After a week off primarily to address final exams, Louisville plays its second of six straight home games in the KFC Yum! Center as the Cardinals face the Eastern Michigan Eagles on Saturday. Louisville rolled to a 111-63 victory over Grand Canyon on Dec. 5 as eight different players scored seven or more points. UofL held a 55-20 rebounding advantage and the Cardinals improved to 107-1 when breaking the century mark in scoring. Eastern Michigan (6-3) has won four of its last five games, including an 86-58 victory over Rochester on Dec. 8 as the Eagles collected 15 steals and shot 53.2 percent from the field. EMU is third in the nation in steals (11.4) and 17th in field goal percentage defense (.366).

- Louisville's 129 victories over the last five years are the second-most wins in the nation in that stretch. Louisville and Wichita State are the only schools in the nation to win 30 games in three of the last four seasons, including a school-record 35 victories amassed by Louisville's 2012-13 NCAA Championship team.
- UofL **leads in the nation** in rebounding margin (+18.9) and scoring margin (+30.3), is second in scoring defense (55.7) and is fourth in field goal percentage defense (.342).
- Damion Lee matched a season-high with 24 points vs. Grand Canyon, adding six rebounds and three assists. He is among the ACC leaders in steals (1.7, 3rd), scoring (19.1, 4th) and field goal percentage (.553, 9th).
- UofL has a **21-3 record** during the month of December over the last four years, winning nine of its last 11 in that month.
- Louisville is **ninth nationally** in field goal percentage (.514). UofL has shot above 50 percent in six of its seven games this year. The Cards shot 50 percent or above on eight occasions all last season.
- Rick Pitino coached his 500th game at Louisville when the Cards played at Michigan St. on Dec. 2 (374-127 record).
- UofL has an **8-2 record** in games following at least a seven-day break over the last four years (since 2012-13).
- Trey Lewis needs three points for 1,200 in his collegiate career and **Damion Lee** needs 28 points for 1,700 career points.

■ About Eastern Michigan — Eastern Michigan (6-3) has won four of its last five games, including an 86-58 victory over Rochester on Dec. 8 as the Eagles collected 15 steals and shot 53.2 percent from the field. EMU is third in

the nation in steals (11.4) and 17th in field goal percentage defense (.366) through Dec. 8. All five starters for the Eagles are averaging at least eight points a game, led by 6-1 junior guard Willie Mangum (16.1 ppg) and 6-10 freshman forward James Thompson (15.0 ppg, 11.7 rpg).

The Eagles posted a 21-14 record a year ago -its second straight season with 20 or more victories -- and participated in the College Basketball Invitational (CBI) postseason tournament.

Eastern Michigan is one of five first-time foes for the Cardinals this season, including this current stretch of three straight. It will be the second time in three games that Louisville will face a team from Michigan.

The Eagles are No. 94 in the RPI and No. 147 in the Sagarin Ratings through Dec. 8. Eight members of the EMU roster are transfer students, with four each from Division I schools and junior colleges.

Eastern Michigan is picked to finish fourth in the West Division of the Mid American Conference. Louisville has a 24-5 record against current members of the MAC, having faced half of its 12 members (Akron 1-0, Ball State 1-1, Kent State 1-0, Miami/Ohio 4-0, Ohio 10-3, Toledo 7-1). Miami (Ohio) was the last MAC member that UofL has played, with the Cardinals winning 80-39 on Nov. 18, 2012 in the KFC Yum! Center.

Located in Yosilanti, Mich., Eastern Michigan is the alma mater of NBA Hall of Famer George Gervin, two-time Cy Young Award winning pitcher Bob Welch, Boston College assistant coach Stan Heath, and former Detroit Lions and Pittsburgh Steelers quarterback Charlie Batch.

Ypsilanti is the hometown of UofL sophomore forward Jaylen Johnson, who was a first-team all-state selection and finalist for Michigan's Mr. Basketball as a senior.

The Eagles have participated in four NCAA Division I Tournaments (last in 1998). advancing to the Sweet 16 in 1991. EMU was the NAIA national runner-up in 1971.

■ Impressive Victory vs. Grand Canyon — Grand Canyon marked the first time Louisville has started two players from Jefferson County high schools (Quentin Snider and Raymond Spalding) since Dec. 21, 2004 when Terrance Farley and Larry O'Bannon started against IUPUI ... The 61 points in the opening 20 minutes on Saturday were the most for Louisville in the first half of a game since scoring 61 against Towson State on Dec. 7, 1998; and the most in any half since a 61-point second half against Northwestern State on Nov. 18, 2006 ... Louisville improved to 107-1 all-time when reaching the century mark in scoring ... The Cardinals' +35 advantage on the glass vs. Grand Canyon (55-20) was the program's largest rebounding margin at least since 1970, when complete records are available ... Louisville finished with a 26-5 advantage on the glass in the first half on Saturday, the largest margin in any half since outrebounding Jacksonville State 37-13 in the second half on Nov. 17, 2014.

- Card File Trey Lewis needs three points for 1,200 in his collegiate career and Damion Lee needs 28 points for 1,700 career points ... Louisville has a 21-3 record during the month of December over the last three years, winning nine of its last 11 in that month ... Louisville held No. 3 Michigan State to a pair of free throws over the first seven minutes of its game Dec. 2 and led 18-5 over 10 minutes into the game ... Damion Lee had a season-high five steals at Michigan State. He is third in the ACC in steals (1.7 per game) ... Trey Lewis continues to improve his productivity, posting season highs of 22 points and seven rebounds against Saint Louis ... Louisville has shot above 50 percent in six of its seven games this season, starting the season with five straight 50 percent plus games. Dillon Avare buried his two three-point attempts vs. Hartford to score a career-high six points. - Cards vs. Non-Conference Foes -- Louisville has won 41 of its last 42 non-conference games at home in the KFC Yum! Center, spanning the last five seasons. The Cardinals won 35 straight over non-conference opponents between falling to Kentucky on Dec. 27 last season and its previous home non-conference loss on Dec. 31, 2010 to Kentucky. The only other non-conference loss UofL has suffered in the KFC Yum! Center was a 52-46 setback at the hands of Drexel on Dec. 14, 2010. Louisville is in its sixth season in the spectacular KFC Yum! Center with an overall 86-13 record in home games, including a 51-3 record against non-conference opponents. UofL has won 38 consecutive home games in November spanning the last 24 years, including a perfect 25-0 record in the KFC Yum! Center.

■ Computers — Louisville is No. 14 nationally in the ratings percentage index (RPI) and second in the Sagarin Ratings through Dec. 6. UofL has the nation's No. 8 defense in Ken Pomoroy's adjusted defensive ratings are 10th overall.

■ Cards Sixth All-Time in the Polls

— Louisville has been ranked in the Associated Press poll on 590 occasions, sixth most all-time (completed the 2014-15 season with a streak of 60 consecutive weeks). UofL has been ranked among the nation's top 10 in the preseason poll four of the last five years (unranked this year, eighth in 2014-15, third in 2013-14, second in 2012-13, ninth in 2011-12). Until the first three polls of this year, the last time UofL was not in the poll was in the March 5, 2012 poll -- a year in which UofL advanced to the Final Four.

■ Quality Start — Louisville is off to an impressive start at both ends of the floor through its first seven games. Defensively through games of Dec. 8, the Cardinals lead the nation in rebound margin (+18.9), are second in scoring defense (55.7 points), fourth in field goal percentage defense (.346) and 16th in turnover margin (+5.0). The Cardinals had a season-high 12 steals vs. North Florida and UofL is third in the ACC in steals (8.1) and leads the league in scoring margin, scoring defense, field goal percentage defense, field goal percentage and rebounding margin. Louisville has a differential of 16.8 percent between its shooting percentage and its opponents. Each of UofL's six victories have been by 20 or more points. Louisville is eighth in the nation in Ken Pomeroy's adjusted defensive statistics through Dec. 6.

Offensively, the Cardinals are ninth in the nation in field goal percentage (.514) and lead the nation in scoring margin (+30.3 points). This year is the first that the Cards have shot above 50 percent from the field in its first five games of the season since at least 1971-72 (when complete records are available) and UofL has surpassed the 50 percent mark in six games. The Cardinals have shot above 60 percent from the field for a half in four of the last five games, including a high of 69.6 percent vs. Saint Louis. Louisville scored 80 or more points in its four first games for the second straight season. The Cards are 17th nationally in fewest turnovers per game (10.3).

■ Cards Continue Productive Defense — Louisville teams under Rick Pitino have been known for their defensive intensity and the 2015-16 unit has followed in that tradition. UofL has limited its opponents to less than 57 points in four of its seven games this season, allowing an average of 55.7 points, second-best in the nation in scoring defense. Louisville committed fewer turnovers than its opponent in all seven games and is 16th in the nation in turnover margin (+5.0), committing single digit turnovers in three games this season.

Louisville has ranked among the nation's top 40 in field goal percentage defense in 12 of the past 14 years, including this season's .346 percentage, which ranks fourth nationally. UofL has held five of its opponents under 40 percent shooting from the field, four under 36 percent and two under 30 percent.

- Rebounding Strength Louisville leads the nation in rebounding margin with a +18.9 advantage and is fifth in offensive rebounds per game (16.7). The Cardinals have had a double-digit rebounding margin in five of its last six games. Louisville has more than doubled its opponent's rebound total in four games (vs. North Florida, St. Francis, Saint Louis and Grand Canyon) after having done that only five times in the previous 1,000 games. The Cards have registered a +30 or better rebounding advantage in a single game in each of the past two years after finishing with a 53-22 margin vs. North Florida and 55-20 vs. Grand Canyon. Last season, UofL outrebounded Jacksonville State 60-26 on Nov. 17, 2014. Nine different UofL players average at least three rebounds. The Cardinals were outrebounded 40-30 at Michigan State, a team which is second in the nation in rebounding margin.
- Success vs. Top 25 Foes -- Louisville has won 27 of its last 50 against AP ranked opponents, falling at No. 3 Michigan State on Dec. 2 in its last Top 25 matchup. Louisville has a 46-36 record against Top 25 teams over the last nine years (0-1 this year, 4-7 last year, 5-5 in 2013-14, 9-3 in 2012-13). UofL has been victorious seven of the last 16 times it has faced an AP top-five opponent. UofL has won 17 of its last 35 games when facing Top 10 teams, spanning the last nine years.

■ Lee a Candidate for Erving Award UofL graduate guard/forward Damion Lee is among 20 watch list members for the 2016 Julius Erving Small Forward of the Year Award presented by the University of Massachusetts and the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame. Lee was sixth among the nation's top small forwards in a preseason ranking of the postion by The Sporting News. He was also cited on CBSSports.com's list of the Top 100 players entering the 2015-16 season. Lee is playing his final collegiate season at UofL after transferring from Drexel, where he was the nation's No. 4 scorer last year (21.4 ppg). He leads the Cardinals in scoring and is eighth in the ACC, averaging 18.3 points while

Lee is also on the 2016 Naismith Trophy Men's College Player of the Year 50 man early season watch list. He is one of nine ACC players included. The list will be pared to the midseason 30 on Feb. 11 and ten finalists will be named on March 2. The winner will be announced on April 3.

■ Card Clips — Louisville's nonconference schedule strength is rated No. 26 in the nation by the RPI through Dec. 6 ... Before falling at No. 3 Michigan State, Louisville improved to 5-0 overall for the sixth consecutive season. The Cardinals won their first 11 games last year before their first loss ... Deng Adel has missed the Cardinals' last five games with a sprained left knee suffered in practice on Nov. 20. Adel, who started Louisville's first two games this season, is likely out for 3-6 weeks ... Anas Mahmoud swatted a career-high four shots vs. Grand Canyon, adding four points ... Louisville has dominated inside this season, scoring 53 percent of its points in the paint (318 points in seven games, 45.4 per game) ... Quentin Snider's 31 assists with seven turnover this season ranks him fourth in the ACC and 12th in the nation in assiststo-turnover ratio (4.43). He has committed a turnover an average of one every 28 minutes. He handed out a career-high eight assists against Grand Canyon ... Chinanu Onuaku scored a career-high 18 points against Hartford, adding nine rebounds and two blocked shots. His previous high of 12 points vs. Jacksonville State had been set one year ago on the same date (Nov. 17, 2014). Onuaku has grabbed six or more rebounds in five of his last six games ... F Herbert Crook (1984-88), a starter on the Cardinals' 1986 NCAA Championship team, was among six 2015 inductees to the UofL Athletic Hall of Fame.

■ 28 Former Pitino Assistants/Players Became Head Coaches -- UofL Coach Rick Pitino has had 28 of his former assistants or players rise to a collegiate head coaching position. Pitino's son, Richard Pitino, added his name in April 2012 when he was named head coach at FIU and is now at Minnesota. There are 11 additional former assistants as current head coaches to bring the total to 11 active, including Mick Cronin at Cincinnati; Scott Davenport at Bellarmine; Billy Donovan at Florida; Kevin Keatts at UNC Wilmington, Steve Masiello at Manhattan; Marvin Menzies at New Mexico State; Kareem Richardson at Missouri-Kansas City; Reggie Theus at Cal State Northridge; Kevin Willard at Seton Hall; and Tubby Smith at Texas Tech. Pitino's 10 Division I former assistants as current head coaches is the most in the nation. Three active coaches reached the 2015 NCAA Tournament (Cronin, Masiello and Menzies).

Pitino has a collective 39-10 record in games against his former assistants (3-0 vs. Ralph Willard; 7-5 Tubby Smith; 7-0 Billy Donovan, 7-5 Mick Cronin, 1-0 Scott Davenport, 1-0 Marvin Menzies, 6-0 Kevin Willard, 2-0 Steve Masiello, 2-0 Richard Pitino, 1-0 Kareem Richardson, 1-0 Kevin Keatts, 1-0 Reggie Theus). Davenport's team won the 2011 NCAA Division II Championship. Indiana Pacers head coach Frank Vogel was a student manager for Pitino at Kentucky and his video coordinator with the Celtics. Pitino coached former Golden State Warriors coach Mark Jackson at the New York Knicks. Eastern Kentucky coach Dan McHale was a program assistant at Louisville for two seasons. Seven former Pitino players also became collegiate head coaches, five of which are currently active including Travis Ford of Oklahoma St.; Mark Pope of Utah Valley; Sean Woods of Morehead St.; Donovan and Masiello. Including games against both his former assistants and former players who went on to become collegiate head coaches, Pitino is 43-11 (record vs. former players as head coaches: 3-1 vs. Travis Ford, 2-0 vs. John Pelphrey and Donovan).

■ Cards Sign Impressive Duo — Louisville signed a pair of outstanding high school products in November including V.J. King, a 6-7, 180-pound guard/forward from Paul VI Catholic High School in Fairfax, Va.; and Frankie Hughes, a 6-3, 170-pound guard from Garfield Heights (Ohio) High School.

King averaged 18.5 points, 12.3 rebounds and 4.2 assists as a junior last season in helping Paul VI to a 20-15 record. A first-team all-state, all-area and all-conference selection as a junior, King is ranked No. 21 nationally by Scout.com, 24th by Rivals.com, 25th by 247Sports.com and is No. 27 in the ESPN 100.

Originally from North Carolina, King moved to Akron, Ohio, where he played at St. Vincent-St. Mary -- the alma mater of LeBron James -- through his sophomore season before transferring. He averaged 16.2 points as a sophomore in helping SVSM to a 19-10 record and 2013 Ohio Division II State Tournament semifinals.

King has won two gold medals as a member of two USA Basketball team in the 2013 FIBA Americas U16 Championship in Maldonado, Uruguay, averaging 8.2 points and 5.2 rebounds; and the 2014 FIBA U17 World Championship in Dubai, United Arab Emirates where he averaged 6.7 points and 2.9 rebounds. He participated in the 2015 USA Basketball Junior National Team minicamp in October.

Hughes averaged 17 points, 5.8 rebounds and 5.1 assists as a junior last season in leading Garfield Heights to a 24-4 record and the Ohio Division I semifinals, only the third time the school had advanced to that level in the state tournament. He signed with the Cardinals on Nov. 11 on his 18th birthday.

Hughes had 14 points and 11 rebounds in the state semifinal game. Current Louisville guard Trey Lewis also played at Garfield Heights, leading his team to the state semifinals during his senior year in 2011. Terry Rozier, who played two seasons with the Cardinals before joining the Boston Celtics this season, also hailed from the Cleveland area at Shaker Heights High School.

Hughes is ranked among the nation's top 200 players by 247Sports.com, Hughes scored a season-high 28 points against Mentor. He averaged 10.7 points per game as a sophomore. He averaged 7.9 points, 3.5 rebounds and three assists during the 2015 summer AAU competition.

■ Black Ice Uniforms -- Louisville wore special "Black Ice" adidas uniforms for its Nov. 28 game against Saint Louis. Worn by 11 college basketball teams this season, the Iced Out uniform's reflective finish illuminates when hit with a camera flash for a bold look. The monochrome black and white uniforms feature a diamond pattern inspired by basketball nets along the sides of the jersey and shorts. Enlarged team logos are displayed on the shorts and the warm-ups include a new short sleeved hoodie finished with the same reflective fabric and basketball net print. To give players optimum performance on the court, the uniforms feature the same lightweight, sweatwicking technology used in the NBA. Targeted ventilation zones on the chest, back and side keep players cool even in the most intense moments of the game. A mid-hole mesh on the short maximizes comfort and breathability as the game heats up.

- Cardinal Spurts In its seven games this season, Louisville has produced 17 runs of 8-0 or better, including separate runs of 14-0, 14-0 and 9-0 in its last game vs. Grand Canyon. UofL had a season-best 21-0 run vs. Hartford on Nov. 17. Louisville has forced its opponents into 25 scoring droughts of three minutes or more, including three separate scoring droughts of 4:38, 3:45 and 3:20 against Grand Canyon. The Cards had a season-best 9:24 period of scoreless defense vs. Hartford.
- International Flavor Louisville has an international flavor with four players on its roster hailing from foreign countries. Mangok Mathiang was born in Sudan, Africa and lived in Melbourne, Australia where he also played rugby and Australian Rules Football before coming to the United States. He played a season at Carbondale (III.) Brehm Prep School before signing with the Cardinals. Deng Adel followed a similar path as he was born in the Sudan, grew up in Australia and spent his senior year of high school in Florida. From Cairo, Egypt, Anas Mahmoud played a year at West Oaks Academy in Orlando, Florida before joining the Cards. He speaks four languages. Matz Stockman, from Oslo, Norway, attended school in Spain's Canary Islands during the 2013-14 season before his trek to the U.S.
- Redshirt Planned for McMahon -- A redshirt season is planned for freshman guard Ryan McMahon. The 2015 Florida Class 3A Player of the Year, McMahon averaged 26.4 points, 3.3 assists, 3.0 rebounds and 2.5 steals last season in leading Cardinal Mooney to a 26-4 record and the state final four for the first time in school history. He had been considered a candidate for a redshirt year to allow for physical development when he intially signed with Louisville.
- Ear It Pronunciations -- Trouble with pronunciations? Check out the Ear It pronunciations for the Cardinals' players from the men's basketball roster on www.GoCards.com. The links next to player names on the roster are supplied by TheNameEngine.com, an interactive audio service that provides proper audio pronunciations and phonetic spellings.
- Bench Production -- Louisville's depth has been evident throught the Cardinals' first seven games this season, with UofL averaging 29.0 points off the bench. Last season, Louisville averaged just 9.9 points off the bench and had four games in which the bench was scoreless. Entering last year, it had been since Dec. 5, 2000 vs. Georgetown when the Cards' bench had last finished with zero points. UofL's bench scored 44 points vs. Grand Canyon, including Donovon Mitchell's 13.

■ Cards Are Light on Returning Experience -- Louisville has just two players on its roster -- junior center Mangok Mathiang and walk-on junior guard David Levitch -that have played with the Cardinals more than a year. The Cards return just 17 percent of their scoring and a quarter of their assists from last season's 27-9 NCAA Elite Eight team. It is the lowest percentage of scoring returning for Louisville since 1972-73 when

UofL was without a returning starter from its 1972 Final Four team and returned just 9.7 percent of its scoring (254 of 2,614). Quentin Snider's 146 points in 2014-15 ranks him as UofL's top returning scorer, which is the lowest figure for a UofL top returning scorer since 1972-73 (Bill Bunton, 121 points).

■ Cardinals Reached 14th Elite Eight -- Louisville advanced to its 14th NCAA Elite Eight in 2015 and third in the last four years. Louisville's 14 Elite Eight appearances rank sixth nationally. The NCAA recognizes Elite 8 records since 1951, the first year that all teams in the tournament would be required to win at least one game to advance to the Elite Eight. The Cardinals have a 10-4 record in regional championship games, winning two of their last three. UofL has reached the Elite Eight five of the last eight years and the Cardinals have participated in two of the last four Final Fours (UofL years in Elite Eight: 1959, 1972, 1975, 1980, 1982, 1983, 1986, 1997, 2005, 2008, 2009, 2012, 2013, 2015).

Louisville 14 ■ Cards Have 13 Straight 20-Win Seasons — Louisville is Michigan State 13 one of four Division I schools in the nation which has won 20 or more games in each of the past 13 seasons. Reaching 20 victories last year and extending their streaks are Kansas (26), Duke (19), Gonzaga (17), and Louisville (13). UofL Coach Rick Pitino has won at least 20 games in a season on 23 occasions. ranking him fifth among active coaches in 20-win seasons and 11th overall. Pitino won 30 in a single season for the sixth time in 2013-14. UofL has won at least 19 games in 41 of the last 45 years.

■ Cardinals Reached 21st Sweet 16 -- Louisville advanced to its 21st NCAA Sweet 16 appearance and a school-record fourth straight in 2014-15. The Cardinals and Michigan State are the only two teams that have reached the last four Sweet 16s. Only three teams have been to more Sweet 16 appearances than Louisville's 21 since the NCAA began Sweet 16 records in 1975 (North Carolina 26, Kentucky 26, Duke 24). The Cards have won seven of their last eight regional semifinal games and Louisville has a 15-12 record in NCAA regional semifinal games (14-8 since 1975), including a 6-1 mark under Rick Pitino. Louisville has been to at least the Sweet 16 in seven of the last 11 years, has reached the Elite

■ Combined Hoops Success -- Louisville is one of only three NCAA Division I schools that sent both men and women basketball programs to the NCAA Tournament

in each of the last four seasons (also Duke and Gonzaga). Louisville was one of 21 schools with both its men's and women's basketball teams in the 2015 NCAA Tournament and the Cardinals were one of six schools with both its teams seeded four or above (Louisville women 3 seed, men 4).

Louisville was one of two schools in the nation with both its men's and women's teams ranked among the nation's top 10 teams in the final 2014-15 USA Today coaches poll (UofL men #10, women #10), joining Notre Dame with that distinction.

■ Scoring Leader -- Graduate transfer Damion Lee has scored in double figures in all seven games this season. His 19.1 scoring average leads the Cardinals and is fourth in the ACC. The co-captain is shooting 55.3 percent from the field (ninth in ACC) and leads the team with 14 three-pointers (in 37 attempts, .378). He has scored a season-high 24 points twice and against St. Francis, he scored 21 points and produced season highs with eight rebounds and four assists. Lee was the nation's No. 4 scorer last year, averaging 21.4 points per game as a junior at Drexel.

- Toy Collection Dec. 19 New toys will be collected and subsequently donated to Kosair Children's Hospital at the Cardinals' Dec. 19 men's basketball game against Western Kentucky. New toys for any age or gender will be collected in the lobby of the KFC Yum! Center. The collection is associated with UofL Athletics' CardsCARE program and Kyle's Korner for Kids, the community outreach established in 2011 by former Cards' forward Kyle Kuric while a UofL student. About 2,000 toys have been donated annually by Cardinal fans at similar collections in previous years. Kuric, who has been playing basketball for Herbalife Gran Canaria in Spain for the past two seasons, is currently recovering from brain surgery. He helped the Cardinals reach the 2012 Final Four as a senior.
- Three With 360 Louisville is the only NCAA Division I men's basketball program to have three different coaches with at least 360 victories at the school. Current Cards' Coach Rick Pitino has won 374 games in his 15th season at UofL, his predecessor Denny Crum won 675 games in 30 years (1971-2001) and Bernard "Peck" Hickman won 443 in his 23 years guiding the Cardinals (1944-67). Kansas can join that list when Bill Self wins his 360th game at Kansas (358) as Phog Allen (590) and Roy Williams (418) have at least 360 wins there (through Dec. 5).

■ Cards Among Nation's Best in Pitino Era — Louisville is among 17 programs in the nation that have won at least 70 percent of its games over the last 14 years. Louisville has a .747 winning percentage since U of L Coach Rick Pitino took over the reins of the Cardinal program, eighth best in the nation.

■ Impressive Academic Performance -- While the University of Louisville men's basketball team has performed well on the court, the Cardinals have excelled in the classroom as well. The team produced a collective 3.26 grade point average for 2014-15, just below its record 3.40 GPA from the previous season. Louisville has received an NCAA Public Recognition Award in 2013 and 2014 for ranking among the top 10 percent in men's basketball in the Academic Progress Rate, which measures academic eligibility, retention and graduation for student-athletes. The Cardinals had a perfect 1000 APR in the most recent four-year period, all while winning a combined 121 games — the second-most in the nation in that stretch — and the Cardinals won the 2013 NCAA Championship and reached the 2012 Final Four.

A total of 15 of 16 Cardinals earned a 3.0 or better for the 2014 fall semester, including seven with a 3.4 or above. The men's basketball team has been around a collective 3.0 GPA for 14 consecutive semesters. Louisville placed a league-high seven individuals on the 21-member 2015 ACC All-Academic Team. Prior to entering the ACC, UofL's men's basketball team earned its league's last four Team Academic Excellence Awards, which recognized the highest collective grade-point averages in each of the 23 conference sports (2014 American Athletic Conferenc, 2011-13 Big East).

■ Challenging Schedule — Three participants from the 2015 NCAA Final Four are among a challenging schedule that UofL will face this season. Louisville has played a schedule ranked among the top 16 toughest by the ratings percent index (RPI) in seven of the last eight seasons. Sixteen of the Cards' 31 games will be played against teams that participated in post-season competition last season, including 10 from the 2015 NCAA Tournament. Nineteen of the Cardinals' games will be played against teams that won at least 17 games last season. UofL's schedule is No. 22 in the RPI.

Eleven of Louisville's 31 games this season will be against teams that were ranked among the nation's top 25 or were receiving votes in the preseason USA Today coaches poll, including six games among teams in the top six (1 North Carolina, 1 Kentucky, 4 Duke twice, 6 Virginia twice, 13 Michigan State, 18 Notre Dame; receiving votes: NC State, Florida State, Miami). Four of the top 20 teams in the preseason poll hail from the ACC, with four more among those receiving votes (including Louisville). The two teams that shared the preseason top ranking are among the Cardinals' foes.

- Anniversary Year for Two Championship teams The 2015-16 season marks notable anniversaries for two of Louisville's national championship teams. It is the 30th anniversary for UofL's 1986 NCAA Championship team (32-7 record), which was guided by future Hall of Fame Coach Denny Crum and featured four starters that currently rank among the top 11 scorers all-time at UofL: Pervis Ellison (2,143 career points), Milt Wagner (1,836), Herbert Crook (1,723) and Billy Thompson (1,685); starting guard Jeff Hall was also a career 1,000-point scorer (1,294). Louisville defeated Duke 72-69 in the 1986 title game and Ellison became the second freshman in NCAA history to be named the Most Outstanding Player after producing 25 points and 11 rebounds against the Blue Devils. This season also marks the 60th anniversary of the Cardinals' 1956 National Invitation Tournament title. The 1956 NIT Champions, which UofL Coach Peck Hickman had directed to a No. 6 national ranking entering the tournament, beat third-ranked Dayton 93-80 in the title game to cap a 26-3 season. Former U of L All-America Charlie Tyra was honored as the Most Valuable Player of the 1956 NIT, scoring 29 points against St. Joseph's in the national semifinal.
- Non-Conference Success -- Louisville has a 185-43 record (.811) against non-conference opponents in Coach Rick Pitino's 15 seasons (includes post-season). The Cardinals are 126-10 at home in regular season non-conference games under Pitino, including a 51-3 mark over the last six seasons in the KFC Yum! Center.
- Pitino Fifth in Wins Through 31 Seasons -- UofL Coach Rick Pitino is fifth in most career coaching victories through 31 seasons. Pitino needs one victory to add to his 728 current total to tie him for fourth on the list with Jerry Tarkanian (Long Beach State, UNLV, Fresno State).

HEAD COACH RICK PITINO

In his 31st season as a collegiate head coach and 15th at Louisville, UofL Coach **Rick Pitino** has compiled a 728-255 overall record (374-127 at UofL). A member of the Naismith Memorial



Basketball Hall of Fame, he is the first coach to take three different schools to the NCAA Final Four -- including his 2005. 2012 and 2013 Cardinal teams -- and the first to win an NCAA Championship at two different schools after guiding Louisville to the 2013 NCAA title. Among active coaches, Pitino (Massachusetts '74) has the second-highest winning percentage in NCAA Tournament games (.746 winning percentage, 53-18 record in 20 NCAA tournament appearances) and his overall .741 winning percentage ranks him 14th among active coaches. He guided Kentucky to three NCAA Final Four appearances in eight seasons (1989-97). winning the 1996 NCAA Championship and reaching the national title game in 1997. He has also served as head coach at Providence College (1985-87, 1987 Final Four), Boston University (1978-83), Hawaii (last six games in 1975-76) as well as the NBA New York Knicks (1987-89) and Boston Celtics (1997-2001).

■ Two Cards in International Competition -- Two UofL players competed in international events during the summer. Sophomore forward/center Chinanu Onuaku won a gold medal as a member of the 2015 USA Basketball Men's U19 World Championship Team, while junior center Mangok Mathiang competed with Australia in the 2015 World University Games.

In seven games during the event played June 27-July 5 in Heraklion, Crete, Greece, **Onuaku** started six games and averaged 4.6 points, 5.0 rebounds, hit 13-of-20 field goals (.650) and added 10 steals and a team-high 12 blocked shots while averaging 16 minutes a game for the deep USA squad, coached by Arizona's Sean Miller. Onuaku's 1.7 blocked shots were the sixth-most in the 16-team event.

Onuaku totaled six points, eight rebounds and a team-high four blocked shots in 28 minutes in the USA's 79-71 overtime victory over Croatia, claiming its second straight U19 World Championship, the first USA back-to-back titles in the event since 1983. Former UofL forward Montrezl Harrell was a member of the 2013 gold medal winning team.

Mathiang led the 23-team World University Games in rebounding and finished tied for eighth in scoring, producing five double-doubles.

He started all eight games for Australia, averaging 13.5 points and 10.3 rebounds while shooting 56.1 percent from the field (46-of-82, fourth-best in the event) and adding seven blocked shots. His top scoring effort was 23 points against Chinese Taipei and his best rebounding game was 17 against the home nation Korea. The USA won the gold medal.

Australia (5-3) finished 10th in the event played in Gwangju, South Korea July 4-13. Mathiang was born in Sudan, Africa, but lived in Melbourne, Australia before moving to the United States in 2010 to attend prep school.

Former Cardinal Luke Hancock had been the last UofL player to participate in the World University Games, finishing ninth with the USA squad in the 2013 games played in Kazan. Russia.

In addition to the players, UofL's Rick Pitino coached the Puerto Rico National Team in the summer of 2015 in three international competitions. He guided an injury depleted Puerto Rico team to a fifth-place finish in the 2015 FIBA Americas tournament, keeping hopes alive for Olympic qualification.

The participation by both players, as well as Pitino's coaching stint with the Puerto Rico national team, were also part of the ACC Worldwide initiative that seeks to further the conference's member institutions internationally through promotion, marketing and athletic competition.

■ Cardinals Visited Puerto Rico -- The Cardinals gained valuable experience with its 10 days of practice and series of seven games over five days against the Puerto Rico National Team and Junior Team during their Aug. 10-17 visit to Puerto Rico. The competition coincided with UofL Coach Rick Pitino's decision to serve as the head coach of the Puerto Rico basketball team in two international events this summer. The opportunity to face off against the Puerto Rican teams was among the top reasons that Pitino took the position. UofL attained a waiver to allow the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico, a United States territory, to serve as the destination for the team's foreign trip as Pitino was serving as head coach of the Puerto Rico National Team.

Louisville recently visited Puerto Rico for the 2014 Armed Forces Classic, facing Minnesota in Aguadilla, Puerto Rico for the opening game last season in a hangar at the Coast Guard's US Air Station Boringuen.

■ Two NBA Draft Picks -- A pair of UofL underclassmen were selected in the 2015 NBA Draft as guard Terry Rozier was selected in the first round by the Boston Celtics as the 16th overall pick, while forward Montrezl Harrell was taken in the second round by the Houston Rockets as the 32nd selection. Rozier left UofL following his sophomore year while Harrell played three seasons with the Cardinals.

A total of 68 former Louisville players have been selected in the NBA Draft, including five in the last three years. Currently with the Memphis Grizzlies, Russ Smith was selected by the Philadelphia 76ers in the second round of the 2014 NBA Draft with the 47th overall pick, and was subsequently traded to the New Orleans Pelicans. Gorgui Dieng was a first-round selection and the 21st overall pick by the Utah Jazz in 2013, with his rights subsequently traded to the Minnesota Timberwolves, where he has played the last two seasons. Peyton Siva was a second round choice of the Detroit Pistons in 2013 with the 56th pick overall.

Louisville has produced 22 first-round NBA Draft choices, including 11 in the top ten and five among the top three picks (Pervis Ellison first in 1989; Wes Unseld second in 1968; Darrell Griffith second in 1980; Charlie Tyra second in 1957; Rodney McCray third in 1983).

10 Things About Louisville Basketball

- 1. Louisville's 129 victories over the last five years are the second-most wins in the nation in that stretch (Kentucky leads with 133 through Dec. 5).
- 2. Louisville and Wichita State are the only schools in the nation to win at least 30 games in three of the last four seasons seasons, including a school-record 35 victories by UofL's 2012-13 NCAA Championship team (30 in 2011-12, 31 in 2013-14).
- 3. Louisville reached the NCAA Sweet 16 for a school-record fourth straight time in 2015 (tied for the most in the nation)and the 21st occasion in school history. Michigan State is the only other school that has reached each of the last four Sweet 16s. The Cardinals have been to the Elite Eight in five of the last eight years.
- 4. Louisville Coach Rick Pitino reached his 700th collegiate coaching win in 2014. He is one of five active collegiate coaches in the Basketball Hall of Fame, four of which are in the ACC.
- 5. The Cards' 2014-15 senior class was the winningest in UofL history, winning a combined 123 games over the last four years.
- 6. Louisville, Syracuse and VCU are the only three teams to rank among the top 25 nationally in steals over the last five years. In 2014-15, UofL ranked among the national defensive leaders in blocked shots (5.4, 13th in the NCAA), steals (7.9, 23rd), three-point field goal percentage defense (30.3, 19th), scoring defense (59.8, 23rd), and field goal percentage defense (.392, 23rd).
- 7. Louisville is one of just four schools which have won 20 or more games in each of the last 13 seasons. Louisville has won at least 19 games in 41 of the last 45 years.
- 8. While also winning on the court, Louis-ville has earned its last four consecutive conference top team academic excellence awards. The Cardinals have a perfect Academic Progress Rate score for the most recent four-year period (2009-13). The team posted a record 3.40 grade point average collectively for the 2013-14 academic year and had a collective 326 mark in 2014-15.
- 9. Louisville has won 10 of its last 11 conference tournament games, claiming three of its last four conference tournament championships. Six of the last 13 NCAA Championships have been won by current ACC schools, including the Cardinals' 2013 title.
- 10. Louisville has a 60-33 record in road games over the last 10 years (.645) and has a 32-6 record in neutral site games over the past five seasons (.842).

■ Cards Have Been Tough on the Road — UofL has a 60-33 record over the last 10 years on its opponent's home court (.652). Louisville had the most road victories of any school in Big East Conference games over its last seven years in that league and was a league-best 8-1 in its road games in The American during the 2013-14 season. UofL posted a 6-3 road record in its first year in the ACC, fourth-best in the league. The Cardinals have a 52-28 record in conference games on the road over the last nine seasons (.650). In neutral site games, Louisville has a 32-6 record over the last five years (.842) and a 42-13 neutral site record over the last eight years (.763).

In conference games overall, Louisville had the most Big East Conference victories over its eight years in that league during the regular season (from 2005 to 2013). Louisville had a 95-45 Big East record in league victories during the regular season, just ahead of Syracuse and Pittsburgh (both at 92-48). Louisville finished fourth in its first year in the ACC with a 12-6 league record.

- Cards Will Host 2016 NCAA Regional The University of Louisville will serve as the host institution for the South Regional of the 2016 NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Championship to be played March 24 and 26, 2016 at the KFC Yum! Center. It is the first time in which Louisville has served as the site for an NCAA Regional since 1987, when a Rick Pitino coached Providence squad beat Georgetown in the Southeast Regional Championship in Louisville's Freedom Hall to move on to the Final Four. UofL and the KFC Yum! Center also served as host for the Second and Third Rounds of the 2015 NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Championship on March 19 and 21, 2015 at the KFC Yum! Center.
- Mitchell's Effort Among Top Freshmen Starts Freshman guard Donovan Mitchell got off to a great start against Samford in the Cardinals' opener. He is one of just 10 players in Louisville history to score as many as 14 points in a freshman career debut, tying for eighth on that list with 14 off the bench, hitting all four of his field goals, his lone three-pointer and 5-of-6 free throws. He added three steals, three rebounds, and an assist without a turnover -- all in just 17 minutes. His individual scoring high at Brewster Academy last season was 29 points against St. Thomas More.
- Louisville Top College Basketball Market -- Louisville is consistently the highest-rated television market for college basketball on ESPN. Louisville has been the top market each of the last 13 years, averaging a 5.9 rating for the 2014-15 season. Louisville was nearly three points higher than second-place Greensboro, which averaged a 3.0 rating. The remaining top 10 was Raleigh-Durham (2.7), Kansas City (2.4), Columbus (2.1), Cincinnati (1.9), Dayton (1.9) Indianapolis (1.8), Charlotte (1.8) and Memphis (1.8). The Cardinals' NCAA Sweet 16 game against Kentucky in 2014 drew a 51.5 rating and 73 share, making it the second highest-rated event in Louisville television history. Louisville's 2013 NCAA Championship game against Michigan is the top-rated television event all-time in the Louisville market.
- Sixth Season in KFC Yum! Center -- This is Louisville's sixth season in the spectacular KFC Yum! Center, located on the banks of the Ohio River in downtown Louisville. The Cardinals had previously played basketball for 54 years in Freedom Hall (1956-2010). The 22,000-seat multi-purpose arena was built at a cost of \$238 million and includes 71 luxury suites, 62 four- or six-seat premium boxes, over 2,000 side-court club seats and four party suites with a seating capacity of 32 each.

UofL's men's and women's teams have permanent locker rooms. There are five additional team locker rooms, two officials locker rooms, five star dressing rooms, a fullfunction media work room and a full-sized basketball practice court on the event level. The seven levels of the arena (including the upper catwalk) include a collective 721,762 square feet, or roughly the area of 13 football fields.

After passing through the one and a half acre landscaped entry plaza that features a basketball-themed fountain, entering fans can visit the 2,500-square foot U of L adidas store, the 3,000-square foot U of L Hall of Honor, or head to their seats using one of the eight escalators or seven elevators within the building.

Lounge space is abundant within the three that overlook the Ohio River. The



7,000-square foot main concourse restaurant overlooks the river and a main concourse sports bar has views directly into the arena bowl. Two 4,000-square foot club lounges on the event level, as well as the terrace club and premium box lounges, provide amenities for their respective patrons. The KFC Yum! Center served as the site for the NCAA Men's Basketball Tournament second and third rounds in 2012 and 2015, will be the site for the South Regional in March 2016 and was the site for the 2012 NCAA Women's Volleyball Championship on December 13 and 15.

- ... 48 of its last 64 post-season tournament games over the last 11 years (including conference, NCAA and NIT since 2005). Louisville is 25-4 in the postseason over the last four years.
- ... 26 of its last 34 games in the NCAA Tournament (since 2005), advancing to the final eight teams five times in the last eight years (2008, 2009, 2012, 2013, 2015).
- ... 29 of 36 games during the month of March over the last four years.
- ... 129 games over the last five years, the second-most wins in the nation in that stretch (Kentucky leads with 133 through Dec. 5). Louisville and Wichita State are the only two schools in the nation to win 30 games in three of the last four seasons, including a schoolrecord 35 victories by the Cardinals' 2012-13 NCAA Championship team. ... 20 games for the 13th straight season,
- a feat accomplished by only four schools. ... 12 ACC regular season games in 2014-15. Louisville has won at least 10 league games for eight straight seasons. UofL has finished in the top three in its conference six of the last nine years.
- ... 10 of its last 11 conference tournament games. Louisville is 15-3 with three championships over its last seven conference tournaments, reaching the title game five times. Louisville has won three of its last four conference titles.

- Statistical Trends UofL is 164-9 over the last 15 seasons under Coach Rick Pitino when scoring 80 or more points (5-0 this season, 11-0 in 2014-15) ... Over the past 15 years under Pitino, Louisville is 122-6 when shooting 50 percent or better from the field (6-0 this season, 8-0 in 2014-15) ... UofL is 299-46 when holding its opponent below 70 points over the past 15 years under Pitino (6-0 this season, 24-4 in 2014-15, 27-1 in 2013-14, 32-1 in 2012-13).
- Kennesaw State Awaits Next Louisville plays its third of six straight home games in the KFC Yum! Center as the Cardinals face the Kennesaw State Owls on Dec. 16 (Wednesday, 7 p.m., ESPNU). Kennesaw State (3-8) beat Thomas University 69-59 for its second victory in three games as junior guard Kendrick Ray produced his third double-double in four games with 21 points, 10 rebounds and four assists. The Owls have a nine-day break prior to facing the Cardinals.

The Owls are coached by Al Skinner, a teammate of UofL Coach Rick Pitino's at Massachusetts from 1970-74. In his first season at Kennesaw State, Skinner is a former Atlantic 10, Big East and national coach of the year. Preseason All-Atlantic Sun selection Yonel Brown, a 5-9 senior guard, is among two returning starters from the Owls' team which posted a 10-22 record a year ago. Located in Kennesaw, Ga., KSU is No. 279 in the RPI and No. 320 in the Sagarin Ratings through Dec. 8. Kennesaw State is one of five first-time foes for the Cardinals this season, including this current stretch of three straight.

Cardinals in the NCAA Tournament

■ Louisville made its 41st NCAA Tournament appearance in 2015. The Cardinals have reached the NCAA Tournament 32 of the last 39 years (nine straight, 12 of the last 13, 14 of the last 17 years, and 20 of last 24). The Cards have reached the Sweet 16 on 21 occasions (four straight) and have advanced to the Elite Eight five of the last eight

appearances, including 12 of his last 13 years at Louisville (nine straight). His last six

straight Kentucky teams reached the NCAA Tournament. The Wildcats won the 1996

NCAA title and were national runner-up in 1997 under his guidance.

seasons. Louisville is sixth in tournament victories (75) and is fifth in tournament appearances (41). UofL has a 75-42 overall NCAA Tournament record, reaching the Final Four 10 times.

- Only four teams -- Kentucky (55), North Carolina (46), UCLA (45), and Kansas (44) -- have more NCAA Tournament appearances than Louisville's 41.
- U of L Coach Rick Pitino has a 53-18 record in NCAA Tournament play (.746), ranking him second among active coaches in winning percentage and 10th all time. Only three coaches have coached more Final Four teams than Pitino's seven, a feat matched by one other. Pitino is the first coach to win an NCAA Championship at two different schools; the first to lead three different teams to the Final Four; is one of 11 coaches
