Headlines

→ Saturday's game will be the Bulldogs' first road game of the 2020 season.
 → The Bulldogs and Rebels will meet for the 23rd time on Saturday.
 → Fresno State has won 13 of its last 16 contests against UNLV.
 → The 'Dogs have scored at least 48 points against UNLV in each of their last two meetings.
 → Fresno State is seeking to go above .500 for the first time since finishing the 2018 season 12-2 and being ranked No. 18 in both the final AP & Coaches poll, respectively.
 → There have been 22 players that have made their playing debuts as Bulldogs this season.
 → There have been 10 players that have made their first starts for Fresno State in their respective careers. Seven in the Bulldogs' opener, and three more last time out.
 → **Third down turnaround:** Fresno State's offense went from 5-of-12 in game 1, to 10-of-18 in game 2. Quarterback Jake Haener was 9-of-11 passing for 153 yards on third downs against Colorado State, and moved the chains seven times on third down.
 → **Third down turnaround:** Fresno State's defense went from allowing 11-of-17 third down conversions against Hawai'i, to limiting Colorado State to 4-of-15 on third down attempts.
 → With 71 all-purpose yards at UNLV, Ronnie Rivers can move from No. 17, where he sits currently, to No. 13, on the program's all-time career all-purpose yards rankings.
 → Rivers currently owns a streak of 10-straight games scoring at least once, whether it be rushing or receiving.
 → Who's first: UNLV has not thrown an INT in 2020, while FS remains looking to grab their first INT of the season. The Bulldogs have two fumble recoveries in 2020. UNLV has lost one fumble in 2020.
 → Fresno State ranks third nationally and leads the Mountain West in sacks per game (4.0).
 → Fresno State was unable to bring its student-athletes back to campus until late September. Prior to then, the last team meeting was on March 12. The Bulldogs missed the entirety of spring football and there were no traditional summer workouts either.

Series History

Saturday's game will be the 23rd meeting all-time between the Bulldogs and Rebels. Fresno State leads the series with UNLV, 15-7. The matchup dates back to 1979, and has been a Big West, WAC and Mountain West battle over the decades.

The first meeting, in 1979 at Ratcliff Stadium (Fresno), was a 31-28 loss. Fresno State lost four of its first six all-time contests, but have won 13 of its last 16 games versus the Rebels. The teams met 10 straight times in the Big West from 1982-1991 and again in 1996-97 in the WAC.

UNLV, one of the founding members of the Mountain West's inaugural 1999 season, left the WAC, a conference affiliation they shared with the Bulldogs for just two seasons (1996-97). There was a gap from that 1997 season until 2013 when the two became conference foes again in the MW (the two schools were not scheduled for competition in the Bulldogs' inaugural 2012 MW season).

The last time the 'Dogs traveled to take on UNLV in Sin City was Nov. 3, 2018 and Fresno State won big, 48-3. That win was the first for the Bulldogs on the road in Vegas since 1996.

Scouting UNLV

UNLV (0-2, 0-2 MW) is off to a slow start to its 2020 season, opening the year with back-to-back losses to San Diego State (Oct. 24) and Nevada (Oct. 31).

The Rebels dropped their home opener to The Pack on Halloween night, their first game in Allegiant Stadium. The Wolf Pack earned a 37-19 win in the battle for the Fremont Cannon, the teams' in-state rivalry trophy.

Having trouble finding its offensive groove against a tough Aztec defense in its season opener, UNLV played three different quarterbacks in the first half and was only able to score six points to SDSU's 34 in the game. For week 2, the Rebels settled in with quarterback Max Gilliam who was 27-of-40 for 207 yards and two touchdowns. Even with the quarterback uncertainty, UNLV has not thrown an interception on the year.

A consistent anchor for the Rebel offense has been senior running back Charles Williams, a native of Fresno and graduate of Bullard High School. This season, Williams has compiled 39 carries for 179 yards, averaging 89.5 yards per game, but has yet to find the end zone. Williams was a preseason All-Mountain West selection this year, and has earned national recognition from the Doak Walker Award (top running back) watch list and the Maxwell Award (top overall player) watch list.

Similar to Fresno State, UNLV has a young roster this season with several players making their collegiate debuts in weeks one and two. The Rebels had 20 first-time players see game action in the opener at San Diego State, and four earned their first starts. UNLV also had four transfer students make their first appearance in a Rebel uniform versus the Aztecs.

UNLV is one of six MW programs to be under the leadership of a new head coach this season. Marcus Arroyo was appointed as the newest head coach for the Rebels on Dec. 13, 2019.

Last time vs. UNLV

The Bulldogs won big last time against UNLV, 56-27. The teams met last year on a Friday night (Oct. 18) at Bulldog Stadium. The Bulldogs' 56 points were the most scored that season, six TDs were scored on the ground by a trio of players.

Jalen Cropper had one of the most explosive runs of his young career, an 82-yard sprint down the field, tackled short on the 1-yard line, to set the 'Dogs up for a touchdown on the following play. Cropper led the team in rushing yards with only two attempts. Ronnie Rivers had a team-high 14 carries for 51 yards and a pair of touchdowns. Keric Wheatfall led the team in receptions with a then career-high four catches for 86 yards.

The Bulldog defense was showing out just as much as the offense, producing five takeaways in the game. Linebacker Levelle Bailey had two takeaways of his own, picking up a fumble and grabbing an interception in the first quarter of play as a true freshman.



The DeBoer era begins

The Kalen DeBoer era is finally underway after his long-awaited debut as one of six new head coaches this season in the Mountain West. The Bulldogs' former offensive coordinator (2017-18) had to wait five days to celebrate win No. 1, after falling in his first career game on Saturday, Oct. 24 against Hawai'i, but a Gatorade shower awaited him following a 38-17 thumping of Colorado State on Oct. 29. DeBoer is the 20th head coach in program history, and the return to Fresno kept the continuity and foundation that was built by former head coach Jeff Tedford. While DeBoer ushered in six new assistant coaches, who all have strong ties to his corner, four assistant coaches stayed on-board.

67-3, yes, that's a win-loss record

Kalen DeBoer was once a head coach before, at NAIA Sioux Falls. He spent 10 seasons there (2000-09), the first five as the offensive coordinator before taking over in 2005 as head coach.

Over his five seasons as head coach at Sioux Falls, he owned a 67-3 record and won three national championships. He was a three-time NAIA National Coach of the Year at Sioux Falls, won four Great Plains Athletic Conference titles, 50-straight home games and 29-consecutive games overall in his final two years. He boasted a 17-2 playoff record, 49-1 conference ledger and appeared in four-straight national championship games (2006-09). He departed with an astonishing 67-3 career record as the Sioux Falls head coach.

→ In DeBoer's two seasons at Fresno State as the offensive coordinator in 2017-18, the Bulldogs were 22-6 and won the 2018 MW Championship game.

The waiting is the hardest part

When between the lines, the other side doesn't care when Fresno State started preparing, nor will Fresno State be thinking about it. But the Bulldogs will be overcoming the odds given the team did not meet or hold any organized training in person until Sept. 25.

Prior to then, the last team meeting was on March 12. The Bulldogs missed the entirety of spring football, which was set to start March 16. There were no traditional summer workouts either. Due to local county rules and restrictions, Fresno State was unable to bring its student-athletes back to campus until late September.

Last time out

Kalen DeBoer earned career win No. 1 as head coach at Fresno State on Oct. 29 behind an emphatic 38-17 thumping of Colorado State. The Bulldogs racked up 432 yards of offense with 164 of those, and three touchdowns, coming from senior Ronnie Rivers.

Jake Haener notched his first-career 300-yard passing game, throwing for 311 yards on 22-of-32 attempts, for three touchdowns with zero interceptions. The junior quarterback spread the ball around, connecting with seven different receivers on the night. Rivers and fellow senior Keric Wheatfall led the receivers with five receptions apiece with Wheatfall totaling a game-high 87 yards. Rivers also collected 95 yards on the ground, and eight punt return yards, to lead the team with 172 all-purpose yards.

Fresno State's defense allowed the Rams to register 381 yards of offense, and limited their starting quarterback to 141 yards on 10-of-23 passing. Sophomore Evan Williams led the Bulldogs with eight tackles and redshirt freshman Bralyn Lux added six.

Offensive Groove

Last time out the Bulldogs had three drives that extended over 10 or more plays that led to touchdown drives. The first was on their opening drive of the game.

1. 12 plays, 86 yards (6:26): Touchdown
2. 10 plays, 91 yards (3:14): Touchdown
3. 12 plays, 67 yards (4:56): Touchdown

Against Hawai'i, the Bulldogs had zero drives of double-digit plays that led to points, and in eight conference games in 2019, the Bulldogs had five drives of double-digit plays that led to points (4 TD/1 FG).

New kids on the block

With the addition of four more players seeing the field for the first time last time out, there have been 22 players that have made their playing debut as a Fresno State Bulldog this season. Six have been true freshmen, and those six have played in each of the first two games.

Seven made their first starts for Fresno State in their respective careers in the Bulldogs' first game against Hawai'i, and three more got their first chance to start in their respective careers on Oct. 29 versus Colorado State.

→ In 2018, the Bulldogs played one true freshman more than the four games allotted to hold on to a redshirt season - Isaiah Johnson (So.). In 2019, six true freshmen played more than the four games allotted to hold on to a redshirt season.

Team Captains

Seniors Kevin Atkins (DT) and Matt Smith (OL), junior Jake Haener (QB) and sophomore Evan Williams (DB) were named the Bulldogs' 2020 team captains on Tuesday, Oct. 20. The captains were elected by votes from their peers.

Whew, that escalated quickly

Trailing by three points, 10-7, following a Colorado State touchdown at the 13:57 mark in the second quarter - the Bulldogs moved forward with scoring 31 consecutive points. The game was cemented with the Bulldogs' final score, a 6-yard Jalen Cropper TD reception, with 7:58 remaining in the game that gave Fresno State a 38-10 lead. Prior to CSU scoring on its final possession, leaving 41 seconds on the game clock, the Bulldogs' defense held Colorado State without points on eight-straight drives (punt-punt-punt-punt-downs-downs-fumble-downs).

Good things happen when you protect the football

The Bulldogs started out the season with four turnovers against Hawai'i and then did not commit a turnover in week 2 against Colorado State. That is typically a recipe for success when you win the turnover battle, or even better, don't commit a turnover.

Since 2017, the Bulldogs are 12-2 when committing zero turnovers.

Success on third downs

Fresno State held the time of possession advantage, 35:50 to 24:10, over Colorado State and a large reason why was converting third downs. The Bulldogs converted 10-of-18 of their third down tries, and on top of that were 2-of-2 on fourth down attempts.

While converting north of a 55 percent clip on third downs against CSU, it wasn't entirely a cake walk being so succesful as their average third down distance to go was 7.2 yards. The 'Dogs converted 2-of-5 third-and-longs (9+ yds) and converted 5-of-7 third-and-shorts (1-4 yds).

Both of Fresno State's third and long conversions came on the same drive at the end of the first half. On 3rd-and-10 from their own 9-yard line, Haener scrambled and found Josh Kelly for a 34-yard gain ... later in the series on 3rd-and-19, Haener tossed the ball to Ronnie Rivers for a 33-yard gain ... the Bulldogs capped that possession as a 10-play, 91-yard drive to go on top 24-10 at the half.

→ Quarterback Jake Haener was 9-of-11 passing for 153 yards on third downs, and moved the chains seven times on third down against CSU.

Preseason picks, FWIW

Before the 2020 season was put on hold, the Mountain West released its predicted order of finish on July 21, as voted upon by select media, and it pegged the Bulldogs to finish fourth (73) in the West Division over San Jose State (43) and UNLV (43). They were behind No. 3 Hawai'i (74), No. 2 Nevada (100) and preseason favorite San Diego State (122). Boise State was selected as the top Mountain Division team.

But this season that gets tossed out the window. Divisions were eliminated for the 2020 season and the top two teams with the highest Conference winning percentage will face off in the MW Championship game on Saturday, Dec. 19. The schedule is comprised of 46 Conference matchups playing out over eight-straight weeks with no divisional delineation.

Sweeney approved - a new #9 under center

Kevin Sweeney, quarterback for the Bulldogs from 1982-86, departed as the NCAA all-time record holder for career passing yards with 10,623, at that time. The 1987 7th round pick of the Dallas Cowboys later had his No. 9 jersey retired, and it is commemorated on the west side of Bulldog Stadium alongside six other jersey numbers that have been retired over the 98-year history of Bulldog Football.

Enter Jake Haener, and while it's not the first time that the No. 9 jersey has come out of retirement at Fresno State, Haener is the first Bulldog quarterback to don the No. 9 under center since Sweeney did. Sweeney, in agreement with head coach Kalen DeBoer, gave his blessing to Haener to wear the No. 9. It certainly helped given the Haener and Sweeney connection dates back to Bullard High School (in Fresno, Calif.) in the early 80's, where Sweeney and Jake's father, Ryan Haener, met and played on the same high school football team. The bond began the year Ryan, a sophomore, was named then-senior Sweeney's back-up and future successor for Bullard High.

Haener settles in, in second act

Junior quarterback Jake Haener's debut was one to forget, but as any first time starter, not to mention no live game reps since late in the fourth quarter on Nov. 17, 2018 as a backup for the Washington Huskies in a game they won 42-23 over Oregon State ... it takes time to settle in.

Haener had glimpses of a dominant arm with his group of talented receivers in his debut against Hawai'i. Some plays went the way of the 'Dogs and some did not. The bad first, there were three interceptions and a fumble, but there were a handful of exciting plays made, including two deep balls of 51 and 46 yards. He totaled 289 yards, and was 17-of-31 passing.

His answer, he led the Bulldogs to their most first half yards (307) since Oct. 27, 2018 - a game against Hawai'i (350) - and a 24-10 halftime lead over CSU. He was 14-of-17 passing with 210 yards in the first half, and two of the three incompletions were drops.

Haener finished the game 22-of-32 passing for 311 for three touchdowns, and zero turnovers.

Pump the brakes

The tightly contested quarterback competition was no fluke, as sophomore gunslinger Ben Wooldridge challenged Jake Haener every step of the way during the preseason. But when Wooldridge entered for a series in the second quarter against CSU, it was no controversy or indictment on Haener, head coach Kalen DeBoer said after the game it was a predetermined move to get Wooldridge a chance to showcase his knowledge of the offense. Haener was 4-of-5 for 59 yards and one touchdown when Wooldridge entered. Wooldridge was 3-of-4 for 37 yards during his single series, and his incomplection was a touchdown pass caught by Kerik Wheatfall but after review, it was deemed he stepped out of bounds and came back in.

A welcome change

Fresno State started the same five offensive linemen back-to-back weeks for the first time since games five and six of the 2019 season over the first two weeks of the 2020 season. The Bulldogs' offensive line used 10 different starting combinations over 12 games a season ago. Once a troublesome issue, it gave 10 different players a start on the offensive line a year ago, and now it's a positive as seven of those 10 who remain on the 2020 team are that much more experienced on the line (Bull, Smith, Woodley, Tuitele, Schmidt, Sampson, Abbs).

A new source for tight end production

Now out of the shadow of Jared Rice, arguably one the best tight ends in Fresno State history, senior tight end Juan Rodriguez and the Bulldogs were ready for the Portola, Calif. native to have a break out season. He produced in the season opener, catching a pass and barreled 18-yards through defenders for his first career touchdown. But in that game he fell victim to a knee injury, and it was later announced that he would miss the remainder of the season.

The Bulldogs employ a handful of two tight sets, so not only does the stakes get raised for redshirt junior Raymond Pauwels, but junior transfer Rory Hanson and sophomore Jared Torres. All three are seeking their first career catches respectively. Pauwels started his first career game against Colorado State, while Torres owns one career start in 2019.



Movin' on up!

Another week, another move up for senior running back Ronnie Rivers. After a big offensive performance from Rivers on Oct. 29 against Colorado State, the senior moved into fourth all-time for career rushing touchdowns. He scored two rushing touchdowns in the win.

→ Ronnie currently owns a streak of 10-straight games scoring at least once, whether it be rushing or receiving. All 10 of those games have been Mountain West games.

→ Over four consecutive games (10/18/19 - 11/9/19), Ronnie scored two or more touchdowns in each game. He became the first Bulldog to accomplish that feat since Reggie Brown did so in 1994. No player has ever had a streak of five straight games of multiple rushing scores.

→ Ronnie has eight career games with multiple rushing scores.

More career jumps for Ronnie

Rivers had 95 rushing yards last time out, and jumped up two spots on the all-time career rushing yards list. He is now 12th all-time and is quickly approaching the top 10.

He also is fourth all-time in career touchdowns with 39. His three touchdowns last week helped him pass up Davante Adams (38) on the all-time list.

He also has made the move to eighth in all-time career scoring with 234 points in a Bulldog uniform with his 39 career touchdowns - rushing and receiving.

He can run, he can catch, he has it ALL

Not only is Rivers a force on the ground for the Bulldog offense, but he can catch and is the Bulldogs' primary punt returner.

Rivers has accumulated 296 all-purpose yards this season (174 rush, 77 receiving, 45 punt return). He leads the team in the category and is averaging 148 all-purpose yards per game.

Last time out, Rivers had a game-high 172 all-purpose yards with 95 rushing yards, 69 receiving yards and eight punt return yards.

→ The senior Bulldog is among the best in program history with 3,503 career all-purpose yards. He ranks 17th all-time and is only 14 yards away from passing Robbie Rouse (2009-12), 46 yards from passing Ryan Mathews (2007-09), 61 yards from passing Martezze Waller (2012-15) and 71 yards from passing Michael Pittman (1993-97). Rivers could likely walk away from the UNLV contest ranked 13th all-time in career all-purpose yardage. He would need 236 yards to surpass Charles Smith for the No. 12 spot.

Welcome Back, Jordan Mims

Redshirt junior running back Jordan Mims is back in a jersey and pads this season after missing the entire 2019 season due to injury. He made his first appearance since Nov. 24, 2018 against Hawai'i (Oct. 24).

In his first game back, Mims had two carries for 15 yards and was one of just two running backs to see action versus the Rainbow Warriors.

Against Colorado State, Mims broke into the end zone for the first time in 705 days. He had four carries for six yards rushing and three receptions for 48 yards and a touchdown against the Rams. His touchdown play was a 23-yard score straight into the checkerboard end zone.

Mims and Ronnie Rivers both started as true freshmen in 2017, and Mims notched Rivers in season yardage that year, leading all running backs with 672 yards, albeit Rivers did miss some time to injury that season. Mims owns 1,084 career-rushing yards.

A duo any defense should be afraid of

The Bulldogs' running back duo of Ronnie Rivers and Jordan Mims is back again for the first time since the 2018 season, and they have not skipped a beat.

In just two games this season, the pair has totaled 195 rushing yards. But that's not all they can do. Shocking to some, the running back duo has also accumulated a combined 11 receptions for 133 yards and two touchdowns this season.

A new leader emerging

With the 2019 leading receiver Zane Pope out due to injury, the wide receiver room was looking for somebody to fill in the shoes of last season's leader. Senior Keric Wheatfall has wasted no time jumping in on that role. Through two games, Wheatfall leads the team with 160 receiving yards and eight catches. He is sixth in the conference with 80 receiving yards per game.

→ The senior tied his career-long reception in the 2020 season opener with a 46-yard catch from Jake Haener.

→ Wheatfall had a career-high five receptions against Colorado State on Oct. 29.

Showcasing all of the options

Fresno State went through an adjustment period with first-year Bulldog quarterback Jake Haener leading the charge. One promising thing for the Bulldog offense is that there are plenty of options available for Haener.

Through two games this season, nine receivers (six receivers, two running backs and one tight end) have gained yardage for the Bulldogs through the air and five (three running backs, one receiver and Haener) have found a way on the ground.

The offensive wealth has been shared fairly evenly with Keric Wheatfall leading the team with eight receptions, and Erik Brooks, Ronnie Rivers and Jalen Cropper having six apiece. Josh Kelly and Jordan Mims have five catches each.

→ Of the Bulldogs who have played in both games this season, discounting tight end Juan Rodriguez who is out to an injury suffered during game one, each receiver has over 35 yards no matter the amount of receptions.



New faces on defense

When the Bulldog defense lined up for the first time this season on Oct. 24 vs. Hawai'i, it looked a bit different from the start of last year. Fresno State started nine different players from its 2019 season opener. Five different players had never even started - one on the defensive line, two at linebacker and two in the secondary. Also of note was Wylan Free moving back to cornerback, a place where he started at in 2018 before moving to free safety in 2019.

At the start of 2019, it was six new starters from the 2018 opener, but two starters from the previous year moved positions. The difference from 2019 and 2020 - every starter from that squad had seen playing time previously. For David Perales, Jacob Hollins and Bralyn Lux, it was their first time ever seeing field for the Bulldogs.

What a difference a week makes

When the Bulldogs took the field in week one, the defense looked as one might expect after missing a spring and summer full of workouts. While they may have looked a step slow, they weren't in week two against Colorado State. Yards were down. Average per play was down. Completions were down. First downs and third-down conversions were down. And most importantly, points were significantly down. After allowing 38 points in its opener, the Fresno State defense took that performance personal and allowed just 17 points to Colorado State. The 'Dogs held CSU to 10 points through 59 minutes before giving up a late touchdown while holding a 28-point lead.

→ The Bulldogs yielded 24 points less to the Rams in this season's contest after falling 41-31 to CSU last year in Bulldog Stadium.

Money down

Third down is considered the money down. It can be the difference between wins and losses. Finishing 4-8 last season, the Bulldogs were 1-6 when allowing its opponents to convert north of 40 percent on third down. That down was a strong indicator for Fresno State again in each of its first two games. In its 2020 opener the home team struggled to get the Hawai'i offense off the field with the Warriors converting at a 68.8 percent clip (11-of-16). A week later, the Bulldog defense did a complete 180, holding Colorado State to 4-of-15 (26.7 percent) on third down. The drastic difference in third down conversions between week one and week two aided in a 17-point difference, giving up 34 to Hawai'i and only 17 to CSU.

Shoring up the run

A week after allowing 300-plus yards on the ground for only the third time in the last three seasons, Fresno State trimmed Hawai'i's total of 323 by more than half when 'Dogs faced Colorado State, keeping the Rams to 158.

→ The 'Dogs held the Rams to just one rushing touchdown compared to four a week earlier.

→ CSU gained 3.7 yards per rush, 2.4 lower than Hawai'i averaged per carry.

Getting into the backfield

In 2019, Fresno State struggled to get to opposing quarterbacks from the edge. As a collective, the Bulldogs' defensive ends totaled 6.5 sacks in 12 games (includes Mykal Walker who split time at linebacker). This season, the Bulldogs' ends have been much more active, accounting for 5.5 of the team's 8.0 sacks in only two games.

→ Fresno State ranks third nationally and leads the Mountain West in sacks per game (4.0).

→ Of the Bulldogs' three ends who have been featured the most in 2020, they combined to play in four games in 2019. Kwami Jones (3.0 sacks) played in the final four games while David

Perales (1.5 sacks) redshirted the year after transferring from Sacramento State and Da'Marcus Johnson (1.0 sack) was playing for American River College.

→ Jones ranks second nationally sacks per game (3.0) and fifth in tackles for loss per game (2.0).

Not a common occurrence

It had been almost three years since a Fresno State player had recorded three sacks in a game. Before that, it was about another three years. Kwami Jones became the latest Bulldog to add his name to a list of 'Dogs to perform the feat when the senior defensive end got to Hawai'i quarterback Chevan Cordeiro three times in the first quarter on Oct. 24. It was just the third time during the last 10 years it had been done.

→ In November of 2014, it was Tyler Davison with three. In November of 2017, Tobenna Okeke produced three. Then it was Jones' turn. The commonality – Hawai'i. All three times a Bulldog has had three sacks in a game during the last 10 years, it came against UH.

→ Jones was sidelined for the majority of 2019, he played in the final four games of his senior season, which allowed him to return this year.

Avoiding paralysis by analysis

With a defense that has seen seven players start for the first time in 2020, redshirt junior David Perales jumped in head first after redshirting in 2019 and has been a bright spot for the Bulldogs on the end. Through two games the Sacramento State transfer sits fourth on the team in tackles (9), second in tackles for loss (2.5) and sacks (1.5).

→ Against Colorado State, Perales forced a fumble and recovered a fumble, the first time a Bulldog did both in the same game since Evan Williams against Nevada on Nov. 23, 2019.

A sophomore captain

Since making his first career start at Hawai'i on Nov. 2, 2019, defensive back Evan Williams has made quite the impact on the Fresno State program. Then a true freshman, he was a difference maker in the Bulldogs' win on the Island as a nickel back. A week later, he led the team in tackles in his first start at free safety. On Oct. 29, the sophomore captain once again led the team in tackles with eight against Colorado State, moving him to third on the team with 12.

→ In the last five games of 2019, Williams ranked second in tackles for the 'Dogs with 38.

Walk-on to Lux-ury

When Bralyn Lux came to Fresno State in 2019, he did so as a walk-on. He started this season as a walk-on but has quickly shown his worth. Securing the vacant defensive back spot left by the graduation of three-year starter Jaron Bryant, Lux hasn't disappointed. In two games, the redshirt freshman has totaled a pair of pass breakups and ranks fifth nationally in solo tackles per game (7.0).

Who is going to tackle?

No Rice. No Walker. No Hughes. Fresno State entered the 2020 season without its top three tacklers from last season. Through two games newly minted starters Sherwin King Jr. and Bralyn Lux have led the team with 14 tackles each. Sophomore safety Evan Williams sits behind them in third with 12. Joining King Jr. and Lux in the Bulldogs' top six are two other first-year starters in Deonte Perry (9) and David Perales (9).

→ The Bulldogs 2019 trio of Justin Rice, Mykal Walker and Juju Hughes combined for 288 tackles, 34.7 percent of the team's tackles in 2019. Arron Mosby (78) and Wylan Free (64) are the only returning 'Dogs with at least 50 tackles last year.

→ Fresno State has not lost its top three tacklers in an offseason since prior to the 2007 season. Following 2006, the Bulldogs lost Dwayne Andrews (87), Josh Sherley (82) and Alan Goodwin (65) to graduation.

→ The Bulldogs went 4-8 in 2006 but the following year finished 9-4 and defeated Georgia Tech in the Humanitarian Bowl.

Ronnie Rivers (Senior, RB) - father is Ron Rivers (1991-93). Rivers is second all-time in career rushing yards (3,473) and holds the record for career rushing yards per carry (6.6 - minimum 200 attempts).

Leevel Tatum III (Senior, DL) - father is Leevel Tatum II (1983-84), a standout running back for the Bulldogs.

Rodney Wright III (R-Freshman, WR) - father is Rodney Wright II (1998-01). KALEN DEBOER

HEAD COACH

1ST SEASON | SIOUX FALLS (1998)

Kalen DeBoer (pronounced duh-BOR) was named the 20th head coach in Fresno State history on Dec. 17, 2019, succeeding Jeff Tedford. While he embarks on his first season at the helm of the program, it will be his third season with the Bulldogs having first arrived in 2017 with Tedford, hired as his offensive coordinator. DeBoer coached the Bulldogs for two seasons before departing for a one-year stint at Indiana in 2019.

IU sported an 8-5 record in 2019 with DeBoer as its offensive coordinator, a resurrection season said by some in the Midwest, as it was their best regular season in 26 years. The eight wins tied for the third most in school history, trailing only the 1945 and 1967 Big Ten Championships teams who each won nine games. IU posted a winning conference record for the first time since 1993 (5-3) and was nationally ranked for the first time in 25 years, breaking the oldest such drought in the country.

The Hoosiers' offense, a catalyst of the success, excelled under DeBoer ranking inside the top five in the 14-team Big Ten conference in passing offense (302.4, second), first downs (23.4, second), time of possession (33:43, third) turnovers lost (15, third), total offense (432.8, third), passing efficiency (150.6, fourth), third down conversion percentage (.469, fourth) and scoring offense (31.8, fifth).

DeBoer's two years as the Bulldogs' offensive coordinator was one for the ages that concluded with a Mountain West Championship and Las Vegas Bowl win to cap a 22-6 run during the 2017-18 seasons. Those two seasons included double-digit winning seasons each year, coming off a 1-11 campaign by the 2016 team. That feat led to Fresno State becoming the first program in FBS history to secure back-to-back double-digit winning seasons following a double-digit loss season.

Fresno State reached unprecedented heights in year No. 2 with DeBoer as the OC as the Bulldogs posted a school-record 12 victories, and finished ranked No. 18 in both the AP Top 25 and Coaches poll. The offense ranked 26th nationally in scoring offense (34.6) and 29th in passing offense (267.1), and produced five all-conference honorees. The Bulldogs finished eighth nationally in team passing efficiency (156.58), tied for 15th in turnovers lost (14), tied for 19th nationally in red zone offense (89.5 percent) and 25th in third-down conversions

(44.6). Up front, the Bulldogs' offensive line ranked in the top six nationally in fewest sacks and tackles for loss allowed per game in 2018 (6th, 5th).

Prior to joining the Bulldogs' staff, DeBoer spent three seasons as the offensive coordinator at Eastern Michigan where he helped guide the Eagles to their first bowl bid since 1987 following a 7-5 regular season. It was EMU's first season above .500 since 1995.

Prior to his three-year stint at Eastern Michigan, DeBoer spent four seasons as the offensive coordinator at Southern Illinois (2010-13) while also overseeing the wide receiver unit.

Before leading Eastern Michigan and Southern Illinois to prolific offensive numbers, DeBoer served as the head coach at the University of Sioux Falls, where he led one of the most dominant NAIA programs in the nation.

DeBoer was named a three-time NAIA National Coach of the Year and compiled an astonishing 67-3 (.957) record while guiding USF to three national championships in five seasons. He won four Great Plains Athletic Conference Championships, 50-straight home games and 29-straight games overall in his final two seasons. He also boasted a 17-2 record in the playoffs. His teams won back-to-back NAIA National Championships in 2008 and 2009, and adding in his 2006 national championship, DeBoer had as many national championships as games lost during his five-year tenure as USF's head coach.

DeBoer coached three NAIA National Players of the Year winners in quarterbacks Lorenzo Brown (2009) and Chad Cavender (2007) and running back Nick Kortan (2002). During his time at USF, he helped develop 25 first-team All-Americans.

A graduate of USF, DeBoer played for the Cougars from 1993-96, where he was an All-American wide receiver. He set school records for receptions (234), receiving yards (3,400) and touchdown catches (33).

Following his playing days, he became a student assistant for Sioux Falls under coach Bob Young in 1997. From 2000-04, he served as USF's offensive coordinator and succeeded Young as head coach in 2005.

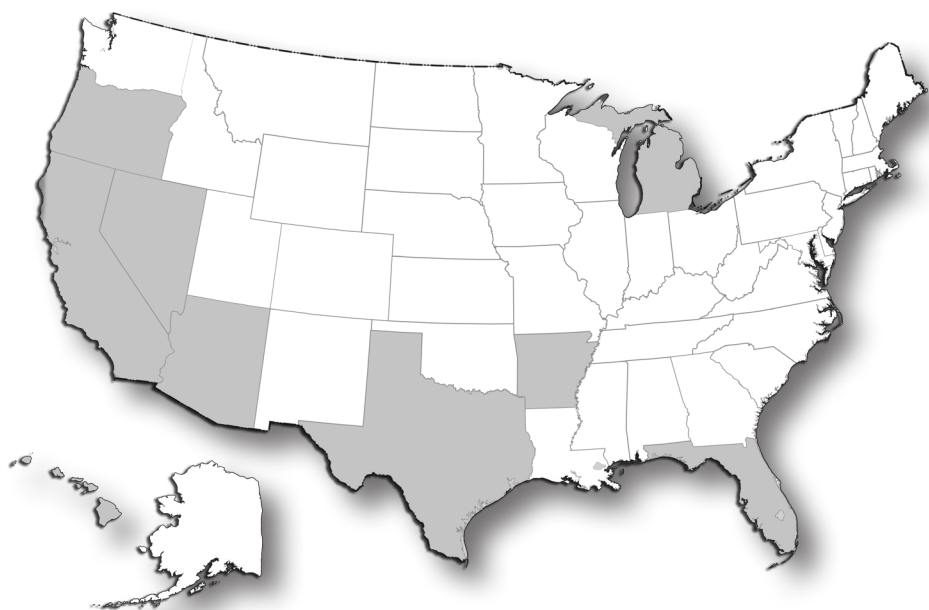

FRESNO, Calif. – The Bulldogs' long-awaited 2020 season opener was met with disappointment Saturday night as Fresno State fell 34-19 to Hawai'i at Bulldog Stadium. The Rainbow Warriors took advantage of four Bulldog turnovers with an offense that was primed to fire, racking up 552 yards.

Fresno State's offense was not stagnant by any means. They registered 409 yards, but turnovers and drives cut short in the red zone that resulted in three points instead of six points was too much to overcome.

In his first start for Fresno State, quarterback Jake Haener passed for 289 yards, one touchdown and three interceptions while running back Ronnie Rivers led the Bulldogs' offense with 124 all-purpose yards. Chevan Cordeiro, the Warriors' signal-caller, had 229 yards passing and was one of two Hawai'i players to have 100-plus yards rushing. Cordeiro added two rushing scores.

How It Happened

Fresno State opened up the game on the front foot as Bralyn Lux jarred the ball loose from the Warriors' kick returner Lincoln Victor on the opening kickoff. Mac Dalena pounced on the ball at the 26-yard line to set things up for the 'Dogs offense to score first. Facing a third-and-13, Haener hooked up with Josh Kelly across the middle for 26 yards to extend the drive. Rivers would later find a lane to the end zone for the Bulldogs' first touchdown of the 2020 season.

The Hawai'i offense countered as it went on to score 10 straight points to take a 10-7 lead with four minutes left in the half.

After pinning UH at the 1-yard line, an ensuing three-and-out by UH and a 23-yard Rivers' punt return set Fresno State up for another short scoring drive, inside the 35-yard line, again. A 15-yard run from Jordan Mims, in his first action since 2018, was followed by Haener connecting down the middle with Juan Rodriguez for an 18-yard score to put the 'Dogs back ahead 13-10 with 1:50 left in the half. The PAT was no good.

The Bulldogs' short scoring drive that put them on top, ended not the way they would of liked as Hawai'i responded quickly to take a 17-13 lead into the break. It took Cordeiro and his offense just over a minute to move the ball 72 yards for the touchdown and the lead.

Fresno State opened the second half with the ball, but committed their third turnover of the game which resulted in the 'Dogs falling behind 11 points as Hawai'i methodically drove the ball 14 plays for 76 yards.

Haener got the Bulldogs right back in business, airing it out on the first play on the following drive, connecting with Kerik Wheatfall for 46 yards. On third-and-6 from the Warriors' 25-yard line, UH's Kai Kaneshiro was tagged with a pair of penalties that put the 'Dogs inside the 10-yard line. Unable to score six points, Cesar Silva pulled the 'Dogs within eight, 24-16.

Fresno State quickly threatened again following a 49-yard missed field, but a Haener throw in UH territory ricocheted off the facemask of Wheatfall and it found the hands of the wrong team. The Warriors continued to strike, scoring again, but this time a 24-yard field goal, to extend the lead to 27-16.

The 'Dogs were again able to move the ball quick, Haener leading off the drive with a 51-yard pitch and catch to Chris Coleman. The drive again stalled inside the red zone, and the 'Dogs would settle for a 25-yard field goal from Silva to pull back within eight, 27-19, with 10:13 on the clock.

Hawai'i scored once more with 4:52 on the clock to close the game with a final result of 34-19.

FRESNO, Calif. – Kalen DeBoer earned career win No. 1 as head coach at Fresno State on Thursday night behind an emphatic 38-17 thumping of Colorado State. The Bulldogs racked up 432 yards of offense with 164 of those, and three touchdowns, coming from senior Ronnie Rivers.

Jake Haener notched his first-career 300-yard passing game, throwing for 311 yards on 22-of-32 attempts, for three touchdowns with zero interceptions. The junior quarterback spread the ball around, connecting with seven different receivers on the night. Rivers and fellow senior Kerik Wheatfall led the receivers with five receptions apiece with Wheatfall totaling a game-high 87 yards. Rivers also collected 95 yards on the ground, and eight punt return yards, to lead the team with 172 all-purpose yards.



Fresno State's defense allowed the Rams to register 381 yards offense, and limited their starting quarterback to 141 yards on 10-of-23 passing. Sophomore Evan Williams led the Bulldogs with eight tackles and redshirt freshman Bralyn Lux added six.

The Bulldogs' biggest swings in the five days since they played last came in two crucial areas, third downs and turnovers. Fresno State held the Rams to 4-of-15 on third downs versus Hawai'i going 11-of-17. The 'Dogs also protected the ball, not committing a turnover rather than four in the first outing.

How It Happened

For the second week in a row, Fresno State jumped out in front first. The Bulldogs worked the ball 86 yards on their opening drive, twice converting on third down. Haener went 4-of-4 on the possession, finishing it off with a 13-yard pass to Rivers in the back of the end zone.

Colorado State responded with 10 unanswered points over the next eight minutes to take a 10-7 lead with 13:57 on the clock in the second.

Ben Wooldridge then entered the contest at quarterback, a planned series entering the game, and opened with a 24-yard completion to Jalen Cropper. The drive resulted in a 34-yard field goal, tying the game 10-10, for Cesar Silva following what was first thought a 17-yard touchdown reception for Wheatfall. It was overturned after it was ruled he stepped out of bounds prior to the catch.

After forcing CSU to a three-and-out later in the second quarter, the Bulldogs quickly found themselves facing a fourth down decision near midfield. The 'Dogs opted to go for it on fourth-and-2 and Haener found Rivers for a gain of 14 yards. The senior back then finished the drive with a 32-yard burst down the sideline, breaking a pair of tackles on his way to the end zone to take a 17-10 advantage with 6:32 left in the first half.

With the half winding down, Fresno State doubled its lead with a 10-play, 91-yard drive. Backed up to his own two-yard line after a sack on the first play, Haener twice extended the drive on third down, first with a 34-yard completion to a diving Josh Kelly on third-and-10, and then on a 33-yard catch and run across the middle from Rivers on third-and-19. Haener finished the drive finding Mims in the flat where the back ran untouched down the left sideline for a 15-yard score.

The second half saw the Bulldog defense keep the Rams out the end zone until the final minute. Rivers and Cropper each added a touchdown during the final 30 minutes to give Fresno State the 38-17 win.
