

No. 15 Seeded Cardinals to Host Belmont in NCAA First Round in Cardinal Arena

Cards Draw Belmont

The No.15 overall seeded University of Louisville volleyball team drew Belmont and will host NCAA First/Second Rounds at Cardinal Arena on campus this Friday-Saturday. The Cards will face the winner of the Illinois/Southern Illinois match should they advance.

UofL's Dance Card

The Cards are making their 25th NCAA appearances and have 27 straight winning seasons, 19 conference championships and have been in NCAAs 24 of last 26 years. Louisville is one of only 14 schools to make 25 or more appearances in the NCAA Tournament since it started in 1981. The Cards have a 15-24 overall record in the NCAA Tournament. The Cardinals last competed in the NCAA Tournament in 2013 when they fell to Marquette 3-0 in Champaign, Ill. on the Illini Campus. UofL's last NCAA victory came in 2012 when it defeated Belmont 3-1 in the first round.

Coach Kordes on the Draw

"We could not be more excited about being at home," said Anne Kordes, UofL head coach and ACC Coach of the Year. "We set up goals for our-



selves for the season. We knew that winning the ACC title and getting the opportunity to host would go hand in hand. We feel blessed to be in this position and all the credit goes to the girls. Now we have a lot of work to do. We played Belmont in the tournament a couple of years ago. They are a scrappy team that plays great defense. They run a quick offense. We are not looking past them at all.

Wrapping Up Regular Season

Louisville enters postseason play with a 24-6 overall record and posted an 18-2 record in the ACC after defeating Boston College and falling to Syracuse in the regular season finale last week. Against Boston College, Janelle Jenkins had a match-high 17 kills along with 15 digs to lead the Cardinals to a 27-29, 25-23, 25-17, 26-24 victory over the Eagles. Erin Fairs added 15 kills while Tess Clark added 11 kills and six blocks, respectively. Katie George posted a double-double with a match high 58 assists and 19 digs. Molly Sauer added 17 digs for the Cardinals.

Against Syracuse, Erin Fairs and Aniah Philo each had 10 kills but fell 23-25, 22-25, 15-25 to the Orange. Katie George had a match high 37 assists while Molly Sauer added a match high 22 digs.

At the conclusion of the regular season, Louisville finished first in the conference and third in the nation with 14.79 kills per set with senior outside hitter Erin Fairs leading the Cardinal attack with 424 kills and averaging 3.89 kills per set, which is second in the conference. Junior outside hitter Janelle Jenkins adds 338 kills while sophomore middle blocker Tess Clark adds 249 kills and boasts a team-high 112 blocks. Clark led the ACC and finished fourth in the nation with a .441 attack percentage.

Senior setter Katie George has dished out 1323 assists on the season and finished ranked fourth in the nation while leading the ACC with an average of 12.14 assists per set. She is second on the team with 308 digs.

Louisville finished second in the ACC with 17.00 digs per set with freshman libero Molly Sauer posting 504 digs (4.62 digs per set) and leads the team with 29 aces. As a team, Louisville holds opponents to a .171 hitting percentage, which was second in the conference.

Belmont at a Glance

Belmont (17-14, 11-5 OVC) defeated top-seeded Murray State in four sets (20-25, 25-18, 25-19, 25-15) to claim the 2015 OVC Volleyball Championship and automatic bid to the 2015 NCAA Volleyball Championship. The Bruins won nine out of 11 sets over Morehead State, Tennessee Tech and the host Racers to claim the conference crown. Belmont is making its fourth NCAA Tournament appearance, second representing the OVC (2006, 2008 - Atlantic Sun; 2012, 2015 - OVC). The Bruins are led by sophomore Arianna Person, who was named Tournament Most Valuable Player, while teammates Emma Price and Jocelyn Youngdahl were named to the OVC All-Tournament Team. As a team, Belmont ranked first in the conference and 11th in the nation with 192 service aces. Emma Price and Jocelyn Youngdahl were named to the OVC All-Tournament Team along with Person.

BU Coach Tony Howell

Belmont is coached by Tony Howell, who is in his second season. Howell has led the Bruins to winning seasons in both of his seasons at the helm of the program. Prior to Belmont, he has been an assistant at Belmont, Middle Tennessee State, Texas Wesleyan University and North Texas.

Cards Against Belmont

Louisville will be facing Belmont for the fourth time in series history. The Cardinals hold a 2-1 advantage in the series including a 1-0 record in postseason action. Louisville won 3-0 in the first round of the 2012 NCAA Tournament.

Illinois at a Glance

On the other side of the bracket are the Illini, a team the Cards faced in the Illini Classic earlier this season. The Cards fell in three but took the Illini down to the wire in each set before falling 27-25, 25-23, 26-24. The No. 18 Fighting Illini fell to Michigan, 3-1 (25-23, 22-25, 25-27, 20-25), in the regular-season Big Ten finale Nov. 27 in Cliff Keen Arena. The Illini face Southern Illinois in the first round. No. 21 Illinois (19-12, 10-10 B1G) is making their 23rd NCAA Tournament appearance after earning an at-large bid into the NCAA Tournament. The Illini have collected a 36-21 record all-time in postseason play and were national runner-ups in 2011. Redshirt senior outside hitter Jocelynn Birks earned her third-straight All-Big Ten accolade after leading the offense with 389 kills and ranks second in the conference with 3.89 kills per set. She ranks second on the team with 251 digs. Junior outside hitter Michelle Strizak and junior middle blocker Katie Stadick add 316 and 277 kills, respectively. All-Freshman Team selection Jordyn Poulter sets up the offense and has 974 assists on the season. Sophomore libero Brandi Donnelly leads the team with 500 digs. The Illini are 13th in the nation with 319 blocks with All-Freshman Ali Bastianelli leading the team with 150 blocks and Katie Stadick adding 132 blocks.

Uofl Coach Kevin Hambly

Kevin Hambly is in his seventh season as the Uofl head volleyball coach. He has led the Fighting Illini to six winning seasons including five trips to the NCAA Sweet 16 and the program's first appearance in the national championship match in 2011.

Cards Against Illinois

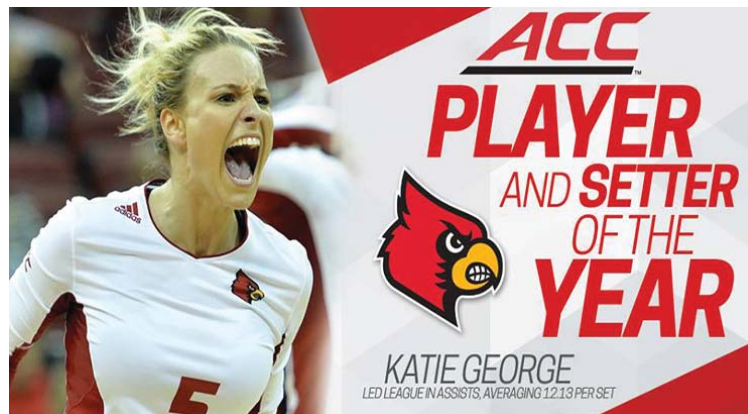
Louisville and the Fighting Illini have met 13 times in series history with Illinois leading the series 9-4, including a 3-0 victory in both team's 2015 season opener. The two teams have met twice in the NCAA Tournament with each team recording a victory. The Illini defeated the Cards 3-0 in 2003 before the Cards defeated the Illini 3-1 the very next year.

Southern Illinois at a Glance

Southern Illinois (23-9, 14-4 MVC) is making its first ever NCAA Tournament appearance after earning an at-large bid into the NCAA Tournament. The Salukis are led by redshirt sophomore outside hitter and First Team All-Conference selection Andrea Estrada who has a team-high 424 kills (3.59 kills per set) while adding 368 digs. Junior Meg Viggars ranks fifth in the nation with six triple-doubles on the season. The First Team All-Conference selection is third on the team with 252 kills and leads the team with 766 assists. She is also second on the team with 127 blocks and third on the team with 320 digs. Sophomore outside hitter Abby Barrow is second on the team with 337 kills for the season. Junior setter Hannah Kaminsky also spends time setting up the offense and has 713 assists on the season. Sophomore middle hitter Alex Rosignol leads the Salukis defensively with 130 blocks and ranks 15th in the nation with 1.48 blocks per set. First Team All-Conference selection Taylor Pippen earned her fourth straight conference honor by picking up First Team All-Conference selection honors. Pippen adds 250 kills and 112 blocks on the season. Junior libero Mariana Pilon leads the Salukis with 470 digs. The Saluki volleyball team concluded its run at the MVC Volleyball Tournament in the semifinal round on Friday night with a 3-0 loss to the No. 3 seed Missouri State Bears. The match saw 11 ties, resulting in 25-22, 25-19 and 25-20 sets. This is the second consecutive year the Salukis were eliminated from the tournament by Missouri State.

About Justin Ingram

2015 MVC Coach of the Year Justin Ingram has been at the helm for the Saluki volleyball team for four seasons and the 2015 season has been his most successful yet. He has led the Salukis to three 20-win seasons and has been an integral part in leading the Salukis to their first NCAA Tournament appearance.



Cards Sweep ACC Awards

In just their second season in the ACC, the Cardinals won their first ACC Championships and swept the ACC Volleyball individual awards. Senior setter Katie George was selected as the 2015 ACC Player and Setter of the Year. Freshman libero Molly Sauer became the first player in ACC Volleyball history to be named both Defensive Player of the Year and Freshman of the Year. Head coach Anne Kordes earned her first ACC Coach of the Year honor, and her third conference honor overall. Katie George and senior outside hitter Erin Fairs were named to the All-ACC Volleyball First Team while middle blocker Tess Clark and outside hitter Janelle Jenkins were named to the All-ACC Volleyball Second Team. Molly Sauer and freshman outside hitter Aniah Philo were both named to the All-Freshman Team.



Cards in the Polls

The Cardinals are 18th in the AVCA Coaches Poll and are ranked No. 25 according to PrepVolleyball.

RPI and Regional Ranking

The Cards' RPI is 19 and they are ranked No. 1 in the East Region. Five ACC teams are in the top 50 of this week's RPI: Louisville (19), North Carolina (24), Florida State (25), Miami (38) and Pitt (47).



Player of the Week -- Tess Clark

Clark led the Cardinals to two conference victories, including a five-set win over No. 20 Florida State. The sophomore started the weekend with a 15-kill, five-block outing in the Cardinals' 3-1 win over Miami before finishing with 14 kills and four blocks against the Seminoles. Clark scored 35.5 points in the two matches, helping Louisville claim sole possession of first place in the conference.

Freshman of the Week -- Molly Sauer

Sauer earned her second Freshman of the Week honor this season after helping Louisville to an undefeated weekend. The freshman finished with 44 digs – 25 against Miami and 19 against Florida State – and committed just one receiving error while being served 51 times. Sauer also recorded six assists and three service aces in the two road victories.

Freshman of the Week -- Aniah Philo

Philo earned her third consecutive Freshman of the Week honor after leading Louisville to 3-0 wins over Notre Dame and Virginia. She collected her fourth double-double of the season against Notre Dame with 13 kills and 12 digs, while also contributing eight kills, nine digs and six blocks against the Cavaliers. Philo finished the weekend with a .319 hitting percentage and averaging 3.5 kills per set.

Freshman of the Week--Aniah Philo

Philo earned her second consecutive Freshman of the Week honor after helping the Cardinals remain undefeated in ACC play with 3-0 victories over Wake Forest and Duke. The freshman finished the weekend with 27 kills, including a match-high 16 against Wake Forest, and averaged 4.50 kills per set in the two matches. Philo also posted 16 digs and finished with a .339 hitting percentage.

Freshman of the Week -- Aniah Philo

Philo finished the weekend with 17 kills, 19 digs and a .378 hitting percentage in 3-0 wins over Georgia Tech and Clemson. The freshman recorded her second double-double of the season against Clemson, finishing the match with 10 kills and 10 digs. Philo rounded out the weekend averaging 2.83 kills per set and 3.17 digs per set.



Freshman Aniah Philo Provides Spark

The freshman finished the weekend with 61 digs, including 30 digs in the Cardinals' win over Ohio and 31 total digs in two three-set wins over Utah and Seton Hall. She also helped the team offensively, recording nine service aces and dishing out seven assists.

George and Jenkins Named All-Illini Classic

UofL Picked Fifth in ACC Preseason Poll

North Carolina has been chosen to repeat as the Atlantic Coast Conference volleyball champion and the Cardinals are tabbed fifth. The Tar Heels accumulated a total of 190 out of a possible 196 points. First-place votes were awarded 14 points, second place received 13 points, etc. Coaches were not allowed to include their own team in their predicted order of finish.

Katie George

Louisville senior setter Katie George was the 2015 Atlantic Coast Conference Player and Setter of the Year. She led the ACC in assists, averaging 12.13 per set and leading a Louisville offense that was second in the conference in hitting percentage and first in kills per set. This team captain and vocal leader hits .319 against nationally ranked teams and averages 2.52 dig/set against nationally ranked opponents. She is just the second recipient of the Setter of the Year honor since its inception in 2014. She is 5th in the nation in assists (12.14) and 30th in the NCAA in total assists (1,323) She was Tournament MVP and All Active Ankle Classic. She was named to the All-Illini Classic Team and was a preseason All-ACC selection. She has 18 double doubles this season and is ranked No. 4 in career assists at Louisville. She is 4th on the team in service aces. She is the current Miss Kentucky USA.

Erin Fairs

Senior captain Erin Fairs transferred from South Florida. With every defense keying on her, she still leads the team in kills (424) and in solo blocks (19). At USE, she was the Big East Freshman of the Year. Then she was the American Athletic Conference Player of the Year and Honorable mention all American as a sophomore. As a junior she was All-AAC. She was named first team all-ACC this year, making her the first player in history to win all conference honors in three different leagues. She was an All-ACC preseason pick and has had 5 matches with 20 or more kills. She has scored double digit points in every match but 3. She had 25+ points against Miami and Pitt and had double digit points against every nationally ranked opponent, including 23 vs. Minnesota and 17.5 vs. Wisconsin. She is the primary passer in 3 rotations and averages 1.34 digs per set. In the NCAA, she is 70th in Kills/Set (3.91) and 60th Points/Set (4.35) in an offense that features four offensive weapons.

Tess Clark

Tess Clark was named to the ACC's second team. She is 4th in the nation in Hitting % (.442) She was All-Active Ankle Challenge after helping UofL to wins over Utah, Seton Hall and Ohio. She was the ACC Player of the week when she led the Cardinals to two conference victories, including a five-set win over No. 20 Florida State. The sophomore had a 15-kill, five-block outing in the Cardinals' 3-1 win over Miami before finishing with 14 kills and four blocks against the Seminoles. Clark scored 35.5 points in the two matches. She leads the team in blocks with 112 and is third in kills with 249 (2.28/set). She hits .396 vs. regionally ranked teams. She hit a season high .760 vs. Ohio with five other matches hitting better than .650. She is last year's AVCA region Freshman of the Year.

Janelle Jenkins

Janelle Jenkins was voted second team All-ACC. She was named to the All-Illini Classic team after leading UofL to a 2-1 mark for the Classic. Janelle had 46 kills, hit .430, three aces and 11 blocks. The junior has nine double-doubles, including ones against Minnesota, Wisconsin, Miami and Florida State. She had 17 matches of 12 or more kills and 11 double digit dig matches. She is one of the main reasons that the Louisville offense is second in the conference in hitting percentage and first in kills per set. She plays all six rotations, hits equally effectively from the back row and is quick and long on defensive digs. Tess Clark was named to the ACC's second team. She is 4th in the nation in Hitting % (.442) She was All-Active Ankle Challenge after helping UofL to wins over Utah, Seton Hall and Ohio. She was the ACC Player of the week when she led the Cardinals to two conference victories, including a five-set win over No. 20 Florida State. The sophomore had a 15-kill, five-block outing in the Cardinals' 3-1 win over Miami before finishing with 14 kills and four blocks against the Seminoles. Clark scored 35.5 points in the two matches. She leads the team in blocks with 112 and is third in kills with 249 (2.28/set). She hits .396 vs. regionally ranked teams. Molly Sauer

Molly Sauer became the first player in ACC Volleyball history to earn both Defensive Player of the Year and Freshman of the Year honors in the same season. The Cardinals ranked 2nd in the ACC in digs behind her defensive leadership and helped Louisville clinch a share of the 2015 ACC title. Sauer also earned ACC Freshman of the Week honors twice. Once for the Miami/Florida State swing where she finished with 44 digs – 25 against UM and 19 against FSU – and committed just one receiving error while being served 51 times. Sauer also recorded 6 assists and 3 service aces. The other ACC FOW was when she was named to the All-Active Ankle Challenge after helping Louisville post a 3-0 record She had 61 digs, including 30 digs in UL's win over Ohio and 31 total digs in 2 three-set wins over Utah and Seton Hall. She also recorded 9 aces and 7 assists. She was a member of the 2015 Women's Junior National Team that represented the United States at the Global Challenge in Pula, Croatia.

Aniah Philo

Aniah Philo was named to the ACC All-Freshman team. She was a three time ACC Freshman of the Week, after leading Louisville to 3-0 wins over Notre Dame and Virginia. She had 13 kills and 12 digs, while also contributing eight kills, nine digs and six blocks against the Cavaliers. She had a .319 hitting percentage and averaging 3.5 kills per set. Her next award was helping the Cards to 3-0 victories over Wake Forest and Duke with 27 kills, including a match-high 16 against Wake Forest, and averaged 4.50 kills per set in the two matches. Philo also posted 16 digs and finished with a .339 hitting percentage. Her third FOW honor came when Philo had 17 kills, 19 digs and a .378 hitting percentage in 3-0 wins over Georgia Tech and Clemson. Philo rounded out the weekend averaging 2.83 kills per set and 3.17 digs per set. The Cards are 18-2 since she earned a starting spot at outside hitter. She has 4 double doubles.
