Headlines

→ The Bulldogs and Aggies will meet for the 32nd time on Saturday.
 → While these two teams have met 31 times before, the Bulldogs have traveled to Logan just two times since 2010. The 'Dogs won 41-24 in 2010, and fell 38-20 in 2016.
 → With Utah State interim head coach Frank Maile now at the helm, the Bulldogs enter their fourth straight game facing an opponent with a first-year head coach.
 → Last week, the Bulldogs went on the road for the first time in 2020, and defeated UNLV 40-27. The Bulldogs play a unique 2-2-2-2 format of home and away games over eight straight weeks this season.
 → The Bulldogs outscored UNLV 13-0 in the fourth quarter, and held them to 40 yards total offense in the final frame to close out their second win of the season.
 → Ronnie Rivers earned his first career Mountain West player of the week honor this week after the senior running back racked up 232 all-purpose yards and scored a single-game career-high four touchdowns in the Bulldogs' win over UNLV.
 → Fresno State is one of 38 FBS teams averaging 30 points or better (min. 3 games played).
 → Fresno State has manufactured 400 yards total offense or better in each of its first three games. It is the longest such streak since 2018.
 → Ronnie Rivers is one touchdown shy of tying the Fresno State program record for career touchdowns. Rivers owns 43 career TDs and trails program leader Anthony Daigle who scored 44 from 1991-93 -- one of his father's teammates.
 → In last week's game at UNLV, Fresno State's defense racked up six sacks. It was the most since the Bulldogs totaled six, ironically against the Rebels, on Oct. 16, 2015.
 → Fresno State ranks sixth nationally in sacks per game (4.67).
 → The forecast on Saturday calls for a chance of snow. The last time the Bulldogs played in those elements was the 2018 Mountain West Championship game when they defeated Boise State, 19-16 in overtime.

Series History with the Aggies

Fresno State leads the all-time series against Utah State, 17-13-1. The two teams first met in 1952.

In four meetings since Fresno State and Utah State began sharing conference affiliation in the Mountain West in 2013, Utah State has won three games while the 'Dogs have won one. But that one, was a big one, as the Bulldogs won the inaugural MW Championship game against the Aggies in 2013.

It has been four years since the Bulldogs last made the trip to Logan, Utah. Fresno State traveled to Logan for an Oct. 22, 2016 matchup in the program's infamous 1-11 season. The 'Dogs fought a tough fight in the opening half, trailing by three as they headed to the locker room but Utah State used a 14-point fourth quarter to seal a 38-20 win.

→ This Saturday will be just the third game for the Bulldogs in Logan since 2010. In a WAC contest, Fresno State won 41-24 on Sept. 18, 2010 - the last win for the 'Dogs in Logan.

Scouting Utah State

Utah State is 0-3 this season. The Aggies are coming off of a 34-9 loss at Nevada on Nov. 5. Their other losses have been to Boise State and San Diego State.

Following the 0-3 start, Utah State made the decision to release Gary Andersen of his football head coaching duties. With the announcement, assistant head coach and co-defensive coordinator Frank Maile was named interim head coach. The decision was made on Nov. 7.

The Aggies have been outscored by their opponents 114-29 this season. Utah State is averaging just 9.67 points and 209.3 yards of total offense per game this season. They have scored points on four touchdowns, three PATs and a safety in three games this year. Quarterback Jason Shelley is 42-of-75 with two interceptions for the Aggies. He has thrown for 276 yards on the year and is averaging 92.0 yards per game.

Defensively, Utah State is led by Shaq Bond with 26 tackles and 3.0 TFLs. As a team, the Aggies have racked up 21 TFLs and eight sacks. The Aggies have not registered a takeaway this season.

Utah State boasts the 2020 preseason All-Mountain West kick returner in senior Savon Scarver. In three games this year, Scarver has four returns for 102 yards. He had a season-long 30-yard kickoff return last time out.

On a different note, Utah State ranks seventh in the NCAA and second in the Mountain West in fewest penalties per game. The Aggies have 11 penalties for a loss of 104 yards in three games on the year. They're averaging 3.67 penalties for a loss of 34.7 yards per game.

Utah State is attempting to fill the void left by all-conference quarterback Jordan Love, who they lost to the 2019 NFL Draft. Defensively, they are also having to make up for the loss of all-conference linebacker David Woodward. Both players made the decision to forego their senior seasons and declare for the draft.

Last time vs. Utah State

Just like each loss for the Bulldogs in 2019, the loss to Utah State came down to the very end and was decided by a game-winning field goal that gave Utah State a 37-35 road win over the 'Dogs on Nov. 9, 2019.

The Bulldog offensive leaders in rushing and receiving from last season return this year as Ronnie Rivers led with 102 rushing yards and three touchdowns, and Jalen Cropper led with three catches for 87 yards.

Defensively, the 'Dogs return the leading tackler from the 2019 game as well. Evan Williams, then a true freshman in his second career start, led the team with a career-high nine tackles.

This is the first time this season that the Bulldogs return three stat leaders from facing the same opponent in 2019.



The DeBoer era

The Kalen DeBoer era is in full swing after his long-awaited debut as one of six new head coaches this season in the Mountain West. The Bulldogs' former offensive coordinator (2017-18) had to wait five days to celebrate win No. 1, after falling in his first career game on Oct. 24 against Hawai'i, but the 'Dogs have been rolling since. A Gatorade shower awaited him following a 38-17 thumping of Colorado State on Oct. 29, and on Nov. 7 he took his 'Dogs on their first road trip of the season and came away with a 40-27 win at UNLV. DeBoer is the 20th head coach in program history, and the return to Fresno kept the continuity and foundation that was built by former head coach Jeff Tedford. While DeBoer ushered in six new assistant coaches, who all have strong ties to his corner, four assistant coaches stayed on-board.

67-3, yes, that's a win-loss record

Kalen DeBoer was once a head coach before, at NAIA Sioux Falls. He spent 10 seasons there (2000-09), the first five as the offensive coordinator before taking over in 2005 as head coach.

Over his five seasons as head coach at Sioux Falls, he owned a 67-3 record and won three national championships. He was a three-time NAIA National Coach of the Year at Sioux Falls, won four Great Plains Athletic Conference titles, 50-straight home games and 29-consecutive games overall in his final two years. He boasted a 17-2 playoff record, a 49-1 conference ledger and appeared in four-straight national championship games (2006-09). He departed with an astonishing 67-3 career record as the Sioux Falls head coach.

→ In DeBoer's two seasons at Fresno State as the offensive coordinator in 2017-18, the Bulldogs were 22-6 and won the 2018 MW Championship game.

The waiting is the hardest part

When between the lines neither football team is thinking, or cares, when Fresno State started preparing, nor will Fresno State use it as an excuse. But the Bulldogs are defying the odds given the team did not meet or hold any organized training in person until Sept. 25.

Prior to then, the last team meeting was on March 12. The Bulldogs missed the entirety of spring football, which was set to start March 16. There were no traditional summer workouts either. Due to local county rules and restrictions, Fresno State was unable to bring its student-athletes back to campus until late September while the NCAA allowed involuntary workouts to begin June 1, and mandatory workouts to begin July 17.

Last time out

Ronnie Rivers was the featured act last time out at the newly minted Allegiant Stadium, as he piled up 232 all-purpose yards and four touchdowns in Fresno State's 40-27 win over UNLV. The senior running back tallied 133 rushing yards and 99 receiving yards, coming up one yard shy of being the first player to surpass 100 yards in both categories since Dale Messer in 1960.

For the third game in a row the Dogs produced more than 400 yards total offense, finishing with 487. UNLV totaled 402 yards but the Bulldogs' defense forced the Rebels into three turnovers that resulted in 10 points. Fresno State's defense also produced a season-high six sacks.

One Bulldog made his collegiate debut last time out. Following the addition of four players seeing the field for the first time against Colorado State, there have been 23 players that have made their playing debut as a Fresno State Bulldog this season. Six have been true freshmen, and those six have played in each of the first three games.

Seven made their first starts for Fresno State in their respective careers in the Bulldogs' first game against Hawai'i, and three more got their first chance to start in their respective careers on Oct. 29 versus Colorado State. Junior Kurtis Brown joined the crew and earned his first Bulldog start at UNLV.

Finish strong, 4's up

Last weekend at UNLV, when the third quarter came to a close, the game was knotted, 27-27. Following a 2019 season where Fresno State battled in six one-score games and fell in five of six of them (including Utah State), there's been an emphasis on embracing the pressure of the fourth quarter and to not be overwhelmed by the situation this season. Well, that paid off as the Bulldogs outscored UNLV 13-0, on the road, to take home the win. Fresno State held UNLV to 40 total yards in the final frame, and 27 of those yards came on one 27-yard dash by Charles Williams as time expired on the final play of the game when the Bulldogs had seven defenders dropped back deep.

Every game was a fight

Of the Bulldogs' eight losses in 2019, their trip to Air Force (L, 43-24) was the sole contest they found themselves not within striking distance. The season was so close to swinging in the other direction that the Bulldogs' total point differential for the season was minus-1.

Over 12 games, Fresno State scored 360 points and allowed 361.

Offensive coordinator, and play caller, Ryan Grubb has the Bulldogs' offense ranked No. 3 in the Mountain West in points per game with 32.3. Fresno State has topped 400 yards total offense in each of its first three games, and have been on an upwards track over each contest. In the opener against Hawai'i, Fresno State had 34 points and 407 yards, week 2 vs. Colorado State had 38 points and 432 yards, and last time out had 40 points and 487 yards.

→ Fresno State is one of 38 FBS teams averaging 30 points or better (min. 3 games played).

→ The last time the 'Dogs had three-straight games with 400 yards total offense or better was games 7, 8 & 9 of the season in 2018 (Oct. 20 at New Mexico-433, Oct. 27 vs. Hawai'i-562, Nov. 3 at UNLV-466).

→ The last time the 'Dogs had four-straight games with 400 yards total offense or better was in 2013 behind the offensive duo of Derek Carr and Davante Adams. That last streak of four, 400-yard games was actually five-straight contests in games 8, 9, 10, 11 & 12 of the season in 2013 (Nov. 2 vs. Nevada-647, Nov. 9 at Wyoming-600, Nov. 23 vs. New Mexico-822, Nov. 29 at San Jose State-646, Dec. 7 vs. Utah State-460).

Protect the rock

The Bulldogs started out the season with four turnovers against Hawai'i and then did not commit a turnover in week 2 against Colorado State. And then went 59:51 into their game against UNLV before a late fumble on a bad exchange on a zone read between Jake Haener and Jordan Mims. They were nine seconds away from back-to-back games with no turnovers for the first time since games 10 & 11 during the 2018 season.

→ Since 2017, the Bulldogs are 12-2 when committing zero turnovers.

Sweeney approved - a new #9 under center

Kevin Sweeney, quarterback for the Bulldogs from 1982-86, departed as the NCAA all-time record holder for career passing yards with 10,623, at that time. The 1987 7th round pick of the Dallas Cowboys later had his No. 9 jersey retired, and it is commemorated on the west side of Bulldog Stadium alongside six other jersey numbers that have been retired over the 98-year history of Bulldog Football.

Enter Jake Haener, and while it's not the first time that the No. 9 jersey has come out of retirement at Fresno State, Haener is the first Bulldog quarterback to don the No. 9 under center since Sweeney did. Sweeney, in agreement with head coach Kalen DeBoer, gave his blessing to Haener to wear the No. 9. It certainly helped given the Haener and Sweeney connection dates back to Bullard High School (in Fresno, Calif.) in the early 80's, where Sweeney and Jake's father, Ryan Haener, met and played on the same high school football team. The bond began the year Ryan, a sophomore, was named then-senior Sweeney's back-up and future successor for Bullard High.

Watch out Ronnie, just kidding

Quarterback Jake Haener showed he can run the ball too, sprinting for a 54-yard touchdown against UNLV, as well as recording runs of 35 and 19 yards in the contest. The signal caller net 79 yards in the game, but gained 107 yards. He was sacked four times, which reduced his rushing output.

→ Haener's 54-yard touchdown rush was the longest run by a quarterback since Marcus McMaryion scampered for 57 yards in 2017 against New Mexico (Oct. 14). It was the longest TD run by a Bulldog quarterback since Brian Burrell ran 66 yards for a score in 2014 against Nebraska (Sept. 13).

Haener settles in

Junior quarterback Jake Haener got off to a turbulent start, but it's been smooth skies since. Against Hawai'i, Fresno State's opener, it was Haener's first start, and first live game reps since late in the fourth quarter on Nov. 17, 2018 as a backup for the Washington Huskies against Oregon State - a 42-23 win for UW.

A look at the first three quarters this season, and the next nine:

First three quarters vs. Hawai'i

10-of-17, 3 INT, 178 Yds., 1 TD

Last nine quarters (UH, CSU, UNLV)

44-of-69, 0 INT, 586 Yds., 4 TDs

Haener's third interception this season took place during the final seconds of the third quarter against Hawai'i, and from the fourth quarter in that game (7-of-14) and forward - he has 69 consecutive pass attempts without an interception. In the Bulldogs' two wins against Colorado State and UNLV, Haener is 37-of-55 passing for 475 yards and four touchdowns. In those games his completion percentage is 67.3 percent and passing efficiency rating is 163.82.

Quarterback depth

The tightly contested quarterback competition that was advertised from preseason camp between quarterbacks Jake Haener and Ben Wooldridge is now out in front for public view as both have seen action over the last two games. While Haener is the bonafide starter, Wooldridge has been productive with his opportunities and it shows why this battle was so tight.

Wooldridge has led the offense on five drives this season. None in game one, one in game two, and four in game three. He has produced points on four of those five attempts.

Wooldridge entered for the first series of the second quarter against CSU, it was no controversy or indictment on Haener, as head coach Kalen DeBoer said after the game it was a predetermined move to get Wooldridge a chance to showcase his knowledge of the offense. Haener was 4-of-5 for 59 yards and one touchdown when Wooldridge entered. Wooldridge was 3-of-4 for 37 yards during his single series, and his incompletion was a touchdown pass caught by Keric Wheatfall but after review, it was deemed he stepped out of bounds and came back in. Fresno State settled for a 34-yard field goal.

Wooldridge entered for the first series of the second quarter for a second straight game against UNLV, but also led the team on three drives in the second half. The Bulldogs scored a touchdown in the second quarter drive he led, and in the second half, the Bulldogs notched one more touchdown, and also a field goal on the drives he was present for.

After the UNLV game, DeBoer reiterated in the postgame press conference, "Jake's still the starting quarterback."

A welcome change

Fresno State started the same five offensive linemen three weeks in a row for the first time since 2018 over the first three weeks of the 2020 season. The Bulldogs' offensive line used 10 different starting combinations over 12 games a season ago. Once a troublesome issue, it gave 10 different players a start on the offensive line a year ago, and now it's a positive as seven of those 10 who remain on the 2020 team are that much more experienced on the line (Bull, Smith, Woodley, Tuitele, Schmidt, Sampson, Abbs).

A new source for tight end production

Now out of the shadow of Jared Rice, arguably one the best tight ends in Fresno State history, senior tight end Juan Rodriguez and the Bulldogs were ready for the Portola, Calif. native to have a break out season. He produced in the season opener, catching a pass and barreled 18-yards through defenders for his first career touchdown. But in that game he fell victim to a knee injury, and it was later announced that he would miss the remainder of the season. Redshirt junior Raymond Pauwels, junior transfer Rory Hanson and sophomore Jared Torres are now all vying to complement the Fresno State offense at the tight end position.



Another week, another move up the record book for senior running back Ronnie Rivers. It was another explosive offensive game for Rivers as he scored a career-high four touchdowns in the Bulldogs' win over the Rebels. Three of his scores were rushing, while one was a reception from Haener.

With three rushing scores on Saturday, Rivers moved up to fourth all-time with 34 career rushing touchdowns. He is just five away from tying the all-time record held by Ryan Mathews.

→ Ronnie currently owns a streak of 11-straight games scoring at least once, whether it be rushing or receiving. All 11 of those games have been Mountain West games.

More yards, more scores, more career jumps

After his first 100-yard rushing game of the season, and seventh career, Rivers broke into the top 10 for all-time for career rushing yards, moving into eighth. He recorded 133 yards on the ground on Saturday at UNLV and now has 2,429 career rushing yards.

He moved into second all-time in career touchdowns after scoring four at UNLV on Saturday. He made the jump to pass Ryan Mathews and Robbie Rouse in the Fresno State record book.

He also has made the move to sixth in all-time career scoring with 258 points in a Bulldog uniform with his 43 career touchdowns - rushing and receiving.

He can run, he can catch, he has it ALL

Not only is Rivers a force on the ground for the Bulldog offense, but he can catch and is the Bulldogs' primary punt returner.

Rivers had a season-best 232 all-purpose yards at UNLV (133 rushing, 99 receiving). His all-purpose numbers on Saturday were the most by any Mountain West player in any game this season. He also ranks 21st in the NCAA for his single-game all-purpose performance on Saturday.

Rivers has accumulated 528 all-purpose yards this season (307 rush, 176 receiving, 45 punt return). He leads the team in the category and is averaging 176 all-purpose yards per game.

→ The senior Bulldog is among the best in program history with 3,735 career all-purpose yards. He ranks 13th all-time and is only 3 yards away from passing Charles Smith (1998-01) for the No. 12 spot.

Rivers named MW Offensive Player of the Week

Ronnie Rivers earned his first career conference player of the week honor on Monday. The senior running back earned a well-deserved offensive recognition after scoring four touchdowns in the Bulldogs' win over UNLV.

His four scores were the most scored by any MW player this season, as were his three rushing touchdowns. Rivers finished the night leading the team with 133 rushing yards and 99 receiving yards. He was one receiving yard shy of being the first Bulldog to have 100-plus yards in both categories since Dale Messer in 1960.

He also posted the highest all-purpose yardage by any Mountain West player this season with 232 yards.

Rivers is the first Bulldog to earn the offensive honor since QB Marcus McMaryion did so twice in 2018.

Welcome Back, Jordan Mims

Redshirt junior running back Jordan Mims is back in a jersey and pads this season after missing the entire 2019 season due to injury. He made his first appearance since Nov. 24, 2018 against Hawai'i (Oct. 24).

In three games this season, Mims has totaled 13 carries for 29 yards, and six catches for 66 yards and a touchdown.

Mims and Ronnie Rivers both started as true freshmen in 2017, and Mims notched Rivers in season yardage that year, leading all running backs with 672 yards, albeit Rivers did miss some time to injury that season. Mims owns 1,092 career-rushing yards.

A new leader emerging

With the 2019 leading receiver Zane Pope out due to injury, the wide receiver room was looking for somebody to fill in the shoes of last season's leader. Senior Keric Wheatfall has wasted no time jumping in on that role. Through three games, Wheatfall leads the team with 225 receiving yards and 13 catches.

He is sixth in the conference with 75.0 receiving yards per game. Wheatfall is averaging 17.3 yards per catch this season.

Showcasing all of the options

Fresno State went through an adjustment period with first-year Bulldog quarterback Jake Haener leading the charge. One promising thing for the Bulldog offense is that there are plenty of options available for Haener.

Through three games this season, 10 receivers (six receivers, two running backs and two tight ends) have gained yardage for the Bulldogs through the air and seven (three running backs, one receiver and two quarterbacks) have found a way on the ground.

The offensive wealth has been shared fairly evenly with Keric Wheatfall leading the team with 13 receptions. Rivers is close behind with 12 catches while Jalen Cropper has eight, Erik Brooks has seven, and Josh Kelly and Jordan Mims have six each.

→ Three Bulldogs have surpassed 100 receiving yards so far this season with Wheatfall leading the way with 225 yards. Rivers adds 176 and Kelly has 104. Brooks is nearing with 88.

New faces on defense

When the Bulldog defense lined up for the first time this season on Oct. 24 vs. Hawai'i, it looked a bit different from the start of last year. Fresno State started nine different players from its 2019 season opener. Five different players had never even started - one on the defensive line, two at linebacker and two in the secondary. Also of note was Wylan Free moving back to cornerback, a place where he started at in 2018 before moving to free safety in 2019.

At the start of 2019, it was six new starters from the 2018 opener, but two starters from the previous year moved positions. The difference from 2019 and 2020 - every starter from that squad had seen playing time previously. For David Perales, Jacob Hollins and Bralyn Lux, it was their first time ever seeing field for the Bulldogs.

Looking like the real Bulldog defense

When the Bulldogs took the field in week one, the defense looked as one might expect after missing a spring and summer full of workouts. While they may have looked a step slow, they haven't been since. Yards are down. Completions are down. First downs are down. And most importantly, points have been down. After allowing 34 points in its opener, the Fresno State defense took that performance personal and has allowed 22 points per game in each of its last two outings.

Second-half adjustments

While the Bulldogs have allowed 27 first-half points in the last two games, they have given up 17 second-half points. Why has this been the case? In 14 second-half defensive possessions, the Bulldogs' defense has forced four turnovers, three punts, three turnover-on-downs and one which saw time expire.

→ Four of the Bulldogs' five turnovers forced this season have come in the second half.

→ The 'Dogs held CSU to 10 points through 59 minutes before giving up a late touchdown while holding a 28-point lead.

→ Fresno State allowed 10 second-half points to UNLV, seven of which resulted from a two-play drive (which included a 71-yard TD run).

Getting to the quarterback

In 2019, Fresno State struggled to get to opposing quarterbacks. Under new defensive coordinator William Inge, the 'Dogs have found a great deal of success at pressuring opposing quarterbacks. The Bulldogs have racked up 14 sacks through three games, only five behind last year's 12-game total.

→ In Saturday's game at UNLV, Fresno State's defense racked up six sacks. It was the most since the Bulldogs totaled six, ironically against the Rebels, on Oct. 16, 2015.

→ Fresno State ranks sixth nationally and second in the Mountain West in sacks per game (4.67).

Rushing from the edge

The Bulldogs' edge rushers have been a big reason this season for causing disruption for quarterbacks. As a collective, the Bulldogs' defensive ends totaled 6.5 sacks in 2019 (includes Mykal Walker who split time at linebacker), but in 2020 the group has already accounted for 7.5 of the team's 14.0 sacks in only three games.

→ Of the Bulldogs' three ends who have been featured the most in 2020, they combined to

play in four games in 2019. Kwami Jones (4.0 sacks) played in the final four games while David Perales (2.5 sacks) redshirted the year after transferring from Sacramento State and Da'Marcus Johnson (1.0 sack) was playing for American River College.

→ Jones ranks 11th nationally sacks per game (1.33) and leads the Mountain West.

Not a common occurrence

It had been almost three years since a Fresno State player had recorded three sacks in a game. Before that, it was about another three years. Kwami Jones became the latest Bulldog to add his name to a list of 'Dogs to perform the feat when the senior defensive end got to Hawai'i quarterback Chevan Cordeiro three times in the first quarter on Oct. 24. It was just the third time during the last 10 years it had been done.

→ In November of 2014, it was Tyeler Davison with three. In November of 2017, Tobenna Okeke produced three. Then it was Jones' turn. The commonality – Hawai'i. All three times a Bulldog has had three sacks in a game during the last 10 years, it came against UH.

→ Jones was sidelined for the majority of 2019, he played in the final four games of his senior season, which allowed him to return this year.

Avoiding paralysis by analysis

With a defense that has seen eight players start for the first time in their careers in 2020, redshirt junior David Perales jumped in head first after redshirting in 2019 and has been a bright spot for the Bulldogs on the end. Through three games the Sacramento State transfer sits fourth on the team in tackles (16), second in tackles for loss (4.5) and sacks (2.5).

→ Perales has forced a fumble in back-to-back games. He leads the Mountain West and ranks 21st in the nation in fumbles forced fumbles per game (0.67).

→ Against Colorado State, Perales forced a fumble and recovered a fumble, the first time a Bulldog did both in the same game since Evan Williams against Nevada on Nov. 23, 2019.

A sophomore captain

Since making his first career start at Hawai'i on Nov. 2, 2019, defensive back Evan Williams has made quite the impact on the Fresno State program. Then a true freshman, he was a difference maker in the Bulldogs' win on the Island as a nickel back. A week later, he led the team in tackles in his first start at free safety. On Oct. 29, the sophomore captain once again led the team in tackles with eight against Colorado State. Fresno State's steady presence sits second on the team in tackles with 20.

→ In the last five games of 2019, Williams ranked second in tackles for the 'Dogs with 38.

Walk-on to Lux-ury

When Bralyn Lux came to Fresno State in 2019, he did so as a walk-on. He started this season as a walk-on but has quickly shown his worth. Securing the vacant defensive back spot left by the graduation of three-year starter Jaron Bryant, Lux hasn't disappointed. In three games, the redshirt freshman has totaled three pass breakups, leads the 'Dogs in tackles (23) and ranks eighth nationally in solo tackles per game (7.0).

First to get a pick

Going into Week 3, Fresno State had yet to pull in an interception. That changed when backup defensive back Chris Gaston hauled in two in the fourth quarter at UNLV. It was the first time in more than a year that a Bulldog has recorded two interceptions in a game (Wylan Free - Sept. 28, 2019 at New Mexico State).

→ Two games without an interception to start a season was the longest stretch for Fresno State to go since 2014 when the 'Dogs went three games into a season without an INT.

Ronnie Rivers (Senior, RB) - father is Ron Rivers (1991-93). Rivers is second all-time in career rushing yards (3,473) and holds the record for career rushing yards per carry (6.6 - minimum 200 attempts).

Leevel Tatum III (Senior, DL) - father is Leevel Tatum II (1983-84), a standout running back for the Bulldogs.

Rodney Wright III (R-Freshman, WR) - father is Rodney Wright II (1998-01). Wright II was also a wide receiver for the 'Dogs, and is fourth in career pass receptions (222) and third in receiving yardage (3,274). In 2001, Wright II had a nation-leading 104 catches for the Bulldogs alongside quarterback David Carr.

KALEN DEBOER

HEAD COACH

1ST SEASON | SIOUX FALLS (1998)

Kalen DeBoer (pronounced duh-BOR) was named the 20th head coach in Fresno State history on Dec. 17, 2019, succeeding Jeff Tedford. While he embarks on his first season at the helm of the program, it will be his third season with the Bulldogs having first arrived in 2017 with Tedford, hired as his offensive coordinator. DeBoer coached the Bulldogs for two seasons before departing for a one-year stint at Indiana in 2019.

IU sported an 8-5 record in 2019 with DeBoer as its offensive coordinator, a resurrection season said by some in the Midwest, as it was their best regular season in 26 years. The eight wins tied for the third most in school history, trailing only the 1945 and 1967 Big Ten Championships teams who each won nine games. IU posted a winning conference record for the first time since 1993 (5-3) and was nationally ranked for the first time in 25 years, breaking the oldest such drought in the country.

The Hoosiers' offense, a catalyst of the success, excelled under DeBoer ranking inside the top five in the 14-team Big Ten conference in passing offense (302.4, second), first downs (23.4, second), time of possession (33:43, third) turnovers lost (15, third), total offense (432.8, third), passing efficiency (150.6, fourth), third down conversion percentage (.469, fourth) and scoring offense (31.8, fifth).

DeBoer's two years as the Bulldogs' offensive coordinator was one for the ages that concluded with a Mountain West Championship and Las Vegas Bowl win to cap a 22-6 run during the 2017-18 seasons. Those two seasons included double-digit winning seasons each year, coming off a 1-11 campaign by the 2016 team. That feat led to Fresno State becoming the first program in FBS history to secure back-to-back double-digit winning seasons following a double-digit loss season.

Fresno State reached unprecedented heights in year No. 2 with DeBoer as the OC as the Bulldogs posted a school-record 12 victories, and finished ranked No. 18 in both the AP Top 25 and Coaches poll. The offense ranked 26th nationally in scoring offense (34.6) and 29th in passing offense (267.1), and produced five all-conference honorees. The Bulldogs finished eighth nationally in team passing efficiency (156.58), tied for 15th in turnovers lost (14), tied for 19th nationally in red zone offense (89.5 percent) and 25th in third-down conversions

(44.6). Up front, the Bulldogs' offensive line ranked in the top six nationally in fewest sacks and tackles for loss allowed per game in 2018 (6th, 5th).

Prior to joining the Bulldogs' staff, DeBoer spent three seasons as the offensive coordinator at Eastern Michigan where he helped guide the Eagles to their first bowl bid since 1987 following a 7-5 regular season. It was EMU's first season above .500 since 1995.

Prior to his three-year stint at Eastern Michigan, DeBoer spent four seasons as the offensive coordinator at Southern Illinois (2010-13) while also overseeing the wide receiver unit.

Before leading Eastern Michigan and Southern Illinois to prolific offensive numbers, DeBoer served as the head coach at the University of Sioux Falls, where he led one of the most dominant NAIA programs in the nation.

DeBoer was named a three-time NAIA National Coach of the Year and compiled an astonishing 67-3 (.957) record while guiding USF to three national championships in five seasons. He won four Great Plains Athletic Conference Championships, 50-straight home games and 29-straight games overall in his final two seasons. He also boasted a 17-2 record in the playoffs. His teams won back-to-back NAIA National Championships in 2008 and 2009, and adding in his 2006 national championship, DeBoer had as many national championships as games lost during his five-year tenure as USF's head coach.

DeBoer coached three NAIA National Players of the Year winners in quarterbacks Lorenzo Brown (2009) and Chad Cavender (2007) and running back Nick Kortan (2002). During his time at USF, he helped develop 25 first-team All-Americans.

A graduate of USF, DeBoer played for the Cougars from 1993-96, where he was an All-American wide receiver. He set school records for receptions (234), receiving yards (3,400) and touchdown catches (33).



FRESNO, Calif. – The Bulldogs' long-awaited 2020 season opener was met with disappointment Saturday night as Fresno State fell 34-19 to Hawai'i at Bulldog Stadium. The Rainbow Warriors took advantage of four Bulldog turnovers with an offense that was primed to fire, racking up 552 yards.



Fresno State's offense was not stagnant by any means. They registered 409 yards, but turnovers and drives cut short in the red zone that resulted in three points instead of six points was too much to overcome.

In his first start for Fresno State, quarterback Jake Haener passed for 289 yards, one touchdown and three interceptions while running back Ronnie Rivers led the Bulldogs' offense with 124 all-purpose yards. Chevan Cordeiro, the Warriors' signal-caller, had 229 yards passing and was one of two Hawai'i players to have 100-plus yards rushing. Cordeiro added two rushing scores.

How It Happened

Fresno State opened up the game on the front foot as Bralyn Lux jarred the ball loose from the Warriors' kick returner Lincoln Victor on the opening kickoff. Mac Dalena pounced on the ball at the 26-yard line to set things up for the 'Dogs offense to score first. Facing a third-and-13, Haener hooked up with Josh Kelly across the middle for 26 yards to extend the drive. Rivers would later find a lane to the end zone for the Bulldogs' first touchdown of the 2020 season.

The Hawai'i offense countered as it went on to score 10 straight points to take a 10-7 lead with four minutes left in the half.

After pinning UH at the 1-yard line, an ensuing three-and-out by UH and a 23-yard Rivers' punt return set Fresno State up for another short scoring drive, inside the 35-yard line, again. A 15-yard run from Jordan Mims, in his first action since 2018, was followed by Haener connecting down the middle with Juan Rodriguez for an 18-yard score to put the 'Dogs back ahead 13-10 with 1:50 left in the half. The PAT was no good.

The Bulldogs' short scoring drive that put them on top, ended not the way they would of liked as Hawai'i responded quickly to take a 17-13 lead into the break. It took Cordeiro and his offense just over a minute to move the ball 72 yards for the touchdown and the lead.

Fresno State opened the second half with the ball, but committed their third turnover of the game which resulted in the 'Dogs falling behind 11 points as Hawai'i methodically drove the ball 14 plays for 76 yards.

Haener got the Bulldogs right back in business, airing it out on the first play on the following drive, connecting with Kerik Wheatfall for 46 yards. On third-and-6 from the Warriors' 25-yard line, UH's Kai Kaneshiro was tagged with a pair of penalties that put the 'Dogs inside the 10-yard line. Unable to score six points, Cesar Silva pulled the 'Dogs within eight, 24-16.

Fresno State quickly threatened again following a 49-yard missed field, but a Haener throw in UH territory ricocheted off the facemask of Wheatfall and it found the hands of the wrong team. The Warriors continued to strike, scoring again, but this time a 24-yard field goal, to extend the lead to 27-16.

The 'Dogs were again able to move the ball quick, Haener leading off the drive with a 51-yard pitch and catch to Chris Coleman. The drive again stalled inside the red zone, and the 'Dogs would settle for a 25-yard field goal from Silva to pull back within eight, 27-19, with 10:13 on the clock.

Hawai'i scored once more with 4:52 on the clock to close the game with a final result of 34-19.

FRESNO, Calif. – Kalen DeBoer earned career win No. 1 as head coach at Fresno State on Thursday night behind an emphatic 38-17 thumping of Colorado State. The Bulldogs racked up 432 yards of offense with 164 of those, and three touchdowns, coming from senior Ronnie Rivers.



Jake Haener notched his first-career 300-yard passing game, throwing for 311 yards on 22-of-32 attempts, for three touchdowns with zero interceptions. The junior quarterback spread the ball around, connecting with seven different receivers on the night. Rivers and fellow senior Kerik Wheatfall led the receivers with five receptions apiece with Wheatfall totaling a game-high 87 yards. Rivers also collected 95 yards on the ground, and eight punt return yards, to lead the team with 172 all-purpose yards.

Fresno State's defense allowed the Rams to register 381 yards offense, and limited their starting quarterback to 141 yards on 10-of-23 passing. Sophomore Evan Williams led the Bulldogs with eight tackles and redshirt freshman Bralyn Lux added six.

The Bulldogs' biggest swings in the five days since they played last came in two crucial areas, third downs and turnovers. Fresno State held the Rams to 4-of-15 on third downs versus Hawai'i going 11-of-17. The 'Dogs also protected the ball, not committing a turnover rather than four in the first outing.

How It Happened

For the second week in a row, Fresno State jumped out in front first. The Bulldogs worked the ball 86 yards on their opening drive, twice converting on third down. Haener went 4-of-4 on the possession, finishing it off with a 13-yard pass to Rivers in the back of the end zone.

Colorado State responded with 10 unanswered points over the next eight minutes to take a 10-7 lead with 13:57 on the clock in the second.

Ben Wooldridge then entered the contest at quarterback, a planned series entering the game, and opened with a 24-yard completion to Jalen Cropper. The drive resulted in a 34-yard field goal, tying the game 10-10, for Cesar Silva following what was first thought a 17-yard touchdown reception for Wheatfall. It was overturned after it was ruled he stepped out of bounds prior to the catch.

After forcing CSU to a three-and-out later in the second quarter, the Bulldogs quickly found themselves facing a fourth down decision near midfield. The 'Dogs opted to go for it on fourth-and-2 and Haener found Rivers for a gain of 14 yards. The senior back then finished the drive with a 32-yard burst down the sideline, breaking a pair of tackles on his way to the end zone to take a 17-10 advantage with 6:32 left in the first half.

With the half winding down, Fresno State doubled its lead with a 10-play, 91-yard drive. Backed up to his own two-yard line after a sack on the first play, Haener twice extended the drive on third down, first with a 34-yard completion to a diving Josh Kelly on third-and-10, and then on a 33-yard catch and run across the middle from Rivers on third-and-19. Haener finished the drive finding Mims in the flat where the back ran untouched down the left sideline for a 15-yard score.

The second half saw the Bulldog defense keep the Rams out the end zone until the final minute. Rivers and Cropper each added a touchdown during the final 30 minutes to give Fresno State the 38-17 win.

LAS VEGAS – In a city filled with shows, Ronnie Rivers was the featured act on Saturday afternoon at the newly minted Allegiant Stadium, piling up 232 all-purpose yards and four touchdowns in Fresno State's 40-27 win over UNLV. The senior running back tallied 133 rushing yards and 99 receiving yards, coming up one yard shy of being the first player to surpass 100 yards in both categories since Dale Messer in 1960.



For the third game in a row the Bulldogs produced more than 400 yards total offense, finishing with 487. The 'Dogs utilized a balanced offensive attack that saw them rush for 243 yards on 36 attempts and pass for 244 yards on 35 attempts. UNLV totaled 402 yards but the Bulldogs' defense forced the Rebels into three turnovers that resulted in 10 points. Fresno State's defense also produced a season-high six sacks.

Jake Haener threw for 164 yards and one touchdown on 15-of-23 passing. The redshirt junior also rushed for 79 yards and a score. Ben Wooldridge led the offense in four respective drives, he went 5-of-12 passing for 80 yards, and produced points on three of his four opportunities on the field.

On the defensive side, Chris Gaston became the first Bulldog in more than a year to record two interceptions in a game while David Perales and Kurtis Brown paired together for the Bulldogs' third forced turnovers. Perales forced the fumble and Brown fell on top of it. For the second game this season, Bralyn Lux led the 'Dogs in tackles, besting his previous high with nine on Saturday. Evan Williams totaled eight for second straight week. Malachi Langley and Perales each totaled seven tackles and a sack.

How It Happened

On the Bulldogs second drive, Haener and Keric Wheatfall connected on back-to-back plays to move the ball 22 yards down field. Two plays later, Haener found an opening and called his own number off an RPO, outrunning the UNLV defense for a 54-yard touchdown to give the Bulldogs an early 6-0 lead after a failed PAT.

The lead was short lived as the Rebels scored 10 unanswered on their next two drives. A touchdown midway through the first quarter and a field goal early in the second.

Fresno State went back on top 13-10 with 9:34 remaining in the first half. Aided by a roughing the passer call on third-and-5 from the Bulldogs' own 32, quarterback Ben Wooldridge followed the penalty by linking up with Rivers for a 35-yard gain to put the 'Dogs in the red zone. A 12-yard pass to Raymond Pauwels Jr. set up a 6-yard touchdown run to the left side for Rivers behind aggressive blocking from Dontae Bull.

UNLV, though, had an answer, following up the Bulldogs' score with one of its own to put them back on top 17-13 at the 6:12 mark in the second frame.

In a seesaw first half, the Bulldogs regained the lead to close out the half. Following an 18-yard scramble from Haener, the signal caller found Rivers in the flat where the back tip-toed 33 yards down the sideline, again led by Bull in space, to put the 'Dogs ahead 20-17 at halftime.

Two plays into the second half, Perales came off the left edge and knocked the ball out of Rebels' quarterback Max Gilliam's hand for his second forced fumble in as many weeks. Brown pounced on the ball to hand possession back to the Bulldogs' offense. It took just three plays for Fresno State to capitalize and take a 27-17 lead as Rivers slipped through the middle of the line, and raced 16 yards for the score.

Behind a 27-yard field goal and a 71-yard quarterback dash by the home team, the game would once again be level, 27-27, with 3:41 left in the third quarter. Although this would be the last time UNLV would score as Fresno State closed the game outscoring the Rebels 13-0 in the fourth quarter.

Rivers scored for the fourth time in the game, capping an 11-play, 79-yard scoring drive. Rivers finished off the possession with a 3-yard run on fourth-and-2 before going 10 yards untouched into the end zone on the very next play on what was the first play of the fourth quarter.

The defense and Cesar Silva helped put the game away as the Bulldog kicker tacked on 31 and 35-yard field goals while Gaston produced a pair of late interceptions.
