Headlines

→ An 18-game series that started by Fresno State winning the first 17, the Bulldogs and New Mexico State meet again on Saturday for the first time since Nov. 12, 2011. The two met seven straight years prior as WAC foes (2005-11).

→ The Bulldogs have scored 30 or more points in 14 of the 18 games against the Aggies.

→ The Aggies will make the trip to Fresno State on Oct. 17, 2020 to complete the home-and-home series.

→ Saturday will be NM State's third-straight matchup against a Mountain West program. The Aggies fell to San Diego State, 31-10, and most recently lost to New Mexico, 55-52.

→ Following the first three games and four weeks of the college football season, the Bulldogs will travel by air and leave the state of California for the first time this season.

→ The Bulldogs are 8-5 against teams outside the Mountain West under Jeff Tedford.

→ Fresno State has suffered just six losses in its last 28 games.

→ Jorge Reyna ranks No. 14 in the FBS in total offense, averaging 325.0 yards per game.

→ While Fresno State has allowed an alarming 3.33 sacks per game, New Mexico State ranks No. 130 in the FBS in team sacks averaging 0.25 per game.

→ Of the 11 players in the FBS who are averaging 2.0 passes defended per game, LB Justin Rice is the only player who is not a defensive back.

→ Blake Cusick was named to Ray's 8 for week four games. All three of the seniors punts fell inside the 10-yard line last time out; four of Cusick's last six punts have been inside the 10-yard line proving to be the same weapon this year as he was last year as one of 10 Ray Guy Award semifinalists.

→ Four players earned their first career starts versus Sacramento State (OL Nick Aibuedefe, TE Cam Sutton, DE Alex Cruz & DB Deshawn Ruffin).

- Fresno State is one of 17 teams in the nation to have two individuals named to the 2019 watch list and is the only California team to have the distinction.



Looking to even things up before conference play

Having lost as many games in its first two weeks in 2019 as it did in 2018, it's been a tough start for the 2018 Mountain West Champions that finished 12-2 and ranked No. 18 in both major polls last season. Fresno State's 0-2 start was the first for the program since 2014, but it was so close swinging to 1-1 or even 2-0. The 'Dogs average margin of loss in those two games was 5.5 points to USC on the road (Aug. 31) and Minnesota (Sept. 7) at home. While the Trojans are ranked in the latest AP and Coaches poll and Minnesota is receiving votes in both polls, the 'Dogs took their first positive step in the right direction by taking care of business defeating Sacramento State 34-20 to move to 1-2. Fresno State will aim to move to .500 with a win versus New Mexico State in its final nonconference game of 2019 before entering Mountain West action on Oct. 12 at Air Force.

→ Under Tedford, Fresno State has never finished under .500 with its regular season nonconference schedule. The Bulldogs compiled a 2-2 (.500) nonconference record in 2017 and a 3-1 (.750) nonconference record in 2018.

→ Adding in postseason games, Tedford is 8-5 at Fresno State against teams outside the Mountain West owning a 2-0 record in bowl games.

Favorite to Win the West

The Bulldogs were picked in the preseason to repeat as West Division champions of the Mountain West, and despite the 1-2 nonconference record, the team's annual goal of winning the Mountain West and winning a bowl game, is still in front of them having not started Mountain West play yet. In the West Division, San Diego State is the only MW team to have played a league game, losing to Utah State (23-17) last week. In the West this week, UNLV opens MW play at Wyoming while Hawaii travels to Nevada to kick off conference action.

As the first-place pick for the West, Fresno State earned its fourth division leading bid in the preseason media polls dating back to 2013, and second in as many years (2013, 2014, 2018 and 2019). The Bulldogs went on to win the West each season that they were the first-place pick in the preseason polls.

Along with a predicted first-place finish in its division, Fresno State secured three preseason all-conference selections in senior tight end Jared Rice, senior linebacker Mykal Walker and senior defensive back Juju Hughes.

Team Captains

Seniors Jorge Reyna (QB), Juju Hughes (DB), Mykal Walker (LB) and junior Netane Muti (OL) were named the Bulldogs' 2019 team captains on Friday, Aug. 23. The captains are elected by votes from their peers.

This is the first time in Tedford's three seasons that four were named captains and not two. In the previous two seasons a duo served as the team's permanent captains throughout the season while two other individuals would be named on a game-by-game basis. It was anticipated that two of the four 2019 captains could step down on an alternating basis to allow game-by-game captains similar to 2017-18 during the 2019 season, but that has not happened yet.

Always a Dog fight

→ Fresno State has suffered just six losses in its last 28 games.

→ Fresno State has not lost by double-digits since Oct. 28, 2017 - a 10-point loss to UNLV.

Mixing in the new with the old

→ There are 16 players in 2019 who have earned their first career starts. Last time out, four Bulldogs picked up their first starts versus Sacramento State ... in the season opener, nine Bulldogs saw their first start, which included two true freshman.

→ A total of 17 players have seen the field for the first time as Bulldogs this season. There were 12 players that made their debut in the season opener at USC on Aug. 31 - a week later, three more were added to that list in the home opener versus Minnesota on Sept. 7 in WR Erik Brooks, DE Alex Dumais and TE Jared Torres - and that number grew to 17 with the additions of DB Randy Jordan and OL Tyrone Sampson playing on Sept. 21.

→ Four true freshman have made starts for Fresno State in 2019; six true freshman have played in 2019.

→ In 2018, the Bulldogs played one true freshman more than the four games allotted to hold on to a redshirt season - now sophomore Isaiah Johnson.

Keep Away

One way to defeat your opponent is to simply keep the opposition's offense off the field. The Bulldogs held possession for 37:46 on Sept. 21 en route to their victory versus Sacramento State. It was the sixth time since 2011 the Bulldogs held possession for 37-plus minutes in a game.

→ First scoring drive sets the tone: the 'Dogs ate up 5:57 off the clock with a 93-yard TD drive for its first points against Sacramento State. It was the longest drive this season for the 'Dogs.

Series History vs. New Mexico State

A series that started by Fresno State winning the first 17 games, the two schools will meet for the first time since New Mexico State claimed their first program win over the Bulldogs on Nov. 12, 2011. It was a 48-45 win for the Aggies in Las Cruces.

The long history between the Aggies and Bulldogs dates back to 1972 and have previously shared conference affiliation, most recently both playing against each other as WAC opponents from 2005-11.

This will be the 11th time Fresno State will visit New Mexico State in the series' history and own a 9-1 record in Las Cruces. The Aggies will play at Fresno State in 2020 on Oct. 17.

→ The Bulldogs have scored 30 or more points in 14 of the 18 games against the Aggies.

Scouting the New Mexico State Aggies

New Mexico State is off to a 0-4 start to its season.

After suffering a season-opening 58-7 loss at No. 23 Washington State, the Aggies were downed again at No. 2 Alabama in week two, 62-10. Since facing two ranked opponents in the first two weeks of the season, New Mexico State has turned its focus to the Mountain West - hosting San Diego State (Sept. 14) and facing the New Mexico Lobos on the road last week. The in-state rivalry with the Lobos was a high-scoring affair with the Aggies falling, 55-52.

Sophomore quarterback, and 2019 Wuerffel watch list selection, Josh Adkins has passed for 1,000 yards on 103 completions this season. The run game for the Aggie quarterback is dismal as he has 40 carries for -14 yards on the season. His only positive rushing yard game of the season was at New Mexico where he recorded 32 yards.

A familiar offensive force for the Aggies is senior running back and 2018 fourth-team All-American, Jason Huntley. Huntley has recorded 32 carries for 218 yards this season. He broke out against the Lobos with 12 carries, 114 rushing yards and his first rushing touchdown of the season while adding 14 receiving yards and an additional touchdown in the same outing. Huntley also had two kick returns for 98 yards and a long of 71 on the night.

Defensively, New Mexico State is led by redshirt senior linebacker Javahn Ferguson who has 35 total stops on the season. In the last two games, Ferguson has tackled in double-digits with 15 against San Diego State and 13 versus UNM. The veteran linebacker was named to the Senior Bowl watch list prior to the 2019 season.

Revisiting last time vs. New Mexico State (2011)

With 1:50 left in the game, New Mexico State quarterback Matt Christian hit Taveon Rogers on a 37-yard touchdown pass to lift NM State past Fresno State, 48-45, on Nov. 12, 2011 at Aggie Memorial Stadium for its first-ever win against Fresno State in its 18th try.

The game was a battle between the two offensive units as Fresno State gained 495 yards while the Aggies finished with 500. Bulldog tailback Robbie Rouse gave Fresno State a 51-45 lead with a two-yard touchdown run with 8:05 left in the fourth quarter. The Bulldog defense stopped the Aggies on their ensuing possession, but was unable to pick up a first down to wind the clock down when they got the ball. New Mexico State got the ball back on its own 44-yard line with 3:04 to play. It only took four plays for Christian to get the Aggies into the end zone, as Rogers caught a jump ball on a corner route, broke a tackle and walked in for the winning score.

This guy can do it all

Josh Hokit opted out of a scholarship to wrestle at Drake and walked on to the Fresno State football team as a linebacker at his first fall camp as a freshman in 2016. He ended up playing as a true freshman at linebacker as well as at fullback, running back and on special teams. His role as a running back went full-time after a Nov. 19, 2016 game against Hawai'i where he exploded for 97 yards on 18 carries. A week later he got his first start at running back. Fast forward to 2019 spring football, and Hokit returned back to linebacker midway through the team's 15 practices, because he missed the first half due to being at the NCAA wrestling national championships, earning all-american status by placing fifth in the 197 lb. division. He repped at linebacker for the remainder of spring football and the first 13 practices of fall camp in 2019 before a rash of injuries ultimately turned the team-first player back to running back overnight for practice No. 14.

→ After seeing just one rush (for zero yards) and one successful two-point conversion carry through the first two games, the do-it-all athlete was given the keys and took over in the Bulldogs' third game - accounting for three of the team's five touchdowns in Saturday's game.

- Hokit had his first career game with a rushing TD (2) and a receiving TD (1).
- Hokit scored his first career receiving touchdown.

Welcome to the show Keric

The Bulldogs' junior college transfer wide out Keric Wheatfall, from Blinn College in Texas, was anticipated to be an immediate contributor, so much so that he earned a starting spot on the week one depth chart entering Fresno State's first game at USC. Wheatfall was even pegged No. 1 on the depth chart for kick returns. In the opener, Wheatfall logged a 35-yard return, but he also suffered an ankle injury on the play. Wheatfall was ruled out for game two and used the following bye week to be ready for Fresno State's last contest, versus Sacramento State. Wheatfall was the contributor the Bulldogs' believed in as he recorded his first three career catches - all 20-plus yard chunk plays - of 23, 29 and 46 yards.

The 23 and 46 yard catches came on the same 5-play, 84 yard drive in the second quarter that resulted in a touchdown, while the 29-yard catch was an electric 3rd-and-24 conversion that gained a first down at the Sacramento State 2-yard line - the ensuing play was a 2-yard Hokit TD run.

Once a decade tight end

Tight end Jared Rice has arguably been the most productive Fresno State tight end since Bear Pascoe (2005-08), who made himself a seven-year NFL career. Rice, a senior this season, broke Pascoe's single season best marks of receptions and receiving yards by a tight end as a junior - now he closing in on career records set by Pascoe and Marty Thompson.

→ Bear Pascoe owns the records for career receptions (112) and receiving yards (1,294), respectively, by a tight end.

→ Marty Thompson, brother of current Bulldogs' tight end coach Scott Thompson, owns the most single season touchdowns (8) - set in 1991 - and career touchdowns (11) by a tight end in program history.

Among his MW counterparts, Cole McDonald (Hawaii) ranks first and Jordan Love (Utah State) ranks second, but McDonald is the only QB that shares two or more Power 5 opponents faced.

win at Bulldog Stadium for two narrow defeats against two Power 5 opponents that are a combined 6-1 entering week five ... in game three, Reyna did not throw an interception and led the Bulldogs for his first career FBS win. Reyna is completing 61.7 percent of his throws and averaging the fourth-most passing yards per game in the MW with 290.0. He picked up his first career 300-yard game last time out throwing for 326 yards.

Work in progress

The Bulldogs' offensive line has been a dominant one over the past two seasons, having allowed just 22 sacks over those 28 games. In 2018 alone, 97 of the 129 FBS programs allowed 22 sacks or more. At a clip of 0.86 sacks allowed per game in 2018 by the Bulldogs, it ranked sixth-best in the FBS.

But that was then, and this is now. Three games into 2019, Reyna has been sacked 10 times. The Bulldogs uncharacteristically rank 114th in the FBS allowing 3.33 sacks per game.

→ The Bulldogs entered 2018 with a combined 32 career starts, with 27 owned between Netane Muti and Syrus Tuitiele.

→ The Bulldogs next opponent, New Mexico State, ranks last (No. 130) in the FBS in team sacks per game (0.25) as they have posted one sack in four games.

The Golden Leg

Fresno State senior punter Blake Cusick has been a major force in the field position battle this season. Cusick has continued to do what he does best - landing the ball inside the 10 yard line.

The senior is coming off a game with three punts, all inside the 10, and one that was 49-yards and downed at the Sacramento State 1-yard line late in the third quarter. Cusick played a key role in the Bulldogs' 34-20 home victory over Sacramento State by setting up the Hornet offense deep in their own territory, and letting the Bulldog defense get their job done with the pressure of an endzone close behind them. Sacramento State did not score on any drive directly following one of Cusick's punts last week.

Cusick is the 26th ranked punter in the FBS with 496 punt yards, averaging 45.10 yards a punt in his 11 on the season. He is ranked third in the Mountain West punting corps.

Popping the ball free

Forcing fumbles is an art. It hasn't always been a trait of Bulldog football teams but through three games this season the Bulldogs have forced eight, recovering six of those which ranks fifth nationally. Surprisingly, all six recoveries have come from a different Bulldog.

→ Fresno State and South Florida are the only two teams in the top five in fumbles recovered who have played less than four games. The Bulldogs rank second in recoveries per game (2.0) behind the Bulls (2.3).

→ Already more than halfway to double figure fumble recoveries with at least nine games remaining in the season, a mark that only five Bulldog teams have achieved since 2010.

→ The six recoveries has surpassed the season totals from 2010, 2011 and 2016 and is one shy of 2018.

Forcing turnovers under Tedford

After finishing tied for 11th a season ago in turnovers gained, the Bulldogs have continued where last season left off as they currently sit tied for 19th with eight total takeaways.

→ With eight turnovers through three games, the Bulldogs ranked tied for sixth in the FBS in turnovers gained per game with 2.67.

Going against conventional thought

While a barometer for Fresno State in the win/loss column under Jeff Tedford has been through the team's turnover margin, that hasn't proved to be the case during the Bulldog's last six games. Since losing the battle on Nov. 24, 2018, yet winning the game against San Jose State, the Bulldogs have won their last four games when losing the turnover battle.

→ Fresno State is 12-4 when winning the turnover game while going 4-4 when losing it under Tedford.

→ Dating back to Nov. 9, 2018, Fresno State has lost its last three games when winning the turnover battle. Each game has been lost by eight points or less.



Replacing the MW's best

With the departure of Jeff Allison after the junior was named 2018 Mountain West Defensive Player of the Year, the Bulldogs entered the offseason with a big hole to fill in the middle of their defense. In stepped 6-foot-3, 230-pound Mykal Walker and the senior hasn't disappointed. With a team-leading 29 tackles through three games, Walker ranks 29th in the FBS and fifth in the MW in tackles per game with 9.7.

→ Walker picked up his second career fumble recovery against Sacramento State.

→ Playing defensive end in 2018, Walker led the team in tackles for loss, quarterback hurries, forced fumbles, fumble recoveries and blocked kicks and was second in tackles, sacks and defensive touchdowns.

→ Eight months after being named Defensive MVP of the 2018 Mountain West Championship game where he recorded a season-high 12 tackles to go with 2.5 TFLs and a fumble recovery, Walker was named to the watch lists for the Butkus (linebacker), Bednarik (defensive) and Nagurski (defensive) awards.

→ Mykal is following in the footsteps of his late father Michael Walker who similarly played at Fresno State in 1985-86 after redshirting as a Bulldog in 1984. His father transferred to Fresno State from College of Marin and tallied 65 tackles and 6.5 sacks at Fresno State under Jim Sweeney.

A defensive wrecking ball

With older brother Jared finding himself on a pair of national watch lists during the summer, Justin Rice has stepped out of his elder's shadow through three games this season. In three starts, Rice has been a disruptive force for the Bulldogs' defense, causing 1.3 turnovers per game while also defending 2.0 passes per game.

→ Rice is the only player to rank in the top five in the FBS in both turnovers caused and passes defended.

→ Rice is one of five players in the nation to have caused at least four turnovers. Rice though has played in just three games, averaging a FBS-best 1.3 caused turnovers per game.

→ Rice is one of five players in the FBS to have forced three fumbles while his 1.3 per game ranks tied for No. 1 with Appalachian State's Demetrius Taylor.

→ Of the 11 players in the FBS who are averaging 2.0 passes defended per game, Rice is the only player who is not a defensive back.

Atkins leading the line

With the defensive line being one of the most experienced position groups for the Bulldogs entering the season, Kevin Atkins has stepped up as an early leader. As the most of experienced defensive lineman (30 games), the junior leads Fresno State with three sacks and four tackles for loss. The 1.0 sacks per game ranks tied for 19th in the FBS.

→ Atkins ranks third in the MW in sacks per game behind Boise State's Curtis Weaver (1.50) and Wyoming's Solomon Byrd (1.17).

→ Against Sacramento State, the junior earned his first career block, stopping a PAT attempt. It was the first for the Bulldogs' since Matt Boateng blocked a PAT in the 2018 MW Championship game.

Returning to normal

After facing two Power 5 opponents during its first two games, Fresno State's rushing defense wasn't stacking up with those of the previous two seasons, allowing 161 yards per game, that average dropped dramatically after facing Sacramento State. Holding the Hornets to just 12 yards on 17 carries, the Bulldogs' dropped their allowed average to 111 yards per game which ranks fourth in the Mountain West.

→ The Bulldogs have held an opponent under 50 yards rushing three times since 2016. They allowed 49 yards to Hawaii in 2016, -30 yards to Incarnate Word in 2017 and 12 yards to Sacramento State in 2019.

Growing pains

While Fresno State's pass defense has been one of the best nationally during the past two seasons, departures have forced the Bulldogs to go through some growing pains early in the 2019 season. While seniors Juju Hughes and Jaron Bryant have been stalwarts on the secondary, the other spots have gone through some changes. The early departure of Mike Bell saw sophomore Wylan Free move into the vacant free safety spot, a spot he has started all three games in while ranking third on the team in tackles with 20. The other spot, vacated by the graduation of Tank Kelly has seen three corners. Sophomore Chris Gaston started the first two games but an injury against Minnesota saw true freshman Deshawn Ruffin slide in. Ruffin was then injured against Sacramento State which moved another true freshman, Randy Jordan, into the spot. True freshman Evan Williams has also seen time in the defensive backfield at safety and as a nickel corner.

→ Fresno State has allowed 246.3 yards per game through three games this year, the most since the 2014 season.

Family affair

The Bulldogs have a unique situation on their hands as brothers Jared and Justin Rice have both earned starts for Fresno State over the last three games. Jared has made 18 consecutive starts at tight end while Justin has made his first three starts at linebacker.

Justin Rice has actually started in three games in his career, as his first came in 2016 at running back as a true freshman. His brother Jared did not play in that game.

→ Across the FBS, the same can be said for just 11 other institutions that sported brothers in their week one starting lineups.

2019 PRESEASON MOUNTAIN WEST FOOTBALL ALL-CONFERENCE AND AWARDS



The Fresno State football team has been picked to repeat as West Division champions by the media, the Mountain West announced on July 23 prior to kicking off the 2019 football Media Days in Las Vegas.

As the first-place pick for the West, Fresno State has earned its fourth division leading bid in the preseason media polls dating back to 2013, and second in as many years (2013, 2014, 2018 and 2019). The Bulldogs have prevailed and won the West in every season that they have been the first-place pick in the preseason polls.

Along with a predicted first-place finish in its division, Fresno State secured three preseason all-conference selections in senior tight end Jared Rice, senior linebacker Mykal Walker and senior defensive back Juju Hughes.

It was been a busy July for Fresno State's three preseason All-Mountain West selections as each of the senior Bulldogs have been named to seven watch lists for awards in their respective positions.

Rice, Walker and Hughes are continuing their successes from the 2018 season as each were named to either the All-Mountain West first or second team a season ago.

JEFF TEDFORD

HEAD COACH**3RD SEASON | FRESNO STATE (1992)**

Jeff Tedford, 57, inherited a 1-11 football program when he took over the reins of his alma mater and in two seasons all he's done as the 19th head football coach in Fresno State history is lead the program to a 22-6 record, a 2018 Mountain West Championship, two MW West division titles and two bowl wins.

In 2018, in addition to defeating Boise State on the road in overtime, 19-16, for Fresno State's first conference championship since 2013, the Bulldogs capped the season with a 31-20 triumph over Arizona State to win the Mitsubishi Motors Las Vegas Bowl. The bowl win left the Bulldogs with their first 12-win season in the 97-year history of the program. This, one season after engineering one of the greatest turnarounds in FBS history guiding the Bulldogs to a 10-4 record, an appearance in the MW title game and a Hawai'i Bowl win over Houston.

The renaissance under Tedford has led to FBS history being made as Fresno State became the first team to secure back-to-back double-digit winning seasons following a double-digit loss season.

The 2018 Bulldogs finished nationally ranked in the final rankings of the season for the first time since 2004. Fresno State finished ranked No. 18 in both the AP Top 25 and Coaches poll, announced Jan. 8, 2019. It was the best finish in the AP Top 25 in program history, besting No. 22 in 2004. The 'Dogs also held a No. 21 ranking in the final College Football Playoff poll released on Dec. 2, 2018.

Individual accolades in 2018 included Tedford being named an Eddie Robinson Award finalist and a Paul "Bear" Bryant Coach of the Year Award finalist. Fresno State sported 15 all-conference honorees in 2018, including the league's Defensive Player of the Year in linebacker Jeff Allison. In addition, 19 student-athletes were named to the Fall Academic All-Mountain West team.

With a 10-4 record in his first season, Fresno State became the third team in FBS history to turn a double-digit loss season (2016) into a double-digit win season (2017) the following year. The season included an appearance in the nation's top 25, clinching the Mountain West's West Division crown and leading the 'Dogs to their first appearance in the MW Championship game since 2014. He also guided the 'Dogs to the program's first bowl victory since 2007 with their win at the Hawai'i Bowl.

Great success brought great notoriety as Tedford was named the 2017 Mountain West Coach of the Year, was a semifinalist for the George

Munger College Coach of the Year Award presented by the Maxwell Football Club, a finalist for the Eddie Robinson Coach of the Year Award, and the AFCA Region-5 Coach of the Year.

While Tedford was honored as the league's coach of the year, the team had 16 student-athletes recognized with MW postseason honors - the most for the Bulldogs in a single-season since joining the conference in 2012. In the classroom, the 'Dogs also set a team-best number since joining the conference as they had 24 named to the Fall Academic All-Mountain West team.

Tedford, a former Bulldog quarterback and Fresno State assistant coach, returned to the Valley after holding the position of offensive consultant for the Washington Huskies - a 2016 College Football Playoff team.

Tedford assumed the role of acting head coach on Nov. 27, 2016, following the conclusion of the 2016 season as Eric Kiesau carried out interim head coaching duties for the remaining two games on the 2016 schedule following Tedford's introductory press conference. Tedford was officially hired on Nov. 10, 2016.

Tedford, who was an already proven winner on the West Coast, came to the Valley with 11 years of head coaching experience at the Division I level - having led the California Golden Bears to 82 wins from 2002-2012. He left as the school's all-time winningest coach.

Tedford's ties to the Valley and Fresno State run deep. He played quarterback at Fresno State in 1981-82 under Jim Sweeney and coached at Fresno State under Sweeney from 1987-88 and 1992-96, and under a then-first-year head coach Pat Hill in 1997.

Tedford's coaching career started at Fresno State, volunteering as an assistant for the 1987-88 seasons. From there he picked up his first full-time position as an assistant for the Calgary Stampeders of the Canadian Football League - a familiar league in which he played quarterback for six seasons after his collegiate career at Fresno State.

He returned to Fresno State in 1992 as the quarterbacks coach and served as the offensive coordinator for the Bulldogs over the ensuing five seasons.

Tedford graduated from Warren High School in Downey, California and attended Cerritos Junior College for two seasons before becoming the Bulldogs' quarterback in 1981.

He and his wife Donna have two children, Taylor and Quinn.

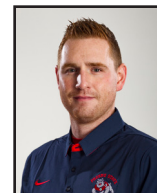

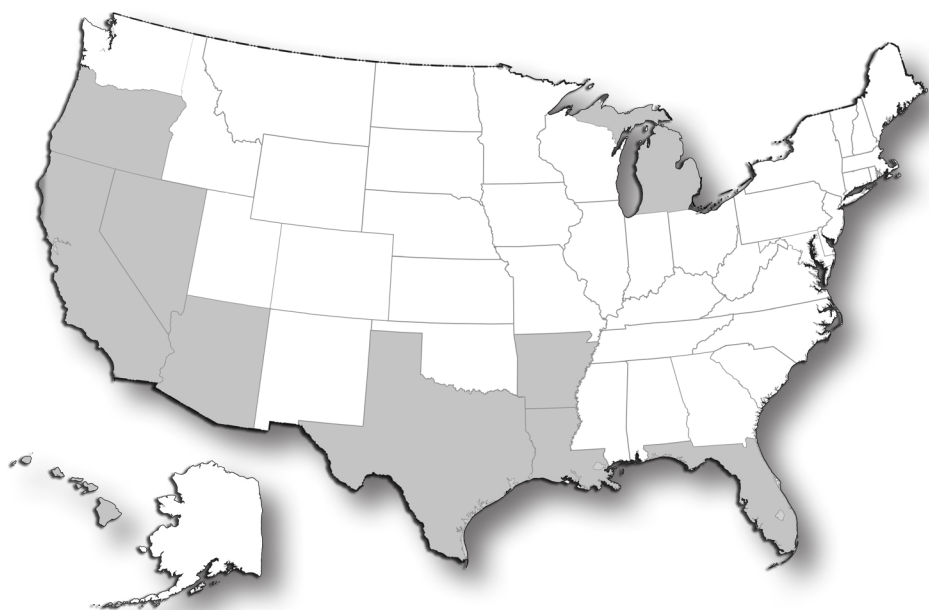

LOS ANGELES – Trailing by 18 with less than 17 minutes to play, Fresno State pushed USC to the end, scoring twice in the final quarter before falling short, 31-23, on Saturday night at LA Memorial Coliseum.

In a homecoming for the Los Angeles area product Jorge Reyna, the senior finished with 344 total yards, throwing for 256 and two touchdowns while adding 88 yards on the ground on 20 carries in his first start as a Bulldog. Kicker Cesar Silva accounted for nine of Fresno State's points going 3-for-3 with a long of 46 yards in his first game as a Bulldog.



The defense kept Fresno State in striking distance, forcing four turnovers, and were led by four Bulldogs registering double-digit tackles in Mykal Walker (15), Chris Gaston (12), Juju Hughes (11) and Justin Rice (10).

A critical 100-yard kick off return by Trojans' Velus Jones in the third quarter proved to be arguably the back-breaker in the third quarter after Fresno State pulled within four, and was quickly extended to the 18 points the 'Dogs still nearly overcame.

Notable

- Jorge Reyna rushed for 88 yards. It was the most rushing yards by a Bulldog quarterback since the turn of the century.
- Cesar Silva, in his Fresno State debut, went 3-for-3 kicking field goals. The last time a Bulldog kicker went 100 percent with at least three attempts was Kody Kroening on Oct. 8, 2016 vs. Nevada.
- Saturday's game was the third game under Jeff Tedford that the Bulldogs surrendered more than 30 points, and it broke a nation-best streak of 25 games that dated back to Sept. 16, 2017.
- In the second quarter, Jorge Reyna tossed his first touchdown of the season and second touchdown pass of his career – a 34-yard TD to Derrion Grim – his first two career TD throws went to Grim.
- Justin Rice, once a starter at running back, recorded his first career interception in the second quarter.
- Fresno State had four players record double-digit tackles: Mykal Walker (15), Chris Gaston (12), Juju Hughes (11) and Justin Rice (10). All four either matched or set career highs. The last time four players had double-digit tackles was against Air Force on Oct. 28, 2016.
- USC tallied 163 yards in the first quarter. The Bulldogs' defense did not allow more than 152 in an opening quarter in 2018 (Hawaii).
- Reyna tossed his second TD pass of the game in the fourth quarter, an 8-yard strike to Chris Coleman for Coleman's first career touchdown.
- USC had 18 first downs in the first half, and were limited to seven in the second half.
- Fresno State forced four turnovers, the most since forcing four on Sept. 15, 2018 at UCLA.
- Fresno State forced two fumbles, the most since forcing two on Sept. 15, 2018 at UCLA.

FRESNO, Calif. – Fresno State battled to the bitter end with Big Ten foe Minnesota in its home opener, falling in double overtime 38-35 in front of 34,790 Saturday night at Bulldog Stadium.



Trailing by three points after holding the Gophers to a field goal in the second overtime period, the Bulldogs aired it out on the first play from scrimmage with its next possession, only to be intercepted in the end zone to silence the home crowd to drop Fresno State to 0-2 for the first time since 2014.

In his first start at home, Jorge Reyna went 24-of-35 passing, throwing for 288 yards, along with three touchdowns and two interceptions, the latter being the costly one that sealed the game for the Gophers. Junior running back Ronnie Rivers produced 124 total yards offense (76 rushing/48 receiving) and a career-high two receiving touchdowns.

The defense won the turnover battle for the second consecutive week, forcing three turnovers. Justin Rice led the Bulldogs with 11 tackles, two forced fumbles and one fumble recovery.

Fresno State had the opportunity to close the game out with 46 seconds left on the clock, up by a touchdown, but Minnesota converted a pivotal fourth-and-13 scoring the game-tying touchdown to send the contest into overtime.

Notable

- Saturday's loss snapped an eight-game home winning streak.
- Fresno State has suffered just six losses in its last 27 games. The Bulldogs have not lost by double-digits since Oct. 28, 2017 – a 10 point loss to UNLV.
- The Bulldogs played in their second overtime game in the last four contests they've played in dating back to 2018. The last overtime game Fresno State participated in was a 19-16 single overtime win to defeat Boise State in the Mountain West championship game.
- Saturday's game was the Bulldogs' seventh multi-period overtime game played in, in program history.
- Fresno State dropped to 8-11 in overtime games in program history. Fresno State's last overtime game at
- Bulldog Stadium was also a double overtime contest, a 48-41 loss to Tulsa on Sept. 24, 2016.
- Fresno State owned a 21-14 lead after the third quarter. Tedford dropped to 20-3 in games with a lead after three quarters.
- Fresno States' defense forced three turnovers, all forced fumbles. The last time Fresno State recovered three fumbles in one game was on Nov. 22, 2014 at Nevada.

FRESNO, Calif. – A pair of fourth-quarter touchdowns on Saturday night lifted Fresno State to a 34-20 win over Sacramento State at Bulldog Stadium for win No. 1 of 2019 in front of more than 30,000 fans. Senior running back Josh Hokit was key in the Bulldogs' late surge, totaling nine carries for 65 yards and a touchdown during the Bulldogs' final two possessions.



Fresno State totaled a season-high 471 yards of offense with 326 yards passing and 145 yards on the ground. Defensively, the 'Dogs held Sacramento State to 245 yards of offense with only 12 yards coming on the ground. The Bulldogs held a 30-14 advantage in first downs and were able to control the ball with nearly 38 minutes of possession on offense.

Leading the way for the Bulldogs through the air was senior quarterback Jorge Reyna who passed for a career-high 326 yards on 28-of-41 passing while throwing two touchdown passes. Hokit led the way on the ground with 12 carries for 72 yards and two rushing scores while adding three receptions for 22 yards and a touchdown. Sophomore wide receiver Zane Pope tallied career-highs in receptions (6) and receiving yards (72) while junior wideout Keric Wheatfall went for a season-best 98 yards on three receptions.

Senior cornerback Jaron Bryant led the Bulldogs in tackles with eight, including six solo, and one tackle for loss along with one pass breakup. Junior linebacker Justin Rice added six stops, five solo, one tackle for loss and three pass breakups.

Notable

- Hokit accounted for three of the Bulldogs' five touchdowns in Saturday's game.
- Hokit had his first career game with a rushing TD (2) and a receiving TD (1).
- Hokit scored his ninth and 10th career rushing touchdowns.
- The Bulldogs improve to 12-2 at home in the Tedford era.
- The Bulldogs all-time series lead against Sacramento State increased to 4-0, following the win. But it was the first time in the series the Bulldogs allowed more than seven points in a game.
- Reyna connected with Grim, 7-yard TD, to put the 'Dogs on top 27-20 (6:41). It was Grim's second receiving score of the season and fifth career.
- Rivers registered a 6-yard TD in the second quarter, his first of the 2019 season and 16th career rushing score.
- Pope topped his career best total in receiving yards in the second quarter (5 rec., 70 yards) while also matching his career best in receptions. He finished with six receptions for 72 yards.
- Cusick placed all three of his punts inside the 10-yard line, including one on the 1-yard line.
- Against the odds – Fresno State won the turnover battle and lost games against USC and Minnesota, but lost the turnover battle to Sacramento State and won the game (2-1).
- Fresno State allowed 12 rushing yards. The Bulldogs have held an opponent under 50 yards rushing three times since 2016. They allowed 49 yards to Hawaii in 2016, -30 yards to Incarnate Word in 2017 and 12 yards to Sacramento State in 2019.
- This was the ninth time in the Tedford era an opponent was held to less than 100 yards rushing.
