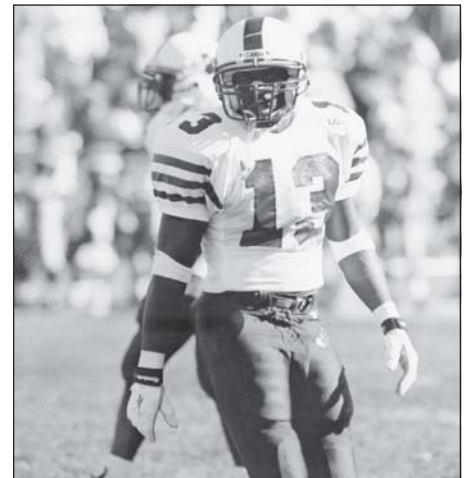

2005 Bronko Nagurski Award Winner



When one thinks of the finest players in the BIG EAST Conference, Elvis Dumervil's name will now be included on that list. Dumervil's 2005 season will go down as the finest ever for a Cardinal.

A native of Miami, Fla., Dumervil played sparingly as a freshman in 2002 before playing in all 13 games as a sophomore in 2003. He recorded 28 tackles

and two sacks, but seemed to always make plays when inserted into the lineup. The 2004 season was his best to that point in his career, recording 52 tackles and leading the team with 10 sacks. However, no one could've forecasted the success Dumervil would achieve in 2005. Dumervil set an NCAA record in the first game that season, recording six sacks in a 31-24 win over Kentucky. He followed that performance with three more sacks against Oregon State to set another record for sacks in consecutive games with nine. He went on to terrorize the opposition for 20 sacks and 10 forced fumbles, both of which led the nation and were school and league records. He guided the Cardinals to a 9-3 record and was named the BIG EAST Defensive Player of the Year. At the end of his senior season, Dumervil was tabbed the winner of the Bronko Nagurski Award, given to the nation's top defensive player. Dumervil was drafted in the fourth round by the Denver Broncos.

#77

BRUCE ARMSTRONG (OL)

A four-year letterwinner for the Cardinals from 1983-86, Bruce Armstrong became one of the most dominating and intimidating offensive linemen in the history of the school.

Beginning his career at U of L as a tight end, Armstrong recorded 33 receptions in his first two seasons at U of L.

With the hiring of legendary coach Howard Schnellenberger, Armstrong was moved to offensive tackle where he anchored the Cardinals line for the next two seasons.

Nobody is complaining after a long and distinguished NFL career.

Armstrong did not allow a sack over his final 18 games as a collegian. He appeared in the 1986 Senior Bowl and was named U of L's most outstanding lineman following his senior season.

Armstrong was drafted with the 23rd pick of the first round by the New England Patriots in 1987 to begin an association that continued for 15 seasons.

A seven-time Pro Bowl honoree, Armstrong started 212 games for the Patriots and is the franchise's all-time leader in that category passing Julius Adams.

Armstrong started 212 of a possible 220 nonstrike games (including the last 118 consecutive of his career) for the Patriots.

The 6-4, 295-pound tackle missed eight contests in 1992 after suffering what was feared to be a career-ending knee injury against the Buffalo Bills.

#56

DOUG BUFFONE (LB/C)

Doug Buffone was a standout on both sides of the football during his career with the Cardinals, playing offensive center and linebacker from 1962-65. He remains the Cardinals' No. 3 all-time tackler with 479, just nine stops behind the program's all-time leader Mark Sander ('87-90).

Born in Yatesboro, Pa., Buffone is one of only four players to lead U of L in tackles for three consecutive seasons. The others are Sander, Tom Jackson ('70-72) and Tyrus McCloud ('94-96).

Following his collegiate career, Buffone was selected by the Chicago Bears in the fourth round of the 1966 NFL Draft and the eighth round of the AFL by the San Diego Chargers.

Buffone went on to play 15 seasons at linebacker for the Bears, retiring in 1980 as the all-time leader in games played for the legendary organization.

In his professional career, Buffone logged more than 1,200 tackles, going over the 100-tackle plateau in seven different seasons. He also held the honor of serving as the defensive captain for eight seasons, beginning in 1972.

Buffone retired with 24 career interceptions to lead all Bear linebackers. His first two interceptions came off Bart Starr and Johnny Unitas.

#34

RAY BUCHANAN (CB)

He endeared himself to all Louisville fans as "Big Play" Ray, but it was a career that almost wasn't for Ray Buchanan.

Arriving as a wide receiver/ running back from Maywood, Ill., Buchanan initially balked at being moved to the defensive backfield, to the point of almost transferring.

After some convincing by coach Howard Schnellenberger, Buchanan made the switch and left his mark on the U of L and NFL history books as a two-time collegiate All-American and NFL Pro Bowl selection.

Buchanan jumped on the scene as a sophomore in 1990, piling up 59 tackles and three interceptions in helping the Cardinals to the 1990 Sunkist Fiesta Bowl (including a key field goal block against Memphis to preserve the bowl bid).

He then made his mark on the national stage as the Defensive MVP of the Fiesta Bowl with five tackles, a fumble recovery and a recovery of a blocked punt in the end zone as Louisville drilled Alabama 34-7.

As a junior in 1991, Buchanan was named a Playboy All-American as he compiled 108 tackles and set a then-school record for interceptions with eight.

Buchanan was drafted in the third round by the Indianapolis Colts and helped the Colts to the 1996 NFC Championship game. He was traded to the Atlanta Falcons, where he played in Super Bowl XXXIII.

#42 ERNIE GREEN (RB)

A native of Columbus, Ga., Ernie Green rushed for more than 1,500 yards in his career as a Louisville Cardinal.

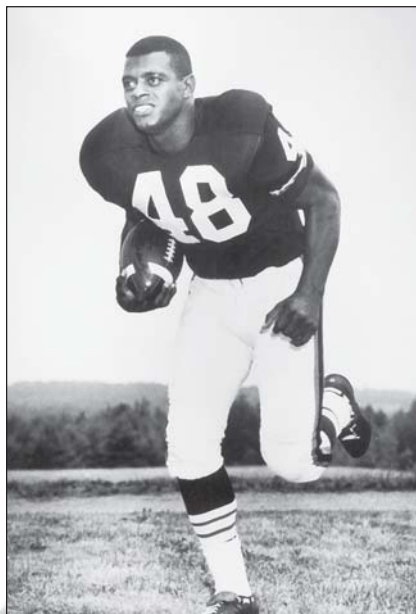
An outstanding athlete, Green led U of L in rushing during two of his four seasons and was a versatile player out of the backfield catching passes. Green also excelled on the baseball diamond spurning contract offers to remain on the gridiron.

Green was selected in the 14th round of the 1962 NFL Draft by the reigning world champion Green Bay Packers. After surviving preseason camp, Green was sold to the Cleveland Browns where he would make a name for himself as one of the league's top fullbacks.

After seeing limited action as a rookie in 1962, Green entered the Cleveland backfield alongside the legendary Jim Brown. Green finished his first season with 526 yards rushing and caught 28 passes out of the backfield.

Following Brown's retirement in 1967, Green teamed with Leroy Kelly to give the Browns one of the most dangerous backfield combinations in the NFL.

Green earned a pair of Pro Bowl appearances following the 1966 and 1967 season and was also a member of the Browns' World Championship team in 1964. He gained 3,204 yards in his six-year NFL career.



#50 TOM JACKSON (LB)

Tom Jackson spent three seasons as a linebacker for the Cardinals leading the team in tackles all three campaigns and earning all-Missouri Valley Conference Player of the Year honors in 1970 and 1972.

A native of Cleveland, Ohio, Jackson played all three seasons under the watchful eye of the colorful Lee Corso as the Cards posted a 23-7-2 mark in Jackson's three seasons as an active player.

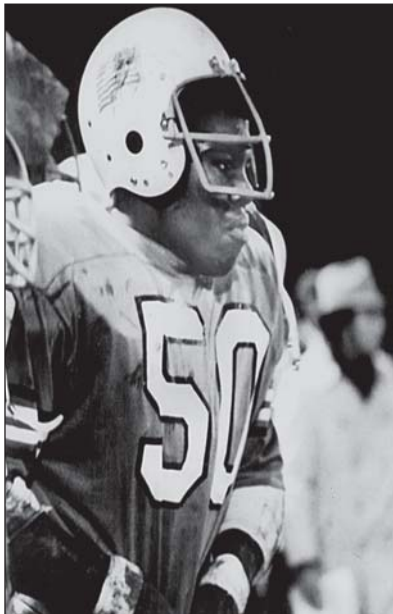
Following his collegiate career, Jackson was selected in the fourth round of the 1973 NFL Draft by the Denver Broncos. He turned out to be one of the biggest draft day steals in history.

For the next 14 seasons, Jackson would wear the Orange and Blue playing in 191 games overall and starting 179. His 191 career games played is second all-time on the Denver list trailing only John Elway.

Voted into the Broncos' Ring of Fame in 1992, Jackson earned three trips to the Pro Bowl and was twice named first-team All-Pro. One of the most popular players in Bronco history, Jackson was recognized by his teammates a franchise record six times as Denver's most inspirational player prior to his retirement in 1986.

He retired fifth on the Broncos' all-time sacks list with 44 and was tied for the franchise lead in interceptions by a linebacker with 20.

Jackson went on to an equally successful stint as a reporter and co-host of ESPN's award-winning NFL GameDay and Primetime shows, which air every Sunday during football season.



#75 JOE JACOBY (OT)

A hometown boy made good, Jacoby was a three-year letter winner as an offensive tackle for the Cardinals after coming in as a prep All-American in both football and basketball from Louisville Western High School.

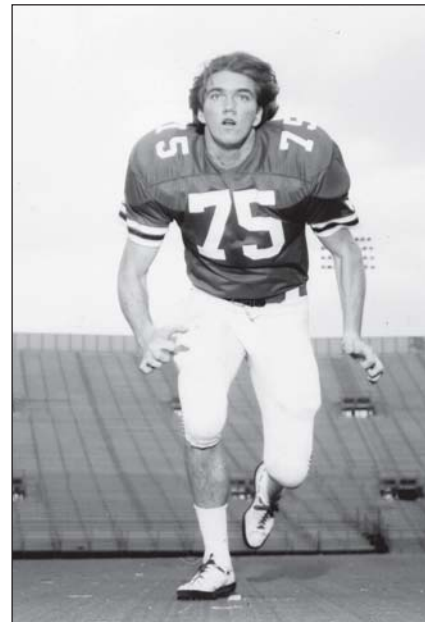
As a sophomore at U of L, his work along the offensive line helped Nathan Poole become one of just 11 Cardinals to rush for over 1,000 yards with 1,394 yards. He became a team captain as a senior.

Following his career at Louisville, Jacoby was snubbed in the NFL draft before signing a free agent contract with the NFL's Washington Redskins.

Along with fellow linemen Mark May, Russ Grimm and Jeff Bostic, Jacoby was a founding member of the famous "Hogs" offensive line which is considered among the best front fives in football history. As a unit, the Hogs helped lead the Redskins to Super Bowl appearances in 1983, 1984, 1988 and 1992, three of which produced an NFL championship.

Perhaps Jacoby's most memorable moment was being the lead blocker on Redskins running back John Riggins famous touchdown run which iced Washington's Super Bowl XVII victory over the Miami Dolphins in 1983.

Jacoby was a Pro Bowl selection for four consecutive years (1983-1986).

#26 LENNY LYLES (RB)

A trailblazer in the integration of the Louisville Cardinals football program, Lenny Lyles was an outstanding player on both sides of the football from 1954-57.

Lyles was a four-year starter for the Cardinals and totaled 2,786 yards on the ground. He left the University as the program's all-time leading rusher but currently stands No. 3 behind Walter Peacock and Nathan Poole.

Lyles scored a school-record 42 touchdowns in his storied career including 18 in 1957 to set a single season record which stood for more than 40 years. He remains the Cards' all-time scoring leader with 300 points in his storied career.

Known as the "Fastest Man in Football" in '57, Lyles became the first Cardinal to surpass the 1,000-yard mark in a single season. His 1,207 yards not only earned him Little All-America acclaim but led all of college football in 1957.

Following graduation, Lyles was selected in the first round of the '58 NFL Draft by the Baltimore Colts, where he teamed with Johnny Unitas.

He returned to the Colts in '61 and played his final eight season in Baltimore.

In his first stint with the Colts, Lyles had the honor of playing in the 1958 NFL Championship Game which ended in sudden-death with the Colts defeating the New York Giants, 23-17. The game has been called "the greatest NFL game ever played."



#56 OTTO KNOP (OL/LB)

A four-year letterwinner at U of L as a linebacker and center from 1949-1952, he earned honorable mention Associated Press Little All-America honors as a sophomore and United Press International All-America his junior year. As a senior he was U of L team captain and a Collier's Little All-America first team selection.

It wasn't uncommon for him to play the entire 60 minutes of a football game. He was inducted into the U of L Athletic Hall of Fame in 1979 in its second induction class, and was inducted into the Kentucky Athletic Hall of Fame in 1994.

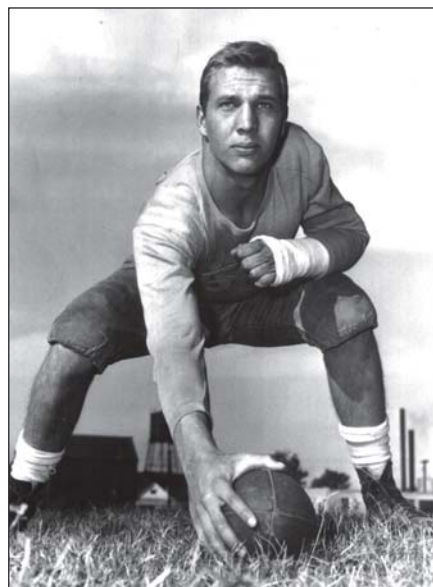
Possibly his most memorable highlight was a fumble recovery that led to the tying touchdown in a stunning 13-13 deadlock at heavily favored Miami (FL) in 1950.

Prior to attending Louisville, he lettered in football, basketball, swimming and track at local St. Xavier High School.

Following his collegiate career, Knop played on the Boling Air Force Base gridiron team in 1954 and 1955, captaining the '55 national service championship team.

He worked for Hubbuch in Kentucky for 20 years before founding Knop Family Inc., a Louisville design firm of which he was president before his death in 1987.

Three of his sons were lettermen for the red and black football team; Otto Jr. (1976-1979), Brian (1978) and Kurt (1980-81).



#13 SAM MADISON (CB)

A four-time letterwinner with the Cardinals from 1993-96, Sam Madison will be remembered as one of the top defensive backs in the school's history.

One of the top athletes ever to play at U of L, Madison concluded his collegiate career as one of the Cards' three captains for the 1996 campaign.

In four seasons with the Cardinals, Madison ranks second all-time in school history with 16 career picks.

Madison also led U of L with 44 career pass breakups, record that has stood since 1996.

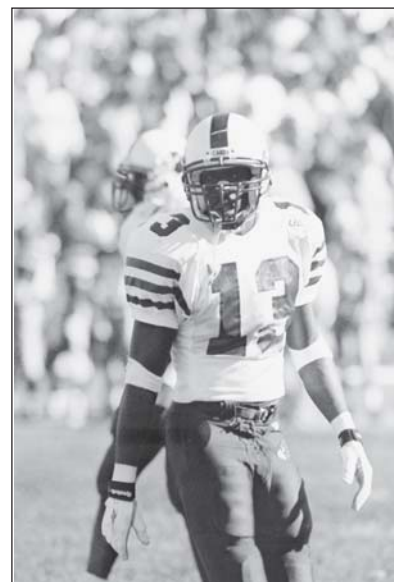
His best season was in 1995 when Madison led the Cardinals with seven interceptions and earned third team All-America accolades.

He was tabbed as one of the top 15 players in the county and was tabbed a preseason Playboy All-American in 1996.

In 1993, Madison was a key performer for the Cardinals as Louisville went 9-3 and defeated Michigan State in the Liberty Bowl.

Upon completion of his eligibility, Madison was a second-round draft pick of the Miami Dolphins and has enjoyed a stellar NFL career with 368 career tackles and 31 interceptions.

A nine-year NFL veteran, Madison recently signed a free-agent contract with the New York Giants.

#1

FRANK MINNIFIELD (CB)

A four-time letterwinner with the Cardinals from 1979-82, Frank Minnifield excelled as a defensive back and kick returner. Deemed "too small" coming out of high school, Minnifield walked on at U of L and quickly received the scholarship recruiters failed to give him coming out of Lexington's Henry Clay High. Minnifield completed his collegiate career as one of the Cards' three captains for the 1982 campaign. In four seasons, Minnifield intercepted seven passes including a career-best three during his sophomore campaign of 1980.

Minnifield led U of L in kickoff returns in 1981 with a 30.4 yard average and topped the Cards in punt returns with a 15-yard average. Upon completion of his eligibility, Minnifield began his professional career as a member of the Chicago Blitz in the United States Football League. He was a member of the Blitz for two seasons.

Signed as a free agent by the Cleveland Browns, Minnifield went on to a nine-year career with the franchise before his retirement in 1992.

He made four consecutive Pro Bowl appearances from 1987-90 and was a three-time all-NFL choice by AP.

Minnifield also had a hand in creating one of professional sports great fans bases. In an attempt to get their defensive teammates fired up, Minnifield and fellow cornerback Hanford Dixon began barking like dogs whenever a standout play was made. Browns' fans caught onto the game, and the "Dawg Pound" was born.

#7

CHRIS REDMAN (QB)

A lifetime Louisville native, Chris Redman followed in the footsteps of his father and grandfather playing football for the Cardinals. When the smoke had cleared on his four-year career, Redman's name dotted not only the U of L record books but the NCAA's as well.

Redman closed his career as the NCAA all-time leader in passes attempted and completed while finishing the 1999 season as one of just three Division I-A signalcallers to throw for more than 12,000 yards in a career.

The Parade National High School Player of the Year at nearby Male High, Redman finished his Cardinal career completing 1,031 of 1,679 passes for 12,541 yards and 84 touchdowns.

A first-team All-Conference USA selection and the league's Offensive Player of the Year in 1999, Redman also added the Johnny Unitas Golden Arm Award to his mantle.

Redman's junior campaign of 1998 rewrote the U of L and C-USA record books as he passed for 4,042 yards and 29 scores despite playing in just 10 regular season games.

His 44-of-56, 592-yard afternoon against East Carolina was the nation's top single game passing performance in 1998.

Redman was the first Cardinal QB to lead his team to back-to-back bowl appearances.

#55

OTIS WILSON (QB)

A three-time letterman for the Cardinals, Otis Wilson was a fierce competitor and sure-handed tackler.

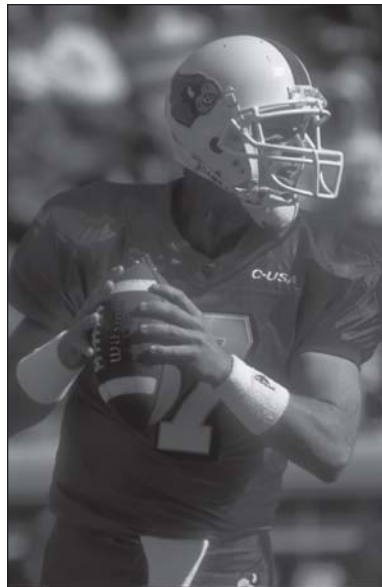
Wilson was a dominating defender and one of the school's all-time leading tacklers.

Co-captain of the 1979 team, Wilson was referred to by head coach Vince Gibson as one of the best players he ever coached. Wilson finished his career as the school's second all-time leading tackler with 484 tackles. He recorded 175 stops in 1977, which is the third-best total in school history and was named the Defensive Most Valuable Player in the 1977 Independence Bowl.

A first team All-American selection in 1979, Wilson registered 152 stops in 1979 and 157 during the 1978 campaign.

After completing his stellar U of L career, Wilson was a first round pick of the Chicago Bears, the sixth player in school history to garner first round status in the NFL Draft.

Wilson played eight years for the Bears from 1980-87, including a 1986 World Championship.

#10

DWAYNE WOODRUFF (QB)

A three-time letterman for the Cardinals, Woodruff opened his career as a reserve running back and wide receiver from New Richmond, Ohio but was moved to the secondary by then-head coach Vince Gibson following his sophomore campaign.

In his two seasons as a defensive back, Woodruff collected 161 tackles while intercepting three passes and recovering three fumbles.

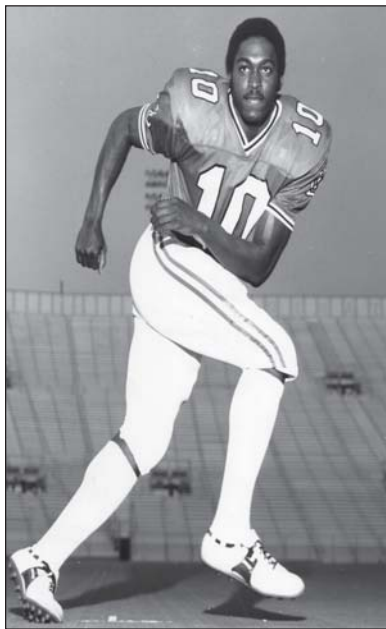
Woodruff accounted for 97 total tackles in 1977 as the Cardinals advanced to the Independence Bowl.

Following his collegiate career, Woodruff was selected by the Pittsburgh Steelers in the sixth round of the 1979 National Football League Draft.

Woodruff spent 11 of the next 12 seasons as a member of the Steelers earning a victory in Super Bowl XIV as a rookie for the Steeler dynasty.

His 37 career interceptions still ranks fifth all-time in the Steel Curtain record books while his three interception returns for touchdowns is the third-most in Pittsburgh history.

Woodruff was named the team's most valuable player following the 1992 season when he topped the team with five interceptions. He led the Steelers in picks during five different campaigns - 1982, 1985, 1987, 1988 and 1989.



#16 (Retired)

Johnny Unitas

Five games into Johnny Unitas' freshman season (Unitas was allowed to play as a freshman because U of L didn't belong to the NCAA), head coach Frank Camp knew he had something unique.

Tossed in against St. Bonaventure when U of L was trailing 19-0, Unitas completed 11 consecutive passes, three for TDs, in a steady rain and helped put the Cards in front 21-19.

But the Cards couldn't stop St. Bonaventure from kicking a last-ditch field goal and U of L lost 22-21.

Despite the loss, nothing could detract from Unitas' astonishing performance.

With Unitas leading the way, U of L went on to win its next four games, including a 35-28 victory over Houston. Louisville was a 19-point underdog against the Cougars.

One of the greatest plays of Unitas' career took place in that game when the Cardinals were leading 28-21 and had the ball on their own eight-yard line in the fourth quarter.

After two unsuccessful running plays, Unitas dropped back into his own end-zone, sidestepped two defenders and threw a pass to Babe Ray who scored a 92-yard TD.

In the next day's *Louisville Courier-Journal*, reporter Jimmy Brown wrote: "If Coach Frank Camp is smart, he'll take Unitas, enclose him in a cellophane bag and put him away with the Cardinals' uniforms for safekeeping over the winter.

Teammate Gene Sartini said: "Back at that time he was just one of the guys. We lived at White Hall.

We were a losing football team who used to go out and eat cheeseburgers at the Doghouse."

In his sophomore season, Unitas completed 77 of his 154 passes and threw 12 TDs. U of L went 3-8 that year. At Florida State, Unitas had one of his best games, completing 17 of 22 passes in a 41-14 victory.

U of L, though, almost fumbled away Johnny Unitas after his sophomore season. After an administrative hassle which saw 15 players dismissed from school, leaving the Cardinal roster empty, Unitas thought about leaving and transferring to Indiana.

Bernie Crimmins, the Hoosier head coach, suggested to Unitas that he would have a better shot at pro ball in the Big Ten.

But Unitas decided against leaving the Cardinals when he was reminded that

Indiana shunned him earlier in his career.

Unitas now holds just a few records at U of L, most of them eclipsed by quarterbacks John Madeya, Ed

Rubbert, Browning Nagle, Jeff Brohm, Marty Lowe, Chris Redman, Dave Ragone and Stefan LeFors. Unitas finished his career completing 247 of 502 passes for 2,912 yards and 27 touchdowns.

The rest of Unitas' story is well documented. He left Louisville when he was the ninth-round pick by the Pittsburgh Steelers in 1955 and was cut by them in a numbers game. The Steelers had four quarterbacks; they only needed three. Unitas was the odd man out.

Unitas took a job with a Pittsburgh tiling company following the cut and then he latched on with the Bloomfield Rams, a semi-pro team. He made six dollars a game. But Unitas didn't linger long in the bush league. The Colts got wind of him and invited him for a tryout. He made the team—signing for \$7,000— and the Steelers made history for one of the biggest blunders of all time.

Unitas was inducted into the NFL Hall of Fame in 1979 and his record 47-consecutive game touchdown passes is a record compared to Joe DiMaggio's 56-game hitting streak.

Sid Luckman once said: "Johnny Unitas is the greatest quarterback ever to play the game—better than me, better than Sammy Baugh, better than anyone."

MEMPHIS, Tenn. — In the highest scoring AutoZone Liberty Bowl ever, it was a defensive play by Louisville that ended Boise State's 22-game winning streak.

Louisville safety Kerry Rhodes intercepted a pass in the end zone as time expired to preserve Louisville's 44-40 victory over 10th-ranked Boise State.

Eric Shelton scored on the go-ahead touchdown on a 1-yard run with 6:48 left. Stefan LeFors threw two touchdowns and ran for a third for the Cardinals.

Quarterback Jared Zabransky drove the Broncos to the Louisville 30 before his final pass was intercepted by Rhodes as time expired.

Everyone expected a high-scoring game in a bowl pairing the nation's top two offenses, and the teams didn't disappoint as they swapped the lead five times. The 84 combined points topped the 80 points by Colorado and Alabama in 1969 and was one of a handful of records set. Louisville won only for the second time in seven bowls despite a season-high four turnovers. The Cardinals rolled up 564 yards, topping 500 yards for the ninth time this season.

LeFors was 18-of-26 for 193 yards and ran 12 times for 76 yards. The Cardinals rushed for 329 yards against a defense that had been the nation's fourth-best against the run.

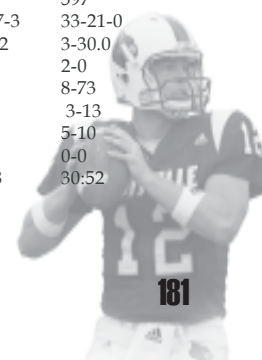

U of L pulled within two at 19-17 when Ragone connected with Deion Branch on a 14-yard scoring play with 13:35 left in the game.

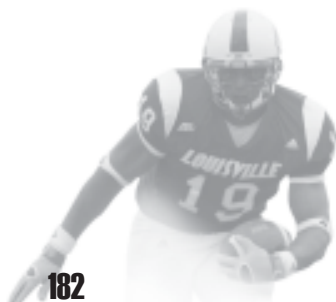

MEMPHIS, Tenn. - The 1993 Cardinals put a cap on an 8-3 regular season with an 18-7 victory over Michigan State at the Liberty Bowl. Howard Schnellenberger's squad registered the first win ever by the Cardinals over a Big Ten foe.

The conditions were hardly ideal for an aerial display, but quarterback Jeff Brohm checked in with one of the guttiest efforts in the history of Cardinal football.

Brohm, playing with two steel pins and one steel plate in the index finger of his throwing hand completed 19-of-29 passes for 197 yards and a touchdown amidst 20-degree temperatures and freezing rain.

Most of that courage was shown in the fourth quarter. Entering the final frame, Louisville trailed 7-3. With 12:05 remaining, Brohm connected on a 25-yard strike to Reggie Ferguson to put the Cardinals in front for good.

Just over three minutes later, it was the defense's turn to make a big play. Pinned back to their one-yard line, the Spartans were merely looking to get some breathing room for their offense. Running back Craig Thomas took the handoff and was immediately met by All-American defensive end Joe Johnson and reserve linebacker Tyrus McCloud for a safety.

A strange play near the end of the game had the Louisville faithful thinking they just might secure a victory.

Madeya threw a screen pass to tailback Tom Jesukaitis, who was supposed to go out of bounds. Instead Jesukaitis put the ball in the air again, throwing a pass to Cookie Brinkman who went in for a touchdown.

The rulebook prohibits more than one pass on a single play, however, and U of L was penalized five yards.

Louisville's Paul Mattingly was named Defensive Player of the Game.

He blocked a 32-yard field goal attempt in the fourth quarter and was in on a game-high 17 tackles

He managed just six yards on two carries.

In Lyles' absence, Ken Porco and Pete Bryant stepped forward offensively. Porco ran for a game-high 119 yards on 20 carries.

Bryant added 80 yards on 14 carries, while also tossing a 20-yard scoring pass. His four-yard run in the second quarter gave the Cardinals a 21-14 advantage that they did not yield.

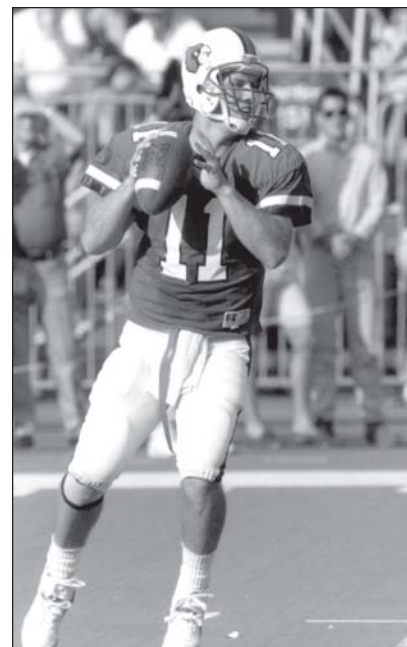
