the third quarter. The Bulldogs pulled ahead in the fourth quarter, leading 14-13, before the Minnesota offense got to work to take a 21-14 lead. The 'Dogs had an opportunity to tie the game with 1:24 remaining. Fresno State pulled out some trickery to get the job done, a halfback pass from Josh Hokit to tight end Jared Rice that was there for taking, but the floating ball with too much air under it, gave the Gopher defensive back enough time to make a play and grab the interception in the end zone to erase the chances for the Bulldogs.

Fresno State vs. Big Ten

The Bulldogs are set to host their first Big Ten opponent at Bulldog Stadium since playing host to Nebraska on Sept. 13, 2014. The Bulldogs' Sept. 7th home-opening game against Minnesota is only the fourth Big Ten matchup at Bulldog Stadium. Fresno State has hosted Nebraska (2014), Illinois (2010) and Wisconsin (2008) in its history.

The Bulldogs have picked up five wins against current Big Ten programs, two against Illinois, two versus Rutgers and one against Wisconsin. Fresno State's earliest win over a Big Ten opponent came in a road game at Wisconsin on Sept. 8, 2001. The 'Dogs earned a 32-20 victory, led by future No. 1 NFL Draft pick David Carr.

Tedford vs. Big Ten opponents

While at Cal, Tedford was 7-2 in nine games against current members of the Big Ten with a 3-0 mark on the road. He dropped to 7-3 overall following last year's 2018 loss to Minnesota.

A dual threat

Jorge Reyna recorded 344 yards total offense in his starting debut. More remarkable is that the quarterback rushed for 88 yards - the most by any Bulldog quarterback since Bill Yancy danced for 142 yards on the ground on Sept. 9, 1978. Prior to Reyna's output, the most yards rushing by any Bulldog quarterback since the turn of the century was 78 yards by Kilton Anderson on Oct. 16, 2015 versus UNLV.

→ In the 40 seasons (1979-2018) since Bill Yancy rushed for 142 yards in a game, 27 of those 40 seasons, a Bulldog quarterback rushed for less than 88 yards the entire season.

1-for-1

2019 starter, quarterback Jorge Reyna is perfect against Minnesota with a 100 percent completion percentage. The senior stepped into last season's game at Minnesota late in the fourth quarter during the Bulldogs' final drive as they tried to tie the game. On the second play of the nine-play drive, Marcus McMaryion had to exit the game as trainers had to visit him after taking a big hit, Reyna stepped into the pressure situation on 1st-and-10 from the Bulldogs' own 44-yard line and fired a seven-yard completion, vs. conservatively handing it off. McMaryion would take back over on the next play.

Developing tandem?

The quarterback-wide receiver relationship between signal caller Jorge Reyna and Derrion Grim might be one to keep an eye on in 2019. Reyna's very first career throw as a Bulldog came in the 2018 season opener - a 33-yard touchdown connection - that was Reyna's sole TD throw as a junior backup QB. Now, as a senior leader of the offense, Reyna wasted no time reuniting with Grim for two more big plays in the 2019 season opener at USC. Reyna found Grim down the middle for a 34-yard TD grab in the second quarter - marking Reyna's first two career TD passes were on connections with Grim - and again in third quarter for a 52-yard heave. Grim accounted for 86 of Reyna's 256 yards passing in his first start.

A diverse crop

Fresno State began using a new wrinkle in its offensive attack in Los Angeles in true freshman Jalen Cropper. An elusive receiver, the product of nearby Parlier was utilized in the run game to allow him to use his speed and big play potential in space. Earning his first start in his first game at Fresno State, Cropper carried the ball four times for 39 yards, the most carries by Bulldog wide receiver since Da'Mari Scott had four for 25 yards on Nov. 25, 2017 against Boise State.

Just wait for it

Entering the 2019 season, Derrion Grim had caught 33 receptions with six of those going for gains of 20 or more yards which included a career-long 63-yard catch at Nevada during his first year with the Bulldogs. Through week one in 2019, the senior rose to the occasion at USC as having a penchant for big plays, catching passes of 52 and 34. The 34-yard touchdown reception came at a crucial time for the 'Dogs in the second quarter at USC when as they trailed 14-3. The other deep ball came with Fresno State deep in their own end immediately after getting an interception.

→ Grim has created one explosive play (20+ yards) for every 4.3 receptions in his career.

Uncharacteristic offense

Fresno State has committed three turnovers in back-to-back games when looking back to its bowl game and its season opener. And in 29 career games for head coach Jeff Tedford, it is just the third time overall his team has committed three or more turnovers in a game. The Bulldogs were able to overcome their mistakes the first two times, but versus the Trojans it dropped the Bulldogs to 2-1 when committing three or more turnovers in a game under Tedford.

→ The Bulldogs turned the ball over only six times from Oct. 6-Dec. 1 (9 games) until its recent stint with six turnovers in two games.



Filling big shoes

With the departure of Jeff Allison after the junior was named 2018 Mountain West Defensive Player of the Year, the Bulldogs entered the offseason with a big hole to fill in the middle of their defense. In steps 6-foot-3, 230-pound Mykal Walker. A natural fit at linebacker, the Sacramento native came to Fresno State two years ago from Azusa Pacific. In his first start at middle linebacker on Aug. 31 at USC, Walker put together a performance like his predecessor, racking up a game-high 15 tackles and finishing the game by blowing up a USC attempt on fourth-and-1 late in the fourth quarter, simultaneously tackling the quarterback and running back in the backfield. The 15 tackles was the most by a Bulldog since Allison posted 17 against Nevada on Sept. 6, 2018.

→ With three senior linebackers roaming the second level in 2018, Walker played defensive end where he led the team in tackles for loss, quarterback hurries, forced fumbles, fumble recoveries and blocked kicks.

→ Eight months after being named Defensive MVP of the 2018 Mountain West Championship game where he recorded a season-high 12 tackles to go with 2.5 TFLs and a fumble recovery, Walker was named to the watch lists for the Butkus (linebacker), Bednarik (defensive) and Nagurski (defensive) awards.

→ Mykal is following in the footsteps of his late father Michael Walker who similarly played at Fresno State in 1985-86 after redshirting as a Bulldog in 1984. His father transferred to Fresno State from College of Marin and tallied 65 tackles and 6.5 sacks at Fresno State under Jim Sweeney.

Family affair

Week one saw a unique situation for Fresno State as brothers Jared and Justin Rice both earned starts for Fresno State. Jared made his 16th consecutive start at tight end while Justin made his first start at linebacker.

With older brother Jared finding himself on a pair of national watch lists during the summer, Justin Rice stepped out of his elder's shadow on Aug. 31 at USC. In his first start as a Bulldog on the defensive side of the field, Justin produced one big play after another to keep Fresno State in the game against the Trojans. Twice in the second quarter the younger Rice ended USC threats in the red zone, the first with an interception at the goal line, and the second with a forced fumble while sacking JT Daniels.

→ Rice totaled 10 tackles and defended three passes, one of which forced the Trojans to settle for a field goal after deflecting a pass on third-and-5 at the 20-yard line.

Throw at your own risk

With only one interception last season after grabbing four in 2017, Jaron Bryant started 2019 off right with his sixth-career pick. A lockdown corner in 2018, few tested the Fort Worth native. USC backup chose Kedon Slovis chose to test him in the fourth quarter Saturday night, airing out a deep ball that was all too easy for the Bulldog senior to track down like a centerfielder.

→ The two-time All-MW honorable mention corner also picked up the first fumble recovery of his career as he stopped USC's Tyler Vaughns in his tracks which allowed Arron Mosby to come in and jar the ball loose.

Racking up the tackles

Against USC's "Air Raid" offense, the Bulldogs saw themselves being stretched from one sideline to the other. Four 'Dogs in particular consistently found themselves around the ball. Mykal Walker (15), Chris Gaston (12), Juju Hughes (11) and Justin Rice (10) accounted for 48 of the team's 82 tackles. It was the first time Fresno State has seen four players record double-digit tackles in the same game since facing Air Force on Oct. 24, 2015.

→ Walker, Gaston and Rice each set career highs in tackles while Hughes recorded 11 tackles for the third time in his career.

YAH-KO-PO becoming steady presence in the interior

Keiti Iakopo started his fifth consecutive game at defensive tackle for the Bulldogs when they traveled to USC for their home opener. Iakopo picked up his first start on Nov. 17 versus San Diego State, since that contest, Iakopo has produced 20 tackles and one TFL in that stretch. Interestingly enough, in game one of 2019, he did not record a tackle, but it was against an air raid offense that was constantly tossing the ball up field.

Finding a groove

While the markings of a good offense is the ability to wear defenses down, Fresno State once again showed in the season opener that its defense has the opposite effect on opposing offenses. After Trojan quarterback JT Daniels started the game 17-of-20 (85 percent) for 146 yards and a touchdown as USC led 17-3 minutes into the second quarter, the Bulldog defense held Daniels and backup Kedon Slovis to 126 yards through the air on 14-of-23 passing (60.9 percent) the rest of the way. During the final 42-plus minutes of the game, Fresno State held the Trojan offense to seven points.

→ Fresno State's defense had a similar impact in last season's Las Vegas Bowl against a high-powered Arizona State offense as the Sun Devils racked up 225 yards and 17 points in the opening half before being held to 68 yards and a field goal in the second half. The Bulldogs forced ASU to punt five times in seven possessions after being held to three-and-outs.

The Red Zone

The Bulldogs' offense had two very costly turnovers in the red zone in their season opener at USC. In total, the 'Dogs went 2-of-4 converting in the red zone, being one of 20 FBS teams to convert 50 percent or less of their trips into the red zone during week one. The 'Dogs have 11+ games to turn that around as in recent past, Fresno State owned the 19th-best conversion percentage (.895) in the FBS in 2018.

Defensively, the 'Dogs picked up where they left off - as a team that ranked No. 1 in the country in red zone defense (.654) in 2018 - Fresno State limited USC to going 4-of-6 (.667) on its red zone conversions. One stop was a Justin Rice interception on the goal line, the other was a forced fumble.



Something to envy

The Bulldogs surrendered a 100-yard kickoff return to USC that pushed the 'Trojans' lead to 24-13 with 8:11 left in third, just seconds after pulling within four, 17-13. Costly special teams mistakes like those are difficult for any team to recover from. For the Bulldogs, having allowed 10 kickoff returns for TDs since returning one themselves on Nov. 7, 2008, their opponents kickoff returns have helped lead teams to three one possession wins in that span.

Hail Cesar

Cesar Silva, in his Fresno State debut, went 3-for-3 kicking field goals. The last time a Bulldog kicker went 100 percent with at least three attempts was Kody Kroening on Oct. 8, 2016 vs. Nevada.

Silva also knocked in two PATs, accounting for 11 points in his first game.

→ Cesar Silva, the Bulldogs' new place kicker, was one of 14 FBS kickers in week one to attempt three or more field goals and go 100 percent converting those tries.

Assisting the defense

A Ray Guy semifinalist in 2018, Blake Cusick has made a habit of helping put his defense in favorable positions against opposing offenses. The senior started off the 2019 campaign placing one inside the 20 and another at the 20 after a booming 60-yard punt sailed over the head of a Trojan returner and was downed. Saturday was the seventh game in his career that Cusick has recorded a punt of at least 60 yards after recording three each during the previous two seasons.

Reviewing 2018 ...

- Fresno State was one of only seven FBS teams to record 12 wins in 2018 (Alabama, Clemson, Fresno State, Notre Dame, Ohio State, Oklahoma and UCF).
- The 'Dogs finished the season winning 21 of their last 25 games dating back to Sept. 30, 2017.
- Fresno State finished the season ranked in the Top 10 in the FBS in 11 statistical categories - red zone defense (1st), scoring defense (3rd), passes intercepted (4th), tackles for loss allowed (5th), 4th-down conversion percentage (5th), team passing efficiency defense (5th), sacks allowed (6th), completion percentage (6th), team passing efficiency (8th), turnover margin (9th) and punt return defense (10th).
- Fresno State faced a total of eight bowl eligible teams in 2018.
- The Bulldogs defeated two Pac-12 teams in one season for the first time since 2003 (Oregon State/UCLA) by defeating UCLA and Arizona State.
- Fresno State snapped its six-game losing skid in bowl games in 2017, with a 33-27 win over Houston at the Hawai'i Bowl, and with its 2018 Las Vegas Bowl win, the 'Dogs have now won back-to-back bowl games for the first time since winning three-straight from 2002-04.
- Ronnie Rivers was named the MVP of the Las Vegas Bowl, Rivers posted the fourth-most all-purpose yards in school history with 286 (212 rush/41 punt return/33 receiving). Rivers' 212 rushing yards marked the 21st 200-yard rushing game in program history and tied for the 14th-most rushing yards in a single game.
- Jeff Tedford was named one of eight finalists for the Eddie Robinson Coach of the Year Award.
- Jeff Tedford was named one of seven finalists for the Paul "Bear" Bryant Coach of the Year Award.
- Mykal Walker was named the MVP of the Mountain West Championship Game; Walker recorded 12 tackles, 2.5 tackles for loss, 1.5 sacks and a fumble recovery.

As the first-place pick for the West, Fresno State has earned its fourth division leading bid in the preseason media polls dating back to 2013, and second in as many years (2013, 2014, 2018 and 2019). The Bulldogs have prevailed and won the West in every season that they have been the first-place pick in the preseason polls.

Along with a predicted first-place finish in its division, Fresno State secured three preseason all-conference selections in senior tight end Jared Rice, senior linebacker Mykal Walker and senior defensive back Juju Hughes.

It was been a busy July for Fresno State's three preseason All-Mountain West selections as each of the senior Bulldogs have been named to seven watch lists for awards in their respective positions.

Rice, Walker and Hughes are continuing their successes from the 2018 season as each were named to either the All-Mountain West first or second team a season ago.

JEFF TEDFORD

HEAD COACH**3RD SEASON | FRESNO STATE (1992)**

Jeff Tedford, 57, inherited a 1-11 football program when he took over the reins of his alma mater and in two seasons all he's done as the 19th head football coach in Fresno State history is lead the program to a 22-6 record, a 2018 Mountain West Championship, two MW West division titles and two bowl wins.

In 2018, in addition to defeating Boise State on the road in overtime, 19-16, for Fresno State's first conference championship since 2013, the Bulldogs capped the season with a 31-20 triumph over Arizona State to win the Mitsubishi Motors Las Vegas Bowl. The bowl win left the Bulldogs with their first 12-win season in the 97-year history of the program. This, one season after engineering one of the greatest turnarounds in FBS history guiding the Bulldogs to a 10-4 record, an appearance in the MW title game and a Hawai'i Bowl win over Houston.

The renaissance under Tedford has led to FBS history being made as Fresno State became the first team to secure back-to-back double-digit winning seasons following a double-digit loss season.

The 2018 Bulldogs finished nationally ranked in the final rankings of the season for the first time since 2004. Fresno State finished ranked No. 18 in both the AP Top 25 and Coaches poll, announced Jan. 8, 2019. It was the best finish in the AP Top 25 in program history, besting No. 22 in 2004. The 'Dogs also held a No. 21 ranking in the final College Football Playoff poll released on Dec. 2, 2018.

Individual accolades in 2018 included Tedford being named an Eddie Robinson Award finalist and a Paul "Bear" Bryant Coach of the Year Award finalist. Fresno State sported 15 all-conference honorees in 2018, including the league's Defensive Player of the Year in linebacker Jeff Allison. In addition, 19 student-athletes were named to the Fall Academic All-Mountain West team.

With a 10-4 record in his first season, Fresno State became the third team in FBS history to turn a double-digit loss season (2016) into a double-digit win season (2017) the following year. The season included an appearance in the nation's top 25, clinching the Mountain West's West Division crown and leading the 'Dogs to their first appearance in the MW Championship game since 2014. He also guided the 'Dogs to the program's first bowl victory since 2007 with their win at the Hawai'i Bowl.

Great success brought great notoriety as Tedford was named the 2017 Mountain West Coach of the Year, was a semifinalist for the George

Munger College Coach of the Year Award presented by the Maxwell Football Club, a finalist for the Eddie Robinson Coach of the Year Award, and the AFCA Region-5 Coach of the Year.

While Tedford was honored as the league's coach of the year, the team had 16 student-athletes recognized with MW postseason honors - the most for the Bulldogs in a single-season since joining the conference in 2012. In the classroom, the 'Dogs also set a team-best number since joining the conference as they had 24 named to the Fall Academic All-Mountain West team.

Tedford, a former Bulldog quarterback and Fresno State assistant coach, returned to the Valley after holding the position of offensive consultant for the Washington Huskies - a 2016 College Football Playoff team.

Tedford assumed the role of acting head coach on Nov. 27, 2016, following the conclusion of the 2016 season as Eric Kiesau carried out interim head coaching duties for the remaining two games on the 2016 schedule following Tedford's introductory press conference. Tedford was officially hired on Nov. 10, 2016.

Tedford, who was an already proven winner on the West Coast, came to the Valley with 11 years of head coaching experience at the Division I level - having led the California Golden Bears to 82 wins from 2002-2012. He left as the school's all-time winningest coach.

Tedford's ties to the Valley and Fresno State run deep. He played quarterback at Fresno State in 1981-82 under Jim Sweeney and coached at Fresno State under Sweeney from 1987-88 and 1992-96, and under a then-first-year head coach Pat Hill in 1997.

Tedford's coaching career started at Fresno State, volunteering as an assistant for the 1987-88 seasons. From there he picked up his first full-time position as an assistant for the Calgary Stampeders of the Canadian Football League - a familiar league in which he played quarterback for six seasons after his collegiate career at Fresno State.

He returned to Fresno State in 1992 as the quarterbacks coach and served as the offensive coordinator for the Bulldogs over the ensuing five seasons.

Tedford graduated from Warren High School in Downey, California and attended Cerritos Junior College for two seasons before becoming the Bulldogs' quarterback in 1981.

He and his wife Donna have two children, Taylor and Quinn.





LOS ANGELES – Trailing by 18 with less than 17 minutes to play, Fresno State pushed USC to the end, scoring twice in the final quarter before falling short, 31-23, on Saturday night at LA Memorial Coliseum.

In a homecoming for the Los Angeles area product Jorge Reyna, the senior finished with 344 total yards, throwing for 256 and two touchdowns while adding 88 yards on the ground on 20 carries in his first start as a Bulldog. Kicker Cesar Silva accounted for nine of Fresno State's points going 3-for-3 with a long of 46 yards in his first game as a Bulldog.



The defense kept Fresno State in striking distance, forcing four turnovers, and were led by four Bulldogs registering double-digit tackles in Mykal Walker (15), Chris Gaston (12), Juju Hughes (11) and Justin Rice (10).

A critical 100-yard kick off return by Trojans' Velus Jones in the third quarter proved to be arguably the back-breaker in the third quarter after Fresno State pulled within four, and was quickly extended to the 18 points the 'Dogs still nearly overcame.

How It Happened

The Trojans opened the game by marching 81 yards down the field in 13 plays. JT Daniels capped the drive by connecting with Stephen Carr from eight yards out. After a fumble from Reyna at the Fresno State 47-yard line ended the Bulldogs' opening drive, USC doubled its lead to 14-0 five plays later with a 14-yard run up the middle from Carr with 7:45 on the clock in the quarter.

The Bulldogs got the ball moving on their next possession, driving into USC territory, but on a third-and-23, Reyna got loose in the open field but would be stopped two yards short of the marker. The effort though set up a 45-yard field goal from Silva to make it a 14-3 score line. The Trojans would regain their 14-point advantage early in the second quarter thanks to a 38-yard field goal from Chase McGrath.

Starting just inside Trojan territory, Derrion Grim would pull the Bulldogs within seven with 7:54 remaining in the quarter. Facing a third-and-10 from the 34-yard line, Reyna connected with Grim across the middle of the end zone. USC would threaten on its ensuing possession but after moving 56 yards down to the nine-yard line, Justin Rice stepped in front of Daniels' pass at the goal line to give the ball back to Fresno State.

With momentum on their side, the Bulldogs opened the second half by moving the ball inside the 10-yard line, but Reyna's second fumble of the night would halt the drive and give the ball back to the Trojans. The 'Dogs would return the favor though as Arron Mosby jarred the ball loose from Tyler Vaughns and Jaron Bryant would come up with the recovery. The turnover turned into three points as Silva's strike from 46 yards out was true to bring the score to 17-13 with 8:25 on the clock in the third quarter. USC wasted no time answering the Bulldog score with a 100-yard kickoff return touchdown from Jones.

After a Fresno State three-and-out, the Bulldogs would see its deficit quickly rise to 31-13 with just under 17 minutes left in the game as the Trojans quickly moved the ball 80 yards on six plays. Vavae Malepeai would punch the ball in from two yards for USC's final score of the night in the third quarter.

Despite a second-straight three-and-out from the Bulldog offense, a deep shot from Kedon Slovis on the next play would drift long and find the awaiting hands of Jaron Bryant. Reyna wasted little time finding Grim deep across the middle of the field for a 52-yard gain on first down. The drive would stall though at the USC 11-yard line and the 'Dogs would be forced to settle for Silva's third field goal of the night. The defense then stood tall on the Trojans' following possession forcing a three-and-out. Reyna and the offense then engineered a 12-play drive that ended with an eight-yard strike to Chris Coleman to bring the 'Dogs within eight at 31-23 with 6:53 remaining.

As USC attempted to bleed the clock, a fourth-and-1 decision arose. Electing to go for it at the Fresno State 44-yard line, Mykal Walker blew up the play and tackled Slovis in the backfield to give the 'Dogs one more chance. After a 36-yard completion to Coleman on fourth down got the Bulldogs down to the 15-yard line, Reyna's shot at the end zone on the next play would find the hands of Isaiah Pola-Mao as the Trojan safety stepped in front of Ronnie Rivers to seal the game.
