Bulldog Bones

- Fresno State returns seven position player starters, and its entire bullpen for the 2020 season.
- The 'Dogs return five All-MW selections in picther Hailey Dolcini, pitcher Danielle Lung, third baseman Schuylar Broussard, designated player and NFCA All-Region selection Hayleigh Galvan, and outfielder McKenzie Wilson, who was the 2019 MW Freshman of the Year.
- The Bulldogs recorded their 38th consecutive 30-win season in 2019 and finished fourth in the MW.
- Fresno State will face a top-ten team during opening weekend for the fifth consecutive season
- Fresno State will face three 2019 NCAA Tournament teams over the weekend in South Florida, Florida and Michigan.

The Bulldog Standard

- With seven starters returning as well as the entire pitching staff and a strong freshmen class, the Bulldogs have their sights set on a MW title and a 34th trip to the NCAA Regionals.
- Fresno State has played in the postseason four of the last five seasons.
- Fresno State has won 23 conference titles 59 NCAA Regional games, making 12 trips to the Women's College World Series with four runner-up finishes and winning the 1998 title.

Votes Are In

- Fresno State is receiving votes in the preseason USA Today/Coaches Poll. The team has received votes the past two seasons, but has not been ranked since 2017.
- The 'Dogs will face four teams that are ranked in the poll including No. 1 Washington, No. 6 Texas, No. 7 Florida and No. 17 Michigan.

30 for 38

- Fresno State recorded a 30-win season for the 38th consecutive year in 2019.
- The program has had an overall winning record in all 42 seasons of its existence.

Bomb Squad

- With seven returning starters Fresno State brings back 29 home runs, 154 RBIs, and 184 runs.
- Hayleigh Galvan led the 'Dogs at the plate hitting .336/.584/.457 with 10 home runs and 45 RBIs. McKenzie Wilson was a big offensive contributor hitting .393/.454/.453, and logging a team-high 72 hits.

Mac is Back

- Last season, McKenzie Wilson broke the single-season program and MW records with 39 steals. Wilson led the MW and all freshmen in NCAA Div. I in steals and finished the season tied for 10th in the nation overall.
- Wilson was named one of 25 finalists for the Schutt Sports / NFCA Freshman of the Year award, presented annually to the top freshman in NCAA Div. I. She is the first Bulldog to ever make the list and one of two MW players honored this year.
- Wilson was named the 2019 MW Freshman of the year, the first Bulldog ever named MW Freshman of the Year and is the first conference Freshman of the Year selection for Fresno State in 11 years, since Morgan Melloh was named WAC Freshman of the Year in 2008
- Wilson also led the team with nine multihit games in conference play, including four three-hit games. She had a team-best .440 onbase percentage as well as 17 runs scored and was tied for second with 13 RBIs while striking out only four times in 85 official at-bats. She also played stellar defense with 41 putouts,

SCOUTING THE SOUTH FLORIDA TOURNAMENT

- **Georgia State** was 8-46 overall last year and placed tenth in the Sun Belt conference with a 5-22 record. Fresno State is a perfect 3-0 against the Panthers.
- Illinois State finished sixth in the Missouri Valley Conference at 18-33 overall and 11-10 in conference games in 2019. Fresno State will see a familiar face as former Bulldog coach Margie Wright is serving as a volunteer assistant for the Red Birds this season. Fresno State owns the all-time record against Illinois State 3-1 defeating the Red Birds 5-0 in 2000.
- South Florida qualified for the NCAA tournament for the 15th appearance in program history. The Bulls finished first in the AAC for the second consecutive season after posting a 17-4 record in conference. South Florida returns two-time AAC Pitcher of the Year and All-American Georgina Corrick ranking sixth in the NCAA finishing the season with a 1.14 ERA. The Bulls will be playing under 2018 coach of the year and 2020 Olympic coach Ken Ericksen. The Bulldogs and Bulls have met once before, a 1-0 Fresno State win in 1986.
- **Michigan** is No. 17 in the 2020 national rankings and claimed the Big 10 tournament regular season title along with the Big 10 Championship title in the 2019 season. The Wolverine's had a 22-1 conference and 43-13 overall mark while having four players among 50 on the 2020 USA Softball Player of the Year watch list. Michigan will be playing under Carol Hutchins, the winningest coach in NCAA softball history earning her 1,458th win last season. The 'Dogs hold the all-time record against Michigan 8-6, but the Wolverines have claimed the last two victories (2017).
- Florida was tabbed No. 7 in the USA Today and NFCA Coaches' Preseason Poll completing the 2019 season with a 49-18 overall record and 12-12 in conference play and won the SEC championships for the second consecutive season. The gators made their 10th appearance at the Women's College World series, tying for seventh in WCWS play and received an NCAA Tournament bid for the 20th time in school history. Florida led the nation with its .986 fielding percentage in 2019 and set a school-record. Florida leads the all-time series 3-2.

Full Circle

- Fresno State brings back four pitchers including All-MW selections Hailey Dolcini and Danielle Lung. Danielle East also returns to the circle as well as reshirt freshman Dariana Orme.
- Dolcini proved to be the Bulldogs' ace with a record of 17-7 and an era of 2.21.
- Lung finished her freshman season with a record of 15-5 and an era of 3.34.

Shutout Leader

- Fresno State led the MW with 13 shutouts in 2019. Hailey Dolcini had seven complete game shutouts and has pitched in nine total shutouts to lead the team.
- The Bulldogs tallied 13 shutouts last season, the most shutouts in a season since the 2015 team finished with 14.
- The Bulldog pitching staff also ended the regular season leading the league with a .226 opposing batting average.

Home Cooking

- Fresno State went 23-5 at home last season. The 2019 'Dogs recorded the most home wins since the 2012 team finished 24-8 at home.
- In 28 home game the Bulldogs hit .338 with 35 stolen

- The Red Wave averaged 1,069 fans per game last year. That attendance average is the highest among all 20 Div. I schools in California (including No. 2 UCLA), second highest among all non-Power-5 schools, and 16th most in all of NCAA Div. I.
- Fresno State's total of 29,945 fans in 2019 was the 12th highest in the nation.
- No other MW team has averaged more than 484 fans per game this year, less than half of the 'Dogs average. Fresno State has averaged more than 1,000 fans per game for 26 consecutive seasons.

LINDA GARZA

Head Coach • 4th Season • UNLV, 2002 • Fresno, Calif.

Fresno native Linda Garza enters her fourth season as head coach of the Fresno State softball program in 2019. Garza became Fresno State's fourth head coach in its storied history in July of 2016.

In 2019 Garza guided the Bulldogs to their most wins since the 2016 season and a postseason berth in the National Invitational Softball Championship (NISC). With 37 wins the 'Dogs recorded their 38th consecutive 30-win season while going 23-5 at home, the most home wins by a Fresno State team since the 2012 season. Fresno State finished the year 37-20 overall and 14-10 in the MW after sweeping NCAA Tournament qualifier Boise State in the last conference series of the season and winning five of their last six MW series.

In her second season leading the program, Garza guided the Bulldogs to their 37th consecutive 30-win season and a winning record for the 41st straight year since the program's inception. The team finished with a 31-23 overall record and a 14-10 mark in the Mountain West despite losing four starting position players and the reigning MW Pitcher of the Year from the 2017 squad. The Bulldogs finished in third place in the Mountain West, extending the program's run of 26 consecutive top-three conference finishes.

In 2018 Garza led the 'Dogs to a 10-game winning streak, the longest since a program-record 23 straight wins in 2016, and had the team earn votes in the USA Today/NFCA Coaches' Poll in three different weeks. Bulldog hitters shattered program and Mountain West records with 71 hit-by-pitches in 2018, the second highest total in NCAA Div. I, and drew a program-record 213 walks as the team ranked fifth in all of NCAA Div. I with a .410 season on-base percentage.

A total of five Bulldogs earned All-Mountain West honors in 2018 with four first team selections. The 'Dogs had one All-MW First Team selection from each class, as senior Katie Castellon, junior Rachel Minogue, sophomore Hayleigh Galvan, and freshman Danielle East earned the honor. Sophomore pitcher Samantha Mejia received a Second Team selection. Galvan also earned NFCA All-Region honors as she was named to the Pacific region third team.

In her first season in 2017, Garza took over a team that had won back-to-back Mountain West Championships, but lost eight seniors to graduation, including the reigning MW Pitcher of the Year and MW Defensive Player

She wrapped up her first season at the helm of the program with a 35-23 record, continuing Fresno State's streak of 36 straight 30-win seasons, and the Bulldogs' 33rd NCAA Tournament appearance. Fresno State tied for third place in the MW with a 14-9 conference record and received an at-large bid into the NCAA Tournament Seattle Regional. In the regional, the 'Dogs fell to No. 20 Michigan 3-1, shut out Montana 7-0, then fell to Michigan again, 4-0.

Five players on the Bulldogs' 2017 squad were named NFCA All-Pacific Region, four were selected to All-MW teams (two first-team and two second-team) and sophomore pitcher Kamalani Dung earned the honor of MW Pitcher of the Year. Fresno State also had seven MW All-Academic selections.

Prior to coming to Fresno State, Garza spent four seasons at the helm of the UC Riverside program, in which the team won 39 and 32 games in 2015 and 2016, respectively. Garza also led Wright State to a 31-win season, Horizon League title and an automatic NCAA tournament berth in 2010.

Prior to her time at UC Riverside, Garza was an associate head coach at Cal Poly (2010-12), head coach at Wright State (2009-10), and an assistant coach at Purdue (2005-09), Tulsa (2004-05) and Arkansas (2002-04).

In the summer of 2012, Garza took over an 11-year-old UC Riverside program that had yet to have a winning season and averaged only 17.4 wins per season over that span. The Highlanders went 13-33 in 2011 and by 2015 she led them to a 39-17 record and the 14th-best ERA (2.13) in the nation. The team averaged 28.8 wins under the leadership of Garza and she coached over 10 All-Big West student-athletes, three NFCA all-region performers, and back-to-back 20-game winning pitchers in 2015 and 2016.

During her time at UCR, nearly every major offensive, defensive and pitching records were set. Its back-to-back 30-win seasons (2015-16) were a first for the program since joining the Big West in 2002 and its 2015 RPI ranking (70) was its highest ever. Garza's student-athletes also shined in the classroom - posting the program's highest team grade point average (GPA) in program history in 2014 at 3.33.

Prior to UCR, Garza was the associate head coach/recruiting coordinator for Cal Poly (2010-12), while coaching the outfield and assisting with hitting and the infield. She also assisted with all day-to-day operations of the program.

As the head coach at Wright State in 2010, the Raiders established single-season records for hits (538), walks (148) and stolen bases (150). This came after serving as an assistant at Purdue and aiding the Boilermakers to 30-plus victories during each of her four seasons.

Garza received her start at UNLV as a student assistant following her playing career from 1998-2001, posting a .262 career batting average as a four-year starter and earning a spot on the All-Mountain West team. She finished her career with 155 straight starts and was among the program's top 10 players for doubles, walks, hits and sacrifices.

A four-time All-MW academic honoree, she received her bachelor's degree in school health education with a minor in athletic coaching and physical education in 2002. Garza earned her master's degree in kinesiology in 2009 from Texas Woman's University.
