THE MATCH-UP

Louisville welcomes Virginia Tech on Thursday to the KFC Yum! Center, with the Cardinals riding a seven-game winning streak. Last time out, Louisville beat Georgia Tech 78-65 on Sunday behind Mariya Moore's season-high 25 points. The Cardinals limited the Yellow Jackets to 33.9 percent from the floor. Virginia Tech has won its last 11 after defeating Boston College 58-33. The Hokies scored 18 points off the Eagles' 24 turnovers. Hannah Young had a game-high 13 points in the win.

BY THE NUMBERS

- 1** Mariya Moore was named ACC Player of the Week on Jan. 4 for the first time in her career after averaging 18.7 points, 6.7 assists, and 5.7 rebounds in a three-game week. The sophomore had consecutive 20-point performances, both in ACC play, and shot 52.9 percent from 3.
- 12** Briahanna Jackson is 12 points away from reaching 1,000 for her career. The redshirt junior transferred from UCF, where she accumulated 769 points. She has tallied 219 in 15 games at Louisville and is averaging 15.9 for her career.
- 15** Louisville ranks 15th nationally in total steals, collecting 156 in 15 games. The Cardinals have produced double-digit thefts in eight contests and boast the 42nd-best average (10.4) in the country. Briahanna Jackson is 15th nationally with 41 steals to date.
- 3** Myisha Hines-Allen (15.3), Briahanna Jackson (14.6), and Mariya Moore (14.4) rank in the ACC's top 15 in points per game, making Louisville the only school with three players in the list's top 20. Combined, they have reached double-digit points 38 times this year.
- 109** Asia Durr surpassed 100 points on the year after she totaled 11 against Georgia Tech in front of her home crowd of Atlanta on Jan. 3. The freshman, who has 109 points this year for a 9.1 average, has scored in double digits six times.

■ **About Virginia Tech** - The Cardinals welcome Virginia Tech to Louisville for the first time since 1995, when the two programs meet on Thursday evening (Jan. 7, 7 p.m., ESPN3). Virginia Tech has won 11-consecutive games, including its conference opener, with its last loss coming on Nov. 18 at Georgetown.

The Hokies began ACC play with a 58-33 victory at home over Boston College on Jan. 3. Virginia Tech shot 42.6 percent from the field and held Boston College to a 20.0 percent clip. The Hokies' defense also forced 24 turnovers and held the Eagles without a field goal in the third period. Notably, Boston College had 13 offensive rebounds, but only six second-chance points.

For Virginia Tech, Hannah Young scored a game-high 13 points on 5-of-9 shooting, Chanette Hicks had 11 points, and Vanessa Panousis added 10. Regan Magarity had a solid all-around performance, with seven points, 10 rebounds, and five steals.

On the season, Panousis is leading the team in scoring (11.0) and has the second-most 3-pointers (39). Young is averaging 10.8 points, with a team-high 41 3s (47.7 3-point percentage), and Magarity is the top rebounder at 6.6 per game.

Nationally, Virginia Tech is first in scoring defense (45.3), second in field goal percentage defense (30.6), 14th in 3-point field goal percentage defense (.249), and 15th in scoring margin (+18.9).

Located in Blacksburg, Va., Virginia Tech is the alma mater of the NFL's Arizona Cardinals' head coach Bruce Arians, CEO of CraigsList.org Jim Buckmaster, winner of the 2011 Jeopardy! Tournament of Champions Roger Craig, and 2009 NFL Hall of Fame inductee Bruce Smith.

■ **Series History** - Louisville and Virginia Tech are facing each other for the 34th time in series history, with the Hokies holding a 17-16 advantage. The two programs often met as members of Metro Conference and Conference USA.

The Cardinals' victory last year in Blacksburg disrupted the Hokies' four-game winning streak in the series. Louisville shot 49 percent from the field and converted Virginia Tech's 18 turnovers into 21 points. The Cardinals' defense also stifled the Hokies to just 35.2 percent shooting.

Mariya Moore had 14 points, hitting four treys, and Shawnta' Dyer and Bria Smith came off the bench to add 15 points and 12 points, respectively, in the victory.

■ **Turning the Corner** - Since Louisville's upset victory over No. 19 Michigan State on Dec. 3, the Cardinals have turned the corner over the 10-game span. Louisville is 9-1, with two wins over Associated Press top-25 teams and impressive numbers to back it up.

In the stretch, Louisville holds a +14.4 scoring margin, is shooting 46.8 percent from the field, including a 37.6 percent clip from long range, and forcing opponents into 21.3 turnovers per contest.

Individually, Myisha Hines-Allen is averaging 16.2 points on 58.7 percent shooting and 7.9 rebounds, Briahanna Jackson is producing 14.4 points and 2.7 steals, and Mariya Moore is contributing 14.0 points and 5.9 assists. Cortnee Walton has played a role on the boards, averaging 7.0 per contest.

■ **Statistical Trends** - Louisville is 149-15 (.909) when scoring 70 or more points under head coach Jeff Walz (9-1 in 2015-16). ... UofL boasts a 75-1 record (.987) when shooting 50 percent or better from the field under Walz (4-0 this year).

■ **Raining 3s** - Louisville has continued to display its firepower from long range this year. The Cardinals, against California, connected on 10 3s - the most in a season opener in school history. Sophomore Mariya Moore, for the second time in her career, knocked down six treys - the most by a Cardinal in a season-opener in school history.

Through 15 games, the Cardinals have nailed 94 3-pointers and rank fourth in the ACC in percentage (.362) - 34th nationally - and seventh in 3-pointers per game (6.3).

Moore and Briahanna Jackson, who each rank in the top 15 in the ACC in 3-pointers per game, are combining for 4.2 per contest.

Thirteen times this season, UofL has connected on at least five treys.

■ **Can I help you?** - Louisville continues to pile up the assists this year on made field goals. Through 15 games, the Cardinals have been credited with 258 assists on 401 field goals, a 64.3 percent rate.

Louisville, which has recorded double-digit assists in each game this season, including at least 20 on seven occasions, ranks third in the ACC at 17.2 per game. Individually, Mariya Moore is fourth in the league at 5.0 assists per game.

Nationally, Louisville is eighth in total assists (258) and 27th in assists per game.

Last year, the Cardinals were one of the best teams in the country in earning assists on made field goals, helping on 62.8 percent of their baskets (587 assists on 934 field goals).

■ **Moore Fabulous over Four** - Mariya Moore was named ACC Player of the Week on Jan. 4, earning the distinction for the first time in her career. The sophomore, over a three-game week, averaged 18.7 points, 6.7 assists, and 5.7 rebounds and had a stellar 3.3 assist-turnover ratio. She also shot 52.9 percent from 3-point range.

During the span, she had consecutive 20-point performances to begin conference play, scoring 20 in the upset win over then-No. 15 Florida State and a season-best 25 versus Georgia Tech.

Over a four-game stretch, Moore is averaging 17.8 points, 4.8 rebounds, and 8.0 assists. Impressively, she is connecting on 48 percent of her 3-pointers (13-of-27).

■ **Hines-Allen Taking Command** - Myisha Hines-Allen is receiving notice as one of the best post players in the country.

Named ACC Player of the Week on Dec. 21, Hines-Allen is averaging 16.5 points on 56.9 percent shooting and 7.9 rebounds over an 11-game period. Her free throw improving has sharpened too, connecting on 71.4 percent of her trips to the charity stripe. In the three-game week, when she earned league honors, she produced two of her three double-doubles this season.

Hines-Allen's play has pushed her name into the top 15 in multiple ACC categories: sixth in scoring (15.3), fifth in rebounding (7.7), 10th in field goal percentage (.529), tied for 10th in offensive rebounds (2.8), and fourth in defensive rebounds (4.9).

■ **January Joy** - Louisville boasts a 45-20 (.692) record in the month of January under head coach Jeff Walz. UofL has won 17 of its last 18 games in the month. With the win over No. 15 Florida State, Louisville has been victorious in 21-consecutive home games in the month of January dating back to the 2009-10 season.

The best record in Walz's tenure came in 2013-14, when the group compiled an 8-0 mark.

Louisville capped December with five-consecutive victories, pushing the program's record under Walz to 53-12 (.815) in the final month of the year. The 7-1 mark is third best mark in school history after the 2007-08 and 2008-09 teams went 8-0.

■ **Ms. Clean** - Cortnee Walton is cleaning up the glass at record pace this season. The redshirt junior has collected 62 offensive rebounds through 15 games.

Walton is tied for first in the ACC at 4.1 offensive rebounds per game. Five times this year, she has recorded more than five rebounds on the offensive end.

Her seven-game total of 29 was the most in school history over that span since Jazz Covington grabbed 33 in seven games in 2004-05.

■ **Bonus from the Bench** - Louisville's bench has contributed in major ways this season, including posting 47 points in the victory over Dartmouth - the most since totaling 47 against Ball State in 2013 (Dec. 17). The group, through 15 games, is averaging 20.8 points per game. The unit has reached at least 20 points in eight games.

■ **Cardinals in the Polls** - Coupling the 2006-07 campaign with that of head coach Jeff Walz's tenure, which started in 2007-08, Louisville has appeared in the Associated Press poll 123 times, with an average rank of 12th over that span. The Cardinals' total appearances in the nine-year timeframe ranks 13th among all NCAA Division I programs. With UofL exiting the poll on Nov. 30, it ended a period of 81-straight weeks in the top 25.

Last year, Louisville debuted at No. 12 in the AP preseason poll and reached as high as fourth from Jan. 12-19. The Cardinals finished the 2014-15 campaign eighth in the AP Poll, their third time concluding the year in the top 10. Louisville also maintained a top-15 ranking throughout the year in the ESPN/USA Today Coaches Poll, taking 10th in the final poll.

■ **Success in the KFC Yum! Center** - Louisville captured its 70th victory in the KFC Yum! Center last season following its 68-55 victory over Miami (Fla.) on Jan. 25. The Cardinals finished the year with a 16-1 mark at home.

UofL boasts a 79-10 record (.888) in the World's Most Spectacular Arena. All-time in the venue, Louisville holds a +22.1 scoring margin (76.2-54.1) and is shooting 45.2 percent from the field. With its 29 field goals against California on Nov. 15, 2015, Louisville surpassed 2,300 field goals made inside the KFC Yum! Center (2479 for 5481).

■ **Moore Assists** - Mariya Moore recorded her second career double-double, with 15 points and a career-best 12 assists against College of Charleston on Dec. 20.

It's the most assists by a UoL player in nearly five years, since Shoni Schimmel dished out 12 against UT Martin on Dec. 28, 2010.

Over the last nine games, Moore is averaging 6.1 assists (55 assists). She has recorded at least five assists in seven of those contests.

Moore logged her first career double-double - also of the points and assists variety - last year, when she produced 11 points and 10 assists against Lafayette (Nov. 28, 2014). Her two points-assists double-doubles are the seventh-most in school history.

■ **Stretches and Spurts** - Through 15 games this season, Louisville has produced 22 runs of 8-0 or better (one against Georgia Tech), including an 18-0 stretch against Dartmouth. Defensively, the Cardinals have forced their opponents into 32 scoring droughts of at least three minutes, including two against Georgia Tech. Louisville held Purdue without a basket for 7:40 and Valparaiso scoreless for a collective 19:43.

Last year, Louisville recorded 76 runs of 8-0 or better and forced opponents into 107 scoring droughts of at least three minutes.

■ **Keeping the Offense Alive** - Louisville has been active on the offensive glass this season, averaging 15.7 boards for fourth in the ACC. UoL has grabbed double-digit offensive rebounds in 13 of its 15 games, including 20 against IUPUI. The Cardinals collected 31 against Western Kentucky on Nov. 21, the most in the Jeff Walz era and the highest total since 2002-03. This year's 235 offensive rebounds have translated into 215 second-chance points, an average of 14.3 per game.

■ **On the Plus Side** - Head coach Jeff Walz has spoken, both with his team and the media, about carefully grading the student-athletes when they go into the game and whether Louisville is in the plus or minus during their time on the court - essentially measuring a player's impact on the game.

Through 15 games this season, redshirt junior Cortnee Walton, sophomore Myisha Hines-Allen, and redshirt junior Briahanna Jackson are having the most positive impact. With Walton on the court, Louisville is plus-152, outscoring its opponents 836-684. Hines-Allen is plus-114, with the Cardinals holding a 796-682 advantage, and Jackson rounds out the top three at plus-104 (856-752).

■ **Double-Digit Point Performer** - Briahanna Jackson, who has reached double digits in 13 games, including the 20-point plateau three times this season, is 11th in the ACC in scoring at 14.6 points per game. For her career, including her tenure at UCF, Jackson has reached 20 points in a game on 16 occasions.

Arguably one of her best performances of the year came against IUPUI, when she poured in 21 of her game-high 23 points in the second half. She logged eight of Louisville's final 10 points to complete the comeback.

Jackson dropped 24 points on Western Kentucky after a 21-point performance in the season-opener versus California. The highly talented guard who starred at UCF had the eighth most points in UoL a season-opener in school history and second most by an individual making her debut.

HEAD COACH JEFF WALZ

Head coach **Jeff Walz**, entering his ninth season as a head coach, has compiled a 218-82 (.727) record as the Cardinals' leader. He has led Louisville to six NCAA Sweet 16 appearances, two of which culminated with NCAA runner-up finishes (2009, 2013). Walz, who is averaging 26 wins per season, became the winningest coach in program history in 2013-14. He also has the most 20-win seasons in school history (7) and the top-three entries for most victories in a season (34 in 2008-09; 33 in 2013-14; and 29 in 2012-13).



Hired on March 27, 2007, the Bluegrass State native took the program to its first NCAA Sweet 16 and it culminated with Louisville earning the No. 12 ranking in the final ESPN/USA Today Coaches Poll. For his efforts, Walz was named the WBCA Maggie Dixon Rookie Coach of the Year.

Prior to taking the reins at Louisville, Walz spent time on four other coaching staffs: Western Kentucky (1996-97), Nebraska (1997-01), Minnesota (2001-02), and Maryland (2002-07). He helped Maryland win the program's first national title in 2006.

■ **Playing in a Packed House** - Since beginning play in the KFC Yum! Center in 2010-11, Louisville has played in front of three arena-capacity crowds (capacity is 22,000), while averaging more than 9,000 per game.

In Louisville's regular-season finale against Connecticut on March 3, 2014, fans packed the venue for a program-record crowd of 22,163. The record prior to that was attained against Kentucky on Dec. 5, 2010, a 78-52 victory in front of 22,152.

The record was first set in the team's opening game in the downtown arena, playing host to Tennessee with 22,124 on hand on Nov. 12, 2010.

All three games ranked in the top five of Division I games attended that season: vs. Kentucky, No. 1 in 2010-11; vs. Tennessee, No. 2 in 2010-11; and vs. UConn, No. 2 in 2013-14.

■ **Trio of Scorers** - Louisville knew heading into the 2015-16 campaign that it had a potent mix of offensive threats in sophomores Mariya Moore and Myisha Hines-Allen and newcomer Briahanna Jackson. Moore was one of the top scorers as a freshman last season, Hines-Allen was one of the best percentage shooters in the country, and Jackson was hailed as one of the best offensive players in the country.

All three rank in the top 15 in the ACC in points per game, making Louisville the only school in the ACC with three players in the list's top 20.

Hines-Allen is sixth at 15.3 points, Jackson is 11th in the league at 14.6 points per game, and Moore is 12th in the league at 14.4 points per contest.

■ **Stepping Up to the Competition** - In the Cardinals' three games against AP top-25 teams (Michigan State, Kentucky, Florida State), four players are averaging double figures in scoring. Mariya Moore has produced 15.7 points and 5.7 assists, Briahanna Jackson is contributing 15.3 points, 5.7 rebounds, and 3.7 steals, and Myisha Hines-Allen has logged 13.7 points and 6.0 rebounds. Asia Durr also has starred, averaging 12.0 points and 2.0 steals. The freshman also has the best 3-point field goal percentage on the team in those games, connecting on 5-of-8 (.625) from long range.

Collectively, Louisville is forcing 23.0 turnovers for 20.0 points per game.

■ **Forcing Turnovers, Leading to Offense** - Louisville is forcing opponents into 20.93 turnovers per game this season, a mark that is second best in the conference and 27th nationally. On nine separate occasions, the Cardinals' defense has bullied its foes into more than 20 turnovers.

Notably, California (27 TOs, 27 FGs), Marist (24 TOs, 18 FGs), Michigan State (27 TOs, 27 FGs), Valparaiso (22 TOs, 13 FGs), IUPUI (22 TOs, 21 FGs), Dartmouth (22 TOs, 17 FGs), and Tennessee Tech (27 TOs, 19 FGs) each had as many or more turnovers than field goals.

Of the 314 times opponents have turned over the ball, Louisville has converted those opportunities into 343 points (22.9 per game) - more than 31 percent of its offense.

■ **Success against AP Top 25** - Following victories over No. 15 Florida State and one of the Big Ten favorites in No. 19 Michigan State, Louisville has defeated a stellar 24 schools over the last six seasons that were ranked in the Associated Press' top 25.

In 2014-15, the Cardinals knocked off No. 22 Iowa 86-52 at home on Dec. 4 in the ACC/Big Ten Challenge, No. 24 California 70-57 on Dec. 21, No. 23 Syracuse 78-58 on Jan. 29, No. 17 North Carolina 75-66 on Feb. 15, North Carolina again (No. 15) 77-75

in overtime on March 6, and No. 25 USF 60-52 on March 23 in the NCAA Tournament.

During 2010-11, Louisville defeated five schools in the top 25, including three in the top

10: Kentucky (No. 8), DePaul (No. 7), and Xavier (No. 5). After defeating one in 2011-12, the Cardinals again defeated five ranked in AP Poll in both 2012-13 and 2013-14. In 2013-14, UofL defeated No. 14 LSU and No. 11 Oklahoma within a three-day window.

■ **Major Comeback** - Louisville put together one of the biggest comebacks in recent history to earn the win over IUPUI on Dec. 13.

The Cardinals trailed the Jaguars by 14 at halftime and saw the deficit grow to 18 in the third quarter. Louisville outscored IUPUI 42-15 over the final 16:45 of the contest, including a 24-9 advantage in the final quarter.

In the second half, Briahanna Jackson scored 21 of her game-high 23 points, and Myisha Hines-Allen added 12 points and eight rebounds in that span.

The 18-point comeback is the biggest deficit the Cardinals have overcome since Jan. 21, 2005, when Louisville climbed out of an 18-point hole in the first half against TCU and went on to win 63-57.

■ **Cardinals on the Road** - Since Jeff Walz became head coach at Louisville in 2007, the Cardinals have a 108-62 record (.635) in games away from home (includes 35-18 record for neutral site games).

This year, the Cardinals own a 5-4 record away from the KFC Yum! Center (includes 1-2 neutral record). Louisville is forcing 19.2 turnovers per game in those contests and connecting on 71.1 percent of its free throws.

In its 17 away games in 2014-15, Louisville went 11-6 and had a +6.5 scoring margin behind 40.9 percent shooting. The Cardinals forced 329 turnovers and tallied 177 steals.

With a 12-2 record in true road games the previous year, UofL tied for third in the nation for road game wins behind Notre Dame and Connecticut.

■ **First-Half Explosion Against Michigan State** - Louisville, playing on its biggest stage in 2015, put together one of its best offensive performances through two quarters this season. The Cardinals scored a then-season-best 23 points in the first quarter and blew out their previous season high of 32 first-half points with 45 in 20 minutes of action.

By the break, Briahanna Jackson (11), Mariya Moore (10), and Asia Durr (10) had double-digit points and the Cardinals were shooting 60.7 percent (17-of-28) from the field. Louisville hit six of its nine 3-pointers, the most in an opening half since connecting on seven against California last season, and went 5-for-5 from the charity stripe.

■ **Short on Seniors** - Louisville's 2015-16 team essentially is a fountain of youth. Of the 12 student-athletes on its roster, nine (75 percent) are freshmen or sophomores. It also marks the first time since head coach Jeff Walz took the reins in 2007 that the Cardinals' roster does not feature a single senior.

■ **Melting Pot** - Louisville's 2015-16 roster is even more of a melting pot than in years past. Of the 12 student-athletes on its roster, 10 are from different states (Arizona, California, Georgia, Indiana, Florida, New Jersey, New York, Ohio, Texas, and Virginia).

■ **Walton a Good Works Team Nominee** - Cortnee Walton is among 103 nominees for the 2016 Allstate Women's Basketball Coaches Association and National Association of Basketball Coaches Good Works Team.

In its fourth year, the Allstate WBCA and NABC Good Works Teams® recognize players at all levels of college basketball who have made outstanding contributions in the areas of volunteerism and civic involvement. From establishing nonprofits that provide youth with the necessary tools to become leaders of tomorrow, to raising awareness around pertinent issues that could save lives, these student-athletes exhibit leadership skills both on and off the court.

Walton, who graduated with her bachelor's degree in less than four years, has participated in a plethora of community service activities. Among the many, she has volunteered her time to Family Scholar House (provides academic and family support services for disadvantaged families), Girls on the Run (teach life skills to 3rd-8th grade girls through games and compete in a celebratory 5K), and Women 4 Women (raise money for female organizations in the city through a 5K walk/run).

The Surprise, Ariz., native also has dedicated time to Maryhurst (mentoring young girls who struggle with emotional/behavioral disabilities and normally have to be placed in out-of-state facilities for treatment), Bring Peace Home (raise awareness about family violence prevention), Read to Achieve (reading to and speaking with elementary school student on literacy importance), and Healthy Hoops Clinic for Kids (clinic put on by UofL basketball legend Darrell Griffith that encourages kids with asthma to stay active).

■ **Nest Nuggets** - Mariya Moore went 12-for-16 from the free throw line on Jan. 3 against Georgia Tech. It's the most free throws since Shoni Schimmel hit 13 versus Colorado (Dec. 21, 2013). Moore's 16 attempts are tied with Angel McCoughtry (2006) and Schimmel (2013) for sixth most in a game in school history. ... Jeff Walz coached in his 300th contest as Louisville's leader in the Cardinals' game against Georgia Tech on Jan. 3. ... The Cardinals held No. 15 Florida State to just six points in the first period, the fewest Louisville has allowed in a quarter this year. ... Myisha Hines-Allen went 10-for-11 (.909) against College of Charleston, tied for the sixth-best single-game shooting percentage this season. She has connected on at least 10 field goals three times in her career (twice as a freshman). ... Louisville announced a crowd of 16,524 for its season-opener against California, the second-highest opening week attendance in the nation in women's college basketball. It is the fifth-largest crowd in program history, surpassing the turnout (16,483) against Connecticut on Feb. 7, 2012.

■ **A Tie in the ACC/Big Ten Challenge** - For the second-consecutive season, third time overall, the Atlantic Coast and Big Ten conferences played to a tie in the annual Big Ten/ACC Challenge. Over the two-day period, each league won seven games.

The ACC was down 5-2 following the first day of competition, but the league rallied to win five games, including Louisville's 85-78 upset victory over No. 19 Michigan State, on the final date to tie and retain the trophy.

■ **Hines-Allen Earns Tournament Honors** - Myisha Hines-Allen was named to the Gulf Coast Showcase's five-player, all-Tournament Team on Nov. 29. She averaged 18.0 points on 47 percent shooting and 7.3 rebounds. Hines-Allen, who scored in double figures in all three contests, including a 20-point performance against Dayton, went 7-for-7 from the charity stripe and added five steals.

■ **Achieving Nonconference Success** - Head coach Jeff Walz has compiled an impressive 100-26 record (.794) against nonconference foes in his nine years at the helm of the program. Two times - in 2008-09 and 2013-14 - he rolled through nonconference play with just one loss, sporting 13-1 and 12-1, records, respectively.

■ **Return of the All-Americans** - Louisville returned just four of its letterwinners from a season ago, but the Cardinals regain the services of two of their top players in All-Americans Mariya Moore and Myisha Hines-Allen.

Moore, an Associated Press All-America honorable mention and a Full Court Freshman first team All-American, paced the Cardinals in points (13.4) and knocked down a team-high 62 3-pointers as a freshman. She also totaled 121 assists, becoming just the fourth player in school history to achieve the feat as a freshman, and 55 steals.

Hines-Allen was just as critical to the Cardinals' success, averaging the second-most points (11.8) on the team. The Full Court Freshman third team All-American connected on a team-high 55.8 percent of her shots, fourth best in the ACC and 13th nationally. During the postseason, she averaged a team-best 12.8 points.

■ **Introducing Briahanna Jackson** - The 5-foot-6 guard came to Louisville from UCF, where she averaged 16.3 points, 3.7 rebounds, and 2.8 steals over her two years (2012-14), knocking down 82 3-pointers. In 2013, she was named the Conference USA Freshman of the Year and earned C-USA All-Tournament Team honors after producing 18.5 points and shooting 92.9 percent from the charity stripe. She sank 11 3-pointers in the tournament, sixth most in league history at the event.

As a freshman, she broke the 15-year-old conference record with 89 steals. Arguably her most notable performance as a Knight came when registered 28 points on 11-of-22 shooting, including six treys, against Connecticut on Jan. 1, 2014.

■ **Duo Receive ACC Recognition** - Sophomore Mariya Moore and freshman Asia Durr received ACC preseason accolades. Moore was named to the preseason all-ACC team by both the Blue Ribbon Panel and the league's 15 coaches. Durr was selected to both of the Newcomer Watch Lists. Louisville is one of just three schools - others are Duke and Notre Dame - with at least one student-athlete on each of the four lists (ACC coaches' and Blue Ribbon preseason all-ACC teams and coaches' and Newcomer Watch Lists).

■ **Weatherford Earns Scholarship** - Dakota Weatherford, who walked on to the team after the start of the preseason, was awarded a scholarship for the 2015-16 season. Weatherford, a Cicero, Ind., native, played at Evansville in 2013-14. She started 26 games and was named to the Missouri Valley Conference all-Freshman Team. She averaged 6.8 points and totaled 114 assists and 65 steals.

■ **National Preseason Honors** - In one of the first preseason national honors announcements, College Sports Madness named Louisville guard Asia Durr as its freshman of the year, while selecting sophomores Mariya Moore (second team) and Myisha Hines-Allen (third team) to the all-Atlantic Coast Conference teams.

Moore, who was named an Associated Press honorable mention All-American last year, also earned Sporting News third-team All-America honors, while Durr was selected as Sports Illustrated's Freshman of the Year.

■ **Louisville Chosen Third in ACC Preseason Polls** - For the second-consecutive season, the Cardinals were picked to finish third in both the Atlantic Coast Conference's Blue Ribbon Panel and coaches' polls. Louisville received 649 points from the Blue Ribbon Panel, including a pair of first-place votes, while earning 190 points from the league's 15 head coaches. Notre Dame was picked to win the title in both polls. The conference tournament will be held at the Greensboro Coliseum from March 2-6 in Greensboro, N.C.

■ **UofL Features Top-Ranked Incoming Class** - One of the major storylines heading into the 2015-16 campaign was the Cardinals' incoming class, which was No. 1 by Prospects Nation and first in the espnW HoopGurlz's rankings during the early signing period. The five-member group consists of **Taja Cole** (Richmond, Va.), **Erin DeGrate** (Waco, Texas), **Asia Durr** (Douglasville, Ga.), **Sam Fuehring** (Wanaque, N.J.), and **Brianna Jones** (North Babylon, N.Y.).

The group boasts a school-record three McDonald's All-Americans (Durr, Cole, Fuehring).

Durr, the top-ranked recruit in the class of 2015 and a two-time Miss Georgia Basketball selection, finished her prep career with 2,764 points on better than 50 percent shooting, 706 rebounds, 254 assists, 266 steals, and 75 blocks.

Cole totaled 1,520 points, 534 rebounds, 553 assists, and 308 steals in her career, while DeGrate produced 2,166 points on 56 percent shooting, 1,395 rebounds, 101 steals, and 355 blocks before entering college. Fuehring's successful tenure included 2,188 points, sixth most in Bergen County history, over 600 rebounds, and more than 150 blocked shots, and Jones averaged 27.8 points, 8.3 rebounds, and 1.1 assists as a senior.

■ **Combined Hoops Success** - Louisville is one of only three NCAA Division I schools that sent both its men's and women's basketball programs to the NCAA Tournament in each of the last four seasons (also Duke and Gonzaga). Louisville was one of 21 schools with both programs in the 2015 NCAA Tournament and the Cardinals were one of six schools with both its teams seeded four or above (women 3, men 4).

Louisville was one of two schools in the nation with both its men's and women's teams ranked among the nation's top 10 teams in the final 2014-15 USA Today coaches poll (UofL men #10, women #10), joining Notre Dame with that distinction.

■ **Challenging Slate Awaits** - Eight of the Cardinals' opponents this season were ranked in the Associated Press' preseason top 25 (Notre Dame 3, Florida State 7, Duke 14, Kentucky 18, South Florida 20, North Carolina 22, Syracuse 23, Michigan State 24), with three receiving votes (California, Western Kentucky, Miami (Fla.)).

Nearly half (13) of the Cardinals' 28 known opponents won at least 20 games a year ago. Twenty of this year's opponents reached postseason play in 2014-15, including 11 that competed in the NCAA Tournament.

■ **Changing of the Guard** - During the offseason, women's basketball underwent a host of rule changes. Among the modifications:

- The women's game is going from two, 20-minute halves, to four, 10-minute quarters.

- Teams will now reach the bonus and shoot two free throws on the fifth team foul in each quarter, eliminating the one-and-one free throw opportunity in women's basketball.

- Each team now gets four timeouts per game (three, 30-second timeouts, and one 60-second timeout), with three carrying over to the second half.

- If a team calls timeout after a made basket during the last 59.9 seconds of the fourth quarter or any overtime period, they can advance the ball to the 28-foot mark.

- Teams have a total of 10 seconds to advance the ball into the frontcourt. The count no longer will reset when the defense deflects the ball out of play, the offense retains possession after a held ball, or if there is a technical foul assessed to the offensive team.

■ **Collecting More Gold** - Head coach Jeff Walz and sophomore Mariya Moore, for the second-consecutive summer, helped USA Basketball earn gold. Walz, serving as an assistant coach, and Moore spent nearly the entire month of July overseas with the U.S. Women's U-19 World Championship Team. The team went 7-0 in the tournament, with Moore averaging 10.3 points on 47.7 percent shooting, connecting on a U.S.-best 11-of-25 from 3-point range. She also added 2.9 assists and 1.7 steals per game.

The previous summer, Walz - again serving as an assistant coach - and Moore guided the U.S. U-18 Women's National Team to a 5-0 mark in Colorado and USA Basketball's seventh-consecutive gold medal in the FIBA Americas U-18 Championship.

■ **Quartet Sign Contracts** - Louisville's senior class was well-decorated and filled with an abundance of talent. Between next-level potential and the visibility of the program, four of the Cardinals' five senior student-athletes graduated and landed professional contracts overseas.

Shawnta' Dyer was one of the first to land an international deal, heading to Romania to team with former Cardinal Monique Reid. Sara Hammond, a two-time all-conference selection, traveled to Spain after signing an agreement, Sheronne Vails is playing in Switzerland, and Bria Smith was competing in Portugal before suffering an injury.

■ **Cardinals Among Statistical Leaders in '14-15** - Louisville ranked in the top 25 nationally in 2014-15 in six Division I statistical categories. The Cardinals were in the top 15 in four areas (scoring margin, assists per game, assist/turnover ratio, and turnover margin). UofL ranked just outside the top 15 in scoring offense (No. 30, 73.1) and rebound margin (No. 23, +7.0).

Individually, Myisha Hines-Allen ranked 13th in field goal percentage (55.8), and Jude Schimmel was 68th in assist/turnover ratio (1.83).

■ **A Brief Look Back at 2014-15 -**

The Cardinals reached the NCAA Sweet 16 last year, advancing to the regional semifinal for the sixth time in program history. The Cardinals, making their program debut in the Atlantic Coast Conference, put together a 27-7 record, with a 12-4 mark in league play to finish third in the conference standings. In reaching its 18th NCAA Tournament, the Cardinals defeated BYU in the first round and then edged USF on its homecourt before falling to Dayton in Albany, N.Y.

■ **Schimmel Invited to White House** - Jude Schimmel, a member of the Confederated Tribes of the Umatilla Indian Reservation, was selected to moderate the seventh annual White House Tribal Nations Conference between President Barack Obama and tribal youth on Nov. 5.

Schimmel is a highly active leader of Generation Indigenous, an initiative that 'focuses on improving the lives of Native youth through new investments and increased engagement.' It was created to improve the lives of Native youth by promoting a national dialogue and policies and programs to mobilize and cultivate the next generation of Native leaders,' including programs that focus on education, health and nutrition, juvenile justice, housing, and youth engagement.

■ **Another Top-Five Class** - Head coach Jeff Walz and his staff did it again - the group compiled the fifth-best recruiting class in the country for 2016, according to espnW HoopGurlz and Prospects Nation. It is the fifth top-10 class under Walz's watch.

The five-member class, with three five-star prospects, consists of **Ciera Johnson**, a 6-foot-4 center from Duncanville, Texas; **Kylee Shook**, a 6-foot-4 center from Colorado Springs, Colo.; **Sydney Zambrotta**, a 5-foot-9 guard from North Babylon, N.Y.; **Jazmine Jones**, a 5-foot-10 guard from Tallahassee, Fla.; and **Bionca Dunham**, a 6-foot-3 forward from Philadelphia, Pa.

Johnson, a five-star recruit according to espnW HoopGurlz, is ranked as the 15th-best overall player in the class of 2016. She is the second-best player at the post spot.

A top-20 recruit according to espnW HoopGurlz, Shook heads to Louisville as the 18th-best overall player and the fourth-best post player in the class of 2016 rankings.

Zambrotta, a five-star recruit according to espnW HoopGurlz, is listed as the 29th-best player in the class of 2016, ninth at the guard position.

Jones, a highly athletic guard from Florida, is a four-star prospect in the class of 2016 according to espnW HoopGurlz. She was tabbed as the 55th-best prospect overall, 14th at the guard position. She is tabbed 19th overall by ProspectsNation.

Dunham, a 6-foot-3 forward, comes to Louisville after leading Imhotep Institute Charter to consecutive Public League championships in Philadelphia. Despite having played basketball for just three years, with limited AAU experience, she is rated a three-star recruit by espnW HoopGurlz.
