Headlines

→ The long-awaited head coaching debut of Kalen DeBoer is set for Saturday. DeBoer brings a 67-3 head coaching record to Fresno State from Sioux Falls, and he's no stranger to the Valley, serving as the OC under Jeff Tedford during a 22-6 run from 2017-18.

→ Saturday's meeting will pit two of the six first-year head coaches in the Mountain West against one another.

→ When Saturday comes and Fresno State suits up for Hawai'i, it will have been 329 days since the Bulldogs last played a game - at San Jose State (Nov. 30, 2019). It will be the longest stretch without football for Fresno State since World War II.

→ Fresno State will meet for the 53rd time on Saturday. The Bulldogs lead the all-time series (29-22-1) against Hawai'i and have won eight of the last nine meetings - including a 41-38 thriller on the Island a year ago.

→ The Bulldogs have only squared off versus two other teams more times than the Rainbow Warriors (San Jose State-83 & San Diego State-59).

→ The Bulldogs named junior Jake Haener QB1 on Oct. 19, five days before the season opener. The Washington transfer beat out redshirt sophomore Ben Wooldridge in a tightly contested battle during fall camp.

→ Haener will have a plethora of options to throw to this season as the 'Dogs returned seven letter-winning wide receivers from a season ago, and did not lose a starter to graduation.

→ For the first time since 2007, the Bulldogs will enter a season without its top three tacklers from the previous season (Rice - 112, Walker - 96, Hughes - 80).

→ Saturday is Fresno State's homecoming, albeit held through a virtual experience throughout the week leading to game day.

Series History

Fresno State will face Hawai'i for the 53rd time on Saturday. The Bulldogs lead the all-time series (29-22-1) and have won eight of their last nine meetings against Hawai'i - dating back to Nov. 19, 2011. That lone loss was a 14-13 heartbreaker at Bulldog Stadium on Nov. 19, 2016.

Fresno State is 15-8-1 against Hawai'i at Bulldog Stadium. The last time UH visited the Valley (Oct. 27, 2018), Fresno State dominated with a 50-20 homecoming victory. It was a solid team win with all three phases of the game coming together for the Bulldogs.

Both programs have been in the same conference since 1992, since Fresno State joined the WAC, and they have played each other every year since. The 'Dogs own a 15-12 advantage during that time period, and it's in large part to its 6-1 mark against UH since both schools joined the MW in 2012. The inaugural game was in 1938, a 15-13 Fresno State victory.

→ The Bulldogs have only squared off versus two other teams more times than the Rainbow Warriors (San Jose State-83 & San Diego State-59).

Last time vs. Hawai'i

The 2019 matchup between Hawai'i and Fresno State saw several momentum changes, but the Bulldogs earned the win on the Island in walk-off fashion as Cesar Silva kicked a 37-yard field goal as time expired to give the 'Dogs a 41-38 win.

Fresno State struck first in the opening quarter, but Hawai'i answered back with 24 points in the second to take a 24-14 lead at the half. It did not take long for the 'Dogs to chip away at the Hawai'i lead, scoring on their opening drive of the second half to cut the deficit to three. Silva tied the game at 24 each with a 22-yard field goal with 4:19 left in the third. Ronnie Rivers would then cap a 6-play, 62-yard drive to put Fresno State on top 31-24 right before the third quarter expired. At the start of the fourth quarter, then-freshman defensive back Evan Williams intercepted a pass by Cole McDonald and the Bulldogs capitalized with the field position at midfield to go in front, 38-24.

Hawai'i brought in QB Chevan Cordeiro who led UH to two touchdowns to tie the game at 38 in under three minutes time thanks in part to successfully recovering an onside kick. With 1:08 to work with, the Bulldogs made their way down the field for a game-winning field goal.

Williams was named the MW Defensive Player of the Week for his efforts at Hawai'i. The true freshman had nine tackles and an interception in his first career start.

Scouting Hawai'i

Hawai'i is led by an entirely new coaching staff under first-year head coach Todd Graham. Graham was hired on Jan. 21, and finalized his coaching staff in February.

UH is coming off of its first-ever West Division title, and Mountain West championship game appearance. Hawai'i lost to Boise State in the 2019 championship game. Despite capturing the West Division title and a 10-5 (5-3 MW) record a season ago, Hawai'i was picked to finish third in the preseason poll. It had one preseason All-MW selection in offensive lineman Ilm Manning.

The Rainbow Warrior offense is taking a hit after two-year starting quarterback Cole McDonald was drafted by the Tennessee Titans in the 2020 NFL Draft. Hawai'i has since named redshirt sophomore Chevan Cordeiro as its starting quarterback. Cordeiro saw the field in 12 games last season and made starts three times. Hawai'i won each of the three games Cordeiro started - San Jose State, UNLV and Army.

The Hawai'i defense is a different scheme this season than last, but with a heavy group of returners in each position, the game knowledge is creating an advantage for what is expected to be a fast and powerful defense. A key game changer for the Warriors is the return of middle linebacker Penei Pavihi. The junior was out with an injury in the 2019 season, but showed promising potential with 87 total tackles as a sophomore in 2018.



The DeBoer era begins

The long-awaited debut of head coach Kalen DeBoer is over as the former Fresno State offensive coordinator (2017-18) returns to Fresno State after one season as the offensive coordinator at Indiana (2019). DeBoer is the 20th head coach in program history, and the return to Fresno kept the continuity and foundation that was built by former head coach Jeff Tedford. While DeBoer ushered in six new assistant coaches, who all have strong ties to his corner, four assistant coaches stayed on-board.

67-3, yes, that's a win-loss record

Kalen DeBoer was once a head coach before, at NAIA Sioux Falls. He spent 10 seasons there (2000-09), the first five as the offensive coordinator before taking over in 2005 as head coach.

Over his five seasons as head coach at Sioux Falls, he owned a 67-3 record and won three national championships. He was a three-time NAIA National Coach of the Year at Sioux Falls, won four Great Plains Athletic Conference titles, 50-straight home games and 29-consecutive games overall in his final two years. He boasted a 17-2 playoff record, 49-1 conference ledger and appeared in four-straight national championship games (2006-09). He departed with an astonishing 67-3 career record as head coach.

→ In DeBoer's two seasons at Fresno State as the offensive coordinator in 2017-18, the Bulldogs were 22-6.

First game of the season, a conference game?

You never open the season with a conference game, right? In 2020, of course you do. However, for Fresno State, it is actually not that foreign of a situation. In 2006, the Bulldogs opened the season with a conference game against Nevada, which was a 28-19 victory at Bulldog Stadium on Sept. 1. The two schools remain Mountain West conference foes, but were both members of the WAC in 2006. Prior to that event, the last time the Bulldogs opened the season with a conference game was in 1985, a 26-6 win over UNLV in Bulldog Stadium - a matchup between then two PCAA programs.

The 2006 and 1985 contests are the only two games that kicked off the season with a conference game since Fresno State began playing in Bulldog Stadium. The 'Dogs have not been on the road to begin a season with a conference game during that time span (1982-pres.).

The waiting is the hardest part

When between the lines, the other side doesn't care when Fresno State started preparing, nor will Fresno State be thinking about it. But the Bulldogs will be overcoming the odds given the team did not meet or hold any organized training in person until Sept. 25.

Prior to then, the last team meeting was on March 12. The Bulldogs missed the entirety of spring football, which was set to start March 16. There were no traditional summer workouts either. Due to local county rules and restrictions, Fresno State was unable to bring its student-athletes back to campus until late September.

Eight-Straight - AGAIN

The Mountain West announced on the evening of Sept. 24 that football will be played in 2020, and on Oct. 1 the 'Dogs learned their conference-only eight-game schedule. The schedule shapes up the same for every MW team in 2020 having eight games to play in eight weeks before when the MW Championship game is schedule, on the ninth week on Dec. 19.

That said, the Bulldogs just a season ago were presented a league schedule that gave them eight-straight conference games. Following its second bye week on Oct. 5, 2019, the Bulldogs entered Mountain West play having played four games and experienced two byes before entering league play. Fresno State was the only FBS team to have not played a conference game entering its week 7 contest versus Air Force on Oct. 12, 2019.

Every game was a fight

Of the Bulldogs' eight losses in 2019, their trip to Air Force (L, 43-24) was the sole contest they found themselves not within striking distance. The season was so close to swinging in the other direction that the Bulldogs' total point differential for the season was minus-1.

Over 12 games, Fresno State scored 360 points and allowed 361.

→ One score games: 6 (1 win, 5 losses)

→ Finished 2019 with six consecutive games decided by 10 points or less. Lost five of six.

The good and not so good MW look back

→ Fresno State was the first defending Mountain West Conference champion since 2001 to not make a bowl game.

→ Fresno State owns the most MW Championship game appearances (4) from the West Division, while in the Mountain Division Boise State jumped ahead for the overall conference lead, earning its fifth appearance in the annual championship game in 2019.

→ Fresno State won the 2018 Mountain West Championship and are three-time MW Champions since becoming a league member in 2012.

Injury bug

Injuries happen, its football. But the amount of season-ending injuries were devastating for Fresno State in 2019. Three Bulldog running backs were ruled lost for the season before it even started, which included Jordan Mims. Defensive tackle Jasad Haynes was lost for the season following game 2, who was pegged as an every game starter, offensive lineman Netane Muti, who was drafted by the Denver Broncos, and cornerback Deshawn Ruffin were lost after game 3, and offensive lineman Matt Smith and defensive end Isaiah Johnson were lost after game 8. In addition to the eight lost for the season, 10 more impact players that remain on the 2020 roster missed one or more games in 2019 (OL Alex Akingbulu-2, OL Dontae Bull-2, WR Jalen Cropper-2, WR Emoryie Edwards-3, CB Chris Gaston-5, WR Jamal Glaspie-1, DE Kwami Jones-8, OL Syrus Tuitele-4, WR Keric Wheatfall-2 and OL Quireo Woodley-2).

Could experience gained in 2019 be fruitful in 2020?

In a season that was less than ideal in the win-loss column, the amount of experience that was gained by the Bulldogs' freshman class in 2019 could prove to be a bright spot for 2020.

→ Eight true freshmen made starts for Fresno State in 2019; only Alabama (9) and Akron (9) started more true freshmen than the Bulldogs a season ago. Sharing the mark of eight with Fresno State was Arizona State, Tennessee, UMass and Stanford. (*stat does not include 2019 bowl season*)

→ While eight true freshmen started games for Fresno State, a total of 12 true freshmen played in 2019.

Highlights

• Jalen Cropper was named to the Paul Hornung honor roll (most versatile athlete) on Nov. 4 as he led Fresno State in all-purpose yards on Nov. 2 against Hawaii with 155 yards (61 rushing, 62 receiving, 32 kick return), which included a 48-yard TD run. He also tossed a 36-yard touchdown pass.

• Evan Williams, named the Mountain West Defensive Player of the Week on Nov. 4, tallied nine total tackles against Hawai'i. He also picked up his first collegiate interception early in the fourth quarter against UH that would result in a Bulldog touchdown on the ensuing offensive drive. Williams has started five consecutive games to close the season, which started at Hawai'i; he ranked second on the team in tackles during that span with 38 (30 solo stops).

How the redshirt rule treated the 2019 true freshmen

The NCAA instituted a couple seasons ago that a player can retain their redshirt year if they participate in four games or less in a given season. In year one under that rule, the Bulldogs played one true freshman, more than the four games allotted to hold on to a redshirt season - now junior Isaiah Johnson. Preseason pick No. 4 in the West

On July 21, the Mountain West released its predicted order of finish, as voted upon by select media, and pegged the Bulldogs to finish fourth with 73 points, behind No. 3 Hawaii (74), No. 2 Nevada (100) and preseason favorite San Diego State (122).

In two of the Bulldogs' three MW title seasons, they were not the preseason favorite. It was only 2018 when they won the MW title that they were also the preseason pick.

Bulldogs to start second-straight season with a new signal caller

The Bulldogs had a tight quarterback competition that was contested so tight the decision to name junior Jake Haener the starting quarterback over sophomore Ben Wooldridge was held until it could not wait any longer, once game week preparation needed to begin for Hawai'i. Haener was publicly named the starter by head coach Kalen DeBoer during his weekly news conference on Monday, Oct. 19.

The Bulldogs will enter its second-straight season with a first-year starting quarterback, and second-year in a row entering a season with a quarterback room with zero career starts. Entering 2020, there are 17 teams, including Fresno State, who enter 2020 with zero career starts at quarterback in their respective quarterback rooms.

A glance at Haener

Haener spent his first two collegiate seasons (2017-18) at Washington before transferring to Fresno State. He was named the Huskies' offensive scout squad MVP the season he redshirted, and the following season as a redshirt freshman saw action in four games and passed for 107 yards and one touchdown on nine completions and 13 attempts. Haener sat out the 2019 season due to NCAA transfer rules, but that did not deter him from being an impact player as he was named the Bulldogs' offensive scout team player of the year.

A glance at Wooldridge

DeBoer was a part of the recruiting process of Wooldridge while he was the offensive coordinator at Fresno State in 2017-18. Wooldridge redshirted as a true freshman in 2018, and in 2019 saw action in three games as a redshirt freshman. The most meaningful snaps came in the season finale against San Jose State when entering for the injured Jorge Reyna. His first career attempt as a Bulldog was a 17-yard touchdown pass to Keric Wheatfall versus Nevada.

October is treating Matt Smith well

Even without football, October has been a good month for senior center Matt Smith. On Oct. 1, Smith was announced a semifinalist for the 2020 William V. Campbell Trophy and on Oct. 14 he was named to the Rimington Trophy watch list.

As a semifinalist for the Campbell Trophy, Smith has an opportunity to receive an \$18,000 post-graduate scholarship, which is awarded to each of the 12-to-14 finalists. An award better known as the Academic Heisman, Smith earned his bachelor's in business administration (sports marketing) last spring with a cumulative undergraduate 3.91 GPA. He's been on the Presidents List (4.0 for semester) six times, named a MW Scholar Athlete twice, named to the Fall Academic All-Mountain West Team twice, and was a 2019 CoSIDA Academic All-District football team selection. Smith now has the chance to become the fourth Bulldog to be a finalist for the award better known as the Academic Heisman. Derek Carr in 2013 was the most recent Bulldog selected to the NFF National Scholar-Athlete Class while Moses Harris (2009) and Vernon Fox (2001) were the first two Bulldogs to earn the high academic honor.

The Rimington Trophy is presented annually to the most outstanding center in NCAA Division I College Football. A watch list typically revealed in July, the Rimington Trophy committee adjusted its procedures in 2020 with consideration to the COVID-19 pandemic, choosing to hold its watch list until play began and a plan was implemented across all Division I conferences. Since its inception, the seventeen-year old award has raised over \$4.45 million for the Boomer Esiason Foundation, which is committed to finding a cure for cystic fibrosis.



Run, Ronnie, Run

Fresno State returns its leading rusher from the 2019 season in senior Ronnie Rivers - he is the Bulldogs' sole 2020 all-MW preseason football team selection. Rivers finished 2019 with 899 rushing yards, and a conference best 16 total touchdowns. He was a second team All-Conference selection.

Rivers had four 100-yard rushing games with a season-best 177 yards at San Jose State to close out the season. He added 146 yards vs. Colorado State, 103 at Hawai'i and 102 against Utah State.

He finished his junior campaign ranked No. 19 in the NCAA for total touchdowns (16) and No. 21 in rushing touchdowns (13).

Rivers enters 2020 as the 14th-leading rusher in program history (2,122). He broke the 2,000-yard plateau in the 2019 season finale, becoming one of 17 players to ever reach that milestone. If he gains 878 yards in 2020, he'd join the 3,000-yard club, which consists of just six Bulldogs - one of which is his father. Ron Rivers (1991-93) is the second-leading rusher in program history with 3,473 rushing yards.

The Rivers father-son duo has been quite a force in the Bulldog football program. The pair is currently tied for seventh all-time for career rushing touchdowns (28).

Rivers has been no stranger to the endzone in a Bulldog uniform. He is currently 12th on the all-time career scoring leaders list with 210 points from 35 touchdowns.

→ Over four consecutive games (10/18/19 - 11/9/19), Ronnie scored two or more touchdowns in each game. He became the first Bulldog to accomplish that feat since Reggie Brown did so in 1994. No player has ever had a streak of five straight games of multiple rushing scores.

→ Ronnie currently owns a streak of eight-straight games scoring at least once, whether it be rushing or receiving. All eight of those games have been Mountain West games.

He can catch, too!

Rivers totaled 348 receiving yards on the year in 2019. He is currently third for career pass receptions by a running back with 89 for 792 yards and seven touchdowns. His seven receiving touchdowns is just two shy of the TD record for touchdown catches by a running back.

Plenty of options

Fresno State returns seven letter-winning wide receivers from 2019. The depth in the receiver room has been something the Bulldog offense can fall back on when it requires speed, toughness, and the ability to move the chains. The 'Dogs did not lose a starting receiver to graduation, and returned Zane Pope and Jalen Cropper as starters.

Additional 2019 letterwinners in the receiver group include Erik Brooks, Emoryie Edwards, Patrick Elima-Juene, Jamal Glaspie and Keric Wheatfall. The Bulldog offense also welcomed Chris Coleman back to its side of the ball after he moved to defense to fill the void left by injuries last season.

The 'Dogs have experience in redshirt freshmen Josh Kelly and Rodney Wright III. Kelly has made a significant improvement and has stood out to the coaching staff throughout fall camp.

True freshmen Mac Dalena, Grant Lake and Jordan Brown join the experienced corp for 2020.

The Bulldogs' leading receiver returns this season in Pope. In 2019, he produced 525 yards on a team-high 47 catches. Wheatfall returns as the receiver with the most production per catch with 18.06 yards per reception in 2019. Wheatfall had 17 receptions for 307 yards a season ago.

Fresno State receivers are led by coach Kirby Moore, who has been with the program for the last three seasons. The group was just one of three position groups to not have a coaching change with DeBoer's new staff.

Next man up

→ The Bulldogs had 10 different starting combinations on the offensive line in its 12 games due to injuries last year.

→ All five game one starters missed time at one point. Quireo Woodley was the only Bulldog unscathed until suffering an injury on the final play of the game at San Diego State as the 10th game came to a close on Nov. 15. When the Nov. 23 game got underway, just one of the five game one starters was active, Dontae Bull, but he was at right tackle, not left tackle where he started the season.

→ 11 different players made at least one start on the offensive line last season. Of the 11 individuals who started on the offensive line last year, six of those individuals started for the first time in their respective careers (Aibuede, Akingbulu, Fuamatu, Sampson, Schmidt, Smith).

→ Fresno State was sacked 23 times last season, for a loss of 158 yards ... in 2017 and 2018 combined, the Bulldogs gave up 22 sacks for a total of 137 yards lost (28 games).

Sapolu named one of the nation's top young coaches

Fresno State football assistant coach Roman Sapolu was named on Sept. 18 to 247Sports' 30Under30 list. The Bulldogs' 28-year-old offensive line coach is one of 30 rising stars under the age of 30, and one of six in the Mountain West, as tabbed by the organization.

Sapolu was charged to lead the offensive line by head coach Kalen DeBoer after his first season with the 'Dogs as an assistant to the offensive line - alongside offensive coordinator Ryan Grubb. In addition, Sapolu also received the promotion of having run game coordinator duties for DeBoer's team.



Defensive leadership

While Kalen DeBoer will be the Bulldogs' third different head coach to begin a season in the last six years, the defense's leadership has been far more in flux. With William Inge taking over the reins in 2020, he will be the program's fifth different defensive coordinator since 2015. He replaces Bert Watts (2018-19), Fresno State's last DC to coach more than one season since Nick Toth (2012-15).

→ Schematically, Inge is set to deploy a 4-2-5 formation, the third different system since Toth's 3-4-4. Lorezno Ward, Orlando Steinauer and Watts each used a 4-3-4.

Next in line for Inge

Throughout much of his coaching career, William Inge has overseen linebackers, a group that he will again manage in 2020 along with his duties as Fresno State's defensive coordinator. The question now is which Bulldog linebackers will shine under him? Fresno State will be replacing both Mykal Walker (graduation/NFL) and Justin Rice (transfer).

→ In four years coaching linebackers at Indiana, Inge had four earn Big Ten All-Freshman honors.

→ In 2018, Chris Covington became IU's first linebacker to be drafter since 1988. That same year, Tegray Scales became the first Hoosier linebacker to claim first-team All-Big Ten honors since 1988. That came a year after Scales was named a SI.com second-team All-American, the first Hoosiers linebacker recognized on an All-America team since 1987.

→ Prior to Indiana, Inge mentored Khalil Mack at Buffalo for two seasons before the former Bull became the No. 5 pick in the 2014 NFL Draft, a five-time All-Pro and the 2016 NFL Defensive Player of the Year.

Fresno State may be the Bulldogs, but its football team will have a Husky in 2020. The Husky is a new position in Fresno State's 4-2-5 defensive formation. It's a linebacker/safety hybrid that utilizes a player's athleticism to cover tight ends and wide receivers while also using their size to help in stopping the run.

→ Coached by Julius "Juice" Brown, the four players in the mix to fill the new position are Levelle Bailey, Tanner Blount, Rian Fields and Justin Houston.

Looking for new positive juju in 2020

With the end of the 2019 season came the end of Juju Hughes' career in the Bulldogs' defensive backfield. The Hanford native was a constant, playing in 52 games during his career and starting the last 40 at strong safety. Projected to replace the former captain is a player who embodies the word "strong" in strong safety. Deonte Perry, last year's defensive weight room award recipient moves into the spot after backing up Hughes in 2019.

→ If you only vaguely recognize the name, the senior has been in the program since 2016 but started his career on the offensive side of the ball as a running back. Redshirting his first year after suffering an injury in fall camp, he appeared just once in 2017. Having played defensive back in high school, he made the move to the opposite side of the ball in 2018 and has contributed primarily on special teams during the last two seasons.

Maintaining his spot

After making his first career start at Hawai'i last season, sophomore Evan Williams has not relinquished a starting spot in Fresno State's defensive backfield and he is projected to start 2020 at free safety. Playing nickel against the Rainbow Warriors, he moved to free safety a week later where he finished out the season.

→ In the last five games of 2019, Williams ranked second in tackles for the 'Dogs with 38.

→ Williams finished the year with 40 tackles, two pass breakups, one interception, one forced fumble and one fumble recovery.

Defensive anchor

With 26 career starts to his name, defensive lineman Kevin Atkins enters 2020 with the most starts on the Fresno State roster. The senior will need to bring that experience to a line that is expected to feature two new starters when it takes the field on Saturday.

→ Atkins finished 2019 with 31 tackles, 7.0 TFLs and five sacks (10th in MW) to earn All-Mountain West honorable mention.

→ Atkins is the only returner on defense to have earned all-conference honors in 2019.

Picking up where he left off

Sidelined for the majority of 2019, defensive end Kwami Jones played in the final four games of his senior season, which allowed him to return this year. With the NCAA's four-game redshirt rule, the Bulldogs' defensive line will be bolstered by Jones' experience this season. The senior played in 27 games prior to 2019 with 10 starts coming in 2018 when he produced 26 tackles and 2.5 sacks.

Who is going to tackle?

No Rice. No Walker. No Hughes. Fresno State will enter the 2020 season without its top three tacklers from last season. The trio combined for 288 tackles, 34.7 percent of the team's tackles in 2019. Arron Mosby (78) and Wylan Free (64) are the only returning 'Dogs with at least 50 tackles last year.

→ Fresno State has not lost its top three tacklers in an offseason since prior to the 2007 season. Following 2006, the Bulldogs lost Dwayne Andrews (87), Josh Sherley (82) and Alan Goodwin (65) to graduation.

→ The Bulldogs went 4-8 in 2006 but the following year finished 9-4 and defeated Georgia Tech in the Humanitarian Bowl.

Takeaways

In each of the previous two seasons, Fresno State has been one of the top teams in the country in forcing turnovers, finishing 23rd in 2019 (22) and 11th in 2018 (26). It marks the first time during the last 10 years that the Bulldogs have finished back-to-back seasons ranked in the top 25 in turnovers gained. Fresno State had finished in the top 25 just one other year (2012) dating back to 2010.

→ Along with the 2017 team, the Bulldogs have produced at least 21 takeaways in three consecutive seasons.

4 to 9

For the third time since 2000, Fresno State finished with four wins in a season. The last two occurrences came in 2006 and 2011. In each of the seasons that followed, the Bulldogs won nine games (9-4). Since 1980, Fresno State has not posted a below-.500 record following a four-win season.

Ronnie Rivers (Senior, RB) - father is Ron Rivers (1991-93). Rivers is second all-time in career rushing yards (3,473) and holds the record for career rushing yards per carry (6.6 - minimum 200 attempts).

Leevel Tatum III (Senior, DL) - father is Leevel Tatum II (1983-84), a standout running back for the Bulldogs.

Rodney Wright III (R-Freshman, WR) - father is Rodney Wright II (1998-01). Wright II was also a wide receiver for the 'Dogs, and is fourth in career pass receptions (222) and third in receiving yardage (3,274). In 2001, Wright II had a nation-leading 104 catches for the Bulldogs alongside quarterback David Carr.

KALEN DEBOER

HEAD COACH

1ST SEASON | SIOUX FALLS (1998)

Kalen DeBoer (pronounced duh-BOR) was named the 20th head coach in Fresno State history on Dec. 17, 2019, succeeding Jeff Tedford. While he embarks on his first season at the helm of the program, it will be his third season with the Bulldogs having first arrived in 2017 with Tedford, hired as his offensive coordinator. DeBoer coached the Bulldogs for two seasons before departing for a one-year stint at Indiana in 2019.

IU sported an 8-5 record in 2019 with DeBoer as its offensive coordinator, a resurrection season said by some in the Midwest, as it was their best regular season in 26 years. The eight wins tied for the third most in school history, trailing only the 1945 and 1967 Big Ten Championships teams who each won nine games. IU posted a winning conference record for the first time since 1993 (5-3) and was nationally ranked for the first time in 25 years, breaking the oldest such drought in the country.

The Hoosiers' offense, a catalyst of the success, excelled under DeBoer ranking inside the top five in the 14-team Big Ten conference in passing offense (302.4, second), first downs (23.4, second), time of possession (33:43, third) turnovers lost (15, third), total offense (432.8, third), passing efficiency (150.6, fourth), third down conversion percentage (.469, fourth) and scoring offense (31.8, fifth).

DeBoer's two years as the Bulldogs' offensive coordinator was one for the ages that concluded with a Mountain West Championship and Las Vegas Bowl win to cap a 22-6 run during the 2017-18 seasons. Those two seasons included double-digit winning seasons each year, coming off a 1-11 campaign by the 2016 team. That feat led to Fresno State becoming the first program in FBS history to secure back-to-back double-digit winning seasons following a double-digit loss season.

Fresno State reached unprecedented heights in year No. 2 with DeBoer as the OC as the Bulldogs posted a school-record 12 victories, and finished ranked No. 18 in both the AP Top 25 and Coaches poll. The offense ranked 26th nationally in scoring offense (34.6) and 29th in passing offense (267.1), and produced five all-conference honorees. The Bulldogs finished eighth nationally in team passing efficiency (156.58), tied for 15th in turnovers lost (14), tied for 19th nationally in red zone offense (89.5 percent) and 25th in third-down conversions

(44.6). Up front, the Bulldogs' offensive line ranked in the top six nationally in fewest sacks and tackles for loss allowed per game in 2018 (6th, 5th).

Prior to joining the Bulldogs' staff, DeBoer spent three seasons as the offensive coordinator at Eastern Michigan where he helped guide the Eagles to their first bowl bid since 1987 following a 7-5 regular season. It was EMU's first season above .500 since 1995.

Prior to his three-year stint at Eastern Michigan, DeBoer spent four seasons as the offensive coordinator at Southern Illinois (2010-13) while also overseeing the wide receiver unit.

Before leading Eastern Michigan and Southern Illinois to prolific offensive numbers, DeBoer served as the head coach at the University of Sioux Falls, where he led one of the most dominant NAIA programs in the nation.

DeBoer was named a three-time NAIA National Coach of the Year and compiled an astonishing 67-3 (.957) record while guiding USF to three national championships in five seasons. He won four Great Plains Athletic Conference Championships, 50-straight home games and 29-straight games overall in his final two seasons. He also boasted a 17-2 record in the playoffs. His teams won back-to-back NAIA National Championships in 2008 and 2009, and adding in his 2006 national championship, DeBoer had as many national championships as games lost during his five-year tenure as USF's head coach.

DeBoer coached three NAIA National Players of the Year winners in quarterbacks Lorenzo Brown (2009) and Chad Cavender (2007) and running back Nick Kortan (2002). During his time at USF, he helped develop 25 first-team All-Americans.

A graduate of USF, DeBoer played for the Cougars from 1993-96, where he was an All-American wide receiver. He set school records for receptions (234), receiving yards (3,400) and touchdown catches (33).

Following his playing days, he became a student assistant for Sioux Falls under coach Bob Young in 1997. From 2000-04, he served as USF's offensive coordinator and succeeded Young as head coach in 2005.

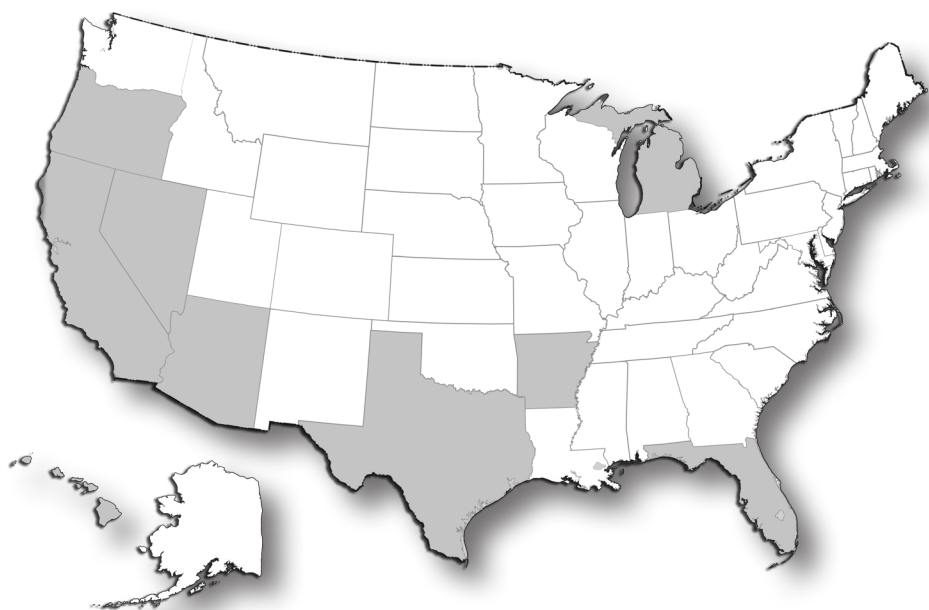
