- Jaylen Johnson has produced doubledoubles in two of the Cardinals' first three games and missed a third by one rebound. He is is tied for the ACC lead and 31st nationally in rebounding (11.3 per game). He had scored in double figures twice in his career entering the season and the two double-doubles are his first.
- Louisville has blocked double-digit shots in two of its first three games (10 vs. Evansville, 11 vs. William & Mary). It was the first time in six years that the Cardinals had 10 or more swats in back-to-back games. UofL's 30 rejections ranks **second in the nation** in blocked shots.
- Louisville's **149 victories** over the last six years are the **fifth-most wins in the nation** in that stretch. The Cards are one of just three teams to win at least 30 games in three of the last five seasons (30-10 in 2011-12, 35-5 in 12-13, 31-6 in 13-14).
- Louisville is one of just four schools which have won 20 or more games in each of the **last** 14 seasons (also Kansas, Duke and Gonzaga).
- Louisville has scored over half of its points inside the paint this season (134 of 257 points).
- UofL Coach Rick Pitino needs two victories to reach 750 in his collegiate career and six wins for his 400th victory at Louisville. He is one of five active coaches with at least 740 victories.
- UofL is **third in the nation** in field goal percentage defense (.296).
- UofL's academic performance has been impressive, as the team posted a collective **3.38** grade point average for the most recent 2016 spring semester, with **14 of 15** student athletes achieving a 3.0 or better GPA. A league-high seven Cardinals were named to the 2016 All-ACC Academic Team.

■ About Old Dominion — After playing its first three games at home in the KFC Yum! Center, Louisville travels to Paradise Island, Bahamas to face the Old Dominion Monarchs (2-0) in the Battle 4 Atlantis on Wednesday, Nov. 23 at 9:30 p.m. (AXS-TV). The game is the first of three games at the Atlantis resort in the eight-team event. Old Dominion beat James Madison 62-55 in its opener on Nov. 11, and prevailing 64-61 at Richmond on Nov. 14 in its last game.

Old Dominion posted a 25-13 record last season, reached the Conference USA championship game and won the inaugural Vegas 16 post-season tournament title. The Monarchs return three starters and four of its top seven scorers. Dating back to last season, ODU has won 12 of its last 13 games. The Monarchs took an eight-day trip to Spain in August.

Louisville defeated ODU 64-53 in the Las Vegas
Invitational on Nov. 24, 2007 in the only previous meeting
between the two schools as Terrence Williams scored 20
points and Earl Clark added 11 points and 15 rebounds to lead the Cardinals.

ODU head coach Jeff Jones, a native of Owensboro, Ky., played against Louisville while at Virginia, totaling 17 points and six rebounds as No. 3 Virginia beat the Cardinals 74-56 in Freedom Hall on Jan. 24, 1982.

ODU assistant coach Bryant Stith faced the Cardinals twice as a player at Virginia. He had 16 points and five rebounds (7-9 FG) in a 74-71 UofL victory on Jan. 4, 1989; and totaled 27 points and seven rebounds (8-19 FG, 11-15 FT) as UofL won 72-56 in Charlottesville, Va. on Feb. 17, 1990. Monarchs head coach Jeff Jones was an assistant coach with those Virginia teams.

Old Dominion was picked fifth in the preseason Conference USA poll of league coaches. Louisville was a member of Conference USA for 10 years (1995-2005), winning the league title in 2005 and tournament titles in 2003 and 2005. UofL has a collective 136-80 record against current C-USA members, having faced 10 of its 14 members.

■ Second Time in Battle 4 Atlantis — This is Louisville's second appearance in the Battle 4 Atlantis, having finished as runner-up in the 2012 event. The Cardinals reached the championship game in 2012, falling 76-71 to Duke in the title game with starting center Gorgui Dieng out with an injury. UofL would avenge the loss later, beating No. 6 Duke 85-63 in the NCAA Midwest Regional Championship on its way to the 2013 NCAA Championship.

■ Cards Were Also in the Bahamas in 2011

— Louisville began its trek for the 2011-12 season with a foreign trip to the Bahamas on Aug. 8-14. In addition to an intrasquad scrimmage on the island, UofL won a pair of games against island professional teams in Nassau, Bahamas on their visit at that time.

■ Tournament Time — Louisville will be seeking its the 29th regular season tournament championship when the Cards play in the Battle 4 Atlantis. Last season, UofL claimed the 2015 Brooklyn Hoops Holiday Invitational title by sweeping its four games in the five-team, roundrobin event, capped by a 77-57 victory over Saint Louis at the Barclays Center in Brooklyn.

■ Challenging Schedule — Louisville will face a challenging schedule for the 2016-17 season. The Cardinals have played a schedule ranked among the top 16 toughest by the ratings percent index (RPI) in seven of the last nine seasons. At least 21 of the Cardinals' 31 games will be played against teams that participated in post-season competition last season, including at least 14 from the 2016 NCAA Tournament. Games against Battle 4 Atlantis participants could add to the list of tournament participants. At least 23 of the Cardinals' games will be played against teams that won 20 or more games last season.

At least 17 of Louisville's 31 games this season will be against teams that are ranked among the nation's top 25 or are receiving votes in the preseason USA Today coaches poll, including five games among teams in the top seven (1 Duke, 4 Kentucky, 6 North Carolina, 7 Virginia twice, 12 Indiana, 15 Purdue, 17 Syracuse twice; receiving votes: Florida State, Miami, Notre Dame twice, Virginia Tech, Clemson, Pittsburgh twice). More could come in the Battle 4 Atlantis. Five of the top 17 teams in the preseason poll hail from the ACC including No. 14 Louisville, with six more among those receiving votes.

- 21 Sweet 16s for Cards Louisville advanced to its 21st NCAA Sweet 16 in 2014-15, its fourth straight. Only three teams have had more Sweet 16 appearances than Louisville's 21 since the NCAA began Sweet 16 records in 1975 (North Carolina 27, Duke 25, Kentucky 24). The Cardinals have won seven of their last eight regional semifinal games. Louisville has been to at least the Sweet 16 in seven of the last 12 years. Louisville's NCAA Sweet 16 teams: 1975, 1978, 1979, 1980, 1982, 1983, 1984, 1986, 1988, 1989, 1993, 1994, 1996, 1997, 2005, 2008, 2009, 2012, 2013, 2014, 2015.
- Cardinals Have Reached 14 Elite Eights -- Louisville has reached the NCAA Elite Eight on 14 occasions, including five of the last nine years. Louisville's 14 Elite Eight appearances rank sixth nationally. The NCAA recognizes Elite Eight records since 1951, the first year that all teams in the tournament would be required to win at least one game to advance to the Elite Eight. The Cardinals have a 10-4 record in regional championship games, winning two of their last three. (UofL years in Elite Eight: 1959, 1972, 1975, 1980, 1982, 1983, 1986, 1997, 2005, 2008, 2009, 2012, 2013, 2015).
- Cards Among Nation's Top Teams in Early Rankings -- Louisville is among the top teams in the nation for 2016-17 in preseason rankings by six national web sites. UofL was fifth nationally in preseason rankings by ESPN. com, ninth by KenPom.com, 10th by NBCSports.com, 12th by the USBWA

and SportingNews.com, 13th by SI.com and the Associated Press, 14th in the USA Today coaches poll, and 11th in rankings by Yahoo.com and SB Nation. Louisville is one of seven ACC teams which have received mention in early rankings (also Duke, Virginia, Syracuse, North Carolina, Florida State and NC State). Louisville was ranked No. 16 in the final AP poll of 2015-16.

■ Cards Have Been Tough on the Road — UofL has a 64-39 record over the last 10 years on its opponent's home court (.621). Louisville has posted a 10-8 road record in its first two years in the ACC. UofL had the most road victories of any school in Big East Conference games over its last seven years in that league and was a league-best 8-1 in its road games in The American during the 2013-14 season. The Cardinals have a 56-33 record in conference games on the road over the last 10 seasons (.629). In neutral site games, Louisville has a 32-6 record over the last five years (.842) and a 42-13 neutral site record over the last eight years (.763).

In conference games overall, Louisville had the most Big East Conference victories over its eight years in that league during the regular season (from 2005 to 2013). Louisville had a 95-45 Big East record in league victories during the regular season, just ahead of Syracuse and Pittsburgh (both at 92-48). Louisville finished fourth in each of its first two years in the ACC with a 12-6 league record each season.

■ Cards Sixth All-Time in the Polls — Louisville has been ranked in the Associated Press poll on 604 occasions, sixth most all-time. UofL has been ranked among the nation's top 10 in the preseason poll four of the last five years (unranked in 2015-16, eighth in 2014-15, third in 2013-14, second in 2012-13, ninth in 2011-12). Until the first three polls of 2014-15, the last time UofL had not been in the poll was March 5, 2012 -- a year in which UofL advanced to the Final Four

■ Cards Among Nation's Best in Pitino

Era — Louisville is among 17 programs in the nation that have won at least 70 percent of its games over the last 16 years. Louisville has a .746 winning percentage since UofL Coach Rick Pitino took over the reins of the Cardinal program, sixth best in the nation.

- Card File Over its first three games, UofL's center position manned by starter Mangok Mathiang and reserves Anas Mahmoud and Matz Stockman have collectively averaged 15.7 points, 14.7 rebounds and 4.7 blocked shots ... Louisville has gathered 10 steals in two of its first three games, with nine in the other. The Cardinals had double-digit steals in five games last season. The Cardinals have scored an average of 22.3 points off of turnovers through its first three games ... Louisville has pounded the ball inside, with over half of its points being scored in the paint (134 of 257) ... Anas Mahmoud blocked three shots against Evansville, the ninth time in his career he has swatted three or more shots. He added 10 points, his second career double-figure scoring effort ... Mangok Mathiang's started at center against Evansville, his first game with the Cardinals since he broke his left foot on Dec. 19, 2015 against Western Kentucky. Mathiang produced nine points, seven rebounds and two blocked shots in 10 minutes ... UofL had a 52-29 rebounding advantage over Evansville and a 51-37 edge over Long Beach State. The Cards had 50 or more rebounds on four occasions last season ... After combining for 59 turnovers in their first public instrasquad game on Oct. 12, the Cardinals committed just nine turnovers against William & Mary and 10 vs. Long Beach State. Louisville's 10.3 turnovers per game is the 19th best in the nation in early statistical rankings through games of Nov. 20. UofL is 12th in assists to turnovers ratio (1.81).
- Big Runs Louisville has had big scoring runs in each of its first three games. UofL outscored Evansville 35-3 during a span of 15:07 across the final 8:30 of the first half and the first 6:37 of the second half. The Cardinals trailed 26-20 when they started the dominant run, which culminated with a 55-29 lead when it ended. UofL had a 16-0 run against William & Mary from the last 1:58 of the first half and the first 2:58 of the second half. Louisville outscored Long Beach State 18-0 during a span of 4:04 during the first half, including a 12-8 lead to a 30-8 advantage.
- Block Birds Louisville has blocked double-digit shots in two of its first three games (10 vs. Evansville, 11 vs. William & Mary, 9 vs. Long Beach State). It was the first time in six years that the Cardinals had 10 or more swats in back-to-back games and it marked only the fourth and fifth time in the last six years that the Cards had double-digit rejections in a game. UofL's 30 rejections ranks third in the nation in blocked shots. Three Cardinals have set career highs in blocked shots: Mangok Mathiang with five vs. William & Mary, Jaylen Johnson with three vs. Evansville and Donovan Mitchell with four swats vs. W&M, which was one more than he had during his entire freshman season. Mathing has blocked a shot in 61 career games and Mahmoud has swatted a shot in 29 career games.

■ Cards Chosen Fourth in ACC Preseason Poll UofL was picked to finish fourth in the Atlantic Coast Conference in 2016-17 in a preseason media poll with Duke as the league favorite. Duke junior guard Gravson Allen was honored as the preseason Player of the Year while NC State freshman guard Dennis Smith. Jr. was chosen the ACC Preseason Rookie of the Year. Louisville did not have a player on the preseason allconference team, but UofL forward V.J. King received votes in the rookie voting. Louisville finished fourth in

each of its first two years in the ACC. The 64th annual ACC Tournament will be played March 7-11 at the Barclays Center in Brooklyn, N.Y.

■ Cards Continue Productive Defense — Louisville teams under Rick Pitino have been known for their defensive intensity and the 2015-16 unit followed in that tradition. Last season, UofL limited its opponents to 58 or less points in 13 games, allowing an average of 61.1 points, which ranked sixth in the nation in scoring defense. Louisville committed fewer turnovers than its opponent in 23 games and was 19th in the nation in turnover margin (+3.0), committing single-digit turnovers in seven games.

Louisville has ranked among the nation's top 40 in field goal percentage defense in 12 of the past 14 years, including last season's .390 percentage, which was ninth in the nation. UofL held 16 of its opponents under 40 percent shooting from the field last year, nine under 36 percent and five under 30 percent.

■ Impressive Academic Performance

-- While the University of Louisville men's basketball team has performed well on the court, the Cardinals have excelled in the classroom as well. The team produced a collective 3.27 grade point average for 2015-16, just below its record 3.40 GPA from the 2013-14 season. Louisville has received an NCAA Public Recognition Award each of the last four years for ranking among the top 10 percent in men's basketball in the Academic Progress Rate, which measures academic eligibility, retention and graduation for student-athletes. The Cardinals had a perfect 1000 APR in the most recent four-year period, all while winning a combined 123 games — the second-most in the nation in that stretch — and the Cardinals won the 2013 NCAA Championship and reached the 2012 Final Four.

UofL had a collective 3.38 GPA for the 2016 spring semester and 14 of 15 Cardinals earned a 3.0 or better, including 10 with a 3.4 or higher GPA. The men's basketball team has been around a collective 3.0 GPA for 16 consecutive semesters. Louisville placed a league-high seven individuals on the 26-member 2016 ACC All-Academic Team. Prior to entering the ACC, UofL's men's basketball team earned four straight league Team Academic Excellence Awards, recognizing the highest collective grade-point averages in each of the conference sports (2014 American Athletic Conf., 2011-13 Big East).

■ Mitchell, Adel Candidates for National Awards - UofL guard Donovan Mitchell is among 20 watch list members for the 2017 Jerry West Shooting Guard of the Year Award, while forward Deng Adel is among the 20-player watch list for the 2017 Julius Erving Small Forward of the Year Award. Both annual awards are in their third year being presented by the the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame.

A communication major from Greenwich, Conn., Mitchell averaged 7.4 points and 3.4 rebounds as a freshman last season when he scored in double figures on 13 occasions, including seven of the last 14 games. Mitchell and Duke's Grayson Allen are the only two ACC representatives on the watch list for the West Award.

Adel was a starter the first two games of his freshman season before being sidelined with an injury for a month. He started the last five games of the season, averaging 7.2 points and 3.2 rebounds per game. Adel is one of six ACC representatives on the watch list for the Erving Award.

- Cards Have 14 Straight 20-Win Seasons Louisville is one of four Division I schools in the nation which has won 20 or more games in each of the past 14 seasons. Reaching 20 victories during the 2015-16 season and extending their streaks are Kansas (27), Duke (20), Gonzaga (18) and Louisville (14). UofL Coach Rick Pitino has won at least 20 games in a season on 24 occasions, ranking him fifth among active coaches in 20-win seasons and 11th overall. Pitino won 30 in a single season for the sixth time in 2013-14. UofL has won at least 19 games in 42 of the last 46 years.
- Mathiang, Snider Named Team Captains Senior forward/center Mangok Mathiang and junior guard Quentin Snider were selected as team captains for the Cardinals' 2016-17 season. One of three captains last season, the 6-10 Mathiang averaged 7.1 points, 5.7 rebounds and 1.2 blocked shots in the first 10 games before a broken foot sidelined him for the rest of the year. He was the MVP of the Brooklyn Hoops Holiday Invitational championship game when he produced a double-double with 17 points and 13 rebounds. Second on the team in minutes played last season, and a team-leading 3.5 assists as a sophomore. His 109 assists and just 40 turnovers ranked him fourth in the ACC in assists-to-turnovers ratio (2.73; 43rd in the NCAA) as he committed a turnover just once in every 21.2 minutes of action. He scored a career-high 21 points at NC State, knocking down 4-of-6 three-pointers in the game. Mathiang and Snider were both members of the All-ACC Academic Men's Basketball team each of the last two years.
- High Production Returns -- While the Cardinals will miss their departed top three scorers in G/F Damion Lee (15.9 ppg, 3.9 rpg, 61 three pointers), G Trey Lewis (11.3 ppg, 2.3 apg, 46 threes) and F/C Chinanu Onuaku (9.9 ppg, 8.5 rpg, .620 FG Pct.), over half of their total production will return. Louisville returns 51 percent of its scoring from the 2015-16 squad (1183 of 2324 points), 59 percent of its rebounding (697 of 1183), 57 percent of its assists (238 of 419) and 57 percent of the total minutes played (3553 of 6200). Louisville returns 10 lettermen and two starters, with Quentin Snider as the Cardinals' leading returning scorer at 9.4 points per game a year ago.
- 29 Former Pitino Assistants/Players Became Head Coaches -- UofL Coach Rick Pitino has had 29 of his former assistants or players rise to a collegiate head coaching position. Pitino's son, Richard Pitino, added his name in April 2012 when he was named head coach at FIU and is now at Minnesota. There are 10 additional former assistants as current head coaches to bring the total to 11 active, including Mick Cronin at Cincinnati; Scott Davenport at Bellarmine (Division II); Kevin Keatts at UNC Wilmington, Steve Masiello at Manhattan; Marvin Menzies at UNLV; Kareem Richardson at Missouri-Kansas City; Reggie Theus at Cal State Northridge; Kevin Willard at Seton Hall; and Tubby Smith at Texas Tech. Pitino's nine Division I former assistants as current head coaches is the most in the nation. Four active coaches reached the 2016 NCAA Tournament (Cronin, Keatts, Smith and Willard).

Pitino has a collective 40-10 record in games against his former assistants (3-0 vs. Ralph Willard; 7-5 Tubby Smith; 7-0 Billy Donovan, 7-5 Mick Cronin, 1-0 Scott Davenport, 1-0 Marvin Menzies, 6-0 Kevin Willard, 2-0 Steve Masiello, 2-0 Richard Pitino, 2-0 Kareem Richardson, 1-0 Kevin Keatts, 1-0 Reggie Theus). Davenport's team won the 2011 NCAA Division II Championship. Indiana Pacers head coach Frank Vogel was a student manager for Pitino at Kentucky and his video coordinator with the Celtics. Pitino coached former Golden State Warriors coach Mark Jackson at the New York Knicks. Donovan moved from Florida to the NBA's Oklahoma City Thunder. Eastern Kentucky coach Dan McHale was a program assistant at Louisville for two seasons. Eight former Pitino players also became collegiate head coaches, five of which are currently active including Travis Ford of Oklahoma St.; Allen Edwards of Wyoming; Mark Pope of Utah Valley; Sean Woods of Morehead St.; Donovan and Masiello. Including games against both his former assistants and former players who went on to become collegiate head coaches, Pitino is 47-11 (record vs. former players as head coaches: 3-1 vs. Travis Ford, 2-0 vs. John Pelphrey, 1-0 Scott Padgett, Mark Pope 1-0 and Donovan).

- Non-Conference Success -- Louisville has a 193-44 record (.812) against non-conference opponents in Coach Rick Pitino's 16 seasons (includes post-season). The Cardinals are 135-10 at home in regular season non-conference games under Pitino, including a 59-3 mark over the last seven seasons in the KFC Yum! Center.
- Pitino Fourth in Wins in 32 Seasons -- Early in the 2016-17 season, UofL Coach Rick Pitino already ranks fourth in most career coaching victories through 32 seasons. Pitino's 748 victories place him 23 wins behind Jim Boeheim for third on the list.

HEAD COACH RICK PITINO

In his 32nd season as a collegiate head coach and 16th at Louisville, UofL Coach Rick Pitino has compiled a 748-262 overall record (394-134 at UofL). A member of the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame, he



is the first coach to take three different schools to the NCAA Final Four -- including his 2005, 2012 and 2013 Cardinal teams -- and the first to win an NCAA Championship at two different schools after guiding Louisville to the 2013 NCAA title. Among active coaches, Pitino (Massachusetts '74) has the second-highest winning percentage in NCAA Tournament games (.746 winning percentage, 53-18 record in 20 NCAA tournament appearances) and his overall .740 winning percentage entering the season ranks him 14th among active coaches. He guided Kentucky to three NCAA Final Four appearances in eight seasons (1989-97), winning the 1996 NCAA Championship and reaching the national title game in 1997. He has also served as head coach at Providence College (1985-87, 1987 Final Four), Boston University (1978-83), Hawaii (last six games in 1975-76) as well as the NBA New York Knicks (1987-89) and Boston Celtics (1997-2001). Pitino has a 2-3 record vs. Old Dominion (1-0 at UofL, 1-0 at UK, 0-3 at Boston).

- Cardinal Spurts In its first three games this season, Louisville has produced eight runs of 8-0 or better, including runs of 18-0 and 8-0 against Long Beach State in its last game. UofL had a season-best 20-0 run vs. Evansville on Nov. 11. Louisville has forced its opponents into 11 scoring droughts of three minutes or more, including scoring droughts of 4:33 and 3:15 in its last game vs. Long Beach State. UofL had a season-best 6:34 period of scoreless defense vs. Evansville.
- Cards' Trio Unique in Top 15 Louisville is the only school in the nation with its football, men's basketball, and women's basketball programs each ranked among the Associated Press' top 15 (football: No. 11; women's basketball: No. 4; men's basketball: No. 10). The Cardinals have four additional sports currently ranked among the nation's top teams in men's soccer (9th), field hockey (8th), women's swimming (8th) and men's swimming (10th). UofL's men's soccer team is the No. 4 overall seed in the NCAA Championship. UofL's women's cross country team advanced to the NCAA Championship for the first time in school history and the Cardinals' field hockey team competed in the NCAA Tournament as well as the event's No. 9 seed.
- Cards' Class Among Nation's Best -- Four outstanding high school products have each signed a national letter-of-intent with UofL, ranking this Cardinal group among the nation's top recruiting classes. The list of impressive signees includes Jordan Nwora, a 6-7, 215-pound forward from Buffalo, N.Y. and Vermont Academy in Saxtons River, Vt.; Darius Perry, a 6-2, 170-pound guard from Powder Springs, Ga. and Wheeler High School in Marietta, Ga.; Lance Thomas, a 6-8, 210-pound forward from Norcross (Ga.) High School; and Malik Williams, a 6-11, 215-pound forward/center from Snider High School in Ft. Wayne, Ind.

Nwora (pronounced nuh-WOR-uh) averaged 23.4 points and 10.1 rebounds as a senior last season in leading The Park School in Buffalo, N.Y. to the Manhattan Cup Class A final. He will play his final prep season at Vermont Academy in Saxtons River, Vt. A two-time All-West New York selection, Nwora enters the year ranked No. 89 nationally by Rivals.com, 109th by 247Sports.com, and is No. 91 in the ESPN 100.

Perry averaged 15.0 points, 4.3 assists, 4.0 rebounds and 3.1 steals as a junior last season as Wheeler posted a 22-6 record before falling in the first round of the Georgia state playoffs. Honored as a first-team all-region pick as a junior, Perry is ranked is No. 53 nationally in the ESPN 100, 63rd by 247Sports.com, 76th by Scout.com and 82nd by Rivals.com.

Thomas averaged 8.3 points, 6.6 rebounds and 3.7 blocked shots as a junior last season in helping his Norcross High School team to a 26-4 record and the Georgia Class AAAAAA Sweet 16 before falling to eventual state champion Westlake. A first-team All-Region 7 selection last year, Thomas is ranked No. 76 nationally by 247Sports.com and No. 121 by Scout.com, which lists him as the 16th-best power forward in the nation.

Williams averaged 21.2 points, 13.1 rebounds, 2.9 blocked shots and connected on 36 percent of his three-point attempts as a junior last season in helping his Snider High School team produce a 14-9 record. A first-team All-Summit Athletic Conference selection as a junior, Williams is ranked No. 21 nationally Scout.com, No. 29 by Rivals.com, No. 30 by 247Sports.com and is No. 41 the ESPN 100.

- Season Openers With its win over Evansville on Nov. 11, UofL has won 22 of its last 24 season openers and the last 13. UofL Coach Rick Pitino improved to 28-3 in opening games collectively at his four full collegiate coaching stops. The Cards have posted a 70-33 record in all-time season openers (47-13 home, 10-15 away, 13-5 neutral). This year was tied with two other games for the second-earliest season opener ever for the Cards (Nov. 9, 2013 vs. College of Charleston was the earliest).
- Five-League Champs -- UofL Coach Rick Pitino is the only coach to win both regular season and tournament championships in five different conferences, including three while at Louisville (ECAC North Atlantic, Southeastern, Conference USA, Big East, American).
- Card File Louisville has been ranked in 77 of the last 80 Associated Press polls ... Attendance at the KFC Yum! Center will surpass the 2.5 million mark this season. A total of 2,448,184 fans have flocked to the arena to watch UofL play through its first three games in the Cards' seventh seasons, 25,687 short of

Quentin Snider is the next closest Cardinal to that milestone, entering his junior year with 457 career points ... All 14 active UofL players saw action in the Cardinals' opener against Evansville, allowing four to make their collegiate debuts in Tony Hicks, V.J. King, Ryan McMahon and Tyler Sharpe ... Over the last seven seasons, Louisville has recovered from nine or more points down to win on 23 occasions ... Louisville has been a member of the conferences of three Battle 4 Atlantis participants: Missouri Valley from 1964-75 (Wichita State), Conference USA from 1995-2005 (Old Dominion) and Big East from 2005-2013 (St. John's).

■ Wichita State — Louisville owns a 20-5 all-time advantage against Wichita State in the series that dates back to 1962. The Cardinals have won 15 of the last 16 meetings.

In the last matchup, Louisville won 72-68 over Wichita State in the NCAA National Semifinals in Atlanta, Ga. on April 6, 2013. The Cardinals overcame a 12-point second-half deficit as walk-on guard Tim Henderson buried two three-pointers in a key stretch. Russ Smith (21 points) and Luke Hancock (20) led UofL. who went on to win the NCAA title.

The teams have faced a common opponent with both teams prevailing over Long Beach State: the Shockers won 92-55 on Nov. 13 and Louisville won 88-56 on Nov. 17.

Wichita State is the preseason favorite to win the Missouri Valley Conference, a league in which Louisville was a member from 1964-75. Louisville has a collective 98-39 record against current members of the Missouri Valley Conference. The Cardinals beat MVC member Evansville 78-47 in this year's season opener and UofL will also face MVC foe Southern Illinois -- the fifth choice in the league preseason poll -- on Dec. 7 in the KFC Yum! Center.

Louisville posted a 17-3 record against Wichita State during its 11 years in the MVC.

Former UofL men's basketball director of operations Devon Smith is in his seventh season as Wichita State's manager of player development.

■ LSU — Louisville has won eight of its nine previous meetings against LSU, including the last five straight.

In the last matchup, the Cardinals prevailed 93-87 in overtime in the John Wooden Classic, played at the Arrowhead Pond in Anahaeim, Ca. on Dec. 7, 1996. In that meeting 19 years ago, DeJuan Wheat led UofL with 26 points.

UofL defeated LSU 88-77 in the national semifinals in Dallas, Texas (March 29, 1986) en route to the Cardinals' 1986 NCAA Champi-

onship. UofL also beat LSU on the way to its 1980 NCAA national title defeating the Tigers 86-66 in the Midwest Regional Championship in Houston, Texas.

Possible Nov. 25 Opponents in the Battle 4 Atlantis

■ Michigan State — Louisville and Michigan State are tied 5-5 in their series, with four of the matchups coming in NCAA Tournament play and three in regional finals. Michigan State prevailed 71-67 over the

Cardinals in last year's meeting in the Big Ten-ACC Challenge in East Lansing, Mich. (12-2-15) as Damion Lee led UofL with 23 points and five steals. Louisville has a collective 44-41 record against current members of the Big Ten Conference. The Cardinals will face two additional Big Ten foes this year, including Purdue on Nov 30 in the ACC-Big 10 Challenge; and Indiana on Dec. 31 at Bankers Life Arena in Indianapolis. Louisville's Jalen Johnson hails from Ypsilanti, Mich., just 75 miles from the Michigan State campus. He and Spartans redshirt sophomore Kenny Goins from Troy, Mich. were both first team Class A all-state selections in Michigan in 2014.

- Baylor Louisville has never faced Baylor. The Cardinals have a collective 31-17 record against current teams from the Big 12, having faced seven of its 10 members. Baylor junior forward Jo Lual-Acuil Jr. hails from Melbourne, Australia, the same city as the Cardinals' Mangok Mathiang and Deng Adel.
- St. John's Louisville has won eight of its nine meetings against St. John's, including the last five straight Louisville holds an 11-4 series advantage over St. John's since the teams first met in 1978. The Cardinals have won the last three and seven of the last eight meetings, including a 72-58 victory in in the KFC Yum! Center in the last matchup when Russ Smith scored 24 points to lead UofL (2/14/13). Louisville was a fellow member of the Big East for eight years (2005-13).
- VCU Louisville has a 10-5 series advantage over VCU, winning three of the last four meetings. In the last matchup, VCU beat the Cardinals 79-74 on Nov. 19, 1999 in the first game played at the Rams' Stuart Siegel Center. UofL and VCU were both members for a period in Conference USA, where the Cardinals resided from 1995-2005.

- Three With 390 Louisville is the only NCAA Division I men's basketball program to have three different coaches with at least 390 victories at the school. Current Cards' Coach Rick Pitino has won 394 games in his 16th season at UofL, his predecessor Denny Crum won 675 games in 30 years (1971-2001) and Bernard "Peck" Hickman won 443 in his 23 years guiding the Cardinals (1944-67). Kansas can join that list when Bill Self wins his 390th game at Kansas (385 entering the season) as Phog Allen (590) and Roy Williams (418) have at least 390 wins there.
- Six NBA Draft Picks in Last Four Years -- Chinanu Onuaku, who was a sophomore forward/center for UofL last season, was selected by the Houston Rockets with the 37th pick overall in the second round of the 2016 NBA Draft.

A total of 69 former Louisville players have been selected in the NBA Draft, including six in the last four years. Terry Rozier was selected in the first round of the 2015 draft by the Boston Celtics as the 16th overall pick, while forward Montrezl Harrell was taken in the second round by the Houston Rockets as the 32nd selection. Russ Smith was selected by the Philadelphia 76ers in the second round of the 2014 NBA Draft with the 47th overall pick, and was subsequently traded to the New Orleans Pelicans. Gorgui Dieng was a first-round selection and the 21st overall pick by the Utah Jazz in 2013, with his rights subsequently traded to the Minnesota Timberwolves, where he has played the last three seasons. Peyton Siva was a second round choice of the Detroit Pistons in 2013 with the 56th pick overall.

Louisville has produced 23 first-round NBA Draft choices, including 11 in the top ten and five among the top three picks (Pervis Ellison first in 1989; Wes Unseld second in 1968; Darrell Griffith second in 1980; Charlie Tyra second in 1957; Rodney McCray third in 1983).

- Louisville Top College Basketball Market -- Louisville is consistently the highest-rated television market for college basketball on ESPN. Louisville has been the top market each of the last 14 years, averaging a 4.9 rating for the 2015-16 season. Louisville was over two points higher than second-place Raleigh-Durham, which averaged a 2.7 rating. The remaining top 10 was Kansas City (2.5), Greensboro-High Point (2.5), Cincinnati (1.8), Dayton (1.7), Greenville (1.7), Indianapolis (1.6) and Memphis (1.5). The Cardinals' NCAA Sweet 16 game against Kentucky in 2014 drew a 51.5 rating and 73 share, making it the second highest-rated event in Louisville television history. Louisville's 2013 NCAA Championship game against Michigan is the top-rated television event all-time in the Louisville market.
- International Flavor Louisville had an international flavor with four players on its roster hailing from foreign countries. Mangok Mathiang was born in Sudan, Africa and lived in Melbourne, Australia where he also played rugby and Australian Rules Football before coming to the United States. He played a season at Carbondale (III.) Brehm Prep School. Deng Adel followed a similar path as he was born in the Sudan, grew up in Australia and spent his senior year of high school in Florida. From Cairo, Egypt, Anas Mahmoud played a year at West Oaks Academy in Orlando, Florida before joining UofL. Matz Stockman, from Oslo, Norway, attended school in Spain's Canary Islands during the 2013-14 season before his trek to the U.S.
- Statistical Trends UofL is 171-9 over the last 16 seasons under Coach Rick Pitino when scoring 80 or more points (2-0 this year, 10-0 in 2015-16, 11-0 in 2014-15) ... Over the past 16 years under Pitino, Louisville is 130-6 when shooting 50 percent or better from the field (14-0 in 2015-16, 8-0 in 2014-15) ... UofL is 316-47 when holding its opponent below 70 points over the past 16 years under Pitino (3-0 this season, 19-1 in 2015-16, 24-4 in 2014-15, 27-1 in 2013-14).
- Seventh Season in KFC Yum! Center -- This is Louisville's seventh season in the spectacular KFC Yum! Center, located on the banks of the Ohio River in downtown Louisville. The Cardinals had previously played basketball for 54 years in Freedom Hall (1956-2010). The 22,000-seat multipurpose arena was built at a cost of \$238 million and includes 71 luxury suites, 62 four- or six-seat premium boxes, over 2,000 side-court club seats and four party suites with a seating capacity of 32 each.

UofL's men's and women's teams have permanent locker rooms. There are five additional team locker rooms, two officials locker rooms, five star dressing rooms, a full-function media work room and a full-sized basketball practice court on the event level. The seven levels of the arena (including the upper catwalk) include a collective 721,762 square feet, or roughly the area of 13 football fields.

After passing through the one and a half acre landscaped entry plaza that features a basketball-themed fountain, entering fans can visit the 2,500-square foot UofL adidas store, the 3,000-square foot UofL Hall of Honor, or head to their seats using one of the eight escalators or seven elevators within the building.

Lounge space is abundant within the arena.
Four spacious donor rooms are available for
Cardinal fans, including three that overlook the Ohio

River. The 7,000-square foot main concourse restaurant overlooks the river and a main concourse sports bar has views directly into the arena bowl. Two 4,000-square foot club lounges on the event level, as well as the terrace club and premium box lounges, provide amenities for their respective patrons. The KFC Yum! Center served as the site for the NCAA Men's Basketball Tournament second and third rounds in 2012 and 2015, the NCAA South Regional in 2016 and was the site for the 2012 NCAA Women's Volleyball Championship on December 13 and 15.

Louisville has won ...

- ... 48 of its last 64 post-season tournament games over the last 12 years (including conference, NCAA and NIT since 2005). Louisville is 25-4 in the postseason over the last five years.
- ... 26 of its last 34 games in the NCAA Tournament (since 2005), advancing to the final eight teams five times in the last nine years (2008, 2009, 2012, 2013, 2015).
- ... 30 of 38 games during the month of March over the last five years.
- ... 149 games over the last six years, tied for the fifth-most wins in the nation in that stretch. Louisville is one of just three teams to win at least 30 games in three of the last five seasons (also Kentucky, Wichita State), winning a school-record 35 victories during the Cardinals' 2012-13 NCAA Championship season.
- ... 20 games for the last 14 straight seasons, a feat accomplished by only four schools.
- ... 12 ACC regular season games in 2014-15 and 2015-16. Louisville has won at least 10 league games for nine straight seasons. UofL has finished in the top three in its conference six of the last 10 years.
- ... 10 of its last 11 conference tournament games. Louisville is 15-3 with three championships over its last seven conference tournaments, reaching the title game five times. Louisville has won three of the last four conference tournament titles in which it has participated.

■ Anniversary Year for Two Final Four teams — The 2016-17 season marks notable anniversaries for two of Louisville's Final Four teams. It is the 45th anniversary for UofL's 1972 NCAA Final Four team (26-5 record), which was guided by future Hall of Fame Coach Denny Crum in his first season with the Cardinals. The Missouri Valley Conference Co-Champions featured five senior

starters, including All-America guard Jim Price (1,460 career points, 1969-72), forward Ron Thomas, whose 13.0 career rebounding average is the fourth-best ever at UofL (1970-72), and 1,000-point scorer Al Vilcheck (1,048 points, 1969-72). This season also marks the 35th anniversary of the Cardinals' 1982 Final Four team, which had six seniors on its roster. Crum's fourth Final Four team, which was runner-up in the Metro Conference, included four starters that totaled over 1,000 career points in Derek Smith (1,826), Lancaster Gordon (1,614), Jerry Eaves (1,250) and Rodney McCray (1,247). The Cardinals beat UAB on its home floor to win the Mideast Regional.

- La Poderosa Broadcast Six Six UofL home men's basketball games will be broadcast this season in Spanish on La Poderosa (WTUV, 620AM). The remaining four games include: Dec. 7 vs. Southern Illinois, Dec. 10 vs. Texas Southern, Jan. 19 vs. Clemson and Feb. 18 vs. Virginia Tech. Carlos Lucio and Elvis Martinez call the action for the broadcasts in UofL's effort to reach out to the Hispanic community for the last 12 years. All of U of L's home football games over the last 12 years have also been broadcast in Spanish.

Cardinals in the NCAA Tournament

- Louisville made its 41st NCAA Tournament appearance in 2015. The Cardinals have reached the NCAA Tournament 32 of the last 40 years (nine of the last 10, 12 of the last 14, 14 of the last 18 years, 20 of last 25). The Cards have reached the Sweet 16 on 21 occasions and have advanced to the Elite Eight four of the last seven seasons. Louisville is sixth in tournament victories (75) and is fifth in NCAA Tournament appearances (41). UofL has a 75-42 overall NCAA Tournament record, reaching the Final Four 10 times.
- Only four teams -- Kentucky (56), North Carolina (47), UCLA (46), and Kansas (45) -- have more NCAA Tournament appearances than Louisville's 41.
- U of L Coach Rick Pitino has a 53-18 record in NCAA Tournament play (.746), ranking him second among active coaches in winning percentage and 10th all time. Only three coaches have coached more Final Four teams than Pitino's seven, a feat matched by one other. Pitino is the first coach to win an NCAA Championship at two different schools; the first to lead three different teams to the Final Four; is one of 11 coaches to lead four different schools to the NCAA Tournament; and one of 10 active collegiate coaches who have won an NCAA Championship.
- Only three teams have been to more Sweet 16 appearances than Louisville's 21 since the NCAA began Sweet 16 records in 1975 (North Carolina 27, Kentucky 26. Duke 25: Kansas is tied with Louisville/21).
- U of L Coach Rick Pitino has guided 20 teams to NCAA tournament appearances, including 12 of his last 14 years at Louisville (nine of the last 10 years). His last six straight Kentucky teams reached the NCAA Tournament. The Wildcats won the 1996 NCAA title and were national runner-up in 1997 under his guidance.
