Louisville Basketball Tradition



Basketball is special to Kentuckians. The sport permeates everyday life from offices to farmlands, from coal mines to neighborhood drug stores. It is more than just a sport played in the cold winter months. It is a source of pride filled year-round with anticipation, hope and celebration. Kentuckians love their basketball, and the tradition-rich University of Louisville program has supplied its fans with one of the nation's finest products for decades.

Legendary coach Bernard "Peck" Hickman, a Basketball Hall of Fame nominee, arrived on the U of L campus in 1944 to begin a remarkable string of 46 consecutive winning seasons. For 23 seasons, Hickman laid an impressive foundation for the Cardinals.

John Dromo, an assistant coach under Hickman for 19 years, continued the Louisville program in outstanding fashion following Hickman's retirement. For 30 years, Denny Crum followed the same path of success that Hickman and Dromo both walked, guiding the Cardinals to even higher acclaim. Now, fifth-year coach Rick Pitino has energized a re-emergence in building upon the rich U of L tradition, returning the Cards to the NCAA Final Four in 2005.

Among the Cardinals' past successes include national championships in the NCAA (1980 and 1986), NIT (1956) and the NAIB (1948). U of L is the only school in the nation to have claimed the championship in all three major tournaments.

The Cardinals have appeared in the NCAA tournament on 32 occasions, which places U of L sixth in all-time NCAA Tournament appearances behind Kentucky (46), North Carolina (35), UCLA (37), Kansas (34) and Indiana (33).

Louisville has played in the Final Four eight times, including four times in the 1980s. Only six schools -- North Carolina

(16), Duke (14), UCLA (14), Kentucky (13), Kansas (12) and Ohio State (9) have reached the Final Four more often.

Louisville was arguably the most dominant team in college basketball during the decade of the 1980s. Evidence of that claim is simple; during the decade of the 80s, the Cardinals won two national championships (equalled only by Indiana); sent an unmatched four teams to the Final Four; appeared among the final 16 teams seven times (bettered only by North Carolina's nine times); and posted the highest NCAA Tournament winning percentage of any other team (.793, 23-6).

Tremendous pride is taken in the

tradition established at the University of Louisville. Student-athletes who attend U of L follow in the footsteps of some of college basketball's all-time greats. These athletes must be willing to give of themselves, just as former U of L stars did, to maintain U of L as one of the nation's top programs. It is more than the Wes Unseld's, Darrell Griffith's and Pervis Ellison's of the U of L world. It's the teamwork of those with the Terry Howard's, Roger Burkman's and Derwin Webb's on the Cardinal rosters that blend into one team, one unit, to achieve a common goal. It is a commitment that has been worthwhile at U of L for decades.

Pervis Ellison - Top NBA Draft Pick of '89

The only player in U of L history to total both 2,000 points and 1,000 rebounds, Pervis Ellison ended his playing career with the Cardinals as the No. 2 all-time scorer and he became only the second player at U of L to score 2,000 points in his career. A consensus All-American in 1989, "Never Nervous Pervis" was named MVP of the 1989 Metro Conference Tournament, an award he also won

as a freshman. The all-time shot blocker at U of L and in the Metro Conference with 374 career rejections, Ellison blocked at least one shot in 130 of his 136 career games. He finished his career third among NCAA career leaders in blocked shots. In 1986, he led the Cardinals to their second NCAA Championship title and was the first freshman since 1944 to be named the Most Outstanding Player of the Final Four. The Cardinals won two regular season Metro titles and three Metro tournament championships during Ellison's career. Following his playing career at U of L, Ellison became one of the select few collegiate players and the first for the Cardinals when he was chosen as the No. 1 pick in the 1989 NBA Draft. His jersey number - 42 - was retired at ceremonies following the 1989 season.

Darrell Griffith - Louisville's Living Legend

In 1980 Darrell Griffith received the prestigious John Wooden Award from the Los Angeles Athletic Club as college basketball's Player of the Year. He was also selected by *The Sporting News* for the same honor. A consensus All-American in 1980, he led Louisville to a 33-3 record and the school's first NCAA national championship. He left U of L as the school's career scoring leader (2,333

points); the first player in U of L history to surpass the 2,000 point mark; the school single season scoring leader with 825 points; and the only player at Louisville to score more than 700 points in one season. He finished his collegiate career having scored in double figures in 41 straight games and 111 of his 126 games with the Cardinals. In his four seasons with Louisville, he helped teams to a combined record of 101-25; two regular season Metro Conference titles; two Metro tournament championships; four straight NCAA tournament appearances; and the 1980 NCAA Championship. His jersey number — 35 — was retired at ceremonies following the 1980 basketball season and his road uniform is on permanent display at the Naismith Basketball Hall of Fame.

Wes Unseld - Top Single Game Scorer

When Wes Unseld ended his career with the University of Louisville following the 1967-68 season, he left as the Cardinals' all-time leading scorer for a three-year player. Today, Unseld ranks seventh on the all-time scoring list, but his career point total of 1,686 is still tops for a three-year player. A consensus All-American during his junior and senior years, Unseld is one of only five other

Cardinal players to pull down over 1,000 rebounds in his career. His 1,551 career rebounds ranks second behind Charlie Tyra's 1,617. Unseld began his senior season with a 45-point effort against Georgetown College, a U of L record that still stands today. Unseld, chosen as second player overall in the NBA draft by Baltimore, was honored on the All-Missouri Valley Conference team all three years at U of L and the Cardinals were 60-22 during his three seasons. During his junior year, Unseld led the Cardinals to a final No. 2 ranking in both wire service polls. Unseld's 20.6 scoring average still ranks as the top scoring average in Louisville history. His 18.9 rebounding average also ranks as the top average for a Cardinal. While playing on the Cardinals' freshmen team, Unseld averaged 35.8 points, 23.6 rebounds and hit 68.6 percent from the field.

Charlie Tyra - Top All-Time Rebounder

A consensus All-American during the 1956 and 1957 seasons, Charlie Tyra led the University of Louisville to its first NIT title in 1956 and was named the tournament's MVP for his performance. Tyra was named Helms Athletic Foundation All-American in his junior and senior years. One of only five Cardinals to record over 1,000 rebounds in his career, Tyra ranks as the all-time

rebounder in U of L history with 1,617. During the 1955-56 season, Tyra pulled down 645 rebounds, a mark that has been bettered by only three other players in NCAA history. He set the Louisville record for most rebounds in a game when he pulled down 38 against Canisius during the 1955-56 season. In his four seasons with Louisville, he helped teams to a combined record of 88-23 and three straight NIT appearances. Tyra ranks first in career free throws made (448), second in career rebounding average (17.0), fourth in career scoring average (18.2), fifth in career scorers (1,728 points) and eighth in field goals made (640). Tyra is one of only four players in U of L history to score 40 points or more in a game (achieved against Notre Dame when he hit 12 of 16 field goals and all 16 of his free throw attempts).

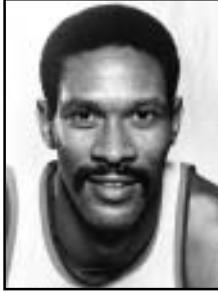

Freedom Hall



U of L is in its 51st season in tradition-rich Freedom Hall.

Situated on the massive Kentucky Fair and Exposition Center in Louisville, Freedom Hall was refurbished and refined in 1984 to increase its seating capacity from 16,613 to 18,865.

The approximate \$13.3 million renovation of the 50-year-old, state-owned facility began April 2, 1984. Lower arena seating and the ceiling were torn out and renovation crews removed some 10,000 square feet of dirt to lower the arena floor about 10 feet.

The resulting renovation project has provided the Cardinals with a showcase for college basketball at its best. In addition to added seating, among the structural improvements were a \$750,000 lighting system that is daylight balanced, a \$225,000 sound system, a new ceiling, a reinforced roof and a new heating, ventilation and air conditioning system.

Also included are 24 private boxes located between the lower arena and loge

seats. A new scoreboard system and video wall setup was installed in 1994.

Other features included in the renovation that accompany the arena are a press room, locker rooms and coaches' offices for the Cardinals and visiting teams, a president's reception room and two plush VIP lounges.

The multi-purpose facility was the site of the 2001 and 2003 Conference USA Basketball Tournaments. Freedom Hall also housed nine Metro Conference Basketball Tournaments (1976, 1980, 1981, 1985, 1986, 1987, 1992, 1993 and 1995).

Six NCAA Finals have been staged in Freedom Hall, home of the University of Louisville basketball team since 1956. The 1976 NCAA Midwest Regional was held there in addition to the first and second rounds of the 1983 NCAA Midwest Regional. The NCAA Southeast Regional was played there in 1987. U of L also hosted the First and Second Rounds of the NCAA Southeast Regional in 1991.

Freedom Hall's facelift provided new

record crowds for the Cards. The largest crowd in the facility was the 20,091 group that witnessed U of L's Jan. 21, 2006 game against third-ranked Connecticut, a game which also served as a backdrop for ESPN's College Gameday. The biggest crowd prior to the renovation was 17,661 against Cincinnati on Feb. 22, 1969.

Freedom Hall surpassed the 10 million mark in attendance for U of L basketball games in 2004. Last year, the Cards ranked fourth nationally in home attendance with a 18,316 average in 22 games, the 31st consecutive year U of L has ranked among the nation's top ten, including 25 straight in the top five. U of L averaged a record 19,591 in 1996-97.

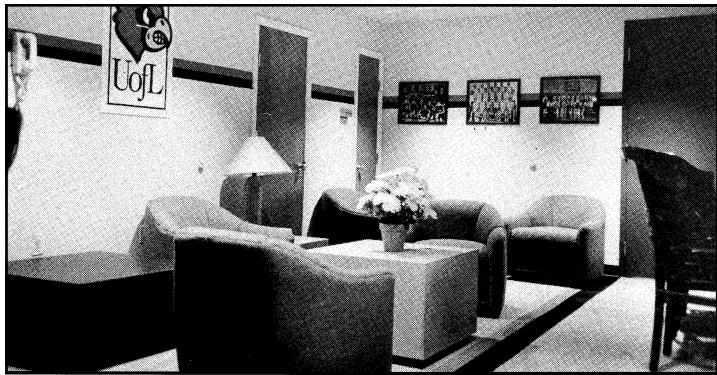
In addition to college basketball, Freedom Hall has served as a site of the state high school basketball tournament, all-star contests and various concerts and conventions. The facility was originally designed for just one event — the Kentucky State Fair Horse Show, considered the world championship for show horses.

■ **Most consecutive victories in Freedom Hall:** 26, starting with a 94-70 win over Tenn.-Chattanooga on Jan. 4, 1979, 16 home games of the 1979-80 season and the first game of the 1980-81 season (78-67 win over Maryland). Utah beat U of L (78-59) on Dec. 20, 1981 to end the home court streak.

■ **Largest Crowd:** 20,088 that witnessed U of L's Jan. 21, 2006 game against Connecticut. Prior to the renovation in 1984, the largest crowd was 17,661 vs. Cincinnati on Feb. 22, 1969.

■ **11 Million Mark Should Be Reached in 2006-07:** U of L should reach the 11 million mark in all-time attendance in Freedom Hall this season. U of L opened the year 211,659 fans short of 11M fans, a mark that should be reached in the Cardinals' game against Northeastern or San Francisco given U of L's usual average attendance. In 50 years of competition in Freedom Hall, 10,788,341 fans have flocked to Freedom Hall to see the Cards play basketball. The Cardinals have been unbeaten in the 18,865-seat facility six seasons, including the three games U of L played in the arena in 1956-57 before officially moving to Freedom Hall the following year.

■ **Note:** U of L played just three games in Freedom Hall in 1956-57, Dec. 26 vs. Notre Dame; Dec. 28 vs. St. Louis; and Dec. 29 vs. Dayton. The Cards played 10 of their home games that season in the Jefferson County Armory. U of L also played one game in the Jefferson County Armory in 1958-59; two games in the Convention Center in 1963-64; and three games in the Convention Center in 1964-65.
