Headlines

→ Fresno State and San Jose State are set to play for the 84th time in the Bulldogs 99th year of football. It is the longest running series for both programs.
 → Fresno State owns a 13-2 record at Bulldog Stadium against San Jose State since 1989.
 → Fresno State has won 19 of its last 25 meetings against San Jose State.
 → Fresno State owns a three-game winning streak after dropping its' season opener.
 → The Bulldogs are averaging 37.7 points per game and 486.7 total yards of offense per game during their current three-game winning streak.
 → Averaging 467.2 yards of total offense per game, Fresno State ranks No. 15 in the FBS in that category (min. 4 games played).
 → Wide receiver Jalen Cropper is this week's Mountain West Offensive Player of the Week, which marks back-to-back weeks the Bulldogs have sported the league's offensive player of the week as Ronnie Rivers earned the honor previously.
 → With one touchdown on Saturday, Ronnie Rivers will set the program's record for most touchdowns in a career. He is currently tied at 44 with Anthony Daigle (1991-93).
 → Rivers has scored at least one touchdown in 12 consecutive games, an active streak that leads the NCAA.
 → Last time out, Rivers became the first player in Fresno State history to record 2,500 yards rushing and 1,000 yards receiving in a career.
 → Fresno State leads the FBS in sacks per game (5.0).
 → The 'Dogs have recorded back-to-back games with at least six sacks for the first time since 2013.
 → The last two weeks have seen Fresno State lock down in the secondary, holding opponents to an average of 152.0 yards passing per game.
 → Fresno State has outscored its opponents 20-0 in the 4th quarter over the last two games.
 → Fresno State head coach Kalen DeBoer, a first-year head coach himself, heads into game five not facing a first-year head coach on the opposite sideline for the first time this season.

Playing for hardware

Introduced in 2013, Fresno State and San Jose State added to its long running rivalry the "Valley Trophy".

The introduction of the trophy coincided with the first season the two teams began sharing league membership in the Mountain West. Prior to the 2019 season, the teams had split time with the trophy, but the Spartans win a year ago gave them a leg up on the all-time record, 4-3. The Spartans last had the Valley Trophy in back-to-back seasons after wins in the 2015 and 2016 faceoffs.



VALLEY TROPHY

Why the Valley Trophy: The two schools are separated by only approximately 150 driving miles and represent two distinct valleys. Fresno State represents the San Joaquin Valley, the world's richest agricultural area of export dollars and is known for wearing a green V on the back of its helmets as a symbol to the agricultural community of the Central Valley of California. San Jose State is the metropolitan capital of the high-tech Silicon Valley.

Series History with the Spartans

In the longest-running series in Fresno State football history, the Bulldogs have a 42-38-3 all-time advantage over the Spartans.

While going through three conference changes together from the Big West to the WAC to the Mountain West, Fresno State has led the series in each conference battle. However, San Jose State took a 4-3 advantage as Mountain West foe last season.

In games played in Fresno, things have gone the way of the 'Dogs in what is now the 99th year since the two teams played for the first time. FS leads 25-18-1 in the series' home games.

Scouting San Jose State

San Jose State (4-0, 4-0 MW) has started its season 4-0 for the first time since 1955. The Spartans are sitting atop the Mountain West standings alongside Nevada (4-0) and Boise State (3-0), who are also perfect in MW play.

San Jose State is averaging 29.2 points per game while its opponents are averaging just 15.2. The Spartans offensive attack is fueled by its air power from quarterback Nick Starkel. The senior transfer quarterback is in his first season with San Jose State after transferring from Arkansas. He also spent three seasons (2016-18) at Texas A&M. Starkel has thrown for 980 yards and nine touchdowns this season. He has only thrown two interceptions while averaging 245.0 yards per game.

Starkel was named the MW Offensive Player of the Week and earned several national recognitions after a 467-yard, five touchdown performance in the Spartan's 38-21 win against New Mexico (Oct. 31). He is ranked 11th in the country with a 70.09 completion percentage.

Junior linebacker Kyle Harmon leads the Spartans with 52 tackles. He also has 3.0 TFLs, 0.5 sacks and a forced fumble. Sophomore safety Tre Jenkins owns the teams only two interceptions. He's also recorded 2.0 TFLs, a forced fumble and a fumble recovery. Jenkins was named the MW Defensive Player of the Week for his nine tackle performance against San Diego State (Nov. 6) that also included a critical forced fumble and interception.

Last time against San Jose State

The Bulldogs suffered a 17-16 loss on the road to surrender the Valley Trophy to the Spartans in what was the season finale for each team in 2019.

The Spartans scored the final 14 points of the game, including the go-ahead score with 2:11 remaining while Fresno State was held scoreless on 11-straight drives after scoring on its first two drives of the game.

How we got here

The Bulldogs started their 2020 campaign with a loss to Hawai'i, but have reeled off three-straight wins for the first time since 2018. The Bulldogs last two contests were road bouts, earning wins against UNLV (40-27) and last time out at Utah State (35-16).

In both road wins, the Bulldogs outscored their opponents a combined 20-0 in the fourth quarter, which also included a second half shut out of Utah State.

The 'Dogs defeated Colorado State at home for their first win of the 2020 season, 38-17.

→ The Bulldogs are averaging 37.7 points per game and 486.7 total yards of offense per game during their current three-game win streak.

Who will emerge the true contender?

It cannot be denied, the Bulldogs last two wins were against opponents who have yet to enter the win column. Colorado State is 1-2 this year while Hawai'i is 2-2. That's a grand total of 3 wins, 12 losses chalked by the Bulldogs' four opponents this year.

This while San Jose State (4-0) owns more wins than the Bulldogs previous four opponents combined. The Spartans have one signature win entering this week's contest, a Friday night win on the road against San Diego State (Nov. 6). Looking past that game, the strength of schedule resumes stack up pretty close entering this week five match up. Who will emerge the true contender for a bid for a Mountain West Championship Game appearance?

Two true feel good program stories

Regardless of who they've played, the stories for how the 3-1 Bulldogs, and 4-0 Spartans got to week five for such a pivotal Mountain West matchup is nothing short of remarkable.

The Bulldogs are defying the odds given the team did not meet or hold any organized training in person until Sept. 25. Prior to then, the last team meeting was on March 12. The Bulldogs missed the entirety of spring football, which was set to start March 16. There were no traditional summer workouts either. Due to local county rules and restrictions, Fresno State was unable to bring its student-athletes back to campus until late September while the NCAA allowed involuntary workouts to begin June 1, and mandatory workouts to begin July 17.

Meanwhile, San Jose State spent 12 days, Oct. 3-14, at Humboldt State in Arcata, Calif. in preparation for the 2020 season. A roughly 650-mile round trip. The state of California's classification of COVID-19 protocols and guidelines in Humboldt County were less restrictive than in Santa Clara County where San Jose State is located.

Team Captains

Seniors Kevin Atkins (DT) and Matt Smith (OL), junior Jake Haener (QB) and sophomore Evan Williams (DB) were named the Bulldogs' 2020 team captains on Tuesday, Oct. 20. The captains were elected by votes from their peers.

→ In each of the first four games, Matt Smith was the coin toss representative.

The DeBoer era

The Kalen DeBoer era is in full swing after his long-awaited debut as one of six new head coaches this season in the Mountain West. The Bulldogs' former offensive coordinator (2017-18) had to wait five extra days to celebrate win No. 1, after falling in his first career game on Oct. 24 against Hawai'i, but the 'Dogs have been rolling since. A Gatorade shower awaited him following a 38-17 thumping of Colorado State on Oct. 29, and on Nov. 7 and Nov. 14 he took his 'Dogs on the road for back-to-back games and came away with victories each time. DeBoer is the 20th head coach in program history, and the return to Fresno kept the continuity and foundation that was built by former head coach Jeff Tedford. While DeBoer ushered in six new assistant coaches, who all have strong ties to his corner, four assistant coaches stayed on-board.

67-3, yes, that's a win-loss record

Kalen DeBoer was once a head coach before, at NAIA Sioux Falls. He spent 10 seasons there (2000-09), the first five as the offensive coordinator before taking over in 2005 as head coach.

Over his five seasons as head coach at Sioux Falls, he owned a 67-3 record and won three national championships. He was a three-time NAIA National Coach of the Year at Sioux Falls, won four Great Plains Athletic Conference titles, 50-straight home games and 29-consecutive games overall in his final two years. He boasted a 17-2 playoff record, a 49-1 conference ledger and appeared in four-straight national championship games (2006-09). He departed with an astonishing 67-3 career record as the Sioux Falls head coach.

→ In DeBoer's two seasons at Fresno State as the offensive coordinator in 2017-18, the Bulldogs were 22-6 and won the 2018 MW Championship game.

Home Sweet Home

The Bulldogs have always been strong at home, proven by its 22nd-best current stadium win percentage in the nation. And that is certainly the case when hosting rival San Jose State. Saturday's game marks the 20th meeting between these two teams at Bulldog Stadium. Fresno State owns a 14-5 record at Bulldog Stadium against SJSU, and are and an even more impressive 13-2 against SJSU since 1989 in Fresno.

New kids on the block

One more Bulldog made his collegiate debut at Utah State last weekend. There have been 24 players that have made their playing debut as a Fresno State Bulldog this season. Six have been true freshmen, and those six have played in each of the first four games.

Seven made their first starts for Fresno State in their respective careers in the Bulldogs' first game against Hawai'i, and three more got their first chance to start in their respective careers on Oct. 29 versus Colorado State. Junior Kurtis Brown joined the crew and earned his first Bulldog start at UNLV while freshman husky Justin Houston and junior tight end Rory Hanson got the first start of their careers at Utah State.

→ In 2018, the Bulldogs played one true freshman more than the four games allotted to hold on to a redshirt season - Isaiah Johnson (So.). In 2019, six true freshmen played more than the four games allotted to hold on to a redshirt season.

Finish strong, 4's up

Following a 2019 season where Fresno State battled in six one-score games and fell in five of six of them (including SJSU), there's been an emphasis on embracing the pressure of the fourth quarter and to not be overwhelmed by the situation this season.

Well, that's paid off lately as the Bulldogs have outscored their opponents 20-0 in the fourth quarter over the last two games, and 20-7 in the Bulldogs' last three wins. The 'Dogs outscored UNLV 13-0, on the road, to take home the win after entering the frame knotted at 27-27. At Utah State last week, nursing a 28-16 halftime lead, the Bulldogs shutout the Aggies in the second half, and won the game 35-16.

The seven points allowed, against Colorado State, were scored with 41 seconds left in the game in a contest that was already put away. The final score was 38-17.

Every game was a fight

Of the Bulldogs' eight losses in 2019, their trip to Air Force (L, 43-24) was the sole contest they found themselves not within striking distance. The season was so close to swinging in the other direction that the Bulldogs' total point differential for the season was minus-1.

Over 12 games, Fresno State scored 360 points and allowed 361.

→ One score games: 6 (1 win, 5 losses)

→ Finished 2019 with six consecutive games decided by 10 points or less. Lost five of six.

Offense clicking with Grubb and Co.

Offensive coordinator, and play caller, Ryan Grubb has the Bulldogs' offense ranked No. 3 in the Mountain West in points per game with 33.0. Fresno State has topped 400 yards total offense in each of its first four games, and have been on an upwards track over each contest in yardage totals. In the opener against Hawai'i, Fresno State had 407 yards, week 2 vs. Colorado State had 432 yards, against UNLV posted 487 yards and last time out set the bar even higher with 541 yards offense.

→ Averaging 467.2 yards total offense per game, Fresno State ranks No. 15 in the FBS in that category (min. 4 games played).

→ The last time the 'Dogs had four-straight games with 400 yards total offense or better was in 2013 behind the offensive duo of Derek Carr and Davante Adams. That last streak of four, 400-yard games was actually five-straight contests in games 8, 9, 10, 11 & 12 of the season in 2013 (Nov. 2 vs. Nevada-647, Nov. 9 at Wyoming-600, Nov. 23 vs. New Mexico-822, Nov. 29 at San Jose State-646, Dec. 7 vs. Utah State-460).

→ The 2020 team is the first team since the 2009 Bulldogs to of registered better than 400 yards of total offense in their first four games of the season. The 2009 season started with eight-straight games with better than 400 yards offense.

Haener settles in

Junior quarterback Jake Haener got off to a rocky start, but it's been smooth sailing since. Against Hawai'i, Fresno State's opener, it was Haener's first start, and first live game reps since late in the fourth quarter on Nov. 17, 2018 as a backup for the Washington Huskies against Oregon State - a 42-23 win for UW.

A look at the first three quarters this season, and the next 13:

First three quarters vs. Hawai'i

After surrendering three interceptions on 17 attempts over the first three quarters in the season opener, he's had 107 pass attempts with just one interception over the last 13 quarters of football. In the Bulldogs' last three wins, Haener is 66-of-93 passing for 897 yards and eight touchdowns, and one INT. In those games his completion percentage is 71.0 percent and passing efficiency rating is 178.22.

→ Haener ranks No. 11 in the FBS in passing yards per game with 296.5/game (min. 4 games played).

Career day

→ Haener set a career-high in passing yards in the first half against Utah State with 318 yards. He finished with 422 yards.

→ Haener's 422 yards ranked as the 15th-most in a single game in program history.

→ Haener was the first Bulldog to throw for 400+ yards in a game since Derek Carr against

Utah State in the 2013 Mountain West championship game. It was the most yards in a game by a Bulldog since Carr threw for 519 yards against San Jose State (Nov. 29) a week prior to the MW Championship game.

→ Fifteen of Haener's completions were 10 or more yards against Utah State, including touchdown throws of 44, 59 and 71 yards.

It wasn't four TD's, but it was still productive

Ronnie Rivers wasn't in the end zone as much as he has been the last two games, but he definitely put up positive yardage for the 'Dogs at Utah State.

On a quiet day for Rivers' standards, he finished with 132 yards rushing, 51 yards receiving and a touchdown in Fresno State's 35-16 win last Saturday. He had 183 all-purpose yards. He registered 100+ yards rushing in back-to-back games, and is now up to eight in his career.

He tied the program record for career touchdowns as he snuck into the end zone in the second quarter against Utah State. Rivers has scored at least one touchdown in 12 consecutive games, an active streak that leads the NCAA.

Sitting at the top

Rivers tied Anthony Daigle's program record of 44 career touchdowns with his lone score at Utah State. Daigle set the record in 1991-93, and Rivers is looking to break it on Saturday.

This season, the senior back has passed Robbie Rouse, Ryan Mathews and Davante Adams on the all-time career touchdown list.

He has also moved up to third place, with Daigle, in career rushing touchdowns. Rivers' touchdown last Saturday gives him 35 rushing scores in his career. Mathews (2007-09) holds the record with 39 career rushing touchdowns. Rivers became the first player in Fresno State history to record 2,500 yards rushing and 1,000 yards receiving in a career.

Wassup, Top 10

Each week, we can expect a move up the record book standings from Rivers. This week it was another big one as he broke into the top 10 in all-time all-purpose yardage.

Rivers now has 3,914 career all-purpose yards, and passed Charles Smith (1998-01), KeeSean Johnson (2015-18) and Dale Messer (1958-60) to sit at 10th all-time.

He also moved to No. 7 all-time with 2,561 career rushing yards. Rivers passed Dean Philpott (1954-57) on the list the last time out.

Rivers vs. the Spartans

Rivers has a history of success against San Jose State, racking up 535 all-purpose yards and four touchdowns in his three previous games.

Rivers totaled 275 all-purpose yards last time he faced San Jose State (177 yards rushing and 63 yards receiving); the sixth-most all-purpose yards in a single game in program history - but it was still only his second-best single game performance as he churned out 286 all-purpose yards in the 2018 Las Vegas Bowl en route to being named the MVP of that game.

Rivers first career 100-yard rushing game and first career multi-TD game both came against the Spartans, as a true freshman on Oct. 7, 2017.

9-5 all day, every day

The offense is learning its weapons each week, and the Jake Haener and Jalen Cropper connection was on full display last Saturday at Utah State. Haener connected with Cropper on 10 of 11 targets in the win. Of Haener's four touchdown passes, three were to Cropper.

Cropper also caught two of Haener's longer passes of the afternoon - a 59-yard reception and a 44-yard reception. Both of those plays were touchdowns.

Cropper named MW Offensive Player of the Week

Sophomore wide receiver Jalen Cropper was named the league's Offensive Player of the Week after an impressive performance at Utah State last weekend.

Cropper finished with career-high numbers across the board. He had 202 yards receiving and three touchdowns on 10 catches. The sophomore had the most receiving yards in a game by a Bulldog since Davante Adams put up 264 yards on Nov. 29, 2013. He also registered the most catches in a game since KeeSean Johnson had 10 on Nov. 17, 2018, and is the first 'Dog to record three receiving scores in a single game since Johnson did so on Sept. 30, 2017.

Cropper is responsible for one of just 13 200-yard receiving games in the FBS this season.

The Valley native had 256 all-purpose yards (202 receiving, 54 kickoff return) for the ninth-most all-purpose yards in a single-game in program history. His total yardage from Saturday is also the eighth-most in the FBS this season.

Among his fellow Mountain West players, Cropper has made his way to the top as he recorded the second-most receptions in a game by any player in the conference this season. He is tied with the most receiving touchdowns, and second in points scored in a game on the year. His 202 receiving yards is the third-most in the conference this season.

Cropper was the winner of Joey Galloway's Helmet Sticker Saturday night on ESPN.

He is the first wide receiver to earn the offensive weekly honor since Colorado State's Warren Jackson picked up the award on Oct. 14, 2019. He is the first Bulldog wideout to earn the recognition from the conference since Davante Adams in 2013.

Sweeney approved - a new #9 under center

Kevin Sweeney, quarterback for the Bulldogs from 1982-86, departed as the NCAA all-time record holder for career passing yards with 10,623, at that time. The 1987 7th round pick of the Dallas Cowboys later had his No. 9 jersey retired, and it is commemorated on the west side of Bulldog Stadium alongside six other jersey numbers that have been retired over the 98-year history of Bulldog Football.

Enter Jake Haener, and while it's not the first time that the No. 9 jersey has come out of retirement at Fresno State, Haener is the first Bulldog quarterback to don the No. 9 under center since Sweeney did. Sweeney, in agreement with head coach Kalen DeBoer, gave his blessing to Haener to wear the No. 9. It certainly helped given the Haener and Sweeney connection dates back to Bullard High School (in Fresno, Calif.) in the early 80's, where Sweeney and Jake's father, Ryan Haener, met and played on the same high school football team. The bond began the year Ryan, a sophomore, was named then-senior Sweeney's back-up and future successor for Bullard High.

A welcome change

Fresno State has started the same five offensive linemen four weeks in a row. That's the first time since 2018 the 'Dogs have had the same starting five over four consecutive weeks. The Bulldogs' offensive line used 10 different starting combinations over 12 games a season ago. Once a troublesome issue, it gave 10 different players a start on the offensive line a year ago, and now it's a positive as seven of those 10 who remain on the 2020 team are that much more experienced on the line (Bull, Smith, Woodley, Tuitele, Schmidt, Sampson, Abbs).

→ Bull (LT), Adkins (LG), Smith (C), Woodley (RG) and Tuitele (RT) have started each of the first four games, while Sampson has seen significant time as the 6th man.



Looking like the real Bulldog defense

When the Bulldogs took the field in week one, the defense looked as one might expect after missing a spring and summer full of workouts. While they may have looked a step slow, they haven't been since. Yards are down. Completions are down. First downs are down. And most importantly, points have been down. After allowing 34 points and 522 yards in its opener, the Fresno State defense has stepped up and allowed just 20.0 points per game in its last three outings.

→ After allowing 522 yards to Hawai'i in Week 1, the Bulldogs have kept two of its last three opponents to below 400 yards of offense. The 'Dogs are allowing 372.3 yards per game in their last three contests.

→ The last two weeks have seen Fresno State lock down in the secondary, holding opponents to an average of 152.0 yards per game. The 'Dogs have also yielded just one touchdown through the air.

Second-half adjustments

While the Bulldogs have allowed 43 first-half points in the last three games, they have given up only 17 second-half points, with just seven coming in the fourth quarter. Why has this been the case? In 20 second-half defensive possessions, the Bulldogs' defense has forced five turnovers, seven punts, four turnover-on-downs and one which saw time expire.

→ Five of the Bulldogs' six turnovers forced this season have come in the second half.

→ The 'Dogs held CSU to 10 points through 59 minutes before giving up a late touchdown while holding a 28-point lead.

→ Fresno State allowed 10 second-half points to UNLV, seven of which resulted from a two-play drive (which included a 71-yard TD run).

→ The Bulldogs shutout Utah State in the second half, the first time they have held an opponent scoreless in the second half since Nov. 17, 2018 vs. San Diego State.

Causing havoc

A year after averaging 5.3 tackles for loss, the new-look Bulldog defensive front has been wreaking havoc on opposing offenses this year. Coming off of another 10 TFL game at Utah State, the Bulldogs sit seventh in the NCAA in TFLs, averaging 8.5 per game.

→ Fresno State has recorded at least 10 TFLs in each of its last two games.

→ Kwami Jones sits 13th in the NCAA in TFLs and third in the MW with 1.7 per game while David Perales is 59th in NCAA and 13th in the MW with 1.3 per game.

Watch your back

In 2019, Fresno State struggled to get to opposing quarterbacks. Under new defensive coordinator William Inge and defensive line coach Eric Schmidt, the 'Dogs have found a great deal of success at pressuring opposing quarterbacks. With six sacks in each of the last two games, Fresno State's 20 sacks on the season has already passed last year's 12-game total of 19.

→ Until last weekend, Fresno State had not recorded back-to-back games with six sacks since 2013.

→ Fresno State leads the NCAA in sacks per game (5.0).

Rushing from the edge

The Bulldogs' edge rushers have been a big reason this season for the disruption inflicted on opposing quarterbacks. As a collective, the Bulldogs' defensive ends totaled 6.5 sacks in 2019 (includes Mykal Walker who split time at linebacker), but in 2020 they have already accounted for 8.0.

→ Of the Bulldogs' three ends who have been featured the most in 2020, they combined to play in four games in 2019. Kwami Jones (4.0 sacks) played in the final four games while David Perales (3.0 sacks) redshirted the year after transferring from Sacramento State, and Da'Marcus Johnson (1.0 sack) was playing for American River College.

→ Jones ranks sixth nationally in sacks per game (1.33) and is second in the Mountain West.

Getting in on the sack party

While the defensive ends were quickest to the quarterback early in the season, the last two games have seen the big guys in middle join in on the party. Led by senior Kevin Atkins, who led the 'Dogs in sacks a season ago with 5.0, the trio of Atkins (4.0), Kurtis Brown (2.0) and Alex Dumais (2.0) have totaled 8.0 sacks, with 6.0 of those coming in the last two outings.

→ The Bulldogs' defensive tackles accounted for four of the team's six sacks on Saturday at Utah State.

Devastating end

Two years ago, current Atlanta Falcons' linebacker Mykal Walker was a force at defensive end for the Bulldogs. Walker was a transfer, alike current defensive end David Perales from Sacramento State. Perales has been a force just like Walker was when playing on the edge in 2018. Through four games the Merced native leads the team in tackles for loss (5.5), forced fumbles (3), fumble recoveries (2) and sits third in sacks (3.0) and tackles (22).

→ Perales has forced a fumble in three straight games.

→ Perales ranks second in fumbles recovered (2) and fourth in forced fumbles (0.75 per game) in the NCAA.

→ Against Colorado State, Perales forced a fumble and recovered a fumble, the first time a Bulldog did both in the same game since Evan Williams against Nevada on Nov. 23, 2019. Perales performed this feat again at Utah State, but this time he recovered his own forced fumble, the first Bulldog to do that since Jasad Haynes against Idaho on Sept. 1, 2018.

A sophomore captain

Since making his first career start at Hawai'i on Nov. 2, 2019, defensive back Evan Williams has made quite the impact on the Fresno State program. Then a true freshman, he was a difference maker in the Bulldogs' win on the Island as a nickel back. A week later, he led the team in tackles in his first start at free safety. The true sophomore captain has led the team in tackles twice this season. Fresno State's steady presence leads the team in tackles with 27.

→ Williams recorded his first caused turnover of the season at Utah State with a forced fumble.

→ In the last five games of 2019, Williams ranked second in tackles for the 'Dogs with 38.

Walk-on to Lux-ury

When Bralyn Lux came to Fresno State in 2019, he did so as a walk-on. He started this season as a walk-on but has quickly shown his worth. Securing the vacant defensive back spot left by the graduation of three-year starter Jaron Bryant, Lux hasn't disappointed. In four games, the redshirt freshman has totaled four pass breakups, is second on the team in tackles (25) and ranks 21st nationally and third in the MW in solo tackles per game (5.8).

CJ Jones (Freshman, DB) - father is Charlie Jones (1992-95). Jones was a star wide receiver for the Bulldogs in the 90's. He is ranked eighth in career pass receptions (187) and second in career receiving yards (3,344).

Ronnie Rivers (Senior, RB) - father is Ron Rivers (1991-93). Rivers is second all-time in career rushing yards (3,473) and holds the record for career rushing yards per carry (6.6 - minimum 200 attempts).

Leevel Tatum III (Senior, DL) - father is Leevel Tatum II (1983-84), a standout running back for the Bulldogs.

Rodney Wright III (R-Freshman, WR) - father is Rodney Wright II (1998-01). Wright II was also a wide receiver for the 'Dogs, and is fourth in career pass receptions (222) and third in receiving yardage (3,274). In 2001, Wright II had a nation-leading 104 catches for the Bulldogs alongside quarterback David Carr.

KALEN DEBOER

HEAD COACH

1ST SEASON | SIOUX FALLS (1998)

Kalen DeBoer (pronounced duh-BOR) was named the 20th head coach in Fresno State history on Dec. 17, 2019, succeeding Jeff Tedford. While he embarks on his first season at the helm of the program, it will be his third season with the Bulldogs having first arrived in 2017 with Tedford, hired as his offensive coordinator. DeBoer coached the Bulldogs for two seasons before departing for a one-year stint at Indiana in 2019.

IU sported an 8-5 record in 2019 with DeBoer as its offensive coordinator, a resurrection season said by some in the Midwest, as it was their best regular season in 26 years. The eight wins tied for the third most in school history, trailing only the 1945 and 1967 Big Ten Championships teams who each won nine games. IU posted a winning conference record for the first time since 1993 (5-3) and was nationally ranked for the first time in 25 years, breaking the oldest such drought in the country.

The Hoosiers' offense, a catalyst of the success, excelled under DeBoer ranking inside the top five in the 14-team Big Ten conference in passing offense (302.4, second), first downs (23.4, second), time of possession (33:43, third) turnovers lost (15, third), total offense (432.8, third), passing efficiency (150.6, fourth), third down conversion percentage (.469, fourth) and scoring offense (31.8, fifth).

DeBoer's two years as the Bulldogs' offensive coordinator was one for the ages that concluded with a Mountain West Championship and Las Vegas Bowl win to cap a 22-6 run during the 2017-18 seasons. Those two seasons included double-digit winning seasons each year, coming off a 1-11 campaign by the 2016 team. That feat led to Fresno State becoming the first program in FBS history to secure back-to-back double-digit winning seasons following a double-digit loss season.

Fresno State reached unprecedented heights in year No. 2 with DeBoer as the OC as the Bulldogs posted a school-record 12 victories, and finished ranked No. 18 in both the AP Top 25 and Coaches poll. The offense ranked 26th nationally in scoring offense (34.6) and 29th in passing offense (267.1), and produced five all-conference honorees. The Bulldogs finished eighth nationally in team passing efficiency (156.58), tied for 15th in turnovers lost (14), tied for 19th nationally in red zone offense (89.5 percent) and 25th in third-down conversions

(44.6). Up front, the Bulldogs' offensive line ranked in the top six nationally in fewest sacks and tackles for loss allowed per game in 2018 (6th, 5th).

Prior to joining the Bulldogs' staff, DeBoer spent three seasons as the offensive coordinator at Eastern Michigan where he helped guide the Eagles to their first bowl bid since 1987 following a 7-5 regular season. It was EMU's first season above .500 since 1995.

Prior to his three-year stint at Eastern Michigan, DeBoer spent four seasons as the offensive coordinator at Southern Illinois (2010-13) while also overseeing the wide receiver unit.

Before leading Eastern Michigan and Southern Illinois to prolific offensive numbers, DeBoer served as the head coach at the University of Sioux Falls, where he led one of the most dominant NAIA programs in the nation.

DeBoer was named a three-time NAIA National Coach of the Year and compiled an astonishing 67-3 (.957) record while guiding USF to three national championships in five seasons. He won four Great Plains Athletic Conference Championships, 50-straight home games and 29-straight games overall in his final two seasons. He also boasted a 17-2 record in the playoffs. His teams won back-to-back NAIA National Championships in 2008 and 2009, and adding in his 2006 national championship, DeBoer had as many national championships as games lost during his five-year tenure as USF's head coach.

DeBoer coached three NAIA National Players of the Year winners in quarterbacks Lorenzo Brown (2009) and Chad Cavender (2007) and running back Nick Kortan (2002). During his time at USF, he helped develop 25 first-team All-Americans.

A graduate of USF, DeBoer played for the Cougars from 1993-96, where he was an All-American wide receiver. He set school records for receptions (234), receiving yards (3,400) and touchdown catches (33).

Following his playing days, he became a student assistant for Sioux Falls under coach Bob Young in 1997. From 2000-04, he served as USF's offensive coordinator and succeeded Young as head coach in 2005.

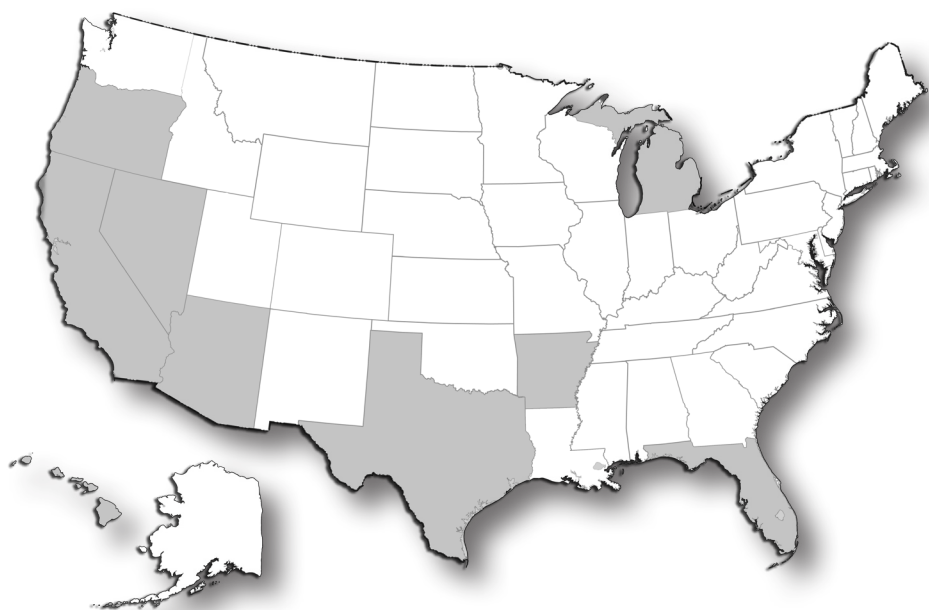

FRESNO, Calif. – The Bulldogs' long-awaited 2020 season opener was met with disappointment Saturday night as Fresno State fell 34-19 to Hawai'i at Bulldog Stadium. The Rainbow Warriors took advantage of four Bulldog turnovers with an offense that was primed to fire, racking up 552 yards.

Fresno State's offense was not stagnant by any means. They registered 409 yards, but turnovers and drives cut short in the red zone that resulted in three points instead of six points was too much to overcome.

In his first start for Fresno State, quarterback Jake Haener passed for 289 yards, one touchdown and three interceptions while running back Ronnie Rivers led the Bulldogs' offense with 124 all-purpose yards. Chevan Cordeiro, the Warriors' signal-caller, had 229 yards passing and was one of two Hawai'i players to have 100-plus yards rushing. Cordeiro added two rushing scores.

How It Happened

Fresno State opened up the game on the front foot as Bralyn Lux jarred the ball loose from the Warriors' kick returner Lincoln Victor on the opening kickoff. Mac Dalena pounced on the ball at the 26-yard line to set things up for the 'Dogs offense to score first. Facing a third-and-13, Haener hooked up with Josh Kelly across the middle for 26 yards to extend the drive. Rivers would later find a lane to the end zone for the Bulldogs' first touchdown of the 2020 season.

The Hawai'i offense countered as it went on to score 10 straight points to take a 10-7 lead with four minutes left in the half.

After pinning UH at the 1-yard line, an ensuing three-and-out by UH and a 23-yard Rivers' punt return set Fresno State up for another short scoring drive, inside the 35-yard line, again. A 15-yard run from Jordan Mims, in his first action since 2018, was followed by Haener connecting down the middle with Juan Rodriguez for an 18-yard score to put the 'Dogs back ahead 13-10 with 1:50 left in the half. The PAT was no good.

The Bulldogs' short scoring drive that put them on top, ended not the way they would of liked as Hawai'i responded quickly to take a 17-13 lead into the break. It took Cordeiro and his offense just over a minute to move the ball 72 yards for the touchdown and the lead.

Fresno State opened the second half with the ball, but committed their third turnover of the game which resulted in the 'Dogs falling behind 11 points as Hawai'i methodically drove the ball 14 plays for 76 yards.

Haener got the Bulldogs right back in business, airing it out on the first play on the following drive, connecting with Kerik Wheatfall for 46 yards. On third-and-6 from the Warriors' 25-yard line, UH's Kai Kaneshiro was tagged with a pair of penalties that put the 'Dogs inside the 10-yard line. Unable to score six points, Cesar Silva pulled the 'Dogs within eight, 24-16.

Fresno State quickly threatened again following a 49-yard missed field, but a Haener throw in UH territory ricocheted off the facemask of Wheatfall and it found the hands of the wrong team. The Warriors continued to strike, scoring again, but this time a 24-yard field goal, to extend the lead to 27-16.

The 'Dogs were again able to move the ball quick, Haener leading off the drive with a 51-yard pitch and catch to Chris Coleman. The drive again stalled inside the red zone, and the 'Dogs would settle for a 25-yard field goal from Silva to pull back within eight, 27-19, with 10:13 on the clock.

Hawai'i scored once more with 4:52 on the clock to close the game with a final result of 34-19.

FRESNO, Calif. – Kalen DeBoer earned career win No. 1 as head coach at Fresno State on Thursday night behind an emphatic 38-17 thumping of Colorado State. The Bulldogs racked up 432 yards of offense with 164 of those, and three touchdowns, coming from senior Ronnie Rivers.

Jake Haener notched his first-career 300-yard passing game, throwing for 311 yards on 22-of-32 attempts, for three touchdowns with zero interceptions. The junior quarterback spread the ball around, connecting with seven different receivers on the night. Rivers and fellow senior Kerik Wheatfall led the receivers with five receptions apiece with Wheatfall totaling a game-high 87 yards. Rivers also collected 95 yards on the ground, and eight punt return yards, to lead the team with 172 all-purpose yards.



Fresno State's defense allowed the Rams to register 381 yards offense, and limited their starting quarterback to 141 yards on 10-of-23 passing. Sophomore Evan Williams led the Bulldogs with eight tackles and redshirt freshman Bralyn Lux added six.

The Bulldogs' biggest swings in the five days since they played last came in two crucial areas, third downs and turnovers. Fresno State held the Rams to 4-of-15 on third downs versus Hawai'i going 11-of-17. The 'Dogs also protected the ball, not committing a turnover rather than four in the first outing.

How It Happened

For the second week in a row, Fresno State jumped out in front first. The Bulldogs worked the ball 86 yards on their opening drive, twice converting on third down. Haener went 4-of-4 on the possession, finishing it off with a 13-yard pass to Rivers in the back of the end zone.

Colorado State responded with 10 unanswered points over the next eight minutes to take a 10-7 lead with 13:57 on the clock in the second.

Ben Wooldridge then entered the contest at quarterback, a planned series entering the game, and opened with a 24-yard completion to Jalen Cropper. The drive resulted in a 34-yard field goal, tying the game 10-10, for Cesar Silva following what was first thought a 17-yard touchdown reception for Wheatfall. It was overturned after it was ruled he stepped out of bounds prior to the catch.

After forcing CSU to a three-and-out later in the second quarter, the Bulldogs quickly found themselves facing a fourth down decision near midfield. The 'Dogs opted to go for it on fourth-and-2 and Haener found Rivers for a gain of 14 yards. The senior back then finished the drive with a 32-yard burst down the sideline, breaking a pair of tackles on his way to the end zone to take a 17-10 advantage with 6:32 left in the first half.

With the half winding down, Fresno State doubled its lead with a 10-play, 91-yard drive. Backed up to his own two-yard line after a sack on the first play, Haener twice extended the drive on third down, first with a 34-yard completion to a diving Josh Kelly on third-and-10, and then on a 33-yard catch and run across the middle from Rivers on third-and-19. Haener finished the drive finding Mims in the flat where the back ran untouched down the left sideline for a 15-yard score.

The second half saw the Bulldog defense keep the Rams out the end zone until the final minute. Rivers and Cropper each added a touchdown during the final 30 minutes to give Fresno State the 38-17 win.

LAS VEGAS – In a city filled with shows, Ronnie Rivers was the featured act on Saturday afternoon at the newly minted Allegiant Stadium, piling up 232 all-purpose yards and four touchdowns in Fresno State's 40-27 win over UNLV. The senior running back tallied 133 rushing yards and 99 receiving yards, coming up one yard shy of being the first player to surpass 100 yards in both categories since Dale Messer in 1960.



For the third game in a row the Bulldogs produced more than 400 yards total offense, finishing with 487. The 'Dogs utilized a balanced offensive attack that saw them rush for 243 yards on 36 attempts and pass for 244 yards on 35 attempts. UNLV totaled 402 yards but the Bulldogs' defense forced the Rebels into three turnovers that resulted in 10 points. Fresno State's defense also produced a season-high six sacks.

Jake Haener threw for 164 yards and one touchdown on 15-of-23 passing. The redshirt junior also rushed for 79 yards and a score. Ben Woolldridge led the offense in four respective drives, he went 5-of-12 passing for 80 yards, and produced points on three of his four opportunities on the field.

On the defensive side, Chris Gaston became the first Bulldog in more than a year to record two interceptions in a game while David Perales and Kurtis Brown paired together for the Bulldogs' third forced turnovers. Perales forced the fumble and Brown fell on top of it. For the second game this season, Bralyn Lux led the 'Dogs in tackles, besting his previous high with nine on Saturday. Evan Williams totaled eight for second straight week. Malachi Langley and Perales each totaled seven tackles and a sack.

How It Happened

On the Bulldogs second drive, Haener and Kerie Wheatfall connected on back-to-back plays to move the ball 22 yards down field. Two plays later, Haener found an opening and called his own number off an RPO, outrunning the UNLV defense for a 54-yard touchdown to give the Bulldogs an early 6-0 lead after a failed PAT.

The lead was short lived as the Rebels scored 10 unanswered on their next two drives. A touchdown midway through the first quarter and a field goal early in the second.

Fresno State went back on top 13-10 with 9:34 remaining in the first half. Aided by a roughing the passer call on third-and-5 from the Bulldogs' own 32, quarterback Ben Woolldridge followed the penalty by linking up with Rivers for a 35-yard gain to put the 'Dogs in the red zone. A 12-yard pass to Raymond Pauwels Jr. set up a 6-yard touchdown run to the left side for Rivers behind aggressive blocking from Dontae Bull.

UNLV, though, had an answer, following up the Bulldogs' score with one of its own to put them back on top 17-13 at the 6:12 mark in the second frame.

In a seesaw first half, the Bulldogs regained the lead to close out the half. Following an 18-yard scramble from Haener, the signal caller found Rivers in the flat where the back tip-toed 33 yards down the sideline, again led by Bull in space, to put the 'Dogs ahead 20-17 at halftime.

Two plays into the second half, Perales came off the left edge and knocked the ball out of Rebels' quarterback Max Gilliam's hand for his second forced fumble in as many weeks. Brown pounced on the ball to hand possession back to the Bulldogs' offense. It took just three plays for Fresno State to capitalize and take a 27-17 lead as Rivers slipped through the middle of the line, and raced 16 yards for the score.

Behind a 27-yard field goal and a 71-yard quarterback dash by the home team, the game would once again be level, 27-27, with 3:41 left in the third quarter. Although this would be the last time UNLV would score as Fresno State closed the game outscoring the Rebels 13-0 in the fourth quarter.

Rivers scored for the fourth time in the game, capping an 11-play, 79-yard scoring drive. Rivers finished off the possession with a 3-yard run on fourth-and-2 before going 10 yards untouched into the end zone on the very next play on what was the first play of the fourth quarter.

The defense and Cesar Silva helped put the game away as the Bulldog kicker tacked on 31 and 35-yard field goals while Gaston produced a pair of late interceptions.

LOGAN, Utah – One big play after another. That was the story on Saturday afternoon as Fresno State left Maverik Stadium with its third-straight win, a 35-16 victory over Utah State.



The home team may have had two big plays before the Bulldogs got going but Fresno State quarterback Jake Haener wouldn't let those be the last of the game. The redshirt junior quarterback tossed a career-high 422 yards and four touchdowns, passing at a clip of 76.3 percent (29-of-38). It was the most passing yards by a Fresno State quarterback since Derek Carr's 2013 Mountain West championship game performance. Fifteen of Haener's completions were 10 or more yards, including touchdown throws of 44, 59 and 71 yards.

While Josh Kelly may have caught the longest pass from Haener (71 yards), it was Jalen Cropper who Haener looked to time and time again. Cropper hauled in 10 receptions for 202 yards and three touchdowns. It was the most receiving yards by a Bulldog since Davante Adams had 264 yards on Nov. 29, 2013.

Possibly overshadowed by the aerial show was the work of Ronnie Rivers who churned out 183 yards of offense on 31 touches (132 yards rushing, 51 yards receiving). The all-purpose back also scored a touchdown for the 12th straight game, the longest active streak in the NCAA.

Fresno State's defense also locked in following the Aggies' early scores, holding USU to three points and 257 yards over the final 49 minutes of the game. A week after piling up six sacks at UNLV, the 'Dogs racked up six more without the services of Kwami Jones, the league's sack leader. Kevin Atkins led the team with 2.0 on the day.

How It Happened

Utah State became the first team to score before the Bulldogs could this season, scoring one play after an interception using an 86-yard run from Jaylen Warren. Evan Williams blocked the point after try.

The Bulldogs answered with a methodical 13-play drive. Haener capitalized on a fourth-and-4 red zone conversion to tight end Rory Hanson, then found Cropper on the edge for a 9-yard score to go up 7-6. That advantage quickly disappeared behind a 94-yard kickoff return from the Aggies' special teams ace, Savon Scarver.

Fresno State regained the lead, 14-13, early in the second quarter and never trailed again. A 28-yard run from Rivers deep in the Bulldogs' territory gave the 'Dogs some breathing room. Two plays later, Haener connected with Cropper for a 59-yard touchdown to cap a quick four-play, 96-yard drive over just one minute, 27 seconds.

With less than six minutes remaining in the half, Haener bested what was his career-long pass earlier to Cropper, linking up with Josh Kelly along the sideline for 71 yards. The redshirt freshman receiver stayed in bounds and broke free from the defense, racing into the end zone for his first career touchdown.

Utah State countered on the ensuing drive, netting a 38-yard field goal with 1:59 on the clock to cut the Bulldogs' lead to five at 21-16. That was enough time for Fresno State to tack on seven more points as Haener completed five-straight passes to quickly move the 'Dogs 70 yards down the field. Rivers finished off the drive with a 4-yard run up the middle to give the Bulldogs a 28-16 advantage at the half.

After the defenses took over for much of the second half, the Bulldogs' offense could not be contained for the entirety of it like the Aggies were. The big-play connection of Haener and Cropper appeared once again in the fourth quarter as the Bulldogs' signal caller found the receiver in stride over the top of the Aggie defense for his third receiving touchdown of the game, a 44-yard score to give the 'Dogs the final result, 35-16.
